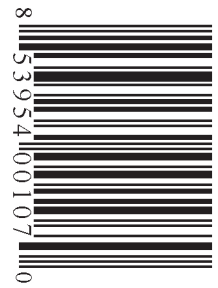

Legend of Stingy Jack leads to a world of decorated pumpkins

Stingy Jack, also known as Jack the Smith and Jack of the Lantern, is a mythical, Irish character associated with All Hallows Eve (Halloween). The term "Jack-o-Lantern" is derived from the legend of Stingy Jack.

Long ago, there lived a mean, worthless drunkard named Jack the Smith, who was popularly called Stingy Jack. Jack was known throughout all of Ireland as a miserly trickster, who enjoyed playing tricks on everyone he knew, including Satan.

One dark night, Jack tricked Satan into climbing up an old apple tree. Once Satan was high in the branches, Jack quickly placed crucifixes around the tree's trunk, stopping Satan from climbing down. Stingy Jack then forced Satan to promise that he, upon Jack's death, would never take Jack's soul. After making the promise, Jack removed the crucifixes and let the devil go his way.

Nearly a half century passed, and Jack finally died. When he stood before Saint Peter, at Heaven's pearly gates, Saint Peter notified Jack that he was too mean and stingy to enter Heaven. Stingy Jack quickly went to Hell and asked Satan for eternal lodging there;

however, the devil remembered his promise from 50 years earlier and refused to allow Jack to enter Hell.

Stingy Jack was forced to wander the darkness between Heaven and Hell for eternity because of his trickery and meanness. The devil, perhaps out of pity, gave Stingy Jack an ember from the flames of Hell so that Jack might see his way. Jack placed the ember in a hollowed-out turnip, one of his favorite foods, creating a lantern, which he called "Jack's Lantern."

From that day forward, throughout all of eternity, Stingy Jack roams the earth between the planes of Heaven

and Hell, lighting his way with his Jack-o-Lantern.

As the story states, the original Jack-o-Lantern was formed by hollowing out a turnip. The Irish also used potatoes, gourds, and rutabagas to hold candles and ward off evil spirits. During the early 1800s, several

Revolutionary War comes to life in Troiani paintings

PHILADELPHIA — A defiant Nathan Hale, a sign reading “Rebel Spy” around his neck, his hands behind his back. Mary Hays, better known as “Molly Pitcher,” her clothing tattered, and her face streaked as she loads a cannon with her grimy hands. An animated George Washington, astride a handsome horse, actively leading the charge. These and scores of others, named and unnamed, come to life in Don Troiani’s paintings of the American Revolution. And for the first time, forty-six of these paintings by the nationally renowned historical artist have been brought together and are currently on display at the Museum of the American Revolution in Philadelphia. Among them is a painting commissioned for the Museum, now part of its permanent collection.

On exhibit until Sept. 5, 2022, “Liberty: Don Troiani’s Paintings of the Revolutionary War” provides “a reliable answer to ‘What did the Revolution look like?’” in the words of Matthew Skic. As curator of exhibitions at the Museum, Skic describes Troiani’s artwork as the result of “extensive and meticulous research,” which, combining with a “flare for dramatic scenes” and a “sense of humanity,” portrays the



trials and hardships of the time.

Skic characterized this exhibition, spread over some 5,000 square feet of gallery space, as “blockbuster-style.” The largest of the oil-on-canvas battle scenes, “The Oneida at the Battle of Oriskany, August

6, 1777,” measures approximately 90 inches wide. Figure studies, watercolor and gouache on Bristol board, are considerably smaller.

In addition to Troiani’s heart-wrenching images are 40 Revolutionary War relics, including some from the artist’s personal collection. Some of the objects on display were used in the creation of the paintings, while others are connected to the scenes. Among the artifacts are an original Hessian cap, fragments of a captured silk flag (as well as tassels that once adorned it), and a Hessian musket and sword, all of which helped to ensure accuracy in “Battle of Trenton, December 26, 1776.” Also notable are epaulettes (“extremely rare” in Skic’s words) that belonged to Sgt. James Davenport, a non-commissioned officer who fought at Yorktown. Marked with their owner’s initials, their provenance is impeccable, having been passed down through his family.

