Hadley Pottery closing its doors after 80 years

The pandemic and inflation continue to take its toll on many aspects of life. For the M. A. Hadley Pottery of Louisville, Kentucky, sadly it means the closing of the company.

For more than 80 years, this family-owned operation has been crafting highly collectible decorative earthenware pieces, that unlike many such items; were still being actively acquired by those who love the ware.

The company broke the news at the end of March via their Facebook page, telling their customers, "THANK YOU, THANK YOU for your outstanding and remarkable loyalty over the years," adding, "We were here all this time because of you."

The culprit behind the closure, not unlike what many businesses are facing, is the high cost of materials coupled with costly machine repairs and replacements with the post explaining, "it has become impossible for us to continue for the long run."

And what a long run!

It's not surprising the beginnings of what would become the M. A. Hadley Pottery Company originated in the Louisville, Kentucky, area. Ancient clay deposits were – and still are - commonplace there. It only made sense potteries would spring up in the area since this natural resource was so readily available.

Born into a family of clay tile makers who lived and worked in the Louisville area in the early 1900s, Mary Alice Hadley came to pottery-making honestly, but

And the 4 inch tall mug with a house motif on one side and a boat on the other; again with "All Gone" written on the bottom inside the mug was signed by a M.A. Hadley painter. Orlemann states, "These were a gift given to my mother for me when I was born in 1970, so all the pieces are at least 50 years old." The set is currently for sale on eBay for \$60.

that was not where she started. Instead, her earliest interests centered around art and design, eventually leading her to become a well-known painter garnering numerous awards along the way.

It's easy to predict Hadley's artistic abilities and her knowledge of pottery-making would eventually meet up. That took place in 1939, as the story goes, when Hadley created a set of custom dishes for her houseboat on the Ohio

Interestingly, Mary Alice fired these

Collectors can step into spring with yellow ware

Collectors love beautiful yellow ware pottery, and many pay well for a mint-conditioned piece. But yellow ware was once considered one of the cheapest forms of common pottery made. In the mid-1800s, when production of yellow ware reached its peak, over 100 American potters turned out yellow ware.

John Ramsay, in "American Potters and Pottery," wrote "Potters, like all other manufacturers, must meet the popular taste to remain in business." During the 1830s and '40s, "imported porcelain was still preferred, leaving to the American potters only the field of the cheapest and most durable ware," so yellow ware quickly became their staple product.

Yellow ware originated in England as potters searched for a ware that was "sturdier than redware and less dense than stoneware." Yellow ware sold well in America, so American potters began turning out a wide range of yellow ware kitchen pieces using existing Rockingham molds. New Jersey potters flourished with their inexpensive yellow ware, and by 1845, there were approximately 80-100 ceramic plants from New Jersey to Illinois, turning out enormous quantities of utilitarian yellow ware. The Ohio River Valley became an important producer of yellow ware, and the city of East Liverpool, Ohio, "produced other types of pottery by its clear lead

the great bulk of yellow ware, particularly of the simpler types, made in the United States between 1840 and 1900."

Yellow ware is distinguished from

or alkaline glaze. This clear glaze is responsible for the buff or yellow color attributed to yellow ware; however, not all yellow ware is yellow. Yellow ware covers the spectrum of color from light

cream through various shades of yellow to dark brown. Some pieces are bi-colored, partly solid brown and partly buff or cream. Some yellow ware pieces have blue slip color while the beautiful bright

dark mottled tortoiseshell of Rockingham covers other pieces.

Basically, there are seven types of decoration found on yellow ware: plain, banded, Rockingham, mocha, sponging, flint enamel, and advertising. Plain yellow ware is the most common and is fired twice to achieve its glasslike surface. After the initial firing, to harden the piece, a clear alkaline-based glaze is applied and a second firing affixes the glaze to the piece. The natural color of the clay is enhanced through this process, leaving the piece a light buff to dark brown color.

While plain yellow ware is the most common type of yellow ware, banded yellow ware is the most common decoration. Banding consists of one or more horizontal colored bands. Dribbling slip, a creamy substance made from clay and water with coloring agents added, onto the green pottery produced bands on yellow ware as it turned on the wheel. Slip was added to a piece before the first firing, and then the piece was fired a second time just like a plain piece. While many colors could be added, the three most common were brown, blue, and green.

The most expensive pieces of yellow ware are those found with advertising on them. Advertising often helps identify both the area where the pottery was made and the date of the pottery.

Novice collectors mistakenly think yellow ware is only bowls and pitchers, but that is wrong. Every conceivable pottery item that the average home needed was once produced in yellow


ware. And prices run from \$5 for small, often cracked bowls to over \$3,000 for a 12-inch colander with decorative brown and white slip.

