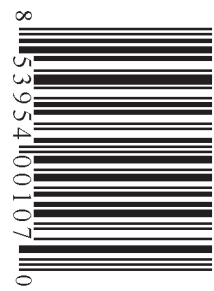

Settle down for a Little Golden Christmas story

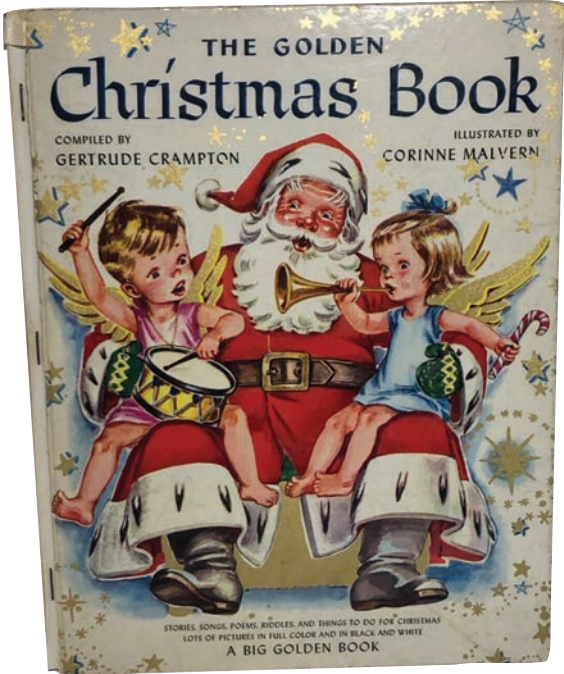
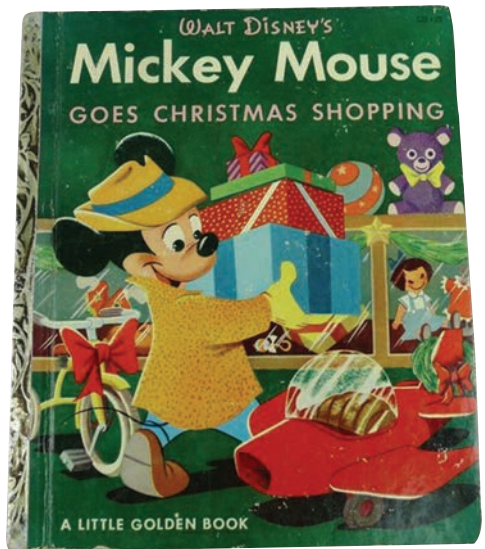
Little Golden Books can make the perfect Christmas decoration with their colorful titles. As an added bonus, guests can read them in just a few minutes.

The Artists and Writers Guild, a subsidiary of Western Publishing and Lithographing Company of Racine, Wis., first published Little Golden Books, in association with Simon & Schuster, 79 ago, in 1942. There were 12 titles in the original series: Three Little Kittens, Bedtime Stories, The Alphabet from A to Z, Mother Goose, Prayers for Children, The Little Red Hen, Nursery Songs, The Poky Little Puppy, The Golden Book of Fairy Tales, Baby's Book, The Animals of Farmer Jones, and This Little Piggy and Other Counting Rhymes. Each book cost 25¢.

When first published, Little Golden Books were as popular with mothers as they were with children. Even in hard times, mothers considered the books inexpensive. And Little Golden Books were one of the first children's book series to be offered for sale in grocery stores and five & dime stores, such as Woolworth's.

Collectors today always seek out the original 12 titles, which have become something of a Holy Grail in Little Golden Book collecting. Other books based on vintage television shows and

