

Pick a candidate and jump into political collectibles

When most antique and flea market dealers are asked whether they have political campaign memorabilia for sale, they typically think of pinback buttons sporting the names and likenesses of admired presidents from recent years, such as Ronald Reagan and Barack Obama.

But political collectibles consist of millions of items issued in support of candidates for all elected positions throughout the nation's history, ranging from clothing buttons celebrating George Washington's inauguration to ferrotype tokens with Abe Lincoln's image to sunglasses that proclaim, "I Like Ike."

The diversity of items is perhaps the most exciting aspect of collecting political memorabilia, followed closely by the limitless supply of materials. Every four years, hundreds of thousands of new items are created during the presidential campaign: the race between Joe Biden and Donald Trump was no exception, with eBay and flea markets full of political pins, flags, stickers, facemasks and more for each candidate, created and distributed despite the pandemic.

The best part for hobbyists is when a previously unknown presidential campaign banner, ribbon, or button from 100 or even 200 years ago emerges from an attic or desk drawer somewhere and is made available online or through an auction. And, for the truly committed, local campaigns for Governor, Congress and Senate are waged regularly, and even more potential collectibles are produced.

Since pinback buttons are at the heart of political collecting, most new collectors begin with a handful of buttons they've picked up along the way or inherited from a relative. From there, they tend to follow one of three directions:

They accumulate everything they can find and afford from every candidate for public office (though many

focus only on presidential aspirants).

They search for items from candidates in a specific category, such as everyone who ran for Governor of their state, or every Republican presidential candidate from the 20th century;

Or they select one candidate and collect all they can find related to that person, whether it's a book, a balloon, sheet music or a postcard.

Of course, no one approach is better than another, and many advanced collectors mix and match their collections among many specialties. It's all determined by personal preference and budget restrictions. But depending on which direction you head, where you look plays a large role in your level of success. For instance, if you're gathering every political item you can find, you won't go wrong at flea markets and antique shows (unless you uncover reproduced material, which I'll cover later).

If you're more selective, you're usually better off at collectible shows that focus on political Americana, such as those sponsored by the American Political Items Collectors (APIC). This non-profit group has chapters nationally that hold more than two dozen local and regional meetings each year, and a national convention every two years (the next is planned for Nashville in late July). The APIC also produces a glossy magazine for collectors, and a monthly newspaper that includes a schedule of events (for information on joining APIC, see the email address at the end of this article).

What differentiates political collecting from many other collecting specialties is the responsibility assumed by owners of historical memorabilia to preserve it for future generations. Many museums that feature political items on display borrow them from private collections. And since buttons and related items are particularly susceptible to damage from sunlight, heat and humidity, a prize collection can become practically worthless, both financially and historically, if it isn't well cared

for.

One issue that tends to stump new collectors is learning the difference between similar items that are valued substantially differently. For example, a 7/8-inch red, white, and blue John F. Kennedy lithographed pinback

button that pictures his head with the words, "For President," is common and valued at \$3. A similar sized red and white button with the words, "Shoemakers for" above Kennedy's head is

Springfield Antique Show shines bright 1 year after lockdown

SPRINGFIELD, Ohio — The weekend of March 19-21 was somewhat of a landmark date in Ohio, as it represented nearly one year to the day when the state shut down for COVID.

Jenkins Promotions, like all large show promoters, saw its show series halted for most of 2020. By July, Jenkins was able to restart the series, and while certainly rocky, the outcome has been laudable. Now, one year after the pandemic abruptly changed the antiques industry, the Springfield shows are a testament to how large antique events can get back on their feet.

No doubt, the weekend's near-perfect early spring weather helped attract attendees. Saturday morning opened at the Clark County Fairgrounds to 48-degree temperatures and a virtually cloudless sky. By noon, temperatures had hit 60-degrees and jackets came off. The hundreds of shoppers were obviously enjoying the fresh air and sunshine, while the outdoor vendors were benefitting from the traffic. Everyone seemed upbeat, and to be cliché, the air was figuratively and literally, full of excitement.

