Collectors are falling for snow globes


The snow globe (sometimes called a snow dome, water globe or snowstorm) is an object that simultaneously evokes holiday cheer and, for some, an eye-roll-worthy sensation. Snow gloves are irresistible for their promise of brief, easy entertainment. In addition, there's an added visual delight of miniatures in each globe. To many the globes were a reminder of a place once visited.

Hard to believe, these often-bought and soon thereafter discarded, hand-held holiday items are now worth a pretty penny or two. Wells Fargo Chinese Western directory opened a big bid at \$13,750

RENO, Nev. - A Wells Fargo Express Chinese Western directory from 1878 sold for \$13,750, while signed and numbered photographs by Western photographer Ansel Adams (1902-1984) and rare tokens from the glory days of America's Gold Rush era all did well in Holabird Western Americana Collections' December Dreams: Premier Americana Auction held December 17 - 19.

The three-day sale, held online and live at the Holabird gallery in Reno, featured over 1,900 lots of rare books, art, mining, numismatics, stock certificates, postcards and more. Highlighted collections included more parts of the Ken Prag postcard collection, the Bill McIver token and medal collection, the MacKenzie Montana collection and the Ron Lerch Western collection.

About 7,500 people registered to bid, with the top categories being art, directories and numismatics. "We're attracting hundreds of new collectors with each sale that goes by," said Fred Holabird of Holabird Western Americana Collections. All prices include buyer's premium.

Day 1 contained over 600 lots of philatelic (stamps); military, political and firearms; gaming collectibles; and model railroad and toys. Postcards, many of them from the Ken Prag collection, included California

Titanic and Pioneer cards. The gaming section included items from the Shirley Bovis Cowboy Museum in Tombstone, Ariz.

Of the 500 postcard lots from the Ken Prag collection, about 350 lots were California-related, but 40 lots or so were Hawaii-themed. Lot 1370 was a collection of

(especially wine country), Hawaii, Disney, more than 210 postcards with color renderings of rare and exotic fishes of Hawaii. Most were from a series published for the Waikiki Aquarium in Honolulu. All were from the early 20th century. The lot went

sential aspects of historical research.

The Wells Fargo Express Chinese directory from 1878 is one of the most sought-after, rare and important of all the Western directories and sold accordingly, for \$13,750. It was a directory for Chinese houses in San Francisco, Sacramento, Stockton, Marysville, San Jose, Portland and Virginia City for that year. It was well-used and worn, with Chinese notes on pages throughout.

A first edition copy of the Hawaiian Kingdom Statistical and Commercial Directory from 1880-1881, included a tourist guide. Each island in the Kingdom was listed, along with officials, principal villages and descriptions of the islands, plus colored ads (\$2,250).


A Brown's Marysville (Calif.) Directory for the year beginning March 1861, a general and business register of citizens with statistical tables, historical references and more, prefaced by sketches of industrial enterprises and charitable organizations

A very rare copy of the A.R. Dunbar &Co.'s Chinese Mercantile Directory for 1897, listing all the principal Chinese merchants and manufacturers in the U.S., Canada and Hawaii, 216 pages from the press of Brown, Meese & Craddock, San Francisco (\$8,435).

Other Day 2 highlights included a handbill issued by Wells Fargo in 1866 (Gold Hill, Nevada), extolling the thefts of company monies used by several WF agents to gamble on mining stocks (\$3,375); and a Britton &

in the Mines and Long Tom, one of only five known copies (\$1,625).

A rare stereo view of gold miner Ed Schieffelin (who founded Tombstone, Arizona in 1877), showing him with a pick, breaking a rock, taken by Charles O. Farciot, hammered for \$3,125. Also, a stock certificate for 42 shares from 1863 for the Byron Gold & Silver Mining Co. (Sutro, Nevada), a company mentioned by Mark Twain in a letter dated Feb. 3, 1863, fin-

The signed and numbered photographs by Ansel Adams were from a special edition of fine prints from Photographs of Yosemite (Calif.) by Ansel Adams. Images included Moon and Half Dome, the tenth print made of this world-class photograph from 1960 (\$9,687); Bridal Veil Fall, from circa 1958-1970 (\$7,500); and El Capitan in Winter, also printed circa 1958-1970 (\$5,625).

