Nemadji pottery did its best to hide its Minnesota roots

Nemadji pottery has a decidedly Southwestern look with its eye-catching mix of multi-colored swirls against an earth-tone base. Those who see it for the first time might assume it was made in Arizona or New Mexico. Few would guess northeastern Minnesota.

From the company's earliest days, its "up North" origins were underplayed. A Nemadji catalog from the 1960s notes that the pottery was "made largely from designs of ancient Indian pottery, and many of their traditional shapes are preserved in our designs." As late as 1982, Better Homes & Gardens praised Nemadji's "rich earthen hues . . .made by the American Indians," and many eBay listings still tout Nemadji as the perfect addition to a Native American collection. The implied connection was emphasized in the inserts that accompanied each item sold:

"From the bottom of ancient Lake Nemadji are secured the clays from which Nemadji tile and pottery are made. The Indians used this clay left by the ice sheet to make cooking pots and vases, and in the ancient warrior's grave are found fragments of his favorite cooking pot. Research has shown us how to imitate the pottery made from these same clays by the ancient Ojibwe tribes.

"Nemadji pottery expresses the soul of the Arrowhead Country and of the Redman, who, though long since gone to the Happy Hunting Ground, still haunts our shores and woods."

With that hyperbole, some confusion over the pottery's heritage is understandable. But what exactly is Nemadji? The story begins with ceramist Frank Johnson, an employee of Red Wing Union Stoneware, the Minnesota firm famed for its salt glaze crocks and jugs. In 1920, with dreams of starting his own business, Johnson headed north — just about as far north as you can get in Minnesota without falling into Lake Superi-

Clay Products Corporation in Nemadji Township, just northeast of Moose Lake. The location, conveniently situated on a large bed of native Minnesota clay, was ideal for Johnson's purposes. Specializing in industrial brick, as well as some decorative hand-thrown pottery, Northern Clay was a success. But more capital was needed. For that, Johnson called on prominent Moose Lake attorney and lumberman, Clayton J. Dodge.

renamed "Nemadji Tile and Pottery Company" soon won acclaim for its decorative tile, used primarily for flooring. Hand-thrown Nemadji pottery was also popular, and there the difficulty set in. Dodge saw decorative pottery as a sure thing for the country's burgeoning tourist trade. Johnson, however, had no interest in mass-produced ware, and the partnership ended.


His 1929 replacement proved largely

Dodge was happy to oblige. The responsible for the Nemadji designs today's collectors covet. Danish immigrant Eric Hellman had no qualms about creating the original thrown pottery needed to fashion molds for mass production. Hellman also modernized the Nemadii kilns and trained the company's workers in adding individual touches to give each piece of pottery a "one-of-akind" look. Most importantly, Hellman introduced the "cold striped" painting process which produced Nemadji's sig-


nature multi-colored swirls.

These "color baths" involved dripping different colors of synthetic enamels into a metal wash tub filled with water, laced with a bit of vinegar to aid cohesion. The craftsman would then blow lightly on the paint swirls, creating a patch of clear



Rare photo of Susan B. Anthony discovered in hidden room

CANANDAIGUA, N.Y. — Attorney David Whitcomb was changing a light-bulb on the third floor of a mid-19th century building he had recently purchased when he discovered a hidden studio.

"There was a drop ceiling on the third floor, and I was up on a stack of chairs pushing back a sliding panel," Whitcomb said. "I shined my cell phone flashlight up into the space, expecting to see rafters."

But, instead, his light reflected on sparkling stacks of ornate gilded picture frames.

"The frames looked gorgeous they were gold, gilded and they were really bright in the light. I lowered myself and said, 'I think we just found the Goonies' treasure," referring to the 1985 adventure comedy film.

The drop ceiling of the building in downtown Geneva, N.Y., had been installed decades earlier when the building's third floor was turned into an apartment. Whitcomb was buying the building to expand his law practice.

