Not all teapots are 'short and stout'

Teapots are decorative vessels used to steep and serve hot herbal mixes or tea. Because they are not exposed to open flame, many are fashioned from delicate porcelain. Scores, like the short, stout one described in "I'm a Little Teapot," are globular. Others, despite constraints of steeping tea and keeping it warm, are novel marvels of whimsy, individuality, and creativity.

Though teapots are a relatively new invention, tea itself dates back thousands of years to ancient China. Tea leaves, then valued as medicinal, were roasted, ground into a paste, then molded into small "bricks". When boiled with ginger or orange peel, for example, they yielded

a soup-like infusion.

During the Song Dynasty (960-1279), when this fragrant refreshment became increasingly popular, its preparation simplified. Some brewed delicate, loose-leaf teas. Others pounded or crumbled tea leaves into a fine powder, placed them in ceramic kettles or metal wine ewers, steeped them in freshly boiled water, then whisked them into a froth.

Small, heat-retaining porcelain teapots, which appeared hundreds of years later, were one-cups sipped directly from straight spouts. Finely textured, pale buff to deep brown Yixing teapots, fashioned from unique purple clay, emerged in the 1400s. Because these were so absorbent, however, accumulated traces of taste, minerals, and hues from past usage enriched future brews.

As tea culture spread through Asia, local artists developed decorative teapot designs of their own. Despite their functional features — bodies, handles, lids, spout, and finials - materials and styles vary greatly.

Chinese tea leaves reached Europe through the 1600s, together with thinwalled, translucent, pear-shaped, porcelain "chinaware" teapots. Most featured hand-painted blue-and-white underglaze designs. Models in delicate "famille rose" (red) or "famille verte" (green) palettes fol-

So did highly glazed Cadogan teapots, adaptations of Chinese pitcher-shaped wine-pots. Curved peach-form ones often depict auspicious, hand-painted prunus, peony, dragon, phoenix, or lotus motifs. Later models, reflecting the expansion of international trade, often display Chinese trading posts or East India Company merchant fleets. Though these beauties appear conventional, each harbors a conversation-starting secret. All feature functional handles and pour through spouts - but lack lids. How were they filled? When inverted, hot water, poured through a wide hole in their base, flowed into a narrowing, funnel-like inner channel. When righted, the water pooled around the widest part of that funnel — its base.

Though imported Chinaware was exceedingly expensive, it proved far more durable and elegant than local horn, glass, or earthenware teapots. So as "tea fever" spread, enterprising Dutch and British potters desperately sought to duplicate its

appealing blend of beauty, strength, fragility, and resistance to hot liquids.

Initially, they produced fragile, softpaste porcelain cups, mugs, and ewers fired at low temperatures. Though stylish, they sometimes exploded when subjected to boiling water. In fact, directions found on the inner lid of a Belleek teapot, found at London's Victoria and Albert Museum, cautions "Fill with water blood warm [at tepid temperature] and allow it to stand a few minutes empty and use with boiling water."

Understandably, the quest for more durable, hard-paste porcelain continued.

In 1708, after extensive experimentation (a saga of alchemy, chemistry, secrecy, and coercion), Johann Böttger finally formulated fine, high-fired, hard-paste porcelain. His remarkable, bright "white gold" not only rivaled imported Chinaware, but could also be enameled, glazed, and gilded.

Soon hundreds of European potteries produced similar wares adorned with lush, gold-trimmed floral designs. Apparently, the tea craze heralded Europe's luxurious Age of Porcelain

Because tea leaves were still a luxury, however, most early porcelain teapots were small. In style, however, they ranged from common to curious. In the 1740s, for example, the Meissen Porcelain Manufactory issued a playful pot shaped like a monkey cradling an infant, with another on her back, forming its spout. Not long after, the Minton Pottery issued a pot featuring a bemused monkey clasping a coconut, his head its cover, his tail curled into its handle. Some created agateware pots, fashioned from colorful, agate-like layers of marbleized clay. Around 1760, potters in Staffordshire, long an area of fine pot-