Offerings from the Bill McIver Nevada token and medal collection included the centerpiece of his collection: possibly the finest known 12.5-cent token from The Payteller (Rhyolite, Nev.), showing a bearded miner with a pick, shovel and lunch bucket, plus a mountain and rising sun (\$5,500); and a Copper Block Buffet (Valdez, Alaska) gold nugget token, good for \$1 (\$2,625).

Other tokens included an extremely rare Rhyolite token for the Southern Bar ("Good for a Drink or Cigar"), very rare, round in shape, 24mm, made by L.A. Rubber Stamp Company (\$2,125); and a Victor Venturino token from the Eureka County (Nev.) town of Mineral Hill ("Good for 12 1/2 Cents in Trade"), round in shape, 25mm, with what appeared to be a plug or a hole (\$2,500).

A great numismatic rarity was found in an 1851 letter. Prior to the establishment of a Branch US Mint in California, private firms made their own gold coins. Some



came under fire in 1851 for not containing sufficient gold. These firms, including Dunbar & Co., were "attacked" in the local press, which adversely affected their value. Reacting to this adversity, the letter addresses how Dunbar would cure and defect. It is the first original document to discuss this important period.

The letter was signed by Dunbar & Co. and dated March 31, 1851, noting the receipt of 192 9/16 ounces of gold dust at \$17.125 per ounce to be paid in Dunbar & Co.'s (gold) coin on demand, "or if said coin will not pay at par at the time of such demand, the amount shall be redeemed at the office of Dodge & Co. in current silver at the hands of Henry D. Cogswell." It made

therefore unknown), numbered "59/350", realized \$2.625.

Native Americana was led by a Tlingit Indian basket, 8 inches in diameter and 4 inches tall, with seven swastikas false embroidered into the middle band, circa 1900 (\$1,000); a large Haida (Alaska) ornate design box with patterns on all sides with shell inlays as eyes of birds and animals, plus typical red and black patterns (\$625); and a vintage, museum-quality sterling silver and turquoise squash blossom necklace, unmarked, with 20 gorgeous turquoise stones (\$938).

Golf show hit a hole in one for visitors and exhibitors

FOR THE COLUMBUS GOLF SHOW

DUBLIN, Ohio — Nearly 100 golf memorabilia enthusiasts gathered in Dublin Jan. 7-8, for the Columbus Golf Collectibles Show, hosted by Gary and Susan Wyckhoff of Huntsville. Both members of the Golf Heritage Society, they have hosted the show since 2015.

This year's show, at the Hilton Embassy Suites Hotel in Dublin, attracted more than 50 exhibitors.

Among the exhibitors was Dr. Michael Hurdzan, a golf course architect of some renown – his Erin Hills Golf Course near Milwaukee, Wis., was the site for the U.S. Open in 2017 – who had a table with a variety of books. Hurdzan's office on Old Henderson Road in Columbus, is a treasure of golf artifacts itself, from books to posters, golf clubs and more from which he annually brings in a sampling for sale. "It is an enjoyable show," he said, "and I love seeing again friends and fellow collectors."

Some of these hail from as far as Texas and the Carolinas, some from New York, Michigan and Pennsylvania. Some, like Bob Muir of Pittsburgh, confess that he does not expect to sell much. For him, the real value of the show are the connections he makes, the opportunity to see what others bring and, like Hurdzan, the chance to catch up with old friends.

Hickory golf clubs seemed by far the items in most abundance, still the visitor could select from small silver collectibles such as cigarette cases, hat pins, brooches and the like, to gorgeous ceramics from the likes of Spode, Gerz, Royal Doulton, and O'Hara, and even lovely examples of classic clubs from the 1960s-1980s.

There were posters featuring modern heroes like Tiger Woods, Jack and Arnie to the legendary stars of the distant past such



as Bobby Jones, Walter Hagen and Harry Vardon. One display of colorful golf ball boxes caught the eye, as did a handsome set of golf statuettes made by Endurance LTD, a now defunct maker of sports figurines from Dunfermline in Scotland.

Some items could be had for a mere handful of dollars while others, such as rare clubs, golf balls and books, might have the potential buyer and seller locked in serious negotiations for a few minutes.