On a broader picture and leaning into the Museum’s mission that “a more diverse story is a more accurate story,” is the Troiani painting entitled “Brave Men As Ever Fought.” The story behind the inspiration for the work is remarkable in itself: On his 15th birthday, Sept. 2, 1781, a free Black sailor named James Forten was

Al Capone auction shows the family side of the gangster

SACRAMENTO, Calif. — A different side of Al Capone was showcased during an Oct. 8 auction conducted by Witherell’s. Billed as “A Century of Notoriety: The Estate of Al Capone,” the auction presented a fascinating study of the legendary gangster as family man, husband, and father.

However, the gangster was also represented in the 16 guns auctioned, 15 pistols and a rifle including a Colt .45-caliber that Al Capone carried every day when he infamously controlled the streets of Chicago.

Diane Patricia Capone, Al Capone’s granddaughter, said in an interview concerning this auction, “My grandfather’s name is synonymous with Chicago gangland history, but what I found lacking, as an adult looking back, is that there was very little information about his private life, his personal family life. He was “Papa” to us, a very loving grandfather figure who played with us in the garden. The public doesn’t realize he was so completely devoted to his family.”

Seating at the auction was limited and by invitation only, but there were over 1,000 registered online bidders.

The first lot to cross the auction block was a hand-colored silver print of Al Capone and his young son, Sonny Capone. In the photo, Al has his arm draped over his son’s shoulders, and big Al is smiling, wearing a fedora, suit with vest, and red boutonniere. When the hammer fell, the realized price was \$11,495.

The 175-lot auction included 50 photographic lots mostly of Al, his wife, Mae, Sonny, Sonny’s wife, and Al’s three granddaughters. There was even a photo offered

of Al and some of his cronies hanging out in Hot Springs, Arkansas, a “cease fire” safe area for gangsters. This silver print realized \$9,075.

The last photograph ever taken of Al Capone with his wife, Mae, and his three granddaughters was also offered. The photo was taken at his home on Palm Island, Florida, shortly before his death by syphilis at age 48. This photo, representing the passing of a legend, sold for \$19,360.

A letter from Capone to his son was written from a prison cell on Alcatraz Island, Brian Witherell, of Witherell’s, said of this letter, “Capone’s letter to his son gets to the soul of a person. It is a much more intimate object and tells a story. History is important and objects tell stories, and these objects [such as this letter] tell the story of one of America’s most important and legendary figures.”

This letter, hand written in pencil and three pages long, said in part, “To My Dear Son, Well Son of my heart, here is dear father, who loves you with all my heart and proud to have a son, as smart as you are... Give Mother a nice big kiss for me and God bless you both. Your dear Father Alphonse Capone.” When the gavel fell, Al’s letter to his son sold for \$56,700.

Of the 16 guns sold in this auction two of the pistols belonged to Al Capone, and the other 14 weapons belonged to Sonny Capone. The highlight of the auction was Al Capone’s .45-caliber semi-automatic pistol.

The provenance of this Colt Model 1911 .45-caliber pistol passed uninterrupted from Al Capone to Mae Capone to Sonny Capone, and, upon Sonny’s death, to his daughters.

Diane Capone said of this pistol, “There were numerous attacks on my grandfather, so Papa carried a .45-caliber Colt semi-au-

tomatic pistol. In a biography on him, my grandfather was referred to as ‘the most shot at man in America.’ This Colt .45 was his number one gun for protection, as far as he was concerned, and I know he referred to this pistol as his ‘sweetheart.’”

Al’s “sweetheart” .45 opened with a \$50,000 bid, quickly jumped to \$160,000, and then rose in increments of \$10,000 until the hammer finally fell, realizing \$1,040,600.

