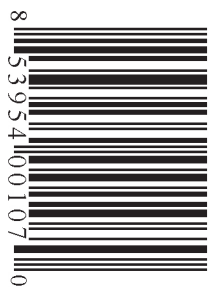

Glass cards have withstood the test of time

"Happy Birthday" or "Merry Christmas." "Happy Valentine's Day" or "Get well." "Pick you up at the station" or "Ma is feeling better." Be it a hastily scrawled postcard message with a one-cent stamp or a greeting card in an envelope shielding it from the eyes of curious postal clerks, the United States Postal Service has delivered them all. Although the sale of greeting cards remains strong, today's sentiments are also sent online, in the form of eCards, emails, and text messages.

But there was a time when little glass trays, nestled in cardboard boxes and then dropped in the mail, conveyed similar greetings. Amazingly, a number of these seemingly fragile "cards" have survived the decades since their introduction. And not surprisingly, as interest in all things mid-century continues to grow, these quirky greetings, particularly those made by Houze Art Glass, are sought after and collected.

Learning the glassblowing trade while still a boy, Leon Joseph Houze, Sr., emigrated from Belgium to America in 1879. After working for the Day William Window Glass Company in Kent, Ohio, he and his four brothers founded Houze Brothers Glass in Meadville, Pa. After a second fire at their window glass factory, they decided not to rebuild. Instead, the brothers went their separate ways.

Leon continued to move about, building glass factories in Illinois, Indiana, Ohio, New York, West Virginia, and Pennsylvania. In 1899, he landed in the Pennsylvania town of Port Marion, located in the southwest corner of the state at the convergence of the Cheat and Monongahela Rivers. There he built the Jeannette Window Glass Company; a few years later, in 1902, he returned to Port Marion to build the Federated Glass Company. Having been named president and manager of Federated, Houze built two additional glass plants in the town. By 1923, he had bought all four of these glass con-

cerns and incorporated them under the name of the L.J. Houze Convex Glass Company.

An innovator in the development of colored sheet glass, Leon Houze held 40 patents, according to family records shared by his great-great nephew, John Houze. Leon's three sons all worked at the factory and continued in their father's footsteps past his retirement in 1938. In addition to window glass (including 60 exterior windows for the post-World War II renovation of the White House) and projects for various governmental agencies, the company also manufactured a wide variety of glass products, including practical items such as lenses for sunglasses, goggles, and binoculars; as well as tail lights and gearshift and window knobs for automobiles. Additionally, Houze

also produced lamps and lamp shades, vases and toy glass dishes, and a broad assortment of other items for the home.

Then, in 1948, Roger J. Houze, grandson of the company's founder, put his artistic abilities to the test. What would happen if a small piece of glass was cut and curved on the ends and then emblazoned with pictures, logos and advertisements? According to company records, Houze first produced Christmas cards on glass trays in 1950 under the name of a new department for the company, "Houze Art." This enterprise came to attract the talents of such artists as Peter Max, Dan Baird, and Tommy Parzinger, all of whom were commissioned to produce

Mike Clum Auctions adds fourth generation auctioneer to the roster

RUSHVILLE, Ohio - Family businesses only continue to exist if younger family members decide to make a commitment to preserve the legacy. Mike Clum Auctions, Inc. of Rushville, Ohio, has been family owned and operated since 1968, and it looks like it will be doing what it does best; being an honest and professional auction service, handling everything from single items to entire estates and collections, for years to come.

Chase Watson, Mike Clum's grandson and the fourth generation of this auctioneering family, just passed his Ohio Auctioneer exam.

"We are so excited for Chase and our company," said Laura Watson, daughter of Mike Clum. She and her husband Larry, also an auctioneer well-known for selling real estate with Better Homes & Gardens in Lancaster, Ohio, own and operate Mike Clum Auctions along with Chase's grandfather; Mike Clum.

And while Chase might be the youngest auctioneer in the family, the oldest Clum to wield a gavel was John E. Clum, who in 2009 was still auctioneering at age 90 earning him the title of possibly being the oldest licensed, active auctioneer in the state of Ohio at the time. He was working with his son, Mike Clum at the Rushville auction house.

"My dad, Mike Clum, started the auction company in 1968, and his dad, John, decided to get his license in 1978 and join in the fun," Laura said. John E. Clum died in 2011 at the age of 92.

