# Cameos stand out in the collecting world

From ancient Egypt to the modern day, collectors have been enchanted by cameos. A cameo is a picture produced in relief from a material often containing multiple strata layers of different colors. Layers are removed from the material to create a 3-D picture. If the material layers vary in color, the artist can expose the different colors in contrast to accentuate the details of the subject matter.

Cameos have been made from many different materials including shell, lava, glass, ivory, coral, plastic and multiple types of stones. Stones are harder to carve than shell and glass, so they required more skill and different tools. Some types of stones used over the years include agate, sardonyx, opal, onyx, malachite, bloodstone, turquoise, jasper and cornelian.

In general, historians believe that cameos were first created in Egypt around 332 BCE. Prior to that, expert and mediocre carvers had been creating "seals" - objects used to make an impression in soft clay or wax. Seals were used to mark and secure personal property and documents. A seal would identify the owner and serve to discourage tampering. Seals and engraved stones were also used as amulets to protect against evil and to bring the bearer good luck.

The introduction of sardonyx, a multi-layered stone from India and Arabia, inspired carvers to create the cameo type carving by removing the different color layers to create pictures. Skills and tools from making seals transferred to making cameos.

Different color materials had different

Early Egyptian, Roman and Greek cameos often featured the likeness of rulers, gods, Biblical characters and pastoral scenes. Over the years they were used to adorn a variety of items such as jewelry, helmets, breast plates, crowns,

meanings.

cups, dishes and just decorative ornaments for the home.

Many well-known people throughout history have collected cameos including Napoleon and Queen Victoria. Queen Victoria's love of wearing cameos caused a collecting craze. Men and women alike wore cameos as fashion statements and sometimes with hidden meanings that could even be considered flirting, depending on the subject matter.

The widespread use of shells for cameos grew out of Italy in the early 1800s. Easy to carve and exhibiting multiple color layers, shells were a perfect material for cameo making. The most used shells were carnelian, sardonyx shell and Helmet shells. Wealthy English Victorians taking a "Grand Tour" invariably brought home Italian cameos as souvenirs. During this time, the "habilles" form of cameo became popular. This is the process of making small holes in the cameo and attaching jewelry to the subject of the cameo. The profile of a woman might be wearing a necklace, earrings or a brooch set with diamonds in a habilles

In a discussion of carved cameos there is another type of carving method that should be mentioned and that is intaglio. Intaglio differs from cameo carving in that the carving is recessed into the material so that it appears as a depression, whereas a cameo cut in relief appears raised from the surface. The subject matter and materials used for intaglio can be like that of cameos, but intaglio carving is another whole subject altogether!

# No need to check the gauge; petroliana was hot

COLUMBUS, Ohio — One of the country's biggest petroliana events, the Check the Oil Show & Auction returned to the Embassy Suites in Columbus June 25-26, after a year's hiatus. On all accounts, the event was strikingly successful, hardly reflecting any adverse effects from the lost year.

Promoters Andy Hussar and Aaron Hop were back in the driver's seat, eager to have the show running again after 2020s shutdown. Just like 2019, attendees and vendors booked out the entire Embassy Suites hotel - over 220 rooms booked, and all vendor spaces sold out! Outside, vendors wrapped around the entire eight-story building, filling up all the building's adjacent parking lot. Inside, dealers occupied the first-floor ballroom along with other first-floor spaces. But it was the four additional floors of "room crawls," where vendors displayed merchandise in their lodging rooms, which created a distinct vibe to the event.

A special participant this year was the Gulf Oil Historical Society. David Montgomery, the group's current president explained the group was founded

in 1999 and currently has a membership of around 65 members. Its annual meeting is now held at the show. The group had merchandise for sale in the

room crawl along with items offered in a silent auction on Friday.

Check the Oil is free and open to the public, and it drew attendees as far as California and Canada. On whole, guests tend to be older and mostly male; but it's important to note the number of women (on both sides of the sales tables) and the growing number of Gen-X and Millennials just starting

their collections.

