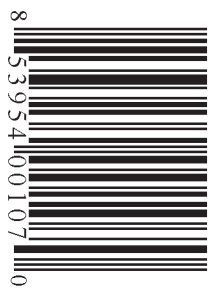

Antique tools are handy and collectible

Antique tools are not as glamorous or high profile as contemporary artworks that sell for millions of dollars but they are highly sought after by collectors. Carpentry tools especially are utilitarian yet have strong aesthetic appeal. Used to build everything from furniture to houses, these tools have a rich history that prompts many people to buy them to use in wood-working projects today.

Rick Hansen of St. Paul, Minnesota, runs the website Vintage Woodworking Tools. He said over the last 10 years or so there's been a renaissance in hand tool woodworking, so many people are buying old tools for use. But, he adds, there is the huge segment that collects them as a hobby.

"Tools made after 1950 are generally not in high demand," he said. "I would say that most collectors are looking for items prior to World War II. After that quality declined and many lines of tools were discontinued due to the economy in the 1930s and to increased use of electric power tools. Serious collectors want tools in good condition, the nicer the better. If a tool is in the original packaging it will sell at a premium."

When it comes to old tools, Hansen says, Stanley and Disston are probably the most popular brands.

"Stanley was the largest tool maker of things like hand planes, levels, rules and more, and Disston was the largest saw manufacturer in the world," he said. "The popularity of Stanley and Disston is due to their availability and the wide range of items made."

In the United States, the words "tools and hardware" and "Stanley" are almost synonymous. The company began modestly in 1843, when Frederick T. Stanley founded a door-hardware company in New Britain, Connecticut. In 1857, Henry Stanley, Frederick's cousin, launched the Stanley Rule and Level Company, which acquired Leonard Bailey & Company in 1878. Bailey held numerous patents on such mainstay tools as planes, which

Stanley Rule and Level augmented with miter boxes, rulers, hand drills, hammers and of course, its line of wood and iron levels. By 1920, the two Stanley firms merged.

While Stanley is well known for everything from toolboxes to hinges to garage-door openers it is perhaps best known as a plane manufacturer. Stanley entered that market in 1843, and by 1900 it was the dominant player, often buying out competitors.

Lee Richmond is the founder of The Best Things Corporation, specializing in fine woodworking tools. He is also a 19-year veteran tool expert for the traveling PBS series, Antiques Roadshow, exchanging appraisals for close-up encounters with old tools and the local people who bring them in.

"Woodworkers choose tools for their quality, craftsmanship and functionality," Richmond said. "Collectors who never intend to use an antique tool are more

interested in the history, aesthetics and condition. They generally collect based on the type of tool, the time period, the region, or the patents on the design."

Then again, there are those who collect tools across the spectrum.

"From planes and saws to levels, wrenches, drills and rules, antique hand tools are the pride and joy of many a collectors' possessions," says Paul Blakeman, a retired tool and die maker from Elyria, Ohio, who inherited his father's 12,000-piece tool collection.

"In my dad's collection he probably had 100 chisels, 100 hammers, 100 vice grips....it seems that he had just about every hand tool imaginable," Blakeman said. "He had this 'gold mine' and didn't even know it. Depending on the condition of the tool and its type, a good tool can be worth a few hundred dollars, and in some cases much more than that."

Alexander Hamilton’s spectacles saw a \$26,250 bid at Skinner

MARLBOROUGH, Mass. – An American Decorative Arts auction, hosted by Skinner offered works from iconic 18th century artists and artisans, as well as relics attributed to America’s Founding Fathers. The elite 111 lot sale attracted collectors seeking those one-of-a-kind, never to come again, articles of historic importance.

“We put together a small and carefully curated sale and had a very good response during the previews and very good bidding throughout on most lots. Bidders were excited for the opportunity to handle historic pieces. Anything connected to important figures or events makes it difficult to predict a price, but we did well and were extremely pleased with the performance of the historic articles,” said Stephen Fletcher, head of Skinner’s American Furniture & Decorative Arts department.