When asked why she thought Chase decided to become an auctioneer, his mom joked, "I don't know. We encouraged him to go do something else," and then added, "In all seriousness, it's a calling, and we are so happy he decided to continue our family's tradition."

For Chase's grandfather, Mike Clum, becoming an auctioneer was also a calling. "Even at

the young age of 8 years old, my dad loved attending farm auctions," his daughter Laura explains.

Still, Mike Clum did not become an auctioneer when he became an adult. "My dad was actually a barber, and loved listening to the old-timers talk about antiques. At some point he said he was tired of looking at the back of people's heads; knew he loved old things, and decided to go get his auctioneer's license," she said.

It was the passing of Mike Clum's wife; Kathy Clum, that was kind of the catalyst for Chase's wanting to become involved with the business. "My mom did everything, and we when we lost her, I floundered trying to take on all her roles. I think Chase saw this and

becoming involved was something he decided he wanted to do," Laura said.

Chase received his auctioneers license on April 25, 2022, after his one year apprenticeship. His first "licensed" auction was April 28 where he auctioned along side his father, Larry, and grandfather, Mike.

Three generations behind the auction block carrying on a long-standing family tradition.

Fisher-Price toys were all about fun and strong construction

Fisher-Price Toys is a name we all know and love. Most Americans born after 1930 have owned at least one of the countless toys produced by Fisher-Price since their inception that year.

As with most businesses, Fisher-Price started from humble beginnings. Originally located in a small refurbished building in East Aurora, N.Y., the toy manufacturer set out with the belief that "the shape, expression and color of toys must capture the child's attention immediately." What set Fisher-Price apart from other companies was the stellar talent brought to the table from the original founders. Herman Guy Fisher, Irving R. Price and Helen M. Schelle all contributed from their extensive experience in either toy manufacturing and/or retail work.

Fisher was born in Unionville, Pa., and worked a variety of jobs in New York City after graduating from Penn State. He seemed to find his calling when he landed at All-Fair Toys in Churchville, N.Y. So much so that he tried to buy the company. Fortunately, for the future of toy-making, this attempt was unsuccessful.

Irving R. Price was a brilliant Brown University graduate who had

a 17 year career at Woolworths. He served in local politics in East Aurora, N.Y., and was highly regarded in his community.

Helen M. Schelle is the least known of the original three founders. Her experience from operating and later owning Penny Walker Toy Store in Binghamton, N.Y., was invaluable

toward the success of the company.

The firm started with 15 employees and a Five Fold Creed that toys must have:

1. Intrinsic play value
2. Ingenuity
3. Strong construction
4. Good value for the money
5. Action

Additionally, "Children love best the cheerful, friendly toys with amusing action, toys that DO something new and surprising and funny." This creed is still adhered to today.

The first toys to roll off the assembly line for Fisher-Price were introduced at Toy Fair in 1931 and were

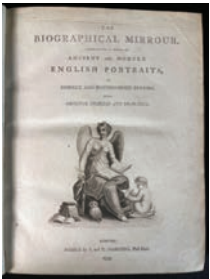
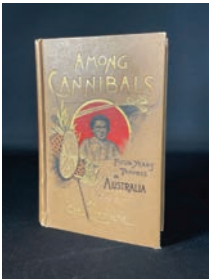

referred to as the “16 Hopefuls.” They were preceded by a brochure “Birth Announcement” and were a huge success. They included: Bun-ny Scoot, Drummer Bear, Granny Doodle, Doctor Doodle, Barky Pup-py, Lookee Monk, Go’n’ Back Mule, Go’n’ Back Bruno, Go’n’ Back Jum-bo, Woodsy-Wee Circus, Woodsy-Wee Zoo, Woodsy-Wee Pets, Dizzy Dino, Stoopy Storky, Lofty Lizzy and Tail-spin Tabby.

These early toys were made from Ponderosa pine with metal parts and paper lithograph. They were largely designed by Helen Schelle and Mar-garet Evans Price, the wife of Irving Price. Mrs. Price was a well-known artist and had written and illustrated many children’s books. Her unique “feel” for what appealed to children was evident in the creative toys that she designed. Toys that would ding, pop, spin, walk, chime, click, cluck, moo, hop, roll, row and so much more were all destined to be top sellers.