A few of the other guns included Al’s Colt Model 1908 hammerless .38-caliber semi-automatic that realized \$242,000, and Sonny’s pistols, including his massive “Dirty Harry” style Smith and Wesson Model 29 .44-caliber magnum revolver that sold for \$6,050, his .25-caliber Italian-made automatic pistol that sold for \$3,933, his Walther PP 9 mm

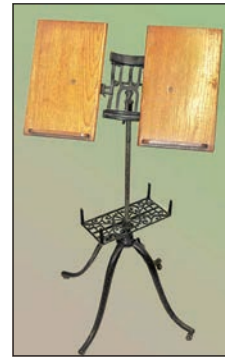

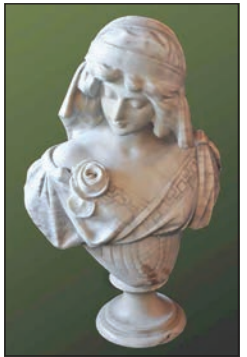

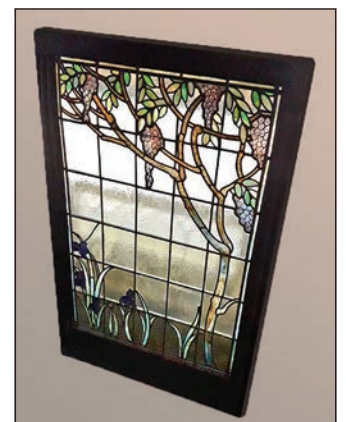

among the crowd of thousands who cheered on the Rhode Island Regiment as its members marched along Chestnut Street in Philadelphia on the way to Yorktown, Virginia. Two companies of that regiment were entirely made of soldiers of African and Native American ancestry.

Years later, Forten, a successful businessman, wrote a letter to a fellow abolitionist, recalling the scene. Passing by what is now called Independence Hall were "brave men as ever fought," he stated. This reminiscence has been captured by Troiani in a painting commissioned for the Museum and funded by the Washington-Rochambeau Revolutionary Route National Historic Trail of the National Park Service. It captures the mixed emotions of the day: Contrasting with the gallantry of the dedicated soldiers are small detail, two young boys in the foreground, one munching on an apple and the other smoking a pipe, and a lone cat, unaffected by the commotion and calmly sitting on a window ledge (which, as it happens, is just steps away from the current site of the Museum).

For those looking to get a sense of the Revolutionary War, this exhibition beckons. Beginning with "The Boston Massacre, March 5, 1770," and ending with "The Veteran's Return," the exhibition pictures men and women of varying ethnicities, living at various points along the Eastern seaboard and hailing from all walks of life as they experienced the harsh realities of war. Other highlights of the exhibition are depictions of the battle at Fort Mifflin (where Margaret Corbin was wounded and

became the first woman military pensioner of the United States), "Victory or Death, Advance on Trenton" (with Captain Alexander Hamilton in the foreground), and "The Battle of Kings Mountain" (leaving one to wonder how anyone survived this brutal hand-to-hand combat). Clearly, there is a widespread geographic interest represented in this exhibition.

Although there are no plans for this to be a traveling show, by early next year, there will be a 360-degree tour of the exhibition online, with "access freely on the internet all over the world," according to Skic. "We now have an increased audience," he added. Additionally, there is a book documenting the exhibition which can be purchased through the Museum's bookshop (with proceeds supporting the work of the Museum) as well as through other outlets.

In addition to those interested in learning about the Revolutionary War, Skic noted that this exhibition gives an opportunity to "fans of Don Troiani's work" to view first-hand his art. Although he might best be remembered for his depictions of the Civil War (not to mention those of the French and Indian War), Skic said that Troiani's primary interest rests in the events of the Revolutionary War.

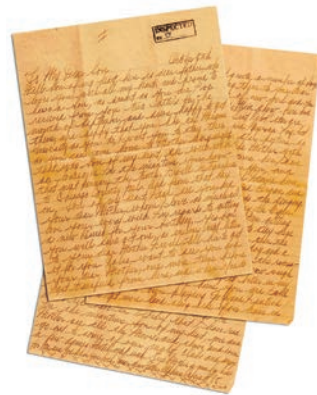

semi-automatic pistol that sold for \$5,143, and his World War II US M-1 .30-caliber Carbine, the only rifle in the auction, that sold for \$7,865.

