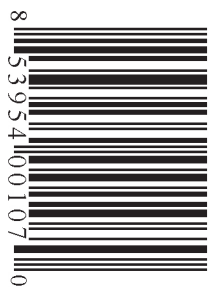

From fashion statement to protection: Charms enthrall us

Who doesn't love jingly, jangly charm bracelets featuring tiny, decorative trinkets or amulets? Indeed, people have prized charms since time immemorial. Early ones, probably eye-catching shells, roots, animal bones, or pebbles, averted demon-fear, night-fright, witchcraft, and other dangers. As civilizations rose and fell, people also fashioned good luck charms from precious metals, gemstones, ivory, bone, or bits of clay.

Mesopotamians, who believed medicine was magic, relied on charms to protect family members, as well as possessions, livestock, and flocks, from every imaginable threat. Blue or green charm-pendants, for example, safeguarded wearers from Evil. Onyx or agate-stone ones, depicting eye-like orbs, averted the Evil Eye. Mesopotamian royalty carried protective golden charms against "manifold perils from forces visible and invisible." Moreover, during religious rites, they wore gold charm-necklaces to guard against Divine mysteries.

Wellborn Egyptians often carried protective charms cast from metal or carved from bone, ivory, or gemstones. Many portrayed stylized, three-dimensional falcons, fish, or bulge-eyed frogs. Others depicted Egyptian deities. A finely glazed turquoise faience beauty, explains Allan Anawati, director at Medusa-art.com, depicts Thoth (god of wisdom) in ibis-form, its beak resting upon the Egyptian hieroglyph for the word "truth."

Additionally, Egyptians, rich and poor, strung rings of sacred, beetle-like scarabs, symbolizing rebirth and regeneration, round their wrists or necks. Scores not only resembled those insects in size and shape, but also bore naturalistic mandibles, eyes, antennae, and striated wing cases. Traditionally, scarabs also protected the deceased in their journeys through the Afterlife. Thus high-status mummies sometimes bear large, ornate breastplate scarabs inscribed with appropriate names or drawings, above their heart-areas, and uninscribed ones tucked within their bodies.

Greeks favored elegant cylindrical gold charms, as well as round ones featuring images like elephants, birds, or fish. Ones inscribed with the ancient magical word abracadabra, were also popular.

In Rome, athletes sometimes suspended tiny, metallic charms round their necks to ensure victory. Others trusted ivory, glass, amber, or glazed ceramic charms, sometimes mimicking body

parts, to neutralize poison, deflect calamity, cure disease, and avert the Evil Eye. While some carried replicas of Egyptian scarabs. Others made do with rough, unpolished lumps of gemstones. Roman Christians, on the other hand, secreted tiny fish-shaped charms, symbols of forbidden belief, deep within their clothing.

During the Middle Ages, knights and nobility bore charms to ensure good health, luck, and protection in battle. Others strung sets, identifying family origins, religious convictions, or social status, on bracelets or belts. Though charms eventually fell from courtly fashion, they became popular among the lower classes.

Queen Victoria popularized charm bracelets not only by wearing them, but also by offering personalized ones as gifts. After her beloved Prince Albert died in 1861, this trend-setter, along

with somber widow's weeds, introduced "mourning" charms. Mourning subjects adopted them as well. Some were carved from black jet. Others depicted tiny por-

traits of the deceased or cradled locks of their hair.

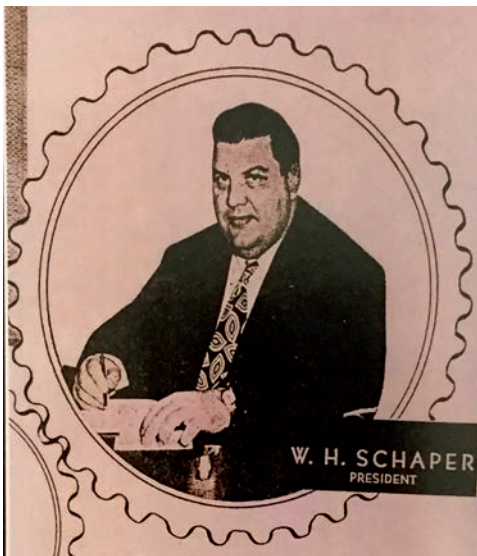

Stuck in the house still? Read up on board games

Cooped up and spending an evening together but don't want to "Risk" starting a "Family Feud"? Are you looking for a "Strategy" to pass hours of "Fascination," but you don't want to "Break the Bank" (because, after all, who wants to "Go For Broke")? Well, here's a book that can provide more than one "Clue" to insure "Happy Days" and evenings. And "To Tell The Truth," I promise you won't be "Sorry."