Fisher-Price continued to grow and expand. Always producing inno-vative toys with wide appeal led the



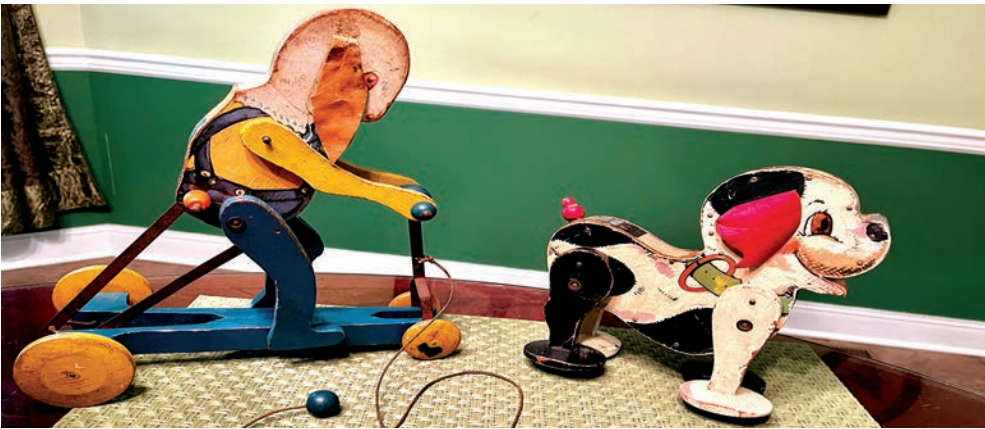

company to become one of the larg-est toy manufacturers in the world. In 1969, Fisher-Price Toys was pur-chased by the Quaker Oats Company and is still in business today.

Although the early toys were made from wood, Fisher-Price eventually began to incorporate plastic into its designs. Modern Fisher-Price toys are all plastic now. De be aware there are fakes out there. On those, the lithographs are often blurry and the colors are overly jewel-toned. Usually the construction differs con-siderably from the original toy, as well.

Auctioneer will offer some of his personal collection at Stevens event

ABERDEEN, Miss. – The contents of the Adams French Mansion – a magnificent antebellum home in Aberdeen that’s only had a handful of owners since it was built in 1856 – will be sold on Saturday, June 4, at the mansion itself by Stevens Auction Company. All furnishings in the 7,000-square-foot Greek Revival mansion will be offered.

“Until recently, the Adams French Mansion only had three owners, but now that has changed,” said Dwight Stevens of Stevens Auction Company, who was himself one of the three owners. “This huge, one-day event will include antique furniture, antique cars, clocks, 19th century lighting, a Civil War library, china, crystal, handmade Persian rugs, Southern finery and more.”

In addition, several warehouses of antiques from Stevens’s personal life-long collection will also be sold.

Wonderful 19th century beds are common place at Stevens Auction events, and this one is no exception. The lineup will be led by a rosewood rococo half tester plantation bed by C. Lee, with a carved crown and finials, 11 feet 2 inches on height and 71 inches wide (est. \$12,000-\$15,000).

Others will include a circa 1855 Prudent Mallard three quarters tester

bed by Mitchell & Rammelsberg, with excellent carving (est. \$2,800-\$4,000) and an accompanying matching Carpathian walnut carved dresser (est. \$1,500-\$2,500).

A magnificent 8-piece rosewood parlor suit by George Henkel (N.Y.), with beautiful new period style upholstery, the sofa 84 inches wide, has an estimate of \$4,000-\$7,000; while a rosewood pierced carved rocking chair attributed to Henkel should hit \$500-\$1,000. Also sold will be a rosewood etagere with white marble and glass doors, 8 feet 8 inches tall (est. \$1,500-\$2,500).

Vases will include a very fine circa 1860s Sevres vase, signed and in good condition, 23 inches tall (est. \$1,500-\$2,000); a large pair of Old Paris vases, 17 inches tall (est. \$400-\$800); and a fine pair of Old Paris hair vases with hand-painted romantic scenes, angel handles and a deep pink background, 14 inches tall. They are expected to sell to a happy bidder for \$400-\$600.

Lamps and lighting will be led by an astral lamp with bird figures, the original shade and 12-inch prisms, 34

inches tall (est. \$2,000-\$4,000); a Sinumbra lamp with the original shade, a marble base and 9-inch prisms, 34 inches tall (est. \$1,500-\$3,000); and a hand-painted Gone With the Wind lamp with roses, modernized with electrical capability, 29 inches tall (est. \$400-\$800).