The next day, fully armed with flashlights and additional manpow-

er, Whitcomb resumed the treasure hunt. What he had discovered was the skylight studio of professional photographer J.E. Hale who practiced there between 1890 and 1920. It was just as Hale had left it more than 100 years ago.

Born in 1850, Hale had photographed President Grover Cleveland's fiancé' Francis Folsom in 1885, as well as several early suffragists. Many of the photos were displayed at the 1907 New York State Woman Suffrage Association in Geneva.

Geneva is located 10 miles west of Seneca Falls, a village that played a prominent role in the Women's Rights Movement as early as 1848.

Little else is known of Hale, only that he left the New York studio in 1920, moved to Michigan and died about four years later.



But the evidence uncovered in Hale's sealed-off studio shows that the photographer captured some very important portraits of historical figures.

Chief among these is a 16-by 20-inch framed portrait of suffragist Susan B. Anthony. The photograph, taken about four months prior to her death, is one of the last known portraits of the famed women's rights leader.

The photo was taken in early November 1905. Hale gave the rights to the image to the Susan B. Anthony Memorial Association which uses the photo as her official portrait. A clipping of a newspaper story featuring the same photo is part of the collection of the Library of Congress in Washington D.C.

The 44-year-old attorney also found broken pieces of the glass negative from which the photo was printed.

There are only four prints of the portrait known to exist, according to Aaron Kirvan, owner of One Source Auction and Antiques in Canandaigua where

Whitcomb chose to auction the trove of historical photos, hand-painted backdrops, camera equipment, props and photographic supplies. There will be more than 1,000 items sold in the 350lot sale to be held Sept. 18, according

The treasure trove has been appraised by the auction firm at \$100,000, with the Anthony portrait alone possibly fetching between \$10,000 and \$50,000. Bidding starts at \$5,000 for the rare Anthony photo.

"It's a very uncommon find, especially this being the main photo of Susan B. Anthony on file at the Library of Congress," Kirvan said.

In addition to other rare photos of Anthony are photographs of other prominent suffragette activists Elizabeth "Libby" Smith Miller, Anne Fitzhugh Miller and many as yet unidentified fighters for women's rights.

Another auspicious find was a photograph of William Robert Brooks (1844-1921), a British born astronomer who moved to the United States. He discovered numerous comets during his life. He discovered his first comet in 1881, using a telescope of his own construc-

in a previous show.

tion. In 1886, he discovered three new comets. Brooks, also a former professional photographer, is considered a pioneer in the field of astrophotography.

"He's dressed in a cap and gown and appears to be about in his 60s," Kirvan said. "At one time, he was considered a leading astronomer in the world."

Brooks moved to Geneva after a local businessman built an observatory and home for his fam-

spacious Memorial Hall East at the York Fairgrounds at 334 Carlisle Ave.

The past two York Shows, (September 2020 and January 2021) were cancelled due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

Despite reports of an upsurge in Covid cases during the past few months, Arion is cautiously confident the show will go on.

"We hated to lose those two shows, but there's nothing you can do when the state shuts down," he said. "I'm watching the news closely every day, and up until now I can say there are no signs of any closures. But like everyone else, I'm holding my breath."

The York Show debuted in 1934 under the direction of Mabel Renner who reportedly charged a 35 cents admission fee. She aptly managed the show into the 1950s, when she sold the show to Paul Ettline, one of her former York Show employees.

During those early years, the show had opened in a variety of venues, including an old bowling alley that burned to the ground during one of York's more spectacular structural fires.

In 1996, Arion bought the show from the 77-year-old Ettline, subsequently becoming the first vendor to open in the just completed Memorial Hall that opened at the York Fairgrounds. At that time, Arion had 50 dealers in the show.

The show continues to be conducted in Memorial Hall East. In the past few years Arion has filled up the Hall to accommodate close to 100 vendors. He attributed this year's dip in dealer attendance to lingering virus fears.

Arion, from Delaware, is a long-time antique collector and dealer, specializing in 18th and 19th century furniture and accessories.

