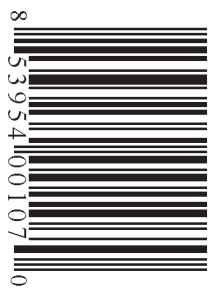

Holt-Howard Pixieware is on fire

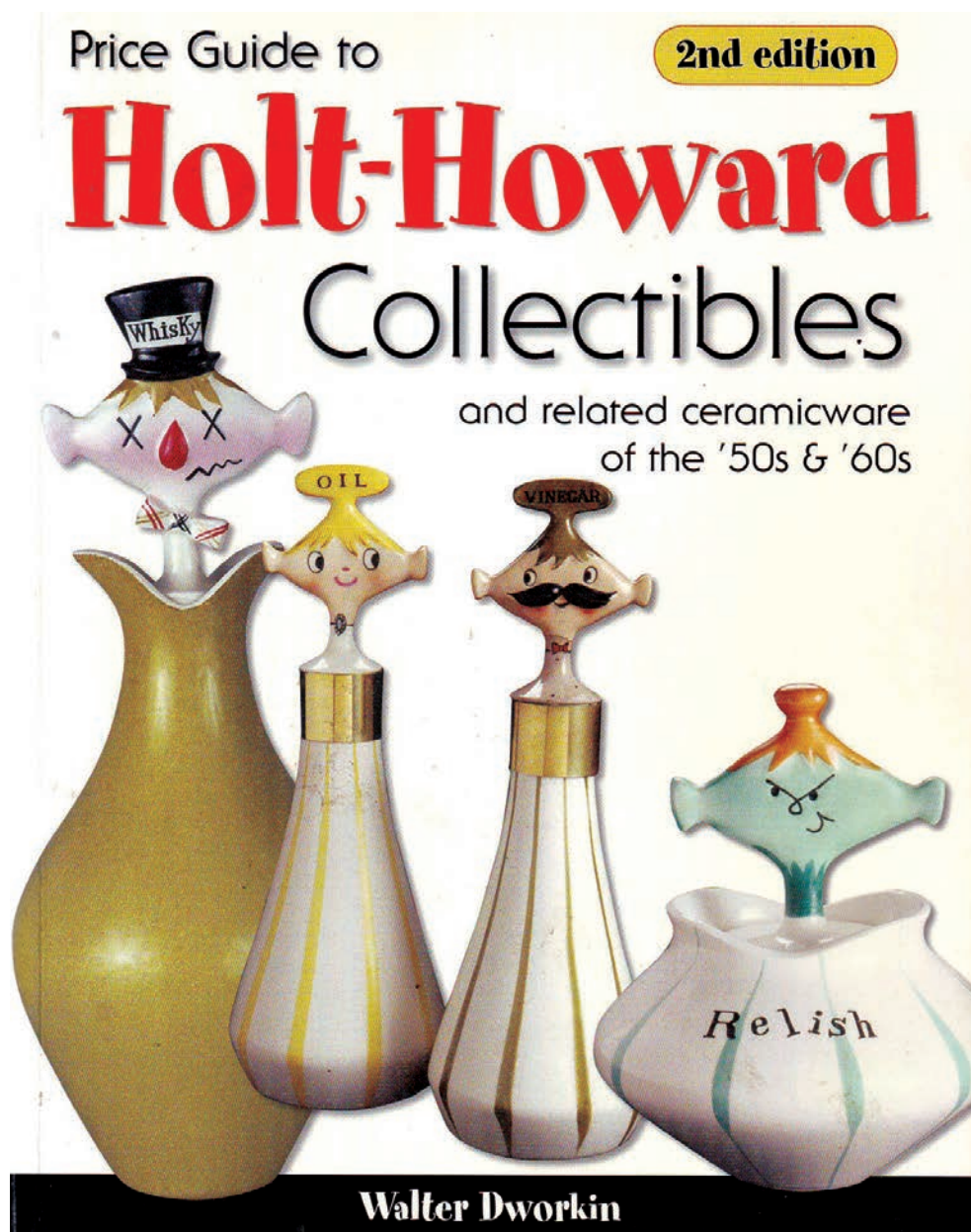
Considered one of the hottest collecting trends today, Holt-Howard Pixieware continues to delight and attract collectors. Introduced in 1958 by the Howard brothers; John and Robert and Grant Holt, Pixieware combines whimsy with functionality resulting in one very desirable line of ceramic kitchen, gift, and bar ware.