'Ulysses' by James Joyce tops AbeBooks list for 2020



If nothing else, this was the year to catch up on personal reading. For many, that meant total immersion in the world of Jane Austin, William Faulkner, and F. Scott Fitgerald. But even as some were working their way through "Emma," "The Sound and the Fury," and "The Great Gatsby," serious book collectors were actively adding expensive items to their collections, thanks to AbeBooks, a subsidiary of Amazon. "Like many purely digital businesses, we had a good year in 2020. People needed books more than ever," according to spokesman Richard Davies.

Topping the list of the most expensive books purchased was a copy of "Ulysses" by James Joyce. Published by John Lane The Bodley Head in 1936, this first edition, number 60 of 100 and bound in vellum, is a "fine" copy, accompanied with a "near-fine" original slipcase. "Ulysses," Davies commented, is "regularly on our end-of-year lists," even though the novel's stream-of-consciousness narrative style makes it "notoriously hard to read." This volume sold for \$46,310.

In second place, at \$41,800 was "Innocentia Victrix," written by a group of Jesuit missionaries based in China. Printed in Canton in 1671 and employing Chinese printing technology ("much to the surprise of their colleagues in Rome"), this book contains Chinese and Latin text and helps to confirm China's tolerance toward Christians, following a period of persecution between 1664 and 1666. The frontispiece bears a Chinese woodblock of the Jesuit Order

A single-sheet map by Ptolemy, marking only the third time that Arabia had been depicted in an atlas, changed hands for \$27,880. And a first edition of Charles Dickens' "A Christmas Carol," an 1843 first edition in near-fine condition, published by Chapman and Hall, changed

hands for \$27,500.

"Usually, it takes years for a book to become collectible," Davies continued. J.K. Rowling's "Harry Potter" books, notable exceptions to this generalization, were supplanted this year by two modern books from Taschen, "David Bailey Art Edition" (\$25,225) and "Linda McCartney Life in Photographs" (\$20,000). The former is

the John Lennon and Paul McCartney variant of a book published in 2019, Davies specified. Limited to 75 copies and published in 2019, this "hefty Sumo-sized photography book," signed by David Bailey, was accompanied by a white tripod bookstand and four different dust jackets. "Taschen loves to create special editions, and this is a good one."

Published in 2011, the latter is a retrospective of Linda's life and photography, one of 125 copies produced in the "Art Edition B" run. It includes a print of Paul McCartney (which, like the book, was individually numbered and

On Nov. 15, World Auction Gallery provided a cure for those suffering from election fatigue. For nine hours, grateful bidders transitioned from politics to paintings, patina, porcelain, photographs, paperweights, and a few pennies.

Leading off the 645-lot sale were 93 paintings by American, European and Asian artists. The clear winner was the featured lot of the sale: a signed oil on canvas by Lin Fengmian (Chinese, 1900-1991) titled Autumn River Scene. Before the rise of Communism in the 1920s and 1930s, Lin pioneered in blending Western and Eastern painting styles. The colorful, framed 31 by 25 inch painting sold to an international dealer bidding on the phone for \$348,000. "Although he is not a household name," said auctioneer Ben Nejat, "Lin's auction records range from \$100,000 to nearly \$4 million at a recent Christie's sale in Hong Kong.

Because of COVID-19 concerns, there

were no onsite bidders at the November sale. Dogs had their day. A 25 by 18 by 12 inch Black Forest carving of a pair of St. Bernards on an elaborate wooden base did exception-

ally well. The finely carved pair sold to an Upstate New York collector for \$12,000. Several animal portraits sold, but none did better than a pair of dogs dressed in duds their owners might wear. An oil on canvas paintings of a dog in a military uniform and another in a professor's gown and cap demolished their \$100/\$200 estimate to sell for \$2,432.