One of the highlights among the historic items was a pair of gold frame spectacles that were given to Alexander Hamilton by George Washington. The lot also included a swatch of silk fabric from Martha Washington’s wedding dress. The dress fragment was mounted to a card with a pencil inscription stating its history and stored in a leather wallet. The oval lens spectacles were believed to date to the early 19th century and were accompanied by an 1829 letter describing their provenance, along with a card from Mrs. Allan McLane Hamilton that also documented the authenticity. The lot carried a presale estimate of \$800 to

\$1,200, but aggressive bidding pushed the realized price to an impressive \$26,250.

A framed lock of Alexander Hamilton’s hair sold with two pairs of colorless glass salts, two enamel twist wine glasses, and an early reproduction of an Alexander Hamilton letter, which was a photostat of the letter that was written just prior to Hamilton’s duel with Aaron Burr. The large lock of hair came with a note identifying it as such by Philip Hamilton. The entire lot was derived from family descent to the consignor and brought \$21,250, crushing the presale estimate of \$300 to \$500.

Another Hamilton artifact was a mahogany tea box with brass hardware fittings that was presented to Captain Alexander Hamilton by Rufus King in 1791 in gratitude for his efforts as Captain in the New York Artillery in the defense of White Plains in the summer of 1776. The top had an engraved brass plate that read “Capt/ Hamilton” and the box opened to a compartmented interior with three fitted additional removable mahogany boxes. The piece passed from Alexander Hamilton’s

Great U.S. 50 Yard Sale had some guessing this year

For 22 years, the “Great U.S. 50 Yard Sale” has been part of the ranks of regional yard sales like the World’s Longest Yard Sale, the Lincoln Buyway, and the National Road Yard Sale. The popular shopping jaunts follow historic roads like Route 50, typically spanning hundreds of miles and often multiple states. Like its namesake highway, the sale now runs coast to coast. Its growth has precipitated a need for direction.

U.S. Highway 50 was created in 1926. Expansion to California and the Maryland shore in the 1940s made it one of the longest roads in the nation. Today, Route 50 stretches more than 3,000 miles through 12 states, the nation’s capital, and four state capitals. Much of it harkens back to an earlier time, brimming with small-town squares, vintage roadside architecture, and the beautiful open road. In the desert southwest, the landscape is so empty that Life Magazine nicknamed it “The Loneliest Road in America.”

The Route 50 Yard Sale was born in 2000 along a segment in southern Indiana. Recognizing the success of other regional sales along historic highways, retired school administrator Tom Taylor proposed to his town council the idea of a yard sale along Route 50 as a way of boosting local tourism.

Despite those local beginnings, the sale

attracted attention across Indiana and in other states where route 50 passes. It quickly evolved into an annual, national event. Participation varies but West Virginia, Ohio, Illinois, Kansas, Colorado, and Nevada seem to regularly take part.

Yet, inconsistent turnout — either by shoppers or sellers — can be problematic.

That was the case this year. Unlike post-Covid 2021, with people’s pent-up desire to get out, this year’s sale fell short. In some

