Rhinestones are the perfect way to sparkle in the New Year

Rhinestones were once referred to as Rhine stones, so named as they were cut from natural, brilliantly colored rock crystals found on the banks of the Rhine River, one of Europe's great waterways. As these appealing pretties were depleted, artisans duplicated them with artificial, hand-crafted, finely polished bling — bits of "rhinestone" glass.

In the late 1770s, jeweler George Fredrich Strass, striving to replicate diamonds, devised a method of backing rhinestones with metal powder. As a result, light, rather than passing through their facets directly, refracted into a range of dazzling hues. Yet when the stones were backed with shiny, mirror-like foils, they twinkled brighter still.

Since nobility and wealthy Europeans often wore diamond jewelry while attending social events or traveling, damage, loss, and "highway robbery" was common. So scores, while out in public, wore clear, high quality, diamond look-alike rhinestone replicas instead. Because these "poor man's diamonds" were pasted into jewelry molds, they were soon known as "paste." Since each stone was individually faceted, molded, and finished by hand, most of these creations were actually as costly as their originals. When open-back diamond settings became desirable, however, paste rhinestones fell from favor.

During the mid-1800s, resplendent hand-cut, silver-mounted rhinestone reproductions of Louis XV period shoe buckles, buttons, and hair ornaments were the height of fashion. So were rhinestone belt buckles, dress clips, and all sorts of jewelry.

From the Victorian Era, a time of symbolism and sentimentality, jewelers created scores of stunning rhinestone-studded brooches, bangles, pendants, and stick pins that not only complimented a lady's style, but also revealed her social status. Though some were diamond-clear, others, backed by colored metallic foil, boasted rich shades of red, purple, or peacock-feather greens and blues.

When smaller, simpler, more elegant jewelry became fashionable, transparent rhinestones also admirably simulated costly, semi-precious gems like onyx, sapphire, peridot, carnelian, ruby, turquoise, amethyst, and carnelian.

In the 1890s, when jewelry was again becoming ornate, Daniel Swarovski, son of a Bohemian gem cutter, designed a glass cutting machine that produced many-faceted crystals faster, more precisely, and more economically than creating traditional, hand-cut lead crystal. These Strawberry?search=1&t=9759cl4f7 proved so successful that, by the turn of the century, he established the Swarovski crystal-cutting company in Austria.

Because each rhinestone facet breaks reflected light into striking sparks of color, the more facets, the flashier. Moreover, when Swarovski increased the lead content of his crystals, his high-faceted rhinestones outdazzled everything on the market. They also revolutionized the high-end fashion couture and jewelry industries.

Jewelry sparked top bidding at Over and Above Auctions

TIMONIUM, Md. — Over and Above Auctions conducted a hybrid sale containing a fantastic collection of Baltimore and Maryland collectibles, curiosities, fine and folk art, and estate jewelry. In total, there were 501 lots offered live and online via LiveAuctioneers

On whole, jewelry took the highest bids. The auction's highest bid of \$1,400 went to an Italian-made 14k 'Epiphany' yellow and white gold choker approximately 17 inches in length. It featured alternating white gold and brushed yellow gold links and came with the original "Epiphany" box.

A 14k white gold Art Deco diamond dinner ring set with four .06 carat diamonds, one bid (\$800) was this Art Deco dinner ring

.13 carat diamond, nine .04 carat diamonds,

and ten channel baguette sapphires sold for \$800. Also selling for \$800 was a 14k yellow gold and diamond ladys's bracelet in a checkered design holding 21 .10 carat round dia-

Covid turned wedding venue into drive-in auction site

NASHVILLE, Mich. — April 2020 should have been the grand opening of FoxView, a wedding and events venue in Nashville, Mich. Unfortunately for owners Aaron and Angie Warner, the pandemic put a stop to gatherings at venues such as the one they wanted to open. The couple then got creative on a way to provide some

After many twists and turns they hit upon auctions in their parking lot; which proved so popular the auctions have now moved indoors after gathering restrictions

"We had purchased the property with just enough funds to finish renovations," says Aaron. "But when the state ordered closings of all these types of businesses



just months later, we had no choice but to get creative if we had any hope of saving our investment."

