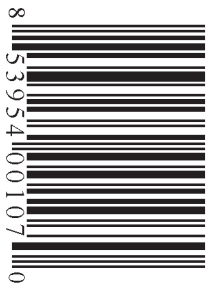

Tobacco tin collectibles are not going up in smoke

Tobacco needs to be stored in special conditions that maintain the humidity and air to keep the tobacco fresh.

In the mid-19th century, tin containers filled that requirement. Early makers of those tins quickly discovered their versatility as they were used to store many products because of their airtight seals that preserved freshness.

Design of the tin was limited, but by the 1890s the process of lithographing directly on tin was perfected, making for amazing artwork. This art has made the tin containers desirable with today's collectors.

Mike Leonard, 62, of Mansfield, Ohio, been an avid collector of tobacco tins since he spotted a collection at a flea market when he was just 12 years old. He recently returned from the Premium Cigar Association Trade Show held in Las Vegas last month.

"Fifty years ago, I became fascinated with the color, artwork and durability of these tins," Leonard said. His collection has now eclipsed the 1,000 mark. "My own dad was a pipe smoker and purchased these tins. You could smell the tobacco long after the product was gone. Other boys my age were into baseball cards, skateboards, Matchbox cars and banana-seat bikes. I gravitated towards these tins. They weren't the

collectible item of choice back then, but more and more people have discovered them these days."

Leonard is a regular at the monthly Urbana Flea Market in Urbana, Ohio. There he buys, sells and trades tobacco tins and pipes.

Tobacco tins were manufactured in a limited number of shapes and styles. Cylinders and boxes were used for tobacco sold in bulk, while smaller, flat or concave tins were designed to be carried in a pocket. A third form was the lunchbox tin, so named for its wire handle and frequent reuse by smokers and their children alike to carry their lunch to work or school.

Because the shapes of tobacco tins were relatively standard, the lithographed artwork on the outside of the tins was just about the only way to differentiate products on a tobaccoist's shelves. Imagery ranged from birds to butterflies to flowers, with some brands

Shoppers rolled down the highway along the World’s Longest Yard Sale

Despite growing concerns over the Delta variant of COVID, throngs of people hit the road to enjoy this year’s Route 127 Corridor sale. Dubbed “The World’s Longest Yard Sale,” its route spans 690 miles and six states: Michigan, Ohio, Kentucky, Tennessee, Georgia, Alabama. The five-day event, now in its 34th year, ran August 4-7.

The idea for the sale originated in Jamestown, Tenn., with the former county executive, Mike Walker. He wanted to create an event that encouraged travelers to leave the interstate, taking them instead on a scenic route through the area’s small towns and rural communities to experience what they had to offer. That idea has evolved into a nationally heralded event taking its place alongside other banner shows like Brimfield and Round Top. Visitors from around the country flock to the sale each year. One travel-

er from Idaho called the sale her “2021 Bucket list adventure!” Another, echoing similar sentiments, claimed, “This was the ultimate dream vacation for me, loved every minute of it.”

While it’s impossible to determine the number of sellers across the entire route, it’s important to note that it doesn’t take a multi-state or multi-day sojourn to enjoy the show. There can be enough sellers in a single small town — or within a handful of miles — that will take a serious shopper several hours to peruse. A traveler from Michigan described a typical experience, “This is at least our eighth year in a row that we travel from Michigan. We enjoy all the houses and farms along the roads and the neighborhood

Great for trivia night is ‘This Day in Collecting History’

The first time I heard of the book “This Day in Collecting History,” the frustrated author in me thought, “Rats, why didn’t I think of that? What a cool idea.” But then, holding the 272-page paperback book in my hands, I was glad I hadn’t. It became clear to me that such a challenge would not be as easy as it seemed. Talk about your labor of love.

