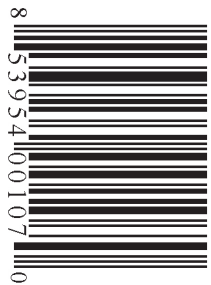

Colorful Bakelite still stylish and fun to collect

Mention Bakelite and colorful, vintage Bakelite jewelry comes to mind. Yet from the early 1900s, this synthetic, phenol-formaldehyde resin, an alternative to brittle, flammable celluloid, has played countless other roles as well.

In fact, some consider this versatile material to be one of the most important inventions of the 20th century.

Initially, due to its exceptional durability and resistance to heat, electricity, and chemical change, Bakelite was used in the emerging automotive, electrical, and electronic industries. During World War I, radio phones, and airplane propellers also featured Bakelite components. In the 1920s, the corporation cast a limited number of solid, transparent Bakelite resin blocks, known as "cast amber," as pieces of jewelry, cigarette holders, and pipe stems.

Interest in molded plastics was rising. So, the Bakelite Company began pressing resin, strengthened with dense cloth, paper, sawdust, or carbon black fillers, in molds. This resulted in inexpensive, smooth pieces that retained their shape, resisted scratches, and could be buffed to brightness. Besides, it was extremely durable.

As a result, this dark, drab brown, or cream-colored material, an alternate to wood and metal, was dubbed "The Material of a Thousand Uses." Bakelite was molded into household items such as napkin rings, tongs, butter knives, cake slicers, cookware, clocks, and cabinet knobs and handles. Furthermore, companies, like Ericsson and Western Electric, produced dark, durable, molded Bakelite telephones.

After the Bakelite resin patent expired in 1927, a competing company, American Catalin Corporation, introduced an innovative, purified alternative, produced without need for strengthening, darkening fillers. Its extensive range of translucent, opaque, and marbled shades proved appealing. Over time, Catalin resin was used to beautify various household objects, like lamps, desk sets, trinket boxes, and cutlery handles.

In response, the Bakelite Corporation, experimenting with colorants and dye saturations, created hundreds of colorful, swirled, and mottled resins. Other companies, like Marblette and Opalon, soon followed suit, creating alabaster, onyx, mottled walnut, and lapis lazuli-hued resins.

During the 1930s, many companies, including RCA, FADA Emerson, and

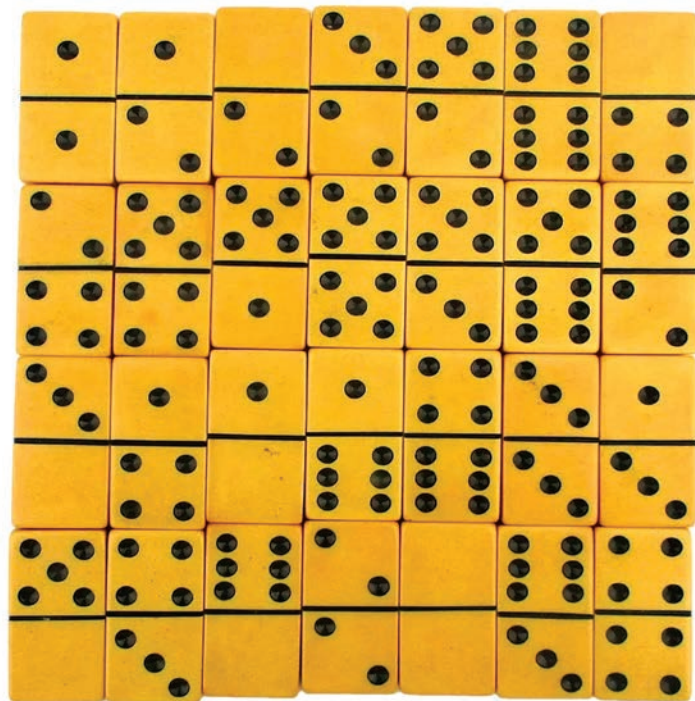

Motorola produced thousands of shiny, modern, inexpensive blue, yellow, green, and cherry-red Catalin table radios. In tune with the times, many also featured sleek, curvy shapes enhanced with Art Deco geometric adornments. Because these have sometimes been stored under extreme conditions in attics or basements, however, many have oxidized to deeper shades or become brittle. So those in prime condition, in full working order, and featuring original on/off and tuning knobs, may command well over \$1,000.

