Often, how we view the past is dependent on what's available for viewing today. We see Fred Astaire and Ginger Rogers click-clacking their way through a 1930s movie musical. He's in a sleek black tuxedo. She's in flowing white satin. There's a gleaming black dance floor, framed by white draperies. The movie itself, as you may have guessed, is also in black and white. The cinematography captures both the darkest and brightest elements of each extreme. And there it is: tangible evidence of a world where everything is black and white. And we say to ourselves, "well, that's Art Deco.'

Except that it isn't, or at least it isn't all the time. Although black and white were important elements, the Art Deco era was also alive with a riot of color. Designers and decorators offered up a unique blend of the traditions of the past (such as the recently departed, softer-edged Art Nouveau), with the "streamlined" design innovations of the present (the last years of the Roaring '20s, through the Depression-bound days of the 1930s). Opposite poles of the visual spectrum collided, propelled by an explosion of artistic energy. That's why Art Deco design is so satisfying, and has such longevity. It offers, quite literally, something for everyone.

A case in point: Art Deco items for the home. While some serve a purely decorative function, the majority incorporate usefulness into their art. That's because manufacturers were faced with a Depression-based dilemma: bowls, plates, coffeepots, vases, and other home accessories had been around for ages. What could possibly persuade buyers in a depressed economy to purchase new items, when older ones were still performing reasonably well? The answer was to promote the new as "improved" versions of the old, efficiently addressing the three concerns of primary importance to consumers: usefulness, cost and appearance. That task fell to a Decospawned new breed: the industrial designer. Generally contracted as free agents, these wonder-workers were sought after by companies which turned out products as diverse as washing machines, auto-

mobiles, porch furniture, and refrigerators. The talent of the industrial designer was an uncanny ability to modernize the mundane—and to do so without compromising form or function.

Leading the industrial design pack was the Chase Brass & Copper Co. From 1933 to 1942, Chase turned out a gleaming (and seemingly endless), array of buffet service articles, drinking and smoking accessories, lamps, and assorted home décor items. Fashioned primarily of brass, copper, or the newly popular chromium, these "Chase Specialties" were truly what etiquette expert Emily Post (on the Chase payroll as "design advisor") praised as "the answer to the housewife's prayer." They provided a look of elegance, they were easy to care for, and, best of all, they were available at prices Depression buyers could afford. "It's smart to be informal," said Post, "and Chase makes informality smart!"

While Chase advertisements stressed that the company's metal giftwares were "not meant to compete with solid silver," they of course did. In the opinion of many housewives, Chase was clearly the winner. In homes without squadrons of servants, there was little time (or incli-

Patsy dolls were a staple in the play room for decades

Many a Baby Boomer owned an Effanbee Patsy doll.

Bernard Fleischaker and Hugo Baum founded the Effanbee Doll Company in 1912. And while the company has had a series of owners, it still produces dolls today. Well-known dolls that have been produced by Effanbee include Patsy, Skippy (Patsy's boyfriend), and Betsy McCall. Effanbee's best known doll is Patsy.

Effanbee began production at the beginning of the composition doll era (1912), and the company prospered immediately. Designed by Bernard Lipfert, Patsy was first offered for sale, under her original name "Mimi" in 1927, but she was renamed Patsy in 1928. Effanbee patented Patsy's unique neck joint that allowed her to pose and stand-alone. Later Patsy and her family of dolls were made of hard



plastic, vinyl, and rubber, but they were still quite popular.

Patsy dolls range in size from Wee Patsy (about 5 3/4 inches) to Mama Patsy (about 29 inches). The original Patsy was intended to portray an actual-looking three year old girl with short bobbed red hair and molded headband. She possessed a pouty mouth, side glancing eyes, a gold paper heart tag with her name on it, and wore simple, classic-designed clothing. The original Patsy wore a golden heart charm bracelet on her wrist. Patsy was one of the first dolls to have manufactured clothing and accessories that were both sold with her and sold separately so that the doll could be "dressed" up by little girls.

Collectors hunt for vintage, pre-1960, Patsy dolls, especially those in mint condition. Early, composition Patsy dolls can sell for over \$600.

