Beads provided art for Native American textiles

Beads of all types of long played a role in decorating Native American items. In times gone by, each of their beaded creations began with a hunt — acquiring buffalo, deer, mountain sheep, or elk hides. Soaking, cleaning, stretching, and softening (sometimes with boiled animal brains) transformed them into pieces of pliable leather. Many were sinew-sewn into clothing like leggings, dresses, and moccasins. Others were fashioned into lightweight, portable personal effects like saddle bags, pipe bags, belts, and bow cases.

Wearing or using an animal skin symbolized the spiritual bond between the animal, who surrendered its life, and the Native American, who depended on it for survival. Thus, beautifying a dressed skin not only benefitted the wearer, but also honored the animal's sacrifice.

Native Americans crafted beads from natural materials at hand, like bones, claws, and animal teeth, using them as ornamentation and in trade. Over hundreds of years, Eastern Woodlands tribes also fashioned beads from hard-shelled clams. Strung together or bound into belts, these served in storytelling, as ceremonial gifts, and as visual symbols of historic events, tribal treaties, status, and political

Across the continent, along rivers and streams where porcupines made their homes, women also adorned moccasins, pipe bags, war shirts, and more with uniquely Native American quillwork — a variety of embroidery-like patterns created from stitched, plaited, twisted, or woven dyed, needle-like porcupine-quills.

When white traders introduced large, coarse, lusterless, European beads known as "pony", however, quillwork styles began to change. Scores featured decorative pony bead edgings or arcs. Others featured traditional quillwork-style square, triangle, and diamond designs worked in pony beads. All were created by stringing beads strung on animal-sinew thread through hide-holes laboriously bored with thorns, sharpened antlers or

Quillwork was largely abandoned in the mid-1800s, when pony beads were replaced with fine, flattened Czech "seed" beads. These shiny bits of glass, available in a variety of sizes, not only allowed easy coverage of broad areas. Their bright hues white, rose-red, blue, green, "greasy yellow," and many others, also inspired more fanciful, detailed designs.

Native American beadwork pieces dated prior to the 1860s, whether featuring nat-

urally dyed quillwork or beadwork alone, are extremely desirable. Yet their function, quality, rarity, design, and condition greatly affect their worth. Though missing quills, discoloration, mold, water damage, tears, loose stitching, holes, or bead loss may lower their value, age-acquired patinas are sought seen as proof of use. Even so, prices vary greatly. In 2015, for exam-

ple, Heritage Auctions sold a Sioux Spontoon tomahawk with beaded buffalo leather hide drop for \$87,500. Recently a Sioux beaded and guilled hair ornament realized

As seed beading swept through the cashless Native American society, beadwork, valued for its long hours of labor as much as its beauty, came to symbolize

After a one-year shut down; Allegan was back in full swing

ALLEGAN, Mich. — Picture-perfect weather combined with buyers and sellers eager to be back out buying and selling helped create a successful first show of the season for the Allegan Antiques Market on May 30.

"They came to spread their wings," said promoter Larry Wood as smiling shoppers stood by the gates, ready to enter the fairgrounds for the season-opening show.

Closed for a year because of the Covid pandemic, people were in an upbeat mood while adhering to some restrictions by county and state health

Some folks used the Covid downtime to their advantage. "My wife used the break to get her PhD in antiques," said dealer Bruce Bunn, pointing to his wife Barbara, who took the full Ashford Institute of Antiques 6-month computer-based study course from their home in Grandville, Mich. The couple filled their booth at the Allegan show with more than 20 antique quilts, priced from \$30 to \$229, along with assorted sewing items. Two tiny 8-inchlong hand-crank cast metal sewing ma-

\$75 each. Twelve-year veteran Allegan dealer John Bogolin once again traveled 300 miles from Cleveland, Ohio, to set up at the May show and displayed a pair of 1910 Jacobean style gesso-based table lamps with hand painted mica shades that could grace your home for \$295. Many people checked out his colorful

It was a shorter drive to the fairgrounds for Duane Hampsten of The Watch Works in Portage, Mich. The repair and restoration dealer showed off more than 60 timepieces at the show. Many people stopped to admire his 1890s Swiss-made minute-repeater triple calendar 18k gold pocket watch

which could keep you on time for \$10,000. For home use, a Seth Thomas mantel clock with scarce Aventine-white finish, circa 1910, could grace your home for \$225.