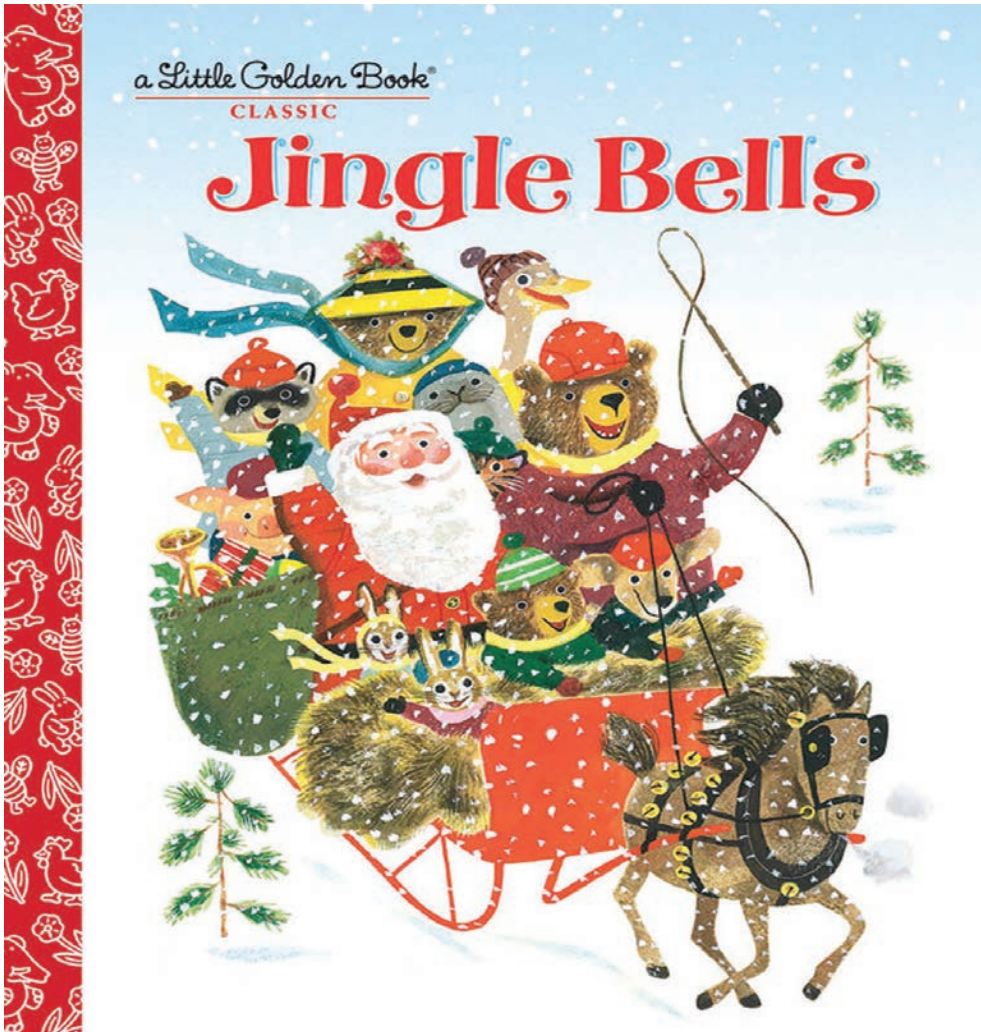

movies are also popular. Books such as Bambi (1949), Captain Kangaroo (1959), Alice in Wonderland (1951) Howdy Doody (1955), and the Lone Ranger in 1956 are eagerly sought after. There are even Little Golden Book collectors who only collect Disney editions. One of the most fun and most rewarding Little Golden Book collections is its line of Christmas books, which thrilled children then and still thrill collectors today.

Besides The Christmas Story, some of the Little Golden Book Christmas books that collectors seek are Noel (the story of a Christmas tree ornament), Frosty the Snowman, Jingle Bells, and Rudolf the Red-Nosed Reindeer.

Walt Disney Productions copyrighted several Little Golden Books Christmas books, such as Mickey's Christmas Carol, Santa's Toy Shop, and Mickey Mouse Goes Christmas Shopping. These books are all considered cross collectible, and they give a wonderful Disney-depth to any Christmas book collection.

Collectors also seek Big Golden

Forget supply chain issues; buy vintage games

Sink a battleship, defeat a king, snag your dream date for the prom. Build a hotel on the Boardwalk, put a “Z” tile on “triple word score,” accuse Miss Scarlett of murder with a lead pipe in the Conservatory. It’s all in an afternoon’s (or evening’s) diversion, all with the comforts of home. As people have spent more time indoors due to the pandemic, many have turned to old favorites. Combine that with the upcoming holidays (not to mention cold weather): The popularity of board and card games is burgeoning on the retail front and increasingly popular among collectors. And experts have the numbers to prove it.

While today’s games have roots that extend back multiple centuries and span worldwide cultures, the first American board games were produced in the 1800s. Early examples include “The Travellers Tour Through the United States” (introduced in 1822, markers are advanced by a spinner, not dice, across a map) and “Mansion of Happiness,” (first published in 1843 and inspired by the early Italian game “Goose,” it encourages moralistic behavior).

They were just the beginning: Since then, thousands of board and card games have been manufactured, according to Desi Scarpone, a dedicated collector. As for the current market, he confirmed that interest (and prices) are up. “There was definitely a time when board games were in a slump. Nothing was selling,” noted Scarpone, author of books on the subject (including a series of Schiffer-published titles). “But it seems like the next generation of kids are now adults, and they are looking for the

games of their youth.” Scarpone said he’s amazed that relatively recent games, including “It From the Pit,” “Fireball Island,” “Tornado Rex,” and “Hero Quest,” all games that he “wouldn’t have given a second glance to,” are now “consistently selling for hundreds of dollars.” Similarly, games from the 1960s, particularly TV-related ones, are commanding surprisingly high prices. Among his “too many” personal favorites are “Voice of the Mummy,” “Skittle Bowl,” “Green Ghost” and “Can’t Stop,” as well as “Barnabas Collins Dark Shadows Game” and “Dogfight.” Recent acquisitions include Hasbro’s “Banana Splits Game,”

Milton Bradley’s “Win-a-Card Trading Game” and Lakeside’s “Le Boomb!” Scarpone tries to buy only complete games in good condition, but there are exceptions. He finally cobbled together a complete “That Girl,” after three tries. On the other hand, he has a 1964 “Munster” game that is “missing a side of the box, but I think it’s better to have any copy, regardless of condition, rather than none.” But for those who just want to play the game, the collector pointed out, condition is not a factor. And old is often better than new. “New reissues of old games are usually far inferior, from materials to artwork

After almost 2-year hiatus, Scott Show returns to Columbus

COLUMBUS, Ohio—The Scott Antique Show returned to the Columbus market the weekend of November 27-28, after nearly two years of COVID forced hiatus. Both dealers and customers were waiting. Scott Antique Markets began over three decades ago by former antique dealer Don Scott. Antique shows were quite different 30 years ago and Scott felt a calling to start his own series that placed a greater emphasis on customer service. The events quickly grew in popularity and vendors and guests flock from across the country to Expo centers in Atlanta, Ga., and Columbus, Ohio, to attend the markets.