How many man (and woman) hours must it have taken to think up 366-plus witticisms, historical nuggets, and the like, all falling into the stated categories of the book’s subtitle, “A Year of Art, Memorabilia & Other Treasures Sold”? A gargantuan task in itself. For that matter, the editing process alone would

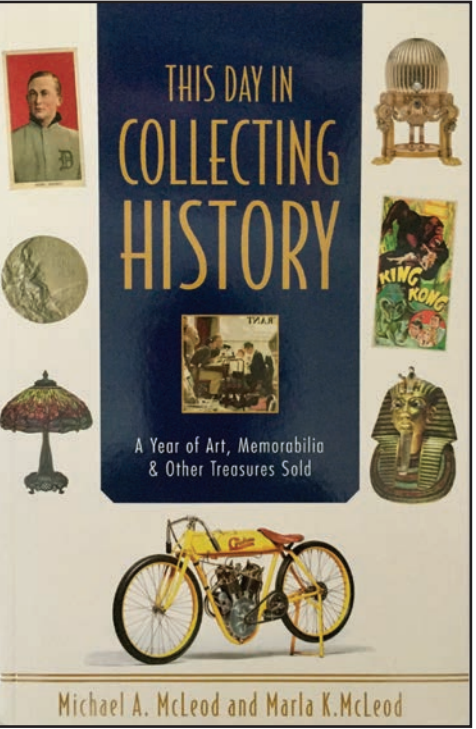

probably have done me in. And then there’s the task of tracking down appropriate illustrations. No thanks. But mercifully, the husband-and-wife team of Michael A. and Marla K. McLeod was clearly up to the challenge. And we all should be glad that they were.

Like other Schiffer publications, this book feels and looks good. More importantly, the information inside these pages is taken on good authority: Michael, as it turns out, served for 16 years as editor of the now-defunct “South-eastern Antiquing and Collecting Magazine.” For the record, he credits Marla as having provided the inspiration for the project; she, in turn, served as fact checker.

The format is straightforward: Each date has at least one entry (the birthday of someone notable, for instance, or the anniversary of an important historical event), as well as a detailed account of the sale of a related item (say, a costume worn in a famous role, the sale of a first edition or an autograph, something like that). There is an accompanying photograph for nearly every entry.

For the reader, where to begin? As I see it, there are several different ways to approach this chock-full-of-trivia book. Within the first five minutes of having it in my hand, I looked up dates including my birthday, my daughter’s and grandkids’ birthdays, and Christmas, just to see what was happening then. Turns out that I share a birthday with Hall of Famer “Dizzy” Dean; Kat and Knute (“Win just one for the Gipper”) Rockne made their entrance into the world on the same day, different century. New Year’s Day is remarkable for two reasons: It was the day that President Abraham Lincoln signed the Emancipation Proclamation as well as being the day that Paul Revere was born. Flipping to the last

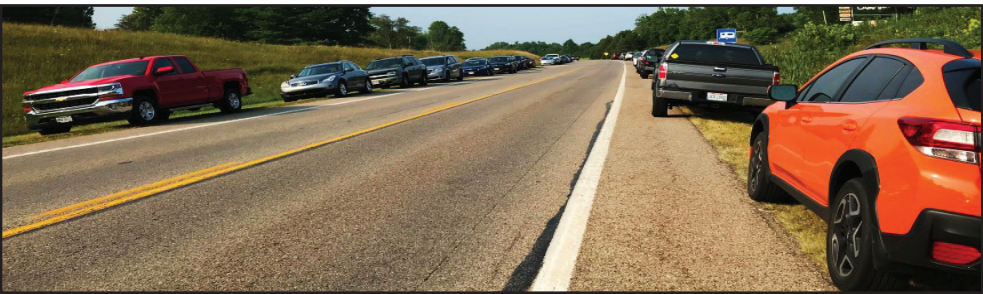

sales when we get to the towns. Our favorites are West Unity, Van Wert, and Celina, Ohio. It takes us three days to get through Ohio. We made it to Kentucky one year on a Sunday.”

Most sales are found at private residences on or near the route. Others are berthed in vacant lots, with sellers often camping. Sometimes, small groups of vendors will congregate in parking lots rented for the event. Then, there are the major vendor stops which host a minimum of 25 sellers each, often set up at fairgrounds or campgrounds. More than 30 of those stops are listed on the sale’s web-site. One of them was at Cross’s Campground in Camden, Ohio, where about 40 sellers and a handful of food vendors created a fair-like setting. Almost directly across the road, Camden itself looked like a flea market, brimming with tents and trailers spread along the village streets.

Shopping aside, the 127 sale presents a great opportunity for a road trip, with numerous activities along the way. There are museums, farm markets, wineries, and local attractions like scenic railroads and even aquariums in both Tennessee and Kentucky. Adding another element are the increasing numbers of food trucks, some of which congregate in makeshift food truck “parks.”