Though these highly collectible radios are traditionally called Catalin, some,

though chemically similar, may have been made by Bakelite or Marblette. To add to the confusion, other products are sometimes described as Bakelite/Catalin. These days, however, Bakelite is the most popular term for all phenol formaldehyde resin products produced through the 1920s and 1930s.

The Art Deco era marked the heyday of Bakelite jewelry. Producing each piece was a lengthy, multi-step procedure. After huge factories created raw resin through a complex chemical process, batches were delivered to design-driven companies where jewelry items were

made. Then each pendant, bracelet, and bead was hand-shaped, carved, scalloped, faceted, waffled, painted, ridged, rippled, or inlaid. Finally, each piece was shone to a sheen.

Before World War II, durable Bakelite poker chips, cue sticks, gaming dice, mah-jong tiles, chessmen, and domino sets were popular as well. Yet the advent of more advanced plastic technologies eventually rendered Bakelite products behind the times.

In recent years, however, fashionistas

Art lovers can immerse themselves in Van Gogh at new touring exhibit

One of the great and sad ironies of the fine art world is the plight of Post-Impressionist Vincent van Gogh, a depression-prone, poverty-stricken figure who died by his own hand in obscurity in 1890 at the age of 37, having sold but a single painting (for a mere pittance) in his lifetime. Contrast this with posthumous worldwide fame and sales in the hundreds of millions of dollars, and you've got a story of pathos and tragedy for the ages.

Ironically, Van Gogh's stature as one of history's greatest artists has inspired the type of kitschy merchandising more commonly associated with actors, athletes, comic strip characters, and rock stars. Such items include T-shirts, coasters, flip flops, magnets, water bottles, throw pillows, journals, mouse pads, baseball caps, iPhone cases, and too many others to list. Van Gogh is hardly unique to this phenomenon (just check any fine

art museum's gift shop), but items bearing the image of his paintings seem especially ubiquitous.

As a huge fan of the artist, and as someone who has seen more than 80 ac-

tual Van Gogh paintings in my lifetime, I typically avoid this kind of stuff like off-brand peanut butter or pirated movies. I do make the occasional exception, like my Van Gogh necktie and coffee mug (okay, I'm a bit of a hypocrite here), but Van Gogh trinkets tend to diminish the brilliant artist's work rather than illuminate it. His broad, thick, swirling, fever-pitched brush strokes and ingenious use of color give his work a uniqueness, boldness, emotional depth, and lasting resonance that fall flat when duplicated on frivolous merchandise. As such, I typically stick with books and posters

when it comes to Van Gogh collecting. At least these things try to replicate his work as well as possible given the obvious restrictions.

I was prepared not to like Van Gogh:

The Immersive Experience, an interactive exhibit that is touring big cities all over the world. I knew going in to this much-hyped attraction there wouldn't be a single original Van Gogh painting on display, but I decided to check it out anyway because some of the videos I saw online looked cool. My wife and I made a date of it as she's a Van Gogh fan as well and is always up for an adventure.

I approached Van Gogh: The Immersive Experience with the attitude that it's obviously a contrived event, but that I might enjoy it if I leave my critic's hat at the door and just experience it for what it is—a celebration of the power and popularity of Van Gogh's work, but without any actual Van Gogh paintings anywhere to be found. And enjoy it I did.