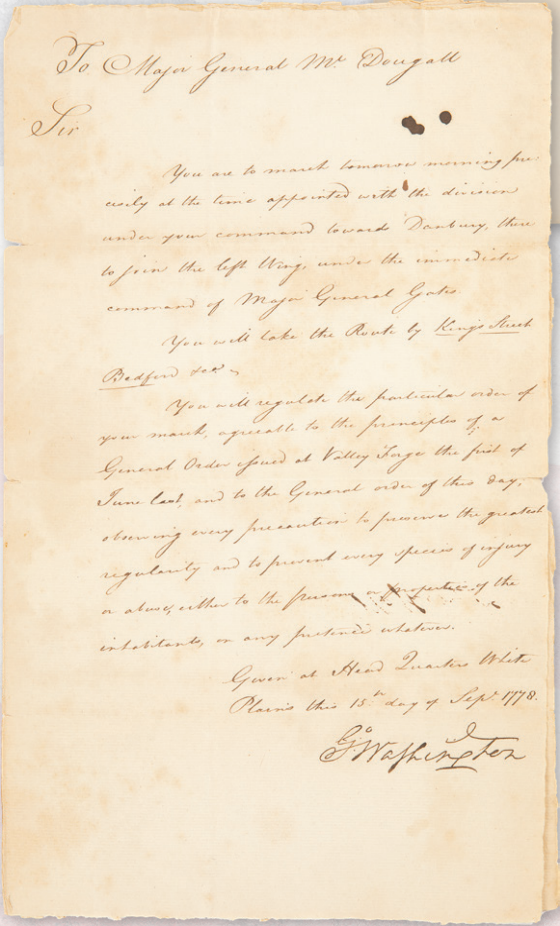

widow, Elizabeth, to N.R. Allen in 1806 and sold for \$8,125, surpassing the estimate of \$1,000 to \$1,500.

18th century items of special interest attracted serious bidders. A standout piece among them was a 27 inch tall doll from England, with a gown and stays, which was dated to the mid-18th century. The figure had a carved and painted head with blue glass eyes and a wig, as well as jointed arms and legs. She was dressed in a silk gown with floral trim, a quilted petticoat, linen and cotton underclothes, and a linen and silk set of stays with baleen boning. The lot included a framed 18th century letter regarding the doll and carried a presale estimate of \$3,000 to \$5,000, but went well beyond to command a staggering \$40,625. Fletcher noted this lot was his personal favorite. "It was an incredibly cool object, a rare thing that was expensive in its day, and for it to have survived so long in quite nice condition with all the clothing and undergarments in tack is astonishing."

18th century furniture items were topped by a Chippendale mahogany bombe chest of drawers, Boston or Salem, circa 1760-1780. It had a molded top with inverted corners on a beaded case of four graduated drawers. The drawer fronts aligned with the curved sides that had exposed dovetails, and all stood on ogee bracket feet that were centered by a drop-pendant on the skirt. The chest was the property of Historic New England and brought \$43,750.

A Queen Anne maple carved chest on chest, attributed to Major John Dunlap, Bedford, New Hampshire, late 18th century,

ry, sold for \$31,250. The piece had elaborate accent carvings with cresting that had cut-out scrolls and a carved central fan flanked by reticulated basket-weave panels. It also had fans at the corners and reticulated carvings repeated on the sides. The seven drawer over five drawer piece had a deep fan-carved drawer at the bottom, flanked by two additional drawers, all mounted above a scroll and fan-carved skirt that stood on cabriole legs ending in pad feet.

Works by skilled artisans of the day were well represented. The sum of \$37,500 was realized for a patriotic sand picture depicting a ship and an eagle by Andrew Clemens. The multicolored sand was arranged as an ocean scene in a 5 ¼ inch tall glass bottle, with one side depicting an unnamed hermaphrodite brig with a black hull and another ship approaching in the distance. The opposite side showed an eagle and

an American flag. Both images were surrounded with polychrome wavy lines and abstract and geometric motifs. Andrew Clemens (circa 1857 – 1894) worked in McGregor, Iowa, as a celebrated sand painting artist who collected naturally colored grains of sand from an area in Pikes Peak State Park known as Pictured Rocks.

A late 18th century carved and gilded figural eagle by Samuel McIntire, (1757 – 1811) Salem, Massachusetts, exceeded the high estimate to sell for \$21,250. The 10 inch high sculptural spread wing eagle had a finely carved body with feather details and was perched atop a ball.

An American mid-19th century sheet copper and lead weathervane, created in the form of a locomotive, brought \$18,750, against an estimate of \$3,000 to \$5,000. The work had intricate piercings throughout, a lead covered smokestack, a cutout copper lantern, a whistle, and a bell on the top.

places, both vendors and shoppers questioned whether the sale was taking place. In one 70-mile stretch between Athens, Ohio, and Parkersburg, W.Va., fewer than ten sales were spotted.