Coming up with new money-making concepts the media referred to as "pivoting" wasn't the difficult part. The Warners hosted their own Drive-Thru Zombie Zoo in the parking lot, a catered Thanksgiving Dinner pick-up, and a three-ring Drive-Thru Santa Circus complete with sword swallowers, hot air balloons, genuine reindeer and even Santa Claus who waved at kids from the safety of their enclosed car. But, according to the Warners, a business that "pivots" is essentially having to invest in an entirely new business.

"The costs to buy new supplies for events we were inventing, along with the cost to hire staff to help pull it off, was sinking us even more, even though the events were very well attended, and the line of cars was a mile long to get in," says Angie, who greeted guests at each event while selling tickets and popcorn through car windows. "The events were a lot of fun, but they paid for themselves and not much else."

The dedicated couple continued down their list, hosting 5k runs and outdoor movies...even professional wrestling and lawnmower races for an Independence Day fundraiser they called America Fest. Each event was well received and attended but the startup costs defeated the purpose; until they began hosting Tailgate Auc-

Their wedding/reception venue parking lot is where they decided to host their first Tailgate Auction which attracted five sellers attracted from flyers the Warner's hung around town. Around a dozen buyers came to watch and possibly buy what the five cars held inside. As each tailgate, door or hatchback was opened, the auctioneer began his chant, selling off anything the seller had brought, from old tires to collectible antiques, old toys to video games. And though to Aaron it was a con-



sheath. A collection of trench art, with two ashtrays made from artillery shells, and a letter opener in the shape of a sword mounted to a bullet, sold for \$60.

Another fascinating feature of this auction was the 150-plus lots of Baltimore and Maryland-related items. Among them were souvenir plates, postcards, stereoviews, books, and plenty of Colts, and Oriole's sports paraphernalia.

Perhaps the most captivating lots in this category were documents like land surveys and other historical real estate records from various Maryland counties. One particularly interesting lot of seven documents Somerset County, Maryland, included an indenture deed from 1725, paid for with 2000 pounds of tobacco. The nearly 300-year-old document was graded in good condition. Bidders took the lot to

A collection of nine 18th and 19th-century documents from Prince George's and Anne Arundel Counties went for \$110. Those papers, many graded in poor condition, included a plat survey from 1710, several deeds, and boundary dispute resolution.

Items from the last century included a lot of seven deputy sheriff of Baltimore County badges that reached \$375. Four Baltimore pinup calendars sold for \$100. Among the pieces was a nude Marilyn Monroe calendar from 1955 advertising Aarid Van Lines. And, eight Baltimore and vicinity pennants, including one for the original "Friendship International Airport" (now Baltimore-Washington International Airport) went for \$120.

Maryland sports fans had nearly three-dozen lots to pursue, including a batch of seven very-good-condition Baltimore Orioles yearbooks from the 1960s which went for \$80. A set of two Baltimore Orioles pennants from the 1960s in overall very good condition hit \$70. A Sears wool child's Baltimore Colts Johnny Unitas jacket also went for \$80.

The auction also offered plenty of art and antiques. A two-piece lot of signed vintage Mexico popote/popotillo dyed straw art sold for \$900. One was labeled Carbonero and depicted a scene of burrows and farmers. A bronze bulldog mechanical bank reached \$325. Surprising was the set of porcelain that climbed to \$250. The lot, graded very good, contained four matching pieces of Austrian porcelain paired with two additions. The Austrian pieces were adorned in green, red, and gilt, and included a lidded chocolate pot, cup & saucer, and small creamer. Added were a large Spode vase and a gilt decorated Staffordshire bud vase.

Over and Above's next announced auction will take place on March 7. It features pens and pencils from names like Mont Blanc, Schaeffer, and Waterman, along

Guns stolen in the 1970s make their way home to musuems

PHILADELPHIA — Stolen artifacts were recently returned to their rightful owners — six museums from the Philadelphia region — in a repatriation ceremony held by the Federal Bureau of Investigation Art Crime Team - Philadelphia Division at the Museum of the American Revolution.

The artifacts were recovered through the efforts of the Federal Bureau of Investigation Art Crime Team - Philadelphia Division, the United States Attorney's Office of the Eastern District of Pennsylvania, and the Upper Merion Township Police Department.