Small, highly desirable antiques were among the offerings of 10-year-dealer Dave Pryce of S.D. Pryce Antiques, Grand Rapids, Mich. A 6-inch-long brass wood and steel English black

them. The ones with one word: "Thankful," "Dream," or "Gather." The saccharine-y ones: "This is my happy place," "You are my sunshine," and "Live, laugh, love." And then there's my

personal favorite, "No fussin', no cussin', no backtalkin'." Ugh. Thank you, Dr. Rick, for tossing that one into the trash can.

If you google "vintage signs," or go into a brick-and-mortar shop that specializes in accessories for the home, you're sure to be treated to a vast array of platitudes and wisecracks to affix to the walls of your home. Ready for hanging, these signs are often meant to look as though they've been personally hand-lettered on distressed wood, salvaged from an old barn, or shed. You know the look. Far from being unique, it's more likely that they've been cranked out within the past year halfway around the globe and imported by the gross. As an aside, I find it rather ironic that someone would purchase one such sign that advises "Collect moments, not things," but that's beside the point.

I see these "vintage" wannabes and they make me cringe. But here's the good news: By using old things in new ways, we can freshen up our living spaces without ac-ramics bearing mottos. Most notable is a cumulating things that lack any real value, objects that are destined for your next yard sale or, worse yet, the landfill. Before embarking on a trip to an antique shop or mall, though, follow the advice of a vintage-inspired friend of mine who recom-



mends first shopping your own home.

To this end, I looked around. I have several hand stitched pillows and framed samplers prominentdisplayed, and indeed, a few more might not be a bad

thing. I've long admired "Home Sweet Home" samplers, probably about 100 years old now. What I didn't know is that they started popping up nearly 200 years ago, when a song called "Home Sweet Home" caught fire on the opera stage and provided inspiration for stitchers. Similarly, on a well-chosen antique outing, you can pick up needlework made by someone else's Grandmother with similar sentiments including, but not limited to, "Bless This House," "Peace to Those Who Enter," and even "Malice toward None/Charity to All." I think a grouping of these (and similar samplers) would look great in an entrance hall. Because I wouldn't be too picky about the skill of the crafter nor the condition in which the work is found, a collection such as this one shouldn't break the bank. Of course, extra points if you know who worked it.

Upon closer inspection, in addition to textiles, I found several examples of cepiece of mid-century California Cleminsons pottery that I can't remember not having around. A hanging wall pocket in the shape of a skillet, it has a "Pennsylvania Dutch" flavor, thanks in large part to a distelfink. As for the words, it reads "Them that works

hard eats hearty." And then there is the sampling of a former collection of beer mugs made in Baltimore by the Edwin Bennett Pottery Company that continue to produce a snicker more than 100 years later ("Ain't it hell to be poor?").

But maybe decorating with words of wisdom that inspired previous generations doesn't count.












powder tester, circa 1790, could be taken home for \$950. At the same spot, a 5-inch-tall 1913 bronze and white metal tabletop lighter, shaped like baseball player Honus Wagner, could grace your dresser for \$950.

Also from Grand Rapids, Eric Bernard filled his booth with antique cast iron kitchenware items priced from \$25 up. He offered a no. 2 Griswold early 1900s 6-inch skillet for \$1,050, while a no. 50 gem pan was offered for \$775.