Demographics withstanding, the show opened to an amazing crowd, with Friday as busy as would otherwise be expected on a Saturday. By 9 a.m. parking was at a premium and the throngs were shopping both the outside booths and filling the hallways inside.

Attendees were there to buy and not just browse. Pricing at authentic petroliana events like Check the Oil is not for the faint of heart. Amounts like \$500 or even \$5,000 are the norm - and matter-of-factly asked for items like porcelain signs and restored pumps. It's a result of vet-

ting; all merchandise must be authentic, or in cases in which reproductions are appropriate (like replica globes for pump restoration), the pieces must be clearly marked. Buyers are prepared and confident to part with such sums for good-caliber items.

# Definitely fill up your shopping cart with "Got Gas"

My earliest memories of "fill 'er up" date back to riding shotgun in the family Nash Rambler to Jess Floyd's Mobil station (how/ why do I still remember his name?) on Saturday mornings. My reward for keeping Dad company: A five-cent, eight-ounce bottle of Coke from the machine. A couple of years later, there were "gas wars," at our neighborhood stations, where we filled up the most beautiful car I ever saw, a 1961 Chevrolet "Bel Air" named "Dinah," with "Texas tea" priced from 19.9 to 21.9 cents a gallon at the pump, depending on which corner station you chose. (Just saying, do they think that they can fool us by not rounding off the price to the next cent?) By the mid-1960s, we were receiving points for buying gasoline at an independent station; I still use one of the premiums, a Pyrex baking dish.

Owning a car has long meant regular stops at the pump, but what was once something of an informal community cen-



ter has somehow shifted to something else. Think gas lines. Self-serve. Mini-marts. These days, I'm thrilled to get a few cents off four bucks a gallon using grocery store discounts. Phew.

Why am I even sharing any of this? It's because I have in my hand Jimmy Rosen's new book, "Got Gas? A pictorial look at central Pennsylvania service stations from the 20th century," a sheer delight and a tribute to America's love affair with the automobile and how we kept them motoring back in the day.

Rosen came to author this book quite by accident, having received negatives (and some images) of gas stations in central Pennsylvania dating from the first half of the 20th century. When he realized what he had, he went

on a mission to not only print the photos but also to identify the stations. He began posting images on Facebook; a loyal following joined the cause and helped to identify some of the pictured gasoline stations. At some point, Rosen realized that he had a book on his hands. He took a few road trips for "before and after" pictures (arguably the best part of the book).

I caught up with Rosen a bit more than a year ago while his project was still in its infancy. Having often visited his antique

mall in Duncannon, Pa., I tracked the Old Sled Works during the pandemic for "AntiqueWeek." One day, while chatting with mall manager Kathy, I learned of Rosen's new project and wrote a story about what he was up to. I'm proud to say that he included my words as a bit of narrative in his 200-page book.

But a reprint of my nifty story isn't the only reason you need to check out "Got

Gas pumps, perhaps more than anything else, attract the most attention. Pumps were all over the outdoor venue, coming in the form of boneyard pieces priced in the low hundreds to completely restored examples typically running four figures. One dealer had a nice handful of pumps, including a Tokheim Texaco Sky Chief unit with globe for \$1,900, a circa 1940 Bennett pump branded to Mobilgas and ready to restore for \$2,200, and a Wayne Clock Meter branded to Magnolia Gas for \$2,500.

Then there were the signs and other forms of advertising pieces that seemingly dominated the landscape inside and out. Among the hundreds of Mobiloil and Texaco signs were some standout pieces like a crated Kaiser Frazer neon sign, which was working prior to load out, priced at \$9,500. A 30s-era steel Horton's Ice Cream sign from New York was marked at \$1,600.

All those big pieces like the pumps were limited to the outside spaces. Inside the rooms was merchandise that ran the gamut from smaller signs to oil cans and ephemera. While prices remained impressive indoors, that was where merchandise priced for those with smaller wallets was often found. Roadmaps and dealer catalogs, for example, ran as little as \$5. The Gulf Oil Historical Society had numerous items under \$100, including a set of four Gulf cocktail glasses for \$10.

