Artists of every sort have always found Moms to be fair game. There've been moms in song; in stories, on stage and on screen.

Those are the moms you've heard of. The famous ones. But at least once a year, every mom has her moment in the sun. That's when the second Sunday in May rolls around, and with it, our annual celebration of "all things Mom": Mother's Day!

Over the years, one of the most time-honored and heartwarming representations of motherhood has been the Madonna. During the 1940s and '50s, almost every well-known ceramic firm included a Madonna figurine in its spring line. Now collectors are drawn to these ceramics for their innate beauty, and their endless variations on a single theme, as interpreted by a wide variety of artists. Ceramic Madonnas serve as graceful, ongoing reminders that every day should, (at least in some small way), be "Mother's Day."

Although many view Mother's Day as a "modern" holiday, the custom has its roots in ancient times. There was an early Egyptian festival honoring Isis, "Mother of the Pharaohs," and March festivals in honor of the Greek mother goddess Rhea, and her Roman counterpart, Cybele, "The Great Mother." One ancient tradition has stayed with us to the present day: a gift of flowers as part of the festivities.

The rise of Christianity led to a Lenten observance honoring "Mother Church," (the home church in which early Christians were baptized). By the 1600s, this event had morphed into the English custom of "Mothering Day," which offered temporary relief from the austerity of Lent. Even servants were given the day off to spend with their families, and stringent Lenten fasting requirements were lifted for a day of revelry.

When the Pilgrims came to America, "Mothering Day" remained behind in England. Stemming from a dim Puritanical view of gaudy festivity, the idea of a specific "Mother's Day"

lay dormant in the United States until the mid-1800s.

The unlikely impetus in the renewed push for an American "Mother's Day" was Julia Ward Howe, best known for her stirring lyrics to "The Battle Hymn of the Republic." In 1870, distressed by the violence of the recently concluded Civil War, Howe issued a proclamation calling for a "Mother's Day" that would celebrate both motherhood and international peace.

Howe's initial suggested date for the observance — July 4 — garnered little support from those with other plans for the 4th of July. However, by 1873, 18 cities across the United States were observing a "Mother's Day" on an alternate date (June 2nd), their get-togethers paid for by Howe. Unfortunately, when the funding ended, so did most of the "Mother's Day" gatherings.

Howe's plan may have been shortlived, but, thanks to her fame, she gave a major boost to the modern concept of Mother's Day. Nearly concurrent, and perhaps even more important in the development of the holiday, were the efforts of less-famous Anna Reeves Jarvis. In 1858, Jarvis formed a group in West Virginia to observe

"Mother's Friendship Day". Her goal: to promote reconciliation between Union and Confederate backers. Following Jarvis's death, her daughter, Anna M. Jarvis took up the cause. Indoor Antique Advertising Show brought out buyers

INDIANAPOLIS - "It's a home-run, we knocked it out of the park," said promoter Damon Granger, calling attention to a record number of dealers and buyers for the semi-annual Indoor Antique Advertising Show at the Indiana State Fairgrounds.

The show was the fourth gathering since Granger took over its leadership in 2017, missing only one date because of Covid shutdowns last year. "Dealer and

visitor numbers have risen over 50 percent since our first one," said Granger.

Jim Maley of California displayed 12-inch-tall California

the show with Granger as promoter. As the event ended Maley said it was "better than I imagined," adding, "I'm planning to come back again."

It was a shorter trip for Myron Huffman, who drove to the Indy Show from Spencerville, Ind. He featured a 4-inch-tall 1905 Totem advertising tobacco can with a colorful Indian Left: An Ohio dealer, Kim Diamond, quickly sold this 6-inch-tall salesman sample tin advertising thermometer at the March event

and totem pole illustration. Although a mere 4 inches, it carried a tall collector price of \$2,500. Also measuring 4 inches tall was a 1910 Busy Biddy Spices tin at a more moderate \$150.

> Yet another Indiana dealer, Lavon Yoder of Shipshewana, pointed out a 28-inch-tall life-size wood and papier mache' sand paint pig advertising Beechnut Hams & Bacon tagged at \$7,500. Keeping Porky company on the same table was a near-same-size papier mache' animated nodding head red goose advertising shoes of the same name. The goose seemed to nod approval when a customer asked about the price, which was \$1,800.

