Vintage cards can be the perfect way to say 'Happy Birthday'

"Joyeux Anniversaire". . . "Lang zal hij/zig leven". . . "Zum Geburtstag Viel Gluck"...


"Sto lat". . . "Zhu ni sheng ri kuai le". Whether in French, Dutch, German, Polish, or Mandarin Chinese, the sentiments remain pretty much the same: "Happy Birthday to You!" With very few exceptions, birthdays are joyously celebrated around the globe. And well they should be. After all, when else do you get a day's worth, (or a week's worth, or even a month's worth, depending on how effectively you milk it), of effusive good wishes just for being you?

Cards are the most prevalent means of commemorating birthdays, and the general tradition of card exchange has its roots in the distant past. In ancient Egypt, good wishes were scraped on papyrus; in imperial China, hand-lettered greetings were the custom. During the centuries that followed, well-wishers continued to rely on similar meticulous means of handicraft. Such options were both expensive and time-consuming, limiting the number of cards that could realistically be produced.

With the development of lithography in the 19th century, recognizing notable occasions with a card became both more feasible and more affordable. The refinement of commercial printing in the early 1900s finally put what Hallmark enshrined as "caring enough to send the very best" within the economic range of one and all. Also playing an important role in greeting card growth: affordable postage, which meant that even those too cashstrapped to spring for a gift could at least send some form of birthday remembrance. In 19th-century England, sending a birthday card had been seen as a form of apology. The ideal was to extend birthday wishes in person; failing that, a card was "the next-best thing." Now, rather than serving as an apology, a birthday card





Russell Springs Antique Mall closing; selling collections at auction

RUSSELL SPRINGS, Ky. - Neatly tucked within the southern hills of south Kentucky, the Russell Springs Antique Mall was one of those places an avid antiquer wouldn't tell his neighbor antiquer about. Thing is, though, he probably already knew about the spot.

Out-of-the-way from the hustling, bustling crowds; but located at the Gateway to Lake Cumberland, people from all over the country have kicked around inside the Russell Antique Store.

"The Russell" was founded by David and Linda Stephens, opening in 1991 after David retired. David had been puttering around with antiques ever since he was working for the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) in Texas. As a chemistry/biology researcher he was promoted to a position on a New York City project.

Predictably the boy from Kentucky wasn't pleased with the ambiance of the city, and he was back in no time at Russell Springs. From there, he changed his career to education, taught at several area schools and ended up finishing a 5-year professional tenure





in antiques. In 1988, he launched his first all-out assault on a collecting category - cookie jars. His collection topped out at more than 850 cookie jars and earned him the title as "The Cookie Jar Man."

David particularly liked the human side of the antique game. Within the 5,000-square-foot shop, he filled it will all manner of antiques and collectibles. The cookie jars (well, most of the cookie jars) weren't for sale. But David loved to find the unique, haggle, swap and cajole with people.

"He had been thinking about doing this for five years," Linda said. "And it was the perfect idea. David was good with people; he truly loved the business, and it was a thriving business. We had Lake Cumberland and the big Highway 127 yard sale goes through the county. We had many good years.

The second sale is scheduled for Oct. 19-Nov. 2; and the third sale, Nov. 23-Dec. 7. All the sales are being conducted by Golden Rule - Wilson Real Estate and Auctions.

ored stemware is in vogue, he said; consider swapping out a colorless stem for a colored one (although purists might still insist upon a clear glass for wine). Think "upscale modern."

There does remain the issue of cleanup. But this is less of a problem with a smaller group of people dining together. As for washing silver flatware, Keith explained that it's dishwasher-safe if you don't mix it with other metals. For years, I've avoided using lemon-scented detergents because of their acidic nature (an old hint from Replacements). Add a fresh table runner or tablecloth, colorful placemats or napkins, and you're in business.

Finally, if the dining room table is otherwise occupied, Keith suggested using a cocktail table in the living room, or maybe even taking the meal outdoors, weather permitting (remember, he lives in the South). "But still make it special."

The mall has been a fixture in of Plainfield since the late 1980s, offering a wide variety of collectibles, memorabilia and antique items.

"We're thrilled with the way things have started out. We have a great staff that have stayed on and we're full as far as dealer stalls are concerned," Tedrow said. "My son-in-law, Doug Bryant, has had a long-held interest in antiques so when I found out Gilley's was for sale, I immediately thought of him. He's going to manage the business and it's a win/win for us both."