In some cases, items of local interest found their way to the fairgrounds and were sold at the show. Dealer Cory Johnson offered two large 1920s colorful mint condition advertising sign cloth banners from his grandfather's locally owned Cook Oil Co. service station in downtown Allegan, which closed years ago. The banners, with an illustration of a service station attendant pouring denatured alcohol into a vintage automobile radiator, measured 30 by 50 inches each and sold quickly. They were tagged at \$450 each.

Johnson lives in the home of his late grandfather, who started the business Johnson said he discovered the banners in the basement, carefully wrapped in a plastic bag and obviously stored away many years ago.

Still another local connection came with dealer Damon Granger of Traverse City, Mich., who set up at Allegan with wife Angela offering antique advertising signs.

Granger, who hosts the twice -a-year Indoor Indianapolis Advertising Shows, was approached at the Memorial weekend show by an Allegan resident who said his family owned a local hardware store years ago and had two 1950s Winchester guns and ammo new-old-stock tin signs. The resident wondered if Granger was interested in purchasing them. The two met later in

the day and made a deal which Granger said, "made both of us happy.'

While Granger completed the deal, advertising sign collectors checked out his unusual triangular 1800s clothing store porcelain 18-by 14-inch advertising sign priced at \$750.

As the show ended, Wood said he was "glad to see old friends, both dealers and shoppers, back on the fairgrounds enjoying the day,"

Because of health restrictions some booths were spaced apart more than usual. The Allegan Antiques Market, located midway between Kalamazoo and Grand Rapids, is held the last Sunday of each month during the warm-weather season.

Truman Presidential Library reopens after two-year renovation

INDEPENDENCE, Mo. (AP) — After nearly two years of renovations complicated by COVID-19 restrictions, the Harry S. Truman Presidential Library and Museum is ready to welcome visitors back with an updated focus on how Truman's legacy resonates today.

The museum opens to the public July 2, with hours and visitor numbers initially restricted because of pandemic regulations.

Visitors will find a museum completely reimagined during its most extensive renovation since it opened in 1957 in Truman's hometown of Independence, Mo., an eastern suburb of Kansas City. The nearly \$30 million project includes a sparkling new entrance; many more artifacts, photographs, videos and films; and exhibits that encourage visitors to touch and interact with displays.

One solemn gallery showcases Truman's first four months in office, some of the most consequential months in U.S. history. Germany surrendered, the U.S. dropped nuclear bombs on Japan to end World War II, and world leaders at the Potsdam conference determined the makeup of the postwar world.

Nearly everyone knows Truman dropped the bombs, but his legacy was formed in the next 7 1/2 years of his presidency, when he set out to win the peace and put the world back together, said Museum Director Kurt Graham.

"If you focus only on the bomb, you miss the heart of his legacy. My job isn't to say he got everything right, but I think it's important for people, especially young people, to realize that Harry Truman had more influence on the world they have inherited than most other U.S. presidents," he said.

Graham said the museum, which closed in July 2019 for the renovations, was demolished "down to the bare studs." People who remember the old building will recognize little except a Thomas Hart Benton mural, some artifacts and a recreation of Truman's Oval Office, he said.

After starting in the new 3.000-squarefoot Grandview Hall entrance, visitors first see Truman giving a speech in 1945 when he was running as Franklin Delano Roosevelt's vice president. FDR died only 82 days into that term, leaving the world wondering, "who is this farmer from Missouri who is taking over the free world?" Graham said.

The exhibits try to answer that question. The first gallery shows Truman's life in Missouri before he entered politics, from his childhood on a farm to his service in World War I to his failed haberdashery and his connection to Kansas City political machine boss Thomas Pendergast.

The previous museum had showcased Truman's political life and presidency and the basement. Now, his story is told in a more linear way.

"Now you can truly weave through his boyhood into the presidency and beyond," said Kelly Anders, deputy director of the

The centerpiece of the gallery about Truman's first months in office shows a safety plug from the bomb that was dropped on Nagasaki. Nearby is a display about the more than 1,000 origami cranes symbolizing peace that were created by Sadako Sasaki, a Japanese girl who died at age 12 from radiation poisoning. Her brother donated what is believed to be one of the last cranes she folded.