No doubt, lack of promotion contributed to this year's situation. The central source of information on the sale — the Route50.com website — had not been updated since May of 2019. A handful of local organizations like the Ross-Chillicothe, Ohio visitors bureau and the Cañon City, Colorado Chamber of Commerce had information on their websites; yet, even many of them used boilerplate text that originated in Indiana in 2019.

Social media promotion was also scanty. What appeared to be the sales' national Facebook page was actually for Hillsboro, Ohio. The only other Facebook page was run by a family in Brownstown, Indiana, who was renting vendor spaces. Nationwide, there were only five Facebook event listings. One was for a church in New Hope, Indiana that was also renting vendor spaces. Mainly, there were stray 2020 and 2021 listings that had would-be participants scratching their heads as to the status of this year's sale.

Route 50's physical nature is also a contributing factor. Unlike the roadways of

other regional yard sales, Route 50 is not always a leisurely two-lane. In many places, it's a four-lane divided highway. That means sales aren't roadside but rather in nearby towns or down side roads. Roadway signs aren't always practical and drivers can't always spot them at highway speed. Without an outside source of information, shoppers are left guessing where they should head.

Furthermore, Route 50 originated in the auto age. That means towns can be as much as 25 miles or more apart. Record gas prices may have curtailed shoppers' willingness to blindly travel in the hopes of hitting a cluster of sales. In contrast, many

other regional sales are on pre-auto routes like the National Road where towns sit about every 8-10 miles. Closer proximity fosters a greater "bang for the buck" as far as gas is concerned.

There are, of course, portions of U.S. 50 very conducive to leisurely shopping. However, the route is so varied and extensive that both sellers and shoppers need something better than the current hit-or-miss coordination and publicity. Since sellers are ultimately responsible for handling their sales and finding sales is, at best, guesswork for buyers, there is an obvious need for more readily available information.

More extensive exposure will ensure the sale is "on the map" each year. Whether it's local reporting or information aggregated into a national source, participants would have a place to research when and where things are taking place. That will help ensure the Great U.S. 50 Yard Sale retains its spot among the top regional yard sales in the country.

Mud figures have a long history of production in China

Chinese mudmen, mud people, mud-ware or simply mud figurines have a history dating back 1,400 years. During the Tang Dynasty (618-907 AD) Chinese artists were creating miniature landscapes using Bonsai trees and mud figures. This practice was called Pen’Jing – or Chinese landscape bonsai. Over time, the demand for the figures waned and production would fluctuate until the late Victorian times when a fascination for the Orient spread among collectors. This led to the creation of mud figures for export.

Made by hand, the figures were created in various villages. The location of the village largely determined the color of the clay “mud.” A village in a low-lying valley of China would typically use the darker local clay, whereas a village in a higher region with less silt may have a much lighter colored clay available. In fact, clay colors can range from dark brown to gray, to peachy, to even an almost white shade.

Often the residents of a village would work in their rice fields until the end of the season and then switch to mud figure production to support the local economy until rice season resumed. Typically, villagers would press the clay into molds, with each piece being molded separately then assembled afterward. Heads, hands and feet were added to torsos, then hair, hats, beards and other accessories were applied. The eyes, noses and sometimes ears were pierced as tiny holes before

the piece was fired. Clothing and other items were then painted with a low temperature glass glaze. The skin areas such as the face, hands and feet were left unpainted to represent flesh tones and texture. The most common colors for paint were cerulean blue, celadon green and mustard yellow. Brown and red are not uncommon and white is frequently seen on beards and other accent features. Most figures have a hole in the bottom where the artist held the figure

while shaping it, but this is not always the case. It really depended on the artist and the pose.