Mae Capone's feminine side was revealed in this auction with her collection of Dresden-style German ceramic figurines. A seated couple in musical duet realized \$3,328 and a courting couple realized \$1,513. A Ferdinand Preiss, a leading Art Deco artist, sculpture, Phyrne, which Mae owned, sold for \$12,100.

Three surprising lots were an Italian Majolica decorative vase that realized \$36,300, a 16-inch-tall

alabaster bust of Madonna, showing Capone's Italian Catholic side, which realized \$69,300, and a signed (addressed to Sonny Capone) silver print photograph of Lucille Ball and Desi Arnaz, circa 1950s, that realized an amazing \$2,118.

Al and Mae's Jacobean Revival bed which had a pre-auction estimate of \$5,000 and sold for \$84,700. And Capone's platinum and diamond Patek Philippe pocket watch, with 90 single cut diamonds, realized \$229,900, well over its \$50,000 pre-auction estimate.

The final lot was a set of Al Capone's personal, diamond studded 14k gold cufflinks that had a pre-auction estimate of



\$2,500 - \$5,000. After some quick back and forth bidding, the gavel fell for the last time that night at \$33,275, over six times their pre-auction estimate.

Kaminski will sell items from legendary Athanas restaurants

DANVERS, Mass. — Kaminski Auctions is pleased to present the collection of the legendary restaurateur Anthony Athanas of Anthony's Pier 4 fame Oct. 23-24 at the Athanas restaurant's warehouse in Danvers. The auction will include furniture, furnishings, and the extensive wine collection from his four restaurants.

A self-made millionaire and philanthropist, Athanas, emigrated from Albania to the United States with his mother in 1915 to join his father and brothers. They settled in Lynn, Mass. At the age of 13, he left school and started working in restaurants to learn the business. In the 1950s he opened his first restaurant, Anthony's Hawthorne Café, in his hometown. Not long after, it became the largest-volume restaurant in Massachusetts, grossing more than \$1 million a year.

He later opened his iconic restaurant Anthony's Pier 4 on an abandoned landfill on Boston's waterfront. In the 1960s and 70's Anthony's Pier 4 was the place to be seen in Boston. The powerful from all walks of life in Boston dined at Anthony's Pier 4, and it was the go-to restaurant for out-of-town celebrities, athletes, and film stars visiting the city. The iconic restaurant's foyer walls were lined with photographs of Anthony greeting celebrities and the who's who of Boston business, politics, and athletics.

With sales of close to 12 million dollars annually and serving over 700,000 meals per year, Anthony's Pier 4 restaurant became one of the highest-grossing restaurants in the United States.

Anthony's empire eventually included four restaurants with Hawthorne by the Sea Tavern in Swampscott and Anthony's Cummaquid Inn in Yarmouth Port, Cape Cod.

Athanas was a visionary, recognizing long before others that Boston's waterfront would be an attractive location. He was one of the first to offer complimentary popovers, for which the restaurant became famous and an extensive selection of fine wines. His hard work and attention to detail permeated every aspect of running his restaurants, including decorating each one with unique original furniture and nautical antiques. In May of 1970, Athanas attended the auction conducted by the David Weisz

Company, which auctioned off the furniture and furnishings from the Metro Goldwyn Mayer film sets in Hollywood. Many of the furnishings original to his four restaurants came from this historical sale, including original English oak cabinets and French Louis XV and XVI furniture from the Marie Antoinette film set.

Of particular interest is a 19th-century French mahogany partner's desk with a leather top and ormolu trim from the movie set of "Dinner at Eight" starring Jean Harlow, and a Louis XVI-style giltwood suite of two armchairs, chairs, and settee from the movie set of "Marie Antoinette." A pair of continental upholstered throne chairs are also from the movie set of "Marie Antoinette."