One fellow left the room several times with bundles of hickory golf clubs that he presumably will repair and re-sell. Another found an early club made by a manufacturer that he collects.

"It's a hickory-shafted mashie made by the Vulcan Company of Portsmouth, Ohio," Paul O'Neill said. "I'm from Portsmouth and I collect these. I was very happy to find

Modern putter designer Bobby Grace was seen in the room, offering some of his own clubs, some of which fetch handsome prices in four figures, but also gathering information for a project that charts the evolution of the wedge, or sand wedge. "One of the collectors in here has some prime examples," Grace said, "and I'm lucky he is willing to share photos and information about them."

Wyckhoff said he plans to host the show again next year, same place and around the same time in early January. Meanwhile, for those keen to get into the robust hobby of golf collecting, check out the Golf Heritage Society at www.golfheritage.org.

Putting together an auction preview is no easy task

DOWNINGTOWN, Pa. — With the resumption of live sales at Pook & Pook comes the return of a favorite pastime, the auction preview. People gather to wander through the exhibition, admiring and engaging with the antiques on display. Old friends, multigenerational families, young couples, antique hounds and renowned experts roam the building. Banter is exchanged. On preview evenings, a glass of wine in hand, there is a distinct note of festivity in the air.

Auction previews at Pook & Pook are experiences. A great deal of care and fore-thought goes into exhibiting the antiques. Respect for the objects and their owners comes first. Auctioneer James Pook creates a museum of furniture in the main hall. Sunlight from windows fifty feet above illuminate this American furniture. It is a bit like stepping back in time.

Upstairs on the sunlit balcony are more intimate areas by exhibition designer Elizabeth Pook. Something of a secret weapon, Elizabeth is a former Exhibitor Magazine Tradeshow Manager of the Year, an award won during her tenure as a marketing executive at Mars/M&M. Having a pro in the house is indispensable, enabling Pook & Pook to deliver results far beyond simply lining auction lots up on shelves or tables. In each exhibition, Elizabeth's creativity and aesthetics are called into play. She is charged with displaying hundreds of assorted objects that are by nature of their creation highly individualistic. "To have such a wonderful, eclectic mix of things to create a display with—I love the challenge. Every auction is different," she says. No matter how eclectic or diverse the antiques displayed, Elizabeth's execution honors the objects, their collectors and creators, and conveys their historical value. light. "I'll never forget the time I recreated a country store for a client. When she arrived and viewed it, it brought tears to her eyes and brought back memories of her collection," Elizabeth reminisces, and those moments are as important to her as winning a national award.

It is no small feat to fill 16 showcases and never present a sterile display. Elizabeth admits, "The hardest thing is to look over a sea of items and put together a mental jigsaw puzzle of how the showcases can fit a juxtaposition of styles that go well together and in an interesting way." Elizabeth's bag of magic tricks is evident: her use of line and perspective to lead the eye, placing opposites in such a way that their interplay complements, the constant variety of texture and shape, the touches of whimsy, make the displays come alive.

OTTAWA LAKE, Mich. — With 1,006 lots presented over a two-day period, the Leonard's Auction Service 17th Annual New Year's Online Auction offered a wide variety of interesting, beautiful, and useful items. These included musical instruments, handsome furniture, antique toys, firearms, and decorative pieces that were in excellent condition and ready for new owners. Prices quoted here do not include the buyer's premium.

Some unusual musical instruments were featured at this sale, including handcarved African drums, a fife and even a wooden rauschpfeife. But the top selling instrument, which also received the highest bid for the entire sale, was the Wm. S. Haynes Co. sterling silver flute. This well-respected company from Boston is noted for producing hand-made instruments featuring precision engineering and rich sound. This early 1900s example was claimed with a high bid of \$1,980. Another fine item from the woodwind family was the Pearl Flute PFP-105 Grenaditte piccolo with carrying case that cleared a final bid of \$271.