Those types of artifacts illuminate why Truman is one of the most significant presidents in U.S. history, said A.J. Baime, author of several non-fiction books, including "Dewey Defeats Truman" and "The Accidental President."

"That's why presidential libraries are so important," said Baime, who did research at the library and toured it during renovations. "Many people are not going to crack open a 300-page book, but seeing those artifacts makes history come alive."

The galleries highlight challenges such as the Red Scare, over the perceived Communist threat in the U.S. during the Cold War; Truman's firing of Gen. Douglas

relegated his personal life in Missouri to MacArthur after disagreements about the Korean War; desegregating the military and promoting civil rights; and recognizing the state of Israel.

> Other displays include a beam from the White House before it was extensively updated during Truman's tenure, some humorous gifts he received, and the famous "The Buck Stops Here" sign he kept on his desk in the Oval Office.

> Because of the controversial decisions he made, Truman left the presidency in 1953 with a 32% approval rating, the lowest for a president in U.S. history.

> In subsequent decades, however, the public and politicians from both major parties have come to appreciate Truman's legacy and often cite his example. Former President Lyndon Johnson and other prominent politicians have visited the museum to sign legislation. The museum showcases praise from current leaders with vastly different beliefs to highlight Truman's continuing relevance, Graham said.

> As visitors head to the exit, they can stop in a courtyard where Truman, wife Bess, their daughter and son-in-law are buried.

> Most of the museum makeover was paid for through private funding, and another \$7 million was raised for endowments and programming.



Price of dinnerware service depends on whether anyone sets a formal table


My youngest daughter has a set of Lenox Maywood pattern dinnerware from Lenox's Cosmopolitan Collection. The set has 12 place settings, two serving bowls, saltshakers, and a coffee pot. She would like to sell it. What are your thoughts?



My first piece of advice is do not look on the Lenox page on Replacements, Ltd.'s website for pricing advice. Replacement's prices are high retail and no way reflect what a private individual can get when trying to dispose of their china service. What Replacements does do is rank patterns by desirability. Lenox's Maywood pattern ranks 31st on Replacement's list of Lenox patterns. Given the number of patterns Lenox made, one might assume this is good news. It is not. The top 10 patterns are marketable and the top 5 patterns are desirable.

The critical question regarding older dinnerware services in the 2020s is: Who sets a formal table these days? If you question this, ask your daughter when was the last time she used the service. If she used it regularly, she most likely would not want to dispose of it.

Since she wants to sell the service, she has a few options. First, find an antiques consignment shop in her area. The fee will be a minimum of 50 percent. The key in the selling process is to remember that



some money is better than no money.

My suggestion is to ask \$75 or \$100 and take whatever offer someone is willing to make. The service lacks a large list of serving accessories. Place settings are common and a glut on the market. It is the serving pieces that sell a dinnerware

When I was 7 years' old, I got a "good luck" plastic arrowhead given as a premium to viewers of Walt Disney's Davy Crockett television series. It has the words, "Be sure you're right and then go ahead on it." Is there any chance you could bring back some great seven-year-old's memories for this retired 74-year-old grandpa?

Walt Disney's five-part, one-hour episode Davy Crockett series aired on Walt Disney's Disneyland television show on ABC between 1954 and

I had trouble identifying the arrowhead as a promotional giveaway. The plastic arrowhead accompanied Davy Crockett's Daisy BB gun, canteen, or powder horn. The 1 inch by 1 3/4-inch, by 3/16-inch plastic arrowhead had a hole in the top so it could be hung on a leather strap. A shorter version was only 1 1/2-inches in height.

The front of the arrowhead had a signature "Davy / Crockett" beneath the hole. Below this was a relief powder horn beneath which was "BE SURE YOU / ARE RIGHT / THEN GO /AHEAD." The reverse had the round "It's a / DAISY" logo.