"It is incredibly significant and exciting for us to be joined by all of these local institutions today and to see them reunited with objects that have been missing for half a century," said Dr. R. Scott Stephenson, President and CEO of the Museum of the American Revolution. "Our collections are used as tools to engage our audiences in an appreciation of history and to reinvigorate their civic commitment – it's the foundation of all of our missions. We are incredibly grateful to the FBI and law enforcement for their tireless work to bring these items

home."

The museums that received repatriated items include the American Swedish Historical Museum, Hershey Story Museum, Landis Valley Museum, Mercer Museum, Museum of the American Revolution, and York County History Center. The 15 total items that were repatriated were primarily historic firearms from the 18th and 19th century, including rifles and pistols, and a Native American concho belt.

"In law enforcement, as in any profession, there are good days and bad days. Today, standing here along with our partners, is one of those good days," said Jacqueline Maguire, Special Agent in Charge of the FBI's Philadelphia Division. "The absence of the items from these museums represented not just a physical or financial loss, but a loss to every visitor, every student, and every researcher who didn't get to see the items over the years and missed out on important pieces of our nation's heritage. The absence of these items was, for so long, a loss to the historical record. The FBI is honored to have helped correct that loss and return these artifacts to the institutions from which they were stolen so long ago."

Through the repatriation, the Museum of the American Revolution received a French gendarmerie flintlock pistol and a pair of Ward & Steele Queen Anne flintlock pistols, which were stolen in 1970, and a French Model 1777 Charleville pistol, which was stolen in 1972. The items were stolen from the Valley Forge Historical Society, which transferred its distinguished collection to the Museum in 2003.

The recovered artifacts were part of a 50-year-old cold case that was cracked by the FBI in 2019 and included the return of a rare firearm made by gunsmith Christian Oerter, which was stolen in 1971 when it was on display at Valley Forge Park. The rifle, which is on loan from the Pennsylvania Society of Sons of the Revolution and its Color Guard (PSSR), is now on display in the Museum of the American Revo-

lution's special exhibition Liberty: Don Troiani's Paintings of the Revolutionary War, which is on view through Sept. 5, 2022.

ceptual success, it was still questionable if this concept would be any more profitable than the cardboard sled races they had hosted in January 2021.

"The second week was the test," said Aaron. "Would anyone return? Would anyone have more items to sell? We had no idea."

And with less than a half-hour before the auction was to begin that second week, the only car in the parking lot belonged to the Warners. Then, one by one, cars began turning in, taking their place among other sellers, or finding a parking space among the buyers. "I have to admit, it was pretty magical," Aaron says. "I started to tear up. It was like a scene in a great comeback movie."

Aaron had always thought being an auctioneer would be fun, and on this second week he began his odyssey.

"Aaron practiced a lot before then, thinking that someday he wanted to be an auctioneer," says Angie, who clerks each week's auction while her husband collects bids as a do-it-yourself auctioneer, both having no formal training. "He practiced while driving down the road, pretending each telephone pole he passed was a new bid. Our four-year old daughter now auctions her toys to the dog."

In just a few weeks, the auctions grew to more than a dozen vehicles arriving ready to sell to nearly 100 buyers. This

Bidders fought for Mars, the God of War, at Rachel Davis auction

By Susan Emerson Nutter

CLEVELAND, Ohio — Mars, the Roman God of War, kept bidders on their toes at an auction conducted by Rachel Davis Fine Arts.

The top lot of the day was a very fine French bronze figural clock featuring Mars. The figure sat atop a red marble base with the 8-day time and strike timepiece having strike round movement. The circa 1860 clock was 33 inches high and sold for \$29,000 (est. \$1,000-\$2,000). Prices do not include the 25 percent buyer's premium.

"A dealer in Wellington, Ohio, cataloged the clocks for me, but apparently the value in this item was the bronze. It may have been cast by Barbidieene," Rachel Davis explains. "I found similar clocks, but nothing that quite matched. We had seven phone bidders as well as lots of action on the other platforms. It sold to a collector in Canada."

Having six planets revolving around the central sun, the planetarium was on a wooden stand and showed the 12 months with the 12 signs of the zodiac. Standing 20 inches high, though the mechanism was not in working order, this lot realized \$15,000 (est. \$200-\$400).

Other globe-related items offered included "The Earth and Its Inhabitatns" a small terrestrial globe with its original box which made \$8,500. By Carl Johann Bauer (Nuremburg, circa 1825) the lid of the box had a colored plate with three figures. The globe was made up of 12 engraved, hand-colored gores, with the continents shaded.