According to Denise Van Patten (author of All About Effanbee Dolls), "Tonner Dolls


READING, Pa. – A few months ago, Bill Howze, owner of Renaissance Auction, was called by a family to look at an estate, that at first blush, seemed to be routine.

However, as Howze, a longtime sports fan and history buff, browsed through a volume of paperwork something caught his eye. Something, even auctioneers with 40 years around the auction ring, doesn't often see.

There, amid the everyday odds and ends, were several Major League baseball programs, dating to the 1940s and 1950s. More significantly, many of the programs were autographed by baseball legends of the past such as Honus Wagner, Hank Greenberg, Richie Ashburn, Robin Roberts, Del Ennis, Bill Mazeroski and Reggie Jackson.


"I looked at a 1945 Pirates-Phillies program and there was Honus Wagner's name, written in pencil, and I wondered what is he doing there?" Howze said. "Then, I look further into the program and saw that he was a coach then.

"It kind of put me in mind of my childhood. I grew up in St. Petersburg, Florida, and they had two spring training teams. We had baseball every day and I would hang around the third base line where the players hung out and ask them for their autographs.





a young man – maybe nine of 10 years old. It's the war years, or coming to the end of the war, and I could see that kid going up to Honus Wagner and saying, 'Mr. Wagner, can I have your autograph' ... that's what real collecting is about."

purchased Effanbee Dolls out of bankruptcy in 2002 and revitalized the company with the introduction of high-quality reproduction Effanbee dolls," so make sure, if you are paying a premium price, that you are actually purchasing an original Effanbee Patsy doll.

The company also formed a Patsy Doll Club, complete with a free metal pinback membership pin. All children who owned a Patsy or who simply wrote Effanbee Company and requested membership could join. Today, these vintage pins and accompanying paperwork sell for about \$35.

At the height of her popularity, Effanbee promoted Patsy dolls with a club newspaper The Patsytown News, which collectors also seek today. This was one of the first marketing ploys aimed directly at children, forming the basis for later clubs such as the Mickey Mouse Club.

During World War II, Skippy dolls were sold wearing military uniforms, which are still prized today by collectors. Another marketing ploy used by Effanbee during the war years was to make Patsy family dolls with small magnets embedded in their hands. The magnets allowed the dolls to hold small accessories, such as a United States flag. When looking for Patsy dolls, carry a small piece of metal, such as a metal key, and test the hands to see if they have magnets. If they do, the doll was made during World War II and has greater interest and value.

Even with clever advertising ploys, the war years wreaked havoc on Effanbee. According to Van Patten, "The loss of income during the war years brought the Effanbee success story into a decline. In 1946, Effanbee was sold to Noma Electric" in the first of many sales of the venerable doll company.

If you are looking for the Effanbee name on a Patsy, try looking on the doll's upper back. Nearly all of the Patsy line were embossed "Effanbee" on the back. Along with the Effanbee logo, you will often find the name of the doll too, such as "Effanbee Patsy JR Doll." Effanbee emphasized in its advertising

that the Effanbee trademark and the doll's name were on the back. One interesting Patsy is the 1946 Patsy Joan that had a body marked "Effandbee" with an extra "d" instead of the company's actu-

al name—"Effanbee." And, to confuse matters, some 1946 Patsy Dolls only had a wrist tag, which over time has been lost on many of these dolls. The wrist tag alone makes a great addition to a collection.

Effanbee collectors are fortunate in that there is so much to collect. Many collectors look as hard for advertising material as they do for the dolls. The types of advertising seem endless—Effanbee books, Patsy books, paper dolls,

newspaper articles and advertising, magazine ads, Effanbee catalogs, Patsy Doll Club advertising and certificates, boxes, and the list goes one. There are even Patsy figurines. It is easy to see that a serious collector could accumulate a good collection reasonably quickly.

American Queen Anne high chest brings \$17,000 at Garth auction

COLUMBUS, Ohio - Garth's Auctioneers & Appraisers of Columbus, Ohio, continues to utilize the online only selling option that got auction houses through the pandemic. Actually, online auctions thrived and continue to do so as the results of this two-day March event that closed on March 26 and 27 once again indicate.