Rather than Van Gogh originals or even prints, there were projected images of his work adorning the walls. I was unimpressed with the static, normal-sized images because they appeared flat, even

Bidding soared high when circus memorabilia came to town

SARASOTA, Fla. — Almost everything in the circus world of the past was about promotion. Advance teams traveled ahead of the circus and distributed various forms of printed materials. These printed materials provide much of today's circus collectible memorabilia. Among these are posters, heralds, window cards, counter cards, and press material for local newspapers.

This entire arrival operation and the shows that followed have left a universe of collectibles. Freedom Auctions most recent circus sale offered 766 lots.

Every human activity appears to have photographers who are especially known for their work documenting that specific activity. Original circus photographs by Frederick Whitman Glazier, Edward J Kely and Harry Alton Atwell were offered in this sale.

Glazier, who once served as the official Ringling Brother's photographer, made his living taking, printing, exhibiting and selling prints of his work. Most images he produced were of the circus or the West and Native Americans, including Buffalo Bill's Wild West shows. Many of the circus performers he photographed would buy his photos to use in their own promotion. Prices ranged from \$50 to \$150 for silver gelatin prints of his work.

Following service in the navy during WW I, Edward Kelly joined the circus in a different way. He created a mobile photo lab in a truck to be able to process his photos on site. He worked primarily in the 1920s and 30s. Known for his panoramic views of large groups of performers this sale sold seven ex-



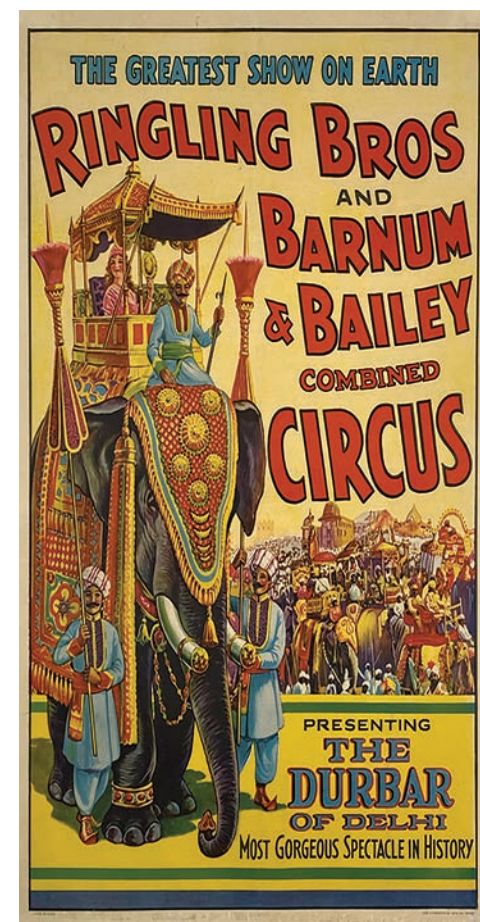

amples from \$140 to \$500.

Chicago based Harry Alton Atwell was an entertainment photographer who became fascinated with the circus and its people in the early 1900s. His images recorded the circus folk, not just their performance or show appearance. Atwell images accounted for only 11 lots and ranged from \$70 to \$375. He also collected the work of other circus photographers which today form a collection at the Wisconsin Historical Society. A smaller Atwell collection is held by the University of California-Riverside.

Once on the circus site, visitors were met

compared to posters. However, a huge, immersive room they had set up in another area of the exhibit was impressive and even surreal. I planted myself on the floor, kicked back, and let the imagery—Van Gogh paintings come to animated life on massive walls—wash over me to the point where I dozed off a couple of times (in a good way). It was very relaxing, and the musical accompaniment fit the scenery nicely.

There were other multi-media attractions as well, including an area where you could color Van Gogh pages, scan the QR codes on said pages, and display your masterpieces on the wall. This was a big hit with kids as well as certain older visitors who probably hadn't picked up a Crayola Crayon in years. There were virtual reality stations, but I thought it was tacky that they charged you an extra \$5 if you wanted to experience the VR. Since tickets to the event were already pricey at \$40 to \$50 each, that extra expense seemed like a bit of an insult. But

if you go, you will want to kick in that extra cash, especially if you've never experienced virtual reality before. It wasn't the greatest VR—the visuals were a little blurry—but it was fun pretending to walk around various areas where Van Gogh lived and worked.