In addition to the show, a 300-item no-reserve petroliana and advertising auction was held on Saturday, highlighting items from the Case Brothers

collection, including many rare Pennzoil collectibles. A 50/50 raffle supporting the Special Olympics of Ohio was also conducted. And a ticketed buffet dinner was available for dealers and attendees on Friday.

If you didn't make it to the Columbus event, Iowa Gas is just around the corner the weekend of August 4-6.

# Items from the Scott family will highlight Briggs online auction

GARNET VALLEY, Pa. — Thomas Alexander Scott of Philadelphia served as Assistant Secretary of War to President Abraham Lincoln and was president of the Pennsylvania Railroad and found of the Texas and Pacific Railroad.

One of his decedents was Helen Hope Montgomery Scott (April 8, 1904 – January 9, 1995) a socialite and philanthropist whom Vanity Fair once called "the unofficial queen of Philadelphia's WASP oligarchy." She was most famous for being the inspiration of the main character in the Philip Barry play "The Philadelphia Story."

Items from this family will be among the highlights of a July 30 online only auction conducted by Briggs Auction.

"Of special note in the auction is an

excellent collection of early English silver decorative and table articles along with some other furnishings and decorative arts from a direct descendant of Thomas Alexander Scott," said a member of Briggs staff.

One of the showpieces of the auction is a fine George Nakashima Minguren side table with a distinctive triangular-form free-edge top over the Minguren base, circa late 1960s/early 1970s. This piece was purchased directly from the artist, and directly descended through the family, as well as a few additional pieces of Midcentury Modern furniture.

A great assortment of maritime paintings from a Chester County, Pa., private collection should also generate enthusiasm, with statement pieces by Scott Cameron, Alexander Charles Stuart, Edouard Adam, Henry Tatnall, and others.

The auction will also include an extensive collection of antique and contemporary collectible gold and platinum coins and proof sets; a fine 18th century or earlier Flemish verdure tapestry; two David Goode cast-bronze sculptures each from "The Goblin Collection"; a beautiful pair of Chinese export mirrors with reverse-painted panels at the tops; a pair of full-size patinated bronze whippet figures and a Delaware copper full-bodied weathervane with directionals by Fred W.

# Washington Peace medal acquired by Colonial Williamsburg

WILLIAMSBURG, Va. — When George Washington was inaugurated as the first President of the United Sates 232 years ago in April 1789, the nation's leaders were well aware that "peace medals" given as diplomatic gifts to American Indian leaders had vital impact. Considered to be of paramount historical significance and the highest rarity, most of the authentic engraved Indian peace medals of the Washington presidency are found in institutional collections. Of the medals made in 1792. the first year they were issued and awarded primarily to Southern Chiefs, perhaps a dozen are known.

Colonial Williamsburg has recently acquired one the finest of only approximately six small-sized medals currently recorded. Crafted in Philadelphia of silver by an unidentified silversmith, this Washington Indian peace medal is 5 ¼ inch tall by 3 3/16 inches wide. The medal is now on view in the Backcountry section of "A Rich and Varied Culture: The Material World of the American South," a long-term exhibition at the DeWitt Wallace Decorative Arts Museum, one of the newly expanded Art Museums of Colonial Williamsburg.

"Acquisition of this well-preserved medal provides Colonial Williamsburg an outstanding opportunity to interpret the story of relationships between the United States government and the American Indian nations residing in the southern states," said Ronald L. Hurst, the Foundation's Carlisle H. Humelsine Chief Curator and vice president for museums, preservation, and historic resources. "It also advances our long-standing determination to ensure that the collections represent the diversity of the early American population."

The custom of giving peace medals has a long history in America. By the French and Indian War, Anglo-Americans began producing impressive medals in hopes of competing against varied European interests for the allegiance of diverse Native American groups. These

include medals commissioned by the Quakers struck in Philadelphia for the 1757 Treaty of Easton and Virginia's "Happy While United" medals of 1780.

