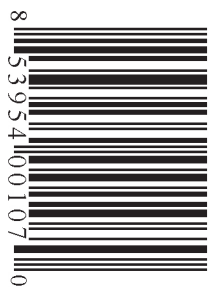

## Sunbeam's Mixmaster still beating up the competition

You probably know one by sight; a sweeping arc of white, made of tough-stuff American steel that U.S. manufacturing was known for. Their electric motors sounded powerful enough to drive a small fishing skiff, and many still run as strong as ever. Those Sunbeam stand mixers — Mixmasters as they were named — were the holy grail of kitchen appliances for decades.

Sunbeam started life in the 1890s as the Chicago Flexible Shaft Company making mechanical farm implements like sheep shears. In the early 20th century, the company transitioned to making household appliances including a popular line of electric irons. The name "Sunbeam" arose from a contest to rebrand that burgeoning home appliance line.

Introduced in 1930, the Mixmaster was the world's first mixer featuring two interlocking detachable blades. Attachments like a meat grinder and juicer were added to expand the machine's capabilities. The Mixmaster was so popular, that even during the Depression Sunbeam sold hundreds of thousands of them.

The Mixmaster M4 series, the first sold to the public, hit retailers around 1931. The inaugural model went through several enhancements. Accessories like the juicer added the next year with models M4F and M4H. A three-speed M4J model, introduced around 1933, was the first with a handle, allowing the head to be removed for use as a hand mixer. The speed control was also moved to the rear of the unit.

In 1935, Sunbeam introduced the Model 1, with a more versatile 10-speed motor and a fan in the housing's front to cool it. There was also a smaller-scale 25-watt, one-speed children's version which offered two mixing bowls and most of the accessories available on the full-size mixer.

The influence of Art Deco industrial design appeared on the Model 3, introduced in 1936. The front grille was redone in streamline style, with vertical open-

ings, while the patented speed control, known as the Mix-Finder Dial, showed aviation inspiration. Four years later, the Model 5 strutted modernist elements that would adorn several later units. Vent openings went horizontal, and two color schemes — white, with white bowls and cream, with jadeite bowls — were offered.

Model 7 came out just before World

War II, the first Mixmaster featuring a handle-based beater ejector. Production was halted during the war, then restarted in 1946, and the Model 7 continued as Sunbeam's bellwether product until the 1950s.

The jet age Model 10 came out in 1950 sporting fins and a new front grille. An adjustment lever for bowl size was added to the base and clear glass bowls were

adopted. This was the first model available in chrome. Model 11 added popular mid-1950s colors like pink and turquoise and had a round-vented front grille, a design feature that lasted for more than a decade. By 1957, an enhanced Model

## Racing material crossed the finish line at Vicary Auctions

DANVILLE, Ind. — Our society's love of the motor car is a given. When speed is added in; well, that's a whole new ballgame. Go one step further by adding the term "vintage" and collectors of all things fast pony up to have a look.

Vicary Auctions offered a fantastic, diverse selection of racing memorabilia during an online-only auction with the results being checkered flag worthy.

All genres of racing items were up for grabs from Indy car to NASCAR with some Sprint car items thrown into the mix. Actual pedal cars were for sale as were pit passes, race programs, and die cast cars with all items up for bids finding new homes.

Auctioneer and owner, Vic Pevler, loves selling vintage racing memorabilia because he is a racer himself. "I loved seeing the items in the two collections that made up this auction," Pevler said. One collection was mainly ephemera; the other had the racing cars, tether cars, etc.

Pevler also pointed out this type of material doesn't always come up for auction. "When a collector of such material passes away as was the case with these two collections, often friends who also collect are contacted and the material finds new homes in that manner. It was exciting to be able to offer the items of these two collectors at auction where everyone had a chance to buy."

The top lot of the day was a Miller Special pedal car by Graves Engineering of Southern California. This 1983 speedster was once owned by well-know collector in the field John LeBold of Perrysburg, Ohio, who died in 2020. In great condition, this racing red beauty sold for \$4,250.