Massive stamp collection will highlight Schultz Auctioneers offering

CLARENCE, N.Y. – Three days. More than 1,500 lots. Everything from stamps to fine furniture, bobbleheads to exquisite jewelry. It's nothing new for Schultz Auctioneers, with its auction house located in upstate New York between Buffalo and Rochester. And beginning at 10 o'clock each morning, April 28-30, father and son auctioneers Kelly and Ben Schultz will preside over another gargantuan sale. Because of what the younger Schultz classified as "an overabundance of inventory," sales on this scale have been scheduled every six to eight weeks for the past year or so. "It's the only way we can keep up with it."

Buyers, either online or in-house, will have a wide range of items upon which to bid. "Beauty is in the eye of the beholder," Schultz said, pointing out that it is impossible to predict what will attract buyers' interest. But it is not hyperbole to say that this auction has something for everyone, with collecting categories as diverse as Susan B. Anthony and Elvis.

A majority of the items to be offered at the upcoming sale are from the estate of Dr. Joe Thomas of Erie, Pennsylvania, as well as from a local unnamed lifelong collector, Schultz explained. An extensive stamp collection is the centerpiece of this sale; among the highlights of the collection are rare "Zeppelin" stamps, which Schultz said have drawn considerable early interest. Also offered are vintage Valentines, including 3-D and lace trimmed examples, as well as many lots of postcards, many of which are holiday-related, including Halloween

Sports fans might zero in on a much sought-after Roberto Clemente bobblehead, as well as baseball cards, a stereoview of Babe Ruth, and a collection of stadium postcards. Ephemera relating to hunting (including American fox hunting) and fishing are also well represented. For dog lovers, there are ribbons from early American Kennel Club shows. Car enthusiasts will be equally satisfied with a variety of items, including mid-century photographs from car rallies and literature related to automobile parts. For Civil War buffs, there

is a "nice group of photos, books and paper."

But that's not all. Also offered for sale are early Batman comics, "Mad" magazines, and vintage circus posters ("colorful and visually pleasing"). There's even a set of encyclopedias. "I know they don't sound exciting, but this is an early set in nice condition," Schultz said with a chuckle. He suggested that a selection of books dealing with Native Americans might also prove to be especially sought after.

Advertising items, including calendars and letterheads of long-forgotten businesses, as well as checks and stocks, are a small sampling of ephemera in the sale. In addition to a wide range of Boy Scouts items (including pocket knives, hatchets and axes, uniforms, and patches), there is also a poster from the 1935 National Jamboree, which was canceled due to an outbreak of polio. And that's just on Day One.

Day Two offerings include fine jewelry (think Van Cleef & Arpels, Cartier, and Tiffany) and artwork, including Charles Burchfield drawings, as well as "formal" antiques: fine furniture, Oriental rugs, and sets of silverware. The final day of the sale includes, among other items, antique slot machines and dolls, country furniture and vintage clothing.

With over 50 years of experience, Ben's

father, Kelly Schultz, is an acknowledged authority on antiques, collectibles, and fine arts. In addition to Schultz Auctioneers, he is the founder of Antique World and Flea Market, one of the largest antique centers in the western New York area, with over 200 dealers and five shops open daily, in addition to Sunday flea markets. Together, Schultzes have been working side-by-side for a number of years, keeping the auction action moving.

"Tm excited about every one of our auctions," the younger Schultz continued, adding that there is always something new to learn. A case in point, he said, is the collection of letter


openers, offered on Day Three of this sale.

Looking back over the past two years, he said that sales have remained strong throughout the pandemic, thanks in large part to online bidding. That, coupled with time at home and the resulting increase in disposable income, has contributed to the strong market. And even though tastes change from one generation of collectors to the next, one thing holds true right now: "The best of the best is better than ever."

Flower Children blossomed to \$37,500 at Rachel Davis auction

CLEVELAND, Ohio — European, American, and Asian paintings, as well as prints, and sculpture spanning the 19th to 21st centuries were up for grabs during Rachel Davis Fine Arts March 19 online-only event. Auctioneer and gallery owner, Rachel Davis, has made a name for herself in northeast Ohio and beyond presenting such events comprised of a nice mix that appeals to collectors' differing

The top lot of this March sale was The Flower Children by American artist Roger Medearis (1920-2001). Known for his works using egg tempera and acrylic on canvas, this work followed suit and was then laminated to a Masonite hardboard panel. Dated 1969 and signed "Medearis" at lower right, the framed 28 by 40 inch painting sold with three preliminary sketches; one being a drawing, another All three sketches were signed with each measuring 16 by 22 inches framed. This lot brought \$37,500 and came to auction from a private Cleveland collection. Prices do not include a buyer's premium.

