Pot lids: When lithography met ceramics

Beginning just after the First Industrial Revolution, which lasted in England from approximately 1760–1840, modern lithography swept England and its manufacturing industry.

It collided with chemists and other individual inventors who were producing and packaging their own lines of medicine, pharmaceuticals, and household, ladies' cosmetics. The golden years for these cottage industries were the late-Victorian Era through the early 1900s, approximately 1880-1910.

These early items were sold in ceramic pots with decorated lids. The decorations were applied to the lids through the application of a glaze over a transfer print on paper.

The process of transfer printing on ceramic wares, which had its origins in the 1750s, was taken to its logical conclusion in the mid-19th century by George Baxter when, in 1835, he adapted transfer lithography to the ceramics industry. Transfer lithography, or the process of color printing on paper and its transfer to ceramics, employed four different color plates (blue, red, yellow and black) that created polychrome decorations and designs that, until the Industrial Revolution, had only been attainable by hand painting.

Felix and Richard Pratt, who founded F & R Pratt in Fenton, Stoke-on-Trent, England, in the early 1840s, first applied Baxter's transfer process to pot lids. The Pratt brothers along with Jesse Austin, a noted English artist and engraver, collaborated to create hundreds of transfer designs and artwork. Pratt's pot lids, in collector circles, became known as "Pratt types," and represent some of the most sought-after pot lids produced.

F & R Pratt, along with T. J. & J. Mayer (another manufacturer of high-quality pot lids) exhibited their unique line of wares at the Great Exhibition held in London in 1851. The Great Exhibition was the first in a series of "World Fairs" that served to celebrate modern industrial technology and design.

It is sometimes difficult to tell which potter made a pot lid since few lids were marked in the ceramic studio. merchandise in ceramic pots with lids marked the pots and lids with their own advertising and company names.

The transfer designs on pot lids often listed the manufacturing company's name and the contents of the pot, such as Pegwell Bay (a company that sold potted shrimp). Other companies advertised different manufactured items, and some lids were simply decorated with artist paintings of British landmarks, such as Anne Hathaway's cottage in

Shoppers of the 1960s and '70s were stuck on S&H Green stamps

Many people Baby Boomers remember going to the grocery store and getting S & H Green stamps along with their change after paying for their groceries. Those stamps would then be taken home and put into booklets.

"S&H" stands for the Sperry & Hutchinson Co., which Thomas Sperry and Shelley Byron Hutchison established by in 1896. S&H Green Stamps became the most popular trading stamps across the United States. S&H Green Stamps were found in many households from the 1930s to the 1980s. But it was during the 1960s and '70s these stamps reached their peak.

According to Greg Hatala's 2013 article, "Made in Jersey: S&H Green Stamps: in the sixties, Americans were stuck on them." S&H was printing three times as many stamps as the U.S. Postal Service at the height of its popularity. And their rewards catalog classified among the lead-






ing single publications in the country. According to Greg's piece nearly 80 percent of American households collected Green Stamps during the 1960s and 1970s. These little green postage-like stamps were dispensed by several retailers to reward for shoppers for their loyalty and draw new customers into the stores.

Once the stamps were collected into booklets, those booklets could be exchanged for things such as china, linens, sporting goods, furniture and more.



Grocery stores, gasoline stations and other retail establishments purchased the stamps from S&H and then presented them as bonuses to shoppers. The number of stamps given a customer hinged on the dollar amount of the transaction. The perforated stamps came in values of one, 10 and 50 points. As shoppers accrued the stamps, they pasted them in their S&H booklets. Each booklet included 24 pages and it required 50 points to fill a page, so each filled booklet totaled 1,200 points. Shoppers would swap their full booklets for premiums-redeeming them from the local Green Stamps store or the catalog. Items from the catalog were given a value based on the number of filled stamp books needed to acquire it.

Recessions during the 1970s decreased sales of green stamps, and as the value of the rewards fell off rather substantially during that same period, requiring either far more stamps to get a worthwhile item or spending money for an item that was **Below:** Was this stuff ever in style? barely discounted from the price at regular stores, creating a general downward spiral as fewer and fewer people saw them as worth the trouble.

Andy Warhol even got into the act show-casing S&H Green Stamps. His life-long attraction with ready-made, reproducible imagery is expressed in creating his S&H painting.

Today S&H Green Stamps are certainly obsolete for use in today's everyday life; but have found new life in the lives of collectors, eBay sellers offer S&H memorabilia on their sites, from the stamps themselves to booklets and Ideabook catalogs.