The March 26 sale featured the 60 year Americana collection of Norma Avery of Pennsylvania and New Mexico, while the March 27 auction was comprised of Americana featuring the 50-plus year personal collection of AnnaMary and Richard York of Lincoln, Nebraska, as well as items from a 60 year collection of a woman from Florida.

Fine and painted furniture was in abundance with the top lot of both auctions being - surprisingly; a piece of "brown furniture;" but what a beauty. Up for grabs was a mid-18th century cherry with yellow pine as its secondary wood, American Queen Anne high chest. Made up of two pieces with pegged construction, this example had a flat top and pad feet. It sold for \$17,000. Prices do not include the buyer's premium.

Major selling points of this chest -a) its original finish in exceptional condition; b) it retained its original brasses, and c) all rosehead nails were used in its construction. Then there was the dovetailed drawers and dovetailed top with a carved fan. The case interior retained chalked drawer numbers. The base had an upper dust shelf and a carved fan on the bottom center

drawer all supported on cabriole legs and scrolled returns. The piece stood an impressive 79¹/₂ inches tall.

An American diminutive (at 36 inches high) grain-painted pine dry sink did well bringing \$2,800 against an estimate of \$300 to \$600. Having an applied lid around the well, a single, two-panel door, and cut-out feet, this one was a cutie.

Pegged and square nail construction and faux-tiger maple paint decoration rounded out its charm.

Another smaller piece at 39 ½ inches high; this being an American bucket bench made of pine with four shelves, shaped ends with cut-out legs all wearing traces of it original red paint sold for \$2,400.

Small seemed to appeal to shoppers during this day as an American table top apothecary only 17 1/4 inches high, having wire nail construction, and wearing its original blue paint realized \$7,500. It boasted 15 nailed drawers with beveled fronts and original porcelain knobs.

Then there was the stunning Compass Artist dometop box hailing from Lancaster County, Pa., which sold for \$6,250. Measuring 4 ³/₄ inches high by 5 ³/₄ inches wide and 4 inches deep, this box wore robin egg blue paint with a red and white compass star decoration.

Other decorative items selling strong included an American domed butterprint with a peg handle featuring a chip carved tulip and heart that sold for \$3,300, while a Prior Hamblin School oil on canvas portrait of a young boy made \$4,500. The portrait showed a lad dressed in a double breasted blue jacket.

The second day of this auction found the strong sales continuing with an interest again in furniture and decorative items. Attributed to Lehigh County, Pa., an American two-piece corner cupboard was strongly vied for ending in the winning bidder

Right: This late 19th-early 20th century, pine American table top apothecary featured wire nail construction and original blue paint. It had fifteen nailed drawers with beveled fronts and original porcelain knobs, and sold for \$3,000. paying \$4,100. Made of cherry with poplar as its secondary wood, this cupboard had a cove molded cornice, a twelve-pane door, and a base with three drawers wearing beaded edges over two single-panel doors. The cupboard stood 91 inches high.

Coming in as the top lot for day two was the Ohio jeweler's trade sign crafted of carved wood in the form of a pocket watch which then hung from a cast iron hanger. Double-sided and wearing layers of gilding and gold paint as well as the words "J. Rickesecker" on one side and "J. Rictsecter" on the other side, this sign sold for \$8,000.

In his May 15 online auction, Howze will be offering these pieces. "There's a lot of interest in that team," he said. "They had the whole nation stirred up and many of the players, like Richie Ashburn, went on to have great careers."

Howze draws a distinction between "firsthand" collectibles and contemporary signatures sold at signing events and the internet.

"I came up with the name, firsthand merchandise, collected by an individual who loves baseball as opposed to the contemporary market which was created by the players. In the 1990s players realized they could create a new stream of revenue by the signings. They also entered into agreements with sportswear companies with signed jerseys, jackets and other items. Then, they would split the proceeds with the company.

"They come with a Certificate of Authenticity (COA), most of which, in my opinion aren't worth the paper they're written on. Authentic vintage memorabilia contrasted with the contemporary world of sports collectibles 'made to order' carries a value premium.

"They certainly have more of an intrinsic value. There's more panache. If you have a picture of your grandfather with Babe Ruth signing a ball, you have something of greater value, than a Babe Ruth ball acquired on the internet.