OK, enough of that. But you get the idea: After spending hours poring over "Board Games" by Desi Scarpone, I'm ready to go through the closet and pull out some of my favorite classic games.

As it turns out, board games have been enjoyed by Americans for more than 150 years, and in the revised second edition of his book, Scarpone pictures nearly 1,500 individual examples, dating from the 1940s through the 1980s. Games are or-

ganized according to four categories: western and military; business, bookshelf, and sports; entertainment (based on, among other things, toys, television shows, and movies); and "general." The author concedes that some games could arguably be placed in more than one group, but a comprehensive index makes it easy to find an old favorite.

Additionally, one chapter is dedicated to W.H. Schaper, the Minneapolis milkman who created a plastic bug toy that led to the game "Cootie." And, as it turns out, every Schaper game was said to have been "Sanitary Wrapped," something of a comfort, I suppose. Scarpone finds Schaper's nostalgic packaging designs with "crew-cut boys" and "pig-tailed girls" appealing. Too bad Schaper took a pass on "Scrabble."

Then there's "Monopoly," the subject of its own chapter. Based on "The Landlord's Game," its universal appeal resulted in the manufacturing of many copies, as well as numerous spin-offs. Consequently, there is little collector interest in the old editions, according to Scarpone.

Believe it or not: Ripley auctions to sell items from Ripley's museum

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind. – Collectors interested in owning a genuine Guinness World Record item, ranging from the world's smallest bicycle to the world's largest pinball machine (Atari Hercules) to a coin-operated animated electric chair exhibit, will get their chance in an online-only auction of items previously displayed at the now-closed Guinness Museum of World Records in Niagara Falls, Canada. Every item in the auction is accompanied by an official certificate of authenticity.

The auction is being conducted by Ripley Auctions in Indianapolis and the catalog is online now, at www.ripleyauctions.com/online-auctions/. Bidding ends on Friday, Feb. 12, at 5 pm Eastern time and is available thru LiveAuctioneers.com, Invaluable.com and Auctionzip.com. Phone and absentee bids will also be taken.

The auction is officially titled Ripley's Remarkable Rarities Presents Guinness World Records Museum of Niagara Falls Auction. Ripley Entertainment, Inc., which is not affiliated with Ripley Auctions, owns the Guinness World Records brand. It has operated the museum in Canada since its grand opening in 1978 until its closing in September 2020, making the exhibit items available.

"In less than twenty hours since the post-

ing of the catalog online, we've generated over 500,000 lot views and \$200,000 in early bids," said Dan Ripley, president and owner of Ripley Auctions. "We encourage everyone to watch and bid live, while enjoying a unique and entertaining live-stream event. The live-stream production is unique to any live auction event I'm aware of."

The auction features over 100 lots of oddities, circus sideshow items, arts and entertainment memorabilia, music and sports collectibles, museum displays, coin-operated interactive exhibits, sculpted characters, artifacts, and even smaller items such as record wall plaques.

The world's smallest wheeled, rideable bicycles were built and ridden by entertainer Charly Charles in his Las Vegas act at the Circus Circus Hotel. The one in the auction has an estimate of \$500-\$1,000, as does the world's smallest camera – a round model made by the Petal Optical Company, manufactured in