There are several English cupboards on offer, including a Gothic eight-door oak cupboard with mirrored upper doors, an English Gothic two-door oak cupboard with carved panels of a man and woman, possibly a marriage piece, and an antique English oak coffer with hand-painted panels and a family crest initialed J. H. and dated illegibly.

An eclectic selection of furniture includes a Biedermeier cabinet from the movie "How The West Was Won" and a Belter rosewood sofa from the movie "Meet Me In St. Louis."

Among the other items are the mirrors, marine paintings, and architectural decorations that graced the walls of the iconic restaurant. Of particular interest are a pair of 19th-century French bronze architectural brackets, vintage gold and silver gilt-framed mirrors, and several

18th-century portraits of English naval officers and noblemen.

Decorative items continue with a vintage heirloom illuminated globe by Replogle, a period Georgian flame mahogany rolling wine cellarette, and a vintage French tin figural horse head display from a butcher shop. Many of the original signs that hung in Anthony's Pier 4 are on offer, including the vintage painted wood English bakery sign advertising 'Fresh Popovers' and the carved, and gilt sign announcing, 'Fresh Seafood.'

The collection of antique ship models from the restaurants is also on offer in the auction. The highlights include a circa 1900 cased wooden ship model by Robert Langly, with a plaque 'Circa 1850 Top Sail', another cased wooden ship model with a plaque 'HMS Speedwell-Launched 1752- 8 Gun Ketch Rigged Sloop: Maker H. W. Shoulder 1875'. There is also a cased wooden ship model of 'The Swift,' flying the American flag, an oak cased British wooden ship model of the 'Hazard 1744', and a cased wooden ship model of 'The Cumberland 1842'.

Silver from the restaurants includes a 19th century English Sheffield plate highly embossed four-piece tea service, with figural falcon spouts and floral finials, a 19th century English Sheffield plate hot water urn with figural dolphin spout, a pair of 19th century English Sheffield plate wine coolers, with fruited vine motif, and engraved family crest and a 19th century English silver plate roll-top warmer, with inner pierced tray, marked 'H. B. & H. S.'

There is a lot of Boston history and nostalgia associated with Anthony Athanas and his legendary restaurants. Apart from the furnishings, Anthony's Pier 4 was famous for being one of the first restaurants in the country to offer an extensive and exclusive list of fine vintage wines from vineyards all over the world. 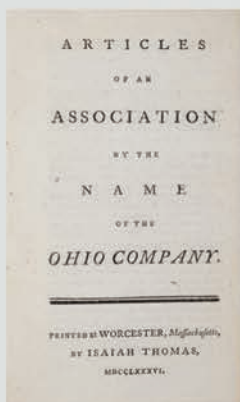

Buyers were out: Many vendors had to restock during Midland show

MIDLAND, Mich. — The sun came out for the Sept. 25-26 Midland Antiques Festival and both buyers and sellers were ready to go.

"I had to go home and dig way back into my archived items to find product to sell today," said Liz, who is a fixture at the Midland Antique Festival. She sells birdhouses that she constructs herself. And these aren't ordinary birdhouses. She sometimes brings condominiums, some covered in small rocks, some with more than one room for the occupants, and more. She spends her time at home hammering, nailing, painting and crafting to have these sturdy units ready for shows. And they are meant to be displayed

outside and used.

"It was an amazing show," said Marty Sizemore. Marty and wife, Denise, always set up with pottery and fine art glass. They have shoppers that look for them in their corner in building two. This year's collection was impressive. After setting up their large display, Marty commented that it took six hours just to get the glass pieces unwrapped and set out. And after two days of selling, they still had to wrap up what was left so it could be carefully transported home to be put back into inventory. They had many beautiful pieces, but a piece of Roseville jumped out. The 1930s jardiniere and pedestal were in the Peony pattern showing off bold colors of green, white and yellow. It was priced to sell at just \$400.

