Majestic tureens welcomed soup to the table

Love it or hate it (or perhaps something in between), it can be made from scratch or heated from a can. A good way to use leftovers, it's often valued for its nutritive and restorative powers, or slurped down as a quick and inexpensive meal. Soup's on!

But there was a time when the consumption of soup at a grand feast was akin to the opening act of a play, the first course of an elaborate meal. Special serving pieces were made to honor this first course. Called tureens, those servers can still be a dramatic addition to any table.

"Of soup and love, the first is the best." So states an 18th-century English proverb, as reported by Donald L. Fennimore and Patricia A. Halfpenny in "Campbell Collection of Soup Tureens of Winterthur," a book written to accompany the world-class exhibition of tureens at the Winterthur Museum.

Tracing the history of soup, Fennimore and Halfpenny noted that the earliest ones were modest at best, a simple meal cooked over an open fire in a single pot. It didn't stop there.

What followed were "splendid public feasts," displaying the power of medieval monarchs and noblemen. But in the 1600s, these formal dinners became "a

less public affair" as they were displaced by more private, but no less formalized, meals. Gathering in a parlor, guests would then enter the dining room and behold the table before them. By 1700, multi-course meals, a tradition adopted from France, were popular.

Whereas a first-course soup might be a clear broth to whet the appetite, the vessel presenting it was anything but simple. Generally oval-shaped, these deep dishes reflected the highest style of their

time. Made of metals, including silver, silver gilt, pewter, and plated base metals, or ceramics, including earthenware, stoneware, and fine porcelain, tureens might well be stand-alone pieces or part of a set, but not necessarily matching other pieces of the dinner service, according to Ann Wagner, curator of decorative arts at Winterthur. Tureens, she said, were "all about showing off. What was inside was not the important part." Unfortunately, she added, "we don't have the story" of when or where tureens made their first grand appearance at the table.

Some generalizations can be made

Despite reissued masking mandate; Extravaganza was popular

SPRINGFIELD, Ohio -- In June, everything looked on-course for the Sept. 17-19 edition of the massive Springfield Extravaganza. Steve Jenkins put on a great show in May even with COVID restrictions. This time, with vaccines getting in arms, and most everything reopened, it looked like things would be business-as-usual for the popular antiques festival.

Yet, just six weeks prior to the show, with the Delta variant rearing its head, Ohio Governor Mike DeWine reissued a statewide indoor mask mandate in public places for anyone 10 years or older. The Jenkins team, once again, found itself having to navigate some tricky waters. While staying upbeat about the situation, they once again had to be clear about compliance via messaging on their website and social media, and through regular PA announcements at the fairgrounds during the show.

The weekend arrived with near idyllic weather that would last the entire weekend. No doubt, Jenkins staff was counting their blessings, since bad weather would not only have put a damper on the show, it would have forced people indoors.

Between the weather and the general popularity of the show, it appeared as if those new masking orders weren't going to hamper a good start. By 10 a.m. Friday, thousands of cars were already parked at the fairgrounds and a line of traffic was backed up as an enthusiastic crowd idled, ready to pay the early bird admission of \$15 that allowed them entrance before noon.

Even the night before, things boded well during the special event known as Line Buying in which vendors sell from the back of their vehicles while waiting to move to

not typical at previous Extravaganzas.

The compliance with the masking mandate was about 50/50 for those indoors. Masks were not required outdoors, and it was rare to see anyone wearing one.

Terry Dobratz of The Rusty Nail from Beloit, Wis., is one of those dealers still specializing in traditional antiques because he appreciates their artisanship and heritage. Dobratz said he's been selling them for 60

Granny chic is in vogue; bring out the afghans

Grandmom's quilts, her crocheted doilies, and the footstools and dining room chairs for which she painstakingly needlepointed covers. Also, white milkglass, pleated lampshades, and chintz. Remember Laura Ashley? Anything pink or green. China cabinets (you have to put all those vintage cups and saucers and colored stemware somewhere!). Oh, and lots of live houseplants (aspidistras, Boston ferns, and all things lush and bushy). And while you're at it, forget about streamlined surfaces: bring on the clutter. What's going on here? Why, it's "Granny Chic," as old things once discarded are now creeping back into modern décors.

Could I make this up? Not in a million years. Nor is this just wishful thinking. Even though the trend might not be sweeping the country, some vintage household accessories are making many homes cozy again. Think comfy thoughts. So what's up with all of this, something alternatively referred to as "Grandma Chic" or "Grandmillennial"?