The sale's 35 bronze figures ranged from roaring lions and snarling tigers to a crying baby and a dancing rabbi. The best bronze was also the best conversation starter: A leering devil figure admiring a demure nude female on a floral and rock-strewn landscape. By Etienne Forestier (French, 1877-1927) with a foundry mark for Rene Fulda, Paris, the 31 by 13 by 20 inch ensemble sold to the phones for \$2,400.

Among the 157 lots of American currency in the sale, it was hard to beat an uncirculat-




signed by the "cute" Beatle) and is enclosed in a clamshell box, still sealed in its original shipping box. "Taschen publishes books designed to be collectible from 'day one.' A handful of their limited editions start increasing in value from the moment they are published," Davies ex-

Last year, a first edition of the first James Bond novel, "Casino Royale," brought \$19,600. This year, "Goldfinger," a signed first edition of Ian Fleming's seventh novel (later adapted as the third Bond movie), in "fine" condition with a "near-fine" dust jacket, brought \$25,000. "There's usually a James Bond book on our endof-year list," Davies commented.

Also on the top-ten list are "The Lost World" by Michael Crichton (\$25,000) and "Alice's Adventures in Wonderland," illustrated by Salvador Dali (\$23,600). The copy of "World," a sequel to "Jurassic Park," is an unread first edition, complete with dust jacket, signed by Steven Spielberg, special effects director Stan Winston, and 10 actors from the film adaptation of the novel, including Jeff Goldblum, Julianne Moore, Vince Vaughn, and Pete Postlethwaite. Dali's "Wonderland," regularly on the AbeBooks list, is one of 200 copies, signed by the artist on the frontispiece etching and the title page.

Considered by many to be Stephen King's "magnum opus," "The Dark Tower I-X," a total of 12 books, "beautifully illustrated" with dust jackets and slipcases, sold for \$21,080. Rounding out the list was "The Vegetable," a short story that F. Scott Fitzgerald developed into his only play; it sold for \$20,000. A comedy about a middle-class clerk, this first edition, in "very good" condition, signed and inscribed by the author, is a reminder of a dramatic failure: The play opened in Atlantic City, closed after a short run, and failed to reach Broadway.

Meanwhile, AbeBooks continues to offer reading copies of "Ulysses" for \$4.14, "A Christmas Carol" for \$3.79, and "Goldfinger" for \$2.59.



ed encased set of four American eagle gold bullion coins with Roman numerals for 1988. The combined weight of the \$50, \$25, \$10 and \$5 gold pieces was 1.85 ounces or \$3,478 if sold purely for melt down value. The 1988 set sold to a bidder on the internet for \$4,160.

There were 14 Tiffany lots in the sale. The category leader was a double mantel bronze student lamp from Tiffany Studio that had not been converted to electricity. "There is still kerosene in the tank," said Nejat. The 29 ½ inch lamp came from a 20-room mansion on 5 1/2 acres in the Victorian village of Northport, Long Island, New York. It sold to a phone bidder for \$14,400.

Perhaps the most important lot of the sale was a circa 1845 two-handled coin silver tray presented to Dr. Frank H. Hamilton (1813-1886) by a student identified only by three initials. Hamilton was the distinguished author, professor and surgeon who with other physicians attended to President James A. Garfield following an assassination attack in 1881. The 22 by 13.5 by 1.75 inch presentation tray sold to a bidder on the internet for



Forget Pantone; Vintage Style choses Marigold as color of the year



Bye-bye, "Classic Blue." Hello, "Ultimate Gray"and "Illuminating"? On Dec. 9, the Pantone Color Institute unveiled its 2021 "Color of the Year." Just as "Rose Quartz" and "Serenity" were named in tandem in 2016, so this year's selection is actually a pair of colors, a "solid and dependable gray" and a "warming yellow shade imbued with solar power." Pantone, you might recall, is the New Jersey-based company that sets color standards for the world of fashion and home decoration; this year, it is hoping to send "a message of happiness supported by fortitude."

Simply stated, once again, "Barbie Pink" lost out.