Before the pandemic hit, Scott shows ran monthly in Columbus from November through March. However, lockdowns forced the Columbus series to shutter early on, and it remained on hiatus until November of 2021. Meanwhile, Atlanta’s markets continued somewhat business-as-usual through much of 2020 and 2021. The operational contrast stemmed from Ohio’s more stringent COVID precautions. Statewide masking mandates

and restrictions on indoor events remained in effect through early summer of 2021. On top of statewide mandates, Columbus and surrounding Franklin County had their own; those remained in force even after state regulations were lifted. During the weekend when Scott reopened, Columbus’s mask mandate was still in effect in indoor public spaces for anyone age 3 or older.

There were plenty of familiar sellers, related to participate during the show’s re-

opening. Among them was Ray Bullock, returning for a 5th year. He usually pairs with fellow Columbus dealer Dennis Eiffel, to offer a booth teaming with Depres-

sion-era pottery from well-known Ohio makers like Hull and McCoy. Added to

to implements. A vintage game will always look, feel, and play better than a modern reissue. It could be nostalgia clogging up my senses, but almost everyone I meet says the same thing. They buy a new game for their children, thinking they will have the same experience they had as a child, and it falls short. Play vintage!”

And as it turns out, this rising popularity of games is not just subjective: Those thinking that board and card games are little more than child’s (or adult’s) play might be surprised to learn of the intensity of market research on the subject. Just ask Dallin Hatch, an analysis expert for Pattern, a global ecommerce accelerator.

“We know that families get together during the holidays and either buy new games or take down dusty ones from the shelf,” Hatch began. “We decided to see if the data bears that out.” A list of popular board and card games was compiled, and thus began a study in 2019 that tracked trends in online demand. As expected, this assumption was confirmed, as interest surged at the beginning of each year’s holiday shopping season.

What could not have been predicted at the outset of the study, though, was the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic. An “overnight spike” was reported on March 22, 2020, due to the national lockdown. Since that time, the curves on Pattern’s graphs have continued to mirror those of the CDC’s reports of infection.

As for which games in particular are being played, chess (“one of the oldest games around”) proved to be the most popular tabletop game of all, topping out with a 400 percent increase over the three-year period. “I should have seen this coming,” Hatch remarked. No doubt, he continued, the popularity of Netflix’s “The Queen’s Gambit,” which premiered in October 2020, contributed to this phenomenon. But even without the series, what Hatch referred to as “the king of board games” has “staying power,” up 47 percent over

last year and resulting in a “new baseline for the game.”

Behind chess in popularity were “Uno,” Pokémon cards, “Clue,” and “Risk,” a 2021 inductee into the National Toy Hall of Fame at The Strong Museum of Play.

Meanwhile, no game showed a larger increase in demand than did “Settlers of Catan” (“it takes a while to play”). It was followed by such diverse titles as “Hungry Hungry Hippos,” and “Ticket to Ride” (a game about train travel and no relation to the Beatles’ song of the same name). Likewise, the game “Pandemic” enjoyed renewed popularity. In general, Hatch noted, games requiring four players were more popular than those played by two (chess and “Connect Four” are exceptions to that rule, however). Games for adults seem to be enjoying a larger upswing than those geared toward children.

The bottom line is that “now more than ever, board and card games have risen in popularity.” And this is not just a hunch, but rather, borne out by statistics. Furthermore, now might well be the time to buy previously played versions of games like “Monopoly” and “Clue,” not as collectibles, but as favorites to be played. This strategy, Hatch said, might well be a way to deal with inflationary prices among new games, not to mention a way to circumvent supply chain shortages. “It’s hard to predict how the world will look next year,” he concluded. But when it comes to estate and yard sales, “Collectors and dealers would be doing themselves a favor by keeping an eye out and buying early in the year.”

their offerings this time was a nice collection of Gonder pottery hailing from Zanesville, Ohio. Among the Gonder sculptures and vases was a matched pair of planters available for \$79 each.

There were some regular dealers absent this round. Yet, in their place were plenty of excited newcomers - like first-timers Joe and Trina Kopus of Crackerjacks from Bellefontaine, Ohio. They were among a small handful of dealers selling furniture. Front and center in their booth were a pair of 70s-era octagonal lamp tables priced at \$110 nicely staged astride a reproduction Louis XV-style chair from the 1950s, tagged at \$52. A handful of holiday decorations rounded out the trappings.