If you've made it this far, I'm sure this review makes me sound like a bit of an art snob, but I just tend to get all worked up when it comes to my favorite artist. I'm profoundly moved by his amazing work, and there's nothing quite like gazing upon a Van Gogh original. Some of his

at the Wisconsin Historical Society. A smaller Atwell collection is held by the University of California-Riverside.

Once on the circus site, visitors were met with hand painted signs encouraging them to see, ride, or eat something. Jim Hand became known as the circus or show painter. Today computers generate such signage making even these items collectible. Hand's signs accounted for eleven lots ranging from \$70 to \$375 for a Topless Gogo Girls example.

The most unique items offered were the thirty-five scrapbook lots that contained the written and photographic diaries of circus people. This collection was built over the years by John and Jan Weifel of Clermont, Fla. These scrapbooks, with untold treasures to be discovered in them, brought from \$40 each for a couple of lots to \$700 for Richard Frey's memorial album honoring "Bird" Millman (O'Day), a tight and slack wire artist.

Closely related was the Nellie Jordan "Writing Album" which sold for \$1,100. Nellie was part of the Flying Jordans aerial act. Dating from 1908 on, this book contained numerous notes and signatures of other performers along with photos and even original art.

For the serious collector or researcher,

a circus route book is a treasure trove. Like a yearbook, a circus would publish these after completing their annual tour. Personalities, events and a city-by-city record is published. A few lots of route books brought \$60 to \$600.

Circus posters were by far the largest part of this sale with 226 lots in groups throughout the sale. Simply seeing these colorful printed promotional items almost made you see, smell and hear the acts that are illustrated. Posters were

the primary form of advertising for these circuses. Many circus poster collectors specialize by an individual circus, act, or type of act such as animals, clowns, juggling, etc. Prices realized ranged from dozens of lots under \$100 to only a handful at \$1,000 or more.

Many serious collectors recognize the value of a reference library making these publications yet another potential collectible. Seventeen lots of books ranged from a group at \$20 to a spiral directory of American Circuses (1732-2000) for \$160. This directory came from Father Hogan's library. Father George "Jerry" Hogan, who passed away this last spring, was known as the "Circus Priest" for his active role among the circus community.

Historians, writers and collectors are always excited to find primary sources of information such as diaries or personal journals. Nellie Jordan's journal, of the Flying Jordans, flew to \$1,100.



A combination of a train and circus big top model would provide a last-minute surprise winning bid of \$3,400 against a presale high estimate of \$1,000. This was a complete hand built 92 square foot layout, with extras, still set up in Father Hogan's residence near Boston.

This was Freedom Auction's seventh circus sale. Asked about how this sale compared with their previous circus auctions, Holifield offered, "demand is strong for this genre. It comes not just from circus collectors, but from cross-over collectors wanting to add a circus piece to their specialty and a few just wanting a sentimental nugget. This sale was on a par with our prior circus sales in terms of participation and prices realized."

Trip flyer recalls the glory days of passenger train travel

Q I have a trip flyer for the “Daylight,” a passenger train operated by the Southern Pacific Company. The train left San Francisco at 8:15 AM Pacific Time and arrived in Los Angeles at 6:25 PM Pacific Time. It made 34 stops in its 475-mile journey. The flyer dates from 1939 or earlier. What is its value?

A The Coast Daylight, known at first as the Daylight Limited, was a passenger train that ran on the Southern Pacific’s Coast Line between San Francisco and Los Angeles. Thanks to its red, orange, and black color scheme, it was known as “the most beautiful passenger train in the world.”