As it happened, this year's selection was announced a bit later than in times past, which, come to think of it, is about par for the course these days. But as the suspense mounted, a number of people in affected industries began predicting their own favorites to fill the vacuum.

Myself growing a bit impatient with Pantone, I reached out to Bindy Bitterman, longtime friend of "Vintage Style," to see if she had any suggestions. For years, I have depended on Bindy for ideas (and images) of old things that have reflected the "Color of the Year." Now retired from "Eureka!," her Chicago-based antique shop, Bindy is focusing on writing her book as well as amusing limericks ("There once was a writer named Barbie?"). Never one to disappoint, she hasn't lost her touch.

Bindy suggested that a good "Color of the Year" selection might be "some form of orange, with a slightly brownish tinge" (even though she admitted to a personal preference for red, although "a bright pink might be good too"). Turns out we're in agreement on all counts. I'm not on the "orange-ish" train, but I get it. As it happens, before the official declaration, others opted for what might best be described as "Marigold" for "Color of the Year." (Full disclosure: "Marigold" is the name of one of my three beloved grandchildren).

That said, there are other good rea-

sons for this selection: It rocks a 1970s vibe without the nastiness associated with "Antique Gold." More importantly, according to the Institute's standards, it is pleasing in all four seasons, winter, spring, summer, and fall. If I were making the case for Pantone, I would describe it as "bright and optimistic, simple and accessible. Marigolds (the flowers) are simple to grow; the color is repeated in fall's chrysanthemums. As the weather turns cold, we take comfort in the golden glow of a crackling fire."

Best of all, though, it works well as both a personal and household accessory. "Marigold," the "Vintage Style Color of the Year for 2021" has long been wearable (think vintage Bakelite and amber jewelry). As for its use as a home accent color, there's amber glass, especially lovely when reflecting sunlight. Versatile, "Marigold" shows up

on a variety of popular tabletop patterns (china and glassware), as well as table linens. And it has been endorsed by Jimmie Bucci, president of the Vintage Tablecloth Lovers Club and friend of Vintage Style. Years ago, selecting a neutral color, he chose a cloth that is predominately "Marigold."

Take that, Pantone!

Finally, because it's January, let's consider the matter of vintage calendars. Advertising or commemorative,

paper or ceramic, those from the following years will once again work just fine in 2021: 1897, 1909, 1915, 1926, 1937, 1943, 1954 (the year linen calendar towels were introduced), 1965, 1971, 1982, 1993, 1999, and 2010. For those with some sentimental attachment, save last year's calendars and use them again in 2048, 2076, and 2144. I don't know about you, but 2020 is one I'd prefer not to relive.

Farny painting brings \$57,500 at New Haven Auctions

NEW HAVEN, Conn. — Fred Giampietro/New Haven Auctions hosted their Autumn Americana Auction Oct.3, featuring Outsider art, Native American and Ethnographic pieces, and quality antiques, that included items hailing from the collection of New England antique dealers Jim and Nancy Glazer. In full, there were 433 lots offered via the hybrid auctioning which included representation on BidSquare and Live Auctioneers.

One of New Haven's calling cards is its well-curated auctions, strong on provenance and high-caliber items. Such was the case here; particularly noteworthy was a first public offering of a Henry Farny gouache and watercolor entitled Native American Hunter. The piece was consigned directly from the artist's family, signed and dated 1902. Bidding exceeded high estimates, climbing to \$57,500 on 46 bids from the house floor.

Also significant, with provenance connected to Christie's in New York, was a 7-foot museum-quality folk art hall stand featuring a carved stag head, canoes, and compotes of flowers. In original condition

winning bids, including a fine-condition 19th-century cigar store Indian woman holding cigars and tobacco plugs in her hands that went for \$10,500. The rare small-size (39-inch) figure from the third quarter of the 19th-century was attributed to Julius Melchers. (1829-1908). While its base was possibly a replacement and there were some imperfections, the figure's clothing still retained its original salmon-color paint.