The three young men who started Holt-Howard did so with the help of their parents who loaned the trio \$9,000 to go into business for themselves. That was in 1949 when \$9,000 was a tidy sum! The industrious young men created the Holt-Howard Company in an apartment on East 34th Street in Manhattan, later moving their office to 126 E. 28th St. Manhattan and adding a showroom in Manhattan's Gift Center Building on 225 Fifth Avenue.

Robert headed up product development. John was in charge of sales management, and Grant was responsible for the financial affairs and office operations. The beginning years saw Holt-Howard delving into Christmas related items, and not necessarily ceramic pieces. Their first "win" was their "Angel-Abra" also called "Angel Chimes" — a metal piece featuring a trumpeting angel with candles that when lit, caused the contraption to spin.

The success of this item launched the success of Holt-Howard's Christmas line, but the group knew they could not rely on holiday items alone and soon ventured into creating ceramic kitchen items. It was the success of their kitchen pieces that is now the catalyst for the current-day collecting frenzy.

According to avid collector, Kevin McDonald of Chicago, and the man behind the Facebook page Kevin's Pixieware Palace (www.facebook.com/KevinsPixiewarePalace) Holt-Howard manufactured



new designs of Pixieware only in 1958 and 1959. However, the designs from both years were made through the early 1960s.

The items were made in Japan and are marked with an ink signature and often a

sticker, or just a sticker depending on the space available.

Pixieware pieces are easy to identify because each food or liquid vessel has an impish pixie head as its finial or topper. For

many of the jars, a spoon was attached to the underside of the Pixie head lid.

Called "Spooky Spoons" by collectors, the Cocktail Onion spoon is curved to scoop up said onion and there is also a small drain hole in the base of the spoon so onion juice does not overwhelm your mixed drink.

Other Spooky Spoons are shaped so that

Disneyland Autopia Car Races off with \$180,000 at Heritage Auction

DALLAS — Scott Rummell called his California home the second happiest place on earth. Behind Disneyland, that is. Given that it looked like a Disney theme park, that was easy to understand.

The veteran voice actor who has lent his voice to everything from promotional trailers for blockbuster movies like Avengers Endgame to animated characters like Aquaman amassed one of the most significant private collections of Disney memorabilia in the world. The weekend of May 21-22, a good chunk of it went up for auction.

Heritage Auctions billed it as, “Disneyland: The Auction.” More than 700 lots from Rummell’s collection of around 45,000 pieces were auctioned. Bidders had a chance to pursue some of the rarest pieces of Disneyana ever brought to market.

Rummell’s love for Disney started with visits to Disneyland as a child in the 1960s. He began collecting Disney memorabilia in the 1980s. His wife Terry added to his stash her own collection of Donald Duck items. From those beginnings, they amassed everything from park souvenirs to actual ride vehicles. The collection became so massive, that it led to the Rummells customizing their 4,500 square-foot house to display significant items.

With their kids grown and the Rummells downsizing, they decided to let others enjoy pieces of their beloved collection. The auction was held over two days on

the HA.com auction platform. Among the hundreds of lots were park signs, show props, historic Disney artifacts and most significantly, several attraction rides.

Drawing the most attention — and a \$180,000 winning bid — was an original 1967 Disneyland Autopia car, which Heritage described as, “the most complete original vehicle to come to auction in history.” The vehicle was designed by Disney Imagineer Bob Gurr to look like a Corvette Stingray. The car was Rummell’s favorite piece in the collection and a centerpiece in his house. “It was the first car I ever drove,” he said.