The newly formed War Department staff, responsible for overseeing Indian affairs, found it challenging to procure these indispensable silver medals. Without the necessary minting machinery, each had to be handmade and painstakingly engraved by expert craftsmen in order to convey the importance embodied in these large, high-quality medals. The work was time consuming and expensive, but the United States government considered it worth the price as they enthusiastically appreciated by the recip-

In 1792, a spectacular design was created that began the custom of

featuring a prominent image of the sitting president on the front of the medal. This tradition continued for nearly a century until the Indian peace medal program ended in 1891. The new design, which was very large and oval, presented a view of George Washington helping to support a pipe being smoked by a traditionally dressed American Indian warrior. On equal footings, the president appears in his military uniform while his ally wears armbands, a feathered headdress and a large oval medal around his neck. Behind the warrior rests his tomahawk placed on the ground. This peace ceremony is depicted at the edge of a wood with the warrior below the branches of a tree and Wash-

ington before an agricultural scene. Below is the legend GEORGE WASHINGTON, PRESIDENT 1792. The reverse side features an engraving of the Great Seal of the United States.

"I can't put into words how thrilled I am to be adding this incredibly rare medal to Colonial Williamsburg's holdings," said Erik Goldstein, Colonial Williamsburg's senior curator of mechanical arts & numismatics. "Though it fills a tremendous void in the collection, I never thought it would be possible, and the fact that it's of the finest style is just icing on the cake."

These resplendent objects were seen as supreme emblems of importance and position by both parties. Official gifts of the United States, they were made in three sizes and given according to the rank of the accepting Chief. Bestowed with great pomp and ceremony, each medal was accompanied by a certificate that spelled out the credentials of the holder and the requirements of deference and respect owed to him by others. At the time, these esteemed American Indian leaders were often referred to as Grand Medal Chiefs.

Production of the large format oval medals ended in 1795, likely because of the expense and difficulty of having them hand-made, perhaps compounded by an increasing need for them. Today, the engraved Indian peace medals of George Washington's presidency remain at the pinnacle of early American numismatic and historical treasures.



# Cameo

Cameos are still being made today. Although the ancient art of carving them has become much less common, new versions can be cut with a laser cutter or just molded from plastic. There are other methods of producing non-carved cameos and famous manufacturers such as Wedgewood and Limoges have even created cameos made from jasperware and porcelain, respectively.

Values for cameos vary widely based on age, material, craftsmanship, condition and rarity. The settings are important in the value of a piece as well. Naturally, a cameo set in a gold frame or bezel would be desirable, although base metals and other materials can be just as lovely.

Becky Couvillon of Huntsville, Ala., has a wonderful collection of cameos. Her interest was sparked as a child by a piece that her mother owned. She thought it was the most beautiful thing she had ever seen. Now Becky owns an enviable collection of cameos in a variety of ages, materials and sizes. She even gives presentations about cameos to small groups in her area.

One of the star pieces in Becky's collection is a mourning cameo from the 1800s. It is set in gold and has a glass locket window on the back side to hold a

lock of a loved one's hair. She can date the piece largely based on the clasp. According to Becky the hook type clasp was used prior to the 19th century where the common safety clasp that we are most familiar with now was a later development.

Becky has a handout she provides during her presentation that explains the care of shell and coral cameos. She advises cleaning them with a soft toothbrush and mild detergent. Moisturize a couple of times a year with baby or mineral oil applied with a cotton swab or your finger. Let the oil sit overnight then remove with a soft cloth the next morning.

Most cameos should never be cleaned

in an ultrasonic jewelry cleaner or with any type of chemical. Some shouldn't even be cleaned with water, just dusted. These include turquoise and opal. Be sure to find out the proper cleaning method for each type of cameo material you have and store them individually, not touching where they could scratch or chip each other.

Fakes abound in the cameo world, so it is advisable to become familiar the different methods of determining whether a cameo is real or not. There is nothing wrong with buying a fake if you know what you are getting. With shell being the most common material used for cameos, it is important to be able to differentiate between shell and plastic.