From Indianapolis came Susan Apple with Tarkington Antiques. Her pieces traveled from the four corners of the world. There were items like an Indian bronze elephant table, priced at \$475. Atop the table, hailing from an upper-class European home, priced at \$275, was a locking liquor bottle cabinet known as a Tantalus. Behind both sat an impressive wooden bench from Ethiopia, wearing remnants of an original cheetah hide covering, selling for \$425.

Dealers reported strong dealer-to-dealer sales on Friday evening and solid business on Saturday. Yet, Sunday's crowd was noticeably thin compared to pre-2020 years. COVID concerns lingered and the city masking mandate no doubt had some effects. While the crowds may have been smaller, they did not lack enthusiasm. Shoppers were enjoying themselves and gleefully snatching up plenty of merchandise. All told, vendors seemed quite pleased with their sales.

Holiday shopping, of course, was on everyone's mind. That emphasis on gift-giving meant modestly priced smalls were more prevalent than furniture and higher-grade antiques. Vintage holiday decor, antique toys, glassware, and estate jewelry were particularly popular. Small did not

necessarily mean inexpensive, and items crossed many price points. One dealer offered an array of Southern face jugs, including a Jerry Brown piece, circa 1902 for \$95. Two booths away, another had pocket watches from names like Howard (\$175) and Hampden (\$215). For anyone who felt Santa needed to relax in a hot bath after a hard Christmas eve, there was a 19th-century copper bathtub available for \$475.

If you missed this show, the next Columbus Scott Antique Market is slated for the weekend of December 18-19. It is a great opportunity for some last-minute holiday shopping. The show is fully indoors, held in the Bricker Building at the Ohio Expo Center. Showtimes are Saturday 9-6 and Sunday 10-4. Admission is free but there is a \$5 charge for parking.

Ansel Adams photo will highlight Holabird auction

RENO, Nev. – Holabird Western Americana Collections, LLC is famous for its five-day auctions featuring thousands of highly collectible items in a rainbow of categories, but the firm will end 2021 with a tidy, three-day affair, December 17-19, online and in the Reno gallery, boasting over 1,900 lots of rare books, art, mining, numismatics, stock certificates, postcards and more.

Day 1 will contain over 600 lots of philatelic (stamps); military, political and firearms; gaming collectibles; and model railroad and toys. Postcards, many of them from the Ken Prag collection, will include California (especially wine country), Hawaii, Disney, Titanic and Pioneer examples.

The gaming section includes items from the Shirley Bovis Cowboy Museum in Tombstone, Ariz.

Of the 500 postcard lots from the Prag collection, about 350 lots are California-related, but 40 lots or so are Hawaii-themed. Lot 1361 – nearly 80 early Hawaii and South Seas Curio Co. postcards, including cards from the Aloha Nui series – has an estimate of \$300-\$600; while lot 1447, a group of ten Titanic-related postcards from around the time of the tragedy, should realize \$700-\$1,500.

A highlight of items from the Shirley Bovis Cowboy Museum is lot 1552, a circa 1880-1890s well-used holster that appears to have been made for a medium-framed revolver with a Buntline length barrel (estimate: \$800-\$1,600).

Tops in the firearms category is lot 1551: a model 1888 Gewehr 88 rifle (aka a commission rifle) made at the Amberg, Germany arsenal in 1891, in very good condition with bluing on the barrel sleeve and magazine well (estimate: \$800-\$1,000). A must-have for original European weapons collectors, the rifle has a Mauser-inspired design but the Mauser arsenal didn't design this model.

Day 2 has 683 lots of books featuring Part 1 of the Ron Leach Western directory collection; mining artifacts and ephemera; and stock certificates and bonds, to include mining and railroad. There are about 200 directories from this first installment of the Ron Lerch collection. Directories are considered a "primary source" material and, as such, are essential aspects of historical research.

Two key pieces from the Lerch collection are the Wells Fargo & Co. Express Directory of Chinese Houses (all in California) from 1878, one of the most sought-after of all the Western directories; and a Montana Territory History & Business Directory from 1879, when Montana was not yet a state, 218 pages, with original fold-out map. Both have estimates of \$3,000-\$6,000.

