## This Father's Day consider a vintage card

"When I was a boy of 14, my father was so ignorant I could hardly stand to have him around. But when I got to be 21, I was astonished at how much the old man had learned in seven years." — Mark Twain

Oh Dad, poor Dad. Even when he gets a compliment, it's a backhanded one. But once a year at least, Dad gets his due. Father's Day is our opportunity to celebrate all the great dads out there. On Father's Day, Dads rule – but without "Mother's Day," your sire might still be in search of a celebration to call his own.

Mother's Day was the brainchild of Anna M. Jarvis, an outgrowth of the "Mother's Friendship Clubs" promoted by her own mother in the mid-1800s. The goal of the clubs: to foster reconciliation between Union and Confederate sympathizers. Anna envisioned a day honoring both her beloved mother, and the goal of world peace. On May 10, 1908, "Mother's Day" had its first official observance at Andrew's Methodist Church, Grafton, West Virginia, where Jarvis' mother had served twenty years as a Sunday School

In 1914, President Woodrow Wilson signed legislation proclaiming the second Sunday in May as Mother's Day.

Now it was time to give Dad his due. In Fairmont, West Virginia, just 15 miles from Grafton, Grace Golden Clayton was inspired by Jarvis' efforts. On July 5, 1908, less than two months after that first "Mother's Day," Clayton organized a "Father's Day" service at Williams Memorial Methodist Episcopal Church South. Hundreds of area fathers (including Clayton's) had perished in a December, 1907 mining disaster. She suggested the event as a means of honoring these men, as well as all fathers.

Clayton, however, was not a promoter. Following the 1908 "Father's Day," her idea lay dormant until 1910, when Sonora Smart Dodd of Spokane, Washington, was similarly inspired. After hearing a Mother's Day sermon, Dodd became convinced that Dad also needed a day. She suggestTo a GRAND GOOD SCOUT

ed June 5, her own father's birthday, but time was short. The celebration was delayed until June 19, 1910, when ministers throughout Spokane praised Dads from their pulpits.

Father's Day caught on, and as early as 1913 a bill was offered in Congress to give the holiday nationwide recognition. In 1916, as part of an extra-special Father's Day extravaganza, President Woodrow Wilson, at home in Washington D.C., unfurled an American flag in Spokane via





## Boba Fett prototype blasted to record \$236,000 at Hake's

YORK, Pa. – The enduring, multigenerational appeal of Star Wars action figures and related collectibles was never more obvious than on June 2, as Hake's first-ever Special Event Auction featuring memorabilia from the legendary franchise closed the books at \$903,000. The online auction, whose final bid was received at 11:14 p.m., achieved a 100 percent sell-through rate and set multiple new world records in so doing. In Hake's last two auctions, 500 lots of Star Wars material have sold for a combined \$2.1 million.

"We're very pleased with the results from our Star Wars Special Event Auction," said Hake's president Alex Winter. "Star Wars has become an important part of our premier events, accounting for a strong percentage of the auction totals. Choosing to hold a Star Wars-only auction was an easy decision because we know our customers are hungry for the cream of the crop from Star Wars collectibles."

The predicted top item, a Boba Fett L-slot rocket-firing prototype, AFA 80+ NM, soared to a record-setting \$236,000. This prototype is famous in collecting circles because it was pulled from Kenner's 1979 Star Wars toy line when the rocket-firing aspect was

deemed a choking hazard. The 3¾inch figure is unpainted and has the L-slot mechanism (named for its shape).

"This sale set a new record for any rocket-firing Boba Fett prototype," Winter said, pointing out that it beat the record Hake's just ities was the Jawa (vinyl cape),

set for a J-slot graded AFA 50, which sold for \$204,435 in their March auction. "What makes that so incredible is that it's not the rarer J-slot and it's in a lower grade than other L-slots we've sold."

One of the auction's key rar-

## Neckties can make a fun collection or perfect gift

Blame it on "Casual Friday." perhaps the pandemic is at the root of it. But then again, maybe it's just the fact that the times, they are a-changing. Although there are those in the menswear industry who might argue to the

contrary, neckties, the traditional go-to gift for Dad on Father's Day, are on their way out. But whether or not this year you shopped for a tie, or are just feeling a bit nostalgic, this could be the time to check out Roseann Ettinger's 1998 book, "Popular & Collectible Neckties: 1955 to Present."