Rachel Davis Fine Arts is also a great place to snag works by Ohio native Clyde Singer (1908-1999). The oil on canvas titled, Jim, and dated 1936 sold within estimate when it brought \$24,000. "The sitter in the painting is Jim Loby who was a frequent model for Singer in Malvern, Ohio," Davis said. This work came to auction from a private North Olmstead, Ohio, collection, and had been acquired directly from the artist.

Keeping with the Ohio artist theme, a Cleveland, Ohio-born, Frank Wilcox (1887-1964) watercolor on illustration board titled Bonaventure Island made \$4,750. Described as the "Dean of Cleveland School painters," Wilcox taught at the Cleveland School of Art (now Cleve-

a tone sketch, and lastly, a color sketch. land Institute of Art or CIA) for more than 40 years. "The artist's grandson confirmed the authenticity of this work," Davis said.

> Stepping away from the states, 17 collotype plates from "A Book of Cats", 1929, by artist Leonard Tsuguharu Foujita (French/Japanese, 1886-1968) sold for \$13,000. Signed in pencil, the 10 by 13 inch sheets were marked 'Made in France.'

> An untitled etching with aquatint in colors by Zao Wou-Ki (Chinese, 1921-2013) dated 1968 did well when it brought \$7,000. The colorful image was 21 by 27 inches and was numbered 15/95.

> Works by living artists also sold strong. The untitled monumental aluminum and resin sculpture with multiple pieces by American sculpture, Don Drumm (1935-), was bid to \$7,500. The approximate size of the sculpture can be best appreciated knowing the central piece is 58 inches high by 82 inches wide by 8 inches deep.

> And the gorgeous watercolor on paper by Gary Bukovnik (American, 1947-) done in 1993, titled Poppies was not only colorful, but expansive measuring 29½ inches high by 60 inches wide. It realized \$3,750.

> Rachel Davis Fine Arts' next auction is scheduled for May 14.

Red Ryder more than a BB gun

Red Ryder was a syndicated Western comic strip from November 6, 1938, through 1965. Stephen Slesinger and western artist Fred Harman created the original Red Ryder strip, which became the inspiration for books, movies, and comic books, and it inspired a potpourri of Red Ryder merchandise that is still collected today.


Slesinger and Harman, who was a charter member of Cowboy Artists of America, worked in New York City for over a year, carefully planning and laying out Red Ryder's future in comic pages, movies, radio shows, contests, and merchandizing tie-ins. Slesinger had a lot of experience creating entire "packages" around fictional characters. He pioneered what became known as "synergy," where the whole concept of a character is greater than any one part. He had made such characters as Tarzan and Winnie the Pooh mega-dollar character franchises, so he set his sights on Red Ryder, determined to make Red a household name. And Slesinger succeeded.

Red was a tough, no-nonsense cowboy who lived on the Painted Valley Ranch in the 1890s. Red loved his mighty horse Thunder and sticking his nose into trouble. His best friend and sidekick was Little Beaver, a Native American boy who followed Red Ryder everywhere on his pinto horse Papoose. Red Ryder was loved by millions of Americans, but some of Slesinger's depictions of Native Americans, especially Little Beaver, are considered stereotypes and offensive today. For instance, Little Beaver was depicted as speaking a broken, pidgin-style English, which included his most famous catchphrase "You betchum, Red Ryder."

Other characters in Red Ryder story lines included Red's aunt, the Duchess, his girlfriend, Beth Wilder, and his arch-nemesis, Ace Hanlon.

Red Ryder has the distinction of being the longest running and most popular of all Western genre comic characters, and the character became one of the longest running business relationships in the history of licensing.

The mass-market appeal of Red Ryder led to a stampede of collectible items that still has genuine Red Ryder items selling to collectors of all ages.

Foremost in Red Ryder collectibles are his long-running comic book series. Slesinger's Hawley Publications issued the first Red Ryder comic book in September 1940. And Hi-Spot comics issued one other single-issue Red Ryder comic book. Then Dell Comics launched its series of Red Ryder comic books, helping make Red Ryder a household name.

Dell Comics published its first Red

changing the name to Red Ryder Ranch Magazine, starting with issue #145. The earliest Red Ryder Dell comic books consisted of reprints of the newspaper comic strip. This changed in June 1947. With the release of issue #47, all Dell Red Ryder comic books were produced with original stories and drawings. In all, Dell published 151 Red Ryder comic books, ending in 1957, which remains one of the longest continuous runs for any Western-themed comic book.



Red Ryder comic books make formidable collections all by themselves, especially if you seek all Red Ryder comic books. From 1954 – 1984, Novaro published 474 regular edition comic books, in Spanish, in 21 different countries and territories. A complete collection of Red Ryder comic books would be staggering and, probably, take a lifetime to collect.