From the Joe Elcano mining stock collection is a certificate for the Grosch

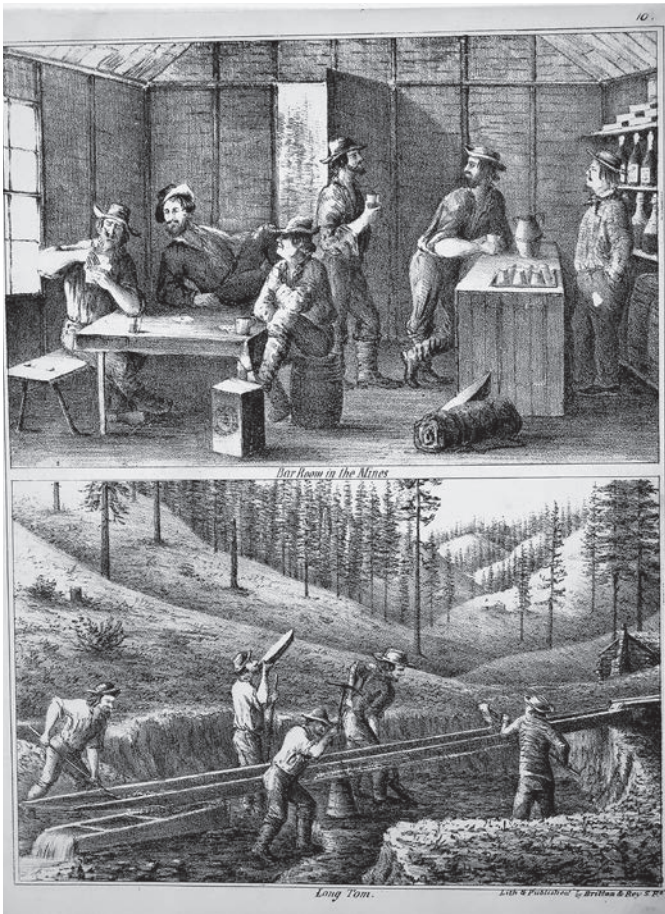

Consolidated Gold & Silver Mining Company (Virginia City, Nev.), for one share, issued to Benjamin Nickerson, issued on Dec. 31, 1864, signed by the company president and secretary, showing two vignettes: a bare-chested allegorical woman and a gold prospector on the move (estimate: \$1,200-\$2,000). The certificate is important because the company was a scam market play on the original Comstock discoverers, the Grosch Brothers.

This is the first one of multiple sales that will feature the Elcano Nevada mining stock collection. The entire Day 2 mining section is strong, though, and features some really great California Gold Rush material (to include letter-sheets), a huge Colorado section, and Montana and Nevada.

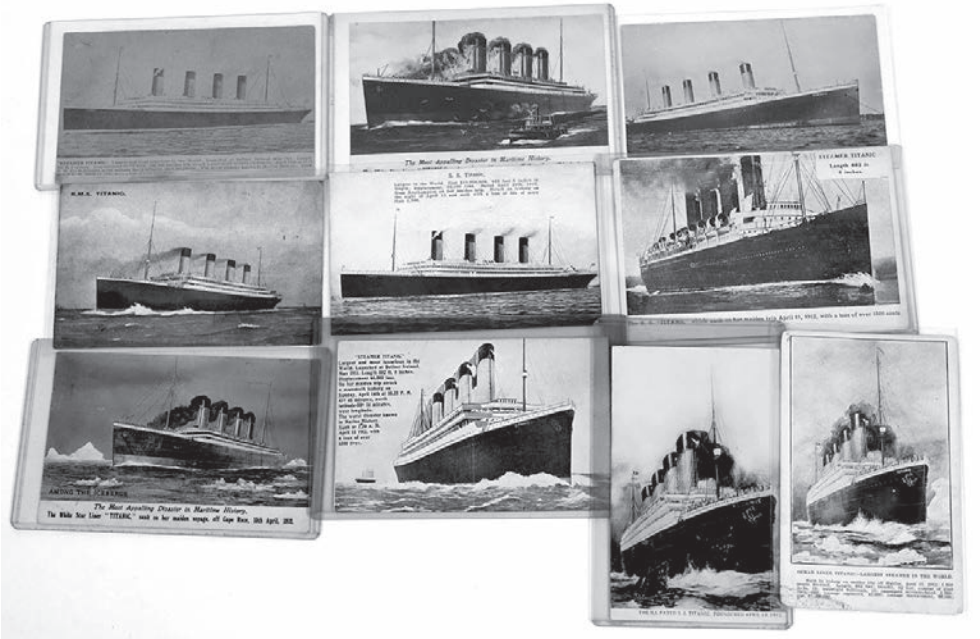
As always, there will be a strong Native American section, featuring baskets (with more to come in the next sale), jewelry and art. Artwork will include three early Salvador Dali signed lithographic prints and a wonderful group of Japanese woodblocks and prints, many signed.

Antiquarian photography is a key category for collectors. Day 3 will feature historic and possibly unique Western stereo-view cards and photographs, led by a fabulous Ansel Adams original photograph group from his Yosemite Series (all signed), including Moon and Half Dome (1960), print No. 10, considered one of Mr. Ad-

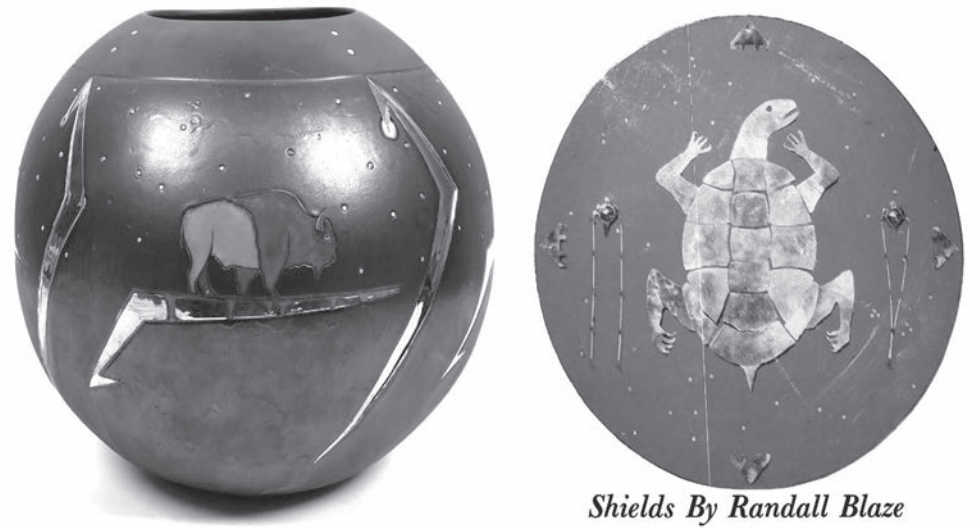
ams's greatest photographs (estimate: \$10,000-\$20,000).