While no interior changes are planned, Tedrow and Bryant hope to remind past and future customers the antique mall is there and ready with a full range of items, including antique, retro, primitive, vintage, collectibles, home décor and repurposed items.

"I grew up in Mooresville and have been coming here for 30 years or so," Bryant said. "Gilley's has been around for a long time, but I'm still surprised by the number of people that come by and say it's the first time they've been here. This is a great



PAGE 10 French dolls were the belles of the ball at Pook & Pook auction

DOWINGTOWN, Pa. - Pook & Pook presented a stellar online only auction on July 28 and 29 that brought impressive prices for a wide diversity of items. Unique objects of high quality characterized the sale that consisted of approximately 1,500 lots. Chief among them was a collection of antique French dolls, three of which achieved the top lots of the entire sale.

The staggering price of \$21,402 was realized for a 31-inch tall French Bru Jne bisque doll that carried an estimate of \$3,000 to \$5,000. The doll had a bisque swivel head and shoulders, fixed blue paperweight eyes, painted eyebrows, a closed mouth, pierced ears, and cork pate. The body was made of kid leather, with molded breasts and lower bisque arms with lower wooden legs. It was inscribed. "BRU Jne 12," retained faint remains of the original label, and the shoes were stamped, "Bebe Jumeau Depose."

According to Jamie Shearer, Vice President, Appraiser & Auctioneer, the doll sold well beyond even the most ambitious house anticipation. "We figured it would bring about \$10,000 but a lot of stars aligned for these exceptional dolls. The doll market is generally soft at present but French dolls lead the pack in popularity, as always, and these particular dolls were standouts because they had very nice faces with pleasant, soft expressions, which is what collectors are looking for these days."

An unmarked 26-inch tall French Bru bisque head doll claimed the second highest price of the day outdistancing the high estimate of \$1,500, commanding a strong \$10,578. It had fixed paperweight eyes, a closed mouth, pierced ears, painted eyebrows, and cork pate. The kid leather body, with bisque lower arms, was dressed in a period outfit with "L. I." marked shoes.

A French bisque socket head and shoulder doll, with fixed blue paperweight eyes, closed mouth, painted eyebrows, pierced ears, and cork pate, but no wig, had a kid leather body that was 25 inches tall. The forehead at the hairline was stamped "Bte S. G. D. G.," the back of the neck was stamped "4," and the shoulder stamped "5." The doll was estimated at \$800 to \$1,200 but flew past that mark to achieve \$8,241.

Apart from the dolls, items of interest that brought outstanding prices in their genre included a set of four 19th century small hand brooms, approximately 15 ½ inches long. The brooms showed appropriate wear and sold for \$2,583, more than ten times the high estimate of \$200. Shearer commented that brooms have always been a popular sale item and hand brooms are considered rare.

Another unusual find that commanded keen bidder attention was a 28-inch-high Victor phonograph, with an oak horn, that soared past the \$400 to \$600 mark to realize \$2,835, despite some losses to the horn. Shearer noted that 80% of the horns on a phonograph are tin, not wood.

A 19 1/2 inch tall carved and painted bird tree by Paul Tyson was signed and dated, "76, #49." It was cataloged as being in very good condition with no apparent damages or repairs and sold for \$2,394, outdistancing a \$300 to \$500 estimate. Paul Tyson (1921- 1984), Pottstown, Pa., was a wood carver who created excellent pieces that rarely come to market.

Furniture included a 76-inch-high oak chiming clock and stand, by G.W. Russell, who worked in Philadelphia, 1831-1850. Chiming clocks differ from tall case clocks in that they are not as tall and are made in two pieces, with the clock mounted on a stand. The clock was in good condition and sold past the high estimate of \$1,200, yielding \$3,087.

An early 1700s William and Mary turned great chair, constructed from period and non-period elements, had been restored with some newer parts. It was in good condition and brought \$3,321 against a high estimate of \$500.



Graceland contract signed by the King sings a \$114,660 tune at auction

PHOENIX, Ariz. – The 1957 contract signed by Elvis Presley and both of his parents for the purchase of the home in Memphis that became known as Graceland soared to \$114,660 in an online auction held August 10 by PristineAuction.com, based in Phoenix.