Red Ryder also appeared on radio and in movies. In 1940, a 12-chapter movie serial of Red Ryder (The Adventures of Red Ryder) appeared, starring Don "Red" Barry as Red Ryder and Tommy Cook as Little Beaver. This initial serial was followed by 27 Red Ryder movies (the last four movies were in color). Collectors search for movie posters and tapes or CDs of these lost Red Ryder

The most famous actor to ever appear in a Red Ryder movie was Robert Blake, who portrayed Little Beaver. Blake was credited at the time

as Bobby Blake.

Two television Red Ryder pilots were shot (they sometimes show up on television western CDs), and in 1963 Gunsmoke featured an episode (I Call Him Wonder) that was supposed to be a pilot for a new Red Ryder television series. It featured Little Beaver as Wonder and was adapted from the story of how Red Ryder and Little Beaver originally met each other. None of these TV pilots reached fruition, but they give collectors new directions to search for Red Ryder productions.

One of the most famous Red Ryder collectibles is the "Daisy Red Ryder Carbine-Action Two-Hundred Shot Range Model Air Rifle BB Gun" that Ralphie wanted for Christmas in the 1983 movie "A Christmas Story." These rifles are still being made (with wooden stocks) and are fun collectibles to take in the backyard and blink at tin cans. But be careful, "You'll shoot your eye out!"







first pieces at the Louisville Pottery Company of Louisville, Kentucky; a pottery that would be a competitor when Mary Alice opened her own company several years later. Still in operation in Louisville and now known as Louisville Stoneware — this pottery continues to produce highly collected decorative and utilitarian ware.

Mary Alice worked for and was considered one of Louisville Pottery's best potters around the time she created these first dishes for her houseboat. The houseboat dishes Hadley designed with nautical flags were so well-received by friends and family, an "A-ha!" moment occurred resulting in what would become the M. A. Hadley Pottery Company.

Making ware to satisfy her family and friends requests resulted in Hadley's pottery reaching a wider audience. Orders for more became commonplace, and a business was born. In 1940, just a year after she made that original set of dishes, the M. A. Hadley Pottery Company was a go.

Besides the talent Hadley, herself, brought to the endeavor, Perry Day, a former Louisville Pottery mold maker and master potter in his own right, came on board. Day was hired by Hadley Pottery to oversee the manufacturing side of the business. With Hadley creating the artwork and Day designing the pottery, this dynamic duo became unstoppable.

With so much success and so many order coming in from across the country, space became an issue.

Kudos go out to Mary Alice's husband, George, who took her home business to the next level. As a birthday present, George Hadley bought a building on Story Avenue in the Butchertown area of Louisville in 1944 so the company could expand.

The building built in 1848 had always been used by some sort of manufacturing. It was a woolen mill, a candle factory, and a cordage mill. For the past 78 years, it has housed all aspects of production, acted as the factory salesroom, and was the headquarters of the M. A. Hadley Pottery Company.

What made Hadley Pottery so desirable was truly the artwork Mary Alice created for the ware. Animals were a staple – be it a horse, turkey, cow, sheep or cat. Ships are a favorite motif, just like houses, holiday images, and people.

The variety of ware is equally as extensive and impressive. There is a nativity set and candlesticks. Mugs, lidded casseroles, salt and pepper shakers, wall pockets and cake covers. Pieces could be custom ordered. They could be

personalized. One could buy sets or single items. M. A. Hadley Pottery made something for everyone's tastes and interests.

As with anything, time marches on and in 1965, Mary Alice passed away. Her husband continued to run the business, deciding to step aside in 1979 when he sold the pottery to Mr. and Mrs. Kenneth W. Moore, also of Louisville.

In September of 2009, the Moores brought new partners into the ownership group. In 2018, the pottery was sold to the Day family; who were distant relatives of Hadley Pottery's master potter, Perry Day.

A quick perusal of eBay listings finds many pieces up for grabs, and most are finding new owners at a rapid pace.

Collectors should know, though the pottery is closed; the outlet store is open and will remain so probably until the

end of 2022 or until the inventory of items to sell is depleted.

It is not yet known what will become of the actual building that housed the pottery. Currently, pieces of original art by Mary Alice are still on display on the walls. Several large murals Mary Alice completed over the course of the pottery's history also decorate walls in the structure.

Current owner, Jerry Day says the historic M A Hadley Pottery's outlet shop will remain open for customers "until the last piece is gone." Collectors should also continue to visit the pottery's Facebook page during this final transition. Hadley Pottery plans to feature several older pieces there, and those items will be put up for sale.