Hake's Americana and Collectibles sold an example at auction for \$158.12 in March 2014. A "sale by date" search on WorthPoint.com's Worthopedia produced sales of \$40.99 on eBay on April 13, 2021, \$44 on eBay on Jan. 18, 2021, and \$65 on eBay on Dec. 22, 2020.

I recently began collecting old baseball gloves. I have three or four from the 1940s and 1950s in various sizes and conditions. I also have some from the 1980s, 1990s, and early 2000s. The condition of these also varies. Are any of them worth selling in their current state? Should I pay to have early gloves restored? Is it possible I only have a box of worthless cowhide? Any information would be appreciated.

Start by identifying your princi-A pal collecting motivation. Do you want to build a representative collection of baseball gloves associated with a specific decade or decades, find gloves that have investment potential and resell them, or do you wish to acquire gloves for research purposes to learn the history behind the gloves and who endorsed them? How you approach collecting depends very much upon your motivation.

Do not pay to restore any gloves, even those that might be considered scarce. Collectors prefer game used gloves, especially those made before 1960. More gloves have been ruined by amateur restorers than by use.

Study the history of baseball gloves. A good place to start is the "Baseball Glove Dating Index" on the KeyMan Collectibles website: http://keymancollectibles. com/baseballgloves.htm. A chronological collecting approach is only one of many possibilities.

Since gloves are position focused, decide if you wish to specialize in one type of glove, for example, a first baseman's mitt. Think condition, condition, condition. Avoid collecting gloves in less than good condition, albeit very good condition would be a better standard. For gloves made after 1970s, use a fine to very fine condition standard. For gloves made after 1990, think mint or near mint condition.

Better to buy a glove with an endorsement signature as opposed a glove without one. Use one simple criteria. If the endorser is not in the Hall of Fame, think twice, even three times before paying a premium for the glove because of its endorsement.

Do not get caught up in the speculation craze of "autographed" gloves. They often command a high price with no guarantee the price will rise or be recoverable in the future.

Collecting any sport memorabilia, especially baseball gloves, is not for the weak at heart. The secondary sports memorabilia market is blood-thirsty, volatile, speculative, and manipulative. Sport collectors play to win. Losing is not an option.

Quilts and Navajo weavings will highlight new exhibits at Williamsburg

WILLIAMSBURG, Va. — Visitors to the Abby Aldrich Rockefeller Folk Art Museum will experience two new textile exhibitions this summer. "The Art of the Quilter" will open on July 3 in the Foster and Muriel McCarl Gallery and "Navajo Weavings: Adapting Tradition" will open in the Mary B. and William Lehman Guyton Gallery in early August.

"Colonial Williamsburg's curators have worked diligently over the last 20 years to ensure that our collections represent the diversity of the American people," said Ronald L. Hurst, the institution's Carlisle H. Humelsine Chief Curator and vice president for museums, preservation, and historic resources. "That critical work is ongoing, and these two exhibitions are clear evidence of our determination to use remarkable objects in telling a more complete and fulsome story."

"The Art of the Quilter" will delight quilt aficionados new and old. A threeyear exhibition that will rotate a selection of bed guilts from the early 19th-century to present day, it will feature 12 examples each year from Colonial Williamsburg's superlative collection. Most of the quilts to be on display have never been shown before and many are recent acquisitions. The quilts tell stories about people from America's past and the societies in which they lived; some bedcovers in the exhibition recalled milestone events in the lives of the makers, such as marriages, births or deaths. Others, such as album guilts, were created as reminders of friends and family left behind after a move that documented an increasingly mobile society in the 19th century as people moved westward to new lands and opportunities. Further stories are expressed through the motifs on the bedcovers. These extraordinary examples of handwork also demonstrate America's multicultural society and include objects from the Anglo-American, African American, German, Amish, and Mennonite communities. The Art of

the Quilter will remain on view through July 2024.