A pair of carved laminated parlor chairs with beautiful period style upholstery attributed to the renowned 19th century American cabinetmaker John H. Belter should command \$1,500-\$2,000; while a rosewood laminated slipper chair with great upholstery by Belter, 3 feet 11 inches tall by 27 inches wide, carries a pre-sale estimate of \$1,000-\$2,000. Belter is popular with collectors.

Tea leaves from Boston Tea Party up for bids at Heritage

DALLAS, Texas – An extremely rare two-sided banner used to promote the first Republican candidate for president could bring \$100,000 or more when it is sold in Heritage Auctions’ Americana & Political Signature® Auction June 11-12.

The John C. Frémont: Fabulous Anti-Slavery Folk Art Banner supported the candidate from California in the 1856 election. An explorer, military officer and California Senator, Frémont also was the founder of the state’s Republican party. He lost the 1856 election to James Buchanan.

“John Frémont was a very important figure in the history of California and the Western United States,” Heritage Auctions Americana Director Curtis Lindner said. “He was an outspoken opponent of slavery, making him part of one of the most important political movements in U.S. history.”

The banner, which is believed to have originated in Connecticut, is magnificent. Despite the adoption of “Free Soil, Free Press, Free Men and Fremont” as the party’s 1856 campaign slogan, campaign artifacts specifically mentioning slavery and Republican resistance to it are exceptionally rare. One side of the banner features a displayed eagle with riband reading, “Fremont and Dayton. Kansas Shall Be Free!” The other side has a flowing riband reading “I am Opposed to Slavery in the Abstract and from Principle! John C. Fremont. “The People’s Choice’ ‘John and Jessie.”

The auction will also include a rare pair of presidential Paris porcelain portrait urns featuring John Adams and Thomas Jefferson. As Founding Fathers, their political philosophies and writings combined to form the key elements of the Declaration of Independence. Adams and Jefferson both served early diplomatic missions in France and became close friends until the ideals of Jeffersonian democracy strained the Federalist establishment ... and their relationship, although they reconciled in the latter stages of their lives. The two actually died on the same day: July 4, 1826, the 50th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence. French porcelains began to appear in the homes of wealthy Americans during the first quarter of the 19th century, often

depicting historical events and patriotic subjects. Beginning with George Washington’s administration, and continuing throughout the 19th century, American presidents chose Paris porcelain for their table and decorative wares.

A desk from the U.S. House of Representatives, circa 1857 was designed by Thomas U. Walter, the architect of the Capitol whose renovations included the enlarged dome surmounted by a statue of a Native American princess, emblematic of Liberty. Chairs and desks were ordered as part of an 1857 renovation of the House, overseen by U.S. Army Quartermaster General Montgomery C. Meigs. There were 241 Congressmen at that time, but when 11 states seceded from the Union, the number of members was reduced to 175. Excess furniture then was distributed to other government buildings and sold to the public. The offered desk, which is not accompanied by a chair, was manufactured by Doe & Hazelton of Boston. When the House of Representatives was refurbished in 1873, any remaining desks and chairs were sold off. Examples reside in several).

The only known example of a James Buchanan: 1856 “Buchanan and Breckinridge” campaign flag generates immediate intrigue for collectors because the names are printed vertically, rather than in the customary horizontal orientation. Political memorabilia is rare for the 15th U.S. president and for Breckenridge, who at the time was the youngest Vice President in American history.

Hand-colored engravings of Raphael’s frescos at Macon Bros. Auction

WALLA WALLA, Wash. — A unique hand colored version of “The Sacred History of Raphael Urban in Vatican Terraces, The Miracle of the Picture Expressed,” by Nicolas Chaperon (1612-1656), published in 1649 will be the star of a Maps & Rare Books auction that will be closing June 11. The book features engravings of Raphael’s 52 frescos of Biblical scenes created for the Vatican. Bell from SS Central America donated to Naval Academy

ANNAPOLIS, Md. — The United States Naval Academy in Annapolis has received an important piece of American and naval history, the bell from the SS Central America, the legendary “Ship of Gold” that was led by Commander William Lewis Herndon (1813-1857). The famous ship sank in 1857 while carrying 578 passengers and crewmembers and a king’s ransom of California Gold Rush treasures.