Fashion and style will highlight Nye Estate Treasures auction

Huang Huali chairs take high bids at John Nye auction

BLOOMFIELD, N.J. — An exceptional collection of rare Chinese export chairs, with impressive provenance, took center stage at Nye & Company Auctioneers Estate Treasures sale, held on Jan. 20 and 21. Commanding a staggering \$221,400, against a high estimate of \$50,000, was a pair of George II Anglo-Chinese Huang Huali side chairs that had ornately carved splats, lion head knees, claw feet, and compass seats. They were one of a group of three similar lots that were closely comparable to a set of chairs that appeared in an important painting of the Gough family by William Verelst, dated 1741. All three lots were described by John Nye as, "fabulous, rare with great quality, beautifully carved, and weighed a ton."

The second lot in the group of 18th century Anglo-Chinese Huang Huali chairs was also side chairs with the same style details, but differed primarily in that they had caned seats. They brought an outstanding \$159,900. The sum of \$116,850 was paid for a third lot that consisted of a single armchair of the same likeness and period. All hailed from the prestigious estate of Robert K. Johnson of Maine and South Carolina.

While the sale was diverse, it resonated across the board with high-quality items by featured artists and craftsmen, strong provenances, and prices that consistently performed well past expectation. "We sold everywhere to everyone," said Nye. "The high quality of the merchandise, combined with realistic but tantalizing estimates, attracted educated bidders and it was one of our best sales. He noted some particulars concerning the sale that departed from the norm. "What fascinated me about this sale was the global interest in items that are typically regionally oriented. For example, an American sterling silver tea service, made in Baltimore, sold to China."

The set he referenced, made by Jenkins and Jenkins, was a wedding present to the Baltimore society beauty, Eleonor Laurenson Myer Simpson Young, from her aunt, Mrs. Edwin F. Abell of Baltimore. It had an overall floral repousse with flower finials, was monogrammed on the bases, and was offered with an S. Kirk and Son sterling silver water pitcher for a total of \$6 400

Contemporary chairs included four Robert Venturi Chippendale chairs, produced by Knoll International, 1984/1985. The modernistic interpretation of period Chippendale design, with pierced splat and fan back, was made of laminate on plywood with leather seats and achieved a hefty \$18,450. An iconic 20th century modern chair, "Standing Ovation," by Pedro Friedeberg, was branded on the underside and brought \$12,160.

Highlights among the furniture selection included a George III mahogany

secretary from the late 18th century, England. The attractive ormolu-mounted fall-front secretary commanded \$22,140, going well beyond the mark of \$1,000 to \$2,000. A George III mahogany architect's desk from the same period had an adjustable ratcheted top with a bookrest, flanked by candleholders on each side, all mounted above a retractable writing surface and drawers. The unusual piece fetched a handsome \$11,070, against a high estimate of \$2,000.

Decorative items featured a pair of English, 19th century three light ormolu-mounted crystal candelabras. They were highly presentational and attributed to John Blades, the renowned London glassmaker who was often commissioned by British royalty. Estimated at \$1,500 to \$2,500, the stunning pair far exceeded that amount to achieve \$9,840.

Pot Lids

Stratford. Scenes from William Shakespeare's plays, battles of the Crimean War, and other European historical landmarks were also commonly painted and transferred to pot lids.

These decorative pot lids were quite popular in England and throughout the United Kingdom. Since collectors became interested in pot lids, nearly 4,000 different designs have been found, and every year a few more are added to this growing collectible field.

Historians believe the artwork on Victorian Era pot lids help trace a social history of Victorian times, depicting scenes of importance to Victorian women, including decorative styles and designs depicting living conditions, clothing, and family units.

Ceramic pot lids were produced in three sizes (3 inch, 4 inch, and 5 inch diameters), which allow collectors to search for identical scenes on all three sizes of lids, making for rich, textured pot lid collections.

While pot lids existed for only a short period of time, they have been called "the pinnacle product marketing component" for the late-Victorian Era, sug-

gesting these small, round lids served as the marketing basis of advertising products for nearly 30 years. Collecting pot lids as a hobby began in the 1890s as Victorian ladies used these ceramic pot lids as wall decorations. Today, Victorian Era pot lids are competitively sought at auctions and bring high prices.

Novice collectors, who desire more information on collecting Victorian Era pot lids, may want to read Pot-Lids and Other Coloured Printed Staffordshire Wares: Reference and Price Guide by K. V. Mortimer.