Getting almost as much fanfare was the circa 1965 Disneyland Skyway gondola car with working lights. The Swiss-built ride was the first of its kind in the United States. Being so large, the gondola car posed some logistical challenges for the Rummells displaying it. It sold for an

impressive \$162,000.

Yet another iconic ride vehicle was offered. A circa 1993 Mr. Toad’s Wild Ride buggy from Disney World reached \$87,000.

Professionally restored and repainted, the buggy was made display-ready with motorized spinning wheels and working headlights.

From Tomorrowland came a 1967 Rocket Jet. Heritage noted that few have ever

DAVISBURG, Mich. — The Michigan Antique Festivals are split between Midland and Davisburg, each on opposite sides of the mitten state. And the dates of the shows are spread out, so a great deal of a shopper’s time could be spent at these four shows, which are held in late April and the first part of October. The Davisburg festival takes place at the Springfield Oaks County Park. It is a truly beautiful country setting with old-time barns, lots of trees, and some hills that take just a bit of determination to climb up. And don’t let yourself be worried if you are directed to park clear out in the boondocks because they run a very convenient shuttle back and forth.

So go ahead and put on your walking shoes, bring your cart or wagon to roll things around in and settle in for a very fun day. Hundreds of dealers pack in Americana, vintage jewelry, art deco and shabby chic, primitives, toys, and just about any kind of antique or collectible you may be searching for.

At Davisburg, there are six barns packed with vendors, a taste of Michigan area, a craft beer garden and a classic car show.

Vendor Tim Green from Holland, Michigan, showed up with some really large displays. His train ride display had to bring smiles from both young and old. This ride-upon fun piece was used in a tool store to keep the youngsters entertained so the adults could shop longer. It played music while giving out rides. Painted with greens, white and black, this adorable ride would have to attract at-

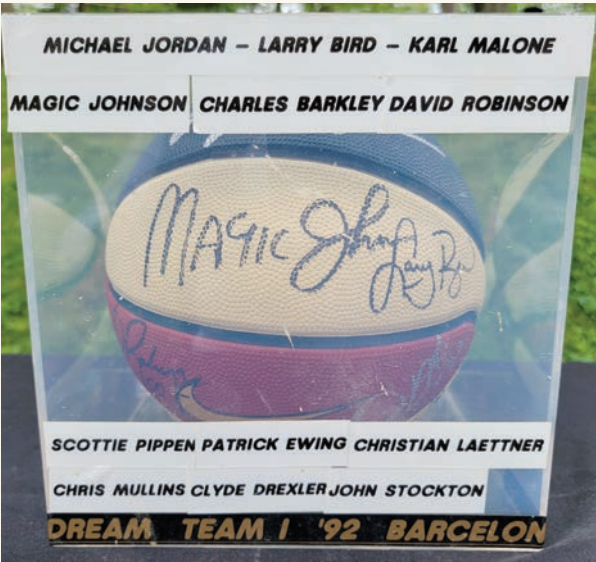

been available to the public. While needing some restoration, it shot away with a \$55,200 winning bid.

Another spotlighted item was an original Disneyland Club 33 sign which once marked the entrance to the exclusive, members-only dining club on New Orleans Square. The club's original inception ran from 1967 to 2014. The glass sign, which fronted Royal Street was one of only three in the club's history. It sold for a whopping \$108,000.

There were numerous lots connected to the Disney Railroad. The most enchanting piece was the original bell from engine number three from Disneyland's Rainbow Caverns Mine Train, purportedly rung by Walt Disney himself. It rang up a \$21,600 winning bid.

Also auctioned were multiple life-size park figures. A replica Pirates of the Caribbean helmsman at the ship's wheel, sold for \$26,400. A Hollywood prop creator had added clothing and other nautical details. The original served as inspiration for the first movie poster for the film Pirates of the Caribbean: The Curse of the Black Pearl. Another figure, a circa 1990s life-size Mickey Mouse from Disneyland, one of only 500 made, sold close at \$21,600.

Several hand silk-screened attraction posters were offered. An iconic one for the monorail read, "Board via Speed Ramp in Tomorrowland or Disneyland Hotel Station." It reached \$8,400.