Rare coin expert, real estate developer, philanthropist, and former sports agent Dwight Manley of Brea, Calif., donated the Central America’s 268-pound bronze bell to the Academy where there has been an important tribute monument to Commander Herndon for the past 162 years. The historic bell was formally dedicated on May 23.

A distinguished career naval officer, Herndon sacrificed his life in a brave effort to save the Central America. “He saved the lives of 152 passengers before he made the decision to go down with the ship,” according to the Naval Academy.

The Central America sank in the Atlantic Ocean 150 miles off the North Carolina coast during a hurricane on Sept. 12, 1857. In 1860, a 21-foot-tall granite obelisk was dedicated in Herndon’s honor near the center of the Naval Academy campus.

Prior to his important assignment as Master of the United States Mail Steamship Central America in 1855, Herndon served with distinction during the Mexican-American War of 1846-1848 and led a successful South America expedition in 1851 that resulted in his acclaimed 1854 report, Exploration of the Valley of the Amazon.

“Commander Herndon is a revered and honored name in the U.S. Navy. His legacy has been part of the annual rite of passage at the Academy with his monument scaled by the current year’s plebes. It is my extreme privilege to be able to unite the bell with the monument so all in attendance each year can experience the sounds Commander Herndon heard as he went down with the ship after 40 hours of valiant effort to save every woman and child aboard,” said Manley who spoke at the bell’s May 23 dedication ceremony.

The bell was discovered 34 years ago, 131 years after the ship sank. It is larger than most ships’ bells of the era, measur-

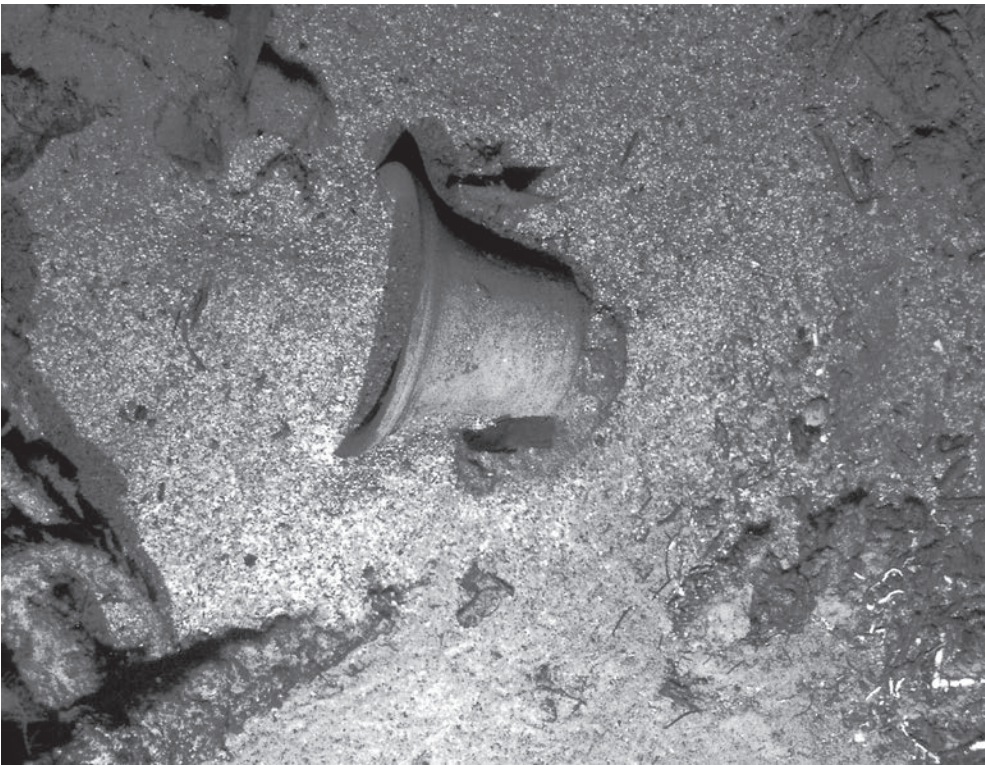

ing nearly two feet tall and a little over two feet wide at its lower flange edge.