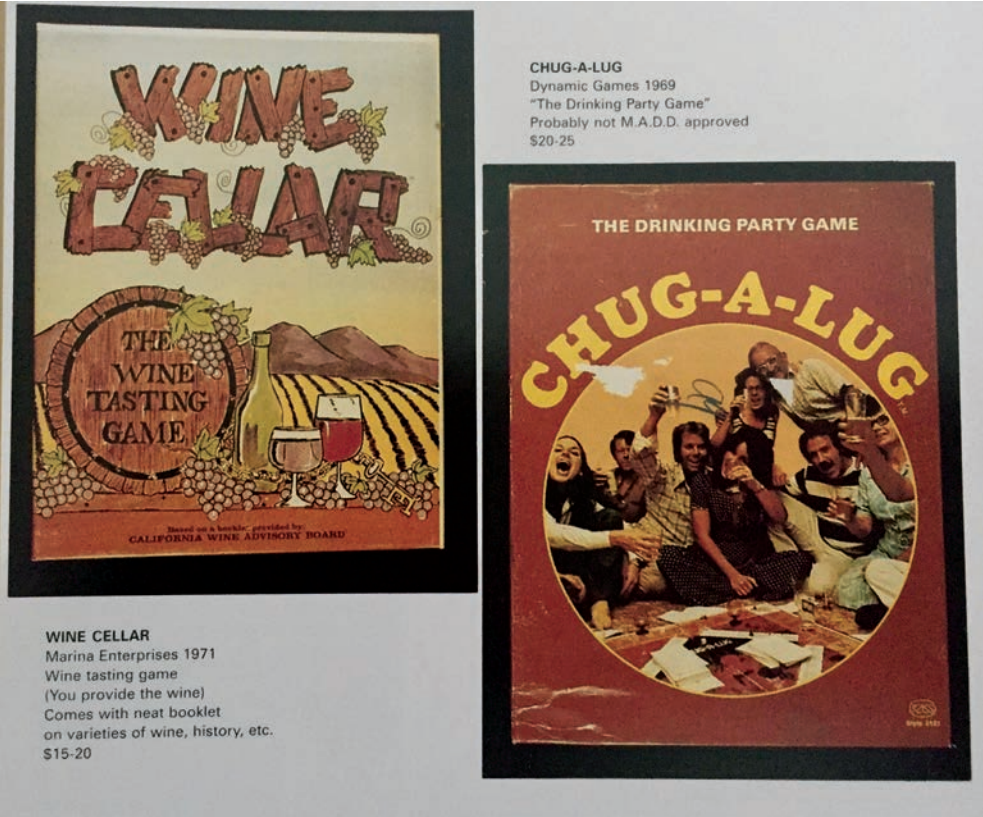
You don’t have to be a war strategist or a sports fanatic to enjoy Scarpone’s book. The color photography is top notch. Scarpone offers some pricing guidelines to use as “approximations,” but it should be noted that the market has undergone changes since this price guide was revised in 2004. And just saying, the author seems to disdain the words “the book says so” when it comes to negotiating a fair price.

Some of the factors that do affect a game’s worth, though, are scarcity, physical location, and emotion. Age alone does not determine value. Games that look good

but are missing essential pieces may be worth less than a complete one that shows wear. Or not. Unlike playing these games, there are no set rules for collecting them.

Since this is a book about games, Scarpone keeps it fun with droll comments and interesting bits of trivia scattered throughout the book. Early “Monopoly” games, for instance, did not come with tokens; players had to supply their own. Furthermore, the descriptive promos inscribed on the box lids can also be pretty amusing. Take “I’m a Schmo and that ain’t good” (the game of “Schmo”) and “Pound an air pump and blast your opponent’s pieces off the game board” (“Battleboard”) as two examples.

In the end, “Board Games” is sure to please any fan of pop culture. My cousin is currently obsessed with Tombstone (don’t

ask me why), and I think he might enjoy the game of “Johnny Ringo.” For me, I still love the Beatles (a different Ringo), so for me to own “Flip Your Wig,” not to play, but to frame the game board, would be great fun. I wish I had kept my copy of “The Game of Barbie” (for obvious reasons), but now I have something else to be on the

lookout for. As Scarpone points out, the playability is not important, it’s the “subtle aesthetics of a game, coupled with the nostalgia factor inherent with the collector,” that really matter.

Occupied Japan in 1947-1948. A roll of film is included. A candidate for top lot of the auction is a Wurlitzer Model OMT 1015 jukebox, restored (est. \$4,000-\$5,000).

inal justice records (est. \$1,000-\$3,000).