Southern Pacific’s Daylight Limited’s inaugural run was on April 28, 1922. The trip took approximately 13 hours. Initially, it ran only on Friday and Saturday between April and the end of November. Daily operations began in July 1923. During the 1924 season, the running time was shortened to 12 hours.

At first, the train made no intermediate stops. The streamlined Daylight began on March 21, 1937. It was pulled by two GS-2 steam locomotives. The run was shortened to 9 3/4-hours. As time passed, additional stops were added.

The Coast Daylight ran on steam until Jan. 7, 1955. The Coast Daylight became the Morning Daylight in 1949, when a Noon Daylight was introduced.

Amtrak took over intercity passenger service in 1972. The Coast Daylight was retained as an unnamed train. Schedule changes were made. In 1974, Amtrak merged it with the Coast Starlight.

The trip flyer is a reminder of the elegance once associated with railroad passenger trains. The Daylight had a dining car and tavern car that were open throughout the trip. Breakfast in the dining car cost 30¢, 45¢, or 60¢. Luncheon or dinner cost 45¢, 50¢, and 75¢. Dessert was not included in the 45¢ dinner. The coffee shop, part of the tavern car, and tavern served drinks and food on an a la carte basis.

A “news agent” traversed the train throughout the journey selling souvenirs, playing cards, sunglasses, candies, dates, figs, gum, tobacco, stamps, magazines, and other items. A maid was available to assist women traveling with small children.

Worthpoint.com’s Worthopedia contains listings for several Southern Pacific Daylight trip flyers. Sell-through prices average between \$13.50 and \$15. All the trip flyer listings date from the post-1945 period. Add a \$3 to \$4 premium for your earlier schedule.

RINKER ON COLLECTIBLES

Q I inherited a collection of stamp plate blocks from the late 1940s. The collection includes a 3-cent block of the GAR Final National Encampment (Scott 985), a 3-cent block of the Minnesota Territorial Centennial (Scott 981), a 3-cent block of the 200th Anniversary of Washington and Lee University (Scott 982), a 3-cent block of Edgar Allan Poe (Scott 986), and a 6-cent block of the 200th anniversary of the United States Postal Service Airmail (Scott C40). Do these plate blocks have any collector interest and/or value?



A The good news is that the stamps can be used for postage, provided you do not mind licking a lot of stamps. Hence, a 3-cent block of four is worth 12-cents and 6-cent block of four 24-cents. So much for the good news.

A stamp plate block is a block of four or more stamps with the salvage attached showing the numbers assigned by the printer to the plate. The United States Postal Service has assigned plate block numbers to stamps since the 19th century. The layout and size of the plate block depends on the method used to print the stamps.

Plate block collecting was extremely popular in the mid-20th century. Beginning collectors would scurry to the local post office each time a new stamp was issued to secure a plate block. It was an era when the United States Postal Service still sold stamps on an individual basis. Special stamp plate block albums were created.

By the end of the third decade of the 20th century, interest in plate block collecting declined, due in part to the Postal Service using multiple plate numbers

(one of each color) on the salvage. Instead of buying four stamps, collectors had to buy a quarter to half a pane of stamps.

The arrival of eBay in the early 1980s, flooded the secondary plate block market. Prices collapsed. Many post-1945 plate blocks sell for less than a dollar, some barely above the face value of the stamps.

Crossover collectors, as opposed to stamp collectors, help maintain a modest secondary market for some plate blocks. For examples, a literary scholar might be attracted to the Edgar Allen Poe block. A Civil War or GAR collector might want to add the GAR block as a peripheral ephemera item to his/her collection.