The human figures can be found in a variety of types and poses such as men standing, sitting, fishing, holding scrolls or pots, BUT – the real challenge is finding a female figure. Apparently not many were made and collectors are eager to come across them. In addition to people,

mud figures can also include small buildings and a variety of animals. In the animal category, mud ducks appear to be the most common but there are several other animals available.

Older mud figures can sometimes be dated by their marks. Not all pieces are marked, but after 1930 all imports in the U.S. were required to be marked with the country of origin. Some made for export before 1930 were marked anyway. If so, the mark for figures made from 1890-1919 will likely be just "China." Items from 1920-1944 can say "Made in China" or "Made in Hong Kong." These marks are usually on the bottom or possibly up inside the hole, if there is one. Modern pieces may be marked "China" as well, so this can make it difficult for an inexperienced collector to tell the difference. It is possible that a piece that is not marked at all could have been created in China but not intended for export, thus not required to have a mark. Another possibility is that it is a newer piece that had a paper label that is now missing.

In the 1950s China began a new era of mud figure production resulting in mass production techniques. These new figures are still being made and sold to tourists or exported for retail sale. Older, handmade figures will usually have a more primitive look while newer ones often have more colors and may have a molded look to their faces. Determining old from new is not an exact science, though. Before you spend a lot on what you think is an old mud figure you need to educate yourself on recognizing them or buy from a trusted dealer.