A custom sculpted, 68-inch-tall character portraying The Tattooed Lady – Krystyne Kolorful – who had 95 percent of her body surface tattooed, with a 32 inch by 49 inch “Most Tattooed Lady” PVC sign, should bring \$1,000-\$2,000; while a custom sculpted, 65-inch-tall portrayal of sword-swallower Martin Henshaw, who was able to swallow an astounding 14 swords at once, with a PVC sign (“The World’s Hungriest Sword Swallower”) has an estimate of \$500-\$1,000.

Sports offerings will include an official signed Wayne Gretzky Hespeler hockey stick and Edmonton Oilers hockey puck (est. 2,500-\$3,500) and a signed Dan Marino Miami Dolphins jersey with two signed photos (est. \$1,250-\$2,000), both with COAs; and a 42-inch-tall sculpted caricature of Gordie Howe, with a “Longest Hockey Career” record card (est. \$1,000-\$1,500).

The Guinness World Records Museum was an attraction landmark in Niagara Falls, Canada for 42 years, entertaining visitors old and young and operating as a franchisee of the world-famous brand while serving as a tribute to the best-selling copyrighted book of all time, The Guinness World Records book. Munnell and Vanard collections at Joe R. Pyle

JANE LEW, W.Va. — There are some personalities that just fill the room. An afternoon with the renowned sports writer J. C. Munnell will validate that point. Anyone with any interest in the modern firearms scene would sit wide-eyed with Munnell as he recalls memories from his lifetime of collecting, trading and building fine firearms. But also in the room is Brian Vanard, an accomplished hunter who has sought game on multiple continents, always with the finest firearm in hand.

Munnell is a retired attorney and accomplished writer who has written and photographed articles for publications such as: Precision Shooting Magazine, Predator Xtreme Magazine, Double Gun Journal, Varmint Hunter Magazine, and Accurate Rifle. Munnell is also the author of at least three books on Ruger firearms and has been involved in the custom firearms trade in various fashions for over five decades.