I have some theories as to why this is happening now. First, styles are cyclical, and it's been nearly 50 years since America's Bicentennial when crafting (including various forms of needlework) and antiquing were in their heyday. More importantly, we're just a few years away from the celebration of America's 250th birthday. And then there's the fact we've all been home a bit more than usual this past year and a half. Put it all together and you get an appreciation for, well, Granny Chic.

Be still my heart.

So how to achieve the look? The experts say it's all about patterns and textures. That translates into wallpaper, although it might be a good

idea to install removable wallpaper, just in case (long term commitment is not part of this movement). Anything floral is good, especially chintz textiles on overstuffed furniture. Skip the modern "throw": Drape your sofa and chairs with a granny square crochet afghan or a crazy quilt (or maybe even a yo-yo quilt), all a riot of color and design. As for throw pillows, forget the "karate chop" squares and look for decorative rounds.

Of course, too much of a good thing can be a problem. The idea here is not to look tired and worn out, or, heaven forbid, dowdy, so don't hesitate reupholstering furniture that has been sat in a few times too many. The key to this decorating trend, as always, is to apply it with moderation. A little bit goes a long way. You really don't need (or want) a display case of blue Wedgwood pieces; a few favorites grouped on a side table will suffice. Similarly, no need to house a china cabinet full of Waterford cut crystal. On the other hand, a special vase with fresh roses and



years. "I have three large warehouses of stuff," he exclaimed. His booth was filled with great pieces of 18th and 19th-century furniture - among the items, a unique cobbler's bench priced at just \$300. The Pennsylvania piece was like a self-contained workshop and featured its original decorative paint and working mechanicals.

A returnee from the Cincinnati area - who also sold at the May show - offered an iconic piece of her area's history. It was the medallion from the crest of the Newport, Ky., building that once housed beer delivery teams for Weidemann beer. The truly one-of-a-kind item was priced at \$5,500. Outside the tent was a 20th-century frog riding toy staged for Halloween with a life-size skeleton atop.

Brandon Bacheler, from nearby West Chester, Ohio, was a first timer. Even as a newbie, he came impressively stocked. Among his offerings were dozens of sign casting molds, each priced at \$40. Spotted were molds for a Gulf of Alaska map sign, the Benton City Courthouse, and the Hamilton Moses Steam Electric Station of Arkansas Power. Also in his booth was a fine condition - and working - 50s-era Coke cooler priced at \$800.

Part of Extravaganza's allure is that buyers never know what they'll find. One booth sported a wooden propeller from a 1918 Douglas D-T, priced at \$7,500. For sheer largess, in the booth of a veteran seller of both Springfield and Mount Dora, was a 7-foot wood horse statue priced at \$1,950. Right beside it sat a 4-foot Remington-style bronze for \$3,400.

Adding to the weekend's excitement was a visit from Worthpoint, coming on the heels of their visit at the September Tri-State Antique Market. Danna Crawford and the Worthpoint team conducted a Thursday

eBay training in nearby Beavercreek, Ohio, and a treasure hunt at the show on Friday.

Worthpoint's visit reflects how antique markets are being reimagined to provide greater appeal to modern audiences. Promoters like Jenkins are adding features intended to move shows beyond just shopping to be more of a "complete experience" with activities, food, and even entertainment. For Extravaganza, that's meant an expanded food court with broader dining choices, wine, beer, and now even cocktail availability, and a DJ providing entertainment.

Festivities aside, Jenkins Management took time on Saturday to hold a small memorial service for Barbara Jenkins, the matriarch of the show who died in July. She had worked the extravaganza for 20 years and was affectionately known as the "voice of the PA."

greens might make for the perfect centerpiece. When setting the table (and yes, that's back in vogue, even though take-out might be on the menu), an accent of colored Depression glass (either a stem or a salad plate) will update the look. Add a vintage tablecloth and you're set.

That said, it's not just home furnishings that are getting the retro treatment: It's personal fashion. Clip earrings and brooches, as well as cardigan sweaters and skirts with flounced hemlines, are all making their return. For myself, I've never stopped wearing vintage milk glass jewelry, a collection inspired years ago by a "Vintage Style" reader.

In the end, I suppose the first thing to keep in mind is if you're al-

ready a Granny/Grandmom/Nana, it's time to share some of your treasures with the kiddos.

On the other hand, if you're just setting up housekeeping, jump on this trend while pieces can still be found at affordable prices at flea markets and consignment shops. And if you're somewhere in between, just have fun and go with it. Just remember, one pleated lampshade might be enough.