“The site of what we thought might be the SS Central America was discovered in 1988 about 7,200 feet below the ocean’s surface. Using a robot submarine, we located a bell and could see part of the embossed lettering on it, MORGAN IRON WORKS NEW YORK 1853. That provided additional evidence that the shipwreck site was indeed the Central America,” explained Bob Evans, the chief scientist and historian on the recovery missions who also attended the bell’s dedication ceremony at the U.S. Naval Academy. “The bell provided spectacular and undeniable confirmation we located the ship.”

The Central America was a 280-foot long, three-masted side-wheel steamship carrying what Life magazine later called “The Greatest Treasure Ever Found,” tons of California Gold Rush-era gold coins and assayers’ ingots. The loss of the valuable cargo was a major factor in the economically devastating financial panic of 1857 in the United States.

Ben-Hur coffee still gallops into hearts of collectors

Following the success of the silent movie Ben-Hur in 1925, the Adams-Henry Company, dealers in coffees, teas and spices, decided the world needed a Ben-Hur brand of coffee.

G. H. Ballou founded G. H. Ballou & Company in 1889 to supply coffee to local groceries in San Diego, Calif. Later, Arthur Cosgrove joined Ballou’s company. When Cosgrove retired in 1906, Ballou & Cosgrove was shipping coffee, spices, and other grocery commodities throughout America and to Asia. In 1912, Albert E. Adams and William Henry formed the Adams-Henry Company and successfully purchased G. H. Ballou & Company. And in 1913, Adams-Henry founded the first coffee company in San Diego, Sun Coffee (“Cups of Sunshine”).

By 1927 the Adams-Henry Company sold Sun Coffee in more than 500 local stores in southern California. When interviewed about the company’s success, William Henry supposedly attributed the company’s rapid expansion to its motto: “Dependable years ago, dependable now.”

In 1925 Sun Coffee offered the public a new brand of coffee—Ben-Hur Coffee, which came in regular and

“Drip.” Ben-Hur Coffee packaging and advertising came complete with the company’s logo of a chariot and four charging horses, which symbolized the famous chariot race in the movie.

The Sun Coffee Company distributed both the locally famous Ben-Hur Coffee and the Ben-Hur brand of teas and spices, including Ben-Hur Thyme, Allspice, and Cinnamon.

Due to the fickle winds of consumer change, Ben-Hur Coffee silently disappeared from grocery shelves in the 1950s as coffee drinkers developed a taste for national brands of coffee

such as Hills Brothers and Chase & Sanborn coffees.

Today, collectors search for Ben-Hur coffee jars, coffee tins, coffee pots, advertising signs, and spice tins. One interesting piece of Ben-Hur Coffee history is the Ben-Hur Metlox ashtray that was given away as a promotional item at the San Diego Pacific International Expo in 1935. If you’re a collector, this piece is worth searching for.

designs for this wing of the company. Even though the family sold the company in 1954 and its supply of bent glass ran out in 1974, the department continued to produce these wares until 1995. The doors of Houze closed in 2004.

At about that same time, collectors were beginning to spot these curious little glass gizmos popping up at yard sales and thrift shops, selling for a dime or a quarter a piece. There was something about them that made them intriguing. Was it their clever sayings, sometimes a bit snarky or even a little risqué (by 1960s standards)? Or maybe it was the graphics, which harkened back to a simpler (but swanky) time? Among those attracted was collector Jimmie Bucci.

“I started picking them up on a whim,” the Boston-area collector said, “and then I realized, ‘I really like them.’” Whenever he saw these glass greetings originally intended to extend good wishes for birthdays and rapid healing, as well as thoughts for getting well or congratulations on the birth of a new baby, he snapped them up. “And, of course, those wishing a ‘Merry Christmas.’”

Bucci was, once again, hooked. In the course of his search, he began finding examples that appeared to be company favors, as well as souvenirs of the New York World’s Fair and Disney. Many of the examples he found were still in their original boxes, suggesting that they might have been purchased and either saved and not mailed, or passed on in person, even though the boxes noted fourth class postage was all that was required to send the contents, marked “glass.” On the other hand, in his extensive collection, Bucci noted that “one or two” have been sent. In his mind, they all appear to be “pretty secure in their boxes, “ with some still retaining their original “Houze Art” sticker, illustrated with an artist’s palette. Some, he added, retain an original plastic “ribbon” wrapped around the box corners to keep the lid in place.