Similarly, "The World with Its Animals"; a small terrestrial globe with its original box that included a 28 page hand-colored engraving concertina depicting the animals; also a Bauer item sold for \$5,000.

"All the globes were from the Trump Brown estate, with the Murdock item selling to a collector in New York city," Davis said. "There was a great deal of phone bidding as well as bidding across the other platforms for this particular item. It got down to two bidders after the \$10,000 mark. A fellow who picked up a globe lot at the auction who collects globes told me he has never seen one like the Murdoch planetarium. I guess there is one in the Smithsonian, but this gentleman has never seen one for sale or documented anywhere else."

Artwork offered was well received. A 19th century American School oil on canvas titled "The Ainsworth Girl" realized \$21,000. This painting was found in the Ainsworth house on No. Elmwood Street in Median, Ohio, when the house was being torn down.

"This oil was also part of the Brown Trump estate," Davis said. "Phone and internet bidding was very active for this work. The buyer; a collector from Columbus,

Ohio, has not let me know if he is attributing it to anyone in particular. The painting was in nice, untouched condition and will clean up beautifully!"

A 19th century Ohio or Kentucky marriage fraktur dated 1831 commemorating the marriage of Robert McCain and Susan Fisher and painted by W.L. Williams sold for \$18,000. The work was 14 inches by 18 inches.

Other decorative items finding new owners this day included a 1932 gelatin silver print, "New York at Night" by Berenice Abbot (American, 1898-1991). The 36 inch by 28 5/8 inch print sold for \$10,000.

A Centennial flag banner with the canton having the date 1776-1876 was bid to \$6,000. It was interesting that two of the stars in the canton were colored blue. The banner measured 28 inches by 46 inches.

And a hand-carved butter mold featuring "Liberty with an eagle and 12 stars" sold for \$4,000. Having a carved edge, the mold was five inches in diameter.


Judaica items will highlight WAG New Year auction

EAST MEADOW, N.Y. – World Auction Gallery will ring in the New Year with a major, 535-lot auction on Sunday, Jan. 2, led by a large collection of items by Yaacov Agam (Israeli, b. 1928) from a private collection; the largest collection of Judaica items, including silver, bronzes and more; and exceptional paintings by noted and listed American, Chinese and European artists.

Also offered will be wonderful enameled Russian silver and Buccellati silver pieces; European porcelain, including Meissen and KPM; and Chinese and Japanese items.

Pieces in the Yaacov Agam collection include an Agamograph lithograph titled Festival #5, fully signed and numbered (42/99), in the original frame measuring 23 inches by 24 inches (estimate: \$800-\$1,000); and two Judaica kinetic Shalom Menorahs, both on a tri-base, both fully signed and numbered and housed in their original padded cases. Each is expected to bring \$600-\$800.

Judaica items will feature a rare silver Torah shield (Warsaw, Poland, dated 1862), 17 ½ inches tall, with a certificate from



Judaica Research dated June 16, 1999, and birds. plus added items (estimate: 3,000-\$4,000); and a large bronze and marble Hanukiah, gold color, 20 inches tall, by Salvador Dali (Spanish, 1904-1999), signed and numbered (5/250), dated 1980 (estimate: \$1,000-

A Russian enameled silver basket with jewels, fully hallmarked and in generally very good, tarnished condition, 8 ½ inches by 4 ½ inches handle-to-handle, should bring \$1,000-\$1,500; while a Russian monumental oil on canvas painting, apparently unsigned, titled Lenin Talking to Farmers, 19 inches by 16 inches (sight, less the beautiful frame), should realize \$800-\$1,200.

The other is an antique Japanese carved wood etagere / cabinet, circa 1880s, 89 inches tall by 57 inches long with decorations of Mount Fuji, flying cranes, dragons



Rhinestones

FROM FRONT PAGE

To many, vintage Swarovski rhinestone pieces are most desirable — especially those that are signed or marked "Genuine Swarovski."

When romantic, flowery bow heart, and bow knot-shaped diamond brooches, some enhanced pearls or garnets, were favored, many wore delicate rhinestone versions instead. Bold, bright rhinestone brooches resembling dragonflies, butterflies, lizards, snails, and frogs, were also captivating.