Document detailing the opening up of Ohio territory to be auctioned

GALLIPOLIS, Ohio – A document detailing the beginnings of settlement west of the Appalachians will be sold online Nov. 8 by the Company Antiques and Art Co.

Titled “Articles of an Association by the Name of the Ohio Company,” the document was printed in Worcester, Mass., in 1786. It is one of a “half dozen” of those known to be extant, according to Andrew Richmond, appraiser and owner of Ohio Company Antiques and Art.

The document, according to Richmond, was used as something of a sales pamphlet explaining how people from Connecticut and Massachusetts were putting together a consortium of investors to buy more than 1 million acres near the confluence of the Muskingum and Ohio Rivers.

“This is where it all began,” Richmond said. “This was the first piece of legislation. The federal government was needing money to pay off the war debts. It names Marietta as the first original settlement, provides public schooling, permitted no slavery, compelled the buyers to treat the Indians fairly ... that didn’t last long ... and made other rules of the corporation.”

The land would be officially open to settlement the next year with the passage of the Northwest Ordinance of 1787.

Co-founder of the Ohio Company, Manasseh Cutler (1742-1823) of Massachusetts negotiated the purchase with Congress, settling for the purchase of up to 1.5 million acres of good Ohio River bordered bottomland, at eight cents an acre.

In addition to the original document is a hand-written set of 11 pages, stitched together, comprising the minutes from the very first meeting on July 2, 1788, of the Ohio Com-

pany, subsequent to the passage of the bill. It is thought that these minutes were later hand-copied by Cutler for his own files.

“I kept looking at the writing and thinking there was something familiar about it,” Richmond said. “I called a colleague of mine and sent her a picture and right away she said, ‘that’s Manasseh’s Cutler’s handwriting.’ I thought to myself, that’s incredible. How did it get here?”

Neither Richmond nor the Holzer family know how the two slim volumes ended up in the Holzer home. “It may be assumed” that Alma or Bobbie Holzer purchased them. Beyond that, it is mostly conjecture.

Documents indicate the pamphlet and hand-written notes were once part of the “legendary” Americana collection of Thomas W. Streeter (1883-1965) of Morristown, N.J.

Streeter began his interest in early American maps and ephemera in 1939. After his death, in 1965, his collection had been widely noted and the auction firm Parke-Bernet Galleries in New York City sold his estate in seven auctions from 1966-1969.

That’s when the sales pamphlet and hand-written minutes were last sold at a price of \$2,100 each. Richmond believes he will get \$8,000-\$12,000 at the Nov. 8 auction, if not more.

In addition to the post-Colonial items, the estate auction will be selling early (probably Gallia County) curly maple chest of drawers, early local ephemera and a 1947 Steinway pi-

ano.

As Richmond points out this is only a two-generation family but spans more than 100 years. “They’re long-lived generations; both pillars of this community.

The Holzer estate was established in Gallipolis, by Charles E. Holzer (1898-1956) who served at the local state-operated hospital as a surgical resident in 1909. Realizing the town required more skilled surgeons, young Dr. Holzer gained additional training in Europe (include volunteer surgery in World War I), returned home to Gallipolis, he married Alma (1886-1970) and began planning the First Avenue Holzer Hospital, the region’s first general hospital. Their son, Charles Jr. returned home in 1946, after graduating from Cornell Medical School, and helped his father build what would eventually become Holzer Medical Center, southeast Ohio’s largest healthcare organization.


Most of the antiques being auctioned, according to Richmond, are from Alma’s collecting days in the late “1940s and early 1950s, while she was re-modeling the house, he said.

During her early collecting years, Alma befriended Wallace Nutting (1861-1941) and the auction includes a significant collection of Wal-

lace Nutting reproduction furniture, much of which she personally received from the artist.

“Notations in the inventory suggest Mrs. Holzer regularly purchased antiques from Nutting, including a Chippendale sofa about which Alma writes, “Original Chippendale from Wallace Nutting collection.”

Dr. Holzer died in 1956, and upon Alma’s death in 1970, many of the antiques including the Wallace Nutting reproductions, were moved across the street to Dr. Charles, Jr. and his wife, Bobbi, and their children.

Charles died in 1998, and Bobbi Holzer died last year at the age of 99.

“The house was full, and everything is in real good condition,” Richmond said. “We’ll have about 400 good antiques online with LiveAuctioneers until Nov. 8. We went over this estate with a fine-tooth comb and I think we made some good finds.”

Toaster association holds annual convention

COLUMBIA, S.C. -- The Toaster Collectors Association (TCA) held its annual convention, Octoasterfest, Oct. 14-16 in Columbia hosted by Ken and Cordie Huggins.