The show will be open on Sept. 17 and 18 from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. On Sept. 19, the show within the smoke-free and air-conditioned building, will be open from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m.

All CDC protocols regarding Covid-19 will be strictly followed.

Seven works by Schimmel will fly high at Pook & Pook auction

Seven works by Wilhelm Schimmel will cross the auction block at Pook & Pook on Sept. 30-Oct. 1.

Schimmel (1817-1890) was from Cumberland County, Pa., and his works are coveted by lovers of folk art. Historian Karl H. Pass estimated Schimmel produced between 1,000 and 1,500 carvings in his lifetime. Of those about 500 are known to still exist today. Many of them have changed hands at Pook & Pook auctions.

It is unknown when Schimmel arrived in Cumberland, or from whence he came. According to historian Milton E. Flower, an 1870 census puts him in the county prison under the name Heinrich, born in Hesse-Darmstadt, Germany. He did not speak English. An alcoholic, Schimmel was evidently a bad drunk, and would terrorize the streets of Carlisle when on a bender. Exchanged for drink, his "fogels," as he called his eagles, lined the shelves in local saloons. He became a local legend during his 21 years in Cumberland. Of the many colorful stories, the earliest is 1869, when, roaring drunk and plastered in mud, he trashed the office of a lumberyard. Upon being ejected, he hurled rocks into the yard until overcome by return volley fire and escorted to jail. In 1879, Schimmel was sozzled at an auction and attacked a man with an axe. His victim managed to hit him over the head with a stone. Schimmel was reported killed, and very nearly was, but he recovered. In 1882 Schimmel's addiction came close to finishing the job when he stepped off

a train moving at full speed a mile short of the station. He was retrieved and loaded into the baggage car, requiring a month in the almshouse for head and eye injuries. Somehow surviving it all, Old Schimmel continued carving and tramping until he was 73.

According to Flower, who collected oral histories and personal narratives in the 1940s, Schimmel roamed the valley along the Conodoguinet Creek between the houses of German-born families. He gathered leftover ends of wood from carpentry shops and sawmills for his carvings and would sleep in outbuildings and barns in exchange for carvings or doing chores. At times, he would even watch children while their parents went to town. More comfortable in the society of children than adults, he would allow them to gather to watch him carve. Many of the carvings he exchanged were gifts and

toys for children, perhaps inspired by their own animals. Some of the children he taught to carve. Many of the accounts collected by Flower were fond remembrances of Schimmel by these same children.

Schimmel carved mostly birds and animals. He created many roosters, parrots, squirrels, and dogs, and became famed for his eagles. Patriotic fervor around the 1876 Centennial resulted in requests for eagles. Schimmel's eagles adorned flagpoles, roofs, and mantels. Flower noted the influence of the Hapsburg eagle on the style of Schimmel's carvings. His are not conventional 19th century depictions of our national symbol, they are unique to Schimmel. Carved from pine, the eagles are either smooth or covered in saw-toothed crosshatching. The resulting diamond pattern from hatching creates the effect of puffed feathers, the unevenness of the cuts hinting at the motion of muscles below. The spread wings were dovetailed on and covered with detailed feathers. The figures were then carefully gessoed and painted. Observing the eagles from different angles, their eyes stay trained upon you, just like those of real eagles, whose range is 300 degrees. Despite their fierce demeanor, Schimmel's eagles meet your gaze with a soulful tilt of the head.

Today Wilhelm Schimmel is revered as one of America's greatest folk artists. In the 1920s, a surging interest in American folk art propelled this itinerant carver to a level of national recognition. Schimmel's carvings were sought after by top collectors like Abby Aldrich Rockefeller, Henry Francis DuPont, and Elie Nadelman (whose bronze Man's Head will cross the block in this auction). According to Karl Pass,

collectors and museums acquired Schimmels through local dealers, who searched out carvings from the original Cumberland Valley family owners. In 1957, Rockefeller's collection founded the Abby Aldrich Rockefeller Folk Art Museum in Williamsburg. In 1965, the museum held the first major exhibition of Schimmel's work, along with that of his pupil, Aaron Mountz. Since then, recognition of Schimmel's genius has grown, and the value of his pieces, the eagles in particular, has soared.