While it was a smaller show, outdoor booths were spread along three thoroughfares flanking a pair of interconnected buildings that housed the inside venues. At one of the first spots along the main pathway was Grandma's Collectibles from Athens, Ohio. With no shortage of shoppers in his booth, owner Chuck reflected, "It's turned out to be a super day. The crowds really came out." Among the wares drawing attention were a pair of duck decoys for \$15 and a small collection of vintage airplane models running \$25 to \$40. In the

adjacent both, Tim, also from Athens was a bit more cautious. "OK comes to mind," he stated. Yet, it was only 10 a.m. and with alluring prices like \$14 for a 20-inch Silver Mill Brand Frozen Food can and just \$4 each for 70s-era Playboy tankards, his sentiments likely picked up as the day went on.

Four booths away, the owners of North American Resale from Dayton, Ohio, were selling merchandise as fast as they could put it out. Center-stage was a complete mid-century modern blonde wood living room set anchored by a boomerang coffee

Heirloom seeds are blooming bright for gardeners

It's not just your imagination that freshly picked, sun-ripened tomatoes don't taste like they used to. For that matter, neither do peas, corn, nor beets. As it happens, there's a reason fresh produce is often lacking in something. But thanks to the Heirloom Seed Project, an important fund-raising arm of the Landis Valley Village & Farm Museum, this could be your year to grow tomatoes, as well as pumpkins, beans, and a variety of other vegetables, that taste as great as you remember.

Landis Valley Museum dates to 1925, when brothers Henry K. and George D. Landis opened to the public a single-building exhibition featuring their collection of old tools. Their hope to preserve the heritage of Pennsylvania Germans grew into a living history museum in Lancaster, Pa. Years later, in 1986, photographer (and volunteer) Lee Stoltzfus suggested to then-farm manager Stephen S. Miller that the gardens of the 104-acre site should not only be beautiful but also historically correct. Volunteer gardener Nancy Pippert was enlisted to join the cause, and the museum's administration and the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission (administrators of Landis Valley) were persuaded to support the establishment of an heirloom seed bank.

A call was put out for gardeners to share their bounty: seeds harvested in the fall and stored over the win-

ter in basements (and nearly forgotten corners of freezers) until planting time the next spring. The response was enthusiastic, no doubt due to a com-



table, all priced for \$785. Out in front, a 40-inch lighted and working Dippitydoo's ice cream shop sign sat ready for a buyer with \$525 and a big chunk of wall space.

Across the aisle was Melanie who drove three hours from Temperance, Mich., to set up at the show. The Springfield "regular" complimented the show's attendance, saying, "There is a tremendous flow of customers, way better than I expected." She quickly added, "The cool morning temperatures haven't slowed things down a bit." Her merchandise was eclectic and the pricing very reasonable, like the pair of 1950s patriotic coin bank dolls for \$38 and a 70s-era globe upon a weather station base for \$39.95.

Along the east side of the building sat about a dozen dealers, including one who outfitted his booth to attract springtime buyers. Staged together front-and-center was an early 20th-century double wash-tub for \$195, a "flower bed" made from a doll's bed filled with artificial flowers, and a perfect accompaniment to it all – a large vintage wicker basket filled dozens of seed packets priced five for \$1.

Antique tool vendors are a common sight at Springfield shows, many of whom offer tools exclusively. This time, tool sellers were conspicuously packed with buyers, enough so that it was often difficult to get near the tables. One of them, a vendor on the west side of the building, was stocked with all manner of antique block planes, both wood and metal framed. Pricing of \$65 to \$75 was typical.

As shoppers browsed, regular announcements were made regarding social distancing and required masking. Perhaps it was because vaccinations had reached the age 40 group in Ohio, but only about a half of all attendees (and vendors) were masked. Outdoors, that didn't seem much of an issue; inside, things were more disconcerting as it was often close quarters and uncomfortably crowded, making distancing difficult. Nonetheless, those packed buildings further affirmed how happy people were to attend the show.

One of the dealers inside, a 26-year veteran of the show, Fred from Columbus noted, "The crowd is great. It feels like Extravaganza." His booth, like so many, was filled mainly with smalls, including diecast cars, glassware, and assorted advertising pieces. Not far away was Brenna from Springfield. She and her family had sold at the show for about 15-years. "The attendance seems back up to pre-Covid," she stated, adding, "There are lots of buyers and plenty just shopping." Her booth was filled with toys, games, and other smalls, like a box of mini Barbie dolls priced at just \$1 each.