Despite its obvious popularity, the year’s



show wasn’t without its detractors. Emanating from Tennessee was some concern over merchandise being a bit too polished and pricey. One Tennessee visitor remarked, “The name should be changed to World’s Longest ANTIQUE Sale. You don’t run across too many actual yard sales. It’s mostly antique dealers with high prices.” Of course, for antique dealers or buyers, that may not necessarily be a bad thing.

More dispiriting was the controversy over masking and social distancing throughout the event, whether people should avoid the event, and whether it should have been held at all given the spread of this newest COVID variant. One commentator from Alabama didn’t sugar-coat, “I can’t believe they are having this. As someone who has vended and attended for many, many years, I am very familiar with the crowds, the close contact, the handling of objects; it sounds like a disaster waiting to happen.”

With the show’s growth, traffic along the route has become an issue in some areas, particularly in rural communities unused to congestion. Parking alongside the road can be difficult, and shoppers must use caution when pulling over and entering back onto the road.

For those who missed this year’s sale, the annual event takes place the first Thursday-Sunday in August; next year, it’s scheduled for August 4-7. The show promoter’s website offers an interactive route map, along with listings for lodging and activities along the way.

page, I noted that New Year’s Eve was the natal day of artist Henri Matisse, as well as a host of others, including Buddy Ebsen and Sylvester Stallone, Johnny Depp and Tony Curtis, Phyllis Diller and Richard Chamberlain, each slipping under the wire as a last-minute tax deduction.

Or you could start with the date of receiving the book and proceed from there. Writing this on August 9, I see that on this day in 1944, Smokey the Bear made his debut. A 1957 string holder in his likeness made \$152 on eBay five years ago. And for those not knowing the uses

for a string holder, there is a short explanation. Spoiler alert: Tomorrow I’ll find out that on August 10, 1846, President James K. Polk signed an executive order establishing the Smithsonian Institution (I looked ahead). And the day after that. . . well, you get the idea.

Best of all is the fact that this book contains a comprehensive index. Feeling curious about, say, the Beatles? Wedged in between Michael Jackson’s “Beat It” jacket and Beatrix Potter’s “Tale of Peter Rabbit” are several listings for Ringo, one for Paul, and a sprinkling relating to John for his guitar, his wire-rim eyeglasses, and for the “Double Fantasy” album (which technically, is not a Beatles album, just saying). What, no George? Looks like Pierre-Auguste Renoir was also born on February 25 and aced out

“the quiet Beatle.” Sigh. Similarly, I see no mention of Hugh Grant, although Cary and Ulysses S. (no relation) represent famous Grants. Likewise, Coca-Cola but no Pepsi-Cola. Joking aside, generalized categories make it easy to learn about Academy Awards, photographs, and rings, as well as stamps, sculptures, and signatures.

Handy for bar bets, ideal for trivia night fans, and just plain interesting for the rest of us, this book might be the perfect gift for the collectors on your holiday list (it’s later than you think!). Order an extra one for yourself.

Clair Bee sports novels a fun read; but have low resale value

Q I have 23 of the 24 Clair Bee Chip Hilton sports novels written for adolescent boys and published by Grosset & Dunlap between 1938 and 1966. The “Fiery Fullback,” the 24th book in the series, is the only title I am missing. All are first editions. Nine of the books have brown covers. The remaining 14 have color lithograph covers, albeit they are hardbound. The binding on “4th Down Showdown” is weak, but I can live with this. I am a 1970s relic and at a point where I need to decide what to do with the books. What do you suggest?



A My first recommendation is to read them again, even if it is for the last time. Memories are more important than objects. Let your last memories be memorable ones.

Clair Bee (1948 to 1966), a college basketball coach and 1968 Basketball Hall of Fame inductee, wrote the series. Bee died in 1966, essentially ending the series. A growing interest in television programming also was a factor. “Fiery Fullback,” his unpublished manuscript, was published by Grosset & Dunlap in 2002. The series sold over 2.2 million books.


The first six books in the series were issued in fire-engine red, smooth textured bindings with blank outer covers. These six books also had full color dust jackets. The first six titles were reprinted. The reprints have blank rougher tweed cover binding and picture dust jackets. Issues #7 through #19 also had this rougher tweed cover binding and picture dust jackets.