"Around 30 years ago, Richard Graves of Long Beach, Calif., began

building these pedal cars, his inspiration stemming from the Indy cars built by the likes of racing icons such as Harry Miller in the 1930s," according to information found on [www.mecum-gallery.com](http://www.mecum-gallery.com)

Vintage toy and model cars also made a mark with a 1950s Yakazawa Sanyo Toy Co. large tin, litho Champion Racer Indianapolis-style race car crossing the finish line at \$2,100. The 18 1/2 inch long racer included a driver and rubber wheels and wore the racing number 98 and the words "Champion's Racer" on the car.

Also selling strong was the 1946 Dooling Brothers F Tether Car racer which sold for \$1,050. The car's original red paint on the magnesium body and pan was in good condition with some wear which is typically found in most magnesium cars, and this exam-

## Take a trip with Max Humphrey and decorate

Max Humphrey had me at the cover of his newly published book, "Modern Americana." There it was, a photograph of a room with an old pull-down map of the world hanging on the wall. Next to it was the kind of school clock I used to stare at in sixth grade, waiting for 3:25. Ah, nostalgia! If interior design is all about getting into your comfort zone (in a stylish kind of way), then I think he hit this one out of the park.

Born in New Hampshire and now living in Portland (by way of a cross-country tour as a bass guitarist in a punk band), Humphrey is an interior designer whose life story might, in itself, make for a good read. From the start, his childhood story is relatable to many: His

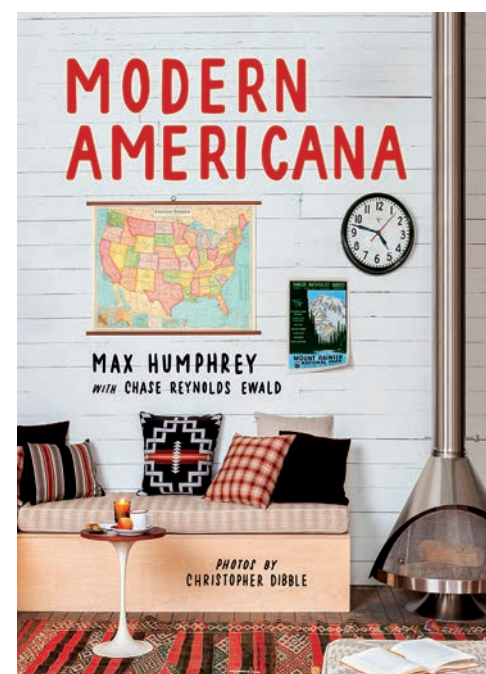
parents dragged their reluctant son through countless antique shops back in the day. He hated it then, but now he's inflicting a similar "punishment" on his kids. Just saying, kudos to Mom and Dad Humphrey.

As for the book, "Modern Americana" is a culmination of Humphrey's lifelong odyssey, all of which results in an easy read, even if you don't love, love, love every one of his ideas (but a bit about that later). Not surprisingly, "Americana" is very up-close-and-personal,

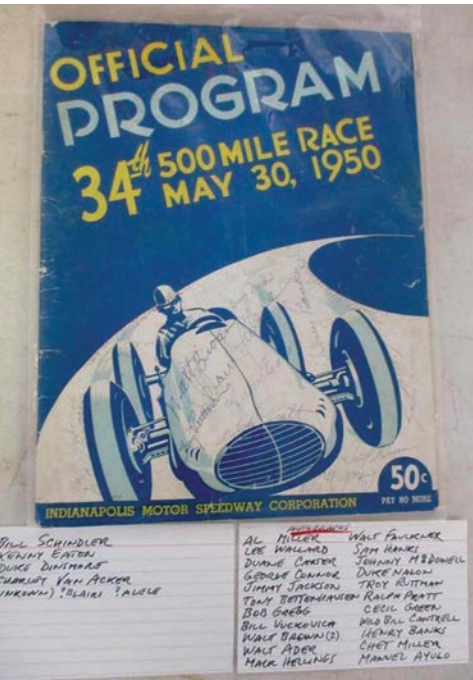

ple still retained its original Dooling wheels and tires. The car sold with a letter to the buyer from the seller at the time of purchase describing how to operate the car and also included its radius rods.