Whether indoors or out, furniture was in somewhat short supply at this event. It appeared as if vendors were being a bit cautious, focusing on smalls that, no doubt, made it easier for them to set up and take down. One of the few sellers offering large

er pieces was Roadhouse Antiques from Springfield. Co-owner Beth said, "It's been a great weekend so far." When asked what merchandise was selling, she indicated, "It's been a little bit of everything; primitives, Victorian antiques, and Arts and Crafts pieces have all been moving." She pointed to spool cabinets and wood cabinets as being particularly popular. Yet to sell by Saturday afternoon was a circa 1904 painted blanket chest for \$395 and an early 20th-century bow-front Victorian china cabinet, also for \$395. Among the few other large pieces of furniture spotted at the show were a circa 1830s dough box for \$900 and a 1900s-era dresser for \$395.

For those interested in upcoming Springfield events, the next monthly show takes place April 17-18. The big date for your calendar is May 14-16, which brings the next Springfield Extravaganza and what could be up to 2,000 vendors to the fairgrounds.

ZIP code provides clue to dating of plush Mack bulldog

Q I have a plush, standing Mack Truck bulldog. One cloth label reads: “DESIGNED EXCLUSIVELY FOR MACK TRUCKS.” A second cloth label has two Big Top tent silhouettes above “Animal Fair, Inc. / Chanhassen, Minn © / 55317 / HAND WASHABLE” beside which is a text block that begins with “CONTENTS: / ALL NEW MATERIAL / SHREDDED SYNTHETIC / FOAM.” The bulldog has a light brown (tan) body, a yellow crown on its head, blue eyes, nose, and mouth, and a red ribbon around its neck. I believe it is scarce. Can you tell me when it was made, what the production run was, and how much it is worth?

A Let’s start with the basics. “55317” is the Zip Code for Chahassen, Minn. Zip Codes were introduced on July 15, 1963. Your stuffed toy was made after this date.

Mack Truck celebrated its 75th anniversary in 1975. Although I found no confirming evidence on the Internet that your stuffed Mack Bulldog was part of the 75th anniversary souvenirs Mack Truck created, the concept remains in the “realm of possibilities.”

A Feb. 1, 2017, article by Richard Crawford entitled “Stuffed toys were made in Chanhassen, ‘By George!’” notes that George Grooms, an artist who worked for Collegiate Manufacturing in Ames, Iowa, founded Animal Fair, Inc., in 1960. Animal Fair, Inc., would produce thousands of George’s plush animal creations. Animal Fair, Inc., was located on 78th Street in Chanhassen in a building that now serves as the High Timber Lodge that is part of Country Inn and Suites.


Girl Scout troops and school groups raised funds by selling stuffed plush animals created exclusively for them by George Grooms. Henry the Dog, with a small storybook attached to his neck, and an assortment of furry animal friends were Animal Fair, Inc.’s top sellers.

In the 1970s, George Grooms sold Animal Fair, Inc., to Guy Shoennecker. He gradually moved the majority of production to China. China created the “skins” which were sent to an Eden Valley, Minn., plant to be stuffed. The showroom and warehouse in Chanhassen closed in the 1980s.

Your plush Mack bulldog dates between the late 1960s and the mid-1970s. No manufacturer or retailer ever releases production run information. My best guess is that production ranged from the mid-hundred to low thousands. As a result, your stuffed Mack bulldog is common rather than scarce.

Determining how it was distributed requires additional research. It may have been a giveaway to a person who visited a showroom to look at a Mack truck or purchased a new truck. Mack also sold advertising merchandise.

A search on WorthPoint.com revealed 74 listings for “Mack Truck stuffed bulldog.” The majority sold through on eBay between \$15 and \$30. I did not find an image that exactly matched your bulldog in this



search. Using “Animal Fair Mack bulldog” as a search string, I found a 1971 Animal Fair Mack bulldog. It was not a match to your plush Mack bulldog.

The fact that I was unable to find an exact match does not discount the fact that your plush Mack bulldog is common. It has a secondary market value between \$20 and \$25.