Although I have purchased many ties over the years but have personally worn only one (thanks, Annie Hall), I love the look of men's neckties and the statement they make about the wearer. According to Ettinger, I am not alone, as most ties are bought by women. That's not the only tidbit of information I learned

Men's ties are, and have been for decades, big business. In her research for this book and its companion piece, "20th Century Neckties: Pre-1955," Ettinger found that by 1952, some 191 million neckties were produced with 40,00 different patterns in 100,000 different combinations. Examining ties from the second half of the century for this book, she breaks them down into four eras. Ultra-skinny ("Toned-Down & Thinned-Down") ties from 1955 to 1965 were worn with conservative suits sporting tapered slacks and small lapels. New synthetic fibers were used in their manufacture at this time; "Miracle Ties," made of 100


12-back-A AFA 80 NM, that achieved \$40,887, a world-record price for any Jawa figure. The 21/4-inch-tall figure comes on an unpunched card, wearing the initial vinyl cape. Later Jawas were repackaged with a cloth cape.

Every auction has a surprise, and on June 2 that distinction went to a Hungarian bootleg Return of the Jedi Boba Fett AFA 50 Q-VG, which more than doubled its pre-auction estimate to command \$20,768, a world auction record for that variety of Boba. Part of a series of 10 Hungarian figures released in 1987, it is recognizable for its smaller size, lack of copyright information, and the fact that it is made of lower-quality injection-molded plastic.

The Power of the Force Yak Face 92back AFA 80 Y-NM realized \$19,145, a world-record price for this particular figure in this grade. The 4-inch-tall figure with matching aluminum collector's coin is from Kenner Canada's 1985 line. It is considered the most desirable of the last 17 vintage figures and was only released in foreign outlets. It comes with provenance from the Doug McKibbon collection.

The 12 Action Figures display header brought \$18,172. Measuring 11%- by 35½ inches, the double-sided sign with "Star Wars Action Figures" text is accompanied by images of the first 12 action figures. This sizable display header was used as a shelf merchandiser for large store displays of the Kenner fig-

The earliest Star Wars figures were represented with the Early Bird Mailer Kit that sold for \$15,576. It includes the original white mailing box, Luke Skywalker with a double-telescoping lightsaber, Princess Leia, Chewbacca, and R2-D2, plus the foot pegs for the

cardboard stage, all contained in baggies in the vacuform plastic tray. It also includes the mini-catalog and action stand offer paper.

The Early Bird Certificate Package settled at \$14,278. When Kenner couldn't meet the demand for toys during the 1977 holiday season, they sent these Early Bird Certificate Packages in their stead. The stiff illustrated envelope contains the sealed kit with the cardboard stand, stickers, and a coupon to be redeemed for the first four

The Toy Center store display measuring 24 by 40 inches long, surpassed its \$10,000 estimate to reach \$12,980. The double-sided die-cut cardboard display was released in 1979 and has holes in the top corners for hanging in toy department displays.

"Time and again we've set records for the rarest pieces, and in turn, we bring in more high-grade, desirable material, proving that Hake's is the best place for Star Wars action figures and toys," Winter said. "We're always on the lookout for more Star Wars items for upcoming auctions, so we hope collectors who may have a desire to sell will reach out to

percent Dacron, were nearly indestructi-

"Wider and Wilder" choices marked 1965 to 1975, as fashion designers and rock stars got into the act. Thick polyester ties, "big, bold, and extremely colorful," were meant to stand out – and they did. By the 1980s, it was, as Ettinger writes, time to get "Back to Reality." Even though ties from this decade "gave the man of the '80s prestige and confidence," they were not boring, as evidenced by examples with abstract designs and floral patterns. The author closes out the century with "Contemporary Ties of the 1990s," many of which were influenced by pop culture icons. The book concludes with a survey of various tie styles, including bowties, pretied ties, and tie sets.