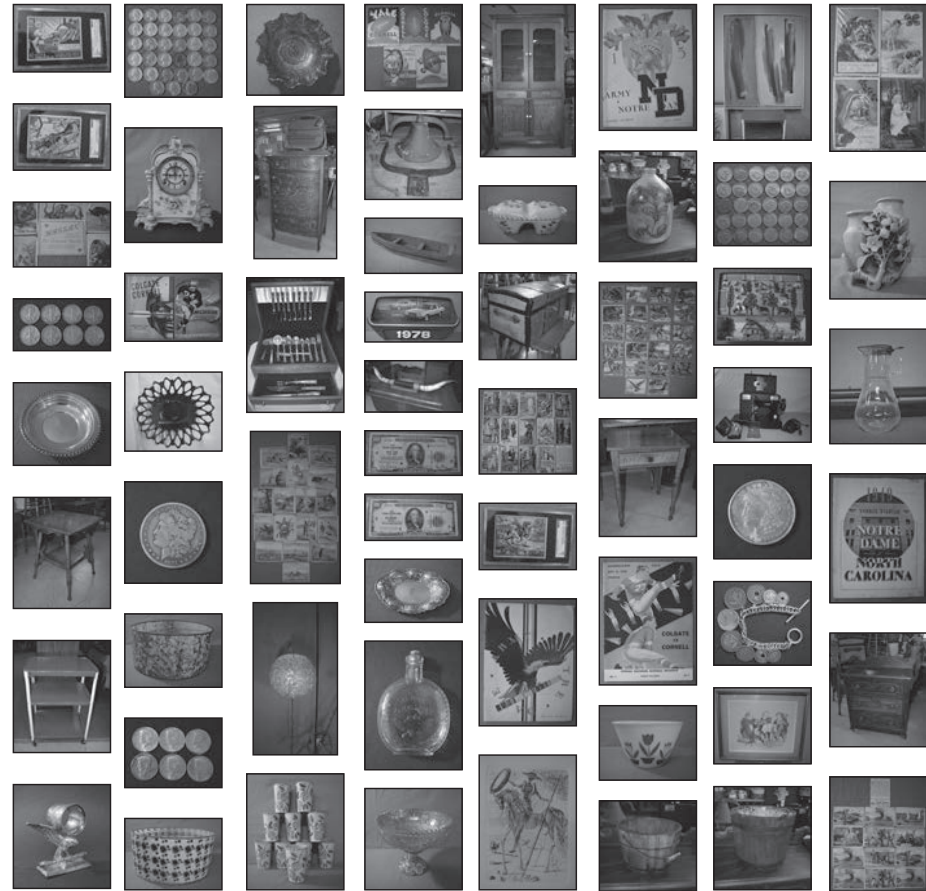

New exhibit at Fraunces Tavern takes visitors back in time

New York, N.Y. — While Fraunces Tavern in New York City is one of the 18th-century's best-known taverns and the site of General George Washington's famous farewell to his officers at the end of the American Revolution, it is less known that in the late 1700s, the site at 54 Pearl Street in lower Manhattan was also home to the nation's first executive governmental building that housed three offices of the Confederation Congress. Although Congress met in City Hall, the space was too small for the government's departments and other office space had to be leased. In 1785, the Department of Foreign Affairs, Department of War and offices of the Board of Treasury leased space at the Tavern and remained tenants there until 1788. Thanks to an extraordinary document — a cashbook that detailed the purchases for the Department of Foreign Affairs during its time at the Tavern that is now housed at the National Archives — the Department's office will be recreated in a new permanent exhibition, *Governing the Nation from Fraunces Tavern*, set to open on June 22. Featuring approximately 60 objects, most of which are authentic to the period and many of which have never before been on public display, including tables, chairs, desks, maps, newspapers and other items, visitors will have the opportunity to travel back to post-colonial New York City and enter the Department of Foreign Affairs office as it appeared during a fascinating period in the nation's history when John Jay was the first Secretary of Foreign Affairs. Visitors will learn about the diplomatic, military and financial challenges that all three departments faced after the Revolutionary War and how those challenges affected the formation of the U.S. Constitution.

"We are in the unique position of having access to a rare, surviving cashbook from the Department of Foreign Affairs," said Craig Hamilton Weaver, co-chairman of the Museum and Art Committee at Fraunces Tavern Museum. "We diligently researched each object in the cashbook and acquired authentic items to create an accurate setting that allows the visitor to step back into history. This is indeed a magnificent gift to the nation."

After an exhaustive search to locate objects that would have been found in the original office, visitors will not only see an extraordinary assemblage of fine American

and British decorative arts, many pieces of which have been donated from private collections, but they will also gain insights into an often-overlooked period in American history. Objects such as *A New and Accurate Map of East and West Florida Drawn from the best Authorities*, a circa 1700s map engraved by J. Procter, London, highlighting Spanish-controlled West Florida; a rare copy of the French-language newspaper *Courier de L'Europe* published in London on September 29, 1786, reporting on America's diplomatic activities with Prussia and Spain; and an array of directional and mapping compasses will help to illustrate the Department's first two pressing matters. The Barbary Pirate Crisis, which led to the 1787 diplomatic treaty with Morocco to end pirate seizures of American vessels in the Mediterranean Sea, and negotiations with Spain regarding control of the Mississippi River will be examined in the exhibition to offer visitors insights into what it took to form a new government as well as a deep appreciation for those individuals who rose to the challenge to do so.

"We want visitors to have an immersive experience," said Scott Dwyer, director of Fraunces Tavern Museum. "The exhibition room was designed and will be arranged to give the sense that John Jay, his under secretary, diplomats, translators, clerks and messengers might enter and resume work at any moment."

Additionally, the office's furnishings will illuminate the socioeconomic stratification of the staff who worked in the room. From Henry Remsen, Jr., Jay's undersecretary for foreign affairs, to the two clerks, a part-time French translator and a messenger, the hierarchy of those employed there will be clearly seen through the caliber of each staffer's work space in his desk, chair and even

desk set; the seniority of the employee's position correlated to the finery of his work area and accoutrements. For example, Under Secretary Remsen's desk has a full writing set made of late 18th-century fused Sheffield plate while the clerk's desk has a pewter inkstand and the messenger's station has a simple stoneware inkwell. The under secretary's desk also features examples of Chinese porcelain that would have come to New York aboard the *Empress of China*, the first American ship to trade with China. The ship returned to New York Harbor and distributed its cargo for local merchants the same year the Department of Foreign Affairs office opened at Fraunces Tavern. Aboard was Samuel Shaw, who would become America's first Consul to Canton (now Guangzhou), China.