Q I recently purchased a codfish weathervane for \$170 from the estate sale of a New England antiques dealer. The seller told me the codfish weathervane dates from 1900. The weathervane appears to be made from copper and painted over (rather roughly) with serval coats of gold paint. The previous owner added a heavy, more modern iron display base. The piece displays nice, and I have no intention of selling it. I would appreciate your thoughts on its authenticity, age, and approximate value.




A Let’s begin with a question you did not ask: “Did the seller lie about the age?” The answer is yes. Your weathervane is a 1960s decorator reproduction. It was made from molded copper. I found several unpainted and painted examples when I searched WorthPoint.com.

It is common for sellers to paint and otherwise falsely age reproductions (exact copies) and copycats (stylistic copies) to allow them to suggest (a polite term on my part) an older date of origin. My guess is that the only place this weathervane ever appeared was in an owner’s den or living room

I wish more of my readers would tell me what they paid for something when sending me a question. Knowing the sale price allows for a high degree of interpretation. First, the sale price should have set off an alarm bell. An almost 125-years old period weathervane, especially one that exhibits outdoor use, does not sell for \$175. The asking price was a clear indication the seller knew the piece was much later.

Second, WorthPoint.com has multiple list-



ings for identical codfish weathervanes. Prices range from \$100 to \$150. One of the criteria of a “fair price” is a willing buyer and willing seller. You were a willing buyer and the seller was willing to sell to you. Since there are no fixed prices for antiques and collectibles, the \$170 you paid was “fair” at that moment in time. You paid slightly over the secondary market retail. Since you bought the codfish weathervane for display purposes and have no intention of selling it, my suggestion is to forget what you paid and simply enjoy the piece.

Q I have a souvenir booklet entitled “AMERICAN POLISH PARTICIPATION / NEW YORK WORLD’S FAIR 1939.” It is over 100 pages in length. The colored cover shows one of the fair buildings and features the American and Polish flags. What is it worth?



A The Polish Pavilion at the 1939 World’s Fair was located in the Government Zone. Jan Cybulski and Jan Galinowski were the architects. Poland spent approximately one million dollars on the building’s construction. Its 70,000 square feet included space for 11,000 exhibits. The Polish Pavilion opened on May 3, 1949, and marked the 148th anniversary of Poland’s first constitution.

The Court of Honor featured documents that stressed Poland’s democratic traditions. Another section called attention to Poland’s contributions to the settling of the United States. The building’s Hall of Science featured more than 200 Polish inventions and also stressed its maritime development. A bar, café, and deluxe restaurant were in a separate building.

The site also contained a bronze statue replica of King Ladislaus II Jagiello by Stanislaw K. Ostrowski, a sculptor, housed on a pedestal at the pavilion’s entrance. The Polish government in exile presented the statue to the City of New York in 1945. It is now located in New York’s Central Park. The Polish pavilion’s murals are currently housed at Le Mayne College in Syracuse, New York.

On Sept. 1, 1939, Germany invaded Poland. A day later over 10,000 members of the Polish National Alliance gathered at the Polish Pavilion to express their support for a free and independent Poland. The Polish government in exile kept the Polish Pavilion open for the 1940 season. When the New World’s Fair ended in autumn 1940, the Polish government in exile sent most of the artifacts to Chicago for storage in the Polish Museum of America. The pavilion itself was torn down.

Despite this great story, there is little collector interest in your booklet. Further, your copy is in fair to good condition. As such, its secondary market retail value is between \$8 and \$12.

Q Do old high school, college, law school, and nursing school diplomas and baptismal certificates dated from the mid- to early 20th century have any value?

A With the exception of family value, which is not a monetary value, the answer is basically no.

The possible exceptions are: (1) diplomas and baptismal certificates that belong to a person of national importance [valuable because of the name connection] or a major resident of a local community [possible value to a local historical society who will want them as a donation as opposed to buying them], (2) have a large vignette of an actual building associated with the institution issuing the diploma [of minor value to a local collector, a few bucks each at most], and (3) printed by a collectible lithograph company such as the American Banknote Company [a long shot at best].

Offer them first to the family. If no takers, try the local historical society. If this fails, contact the librarian at each of the institutions [another long-shot]. If these three avenues fail, consider the landfill.