Ken is the holder of the Guinness World Record for largest toaster collection. He documented 1,284 toasters in his collection as of July 31, 2012, but has added hundreds more since. Twenty members attended coming from Minnesota to Texas and several states in between. The annual conventions began in 1999 and several members have been hosts. The members are encouraged to bring toaster displays, favorite toasters or new acquisitions. Awards are given for best display and best toaster in several category types. Buying, selling and trading is also part of the convention.

Toasters as well as other electric heating devices (irons, stoves, heaters, coffee makers, waffle makers, etc.) be-

came commercially successful following Albert Marsh's 1906 invention of nickel chromium (nichrome) wire that would glow red hot without burning out. GE is generally credited with the first successful mass-produced toaster, the porcelain based model D12, in

1908. The first automatic popup toaster, the Toastmaster 1A1, came out in 1927 following the invention of the commercial bread slicer for bakeries. Interestingly, no electric toasters are being produced in the US today, most coming from China.



about tureens, however. Usually footed, tureens are lidded (to retain heat) and often topped with a decorative finial. Many tureens, particularly those made of ceramics, include liners “but you don’t see that part,” Wagner pointed out. Liners might be filled in the kitchen and then transported to the table (tureens were heavy, and the less handling of them, the better), or the soup might be poured directly into the tureen at the table. To protect the surface of the dining table and the linens covering it, an undertray (not necessarily matching, but complimentary in design) serves double duty by grounding the bowl and, at the same time, adding “a colorful presence.” As for scooping the soup from a tureen to an individual bowl, ladles (“oodles of ladles”) abound. There could be more than one tureen present at the table at one time, Wagner added, perhaps a matching set. But because tureens were intended for use as centerpieces, they do not necessarily relate to (or match with) other pieces of dinnerware at the table.

The “golden age” of tureens, Wagner said, began in the late 18th century, during an era of “riches and opulence.” The “result of sculptural genius,” elaborate decorative features might well include representations of crustaceans, watercress, or peeled lemons, or perhaps even mythological figures. Buds and beasts, figurines and flowers: Tureens at their peak were an artistic visual feast, the “composite effort of artistry.” However, these visual interpretations did not necessarily provide a clue as to the sustenance inside; all for show, they were primarily meant not only to impress guests but also to serve as conversation starters. Because a meal might involve hours at the table, “they were part of the entertainment.”

Through the years, tureens have been used by people of many cultures to serve a variety of dishes, thin broths and rich stews with fish, fowl, and meat, as well as vegetable soups. Indeed, there is a universality associated with them that adds to their appeal; not surprisingly, tureens are among the holdings of numerous museums around the world. The Campbell Collection, now at its permanent home in Wilmington, Delaware, was begun in 1966, when the Campbell Soup Company’s chairman, along with its president, decided to establish a collection. Three years later, the fledgling collection was displayed at the Philadelphia Museum of Art, and then exhibited at Colonial Williamsburg the following year.

As the collection continued to grow, a museum facility was established in Camden, New Jersey, at the company’s headquarters. To share the tureens with a larger audience, a series of travelling

shows ensued, and they were enthusiastically received. In 1996, Winterthur was gifted with the collection in exchange for a commitment to display the majority of the collection in a single gallery.

Today, visitors to Winterthur, located in Wilmington, Delaware, can view the collection, which includes nearly 300 soup service-related objects, 144 tureens from 21 countries. Wagner noted that although tureens are no longer a part of everyday life, visitors to Winterthur, even children, know what these serving pieces are. And the exhibit remains one of the biggest draws at the museum, with a “steady, popular interest” shown by visitors from around the world.

While tureens are found in private and public collections, there is no known collectors’ club. But Wagner pointed out that those who collect silver (she mentioned Gorham, Tiffany, and Kirk-Stieff) as well as certain ceramics (“Blue Willow,” for instance) might well have one or more tureens in their private holdings. Often associated with family meals, tureens are still cherished, including ones made in traditional china patterns. Holiday examples include “Christmas Tree” (Spode) and “Holiday” (Lenox), as well as in sentimental favorites: “Yorktowne” (Pfaltzgraff), “Old Country Roses” (Royal Albert), and “Desert Rose” (Franciscan).

Even though everyday dining traditions are now more relaxed, the appeal of tureens endures. Wagner concluded that this might be because they inspire thoughts of “sharing a meal among family and friends in a generous capacity.” Their presence on a table signals to all that “there is more than enough.” M’m! Good!