Offerings from the Bill McIver Nevada token and medal collection are not to be missed. They include the centerpiece of his collection: possibly the finest known 12.5-cent token from The Payteller (Rhyolite, Nev.), showing a bearded miner with a pick, shovel and lunch bucket, plus a mountain and rising sun (estimate: \$7,000-\$10,000), octagonal in shape and 30mm in width.

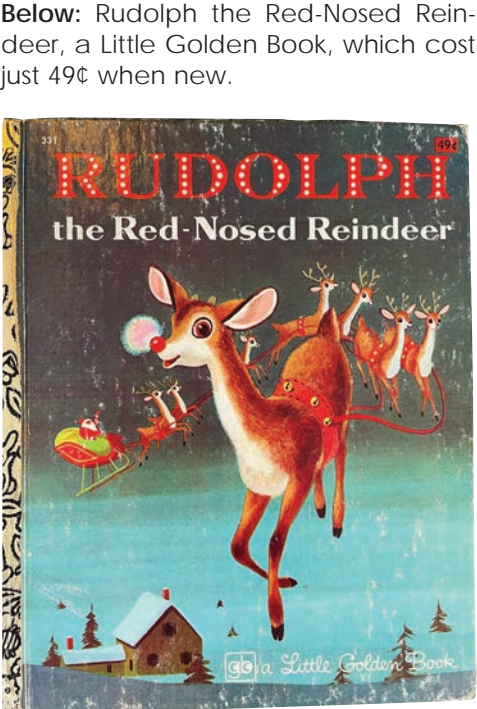
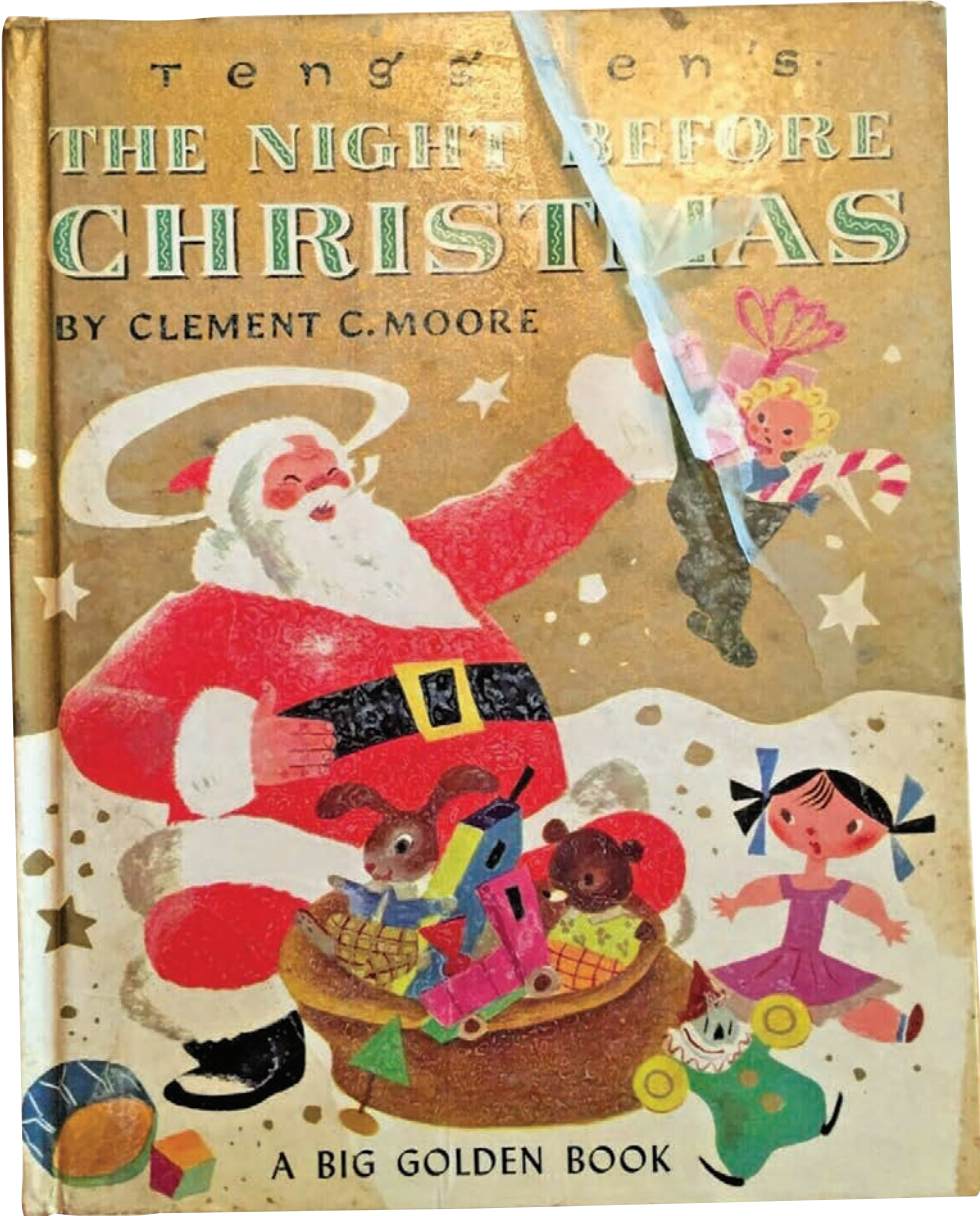
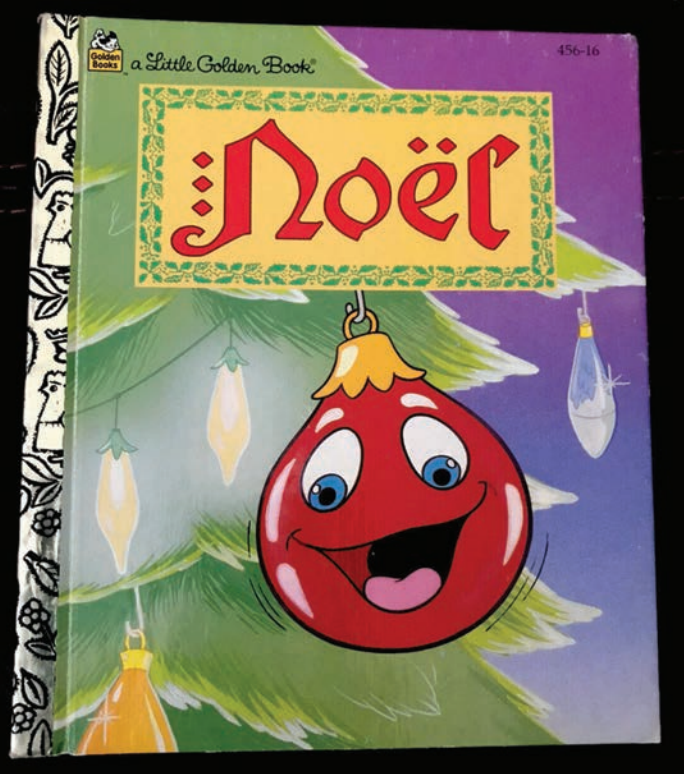

