## The Bregant story: From Vaudeville to promoting candy

"Tiny houses." You've heard of them, haven't you? At just 400 square feet (or less), tiny houses are the standard-bearers for those who advocate living simply.

But what about the original tiny house? For that, you'd have to travel back over 100 years, to Council Bluffs, Iowa. That's where the very first tiny house was built, to meet the very specific needs of Jean and Inez Bregant.

The Bregants were little people. Born into families of average height. Jean Bregant and Inez Lewis embarked on one of the only paths open to those of their stature in that era: a career in vaudeville.

An accomplished singer and dancer since childhood. Inez was discovered at the age of 14, winning raves from critics. Noted one, "this little lady is bright, intelligent, vivacious and witty, and possesses conversational powers far above those of the average person." Meanwhile, Austrian-born Jean had been making a name for himself across Europe as a singing comedian, before coming to the United States in 1904.

draws in the early 1900s —and one of Coney Island's must-sees was Dreamland's Liliputa. Here, 300 little people posed as typical residents, going about their daily doings in scaleddown surroundings. Named as a nod to the characters in Gulliver's Travels, the city was built to resemble a halfscale Nuremberg, Germany. The tiny town came complete with all the trimmings, including its own opera house. That's where "Mrs. Gen. Tom Thumb and All The Liliputian Stars" were the headliners. Among those on the bill: Miss Quiglev Jennie ("Famous Little Scottish Queen"); Oleo Ole-("The Famous son Swedish Midget"); Wm. Platt ("The American Beau Brummel) - and Inez Lewis ("The Miniature Lillian Russell"). Liliputa is where

Jean and Inez met. That meeting, later attributed in promo materials to the "magnet of human destiny," led to their wedding on Christmas Day, 1905. The Bregants continued as performers, with successful European tours in 1908 and 1914. Eventually, the duo moved to Inez's home town of Council Bluffs. There, the Bregants gave up show business, and settled into a new career as grocers. They also settled into a brandnew home: their made-to-order "tiny house." A news article of the time called the one-bedroom Craftsman bungalow "one of the prettiest and most unique homes in the city."

Set back from the street, the Bregant abode could easily be mistaken for a child's playhouse. It was wedged between two towering neighbors — a three-story house on one side, and a two-story duplex on the other. Although miniature in size, it was perfectly proportioned. Once inside, it's quickly evident that the residence was designed for the comfort of its original owners. Reach for a light switch or a doorknob, and you'll find it much lower than expected. The Bregants were both under 4 feet tall. The fireplace mantel, shoulder-height in most homes, reaches the waist at the Bregants'. In the dining room, a specially constructed buffet/hutch boasts an interior mirror perfectly situated for Inez to adjust her hat.

## NEWS Sand, American Girl Dolls and Risk inducted

ROCHESTER, N.Y. — The record number of nominations has been deciphered and tallied. The national selection committee, a group of a dozen or so objective historians, collectors, and "creative types," has narrowed the field down to 12 candidates. And the final votes have been cast. Announced the first Thursday of November, the 2021 inductees into the National Toy Hall of Fame, hosted by The Strong National Museum of Play, are (drumroll, please!) American Girl Dolls, Risk, and sand.

The three winners beat out tough competitors, including Battleship and billiards, Cabbage Patch Kids (their fourth time to the "dance,' having been "white hot" in 1983) and Masters of the Universe, Mahjong (no matter how you spell it) and the Fisher-Price Corn Popper (an homage to beginning walkers). In addition to the usual challenges, this year's winners had to weather a surge from an enthusiastic bloc of supporters hoping to see Hess toy trucks take home the honors.

And that's not even mentioning piñatas (with origins in, get this, 13th century China and with a name corrupted from the Italian), as well as something called "The Settlers of Catan," a 1995 German game that evidently set off a Euro-gaming frenzy

But back to the honored three. The winning formula for inclusion into

the Hall of Fame is four-pronged, according to The Strong's chief curator, Christopher Bensch: Longevity (at least 20 years continually on the market, thereby appealing to at least two generations), recognizability ("you would know them from a hundred paces away"), play value (of course), and innovation (which "might be the trump card that earns you points and gets you into the Hall of Fame").

Founded in 1998, the National Toy Hall of Fame was originally based in a Salem, Oregon, museum. It moved cross country in 2002 to The Strong, located in Rochester, N.Y. As for this year's winners, Bensch noted, "All three winners are playthings of the imagination," likely reflecting families spending an increased amount of time together.