All 23 titles were re-issued in picture cover versions, the images copied from the hardcover editions. These were done later than the first edition dates of #1 to #24, although they appear to be first editions based on information found on the copyright page information.

Paperback editions were issued. The first printing of the first 12 paperback books included a holographic image of a Chip Hilton logo. A Nashville religious book publisher re-issued the entire Chip Hinton series in the late 1990s.

What this means is that you have only a few “true” first editions at best in your collection. The first six books must have the fire

engine red, smooth cover with dust jacket and titles #7 and #19 the rougher tweed cover binding with dust jacket to have a “true” first edition. None of the books in your collection have dust jackets The picture cover versions are reprints. Of course, you may have a first printing (but not edition) of one or more of these titles.

As interest in the Chip Hilton series waned, Grosset & Dunlap printed fewer copies. As a result, a copy of “Hungry Hurler” (#23) with the rough cover and dust jacket is among the most desirable titles. Only 12,000 copies were printed.

A WorthPoint Worthopedia “sale date” search reveals that an average price for a single title in very good condition with a color cover or a hardcover title missing its dust jacket ranges from \$5 to \$7 per volume. If the condition is very fine or better, a sell through price of \$10 is often obtainable.

The secondary market is flooded. This keeps prices low. There are 50 to 60 Chip Hilton books for sale on eBay at any given time. Do not look at asking prices. A seller can ask any price they want. If searching a title on eBay, make certain to use an advance search and ask for examples that have sold. Like so many objects on eBay, you will quickly realize there is a big difference between asking and getting prices.

When it comes time to sell your set, I recommend offering the group as a lot. A good asking price would be \$125 but be prepared to accept less. If you sell individual titles, buyers will buy the best examples, a process known as cherry picking a collection. Make the sale winner-take-all. You do not want to be stuck with copies you cannot sell.

Q My dad was born in 1925. At some point in his life, he acquired a bronze elephant with an open woven basket hanging down each side. The piece measures 9 inches from nose to tail and is 6 inches high. It is 5 1/2 inches in maximum width. There are no maker’s marks on it. My dad used to put his watch on the trunk, his ring on the tail, his cuff links and extra rings on one side, and his billfold on the other. Have you seen anything like this?

A If your dad was born in 1925, he most likely received the elephant in the late 1940s or early 1950s. Bronze and



other metallic plated, pot metal cast objects were extremely popular in the 1950s. There also was a mild elephant craze during the same period.

The elephant jewelry holder is a little too good for a five and dime store item but certainly something that a buyer could find in a medium size department store or small-town specialized jewelry shop of the period.

It most likely was made in post-war Japan but also could have been made in post-war Europe. A wholesale jobber who sold inexpensive merchandise to stores imported the elephant jewelry holder and similar items.

I tried multiple searches on WorthPoint’s Worthopedia to see if I could find an exact match. I was not successful. I did find a pewter elephant with six elephant topped cocktail picks from the same period. It was marked “Spain.”

Your elephant jewelry holder’s value is the personal memories it represents. Its secondary mark value is under \$20.

Q Thirty years ago my wife and I purchased a chair at an auction. I use it to sit at our dining room table. The armchair has a caned back and seat. The seat is trapezoidal and has a maximum width of 23 inches (19 1/2 inches between the arms). The back stiles, arm supports, footrest, and spreader are twisted. I found no markings on the chair. My wife has passed away, and I need to downsize. Does the chair have any value in today’s world?

A Your chair is a Colonial Revival chair from the 1920s or 1930s. Colonial Revival furniture mixed and blended high-style period furniture designs into new functional furniture. The twisted stiles, arm rests, footrests, and spreaders are associated with the Victorian era Elizabethan Revival style. With a little imagination, the overall look of the chair is from the Chippendale period. The caned back and seat dates to the Queen Anne period.

The chair was once part of a set of four or six similar chairs. The four-piece set consisted of one armchair and three side chairs. The six-piece set had two armchairs and four side chairs.

Your chair is an orphan. Its primary value is for reuse. A new owner will use it just as you do – to sit in it. Brown goods’, the trade

name for your type of furniture, secondary market is flat. The furniture does not appeal to younger buyers.