A fantastic Ron Fournier replica racecar; Riverside Special was a great buy at \$850. Approximately 17 inches long, this little metal racer with rubber wheels was impressed “Ron Fournier 067” on the metal in front of the red leather seat.

According to [www.joiechitwoodcollectibles.com](http://www.joiechitwoodcollectibles.com), these 1947 midget race cars are “rare and seldom show up for sale. Ron Fournier is Mr. Metal fabricator and his career spans over 50 years. Ron started with Holman and Moody in 1964. Since then he has worked for racing greats Rodger Penske, AJ Foyt, Kar Kraft, and Bob Sharpe Racing. In 1991, Ron and his family founded Race Craft after receiving countless awards for his metal fabricating books, tool patents, and metal fabrication training films and videos. Ron’s cars are not powered, the detailing and finishing are second to none, and they are made like the real race cars by hand.”

Loads of racing ephemera rounded out this racing memorabilia auction hosted including an autographed program from the 1950 500 Mile Race which sold for \$220. Racing greats

who autographed the program include, among others, Al Miller, Walt Brown, Cecil Green, and Sam Hanks.

Sporting great graphic were the three 500 Mile Sweepstakes tickets that sold together for \$180. The years on the tickets were 1948, 1949, and 1954.

“Overall, it was a great auction with great material being added to new collections,” Pevler said.

even though Chase Reynolds Ewald is credited as a contributor, and the book wouldn’t be half of what it is without the photographic genius of Christopher Dibble.

Humphrey begins with what might well be his Ten Commandments of design (“design is nostalgia,” “DIY”), before moving into the meat of the book, divided into chapters with breezy titles such as “Sitting, Snoozing, Standing Around,” “Thrifty,” and “Stick’em Up.” The author suggests we read his book front to back, back to front, or just a little bit at a time. My first time through, I went with the former.

But just as there are no rules as to how best to appreciate his book, there are no strict guidelines to be followed when it comes to decorating. In the course of the book, we learn a bit about Humphrey’s preferences: He likes brick walls, brass accent pieces (preferably those allowed to mellow), and subway tile, while he abhors accent pillows that have been “karate chopped” and paint-by-number pictures of clowns. Some of his ideas are a bit too “outré” for me: He embraces the idea of a tattered Persian rug, and even though I’m onboard with the “lived-in look,” I’m thinking maybe not. Similarly, layering leather hides on the floor is not my cup of tea. And for that matter, I’m not

sure about hanging a disco ball over a bathtub, although I realize that he had his reasons. Oh, did I mention this? Humphrey also serves as a stylist for furniture catalogs.

That said, let me get personal. For the last umpty-ump years, I’ve written “Vintage Style” for “AntiqueWeek,” a monthly column about using old things in new ways. Because I practice what I preach, I was particularly drawn to Humphrey’s examples of rooms that use, well, old things in new ways. Naturally, I’m fond of his using mismatched chairs around a table (including ones that have been painted

and repainted). I love that he sees beauty in wall art that might not be hung in a formal gallery (old cross-stitched samplers and wooden balloon molds, for example). I, too, have an affinity for anything gingham or plaid, as well as rocking chairs that move without going anywhere. I applaud his using old ice chests as “coffee tables” on the patio. And although today’s smarmy signs drive me nuts, I connect with his using old advertising pieces to fill a wall.

As inviting as some of his pictured rooms

are, though, I suspect that Humphrey would be disappointed if someone tried to replicate them down to the last casually placed guitar. He reminds readers that decorating is ongoing, not the result of a finished process, and if space doesn’t have a bit of “stuff” in it, it’s just not going to work in real life. And who am I to argue?

# From Michael Jackson to windup toys Rich Penn will have it all

WATERLOO, Iowa — In spite of a Covid world impacting every part of our lives, collectors are still out there and hungry for treasures to feed their collections. Even though dining out is still limited these days, The Treasure Trove offered in the Rich Penn May 14-16 auction will certainly tease the appetite of any collector. A truly multi-course feast of delicious items to satisfy even the most voracious of appetites.