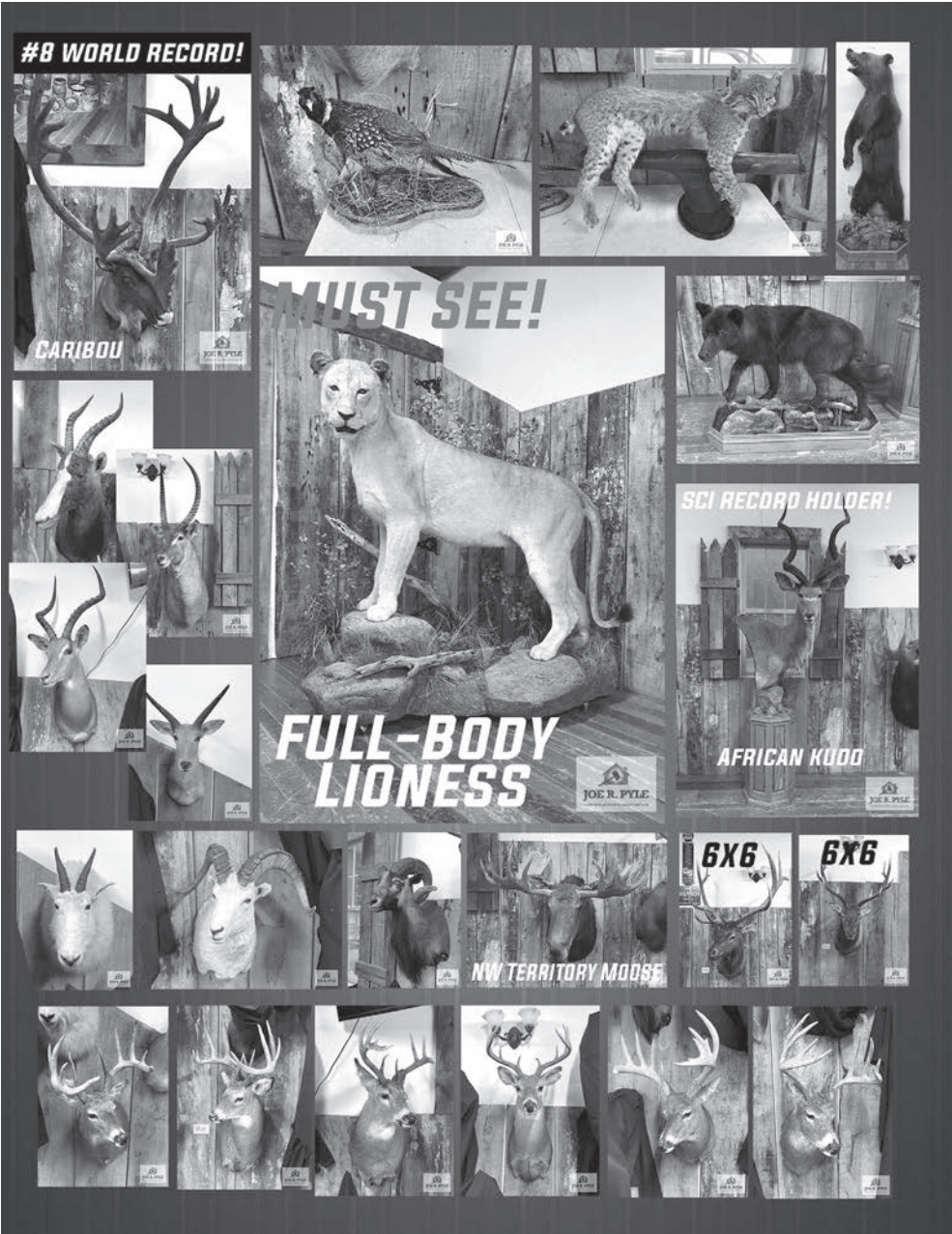
Vanard is an avid outdoorsman who travelled extensively both domestically and around the globe in search of a great trophy. His collection features high-grade left-handed sporting rifles and shotguns and an impressive collection of exotic animal mounts. His passion for conservation spanned many decades as evidenced by his long history of support for organizations such as NWTF, Safari Club International, Friends of the NRA and more.

Both have commissioned Joe R. Pyle to sell items from their extensive collections; Munnell has consigned a large assortment of custom rifles chambered in “wild cat” and proprietary cartridge akin to those made famous by the serious shooters who seemingly always sought a few more feet-per-second of velocity and a few more foot-pounds of stopping power. Vanard’s item include a menagerie of game mounts from around the world.

Firearms in this auction include many left-hand models by Blaser, Mathieu Arms, Kimber, and Benelli. Some of the more notable custom rifles include an FL Neuber Austrian Sporting Rifle built on modified 1893 Mannlicher receiver and chamber in 7x57, a Max Heim Hereen Falling Block Varmint Rifle chambered in .224 Ackley Belted Express, and an H & R (FN) Custom Rifle M-300 8mm/.300 Dakota. The catalog for this auction is stuffed to the gills with custom rifles but also lurking in the pages are rare and desirable “stock” firearms including a Mannlicher-Schoenauer Model 1910 Carbine (first year production), a Winchester Model 71 “Long Tang” Deluxe in .348 WCF, a spectacular Caesar Guerini Magnus 12ga, a H. Krieghoff Pre-War Side-Lock Side-by-Side 16ga, and a Fred Adolph Handmade Prototype Over/Under 12ga. Even deeper is a huge selection of Remington and Winchester pump action shotguns in various gauges, barrel lengths, and configurations.

The sweetheart that will steal the show is the full body lioness mount (an animal harvested by Mr. Vanard using the Sako-action custom bolt action pistol in .360 Imperial Mag that is also offered in this auction). She’s truly a must see item and probably one of the best executed pieces of taxidermy you’re likely to ever encounter. Other taxidermy items include a mount of a Caribou that holds the #8 spot in the world record book, a NW Territory Moose, a full body Inland Grizzly mount, a full body Black Wolf mount, and many more.