Smaller items included park service badges and vintage ticket books, but even they commanded impressive sums. An early cast member badge, circa the late 1950s, went for \$3,360. The very rare badge was likely part of the park's third production run, with the number 5709 indicating the sequence of the employee hired. A Disneyland 30-year Jiminy Cricket bronze service award, circa 2002, sold for \$1,140. Disneyland Cast Member Darrell V. Walker, was the original recipient, in celebration of his career that started in 1972. The 12-inch statue was

inscribed "And always let your conscience be your guide!"

Bidders with modest wallets had plenty to chase. Hundreds of lots, typically containing souvenirs and small pieces of ephemera sold well below the four-figure range. The auction's lowest sum of just \$71 went for a lot containing a 1980s-era Mickey Mouse ears hat and a souvenir coonskin cap from the Davy Crockett's Explorer Canoes.

Media outlets from the New York Times to Good Morning America gave buzz to the collection and the auction. Even the auctioneers seemed duly impressed. In an interview with Attractions Magazine, Jim Lentz, Heritage Auctions Vice President and Director of Animation and Anime Art said, "Handling this collection from Disneyland and Disney Theme Parks has been a true highlight of my time working at Heritage Auctions." Honing in on the Autopia car he added, "Of all the lots I have handled in every single auction, this one is one of my all-time favorite lots."

Rummell was, of course, sentimental seeing his beloved collection move on to legions of new Disney fans. When asked about how he could part with the collection that took a lifetime to build. His sincere reply was that it was time to share it with other people.

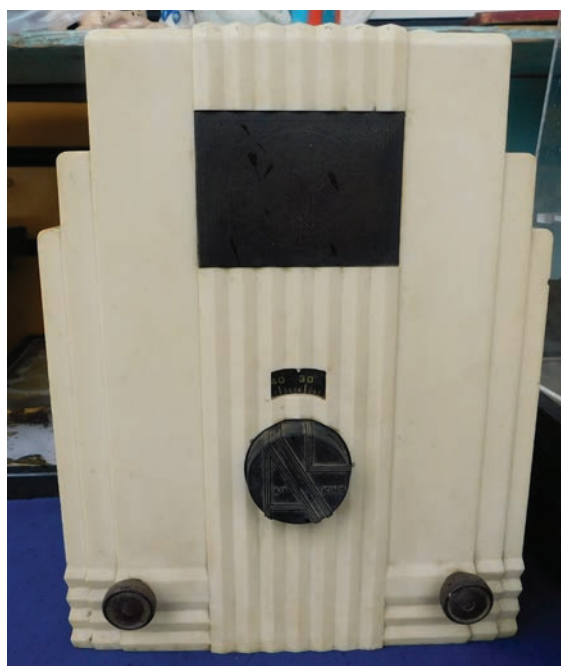

Bohlin parade saddles ride off with \$94,400 at March in Montana

GREAT FALLS, Mont. — Western Art Week has been held annually for over 50 years in celebration of the birthday of Charles M. Russell (March 19, 1864 – October 24, 1926) and, by tradition, it concludes with the much anticipated March in Montana two-day art auction at the historic Charlie Russell Elks Lodge in Great Falls. The major event, presented by Coeur d'Alene Galleries and The Coeur d'Alene Art Auction, is considered a yearly highlight for many dedicated collectors of western art and sculptural works by historic and contemporary masters, as well as Native American textiles and artifacts and cowboy collectibles. This year's 35th Annual Auction attracted record crowds, realized a record sale that tallied \$2.8 million, and set artist world records. "The house was packed," said Ron Nicklas, one of the gallery partners. "We had to rearrange the floor to get more chairs for

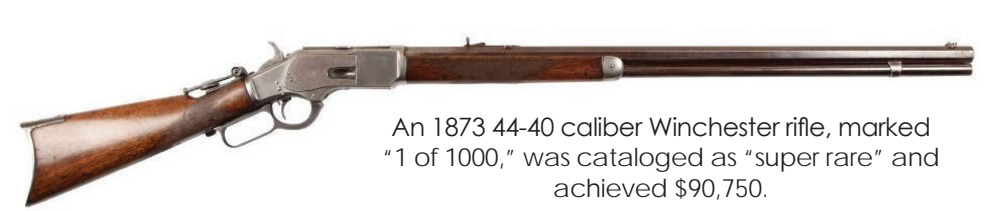

everybody. Both live auction and online bidders competed aggressively. We work hard to offer quality merchandise in a something for everybody format."