With nearly 2,000 lots, there will be a massive “buffet” of collecting treasures. Start with about 500 lots of toys. And Buddy L toys provide the main course, including over 250 lots for pressed steel collectors. Many are meticulously restored. The Toy Buffet has over 150 lots of tin windups along with more cast iron toys. The selection will include many from prominent late 19th and early 20th century toys makers.

Buddy L pieces cover the gamut; trains, tugboats, tressells, trucks in every likeness, even a K-Reproductions Roundhouse. There are enough pieces to start your own Buddy L industrial city set-up.

Wind-up toys bring out more rarities. A General Butler wind-up (Ives), even at 140 years, can still walk!

This three-day event will be packed with outstanding variety on all three days. As always there’s a great selection of country store and soda fountain items. And for Coca-Cola collectors, there’s a massive collection; soda machines, porcelain, tin and cardboard signs, rare calendars, toys and novelties. A variety of other

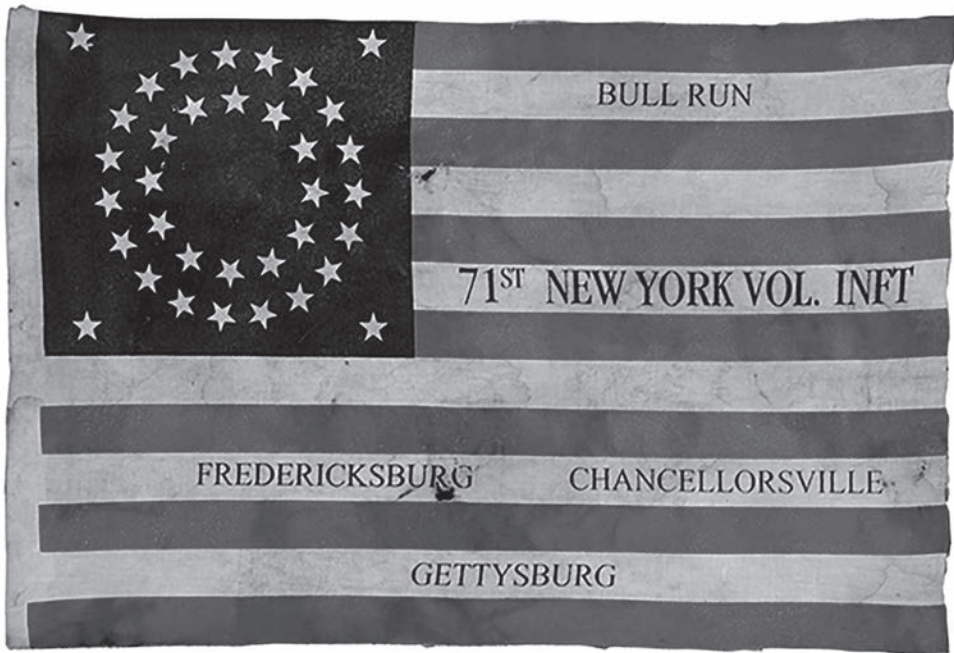

soda advertising is also included. For collectors of Breweriana, there are early trays, signs and a whimsical variety of the figural “Blatz” guys enjoying manly pastimes.

Cruising from the Saloon to the Auto Shop, there’s more in the Automobilia category; porcelain, metal and light-up signs, clocks, thermometers and miscellanies. And for the collector of smalls, coins are easy to collect and enjoy. No building on to the house or garage required for these! There are several hundred, mostly silver coins, including Morgan dollars, Franklin halves, Washington quarters, and Mercury and Roosevelt dimes. For currency aficionados, a nice consecutive serial number run of \$50 bills in UC condition. There are other interesting currency lots from Europe, Asia, South America and even Cuba!

If your inclination is to have a vending machine over just paper currency and you like to enjoy a favorite soda, here’s a rare opportunity. Whether it be Coca-Cola, Pepsi, 7Up, RC, Root Beer, Orange Crush or even coffee, milk or juice, there’s a vending machine to satisfy your thirsty taste. Nearly all are in beautiful, restored condition. According to Penn, “This is the largest and nicest collection of soda machines we’ve had the opportunity to market in

over a decade. There are some fabulous machines here!” The assemblage of vending machines covers just about every category; soda, candy, gum, cigars, cigarettes, matches and even condoms.