Assembling as many New York- or mid-Atlantic-made furnishings as possible to be seen in *Governing the Nation from Fraunces Tavern* was another goal in organizing the exhibition to ensure that the room would be authentic to what would likely have been in the original space. One example to be seen at the messenger's station is a circa 18th-century, brace-back Windsor chair made by Walter MacBride, who worked at 63 Pearl Street in the vicinity of the Tavern. Another such object is a circa 1770-1785, mahogany tilt-top tea table, which was likely made in the vicinity of lower Manhattan where many furniture makers were known to have worked at the time. The table features details characteristic of New York style, such as a flat top (rather than the dish top that was popular in other regions), a vase-form pedestal with a cup and square, webbed feet, all of which are typical of New York-made furniture. Although made later than the time period for the office (circa early 19th century), a pair of brass andirons with the rare mark of New York City craftsman David Phillips is included in the exhibition to exemplify other common, locally produced objects during that period. Phillips may have been working earlier as an apprentice near the neighboring South Street Seaport. In a small yet authentic homage to the important document that guided the reconstruction of the office, a leather-bound account book with entries dating from 1765 at the Garret Abel Company of South Street in lower Manhattan, will be seen placed on the clerk's desk, representing the Foreign Affairs cashbook that informed the object selection for the exhibition. In addition, a facsimile of a page from the actual Foreign Affairs cashbook from 1785 will hang on the wall near the visitor area.

Other featured objects in the exhibition include the negotiation table, made in New York of mahogany and pine in the Chippendale style, c. 1780. The table has carved knees and claw-and-ball legs and is composed of three heavy, solid boards. The strongly carved, original legs have fully developed shells and robust feet. Placed centrally in the room, this is where much of the official business would have been conducted, maps examined and debate likely to have occurred. Another highlight of *Governing the Nation from Fraunces Tavern* will be found hanging above the clerk's desk: British engineer Bernard Ratzer's engraved map, *Plan of the City of New York in North America*, published in 1776 by Jeffreys & Faden, London, commonly referred to as "the Ratzer map." One of the best depictions of the city before the Revolutionary War, it was originally issued in 1770 and was heavily influenced by a 1767 map of New York by British engineer John Montresor. The map offers a bird's-eye view of lower Manhattan Island, eastern New Jersey and western Brooklyn and includes the city's important landmarks, many of which are listed in the legend or key. Additionally, an excellent example of a late-18th-century book press with the rare feature of a built-in drawer will also be seen in the office. Such pieces of equipment were used to copy the multitude of correspondence and documents generated by the office.

Antique Tools

FROM FRONT PAGE

According to those at the Mid-West Tool Collector’s Association (MWTCA), there are a variety of ways people collector tools. Many key in on a specific company or maker. Still others prefer to concentrate on a specific type of hand tool, such as hammers, braces, axes, planes, saws, drills, clamps and more. And then there are those who collector tools from a special period, such as tools from 1850-1900, or post-World War II era tools.

The MWTCA has members who only collect tools from a specific place (England, Scotland, Massachusetts, for example), a specific occupation (carpenter, machinist, watchmaker, for example), though most concentrate on just one specific type of hand tool.

Vintage tool collectors everywhere will agree that wood planes were, and still are, one of the most popular collectible hand tool around. Dear to Blakeman is his five, tiny “Little Victor” block planes from the 1870s, a Stanley Baily No. 4 plane from Canada and several J. Burke 14-inch, early wood planes with wooden screw adjustments.

“Until planes were mass produced, many carpenters made their planes themselves, bought blades from blacksmiths, and carved decorations or initials into the plane. These are especially valuable,” Blakeman said.

Planes of value, Blakeman says, are those that have Brazilian rosewood, beech or birch used on the plane’s tote and know, metal surfaces made of brass and nickel, the name and town of the plane maker on the front of the plane and even antique wood planes made by the Stanley Company.