During the 1920s, when white topaz or diamonds on platinum were trendy, Coco Chanel embraced glitzy costume jewelry for both night and day wear. Soon mass-produced rhinestone brooches, buttons, buckles, ornamental combs, and dress clips were found not only in select shops, but also at lower-end five-and-tens. Even when classic white-on-white rhinestone jewels morphed into dramatic ruby, sapphire, emerald, amethyst and topaz-hued creations, they suited every pocketbook.

As time went by, American manufacturers, including Coro, Haskell, Trifari, and Hobe, also created rhinestone costume jewelry. Many of their designs featured imported Swarovski crystals in tight pave settings—but not all. Rhinestones worn in American movies like "Gone With the Wind" and "The Wizard of Oz "(1939), for instance, featured unique settings that heightened their refraction under studio lights. And as rhinestones flashed across the silver screen, their popularity soared across the world.

Through the 1930s and '40s, exquisite Eisenberg & Son rhinestone swirling bow and snowflake brooches were especially popular. So were their multi-hued clip earrings, dress clips, fur clips, and "fruit salad" brooches. In addition to similar creations, the Albert Weiss Company created classy jewelry winking with black rhinestones.

Afer World War II, as jewelry pieces grew bolder, necklaces, earrings, and bracelets often blossomed with flowery rhinestone clusters. Brooches, on the other hand, often resembled birds, butterflies, leopards, snakes, or zebras. Rhinestone rings, watches, minaudieres, belts, eyeglass frames, cufflinks, bowties, and tie pins were also fashionable

In the mid-1950s, the Swarovski company introduced innovative Aurora Borealis (AB) rhinestones, clear glass crystals were treated with special micro-thin metallic coatings. Like the Aurora Borealis AB rhinestones create shimmering red, blue, green, and gold effects. Since they also reflect hues of adjacent fabrics, they inspired Christian Dior, the famed designer, to embellish many of his alluring evening gowns with them. When his exclusive company rights expired, pieces were soon created by important, well-loved

designers like Elsa Schiaparelli.

In addition to high-class fashionistas, celebrities like Elvis, Diana Ross, and Michael Jackson have worn costumes glittering with rhinestones. Because designers typically worked for various jewelry manufacturers over the course of their careers, identifying who created what can be challenging. Yet materials, manufacturing methods, and colors often offer clues.

Not all rhinestones, however, are Swarovskis or even Austrian. Czech Preciosa, a company based in Bohemia, a traditional glass production center, was established in 1948. Though Preciosa Czech Machine-cut rhinestones feature a slightly lower lead content than Swarovski, they flash brighter at a distance and are less costly. Preciosa Extra Grade glass rhinestones, however, feature double cuts, but molded facets. So naturally, they are less brilliant.

Antique and vintage rhinestone jewels are most collectible of all. "Prices for the finest pieces can reach five figures, especially those by well-known designers, in great condition, and part of a parure—a complete necklace, earring and bracelet set," explains Madeline Celletti, owner at Bohemian Boutique in Georgetown, Mass. "Yet a single rhinestone brooch can range from hundreds of dollars to less than \$10 for a thrift shop find." Design, colors, condition, rarity, as well as personal appeal determine their market value.

Since contemporary, mass-produced rhinestone creations are sometimes altered to appear vintage, collectors are advised to seek pieces featuring foil-backed, prong-set stones, along with overall craftmanship rivaling that of fine jewelry. Though their reverse sides may show scratches or other slight signs of wear, they should not be unduly damaged.

Antique rhinestone pieces may also feature brand stamps, logos., or company signatures revealing their origins. Yet when famous manufacturers copied or reused their designs and molds to create newer pieces, these were generally left unsigned. Books like Rhinestone Jewelry: A Price and Identification Guide by Leigh Leshner, Rhinestone Jewelry, Figurals, Animals and Whimsicals: Identification & Values by Marcia Sparkles Brown, and Rhinestones!: A Collector's Handbook and Price Guide by Nancy N. Schiffer, may help in identification.

Many enthusiasts, instead of collecting rhinestonecollecting jewelry, seek glittering, name-brand powder compacts or evening bags. Others create unabashed retro fashion statements with sparkling jeweled scarfs, sweaters, jeans, jackets, hair ornaments, or festive, fringed cowboy shirts.