Perhaps the most interesting collection offered in Penn’s May auction is the Michael Jackson collection. This group of about 100 lots comes from Jackson’s personally anointed

“Maker of Dreams,” Rob Swinson. Swinson was the contract manager for building many of the rides in Jackson’s Neverland Valley. Swinson was a close friend of Jackson’s and wrote a book memorializing his time and work at Neverland. While there Rob became good friends with Michael and was gifted many of the pieces that

# Celebrate money during National Coin Week

Every coin or piece of paper money in your pocket, wallet, or purse has a story to tell about history, and the stories will be celebrated by collectors nationwide during National Coin Week ([www.NationalCoinWeek.org](http://www.NationalCoinWeek.org)), April 18-24.

It is sponsored by the non-profit American Numismatic Association ([www.money.org](http://www.money.org)) to focus attention on “the historical, cultural, artistic and economic importance of money as well as the enjoyment of coin and paper money collecting,” according to the National Coin Week coordinator Andy Dickes.

The theme of the 98th National Coin Week is “Money, Big & BOLD.” It was inspired by this year’s 100th anniversary of the last time the United States Mint produced two different designs of silver dollars for circulation in the same year, 1921.

Morgan dollars were minted between 1878 and 1921 and are named after their designer, engraver George T. Morgan. Peace dollars struck between 1921 and 1935 are a symbolic representation of hope for peace following the end of World War I. The United States Mint will be striking special 2021-dated versions of the historic Morgan and Peace design silver coins for collectors. “Over the centuries, the designs, denominations and metallic content

of coins can tell us a great deal about civilizations, past, and present, such as famous and not-so-famous political and historical figures, important events and landmarks,” explained Dickes. “There’s no coin shortage during National Coin Week.”

The American Numismatic Associa-

tion is providing complimentary online educational programs as well as hobby-related games and quizzes for children at [www.NationalCoinWeek.org](http://www.NationalCoinWeek.org). Between April 18 and 24, new members can join the association at special discount rates of \$5 for an online-only membership and \$20 to receive

the print edition of the Association’s award-winning monthly magazine, The Numismatist. National Coin Week, observed every third week of April, was established in 1924 to attract the general public to the enjoyable hobby of coin collecting.



# Greyhounds have been racing into collectors’ hearts

On a list of the fastest land animals, the greyhound is listed as the 14<sup>th</sup> fastest. A greyhound can sustain a speed of 39.35 miles per hour with a top speed of 45 miles per hour, which is faster than a mule deer. It is the speed of this breed that has made it a favorite dog among humankind for nearly 8,000 years.

The ancestors of the greyhound were some of the first domesticated dogs. They were prized for their speed and hunting abilities. Drawings of greyhounds, or their distant relatives, have been found on temple walls dating to 6,000 BC in Turkey, and in Iran a funerary vase from 4,000 BC was decorated with images of early greyhounds.