A few more statistics: In a normal year, there are somewhere be-

tween 5,000 and 8,000 nominations (this year there were approximately 55,000 nominations); last year, some 700 different toys were nominated in write-in ballots, but this year, the number was closer to 940. Might this be the result of working from home, Bensch queried, or perhaps because of organized lobbying?

Whatever the case, American Girl Dolls, introduced in 1986, are "not

## Mr. Peanut is definitely a nut above all the others

Mr. Peanut is the advertising logo and mascot for Planters Peanuts, a snack food that is "a nut above the rest." Mr. Peanut is an anthropomorphic peanut, still in its shell, that is dressed in formal clothing like an old-fashioned gentleman — top hat, monocle, white gloves, spats, and a cane. Born in Britain, Mr. Peanuts' full name is Bartholomew Richard Fitzgerald-Smithe, which is quite a mouthful, so he simply goes by Mr. Peanut.

Amedeo Obici founded Planters Peanut Company in 1906 in Wilkes-Barre, Pa. Two years later, he incorporated the company as Planters Nut and Chocolate Company. In 1916, Obici was searching for a logo for his burgeoning company. Antonio Gentile, a young schoolboy, submitted drawings of an anthropomorphic peanut to a design contest Obici sponsored. Gentile's sketches won first place. Commercial artist Andrew S. Wallach redrew the peanut man, adding the top hat, monocle, and cane, and Mr. Peanut, the iconic mascot of Planter Peanuts, was born.

mascot that is still going strong over 100 years later. But as Paul Harvey might say, "Here's the rest of the story." Obici became friends with the schoolboy's family and he paid for Antonio and all four of his siblings to go to college. Obici paid Antonio's educational costs all the way through medical school,

By the 1930s, Mr. Peanut generically symbolized the entire peanut industry. Since his creation, he has appeared on almost all of Planters' packaging and advertisements, and he has been one of the bestknown manufacturing mascots for the past 100 years.

Mr. Peanut is so popular that in 2006 when Planters held an online contest to determine if a bow tie, cufflinks, and pocket watch should be added to his attire, the nut-eating public voted for no changes. They loved Mr. Peanut just as he is.

Planters ride on Mr. Peanut's proverbial coattails (he doesn't actually have coattails) has not always been a smooth ride. In January 2020, Planters killed off Mr. Peanut, for a Super Bowl commercial, showing Mr. Peanut drive his Nutmobile off a cliff to avoid an armadillo. Kool-Aid Man attended Mr. Peanut's funeral, and Kool-Aid Man's tears combined with sunlight caused a new, younger incarnation of Mr. Peanut (apply called "Baby Nut") to grow from the soil. Another advertising campaign, launched in August 2020, showed Baby Nut had grown into "Peanut Jr.," a 21-year-old young adult

## Crown Milano will highlight Dec. 4 Woody auction

DOUGLASS, Kan. – Woody Auction will close out 2021 in grand fashion, with a Saturday, Dec. 4 antique auction highlighted by the Wilson collection out of Illinois that features nearly 100 lots of Crown Milano, plus offerings from private collections that include brides baskets, Steuben, Quezal, Durand, Tiffany, Mettlach plaques and a sizable lamp collection.

"With just over 400 lots, this auction has something for everyone on your holiday shopping list," said Jason Woody of Woody Auction. "All items up for bid will be sold without reserve, online via LiveAuctioneers.com and live in the Woody Auction auction hall located at 130 East Third Street in Douglass. Also, there is no buyer's premium for those who attend in person and pay by cash or check." Steuben is enormously popular with collectors and this sale has some wonderful examples, like the unmarked, outstanding quality art glass lamp in a Dragon pattern, 26 1/2 inches tall, mirror black over celeste blue and acid etched, shape #6094; and a signed rose cintra and opal art glass vase, 12 inches tall in a Supino acid cut pattern and boasting spectacular colors – a worthy addition to any collection.

A solid crystal and 18kt gold sculpture signed Steuben, designed by James Houston and titled Column of the Owl, 7 1/2 inches tall and made in the 1970s, is being offered with the original case.

A colorful item is the massive charger, marked Mettlach (#2697), 17 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> inches in diameter, with an incredible fantasy scene showing a cherub and a fairy, signed Heinrich Schlitt. Equal-

just a doll, or a character from a media-driven source." Bensch said. With accompanying books, they have "a place in history, plus play value." Further, he suggested they offer "positive role modeling," all the while not being "sexualized like so many girls' toys." Their "commitment to diversity" was a plus. It was probably unfortunate for Cabbage Patch Kids that they, like American Girl Dolls, were competing for the fourth time ("they have everything it takes to be inducted").