Vendor Frank Mathison, who is a subscriber of The Auction Exchange & Collectors News, had a unique item right at the front of his booth. "I'm kind of embarrassed today because there's hardly anything left in my booth," said Frank's wife. But this one item was worth the look. It was an orange Hudson Hawk car. This one was an old carnival ride and Mathison had it priced at \$1,250. The seat and the floors were made of wood and the steering wheel appeared to be original. This one couldn't be driven – only ridden. So, it would be a great memory item for anyone who remembers taking a ride in one of these fancy little cars when the circus or fair came to town.

And if you parked in the back of the fairgrounds or walked to see all the vendors set up out there, you would run across a real memory maker. The Good Humor man was there! Yes, an actual man wearing one of the vintage blue shirts, white pants and hat we all remember. This Good Humor ice cream piece of history was from 1969. Randy and Pam Oleynik purchased the vintage truck in 2016. It took them three years to restore it and they sold ice cream out of it in 2019 for the first time. Then covid hit and they were sidelined like the rest of us. But they are excited to have this fun history machine back out at shows. And yes, they sell ice cream from it.

Ann Gianopoulos specializes in Halloween and Christmas and is very popular at this show. She hails from Pontiac, Mich., and spends the year getting ready for these two year-ending holidays. Gianopoulos has some unique ideas and fills her booth with great holiday décor items. Her lighted witches are some of her most popular items. Some of them light up and others are wearing your favorite team witches' outfits so would make some unique gifts. "I had to dig out some more items to refill my booth for today," said Ann. What a wonderful problem for these vendors to have at this show.

And you've heard of pigs' flying? Well, how about pigs rolling. A very unusual pig carriage. This pig wouldn't fly, but he could roll along with a fun-loving doll seated in the carriage.

riage for a doll just beckoned you to get a closer look. The pigs' head was at the front of this small display piece. Still showing the original tag, this piece was imported by All Continental Inc., out of Kent, Washington. This hand-crafted piece was advertised that it would only get better with "natural aging and change". "The characteristics mature in a response to temperature and humidity". The tag goes on further to say that if cracks or flaws appear over time; it is not a flaw in the item or the workmanship. This would make a unique piece for display with a small doll sitting inside the carriage. It was priced at \$45 by vendor Gina, who drove from Aramada, Mich., to sell at this show.

"I had to bring in more boxes today," said vendor Dan Bills, from Waterford, Mich. This was my "best first day ever". He commented that the crowd was steady, and they were spending money. Bills had several vintage cookies jars in his booth. A Woody Woodpecker piece had a great whimsical look. With no chips or cracks, the asking price of \$225 seemed reasonable. Walter Lantz is the person always associated with Woody Woodpecker. This ceramic cookie jar from the 1950s was made by the Norcrest Grantcrest Company. Woody is sitting with his mixing bowl and spoon, mixing up a batch of cookies.