THE POP CULTURE COLLECTIVE

Trade was brisk at DFW Toy Expo with deals to be made

As I mentioned in last month's column, pop culture trade shows are few and far between these days, thanks to a certain pandemic, but here I am once again reporting on a convention I got to attend. In fact, I not only attended — I set up as a vendor! And, not only that, I ran into a former AntiqueWeek cover feature writer!

The DFW Toy Expo was held March 6 in Arlington, Texas, at the Bob Duncan Center, a small, but inviting facility with a main room housing most of the vendors and a few side rooms. As (bad) luck would have it, I was placed in a side room. Table placement is critical at these types of events. A good, highly visible location with lots of traffic can result in double the sales or more over being stuck in the back or over in a corner or, worse yet, a separate, smaller room where certain less-observant attendees might not even venture into.

Despite my disappointing table placement, business was good and steady throughout the day, plus I made a couple of good trades. The day before the show, I raided my antique mall booth in order to load my car with toys and similar items that had been sitting there collecting dust for a year or longer. I figured they might sell if I put them in front of a new audience, and I was right. I also made sure to bring plenty of flyers for my booth to hand out at the show.

I ended up selling a wide variety of odds and ends, including some movie and TV tie-in paperbacks. I haunt used bookstores and thrift stores for these and often find them at half of cover price. For older books, this can mean they cost \$1 or less, and I will mark them up to \$3 to \$5 or more, depending on the popularity or cult status of the film or television show. I also sold a number of retro video games, Barbie catalogs, pop culture figurines, and some random odds and ends.

For the trades I mentioned, I swapped a Star Wars vinyl art print I didn't want for \$50 worth of video games (including Batman Returns, an excellent Super Nintendo game) to another vendor who was very happy to add said print to his collection. It had been sitting in my antique booth unsold for more than two years, so I'm glad it went to a good home. The vendor next to me had a Pac-Man plug-and-play new in the box for just \$10. I would have gladly paid that, but I asked if he saw anything on my table he'd like to trade for, and he grabbed a couple of common PlayStation Portable UMD movies he needed for his collection. Win-win!

There were a lot of newer items for sale at the show, including action figures, Hot Wheels, comic books, and homemade arts and crafts, but there was just enough vintage stuff to appease nostalgic buffs such as myself. A gorgeous boxed Star Trek U.S.S. Enterprise Action Playset was marked \$325. A vendor I spoke with about her Tron (1982) action figures and light cycles had a MAD Magazine board game for just \$10. Original new-in-the-package Return of the Jedi action figures were marked \$60 to \$80 each while unopened figures from two Star Trek shows—Deep Space Nine and Voyager—were just \$5 apiece.

Perhaps the strangest item I saw was a boxed Sandworm from Dune (1984), the epic sci-fi film based on the classic Frank Herbert novel. I didn't catch the price, but its appearance was...let's just say "phallic."

The highlight of the day was when my friend Rick Kelsey came by my table. He bought a British edition Peanuts paperback from me and was kind enough to send me a silly pic of himself with the book when he got home (since I for-




bination of family pride and a sense of history. As a result, the Heirloom Seed Project, 35 years later, boasts an inventory of more than 200 varieties of vegetables, herbs, and ornamentals.

Visitors to Landis Valley are encouraged to interact with costumed interpreters to learn the finer points of smithing, rug hooking, and open-hearth cooking. But they can also appreciate the beauty of six organic gardens, including two “display” kitchen gardens. All of the organic gardens are “biologically controlled” (“the good bugs eat the bad bugs”).

Thanks in part to farm-to-table restaurants and televised cooking shows, there is a resurging interest in heirloom varieties of vegetables, according to Joanne Ranck-Dirks, coordinator of the seed project. Appearance takes second place to flavor, although less-than-perfect colors and irregular shapes have their own appeal among foodies, Ranck-Dirks explained. “People turn to heirloom seeds

for flavor,” this coming from a lifelong gardener who tried, as a child, to cross her mother’s daylilies.

Gardeners choose heirloom seeds with confidence, the project manager said, knowing their crops will be dependably successful — and delicious — from one year to the next. With the current pandemic, she continued, an interest in gardening is on the upswing. Thinking about her regular customers, she noted, “We’re seeing the names of new people, names never before on our list. We’re experiencing a sudden rush of orders.”