Although many advertising items are flashy and colorful to attract attention, not all fit that category.

Classic vehicles tell the story of one man's collecting passion

SPRINGVILLE, N.Y. - Many of the sympathy cards received by the family after local businessman Jack White died in January noted "he was one of a kind." Fittingly, his May 22 estate auction in this small town, about 30 miles south of Buffalo, will be a "one of a kind sale" within the Buffalo region of the Empire State.

The 79-year-old White was the founder and past owner of White's Appliance in Springville, best known for his generosity, small town business support and jokes. A gregarious man, White was a fixture at area auctions, car shows, tractor and tool meets and numerous "cruise ins" over the years.

White began collecting at a young age, buying a 1930 Chevrolet when he was 19 years old. By the time he was nearing retirement age, he began really hitting his stride buying more cars, tractors, hit-and-miss engines, farm primitives (including several old wooden washing machines) and nearly anything else that caught his fancy.

"He claimed he never meant to buy them, they just followed him home," Beverly, his wife of nearly 60 years, says. "Jack could fix

pull off the tarps and take any number of his cars, tractors, engines and other curiosities to shows and outings throughout the area.

"You could see that they were very important to him," Rich Mason of R.G. Mason Auctions who is co-brokering the sale with United Auctions, said. "He took great care of them. All we had to do was take off the tarps, dust them off and they're ready to go. They're ready to drive home and they're in beautiful shape."

In what is considered a major collection in New York and beyond, the classic car segment of the sale offers several cars with extremely low mileage: a 1930 Ford one-ton stakebody truck (purchased from Earl Northrup of Earl's Restaurant in nearby Chaffee, New York), 1,653 miles; a 1941 Mercury Sedan Model 19A, a 4-door car with "suicide doors," 8,976 miles; a 1923 Chevrolet 4-door Touring Car, 1,148 miles; and a 1930 Ford Model A 5-window coupe, 13,041 miles.


For the sake of novelty, if not rarity, the sale will include a 1928 Ford Model A "Woody" delivery pickup (5.360 miles) and a custom-built "Woody" camper trailer. In these early days of production, Ford often supplied the chassis and then the trucks went to coach builders who built the body to meet the customers' need.

And there is much to talk about. White meticulously maintained and carefully stored his cars in outbuildings and within semi-trailers located on his property.





Strawberry farmer and 40-year advertising sign collector Bill Krohne from Dowagiac, Mich., offered an early 1900s painted two-panel 20 by 30-inch sandwich sign for Moore's Paint, tagged at \$900 and a 20 by 24-inch wood framed raised letter tin advertising sign for Dr. Daniels Horse and Dog Medicine, priced at \$1,400.

Catching many an eye at the show, was a 21-inch diameter 1950s neon animated spinner milk advertising clock brought by Greg Rosenak of Anne's Anteex, Peoria, Ill. Marked "sold" was a 24-inch-tall die cut 1930s advertising sign with a diving woman wearing the famous Janzen brand swimsuit. Rosenak was another dealer coming to the show for the first time with promoter Granger and said he was


CRCC Swap Meet to be held May 14-15

to Mason, who is also a third-generation car enthusiast and dealer. "The wood looks the same. I'm not positive that they originally came together, but we think it was some kind of package deal.

"The cars in this sale are true classics. There's not a rough one in the bunch. This is one of those rare sales where you can find what you remember from your childhood ... what your dad, an uncle or your grandfather drove."

Although Mason knows the technical and production facts behind the several cars to be sold, a more intimate perspective will also be included each car.

One of White's granddaughters, 26-yearold Juliana, was particularly close to her grandfather, accompanying him to many of the auctions, cruise ins and other automotive events. One of the cars was purchased in Maine, near the U.S. Canadian border, another from Colorado, and another "just down the road 15 miles," according to Beverly White.

"Juliana was really distraught when Jack died in January," she said. "She went everywhere with him ... from since she was a young girl. She has written a letter for each of the cars, telling the new owner where the car came from, many of their experiences and just how special the car was to her and her grandfather.