As for Risk, the board game was also a four-time finalist before this year's induction. Based on the original French game "Le Conquete du Monde," Risk has undergone "various iterations over the years" that have kept it fresh (think the "Game of Thrones" version). Compared to chess, Bensch suggested, where each game is "a symbolic battle," Risk, "with a map of the world, makes it graphic. You are taking over the world" (which appeals to inner Bond villains and great general wannabes).

And then there's sand, perhaps the oldest toy in the world. It's free for the taking, if you happen to be at the shore, or cheap when purchased at a home improvement store. Wet it, and it's a whole other story, the raw material for fashioning amazing sandcastles on the beach.


Although there were no red carpets and teary-eyed acceptance speeches, the announcement can be viewed on YouTube, complete with thank-you videos from Mattel (for American Girl Dolls) and Hasbro (for Risk). The maker of sand, however, was not available, Bensch laughed. For those wanting to see the National Toy Hall of Fame up-close-and-personal, visitors to The Strong can view a portrait gallery of classic toys, orchestrate a "dazzling music and light show" with the Crayon Piano, and pose in

one of the most popular board games of all time.

nut. The world's nut buying populace went nuts, encouraging other nut eaters to block Peanut Jr. from rising to fame. In February 2021, Planters announced the Baby Nut/ Peanut Jr. advertising campaign a nutty failure, and new commercials, advertisement, and packaging for Planters reintroduced the original Mr. Peanut as their now and forever mascot.

Representing Planters Peanuts for so many years has led to a peanut jar full of collectible Mr. Peanut items, ranging from dolls, posters, packaging items, Worlds Fair items, puppets, banks, cars, clocks, advertising and promotional items, and so much more. Companies such as Limoges in France have offered hand-painted Mr. Peanut boxes. Many collectors search for a mint conditioned Mr. Peanut rubber hand puppet, circa 1950, that, today, costs around \$1,200 and is considered by some collectors to be the Holy Grail of Mr. Peanut collectibles.

Planter's new advertising campaign is called "A Nut Above," and after 100 years of living legumelously, Mr. Peanut has proven himself to truly be a nut above all other nuts, which is why collectors quite literally go "nuts" for Mr. Peanut collectibles.

Collectors should beware: there are quite a few fakes and reproduction Mr. Peanut items around, and no one wants to collect a rotten peanut.

### **Bregant Story**

Of course, not every item in the home was small. As Inez noted in a 1959 interview, "Some people think I furnish my house entirely with small furniture. I don't. It would be foolish. I do quite a bit of entertaining, and all my friends are of 'normal' size."

The ex-vaudevillians lived contentedly in their made-to-order home, running their grocery store, and "keeping their hand in" with occasional performances at local events. And then came re-discovery

Council Bluffs candymaker John G. Woodward & Co. was acclaimed nationwide for its "pure sugar stick candy and real butterscotch." Occupying a full city block, the Woodward factory was, next to the railroad, the largest employer in Council Bluffs. At its busiest, circa 1920, Woodward employed nearly 1,000 workers, and sold 2 million pounds of candy annually.

One day, the Bregants stopped by the Woodward factory to replenish their store's candy supplies, and encountered Mr. Woodward. Impressed by their charming personalities (as well as their show business background), Woodward offered the Bregants yet another new career - as promoters for Woodward Candy, and demonstrators of its goods.

Billed as "the smallest salespeople in the world," the Bregants traveled a 20-state region, pleasing crowds with excerpts from their vaudeville act, and, of course, selling plenty of candy. The advance ads proclaimed, "You'll be pleased to meet this captivating little couple. They're not only the smallest salespeople in the world, but the most clever. And, with each 10-cent Woodward package purchased, they present their souvenir picture." The souvenir card selection featured visuals of the twosome in various poses and settings, including scenes of them at ease in their made-to-scale home. Photo captions focused on the couple's down-to-earth offstage personalities ("A Quiet Evening At Home"; Mrs. Bregant In Her Model Kitchen").

As the "Candy Kids," Jean and Inez enjoyed great popularity, and achieved financial security. Jean, who had, as a young man, worried that his size would limit his options in life, was overjoyed. "In the United States," he said, "it is possible for anyone to get the opportuni-