As for the seed bank, the entire collection is rotated every four years, with some varieties less than that, one notable exception being the peas (“we can’t keep up with demand”). Seeds are refrigerated during storage, and all seeds are subjected to germination testing, with a success rate of at least 85 percent but a goal of 90 to 95 percent. All of this is conducted in the 19th-century “Seed House,” one of 50-plus buildings on the museum property that now boasts an inventory of more than 100,000 artifacts (not counting seeds, of course). Seeds (primarily vegetables, but also including flax from Holland) are sold by mail, with

an order form that can be downloaded from the museum’s website.

The list of offerings varies somewhat from year to year. New this year are two tomatoes, the “Anna Lee Ault” (donated by its namesake from Bristol, Ind., and declared the “best-tasting tomato”) and the “Heart of Gold” (a staff favorite, a large, blemish-free yellow heart-shaped tomato that ripens early and continues all season), as well as “Landis Lettuce” (“a beautiful Lancaster County lettuce from the early 1900s”).

For the adventuresome, there’s the “Black Brandywine Tomato” (“a deep reddish-purple color inside and out”) or its “cousin,” the “Yellow Brandywine Tomato” (same zesty flavor in a bright yellow beefsteak-type vegetable). Traditionalists might select the “Mortgage Lifter Tomato,” developed by M.C. Byles of West Virginia, who sold tomatoes to clear his mortgage in the 1930s, or the “Belgian Beauty Tomato,” a staff favorite.

Not to be missed are “Dr. Martin’s Pole Lima Beans,” “Grandma Hershey’s Sugar Peas,” and “Fortna White Pumpkins,” fine specimens in their own right, but with backstories that make them even better. Top them off with “PA

Dutch Buttered Flavor Popcorn,” dating back to before 1885, “an heirloom variety grown by the Pennsylvania Dutch” that “matures in 105 days, with four to six ears of small, creamy colored kernels.” Hmm. Just in time for Halloween.

Fortune telling machine predicted at \$5,700 bid at Fontaine’s

CANAAN, N.Y. — “I purposely made this an eclectic sale,” said Ralph Fontaine two days before an auction in Canaan. “I put in everything that sells from Mid-Century Modern and model trains to gas pumps and art pottery.” True to his words, categories were as small as two and as large as 20. Bidding was available by phone, absentee or on the LiveAuctioneers website.

Fontaine kicked off the sale with fireworks: 16 lots of antique Oriental dinnerware. He cautiously estimated these lots and just about everything else in the sale at \$50 to \$1,000. Nine of the 16 lots exceeded that high estimate. The top dinnerware lot of 25 cups, saucers and dinner plates, about half damaged, sold for a jaw-dropping \$3,300.

Of the 37 lots of sterling and coin silver, a six-piece sterling silver tea set by Theodore B. Starr silversmith, New York City (active 1907-1918) came in first at \$2,520. An ungraded 1904 \$20 gold piece sold locally for \$2,160.

There is a lot of money and cache in Louis Vuitton. The sale’s smallest category consisted of an LV umbrella and a steamer trunk. The umbrella with a Palm Beach, Fla., label brought \$1,920. The large steamer trunk monogrammed “JEP” with travel labels from around the world sold locally for \$6,600.

Despite competition from dozens of gasoline and auto dealer signs, a rusty Texaco gas pump with its original hose and pump and damaged globe took first place at \$1,560 in this category.

The price leader for Mid-Century Modern from the nine lots of this category was a gateleg “Maria” table by Bruno Mathsson that folded for easy storage. Possibly a mid-century reproduction of the classic 1936 table, it sold to the internet for \$1,250. The Maria was also the top furniture lot.

Before the sale, train collectors bid on every train set in the sale online. Opening bids reflected the intense presale interest. The winner at \$5,000 was an eight-piece set of five passenger cars, two engines and one tanker all wrapped in Lionel paper in their original boxes.

Bidders seemed leery of many of the signed photos of baseball players, but trusted Topps card #471. Mickey Mantle’s mug was on the front and a recap of his career up to 1961 on the reverse. The encased card sold to the internet for \$375.