# Greyhound

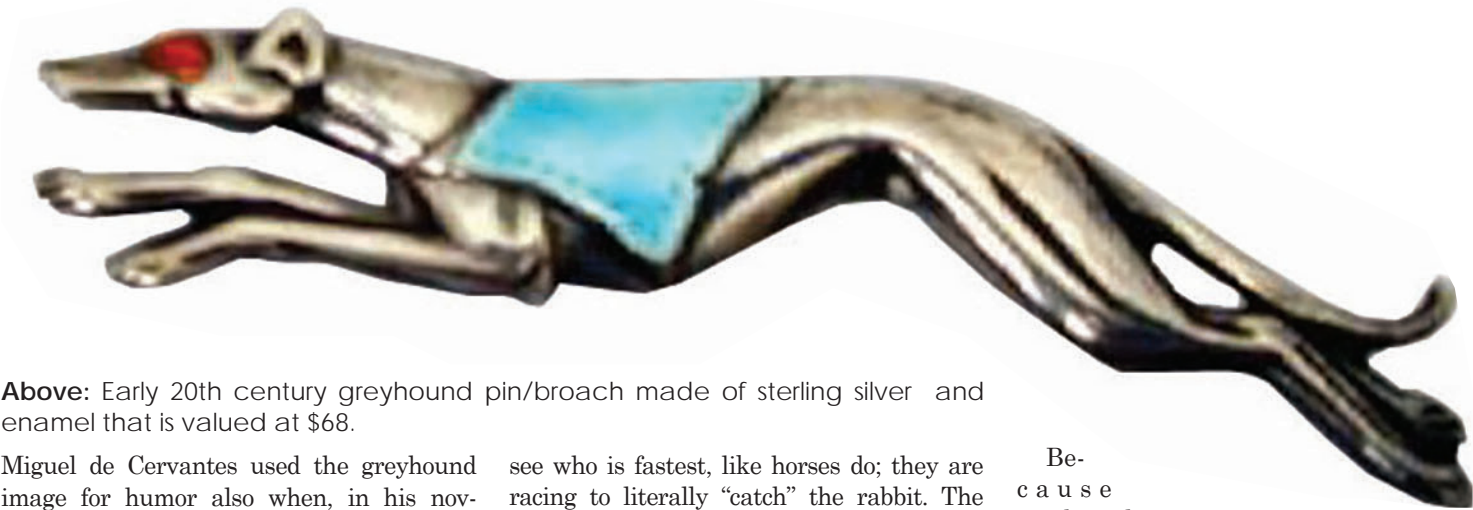

The exact origin of greyhounds has been difficult to pin down. Experts even argue over the dog’s name. Some scholars trace the term “greyhound” to the old English “grighund,” which literally translates to “dog hunting” or “hunting dog.” Until greyhounds were used as racing dogs, they were exclusively bred as the fastest hunting dogs on earth. The Celts believed that greyhounds originated in Greece and called them “Greek hounds.” This was then shortened to greyhound. And finally, the simplest explanation is that the original color of greyhounds was grey — hence “grey hound.” All of this tends to indicate that the greyhound can trace its beginnings to the semi-arid regions of North Africa.

In ancient Egypt, greyhounds were used in hunting and kept as companions by rich Egyptians, including pharaohs, who often had their live dogs entombed with them upon death.

Since hunting has, at least until 200 years ago, been considered one of the sports of kings, greyhounds have often been associated with royalty, especially European royalty. Once, from the 11th to the 14th centuries, English law decreed that no “mean person” could keep a greyhound. In the law, “mean” meant “common” or “poor.” The penalty for breaking this law was death!

In today’s culture, the most widely recognized greyhound is the fictional character Santa’s Little Helper from the cartoon television series The Simpsons. Santa’s Little Helper exhibits many of the intellectual and behavioral characteristics of a greyhound.

Miguel de Cervantes used the greyhound image for humor also when, in his novel Don Quixote, the protagonist imagines that his flea-bitten cur of a mutt is a finely bred greyhound (then again, Don Quixote thought windmills were dragons). Perhaps the longest established use of the greyhound as a cultural icon is with the Greyhound Bus Company. The company’s logo is a racing greyhound, and even a talking version of it has occasionally aired on television commercials.

Greyhound fans are quick to point out that the greyhound is the only breed of dog mentioned by name in the Bible (Proverbs 30:29-31). Homer, Europe’s oldest known author, mentions Odysseus’ greyhound, Argus, in The Odyssey. And Chaucer in Canterbury Tales and Shakespeare in Henry V and Merry Wives of Windsor also mention greyhounds.

Greyhounds are the prototypical sight-hound, a hound that pursues its prey by sight rather than scent, which is why at races, a mechanical rabbit leads the greyhounds. The greyhounds are not racing to

see who is fastest, like horses do; they are racing to literally “catch” the rabbit. The greyhound is basically hunting as it runs around the track.

In the late 20th century greyhound adoption groups began springing up all over America. The earliest groups were formed out of a sense of concern about the treatment of greyhounds while living at racing tracks. These early groups began taking greyhounds from racetracks when they could no longer run and placing the dogs in adoptive homes.