Any offer of \$25 or more is fair.

Q I have a metal statue of a nude child or pixie. I think it is a one-of-kind. Did Armor Bronze do one-of-a-kind castings for sculptors? I have seen one Armor Bronze statue attributed to a famous sculptor, but it was not signed by the sculptor. Any information you can provide would help.



A I am not certain your metal sculpture is one-of-a-kind. The statue lacks the fine detail associated with artist castings. Your statue does not have an artist’s signature nor a foundry casting mark. Also, sculptors often ordered multiple castings of their work.

Armor Bronze made mass-production products. Companies such as Armor Bronze did commission artists to make sculptures that could be cast and sold to the public. These often lack the detail associated with high-end sculptural castings.

Armor Bronze did mass-produce a series of sculpture figures such as Abraham Lincoln and knights in armor. All were under 12 inches.

Could Armor Bronze do a one-of-a-kind casting? Anything is possible, but I doubt it.

Tobacco Tins

targeted to wealthy men and others to women.

Sailors were a popular image. Probably the most known tobacco-tin brand was Player’s, whose Navy Cut cigarettes featured a portrait of a sailor framed by a preserver. Ogden’s made Royal Navy Cigarettes, as did Gold Leaf, Crown, Harvey & Davy, and Hignett, whose Pilot Flake tins depicted a sea captain gripping the wheel of a ship listing hard to starboard.

More than 50 companies produced tobacco tins and tins made after 1901 often carry a stamped set of letters and/or numbers that indicate which company made the tin. “It helps collectors in knowing who the tin maker was,” Leonard said.

Entry level tins usually sell for less than \$20 and many can be purchased for just a few dollars. Such tins were made in the 1960s or later. Entry level tins include brands such as Prince Albert, Velvet, Tuxedo, Sir Walter Raleigh, Dill’s Best, Model and Union Leader. “If you find a tin with a bar code on it then it’s a younger, more common tin,” Leonard added.

“High-end tins don’t come up for sale very often and this combination of rarity and demand can fetch hundreds and sometimes even thousands of dollars,” Leonard said. “The most prized high-end tins are those without areas of the lithography scraped off, without fading, rust, dents or other defects.”

One such tin is the Ty Cobb tobacco tin. Robert Edward Auctions offered a mint-condition Ty Cobb tin in 1994, with a minimum bid of \$50,000. It sold for \$88,875.

“Both the card and tin had the same pose of Ty Cobb in them,” Leonard said. “The Ty Cobb tobacco tin in any condition is the Honus Wager of tobacco tins.”

“Even if you have an incredibly rare item in terms of the fact that you can’t find them often, if collectors aren’t competing to buy is then the value will still be low,” Leonard said. “To achieve high prices, you need both rarity and demand from collectors. Many people get hung up on the idea of whether something is rare, without considering if anyone out there actually wants to buy it. You’ll see this phenomenon all the time on eBay when someone has this ‘rare’ item up for hundreds of dollars and it sits there for weeks or months without selling.”

Age alone is often not a determining fac-

tor in terms of value.

“Many people I talk to get caught up in the age of the tin they have,” he said. “It really doesn’t affect the value in a significant way. If you have two of the exact same tin and one is 10 years older, they still have the same value to collectors. It’s just impossible to date them properly any way. And any original tobacco left in the can does not add value to the tin.”

“Collectors love to see tins with attractive designs and good colors,” Leonard said. “The most valuable tins on the market almost always have beautiful designs such as the Taxi or Gold Dust tin. Design is the appeal to most collectors I’ve run into.”

There were tobacco companies and tobacco tin manufacturers. In some instances, a company produced both. The Lorillard Tobacco Company is one such company. It was one of the largest early producers of tobacco in the U.S. and was founded in 1760. Its famous brands today are Newport, Kent, Maverick and Old Gold (which was tremendously popular in the 1920s), but the company is most known to collectors for the tins they produced, ranging from pocket tins to boxes.

“Advertising muscle made the big brands bigger, so brands produced by the likes of Wills, Ogden’s, Players and the other Imperial group members are generally more commonly available and therefore less valuable,” Leonard said. “Brands produced by the smaller companies and ‘Own Brand’ tins produced by retailers are far rarer and should be more valuable, but because they are not instantly recognizable, they are often overlooked and undervalued.”