Incredibly handsome wooden furniture in mahogany, maple, cherry and other quality woods was eagerly claimed by discerning buyers. Leading this pack was the 65 inches tall by 72 inches wide 1897 oak triple bookcase cabinet with grotesque North Wind faces, original casters, and skeleton key. A tintype was included which showed "Uncle Thomas and Aunt Annie" and documented the cabinet as being purchased in 1900. The cabinet and its valuable provenance finished with a high bid of \$1,400. An eye-catching 37-inch tall Henkel-Harris mahogany bird's-eye maple inlaid 4-drawer chest drew a final bid of \$845. A massive 90 inches tall by 68 inches wide burled walnut marble top carved sideboard with dovetail joints and intricate

A selection of 15 firearms covering a variety of examples were presented for consideration. While long guns were offered, it was the Smith & Wesson model 3 .44 caliber 6 shot top break double action revolver dated 1865-1880 with case that drew the most interest, finishing with a high bid of \$995. The Stevens Browning model C-21 12 gauge pump action pre-1964 shotgun with 30-inch barrel closed at \$630 while the Remington model SPR 310 over and under 12 gauge shotgun with engraved nickel receiver and 28-inch barrel which had never been fired closed at \$600. A 1940s Ranger 101.2 20 gauge bolt action shotgun with 4 shot magazine and 26-inch barrel closed at \$455.

Near the top of the successful high bids was a vintage Dueber 14K gold filled pocket watch with leather fob. It displayed the company's trademark anchor entwined by a serpent. The front cover showed a Native American on horseback and the back cover was a town on a shore. Reported to need oiling and cleaning, this treasure still left with a high bid of \$600. Other jewelry included a 14K gold Joni Designer necklace and cross pendant that cleared \$156 and a sterling silver Indian squash blossom necklace for \$106.

Some appealing artwork by Ohio art-

ist Walter Chapman was well received. His fascinating story includes earning a Bronze Star for combat art during World War II. This award-winning artist was proficient in oil and watercolor, creating both portraits and landscapes, along with serving as a revered art instructor and operator of the Chapman Art Gallery in Sylvania for over 32 years. His fanciful 26 by 32 inch watercolor titled "Wildflowers" featured a brightly colored scene of a shop that sold flowers. It drew a final bid of \$450. A 16 by 20 inch seascape done in oil on canvas featured white caps on the shore with seagulls hovering. A bid of \$200 took it home. A watercolor showing a serene home with a white picket fence closed at \$106 while a print titled "Columbian House" drew a \$65 final bid.

Antique toys are always popular, especially when they are in good condition. Many memories were no doubt rekindled by a glossy red Wyandotte Steel LaSalle sedan car and air stream travel trailer circa 1930s in great condition that required a high bid of \$650. Next, there was a Buddy L aerial ladder fire truck circa 1920s/30s which included the letters "CFD" on the side. Although moderately rusty, it seemed to be complete and was taken with a high bid of \$360. For something completely different, there was a 23-inch steel Tri-ang Railways London Transport red double

decker bus. This detailed model bore the slogan "The world's finest model railway system" and even had the route "93 Wimbledon Morden" displayed. It left with a high bid of \$345. There were also trucks, a crane, and other antique toys as well.

A 5.5-inch 1971 signinchd Labino cranberry art glass pitcher left for \$315 and a 5-inch 1966 Labino green art glass vase for \$304. Both pieces were simple yet elegant designs. A 9-inch tall Imperial art glass yellow threaded iridescent vase with contrasting gold threads closed at \$240 and a rare 12-inch iridescent Fenton art glass vase finished at \$140. For something a little different, there was a 14-inch vintage German Shepherd chalkware TV lamp with a green Vaseline glass shade that was rehomed for \$171.

Something that doesn't come up too often was a vintage Henry Troemner Inc. of Philadelphiabowling ball scale with 4 weights. This sturdy model 9558 Dodo scale (static weight) was taken home with a final bid of \$77.

Snow globes

"Snow globes are widely collectible," says Dr. Lori Verderame, well known antique appraiser. "While they were once reserved as a seasonal, winter collectible, the snow globe has become a popular keepsake year round."

The oldest known description of a snow globe-like object comes from an 1880 U.S. Commissioners report on the 1878 Paris Universal Exposition, where a local glassware company showcased a group of "paper weights of hollow balls" filled with water, containing a man with an umbrella. Also at the Expo were snow globes that contained a small scale model of the newly unveiled Eiffel Tower inside.