"Number one, you don't know the provenance or whether it is a legitimate ball, regardless of the COA. You have no back story, or any idea where the ball come from ... in auctions like ours coming up, although many of the autographs are in pencil and they may be a little unsteady because the player just signed the program while standing around on the third base line, they're much more 'the real collectible.'

"But still you know they're the real thing, there's a story that can be filled in by relatives and the collector's friends, and you know the collector got the item because he loves the sport – not that he's speculating on the future value of "made to order" item. I can imagine the old gentleman pulling out his programs and scrapbooks and ruminating on his younger days. That, to me, is a greater value."







nation) to polish up the family silver before and after each dinner party. With Chase, all it took was a quick wipe with a soapy cloth, then a quick rub with a dry one, and a chrome canapé plate was once more bright and shiny. More importantly, at \$7.20 per dozen, the appeal of chrome canapé plates over solid silver ones was immediately obvious.

Rather than relying on just one or two designers for its output. Chase offered design assignments to many; at least 21 are known to have made contributions to the line. Some, like Director of Design Harry Laylon, his predecessor Helen Bishop Dennis, and Development Engineer Howard Reichenbach, were on the Chase payroll full-time. Others, such as Walter Von Nessen, Ruth and William Gerth, Lurelle Guild, Russel Wright, Rockwell Kent, and Dr. Albert Reimann, were given freelance contracts to create specific pieces. Their work demonstrated resoundingly that functional objects could also be attractive to the eye.

In 1936, Walter Von Nessen told House Beautiful that "a designer today must be an inventor too"-and the designing minds at Chase were definitely inventive. Since other Chase divisions focused on the company's more mundane tasks - producing such everyday necessities as plumbing pipe and electrical parts — discarded shells, elbow joints, and the like soon found their way to the Chase storeroom. It took an industrial designer to see the artistic possibilities inherent in these odds and ends. Efficient re-use of unlikely components by the giftware division proved a cost-effective means of fighting the Depression. A simple toilet floater, for instance, served as the focal point for a variety of prod-

and cobalt made the "Blue Moon Cocktail Set" a Deco icon. Chase designers credited for the set are Howard Reichenbach and Harry Laylon.

ucts, including a "Syrup Jug." Brass bedstead balls found new life as Russel Wright-designed salt and pepper spheres. And Walter Von Nessen's "Diplomat Coffee Set," recipient of an "Award of Merit" from the National Alliance of Art and Industry, began life as extruded chromium plated pipe!

Industrial designers were, of course, much more than Deco Dr. Frankensteins, cobbling together spare parts in hopes of coming up with something marketable. Their task was to reinterpret standard household items in ways that would increase attractiveness, convenience and marketability. As Russel Wright told Design magazine in 1933, "the designer can take a dull product lacking in sales appeal, and with the magic touch of artistic imagination vamp it into an exciting product packed with sales appeal."

Adding additional charm to Art Deco homes were those objects created primarily (if not necessarily solely), for decorative purposes. Certainly, a Robj decanter or a Schneider vase performs a function—but so could a moonshine jug, or a jelly jar, and much less prettily. Enhancing the beauty of a specific home environment was their reason for being. That they could also actually prove useful was merely a pleasant side benefit. Many were "statement" pieces, purchased as gifts to mark an important occasion, such as an anniversary or a wedding.

Porcelain, glass, and metal decorative objects of the period highlight the ways in which old and new could co-exist—and co-exist they did. The dawn of Art Deco never resulted in a wholesale junking of all that came before. During the 1920s

and '30s, the majority of American homes combined the familiar with the futuristic, an amalgam specifically suited to the needs and desires of the individual householder.

That analysis is borne out by the colorful interior illustrations which punctuated advertisements of the era. Glamour art sold the product, placing each featured item in an idyllic locale. If you're hawking something as mundane as a "Herman Nelson Invisible Radiator," for instance, why not star it in an illustration so enticing that the radiator itself becomes. . .well. . .invisible?

Today, prices for Art Deco accessories

can range from the low hundreds for a mass-produced Chase cocktail set, into the thousands for an exquisite Schneider vase. Regardless of choice, a happy fusion of old and new awaits you, just as it awaited aspiring decorators of the 1920s and '30s. In the Art Deco home, past and present combine. The result? An invigorating, visually stunning future.