"We are literally 'covering' America with this exhibition," said Kimberly Smith Ivey, Colonial Williamsburg's senior curator of textiles. "The bed guilts display a variety of techniques, colors and materials and demonstrate the diversity of American society."

Among the featured quilts to be seen when the exhibition opens are a pieced honeycomb quilt made of plain and printed cottons by Sarah Winifred Cobb (1842-1917) and Rachel, circa 1850. This pieced quilt in a pattern often referred to as "Grandmother's Flower Garden" is the product of both White and Black hands. A hand-written label once attached to the quilt reveals that eight-year-old Sarah Winifred Cobb, under the direction of the enslaved Rachel, pieced the guilt top. Apparently, young Sarah was much devoted to Rachel who presided over the nursery for two generations at the family home "Cobb Hill" in Richmond, Ky. Although Sarah and her family are well identified, nothing more is known about Rachel, not even her surname.

Another highlight of "The Art of the Quilter" is a show quilt made of silks with silk embroidery thread, attributed to Jane Ault and probably made in Pennsylvania or Ohio, circa 1900. Constructed of rich-colored silk solids, plaids, textured weaves, and velvets, this small throw has the additional embellishment of feather stitches. Quiltmakers in the late 19th century often used silks edged with fancy stitches to create wildly asymmetrical pieced crazy quilts. In this example, the design is more organized and symmetrical than that of crazy quilts; it consists of 323 pieced blocks of a repeating pattern of scalloped squares on point within a square. The last owner recalls that the quilt was given to her mother by her great-aunt, Jane Ault.

"Navajo Weavings: Adapting Tradi-

tion" will remain on view through December 2022. A longstanding cultural and artistic tradition passed down for generations, anonymous Navajo women created brilliantly colored, boldly designed pictorial blankets and rugs on hand looms. They adapted and modified their weavings from the world around them, creating an art form that is uniquely theirs and providing insight into the Navajo culture at the end of the 19th century. Through the woven motifs of these textiles, museum guests can learn what was important to the makers among the Diné (the term the Navajo use to refer to themselves meaning "the People") and gain a sense of their aspirations.

The earliest of Navajo weavings were blankets to be worn, known as "chief blankets," made with a simple, horizontally striped and banded design and format. A highlight of "Navajo Weavings: Adapting Tradition" is an extremely rare Classic Period chief's blanket. While it remains difficult to closely date objects such as this, as the techniques, materials and design was consistent across the Navajo lands for many years, it is believed that liamsburg.org

this example was made between 1840 and 1860. Its earliest provenance dates to a Ute (Chief Ouray) who obtained the blanket from the Governor of Pueblo de Taos during the 1870s. Because these blankets were utilitarian, many did not survive; it is believed that only approximately 50 to 60 of the early classic Ute design blankets exist and many are in museums. This piece is woven from single-ply, handspun Churro wool; its white and brown colors are natural, and the blue is from an indigo dye.

"The six Navajo weavings spanning about one hundred years highlight how the highly skilled Navajo weavers adapted and modified their traditional textiles from the world around them to meet the demands of a modern market and trade. With bold designs and brilliant colors, simple everyday objects like trains, livestock, and soda bottles were transformed into works of woven art, and today tell a compelling story of adaptation, survival, and change by the Navajo People," said Ivey.

1951 Ford panel truck drove highest bid at Dale's

HOLLAND, Mich. — An eager crowd gathered at the Auction Barn of Dales Auctioneering Service. There the contents of an estate that belonged to a local collector who was employed by Sealed Power piston ring foundry and machining operations were on display. His interest in everything automotive drove him to collect related items such as die cast models, lighters, car parts, signs, and clocks. Those in attendance at this in-person auction included several out of town folks who wished to add a keepsake to their own collection. As always, Dale Flokstra, his wife Elaine, and their entire crew made everyone feel welcome.