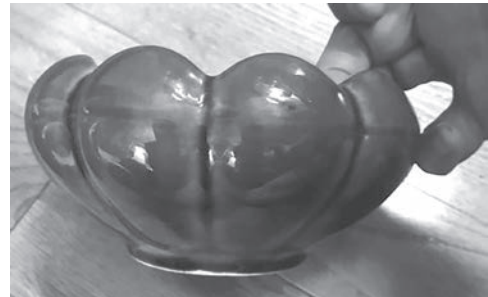
Stamp catalogs list the 3-cent plate blocks in mint condition at \$1 each. The six-cent plate block ranged around 65-cents. Getting these retail values is next to impossible, especially when selling. My recommendation is to add up the number of plate blocks, sell them as a lot (using 25-cents times the number of plate blocks), and take any offer that comes close.

There is an additional approach. See if you can find a youngster who is a beginning stamp collector. Your local librarian should be able to provide a contact for a local stamp club. Ask the club to help you identify the young collector and gift the plate blocks to him/her.

Q I have an olive green, melon-shaped bowl marked “509 / FLORALINE / USA” on the bottom. Should I keep or toss it?

A Your Floraline bowl was made by McCoy. Your piece dates from the 1960s. The same mold number in Floraline was used in the 1970s for a different body pattern.

The McCoy Floraline bowl came in a wide variety of colors – ivory, lavender, yellow with black outline on top, and more.



A “sale date” search on Worthpoint.com’s Worthopedia suggests a secondary market retail prices is around \$15. My field experience suggests two things. First, demand is minimal. Second, getting anywhere near this price is difficult if not impossible.

Your Floraline bowl is garage/yard

sale fodder. You can try it at \$5 but take any offer over \$1.

Q I am trying to find out more information about a set of Post Office uniform buttons I purchased at an antiques mall. The buttons appear to be from a shirt or jacket. The buttons are one-half inch in diameter and have a relief image of a person with his hand extended that appears to be holding mail and the letters “POD” below. The buttons are marked on the back “SUPERIOR.” The buttons had a wire loop on the back. Any information you can provide would be appreciated.

A There were a wide variety of “P. O. D.” buttons. A “RAILWAY / P O D / MAIL SERVICE” button was made by “SCOVILLE MFG. CO. / WATERBURY.” The same button was made by “HORSTMANN BROS. / PHI.” There also were POD air mail buttons.

An early button featured a horse and rider with “P.O.D.” at the bottom. The button had a vertical stippled background. Post Office Delivery buttons featuring a mail carrier with outstretched hands were made by Cincinnati Ragalia Co. Mathers Bros. (Utica), O. H. E. M. Co. (Baltimore), Techheimrer Bros. Co. (Cincinnati), Utica Button Company, and Waterbury Button Company. Apparently, the Post Office used multiple suppliers simultaneously or change contractors frequently. I also found an example with “EXTRA QUALITY” and “SUPERIOR QUALITY” on the back. The modern US Postal Service buttons feature a winged eagle over “U. S. MAIL.”

The “SUPERIOR QUALITY” POD button came in several sizes including 1/2-inch and 7/8-inch diameter.

When sold in lots, POD buttons average between \$2 and \$4 per unit. When sold individually values average around \$5 with an occasional bidder spending slightly over \$10 depending on condition, size, and age.

Bidders will be blowing their horns when Tiffany Studios window hits Fontaine's

PITTSFIELD, Mass. — Fontaine's Auction Gallery will shine a light on impressive fine and decorative arts from the 19th and 20th centuries at its auction on Saturday, Sept. 25, at 11 a.m. The sale includes 500 lots, consisting of works by Tiffany Studios, Duffner & Kimberly, Handel, Pairpoint, Gorham, Whiting, Tiffany & Co., Gustav Stickley, Daum Nancy, Émile Gallé, Rene Lalique, Royal Vienna, KPM, R.J. Horner etc.

"Buyers come to us for certain things, and that list includes Tiffany lighting, art glass, leaded glass windows, clocks, American and European furniture, fine silver, and marble/bronze statuary, to name a few," said John Fontaine, owner of Fontaine's Auction Gallery. "We will have standouts in all the collecting categories we are renowned for, and then some."