Sprinkled throughout the book are vin-

tage advertisements, which in themselves would make a fun collection. Just saying, pretty girls were often used to sell ties back in the day. Additionally, the book's 397 color photographs, accompanied by a price guide, are clear and inspiring, as well as serving as nostalgic reminders of how well-dressed men used to appear. Because this book is 24 years old, I might normally suggest that these monetary values be used for comparison's sake only, but a quick online check seems to confirm that the market has remained stable. The good news: A tie collection is affordable, with many interesting ties priced well under \$100. On the other hand, it's probably a good idea not to collect ties as an investment.

As for collecting strategies, although Ettinger never spells out a plan, the array of options presented suggest to me several categories that would keep a tie collection from turning into a tie accumulation.

For example, pick a designer and focus


on him (or her). On a personal note, I was a bit disappointed not to see any ties by Jerry Garcia or Nicole Miller represented in the book. Oh well. Bicentennial-themed ties might be fun. (Do you think that there will be any made for America's upcoming 250th? Don't hold your breath.) More obvious would be a collection of ties relating to a specific sports team or hobby, or perhaps an interest, such as dogs or cats.

Finally, Ettinger suggests that this is a collection that need not sit in a drawer: "Whether it be a contemporary example, or one worn decades ago, a tie is wearable art." Talk about the tie binds. . . .

## Items from Michael Collins collection fly high at Heritage auction

DALLAS, Texas - The largest-sized American flag aboard the most important flight in the history of the U.S. Space program, owned and signed by the mission's command module pilot, soared to \$162,500 to lead Heritage Auctions' Space Exploration Signature® Auction to \$2,591,768 June 2-3.

The Apollo 11 flag was signed by Michael Collins and came from his personal collection. The flag led the collection of Collins, who famously flew aboard Apollo 11, the first manned mission to reach the moon, with Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin. Collins kept the flag as a treasured souvenir of the historic mission. At 17.75 inches by 11.5 inches, the incredibly rare silk flag is the largest size typically flown by Apollo missions.

"Michael Collins is among the most important astronauts in the history of space travel, and the results of this auction surpassed our loftiest expectations," Heritage Auctions Space Exploration Consignment Director Brad Palmer said. "We knew the interest in the flag would be sky-high, because mission-flown flags of that size (17-3/4 by 11-1/2 inches) are in exceedingly high demand among serious space collectors. This is a fantastic flag, owned and signed by Michael Collins, and it ended up serving as an outstanding launching point for the entire auction."

From the same historic mission came an Apollo 11-flown and crew signed Beta Cloth Mission Insignia Directly that tripled its pre-auction estimate when it reached \$137,500. In the center of the cloth is a circular insignia (diameter: 3-3/8 inches) that was designed by Collins, and shows an eagle carrying an olive branch to the moon with Earth in the distance over the eagle's right shoulder. After the mission, Collins wrote: "Carried to the moon aboard Apollo XI/ July 1969" and signed it, as did Armstrong and Aldrin. Made with fire-safe Fiberglass Beta yarns, Beta cloth was used in the space suits worn by the Apollo astronauts.

Three lots brought triple-figure results; the third was an Apollo 11 flown and used star chart with handwritten annotations. It flew to \$125,000 – more than three times its pre-auction estimate. The chart is a vital piece of documentation from the Apollo 11 mission, depicting dozens of stars and constellations and features numerous handwritten annota-

tions by Collins, with the following written on the left border: "During the flight of/ APOLLO ELEVEN,/ I used this chart/ to help me locate stars. (The/ numbers were/ entered into/ the Command/ Module Computer/ Michael/ Collins/ CMP."

The auction included 19 flags, including an Apollo 11-flown American flag signed by Collins that reached \$81,250 and a framed Apollo 11-flown American flag on a Crew-Signed Presentation Certificate that sold for \$75,000.

Mission-flown Robbins medallions always hold significant appeal to collectors, and this sale was no exception. All told, the event included 23 assorted Robbins medallions, including an Apollo 11-flown MS67 NGC Sterling Silver Robbins medallion, Serial Number 300 that went for \$52,500 and an Apollo 11-flown MS66 NGC Sterling Silver Robbins medallion, Serial Number 357 that closed at \$36,250.