Several weathervanes brought in impressive sums. Hitting \$9,750 was a 51inch Figure of Fame weathervane from the second quarter of the 20th-century, in excellent condition, crafted of molded and sheet copper with a weathered gilded surface. Won for \$9,250, a circa 1875 leaping stag weathervane attributed to Harris and Company, made of molded copper, cast bronze and zinc, in fine condition, with no noted restoration. An 1870s sheet iron Indian weathervane with black painted surface sold for slightly below estimates at \$6,000.

There were over two-dozen lots of Nawith very minor imperfections, it sold for tive American and ethnographic pieces. nearly double the high estimate at \$20,000. Selling for \$4,800 was a Zuni frog and Eight additional lots reached five-figure butterfly effigy olla from the last quarter of the 19th-century listed in excellent condition with no apparent restoration. A 24inch, circa 1935 Hopi Hemis kachina sold for \$3,300. The cottonwood root carving was painted from natural pigment and commercial paint with some identified cracks and old repairs. A 19-inch Native American pipe tomahawk, with pewter inlay, brass tacks, and notch carving on the stem sold for \$2,400.

Furniture buyers had 78 lots of good antique pieces to consider. An early Southern highboy made of walnut and pine reached \$7,500 on 38 bids. The 72-inch-tall chest likely came from southwestern Pennsylvania and had provenance to two families. A circa 1840 American garden bench with cast iron swan ends grabbed \$4,700. The 6-foot bench came from the collection of Jim and Nancy Glazer and was in excellent original condition bearing weathered paint on the swans and wood slats. From the same era, selling for \$2,600

was a carved tiger maple four-post bed with two modern side rails.

Provenance helped instill confidence for buyers and bolster prices for the nearly 100 lots of fine art. Among the offerings were several pieces of outsider art. The genre, which is getting increasingly popular, originates with self-taught artists unconnected with the mainstream art world. This auction included multiple outsider pieces by artists like Jesse Howard (1885-1983), Purvis Young (1943-2010), and Lee Godie (1908-1994). One Jesse Howard oilon-masonite, reaching \$9,000 featured a series of hand-lettered messages. The first public offering was purchased directly from Howard by the consignor. A Lee Godie double portrait painted on a window shade was also a first public offering and acquired directly; it sold for \$2,800. Four paintings attributable to Purvis Young sold from \$600 for a mixed media piece called Christ, to \$1,650 for a paint-on-panel entitled Boat to Freedom.

Among the 137 pieces of decorative art were several folk art face jugs. A rare Southern stoneware vessel, circa 1900 attributed to Kentucky's Ernest Galloway, with no restoration and only minor chips, with good provenance sold for \$9,750, just under its high estimate. A 19th-century glazed stoneware face vessel with provenance linked to Heritage Plantation made it to \$7,000. Four additional lots of face jugs, by Cleater, Reggie, and Lanier Meaders, (considered

some of the most famous folk potters in the country) reached as high as \$1,000 for the Lanier Meaders piece.

Echoing New Haven's location, many New England antiques were available including a shadowbox from the 19th-century featuring a carved ship and whale, in excellent condition, sold for threetimes estimates at \$3,000. A 36-inch carved whale with original paint but a re-glued fin, attributed to Clark Vorhees, grabbed \$1,050. Two lots containing pairs of Nantucket baskets sold for \$650 and \$600 respectively. And, one of several needlework samplers - a 25-inch tall family record for Sarah Huntington, circa 1838 featuring clipper ships - sold for \$1,550.

Teapots

teries, produced exceptionally detailed, quickly decorated transferware teapots based on inked or engraved prints.

By the early 1800s, British upper classes were hosting fashionable "afternoon teas" on prestigious Worcester or Meissen porcelain tea services, matched sets of teapots, cups, saucers, creamers, sugar bowls, milk jugs, and trays. Their daughters, boasting doll-size versions, held "teas" of their own.