The center of attention was an impeccable 1951 blue Ford panel truck. Described at 95 percent restored, a loving hand had taken care of every detail, from the rust-free exterior to the clean and rebuilt interior complete with a new wooden floor. It was a 3-speed on the column and the instrument panel looked amazing. When started up it "purred like a kitten" according to Elaine. This spacious, eye-catching vehicle was considered by many before driving the final bid up to \$13,000.

In keeping with the owner's interest in cars, there was a nice selection of 200 diecast trucks and semis in the 1/64 and 1/34 scales. However, the model car that heated up the competition was the vintage 18-inch Hiller Comet tether race car. This fascinating hobby consists of racing miniature vehicles that are equipped with a gas combustion engine. They are fastened or "tethered" to a post by a 33-foot steel cable and individually race around the track at amazing speeds. This brilliant red vehicle bearing the number 6 was claimed with a high bid of \$1,300. Other vintage toys included a Mobile Gas tanker that was claimed for \$110, a model International dozer for \$90, and a Smith Miller dump truck for \$100. The Lionel trains, many still in their original boxes, were also popular with the collectors, with the Halloween train selling for \$300 and various engines and cars from \$50-\$250.

Other items related to the automotive collection theme also did well. Signs proved popular, including a metal sign with the slogan "Home of the DOCTOR OF MOTORS, we install Perfect Circle Piston Rings". It featured a very confident-looking mechanic and left with a final bid of \$425. There was a Sealed Power Piston Rings rectangular white plastic lighted sign with red letters mounted on a chain that left for \$325. A brilliant yellow metal Pennzoil sign boasting the slogan "Sound your Z" and the words "100% pure Pennsylvania oil Pennzoil safe lubrication" superimposed over a red image of the Liberty Bell was claimed with a high bid of \$275. An-

other familiar sight at a filling station was a Coca Cola metal sign. Offering "ice cold Coca Cola" and "a sign of good taste" this recognizable red and white sign drew a final bid of \$425.

Several items that were found in service stations were offered, including some highly collectible clocks. Leading that category, Perfect Circle piston rings lighted wall clock consisted of a white plastic body with red lettering around the perimeter. There was a small stain on the edge, but otherwise it was in very good condition and was claimed with a high bid of \$450. Not far behind, the American Hammer lighted clock was picked up with a bid of \$325.

Sorting through the many automotive collectibles, the Diamond Reo model engine stood out as a favorite. It was mounted on a wooden platform which had a triangular metal tag that read "Diamond Reo". This handsome model required a bid of \$400 to claim it. Another fun piece was the 1951 Ford red front bumper wall display, which despite some dirt and rust still commanded a final bid of \$200. Other related lots included several glass oil jars, some complete with their carrier, an ANCO windshield wiper metal cabinet, a box of miscellaneous hood ornaments, and even an engine lift.

Moving on to other popular areas of this estate, the owner certainly proved to be a music lover in addition to enjoying his gadgets. Two items in particular highlight this interest. There was an Imperial single comb Symphonion with wind up lever and 30 discs. The handsome mahogany case featured a lithograph (with some damage) showing 7 young children playing music on the lid interior. The mahogany veneered stand provided space for disc storage. Elaine remarked that "soft tones of music could be heard" from this lovely instrument that was claimed with a high bid of \$900. An Edison Amberola model 5217 found a new home with a high bid of \$500, while several other Victor & Edison Amberolas went for \$250-\$500.

The collector was a man of many interests, including a passion for pocket watches and there were several to choose from. The most desirable proved to be a Waltham gold pocket watch which soared to a final value of \$600. Other watches sold for \$250-375. A 16-drawer antique wooden cabinet proved to be the perfect place to house several pocket watches, and this display along with several watches inside found a new home with a high bid of \$400

A couple more items that don't fall into these categories were also well appreciated by the crowd. The merry sound of brass jingle bells will always encourage an enthusiastic response, and this set of 30 sleigh bells mounted on a leather strap, all in excellent condition, certainly proved the point. It required a high bid of \$500 to claim it. Then there was the brilliant red cast iron Gamewell telegraph fire alarm box from days gone by that proved to be popular. The paint was in excellent condition (likely restored), but the original key and alarm mechanism were missing. It required a bid of \$160 to claim it.





beads also served in trade itself. In the 1860s, for instance, a short, six-string bunch of seed beads bought one beaver at Fort McPherson, Nebraska.