An Apollo 11-flown flight plan page 89B with annotations handwritten by Collins nearly quintupled its pre-auction estimate when it drew a winning bid of \$47,500. Measuring 6-1/2 by 8 inches, the page is numbered 89B and comes from the Command Module Pilot Solo Book. The heavily annotated page addresses LM Insertion and covers the time between 124:30 and 125:00. It has been signed in black ink along bottom: "Michael Collins/ CMP" and "A flown page from the Apollo XI/ Flight Plan/ Michael Collins CMP" on the verso, making it an extremely important relic from this historic flight. The lot Included a handwritten LOA from Collins stating he kept this page due to the stretch of time it covered when he was supposed to be "the loneliest human ever."

A dozen bids came in for an Apollo 11-Flown Pilot's Preference Kit (PPK), signed by Collins before it found a new home at \$40,000. The kit includes a Beta cloth bag with a sewn-on tag that reads "KIT PILOT'S PREFERENCE/ P/N SEB 12100018-202/ S/N 1071." Collins signed and annotated that same tag, as well as the notes. Written directly below the tag is: "Flown to the Moon/ Aboard Apollo XI." Accompanying the kit is a handwritten note on



## Delftware collection will highlight upcoming Pook & Pook auction

DOWNINGTOWN, Pa. — On June 30 and July 1, Pook & Pook will present the Collection of Mark and Marjorie Allen of New Hampshire. Well-known for English and Dutch delftware of the 17th and 18th centuries, the Allens had a large and comprehensive delftware inventory. They also collected brass of the 17th and 18th centuries, pre-Federal American and country furniture, paintings, and export porcelain. The sale opens with one of Mark Allen's personal favorites, an important Chippendale walnut slant front desk, circa 1760, attributed to the workshop of Thomas White, Perquimans County, North Carolina. Pictured in "American Furniture" by John Bivins, edited by Luke Beckerdite, with provenance M. Du-Pont. Lot 1. will be a main attraction.

Overall, the Allen furniture encompasses at least eight of the colonies and Canada, featuring many New England William and Mary, Queen Anne, Chippendale, and country examples. Of particular note is the wide assortment of 18th century tavern tables. There are Queen Anne and Windsor chairs to choose from, and, perfect for displaying Delftware and brass candlesticks, a variety of hanging shelves and cupboards, wall cupboards, and a Pennsylvania walnut pewter cupboard. Tables include three New England examples: a delicate William and Mary gateleg table, circa 1740, a William and Mary flame birch gateleg table, and a cherry butterfly table. Other tables include a slight Delaware Valley Queen Anne walnut dressing table, circa 1760, with squared cabriole legs and unusual brushed Spanish feet.



Over 50 lots of candlesticks include many English Queen Anne brass, English bell metal, English brass six shell, English Georgian, Dutch Heemskirk, Spanish brass, and a pair of engraved brass Huguenot candlesticks. Other brass includes German alms dishes. An entertaining assortment of zoomorphic food choppers take the forms of diverse creatures.


Delftware steals the show, with Lot 487, a rare Dutch Delft five piece garniture set, mid 18th century, decorated in the Imari palette. An early Dutch majolica blue dash small charger circa 1625 depicts an urn of tulips, while a Dutch Delft Adam and Eve charger is from later in the century. Other 17th century wares include chargers and plates possibly from the Pickelherring Factory. A polychrome Delft vase circa 1700 is initialed by Adrin Pynacher, and a circa 1700 plaque is marked by Jacobus Pljnocker. Dutch blue and white Delft tobacco jars stand alongside polychrome jars, a pair of which is initialed BP for the De Blompot workshop.

Paintings include one attributed to Duncan McFarlane (British/American 1834-1871) oil on canvas of the British ship Birkby off the Liverpool harbor; an oil on canvas of the well-known Connecticut River Oxbow, as seen from Mount Holyoke, attributed to Victor De Grailly (American 1804-1889); and attributed to Robert Dellow (ca. 1696-1736), a portrait of the young Sir Thomas Pope Blount, 2nd Baronet (1670-1731), in a lush landscape with a small dog and ducks.