The top lot was claimed by a pair of Edward H. Bohlin Beverly model silver mounted parade saddles, circa 1950, that commanded \$94,400. They sold together with silver mounted breast collars, bridles and bits, coronas, and saddle racks. Each had a 14-inch seat. One saddle was initialed W.E.C. (W. E. Cozart) and the other M.L.S. (Merle L. Soult). The catalog noted, "Rare opportunity to acquire a matching pair of parade saddles. Fine condition and ready to ride."

An 1873 44-40 caliber Winchester rifle, marked "1 of 1000" was cataloged as "super rare" and brought \$90,750. It had a 28 inch barrel with a checkered stock and thumb print dust cover. There was a touch of engraving on the end of the barrel and a side plate and receiver marked "108," which is correct on 1 of 1000 guns. The sale included a factory letter confirming the configuration, a group of vin-



tage advertising elements from Winchester, and a book, titled Winchester: The golden age of American Gunmaking and the Winchester 1 of 1000 by R. L. Wilson, in which the gun is featured.

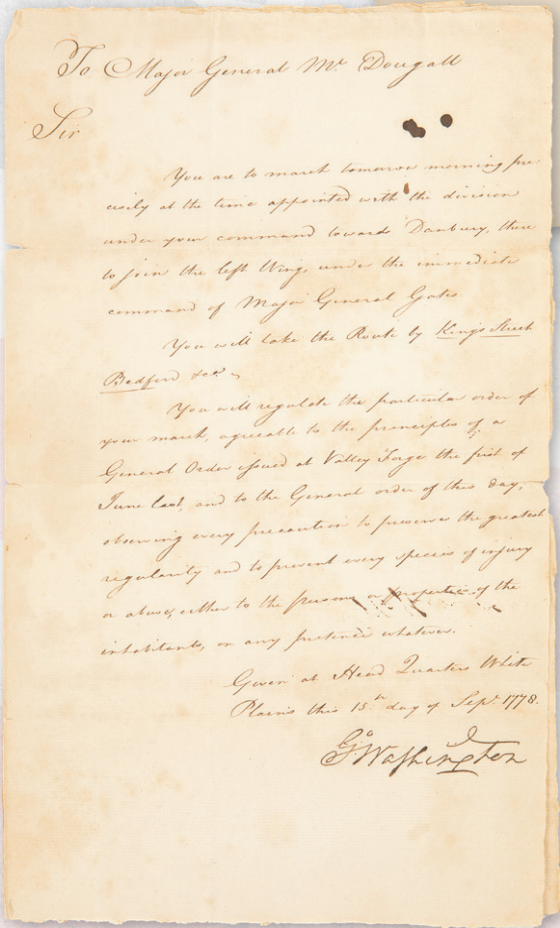

Paintings were in high demand and leaders among them included an oil on canvas, titled “Dance Roach” by Henry C. Balink (1882-1963). The signed work portrayed an elderly Indian in a seated position holding a headdress referred to as roach. It brought an impressive \$64,900, establishing the third highest selling price for the artist to date. Immediately following was another work by Henry C. Balink, titled “The Hunter,” that sold for \$50,150. It too showed an elderly Indian in a seated position as he held hunting spears in each hand. “They were exceptional quality paintings that drew a lot of interest,” Ron Nicklas remarked. “We had so many bidders we had to recruit an audience attendee to be a phone bidder.”

The sum of \$53,100 was paid for an oil on canvas, titled “Unwelcome Guests,” by Don Oelze (b. 1965) that more than doubled the high estimate. The signed work depicted a high action scene of a band of Indians galloping on horseback in pursuit of a stagecoach with the bodyguard riding shotgun, rifle raised in defense position. The canvas was 3 feet by 4 feet, amplifying the intensity of the scene.