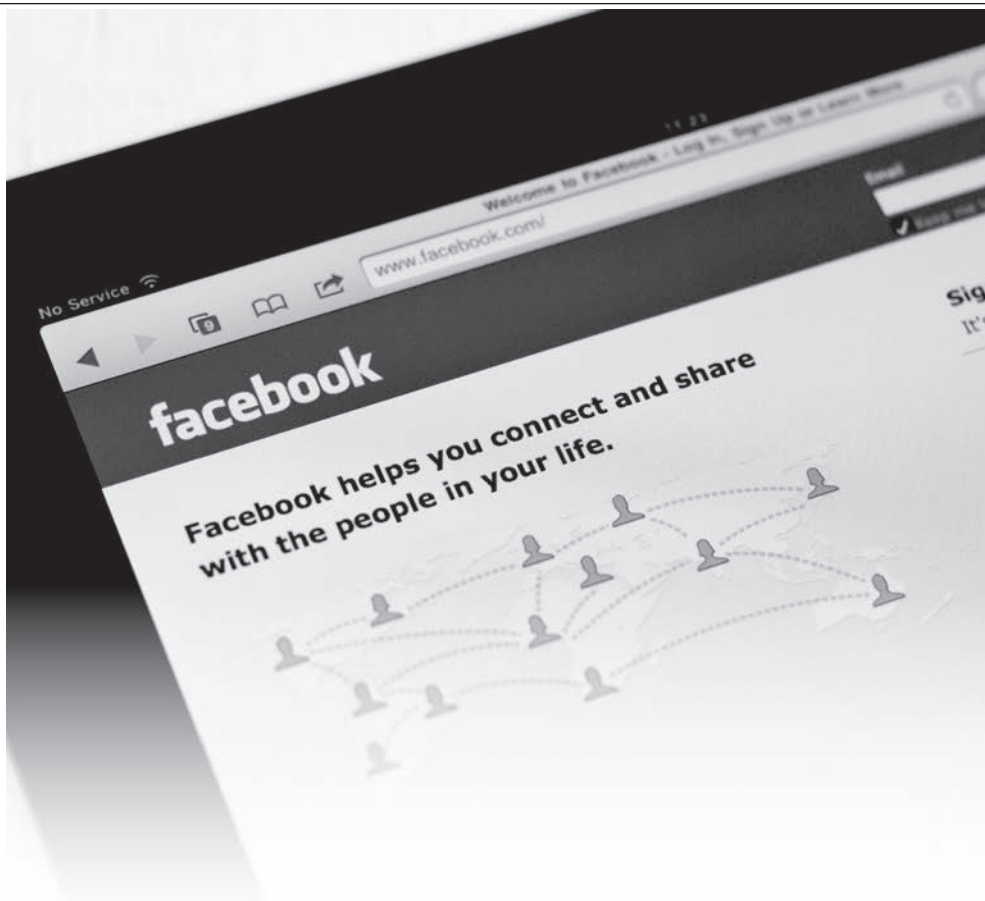

Decorative Pumpkins

waves of Irish immigrants landed in America, bringing their customs, including the use of Jack-o-Lanterns, with them. These immigrants discovered that New England-grown pumpkins were larger and easier to carve than a turnip, and the modern Jack-o-Lantern, carved from a pumpkin, was born.

Jack-o-lanterns are chiefly associated with Halloween; however, the carving out of gourds for their use as lanterns dates back thousands of years to Africa. The concept of carving a monstrous face into a pumpkin and placing a lit candle inside to ward off evil spirits, however, is strictly an American concept.

Americans, in 1837, first used the term "jack-o-lantern" when referring to a carved vegetable lantern. In 1866, the carved pumpkin began its official association with Halloween when it was carved and placed on doorsteps to ward off evil spirits.

The jack-o-lantern further became associated with America's fall festivals when, in 1850, poet John Greenleaf Whittier wrote, "Oh! —fruit loved of boyhood!—the old days recalling./When wood-grapes were purpling and brown nuts were falling!/When wild, ugly faces we carved in its skin,/ Glaring out through the dark with a candle within!"

In the mid-1800s, Americans carved pumpkins and placed them on doorsteps on All Hallows' Eve. The monstrous faces carved into the pumpkins served to ward off evil presences. Believers would also leave a "treat" with the pumpkin, fearing that if

a treat were not left, spirits would play "tricks" on one's home or property. Today this century old concept is known as "trick or treating."

Jack-o-lantern collectors look for vintage pieces that are in good to mint condition and are unique. Papier-mâché has always been a favorite material for collectible Jack-o-lanterns. Other materials used, in combination with papier-mâché, for eyes and teeth include glass, plastic, and paper. It is not uncommon for papier-mâché jack-o-lanterns to date to the latter half of the 19th century. Tin, ceramic, cardboard, and crepe paper have also been used to manufacture jack-o-lanterns.

Jack-o-lantern collectibles take on many forms, such as candy boxes, noisemakers, cookie jars, glass lanterns, pumpkin torches, rattles, and pull string jumping jacks. While many collections center on vintage candy pails, especially the type that children used as candy holders while trick or treating, the list of possible jack-o-lantern items is nearly endless.

Many vintage papier-mâché jack-o-lanterns show signs of repair since papier-mâché is easily repairable.

Don't get caught up in another of Jack's tricks; watch for reproductions when buying jack-o-lanterns.