Some lots defied categorization. There

was only one Peerless Solar Horoscope Fortune Teller complete with gypsy grandmother figure that for 10 cents dispensed a card outlining the customer’s fate. Made by Peerless Weighing Vending Machine Corporation, in working condition and with an ample supply of horoscope cards, the 77-inch machine sold for \$5,700. There was also only one album of 130 photos and autographs of movie and television stars from the ‘30s and ‘50s. The collector’s granddaughter who consigned the multi-page album was pleasantly surprised when it sold for \$2,880.

The sale’s top lot was hardly an antique. A 2005 Nissan Titan pickup truck with 79,000 miles on the odometer sold for \$10,000.

worth at least 50 times more. As with all collectibles, the bottom line is rarity. Many more of the first example were made than the second. Yet rarity doesn't necessarily mean old.

Pinback buttons that feature an image or words and are covered with a thin veneer of celluloid were invented in 1896 and used widely in that year's presidential contest between William McKinley and William Jennings Bryan (McKinley won). Yet, many examples of buttons manufactured for that campaign continue to sell for \$15 or less since so many were created. In the early 1920s, the invention of lithographed buttons that feature wording and images stamped directly on metal, allowed candidates such as Warren Harding and Calvin Coolidge to create millions of simple pinbacks, which continue to fill cigar boxes today and sell for \$5 each or less.

Conversely, buttons created in 2016 for Trump and Clinton delegates to specific events at their respective conventions, such as fundraising dinners with the date and location shown on the button, are held dearly by those who attended. That means their value is whatever the owner is willing to accept to part with their mementos, as well as what collectors are willing to pay if the buttons are offered at auction.

To be sure, there are several rules of thumb that distinguish less common buttons from those that are more widely available, no matter the year or campaign:

- The photos of both candidates for president and vice president on the same button. These are called jugates, and can be tough to find, especially from the 1930s and earlier.
- The presidential candidate is sharing billing on the button with another candidate, such as someone running for Congress, especially if both of their photos are shown. Again, the older, the better.
- A specific date of an event is shown, which usually means the button was made in limited quantities.
- The candidate's image in what appears to be a tintype surrounded by brass, which is called a ferrotype. It's usually the size of a quarter and was used in the late 19th Century before celluloid buttons were invented.
- Advertising for a product or service, such as the slogan, "Buy Fred's Hats and Vote for Taft."

Of course, each of these is subject to the golden rule of collecting: rarity and demand. A Biden or Trump button that was made in large quantities and sold through a website or at an event, even if it carries all these attributes, likely won't have much value for many years since so many were produced.

Many of these rules also apply, in principle, to other political collectibles, such as ribbons, posters and textiles. And they're all affected by condition.

One of the crown jewels of political collecting are buttons created in 1920 featuring the images of James M. Cox for president and Franklin D. Roosevelt for vice president, which have sold for more than \$50,000 in mint condition. But an example with surface cracking and stains was priced \$2,000 at a show early last year and failed to sell. The lesson is that most political buttons can be found in very good to excellent condition, so collectors don't have to settle for those with foxing (brown water marks on the image), cracks or surface bumps.

Nothing dampens the fun of collecting faster than finding out after the fact that you've purchased a reproduction. Fortunately, Congress enacted the Hobby Protection Act, which makes it a crime to recreate political campaign items without marking them as repro-

ductions. Sadly, some items were made before this bill became law in 1975, and they still turn up. Of course, some unscrupulous dealers have been known to scratch off the reproduction mark on the curl of fake buttons and resell them as authentic. And eBay has been plagued with foreign sellers who recreate rare 19th century political ribbons and textiles and sell them as legitimate. And while eBay and other auction sites have been a boon to finding rare political items, it's also been a source of disappointment for many collectors who purchased seemingly rare items, only to discover later that the items were plentiful, or part of a commemorative set issued years after the campaign.

One way to avoid questionable items to take advantage of APIC projects that

have identified most reproduced buttons and other fake or fantasy ephemera. There is a guidebook and website that APIC members can access, which is regularly updated.

Another way to make political item collecting fun is to focus on the candidates you like most. After reading a biography of Abraham Lincoln, Teddy Roosevelt, or Harry Truman, for example, their campaign items may take on extra special value, since you can relate them to specific events in history you've read about.