“Custer at Crow’s Nest,” an oil on canvas signed by Olaf Wieghorst (1899-1988) measuring 18 inches by 24 inches, exceeded the

estimate to achieve \$44,250. On the back was a vintage hand printed description of the subject matter that read as follows, “Custer at Crow’s Nest” On the morning of June 25, 1876 General Custer was informed by Lt. Varnum that his Indian scouts headed by Bloody Knife had located the hostel Indian village on the Little Bighorn. Custer joined the scouts on a point called Crow’s Nest where Bloody Knife tried to point out the village to him – also present where another Crow scout by the name of Red Star, Lt. Varnum and trumpeter John Martin”

A world record was set for Lorenzo Ghiglieri (1931-2020) when his bronze sculpture, titled “The Need for Buffalo,” sold well past the \$6,000 to \$8,000 estimate to realize an impressive \$29,500. The large 42 inch long bronze was inscribed by the artist and marked 33/36. The scene portrayed a group of galloping buffalo under attack by an Indian hunter with bow and arrow drawn.

A bronze by Dave McGary (1958-2013), titled “The Crow and the Bear,” showed rival Indians on horseback in a heated battle with the Crow pursuing the Bear, the Bear in the lead as he fired a rifle back at his relentless adversary. The 57 inch long work was inscribed “Dave McGary 2007, 9/40”and realized \$39,325, far surpassing the high estimate. Nicklas noted the large piece was one of the artist’s best works. He went on to state that due to rising costs and difficulty in obtaining materials major foundries have shut down and bronze collectors are looking to the secondary market.

Holt-Howard Pixieware

spreading the contents of the jar, like mustard, is easier. Or the spoon does not have a hole so it can scoop up the contents, like jam. The olives Pixie jar’s lid features a metal fork to pierce the olive for serving.

The original Pixieware line created in the United States in the 1950s is made up of 64 items. It is doable to own an entire set; sort of. Some of the Pixieware pieces are very hard to find and command a premium price.

One example would be the ever elusive Honey jar with spoon/lid. An example sold in 2017 on eBay for \$545.99. One is currently for sale on eBay priced a whopping \$1,400!

The first Pixieware items released by Holt-Howard in 1958 were the Pixie condiment jars – Mustard, Ketchup, and Jam ‘n Jelly. These first three installments show the attention to detail Holt-Howard items were known for. Both the color schemes and the facial expressions of the Pixies represent the contents of the jars.

Mustard’s Pixie has a yellow face as does its stripes and the Pixie wears a spicy expression. Ketchup’s face is a tomato-orangish red with green hair, and its stripes have a reddish hue. Jam n’ Jelly has a sweet expression, pinkish cheeks, and similar colored stripes.

“These Pixieware condiments jars are such a reflection of the era,” McDonald said. “It would have been gauche back in the day to put a jar of Smucker’s jam on the table, or a bottle of Heinz ketchup. Instead, these condiments were served in decorative containers such as these Pixieware jars.”

Walter Dworkin, author of the “Price Guide to Holt-Howard Collectibles and Related Ceramicware of the 50s and 60s, 2nd Edition” (Krause Publications, 2007) states, “Since these three pieces were the very first pixies Holt-Howard created, more of these were produced than any other resulting from numerous annual manufacturing cycles of 100 dozen (1,200) per run from 1958 through 1962. As a result of this mass production, they are the most commonly found pieces today.”

Other Pixieware pieces produced in 1958 include “Lil’ Sugar” and “Cream Crock.” Not only is the head on the sugar slightly smaller than other Pixieware heads, the cream crock vessel is also a bit smaller. Dworkin notes, “Some color in the pixie’s head would always match the color of the condiment jar’s base. This color coordination assures the novice collector the heads and bases of these pieces correctly match.”