When starting a collection, Leonard suggests concentrating on one of the bigger companies such as WD & HO Wills, Ogden or the Pinkerton Tobacco Company. Leonard said these companies produced tins in huge quantities and many of these tins survived and are quite affordable.

“My final advice is to avoid trying to clean tins with anything other than warm soapy water,” Leonard said, “as the printed surface can be rubbed off very easily, especially on the older tins. If you do wash a tin make sure you dry it thoroughly using a hair dryer and store or display them in a cool, dry place and avoid exposing them to direct sunlight as they will fade.

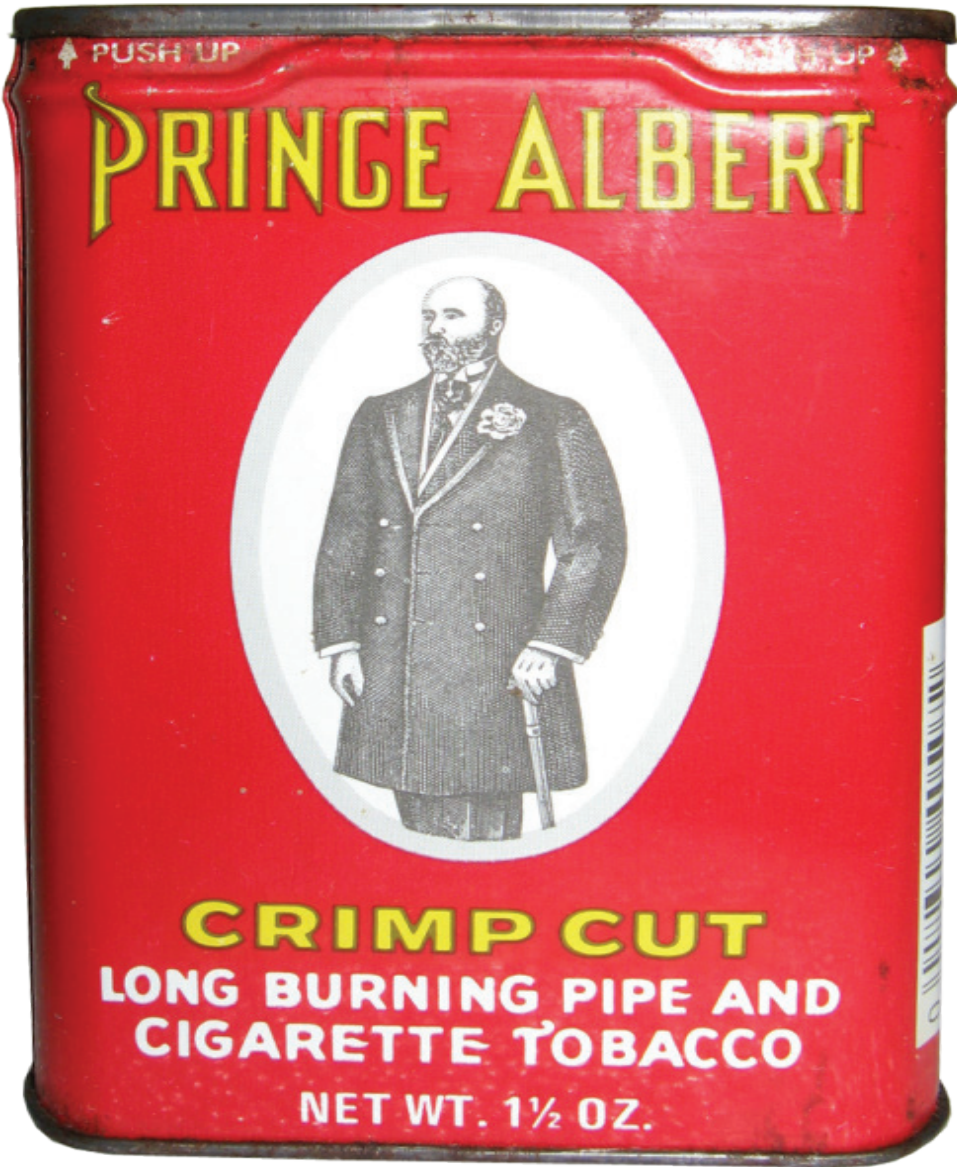