"Old Schimmel' the German who for many years tramped through this and adjoining counties making his headquarters in jails and almshouses, died at the almshouse on Sunday. His only occupation was carving heads of animals out of soft pine wood. These he would sell for a few pennies each. He was apparently a man of very surly disposition." — The Carlisle Evening Sentinel, August 7, 1890.

On Sept. 30th and Oc.t 1, Pook & Pook will offer seven works by Wilhelm Schimmel in their Americana & International sale. Leading the jubilee is a carved spread winged eagle, retaining its original paint, measuring 9 inches high and 12 inches wide it is estimated at \$12/18,000. Flying close behind is another carved spread winged eagle on perch, retaining its original paint, measuring 7 ¾ inches high and estimated at \$8,000/12,000. Other Schimmel lots include an eaglet, two roosters, a rooster stocking stuffer, and a white and black spotted standing dog, all retaining their original paint. There is also a carved eagle in the manner of Schimmel's pupil, Aaron Mount.

Jason Clark wins top honors at bid-calling contest

ST. IGNACE, Mich. – Professional auctioneer, Jason Clark from Alma, Mich., took top honors at the GoToAuction.com Midwest Auctioneer Championship.

The GoToAuction.com Midwest Auctioneer Championship saw a field of 16 auctioneers from around the Midwest competing for the title of the Grand Champion. The championship was held in conjunction with the Midwest Auctioneers Roundup hosted by the Michigan Auctioneers Association.

There were five finalists: Noah Smith of Howard City, Mich., (5th place), Jason Lamoreaux of Belding, Mich., (4th place), Grant Cole of Beulah, Mich., (3rd place), Ed Leist of Petoskey, Mich., (2nd place) and of course, the Champion Jason Clark. All finalists received a plaque commemorating their achievement and a cash prize.

Clark was born and raised on a small dairy farm and exposed to a lot of auctions. One of his earliest memories of an auction was a small farm liquidation that his Uncle Dick and Bill Clark conducted north of Breckenridge, Mich. Clark says, "I remem-

ber this sale because it was the first sale, I felt the excitement of the auctioneer saying 'SOLD' to me personally. I was bidding on a small two-wheel trailer that I could haul my pig manure in. I remember the excitement of the auction, with the huge crowd of people standing around and visiting, the auctioneers on the loudspeakers, and the

food wagon – it seemed more like the county fair than an auction!" Determined to be a good auctioneer like his Uncle Dick, he practiced around the farm and sold a lot of cattle off a 4010 John Deere while feeding them. He didn't realize it at the time, but pretty much everyone around the farm could hear him, but instead of laughing, they encouraged him.

That encouragement led to his first paying job with John Tomaschko working as a contract auctioneer. After four years working for other auctioneers, he felt comfortable enough to be in business on his own and purchased Pioneer Auction Service from his Uncle Dick. Over the 15 years he's been in the industry, he's competed five times in the Michigan Auctioneer Championship. The first few times, his nerves got the best of him and was so hard on himself he didn't come back for a few years. Every time he competed, he felt he left as a better auctioneer, so he kept trying.

"I would strongly encourage any auctioneer to become a member of the Michigan Auctioneers Association and to com-

pete in the available competitions. You will better yourself and your auction business all around," Clark said. This was the first time Clark competed in the GoToAuction. com Midwest Auctioneer Championship. He said "The appeal of this contest is that it's all about bid calling. I was nervous, but not having an interview made it less nerve-wracking." Clark dedicated his win to his Dad and his Uncle Dick, who have both passed in the last two years.