Some other Pixieware pieces produced in 1958 would include - “Instant Coffee” whose lid had a gasket to seal the jar keeping the coffee fresh; both “Cocktail Olives,” and simply “Olives – the only Pixieware pieces with a two-pronged fork attached to their lids. Then there is “Cocktail Onions,” and just “Onions”, both with pixie heads that look like an onion with the facial expressions to match. And similarly, “Cocktail Cherries” and “Cherries.”

The jars with the word “Cocktail” along with olives, onions, and cherries, originally sold together as a trio and were marketed as part of the “Happy Party Gremlins” liquor decanters and four-piece set of pixie liquor bottle bracelets grouping. Later ver-

sions of the olives, onions, and cherries Pixieware jars saw the “Cocktail” word removed. It was felt by removing the alcohol associated word, the trio would be appealing to more consumers.

Speaking of the “Happy Party Gremlins” liquor decanters (labeled “Devil’s Brew”, “300 Proof” and “Whiskey”), know they originally had solid bases; the only solid color based Pixieware pieces made. Holt-Howard soon realized consumers wanted these decanters to match the other Pixieware offerings so later versions had striped bases. These decanters were also tall, standing 10 ½ inches high and hold 24 ounces of alcohol.

“Large Pixieware pieces such as these decanters were manufactured in limited production runs of 300 pieces each, compared to the condiment jars at 100 dozen (1,200) each. As a result, fewer liquor decanters were produced and are a rarer find today,” Dworkin wrote. Expect to pay upwards of \$500-plus for a decanter if you can find one.

Other items in the 1958 Pixieware line include “Bottle Bracelets” to label bottles of alcohol; “Stacking Seasons” consisting of two salts and two peppers that had notches to stack and sold in a wooden holder;

“Pixie Spoons” being stainless steel spoons with pixie heads that sold in packages of four, each with a different face and coloration, and the “Sam and Sally Cruet Set” being oil and vinegar bottles each standing 9 inches high.

Additions to the Pixieware line in 1959 include more condiment jars like “Relish”, “Mayonnaise,” “Honey,” and “Chili Sauce.” “Party Pixies Hors d’ Oeuvre” dishes with elongated pixie hairdos to hold pretzels and a larger attached saucer base where nibbles like chunks of cheese could sit were a hit.

Pixieware shallow snack bowls introduced in 1959 are a collecting venue in its own right. Ten bowls make up the set with seven being for serving snacks and three for sundaes. Holt-Howard gave each of its snack pixies a name to indicate its function: Mustard Max, Ketchup Katie, Pickle Pete, Onion Annie, Olive Oscar, Tartar Tom and Peanut Butter Pat. The sundae bowls are labeled, “Nuts”, “Berries,” and “Goo.” Each bowl’s “handle” is a pixie head representing what should be served in the bowl and again feature the Holt-Howard stripes.

There are salad dressing bottles for Russian, French, and Italian dressing. The one set of three has the tradition flat headed pixies as their toppers. Holt-Howard also

made the three with round-headed pixies as toppers; the only round-headed pixies made.

The giftware line pixies include a pair of “Teapot Candleholder Hurricane Vases” being shaped like a teapot, but acting as a vase and candleholder. “Table Favor” pixies were sold as a set of four and were called “Serviettes.” They were used as ashtrays, tea bag holders, for nuts or as a spoon rest. A “Hanging Pixie Planter” also exists and this item and the a fore-mentioned vases being the only Pixieware pieces that include a full bodied pixie and not just a pixie head.

In 1968, Holt-Howard was purchased by General Housewares Corporation making it part of their Giftware Group. By 1974, the three original partners had left the company.

In 2002, as Pixieware collecting surged, John Howard felt with the renewed interest in the line, it was time a retro Pixieware cookie jar be made available. Howard working with former Holt-Howard employee and designer, Curt Blanchard, designed and produced what they called a “second generation” Pixieware cookie jar that fit perfectly with the original line.

Blanchard went on to produce several other second generation Pixieware items. None of the second gen pieces duplicated any items from the original line, but were new designs and included six Pixie pots, a salt and pepper set, a salsa dish, a spoon rest, and another cookie jar – this being a Christmas design.