The auction will kick off with an iconic example of art glass, a Tiffany Studios "Peacock" and "Gooseneck" Favrile glass vase (\$15/25,000), which is said to be one of Louis Comfort Tiffany's most original forms, inspired by the Persian rosewater sprinklers he esteemed. The window proportions and glass craftsmanship are sublime and the window has quite a visual presence that seems realistic while highlighting the supernatural essence of the angel portrayed.

Tiffany Studios lamps, of course, will be well received in this auction and highlights include a

1894 San Francisco Mint dime sells for \$1.8 million

Who says 10 cents won't buy a cup of coffee anymore? A small silver dime made in 1894 at the San Francisco Mint has been sold for \$1.8 million.

"Mint records indicate only 24 dimes were struck at the San Francisco Mint in 1894. Today only nine of them with that date on the front and the letter S mintmark on the back are known to still exist. This was a record price for this particular example," said Laura Sperber president of Legend Numismatics of Lincroft, New Jersey. She acquired the coin for \$1.8 million on behalf of collector Bruce Morelan of Las Vegas.

"Bruce now owns the trifecta of multi-million-dollar United States numismatics: one of the eight known original 1804 U.S. silver dollars, one of the five known 1913 Liberty Head nickels and now one of the nine known 1894 San Francisco

dimes. We are looking at the possibilities of publicly exhibiting all three together at a major rare coin show," said Sperber.

"I'm very excited at the opportunity to own this magnificent coin," stated Morelan. "Very few collectors have ever owned all of the top three most famous American rarities. I'm proud to join that very exclusive group that includes such legendary 20th century collectors as Baltimore financier Louis E. Eliasberg Sr. who was nicknamed 'The King of Coins,' Wall Street investor Col. E.H.R. Green, and former Los Angeles Lakers basketball team owner Dr. Jerry Buss."

"This was the third 1894-S dime acquired for collectors by Legend since our company's founding in 1987," said Sperber.

Many seek bracelets featuring green-yellow, butterscotch-brown, or "Mississippi Mud" marbling. Others find "end of the day" marbled bracelets — featuring odd hues apparently cobbled from random batches of leftover resin attractive.

However, some of the most collectible Bakelite bracelets, boast bright, chunky, handmade beads spaced along elastic strips or tiny, charm-like Bakelite/celluloid fruits and vegetables. But to many, items featuring multicolor, laminated, horizontal or zig-zag wedges are most alluring of all. Prices vary widely. A glowing Apple Juice belt buckle, featuring gorgeous green, orange, butterscotch, and root beer laminated striping, for instance, may command several hundred dollars. Yet a multicolored, laminated Bakelite Philadelphia hinged bracelet, "the most desirable machine-age piece of jewelry of all -- in any mode, medium or material" commands thousands more," explains Matt Burkholz, Bakelite connoisseur and owner of Route 66 West at rubylane.

Bakelite clip earrings are far more affordable. Single-shade hoops, circles, triangles, and dangles easily coordinate with bracelets of similar shades, while those resembling fruit baskets, birds, or blossoms, for instance, are more colorful. Yet elegant Bakelite teardrop clips, dazzling with diamond, rhinestone, turquoise, or metallic touches, are the epitome of Art Deco chic.

Scores of Bakelite figural pins are molded like tempting bananas, strawberries, and clusters of cherries. Others depict trendy, silver Egyptian motifs or replicate precious jade, jet, cinnabar, or ivory. Resin-washed figural pins, depicting everyday items like boats, blossoms, wide-brimmed hats, or horses, however, may reflect personal pastimes or passions.

Through the 1950s, small, affordable Bakelite dress clips, ornamental pins decorating handbags, furs, and dress straps or necklines, were the fashion accessory. Many featured dramatic, deep carvings or eye-catching, articulated movements. Swanky, lightweight Bakelite square, oval, and rounded cufflinks, available in an array of colors, were also stylish. Though small, they packed a punch.

Abundantly available Bakelite buttons, likely snipped from dresses before relegating them to rag piles, also evoke yesteryear.