"This auction was certainly one of a kind," said Jared Kavile the president and founder of PristineAuction.com. "The company is proud to be part of the sale of such an incredible piece of history. The legend of The King will always live on, and Graceland is one of the most famous mansions in the world, visited by millions of people from around the globe. To be part of that is an honor."

The contract was the actual purchase agreement allowing the Presleys to purchase the property at 3764 Highway 51 in Memphis. It was printed on Virginia Grant Realty Company letterhead and included Virginia Grant's handwritten agreement, stating the Presleys would trade their property on Audubon Drive in Memphis for \$55,000 credit, plus an extra \$90,000 to purchase Graceland.

When Elvis was a boy, he told his parents one day he would make a lot of money and take care of them, putting an end to their years of hard work and financial struggles. Buying the Graceland mansion was the fulfillment of that childhood promise.

The custom-framed document, 30 by 34 inches, was dated March 17, 1957. It was signed by Elvis, his parents (Vernon

and Gladys) and agent Virginia Grant, who signed her name in red and black ink pen. The \$114,660 purchase price included the buyer's premium. After Presley's 1977 death, Graceland was named a National Historic Landmark. It opened to the public in 1982.



knee-slapper had been replaced by sardonic "studio cards" — those long cards with the short punch lines. One studio card example: a front cover illustration of a bucolic hillside. The caption: "Where are you in this picture?" The interior message: "Over the hill!"

For those preferring a softer approach, cards with floral décor, or "Ideals"-like illustrations of rustic scenes, have always remained popular, as have birthday cards directed either toward specific relatives ("Son"; "Wife"), or toward the not-so-specific ("To The Man Who Married My Daughter"). Especially popular today are "handmade" cards, with their straw ties, ransom-note-like irregular lettering on recycled paper stock, watercolor-y illustrations, and other intimations of individual craftsmanship. The message is clear: if not the sender's, at least someone's hands worked on these. Also a 21st century hit: those ubiquitous e-cards, often complete with dancing figures and perky music, which make checking your laptop on birthday morning a party all in itself.

Birthday card collectors are particularly drawn to cards from the 1930s through the 1960s, prized for their eye-catching color, novel designs, and innocent sentiments. Always in demand: cards with "extras," such as glitter, foil, ribbons, or dimensional foldouts. Sometimes the add-on itself is the real draw: a 1939 card by Meryle, for instance, features a removable red Bakelite "Scottie" pin; the pin's value far outweighs the intrinsic value of the actual card.

Signed and dated cards, especially those with hand-written personal messages, add a human dimension to birthday card collecting, and offer a glimpse into the everyday lives of their long-ago authors. Here's one from the 1940s:

"Hope your birthday is the happiest. Kind of on pins and needles here. Expect Jimmy's division was in that invasion of Okinawa. Got a letter from him Saturday. He is so good to write me. Couldn't make it if he didn't. I love and miss him so much."

Of course, the nicest thing about a birthday card collection is that startup is a snap. Everyone has, at some time or another, received at least one birthday card. Add another, and a collection is born! The national average says each person receives seven cards. Whether heartfelt or humorous, elaborate or e-greeting, birthday cards today remain big busi-

Another "Happy Birthday" first: when Apollo IX astronauts belted out a rendition in 1969, it became the first tune sung in outer space.


In 1989, Fort Payne, Alabama, celebrated its 100th birthday with the "World's Largest Birthday Cake." Over 16,000 pounds of icing coated the confection, which weighed in at a whopping 128,238 lbs., 8 oz.






Below: A Jackie Cooper-like little tough guy offers some down-to-earth phrasing on a mid-1940s birthday card from Golden Bell Greetings.






Above: Early personalization: turn the dial to select the birthday. Hmmm. Looks like somebody has one on Oct. 9. McKenzie Greetings, 1949.

cards you're after, you'll be happy to know that they remain readily available and affordable and can often be found at paper shows and estate sales. Prices range from \$1 for simple cards, to \$30 for cards with all the elaborate bells and whistles.

Since birthday cards were usually carefully packed away as keepsakes to be treasured, their condition remains surprisingly intact, despite the passage of years. The exception: cards which were glued into scrapbooks. Enjoy these "as is," without trying to remove them from their books. Any attempt to dissolve the glue would also, in all probability, dissolve the