“Though they’re a bit awkward to collect and store, hand saws are luring more and more collectors,” Blakeman says. “There are numerous styles of vintage saws that may be of interest to collectors, one being Disston saws. You can tell a Disston saw by the stamped name on the spine and a gold medallion on the handle bearing a small insignia. Saws made by Simonds and Atkins bring top dollar as well. Look for handles made from apple or beech. Apple wood was reserved for higher quality saws. If you purchase one of these make sure the blades are rust free and straight. A unique type of saw to collect is the keyhole saw. These can be hard to find.”

Hand drills (non-electric) have a huge following among collectors, as they come in many different shapes, styles and varieties. Many are rare these days and the type of materials that were used on them make them alluring. Of special interest to collectors are hand drills with hollow wooden handles made to hold the bits, drills made entirely out of wood with ivory used on the ends of the bit, long tools that have a brace with an auger or twisted bit, drills with precious metal or ivory inlays, or drills with the manufacturer stamp so that the drill can be dates.

Go to any collector gathering and you’ll notice levels are prominent at many tables. There are two types of antique levels of interest to collectors of antique tools. The first is an inclinometer, which, as its name implies, measures a slope’s degree of incline, which is read via the tools’ circular protractor. Some 19th-century American inclinometer manufacturers only made the device, which customers would then mount in rosewood, cherry and other woods of varying lengths as they saw fit. Most, though, sold their inclinometers in cast-iron or wooden frames. Hard woods with brass accents were the rule. One of the companies most highly regarded for its inclinometers was Davis Level & Tool Co.

The second type of collectible level is the spirit level, which most of us know today as the bubble level. Originally, the liquid in the level’s vial was filled with spirits, which is how the device got its name. The name Davis is associated with levels, as are brands such as Stanley, Miller Farms and Stratton Brothers.

Wrenches and adjustable wrenches haven’t changed in function much over the years, but they style of some older wrench-

es can make them very valuable to collectors.

“You want to look out for those wrenches that have rare cutout designs on the handle, adjustable wrenches that have wooden handles or those that include multiple wrench heads on one handle,” Blakeman said. “The latter is a precursor to the adjustable wrench.”

Plumb box are nothing more than a weight that is suspended from a line. It hangs absolutely true, so that it was always possible for workmen to find a true vertical. Antique plumb bobs often were shaped like common staples such as pears, carrots or turnips. Plump bobs that are of special interest to collectors include those crafted out of brass or inlaid with ivory or stones, and those crafted out of exotic woods. Some older bobs include intricate designs, and those are of interest to most collectors.

Clamps are a hot item as well. Stores today sell clamps, but they’re made of metal. Clamps of days gone by were wooden. Vintage clamps come in a wide variety, including those used for sewing (called “birds”) that included a pincushion right on top of the clamp, vice clamps, blacksmith bench clamps, jeweler clamps, picture farming vises and others.

Before the measuring tape, rulers were extremely important to carpenters and builders. These long rules frequently were made to fold in on themselves and store in unique ways that make them collectible. Some to keep a watchful eye out for include Stanley’s zig-zag rule that folds in 15 places, rulers that combined other tools such as compasses, levels or squares, and cruising sticks with a brass tab at one end.

While the use of hammers hasn’t changed much over the years, the material and shape of the hammers has. There are many rare, unique and collectible types of hammers out there. Some to keep an eye out for include hammers made of different materials like copper, lead, brass and wood. Three-piece hammers are a novelty and sought after by collectors and these include a handle that comes apart for easier storage. Some vintage hammers had moveable heads and some included a separate tool on the other end.

“Check a current antique tool price

guide, or what online dealers are asking for tools, to get some clue as to fair market value,” Richmond said. “The Fine Tool Journal publishes a useful grading system for old tools. Purchasing from dealers is fine, but buyers should expect to pay more from these reputable antiques dealers as they will give you an accurate assessment to the tool’s condition and value.”