Other fans assemble specialized button collections. Some seek only stars, squares, triangles, ovals, or circles. Some seek carved, rippled, or ridged ones in particular shades or sizes. Others prefer buttons encased in ornate metal frames or two-tone, three-tone or multicolor models. Yet figural buttons, molded into anything from giraffes, pelicans, and Scottie dogs to Tom, Tom, the Piper Son or sets of Snow White Seven Dwarves, are most charming of all. Once upon a time, however, they must have been the dickens to button up.

Gangly-jointed Bakelite toy figurines, rotund dollies, and fetching rattles were popular through the 1940s. So were toddler spoons, rabbit-shaped napkin rings, Happy Birthday candle holders, and pencil sharpeners depicting favorite Disney characters. After Tykie Toy Tales, a promotional book for the Tykie Toy Company, was issued in 1946, a series of very collectible Bakelite crib toys illustrating its characters were introduced. These include Bobby Bear, Baby Bunny, Eddie Egg, and Katie Kitten.

Due to its populari-

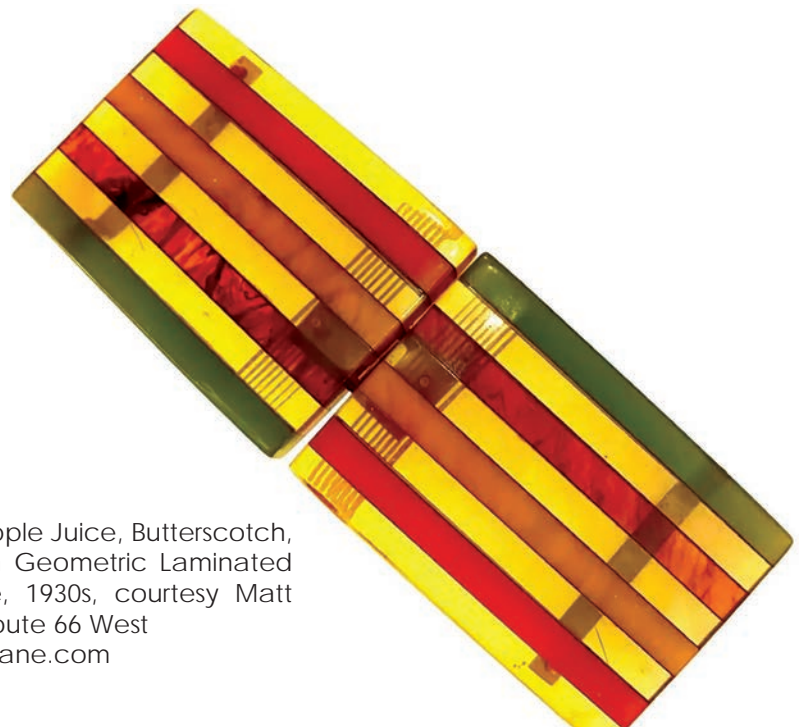
ty, Bakelite pieces are often replicated with modern synthetics. To differentiate real from reproduction, experts recommend using all five senses. Authentic Bakelite is typically heavy, lustrous, and may exhibit microscopic chips or scratches, along with well-worn patinas. Pieces also emit characteristic "clunks" when tapped together.

"If you haven't handled enough Bakelite to know it when you see it," said Madeline Colletti, at Bohemian Boutique in Georgetown, Mass, "it's best to buy from a reputable source. There are also various 'tricks' for testing Bakelite on the spot. The one I like best is to rub it vigorously on a piece of cloth and then sniff it. If it's genuine Bakelite, you should be able to detect a chemical formaldehyde or petroleum-like odor."

In addition to the authoritative, full-color volume *The Bakelite Collection* by Matt Burkholz, *Bakelite Jewelry: Good, Better, Best* by Donna Wasserstrom, and *Bakelite Pins* by Karima Parry, may also prove interesting.