"In her letter, she says 'please let me know what you plan to do with the car." She really wants to know where each car goes and what

But classic cars are only the tip of the iceberg at the White sale.

There are more than 30 antique tractors to be sold, beginning with true antique iron wheel tractors from the McCormick company to the more familiar vintage tractors from John Deere, International Harvester, Farmall, Massey Harris, Allis Chalmers and Minneapolis Moline.

Mason cites an Allis Chalmers Model G orchard tractor as a "very rare find," in addition to an uncommon Massey Harris Pony Tractor. Earlier iron wheel tractors include a McCormick Model F-12.

But the auction doesn't end at classic cars and antique tractors, there are numerous lots of car parts, power and hand tools, 15 hitand-miss engines, die cast toy and dealership model cars, an early German oak grandfather clock, Beverly's collection of 1,000 cookbooks from throughout the United States and overseas, trailers and cargo haulers and more.

"It's impossible to tell how many lots we have here, there's just so much," Carter says. "At times, we'll probably be running two rings. There are hours of uncatalogued, unadvertised items. That's where the real deals will be. We put about five hit-and-miss engines on the internet, but there's a collection of about 15 and they may be more desirable than what we've put online.

"Although we'll have about an hour-and-ahalf bidding time on the internet, there's at least five hours of car parts, antiques, tools and more. What this is, is an old-fashioned on-site estate sale. There's a lot of diversity and quality in this one-owner collection. It's going to be a sale like you seldom see these days."

ing — two for mothers.

Establishing Mother's Day as an officially recognized day of honor became Anna M. Jarvis' primary purpose in life. She petitioned anyone she felt might be of help - social and business organizations, prominent individuals, church groups, and governmental entities. In 1914, President Woodrow Wilson signed legislation proclaiming the second Sunday in May as Mother's Day.

However, having ceded control of "her" holiday, Anna became increasingly displeased with the way others used - or, in her opinion, misused it. When the trade publication Florists Review gleefully exulted "this is a holiday that can be exploited," Anna was incensed. Legal grappling occupied her later years: a 1923 suit to stop a Mother's Day observance . . .a 1930s "disturbing the peace" citation, for disrupting a flower-selling venture by the American War Mothers. . .a 1934 campaign against a postage stamp featuring the words "Mother's Day," framing a portrait of "Whistler's Mother" . . . and an ultimately unsuccessful attempt to copyright the term "Mother's Day" itself.

Jarvis's major foe was the flower industry, for whom Mother's Day proved a welcome sales bonanza. According to Anna M., florists were "charlatans, bandits, pirates, racketeers, kidnappers, and other termites." Ironically, it was the industry she railed against that assisted the aging, cash-strapped, health-challenged Anna: unknown to her, the Florist's Exchange paid for her care. Anna M. Jarvis died in 1948. Although she was childless, Mother's Day, the child of her imagination and determination, continued to flourish.

Envisioning Mother's Day as a non-commercial celebration, Anna M. Jarvis was in the minority. Next to Christmas, it's the biggest holiday of the year for gift purchases. In recent years, the National Retail Foundation has estimated that Mother's Day purchases bring in \$14 billion annually. Of that amount, nearly \$2 billion is spent on flowers. Almost \$700 million goes toward greeting cards. There's about \$3 billion spent on dining out, \$2 billion for jewelry, \$1 billion or so for clothing, plus plenty left over for "other" (which probably includes lots of boxes of chocolates).

Commercialization, however, can't diminish the unique, and quite sincere tug Mother's Day makes on our heartstrings. Those racks laden with greeting cards would not exist if there were no market for them. It's Mom's special day, and we want it to be perfect.





tally, make extremely affordable display items. They're just right for the second Sunday in May, or any day of the year. Especially desirable are vintage cards from the 1940s and '50s, many accented with velvety flocking, tiny "jewels", or bits of real ribbon and lace surrounding their illustrations of festive nosegays and overflowing floral baskets. Group them together, to highlight their variety. Or showcase them with a single ceramic Madonna, surrounded by fresh flowers, in a sprightly celebration of spring. You may even want to put together a display for Mom. She will, as always, thank you effusively.