## Mother Nature didn't dampen enthusaisam at Springfield Extravaganza

SPRINGFIELD, Ohio — When the gates opened on the first day of this season's Springfield Extravaganza, Mother Nature was waiting. A weather system that had wreaked havoc across the country arrived in west-central Ohio. Torrents of rain fell and winds exceeded 25mph. Walkways and dealer spaces filled with water just as guests arrived.

again. Around 3 pm, a tornado warn-Springfield. On a Facebook group for show participants, a warning went out - "Better and gusting winds hit the Clark County Fairgrounds. Dealers spoke of tables blowing over and the grounds getting drowned once again. It was bad enough that one vendor remarked, "This is the worst storm I've seen there. And it's not playing around. I

Before and after that bad round of weather, many dealers packed up and left. One Ohio vendor confessed, "I left Saturday just before the storm hit. I didn't want to risk having a lot of damage." Similarly, many customers went home. One remarked, "I

> left before it came. I wasn't going through a storm when you know it's coming.

For the 800 or so vendors that stayed, Sunday morning arrived chilly and overcast with occasional drizzle. Those without a jacket were at a disadvantage. The grounds remained mucky. Parking

proved challenging since much of it is in grass fields. At least one vehicle - a large RV - had to be towed out of the mud. Some dealer booths still had water ankle deep; others were cut off by flooded walkways. Empty spaces left by departed vendors were conspicuous and crowds were noticeably thin.

The spring Extravaganza has an ironic history of the spring show getting hit with bad weather. Yet, that never seems to dampen the enthusiasm of hardy dealers. Kathy Stanz of Sylvia's Vintage Daughter said she had to set up her booth twice and acknowledged it was a trying weekend for everyone. Yet, more of her commentary revolved around the joy she gets out of selling vintage items and interacting with her patrons. "I've made lots of friends over the years from my customers."

Similarly, Jon and Erin Stigler were berthed in an outdoor booth filled with vintage clothing potentially at risk from the rain. Yet, they were cheerfully greeting and interacting with guests. Perhaps that explains why shoppers as young as their teens, and even one as young as 8-years old, were often repeat buyers.

Bad weather didn't seem to erode the spirits of attendees either. There still seems to be plenty of pent-up, post-COVID desire to shop and partake in activities. One North Carolina guest light-heartedly proclaimed, "Went to the Extravaganza today for the first time! Had a great time in the mud and water!" Shoppers' exuberance spread to their purchases. Vendor Elise Bell Baughman of Baughman Emporium in Lancaster, Ohio said, "I had a great Friday! Probably the best ever." Comments from dealer Vickie Copley of Columbus reflected both

aspects of the day, "Weather was a challenge for us as a vendor. Best show \$ wise I have ever had. Friday was extremely busy."

Of course, indoor vendors did not endure the weather like outdoor vendors did. Not only were they protected from the elements. but when the weather turned, many shoppers moved inside. For Scott Silver from Norah Gracie Antiques being inside was fortunate. His business offers fully restored authentic antiques which would have suffered in the weather. His beautifully-laden booth became a focal point for folks wandering inside. Tracy Little's Rustic Rose was also stationed inside. Her repurposed pieces, some of which were priced as low as \$10-12, attracted shoppers who flocked inside and were motivated to make an impulse buy.

By Sunday afternoon the weather cleared. Temperatures hit the 80s and the sun dried the grounds. New arrivals had a much different shopping experience than those who came earlier in the weekend. One could only wish the weather had been like that weekend-long. The exuberant buying that took place during the off/on rough weather would have been that much better.

Ultimately recognizing how dealers and shoppers alike weathered the storms - and wanting to express gratitude to everyone for another fantastic event - show promoter Jenkins + Co conveyed: "The afterglow of the May 2022 Extravaganza. A huge thank you to everyone who came and tirelessly shopped and took home car and truck loads from small business owners, [and] to the dealers that loaded/hauled across states, set up and weathered Mother Nature's not so funny jokes, to our team and the fairgrounds staff that were there before sunrise and long after sunset...thank you, thank you, thank you."