It is estimated that prior to greyhound adoptive agencies, approximately 20,000 retired racing greyhounds were killed each year. Today, about 90 percent of National Greyhound Association-registered animals are either adopted or kept for breeding purposes; however, greyhound industry numbers still estimate about 2,000 greyhounds are killed each year when they can no longer race. Anti-racing groups in the United States put the death figure at closer to 12,000 yearly.

Not all registered greyhounds race. Some of the reasons why National Association greyhounds are not raced include the dog is too slow, the dog has physical defects, or the dog does not have the required temperament to race. Most greyhounds finish their racing careers between the ages of two and five years, so they are relatively young dogs still.

Because greyhound owners, especially greyhound rescuers, are so fanatic about greyhounds, they tend to collect almost anything associated with the breed. And there are many items to collect. Many porcelain figurines of greyhounds exist. Some are quite collectible items such as the ones from Staffordshire, England. There is even a Lladro greyhound piece (number 5855) that is valued at \$1,200. Many earthenware jugs feature greyhound handles or relief. Greyhounds were featured animals on many Art Deco items, including pottery and umbrella stands. And the 1920 Ford Lincoln sported a greyhound radiator ornament, which is quite striking. Other collectibles include walking sticks, old race cards, and even a Barbie Doll (Society Hound Barbie) by Mattel with a greyhound dog. And, while signs in good shape are not easy to come by (at least not inexpensively), many collectors yearn for a Greyhound Bus sign to hang center point in their collections. The striding dog on the sign epitomizes the finest features of the greyhound.

Whether you love greyhounds or simply are looking for a collection suited for a king, greyhound collectibles might interest you. You will have competition at auctions though, for greyhounds are clearly a favorite on or off the track.

# Sunbeam Mixmaster

12, also available in chrome or popular colors, offered 12 speeds.

In the 1970s, Mixmasters were reengineered, departing from a heritage of steel bodies in favor of plastic cases. Yet, time has proven those models to also be long-lasting and many are still in use. Models with an MM designation or a “1-” moniker (i.e. 1-7, 1-8) are from that era and feature electric cords that detach from the right side of the body.

By mid-century, Sunbeam was a household name and the Mixmaster brand was extended to a line of hand mixers, starting with a six-speed model in 1952. Throughout the years, Sunbeam made everything from waffle irons to coffee makers. As far back as the 1930s, Sunbeam offered a line of toasters — the most stunning was the arced T-9 model from 1939, drawing inspiration from the New York World’s Fair. In the 1960s, the modernist Vista line of appliances was introduced which included additional stand mixers, electric can openers, and blenders.

Sunbeam also expanded its offerings with acquisitions of several household brands in the latter half of the 20th century. The Osterizer came under their umbrella with the acquisition of the John Oster Manufacturing Company in 1960; and, in the late 1970s, it was the Crock-

Pot with the acquisition of Rival.

Yet, the Mixmaster was Sunbeam’s immortal product — so impactful, that in 1998, the US Postal Service dedicated a stamp in its honor. Sadly, as consumers’ preferences turned toward new and cheap, the public lost sight of the value of longevity and good engineering.

Many of these workhorses ended up in thrift stores and even 50 or 60 years later many of them still work just fine. Surprisingly, acquiring one of those dynamos may cost you less than today’s cheap substitutes. Perhaps looking a little worse for its six or seven decade wear, it’s not uncommon to find a solid condition 1950s-era Mixmaster in an antique store for around \$30 and half of that at a yard sale. Those plastic-bodied models from the 1960s and ‘70s can be found for less. The real victory is finding a mixer with its accessories such as juicers, meat grinders, and even drink mixing pieces were available at one time. A good set can raise the price three-fold. Keep an eye out for manuals and cookbooks to round out the collection.

Whatever you find, whether it’s a working model with just its beaters and bowls, or a more complete outfit rife with all the goodies, you are certain to appreciate it just like your mother or grandmother did. Even the most stubborn gingerbread batch is no match for one of these workhorses. And, it still be working when today’s cheap, big-box version is broken and its warranty expired.