The objects also contained white powder that fell in imitation of a snow storm when turned upside down. Such glass-domed paperweights were popular in the late 1800s, but this appears to be the first to include such a playful feature.

However, it an Austrian man named Erwin Perzy who is widely considered to be its proper "inventor," albeit accidentally. That year was 1900 and Perzy was just 24 years old at the time and he was specializing in designing and repairing medical tools. When local doctors asked him for better light in their operating room, he got to work.

Though doctors had electric light bulbs at the time, the newly introduced light bulbs didn't produce much light. Perzy needed a way to make the light brighter. He had noticed shoemakers were using water-filled balls or water globes to magnify the light of a candle. Perzy tried this too, but the light was still not bright enough.

He tried flakes of metal, but they sank too quickly. One day he found a white powder (semolina, used for baby food) and poured it into the glass globe. It got soaked by the water and floated very slowly to the base of the glove. This effect reminded him of a snowfall, giving him the basic idea for inventing a snow globe.

One day, for fun, he put a pewter model of a tiny church into the water-filled ball, then added the white semolina flakes. The result was the look of snowfall that delighted those who saw it. A friend of his took the invention to his store, where it was sold immediately. And the snow globe was born

Perzy added a miniature diorama in his globe, which for the first 40 years of production was always a church. After World War II he incorporated different designs, such as Christmas trees and snowmen. His company is now run by his great-grandson (Erwin Perzy III) and offers 350 different designs. Today, the company produces more than 300,000 snow globes each year.

Perzy's invention gained momentum and eventually globes found their way into the United States. By 1925 a Pittsburgh man named Joseph Garajha obtained a patent to improve upon the snow globe. His feature was that of a new style of glass base that allowed water-filled snow globes to screw, like a light bulb, into a socket base.

"The artificial snow at the time was made of bone or porcelain chips or non-soluble soap flakes," Verderame said. "Today, fake snow is made of tiny pieces of plastic. The snow globe blizzard is enhanced using distilled water or glycerin which makes the flakes hover within the enclosed globe. Some collectible snow globes have Swiss music box mechanisms included in them as well."

Snow globes gained popularity in the U.S. as a promotional item for thousands of travel destinations and roadside attractions. Snow globes were integrally linked with early roadside travel, as early tourist amusement parks, motels and restaurants needed to stand out from the crowd. Snow globes were publicity for famous landmarks, museums, caverns and caves, missions or old homes of famous people, train rides, miniature golf, gardens, trained bear acts, animal parks and storybook castles.

In America during the 1940s, snow globes were often used for advertising. The 1940 Oscar-nominated drama Kitty Foyle, which used one as a plot device to trigger flashback scenes, contributed to a 200-percent increase in sales. Snow globes have appeared in several film scenes, the most famous of which is the opening of the 1941 classic Citizen Kane, wherein Kane dies while holding a glass sphere containing a wintery miniature log cabin, which falls and shatters on the ground.

By the late 1950s, snow globes had become an American phenomenon. Innovations in plastic production and injection-molding during the 1950s further improved the snow globe. Pricey particles used for the "snow" were replaced with cheap plastic flitter, while glycol mixed with water helped it fall more slowly.

By the early 1960s, most American snow domes were designed and manufactured by one of three companies: The Karol Western Corporation, Nanco, and the Allen-Lewis Manufacturing Company. These companies were also making salt and pepper shakers, glasses, pennants, ashtrays, tablecloths and scarves at the same time.

"Most collectors of snow globes do so by category such as age, by maker, by character and so on," Verderame said. "Some valuable snow globes feature tourist landmarks or famous cities and many collectors key in on this category of globe. Vintage snow globes of good quality materials hold their value. Look for a strong base and a complete interior tableau that is complex or intricate as these types of snow globes will bring greater value with collectors. Avoid snow globes that are cloudy or show signs of significant excessive wear or damage on the interior as that will negatively impact the snow globe's value."

According to Verderame, snow globes don't mind a little dust, but direct sunlight is a definite no-no.

"Snow domes are not only fascinating to look at, to hold, to play with, they are folk art," says collector Nancy McMichael, author of Snowdomes (Abbeville Press). "They are a bridge back to an idealized past we think existed but is actually in our head. It is something we carry with us."