As to where they were first sold, Bucci recalled that at his first job in a dime store with an adjacent gift shop, such greetings were sold in the latter, not the former. Their original price remains somewhat of a mystery (“they took off the price tags”). As for identifying features of the “cards,” in addition to bent corners, they often have a smoky gray background, although sometimes, the graphics on the front obscure this. As a credit to the process, Bucci noted, “I have never seen them with chipped or worn paint.” Some examples feature gold paint accents.

Collecting Houze Art glass greetings was something of a lark in the beginning, he continued. “But now people know they’re worth something.” Consequently, they’ve become “harder and harder to find,” and certainly, at higher prices than before. Furthermore, he suspects that other companies made “knock-offs.”

On the other hand, Bucci’s collection continues to give him pleasure. His Boston-area home is likely to be bedecked with glass greetings around the holidays. Although many of them are traditional in design, his favorites are those that feature, for instance, Santa on a rocketship or those picturing turquoise and pink trees. And then there’s the one with the kid on Santa’s lap and the words, “lies, lies, lies.”

Naturally, those that are “comical and clever” are particularly desirable. Bucci cites one with an image of a Model-T car and the words “From one old heap to another, Happy Birthday.” Another favorite, picturing a piano, inquires, “Out of tune? Get well soon.” How about “Happy Birthday to the best

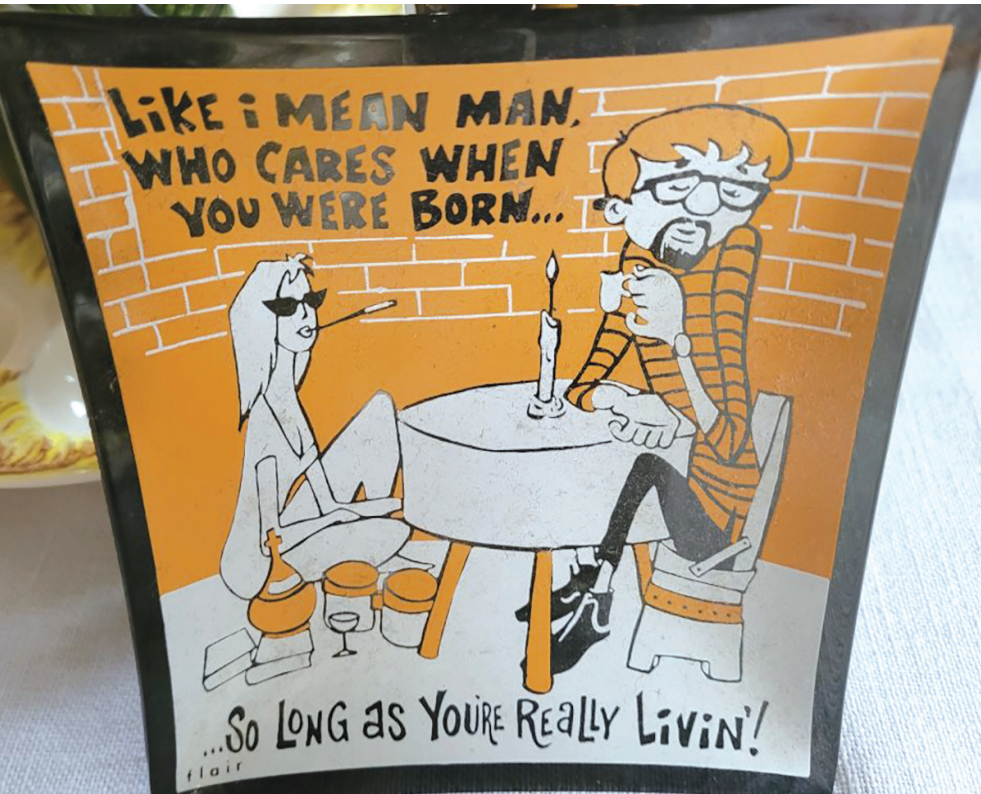

sport of them all” with images of sports equipment? There’s the anniversary card, with a politician proclaiming, “What this country needs is more couples like you.”

You get the idea. But then there are the ones that collectors are particularly drawn to, ones that Bucci characterizes as “creepy insulting.” Best example? “Happy Birthday, Dear. Though you are psychotic, neurotic, narcissistic and traumatic with hypersensitive schizophrenic tendencies, I love you.” Could Hallmark have said it any better?