The full catalog is open now and available for pre-bidding. The live auction will be conducted in a socially distant manner on Feb. 20 at 71 Auction Drive, Jane Lew, WV with online bidding available. Charms

Victorian women also favored silver, hollow, “puffy” heart charms set with precious stones or engraved with sentimental inscriptions. Many also found delicately detailed “mechanical” ones, with tiny moving mechanisms like winding handles or whirling wheels, delightful.

Individual gold or silver Victorian charms, depending on their rarity, weight, and design, may cost several hundred dollars each. Complete, single-themed bracelets, featuring sets of engraved gold discs, semi-precious mounted gems, or British half- sovereigns, cost considerably more. Personalized ones, pairing hollow hearts with fish, clam shells, and crescent moons, say, may be quite costly as well.

Toward the turn of the 20th century, Tiffany & Co, a luxury jewelry store based in New York City, introduced their first charm bracelet, a link chain featuring a single, iconic signed heart. Since then, the company has produced more luxurious charm bracelets as well.

Through the coming years, many purchased modest gilt silver or gold charm bracelets featuring bright enamels, or jingling jumbles of mixed metal charms. Others preferred bright, inexpensive chain-link bracelets featuring enticing orangeade, root beer, or apple-juice-hued Bakelite charms.

Well-to-dos, however, often commissioned exquisite, gold, white gold, or platinum chain bracelets (or necklaces) from prestigious jewelers like Cartier or Van Cleef & Arpels. Many of their delicate charms, ranging from candlestick telephones, horse-drawn carriages, and mechanical rocking horses to motor cars and helicopters, were lavishly adorned with seed pearls, gemstones, or diamonds.

After World War II, when servicemen brought locally made, souvenir trinkets to their near and dear, enterprising American jewelers began creating charms of their own. Soon, charm bracelets were found everywhere.

Furthermore, as pocket watches fell from use, their convenient fobs were often re-purposed into unique bracelets. Those representing fraternal organizations, like the Freemasons, Elks and Odd Fellows, were also re-purposed.

By the 1950s, charm bracelets had become essential fashion accessories. In

addition to lucky four-leaf clovers, horse-shoes, and stars, many women chose ribboned gift, diploma, or wedding cake charms to mark holidays, births, graduations, engagements, or marriages.

Others, year by year, received lovingly chosen charms to mark birthdays or anniversaries. With each addition, their rope or cable chain bracelets became heavier. They also reflected their lives. Take, for example, an heirloom bracelet featuring a gem-marked Zodiac calendar charm, a Greek sorority letter, piano, Cape Cod house, articulated Old Lady in a Shoe (chock full of children), articulated slot machine, bike with turning wheels and moving handlebars, Alaskan scrimshaw fish, working gold whistle, and a cubed dollar bill charm labeled “in case of emergency.” Its owner evidently lived a charmed life!

There were so many charms to choose. Costume jeweler Walter Lampl, for instance, crafted over 700 gold and silver signed models, each a miniature work of art. In addition to his signature keepsake lockets (some with lock and key) and romantic repousse, engraved, or enameled puffy hearts, Lampl offered something for everyone — storks, baby strollers, pencil sharpeners, diplomas, articulated record players, springing mini-mouse traps, Aladdin lamps, and even a windup music box charm.

Though charm-wearing waned toward the end of the 20th century, nearly every American woman has found a couple of charms tucked away in a trinket box or has inherited a charm bracelet of her own. As a result, collecting them has become a rewarding, exciting past time. Rare, handmade vintage charms and charm bracelets are not only highly collectible, but very costly. Yet thousands of others, found at yard sales, antique shops, estate sales, auction houses, and across the Internet, are well within reach.

Besides, charm bracelets are back in style. Standard holiday, seasonal, and personal interest charms abound. Those seeking truly unique creations, however, may opt for contemporary, handmade moons, stars or hearts. Wearing these trendy, ancient hand-shaped symbols, explains noted artist and jeweler Lisa Scala, promise protection and good fortune. They also make charming gifts.

Collectors, eager to learn more about charm history, styles, and market values, may find Charms and Charm Bracelets: The Complete Guide by Joanne Schwartz, Robert N, Schwartz, et al, of interest. This profusely illustrated, comprehensive guide also features a glossary, explanation of metal markings, bibliography, a glossary, and user-friendly index.