## Father's Day Cards



telegraph signals. But support for a nationwide observance continued to languish, amid fears that Father's Day would turn out to be just another sales promotion

In the 1930s, Sonora Dodd again took up the Father's Day banner. This time around, she had strong support: the "Father's Day Council" of the New York Associated Men's Wear Retailers. These purveyors of ties, handkerchiefs, and varied other sundries, saw the occasion as an ideal tie-in for their products. So did the manufacturers of pipes, tobacco tins, fishing tackle, tools, golf clubs, gardening equipment, and a myriad of other sure-toplease-pop products. They joined the Council in its endeavors, and Father's Day, with all its accouterments, was here to stay.

Governmental recognition, however, continued to loiter. Decades went by. Father's Day was celebrated on the third Sunday in June, and heavily promoted in stores, yet no official proclamation was forthcoming. Why the delay? According to one member of the Florist's Exchange, fathers just didn't have the same "sentimental appeal" as mothers.

With the onset of World War II, Father's Day assumed the mantle of a patriotic duty, a way of honoring the servicemen, many of them fathers, stationed "over there." But, when it came to national recognition of this national institution, politicians continued to dawdle. In 1957, Senator Margaret Chase Smith of Maine chided Congress for its delay. Smith noted that "to single out just one of our two parents, and omit the other, is the most grievous insult imaginable." It wasn't until 1966 that Lyndon B. Johnson officially proclaimed the third Sunday in June as "Father's Day." In 1972, a law to that effect was signed by Richard Nixon, and 90-year-old Sonora Smart Dodd was

around to see it happen. By then, of course, Father's Day had become irrevocably established as what the Father's Day Council called "a second Christmas for all the men's gift-oriented industries." Recent estimates are that Americans spend over one billion dollars each year on Father's Day gifts and cards.

For greeting card manufacturers, Dad's day means big business. It's the fifth most popular holiday for sending cards, with retailers totting up nearly 100 million dollars in card sales. And, the market for recipients is no longer limited to just Dad. There are Father's Day greetings tailor-made for grandpas, hubbies, sons, sons-in-law, uncles, godfathers, and assorted other favorite fellas.


While burgeoning in popularity from the 1940s onward, the Father's Day card has historic underpinnings. A Babylonian clay tablet, dating back some 4000 years,

bears carved greetings from a young lad named Elmesu, wishing his father "good health and a long life." There's no word on whether Elmesu's dad also received the Babylonian equivalent of a nice necktie.

Vintage Father's Day cards are popular with today's paper collectors, who are taken with their nostalgic, often humorous appeal. In pre-texting, pre-Facebook days, when long-distance phone calls were still a luxury, greeting cards were pretty much the only affordable means available for sending good wishes across the miles. From "name" manufacturers such as Hallmark and Norcross, to lesser-knowns such as Rose Moderne and The Wishing Well, an overflowing mailbox-full of options was available.

While popular card imagery included such old stalwarts as fishing rods, smoking paraphernalia, and hunting equipment, interesting embellishments often added to the visual appeal. A World War II-era card, featuring an illustration of a hand-carved model battleship, was accented with raised wooden letters, spelling out "Dad." A cartoon illustration of a son "busting his buttons" with pride because "I've got a swell Dad like you" came complete with – you guessed it – an actual button. A take-it-easy Dad was




**Below:** "A toast on Father's Day," sure to win Dad's heart (or at least make him thirsty). The Pollyanna Line, 1950.






**Below:** A Golden Bell (Gartner & Bender Inc.) card from 1943, "For A Model Dad," featuring raised wooden lettering.

was led by Dad on a leash of actual rope, while a card showing a typewriter (remember those?), with the heading "You're the type for me, Dad," came complete with a swatch of "real" typewriter ribbon (in black and red, just like at the office). There were cards with metallic paper "mirrors," so Dad could see who all the fuss was about. . .cards with glowing pipes, their embers courtesy of gold glitter. . .and more than a few cards depicting what Dad might rather be opening on his day off: a ready-to-be-drained cocktail shaker.

This Father's Day, if you're one of the more than 60 percent of Americans who'll be getting Dad a card, why not send one of the vintage variety? Plenty of unsigned, new-old-stock cards are among the hundreds of Father's Day items listed daily on eBay; most sell in the \$5-10 range. Be on the lookout for cards with minimal creasing, fading, smudging, or tape marks, so that the brightly colored visuals are shown to their best advantage.

And when you sign it, be sure and add "Thanks, Dad!"