The GoToAuction.com Midwest Auctioneer Championship was broadcasted live to a worldwide audience. If you missed it, the videos are available on www.youtube.com/michiganauctioneers. "This is a unique competition in the sense there isn't much in the way of rules – other than they must wear a hat, any hat and sell what they are selling within a two-minute time frame. Contestants are scored exclusively on their real-world auction chant – and man, do they put on an authentic show," said GoToAuction.com co-founder and Marketing Director, Kenny Lindsay, CAI.

water in their center. A pottery piece was dipped in the clear water, and the colors quickly raced to adhere. A final twist before removal from the water resulted in the colorful swirls.

For once, the company's promotional claims were right on the money. The ads trumpeted that "the coloring of Nemadji pottery is accomplished in a manner that allows no two pieces to be exactly alike."

Hellman's influence at Nemadji was massive, yet his stay was short-lived. He remained there only until 1931, before leaving for Colorado, and the eventual establishment of his own studio near the Garden of the Gods. However, his contribution to the Nemadji story can't be overemphasized. Despite the introduction of other product lines over the years, Hellman's original designs and techniques remained Nemadji's breadand-butter. That lasted right up until the company's closing in 2002.

Nemadji was essentially "art pottery for the masses", but two things were necessary to guarantee its continued success: dependable sales outlets, and an intriguing storyline which would captivate potential buyers.

Nemadji found the ideal retail outlet in gift shops catering to the tourist trade. As highway travel became more commonplace, particularly after World War II, families piled into the station wagon for fun-filled trips into the Wild West (or at least South Dakota). Souvenirs of these rambles were called for, and Nemadji was there. Each winter, commissioned Nemadji sales representatives made the rounds of trading posts and tourist stops, taking orders for the following year's lineup of vases and pots. Each spring, Nemadji employees worked overtime to fill that avalanche of orders. And each summer, weary-but-happy travelers headed for home, clutching the treasured "Nemadji Indian Pottery" picked up during their journeys.

When it came to a sellable storyline, there were of course all those ads and inserts, romantically lauding the "Indian" heritage of Nemadji Pottery. Clayton Dodge took things a step further, with base stamps featuring an arrowhead, and the wording "Hand Made Nemadji Indian Pottery (from Native Clay)." To please those tourists in search of authenticity, Dodge even had a variety of other stampings available, depending on

where a particular shipment was to be sold: "Nemadji Blackhills Pottery"; "Nemadji Badlands Pottery--Contains Badlands Clay"; and the more all-encompassing moniker, "No. Dak."

That custom died out, but in the 1950s, Ted Hustead, founder of South Dakota's ubiquitous tourist attraction Wall Drug, asked Nemadji to resume stamping "Contains Badlands Clay" on

pottery sold at his store. Harold Wahlstrom, then Nemadji's owner, turned down the request, even after Hustead sent a box of "Badlands Clay," suggesting Wahlstrom mix a bit in with each batch, to justify the stamp.

Was there any real connection at all between Nemadji and Native Americans? The answer is "sort of." Although the Moose Lake area was once home to the Ojibwe, by the time of the town's founding in 1870, most of the original inhabitants had long since been moved to reservations. They did leave behind, however, a notable reminder of their presence: the name "Nemadji." What did it mean? Translated as "left hand," "Nemadji" was simply a directional term for the region's first river on the left, which emptied into Lake Superior.

And that was it. Despite the legends and wishful thinking, there was no "Nemadji tribe" behind Nemadji Pottery. Instead, in an era before cultural appropriation was recognized, enterprising ceramists created their own swirling interpretations of "Southwest style" pottery, and publicists did the rest. While not what original buyers presumed it to be, Nemadji Pottery has since found its own niche, particularly as an accent for Mission and Modern décor schemes. It's affordable, too: most pieces sell for well under \$50. Nemadji once filled souvenir shops nationwide. Taken on its own terms, as a lovely example of mid-century Midwest entrepreneurship, Nemadji continues to fill collectors' shelves today.