As white settlers claimed their homelands, Native Americans were forcibly removed from their homes into reservations. When trading posts, reservation stores providing food and goods in exchange for local products and artwork, were established, traditional beading materials were still in use. Their introduction of metal needles, long-lasting linen thread, velvet fabric, and strips of coveted, machine-made, yellow trade cloth, however, transformed the craft.

Reservation traders, promoting their appealing crafts, eventually established markets far and wide. As a result, Native American artists began supplementing their incomes by creating lucrative, heavily beaded items, like purses, earrings, vests, and dresses, for the tourist trade. As demand grew, some, to streamline the process, produced beadwork on looms. Yet thousands more, men and women both, have continued to meticulously handstitch designs, traditional and new.

Today, hundreds of Native American tribes, following different lifestyles and speaking a variety of dialects, boast beadwork styles and stitches all their own. "Different colors represent different tribes," explains veteran beader Kelly Murdock-Billy. "Apache beaded items, for example, traditionally feature hues associated with the four earthly directions: north-black, south-white; east-yellow, and west-blue or green. Moreover, some colors, like Cheyenne Pink, have come to be used heavily by one nation or another — though they don't really represent that nation.

Different tribes have developed distinctive motifs as well. The Algonquin Nation, which includes the Kickapoo, Potawatomi, Sac and Fox, Ottawa, Ojibwe, and Cree, for example, favors florals. "I personally like the Tuscarora, Seneca, and other Haudenosaunee Nation raised beadwork with all of their strawberries and birds," Murdock-Billy continues, " but my husband's Potawatomi family uses more floral and vining motifs. And his Plains people the Assiniboine, Sioux, and Gros Ventres tribes — favor more geometric designs. Though Navajos used larger beads in strung necklaces and earrings, they did not do beadwork with tiny seed beads until they became 'powwow people."

Powwows are joyous traditional social, religious, and ceremonial dances that affirm Native American culture and iden-

tity. Many pow wow flashy, beaded belt, dress, legging, moccasin, and wristband designs hold traditional meanings or indicate dancers' families, feelings, personal identities, or interests. Other designs symbolize status within their tribes or spiritual quests.

Due to tribal trade, intermarriage, the effect of mission schools, and blended-culture pow wows, Native American beading styles have merged. In addition, beaded regalia remains dynamic through a dancer's lifetime.

Like many Native American beadwork artists of today, Elias Jade Not Afraid, a member of Montana's Crow Nation, is selftaught. His works have not only been featured in many prestigious Native art markets, but recently graced a centerfold of Vogue Magazine. Not Afraid's Apsaalooké-style Flap Bag and Belt, created using 2-needle appliqué with vintage and antique glass seed beads, is hand-constructed from smoked brain tanned deer hide (buckskin). Its traditional 1800s, floral design features Crow tulips. "Because there're hardly used in contemporary beadwork," explains Not Afraid," I thought I'd give it a try." It not only reflects his tribal history and background, but also looks ahead, toward beadwork designs of the future,

Those interested in modern, Native American beadwork will find many relevant groups on Facebook, including Native Art and Beadwork, Native American Selling Group, and Social Distance Powwow Marketplace. Other groups feature work of a particular tribe, like Potawatomi Trade n Shop, or information about historic beading, like Prairie Material Studies.

The Complete Guide to Traditional Native American Beadwork: A Definitive Study of Authentic Tools, Materials, Techniques, and Styles, by Joel Monture, and Beading in the Native American Tradition, by David Dean may also prove interesting.