Little Golden Books can still be found for less than \$25 and often much less. However, the cross collectible titles and early versions can sell for more. One seller listed the Little Golden Book Ukulele and her new doll on eBay for \$3,000. Good condition or, rarely, mint condition books bring much higher prices and add prestige and depth to any collection. If you are new to collecting Little Gold-

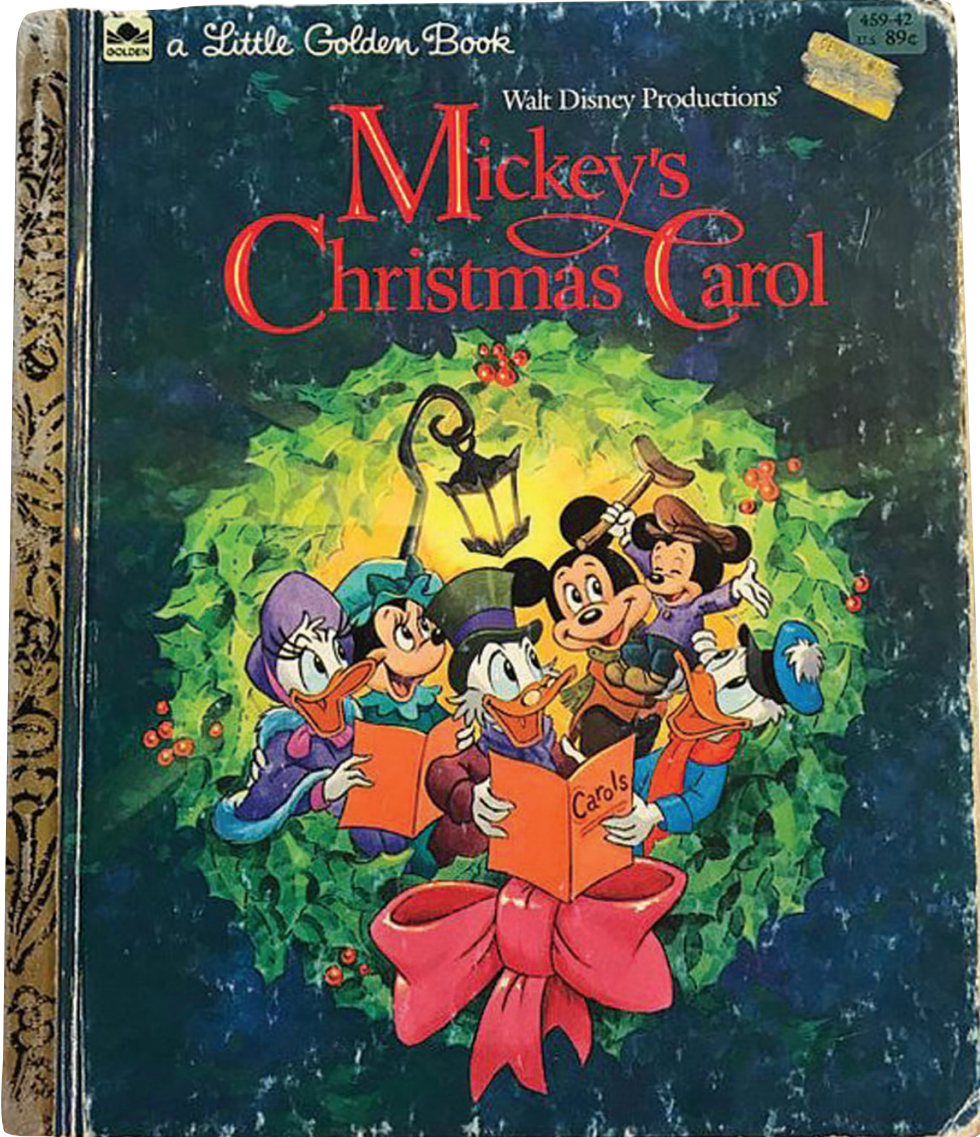
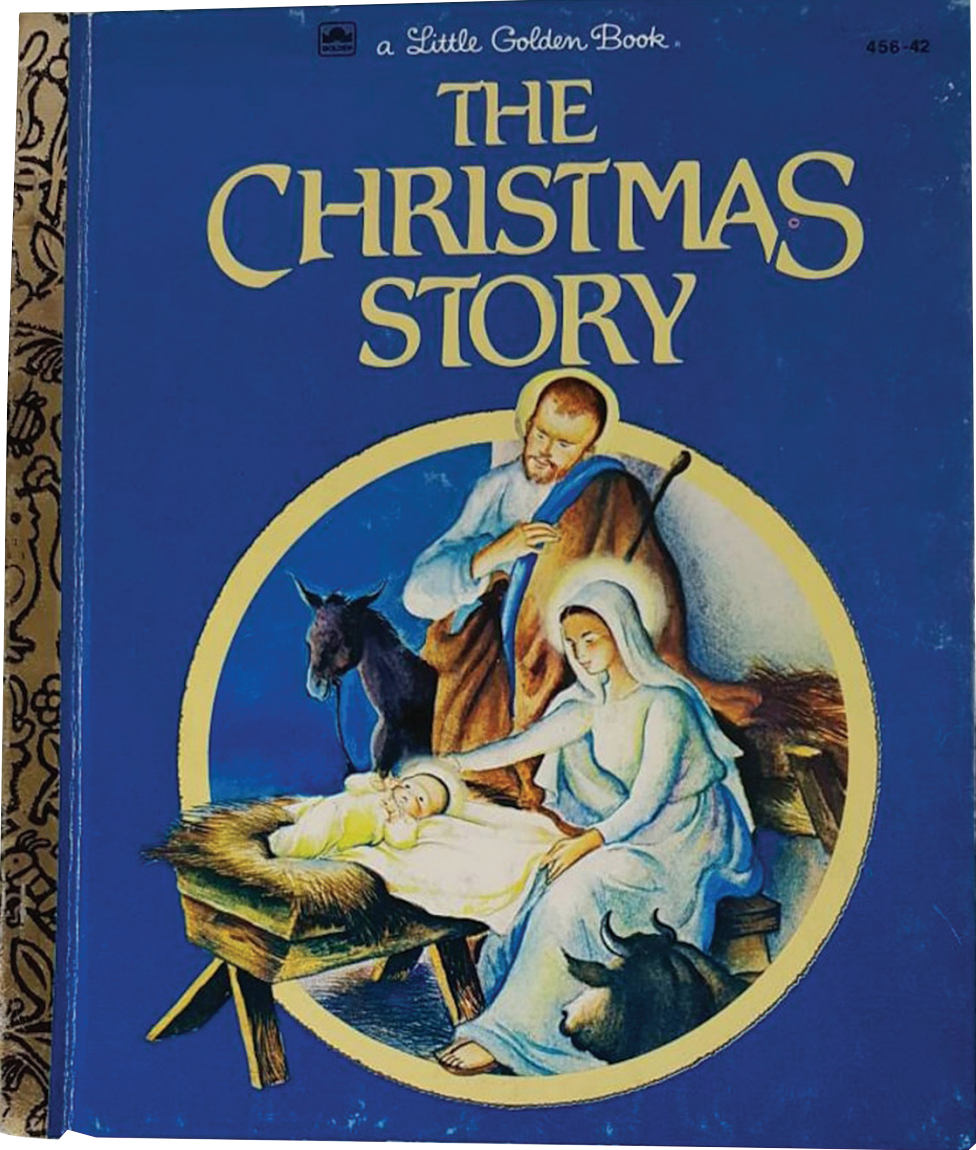