As the price of tea leaves fell, the rising middle classes relaxed over sweet cakes and steaming cuppas at pleasure gardens, tea shops, or in private parlors. As tea fever spread, enterprising potters, including Josiah Wedgwood and Josiah Spode, introduced a variety of models. Fanciful ones resembling cauliflowers and pineapples, a fruit associated with privilege and wealth, were especially enticing.

During the Victorian Era, chintzy-patterned and glazed majolica teapots, featuring molded flora, fauna, or basketwork motifs, were trendy. So were novelty ones which, through image and text, honored British politicians, celebrated leading literary figures, or commemorated royal jubilees or coronations.

Animal figural tea pots, featuring whimsical (yet functional) creature characteristics, however, were especially charming. Cat or cockerel-shaped ones, for instance, often bore tails curled into handles. Fish-form pots often featured fins as finials, while piggy-pot snouts often served as spouts.

Loose tea in porous tea bags, which were introduced around 1904, were designed to be opened, then emptied into teapots. Yet consumers found it easier to use them as is. Moreover, though tea could now be brewed in cups, teapot popularity continued. Many were produced in traditional styles. Others reflected emerging artistic trends.

Octagonal, hexagonal, and cube-form novelty teapots trended during the Art Deco Era. Japanese Noritake teapots, ranging from simple to sumptuous, also reached the international market. Clarice Cliff's inexpensive, brightly colored Bizarre Ware pots, known for intriguing geometric and abstract shapes and designs, followed. So did solid color, highly glazed Fiestaware teapots, featuring concentric circles.

English potter James Sadler & Sons Ltd., in addition to teapots in popular styles, created ones depicting British favorites like Henry VIII, Elizabeth I, a range of English cottages, as well as scenes from Shakespeare. His pottery also created "Famous Landmarks Around

the World," a limited set depicting architectural wonders like the Eiffel Tower, the White House, and the Coliseum. Other Sadler pots, reflecting their times, resemble cars, trains, tanks, and airplanes.

After World War II, a staggering number of novelty teapots flooded the market, ranging from cupcake and kitty cat models to Jemima Puddleduck, Winne the Pooh, and Mad Hatter figurals. Others, one-cup to full-sized, resemble true-to-life telephones, typewriters, kitchen stoves, sewing machines, or stacks of books.

In recent years, numerous studio craftsmen and cottage potteries have been creating unique teapots in limited editions. Their works are not only diverse but often delightful. Paul Cardew, for example, created highly detailed models more cherished than used. His classic, flowered pots often feature molded butterfly finials, while his three-dimensional lids often balance assortments of tiny teapots, teacups, cake plates, open books and baskets of fruit — all made of porcelain. Carder's Moving Day model boasts a jumble of porcelains atop a pile of wrapping- newspapers, above a carton-shaped pot labeled "Handle With Care." Cardew's pots featuring Walt Disney figurals, like Mickey Mouse, Dumbo, and Donald Duck, are also all-time favorites.

Contemporary craftsmen, as of old, still transform humble teapots into collectible works of art. Annette Corcoran, for example, sculpts hers into delicate, amazingly realistic hand-painted birds. Ron Meyer, influenced by Japanese Shino ware and English slipware, features human faces, fish, rabbits, rats, or cats in his designs. Peter Shire creates eccentric pots from disparate colors, shapes, and materials that, somehow, merge into a humorous whole.

Bright or somber, sophisticated or silly, there's a novelty teapot for everyone. Ultimately, it's a matter of taste.

Serious seekers, armchairs enthusiasts, and potters alike may find The Teapot Book by Steve Woodhead of interest. In addition to a comprehensive history, this lavishly illustrated volume features a step-by-step exploration of new and contemporary teapot design, technical aspects, firing instructions, and construction, along with tips on serving tea. Some may prefer to interact with other collectors on social media. Facebook, for example, hosts a number of teapot-related sites, public and private, like Vintage Tea Cups and Tea Set Collectors, and Teacups and Teapots.


