## Pedal vehicles are driving into collector's hearts

Once considered the ultimate child's riding toy, antique pedal toys are now sought by toy collectors and classic car enthusiasts.

The pedal car holds a unique position in the history of toys. A product of the Industrial Age, it took the idea of the "hobby horse" (which itself saw a transition to pedal power in the late 19th century) to the next level. The earliest recorded pedal-powered vehicle was the "Quadracycle" which was exhibited in 1853 at the "Exhibition of the Industry of All Nations World's Fair" held in New York City, at the time when two-wheeled bicycles became popular.

Pedal vehicles for children first appeared in the late 1880s, right after Karl Benz introduced his three-wheel Patent Motorwagen for adults. By the early 1900s, pedal vehicles were widespread, especially in the United States, England, France and Australia.

One of the first companies to make three-wheel velocipedes for children was Whitney Reed, whose wooden horse pulling a sulky is a classic of the early form. The horse's jointed legs moved when the operator pushed the pedals.

Credit for the idea of a pedal car for children is given to the early automobile. Pedal cars mirror automotive design of the Machine Age and reflect advancements in mass production as applied to toy manufacturing. As artifacts, they have become nearly as popular with collectors as the actual automobiles themselves.

The world-changing impact that the automobile had on western society in the late-19th century inspired toy manufac-

turers to start designing small versions of the most popular automotive models for children to emulate their parents' luxury cruising.

Around 1912, Butler Brothers was making "Juvenile Steel Automobiles," which is how the company described the pedal cars in its catalog. These cars had sheet-steel bodies, open steering systems and bottoms, and double-spoke wheels. Models included the Scorcher, the Wizard, and the Speedwell. The pedal version of the best-selling Ford Model T was especially popular among kids, and is highly prized today.

At the onset, pedal cars were most accessible to wealthy children, reaching their peak popularity in the late 1920s and early 1930s. The post-war period marked a resurgence in interest pedal cars. The growing economic prosperity of American families meant that they could afford these now-cheaper toys. Mail-order catalogs like Sears and Montgomery Ward helped to promote them to middle class America. Pedal cars were being produce overseas as well. The Bon Marche in Paris had been selling pedal cars designed after Grand Prix Peugeots. After the war, French toy maker Eureka continued this trend, making pedal cars fashioned after Peugeots, as well as Renaults and the Citroen Rosalie.

with a e d Cyclops pedal car from 1953. Though based in Australia, many of Cyclops' pedal car designs were based on U.S. models and manufacturers, from Buick and Chevrolet, to Pontiac and Packard. In the 1940s, Steelcraft of Ohio made GMC pedal trucks, as well as Mack dump trucks, Model T Roadsters, Dodge Runabouts, and a Chrysler Roadster, which had bullet-shaped headlights and rubber tires. Steelcraft's Chrysler was 50 inches long and costs \$31.50. The early pedal cars were not cheaply made. In fact, they were often as lavishly detailed as the real things. The steel was

# Vintage baby planters are the perfect gift

Expectant mothers these days usually set up a baby registry at department stores and online businesses. The registry includes all of the things they think they will need when the little one arrives. Often, the registry wish list also includes nursery décor in typical "baby" colors of pink, blue, yellow and green. It's great to get the mom-to-be the things she desires for her little one but why not also give her something unexpected and quite useful? A vintage baby planter fits the bill perfectly. And it won't break your pocketbook either.

Baby planters come in a multitude of shapes and designs. Some are baby-related items such as booties, rattles, alphabet blocks and bottles. Some feature figures of babies themselves. Frequently animals are used, including the ubiquitous stork, famed for "delivering" babies to expectant parents. Also, characters

Some baby planters were made as early as the 1930s, but most of the ceramic versions we come across in antique stores and thrift shops date from the 1950s-1980s. Some are still made today but it's hard to compete with the cuteness factor of the vintage ones. You would struggle to find anything

## Step right up and bid on the circus ladies and gentleman

SARASOTA, Fla. - There were no tightrope acts nor daring young men on flying trapezes. No clowns crammed into a tiny car, nor, for that matter, any brassy bands stirring up the crowd. But there was plenty of excitement at the August 6 "three-ring circus" auction, conducted by the Freedom Auction Company. And the "superstar" of the sale, according to Brian Hollifield, was a one-sheet poster that proclaimed Annie Oakley the "peerless wind and rifle shot." Sold early in the day, it made just under \$100,000, at \$96,875. (Note: Prices cited here include the 25 percent buyer's premium).

Indeed, the sale was characterized by spirited - and prolonged - bidding from buyers, be they in-house, online, or on the phone. Beginning at 11 a.m. at his Sarasota-based auction house, Hollifield, the sole auctioneer (ringmaster?) worked his way through 725 lots, "moving at a snail's pace," due to the large number of bids. Eighty percent of the 725 lots sold were purchased by online bidders, who also accounted for 90 percent of the total sales in dollars. By 9:30 p.m., nearly a half-mil-



names," Hollifield said after the sale, although serious collectors want to own something that no one else has. "It balances out." Among the standout posters sold were a 1930s Russell Bros. Circus featuring "the greatest acrobat wonders ever exhibited" (\$5,625); a 1930s Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey poster depicting Pallenberg's Wonder Bears (\$1,375); and a 1930s one-sheet Downie Bros. poster that advertised the "astounding and sensational exhibition of skill and daring that delighted and thrilled Mother and Dad over 40 years ago" (\$1,875). And then there was the "rare and very early banner;" attributed to Nieman Eisman, it depicted a man with a pistol confronting a lion. "Death Defying" indeed, it sold for \$5,937.50.



Among other circus-related curiosities sold were "Uncle Soapy's" oversized clown

to the circus, the Wild West show, and sideshows, had changed hands.

In keeping with the auction's "three ring" theme, circus memorabilia, in the "first ring," made a strong showing. "There's always demand for household

shoes (\$3,750) and Jim Hand's brightly checked clown pants (\$62.50), a collection of circus record albums (\$175) and a crate of "Wisconsin Brand lion food" (\$500), and an antique circus wagon wheel (\$875) and



a Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey elephant tub (\$1,062.50).

Of special interest were approximately 100 lots from the collection of Gordon Turner, a circus historian and retired patent illustrator, who handcrafted detailed 1:12 scale models of circus railroad cars and circus wagons. His model of an advertising car used by Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey from the 1930s to the 1950s sold for \$1,750.

In the "second ring" were more than 60 lots relating to Buffalo Bill's Wild West show, on which there was "strong bidding," according to Hollifield. Other than the aforementioned Annie Oakley poster were a "stunning pictorial" 1908 threesheet poster of Col. W.F. "Buffalo Bill" Cody on horseback (\$35,000); and a "very scarce example" of an 1898 one-sheet poster illustrating an exciting feature of the show, "Virginia Reel on Horseback" (\$12,500).

And in the "third ring" were an eclectic grouping of sideshow objects and assorted curiosities. Among the "multiple" sideshow banners sold was a "rare" 1940s banner, painted and signed by Nieman Eisman, featuring Leroy, a sword swallower who also swallowed neon bulbs (\$4,687.50); a terracotta head of an "iconic" Coney Island funny face, pried from the wall of the amusement complex in 1966 (\$6,562.50); and a Wurlitzer style military band organ, completely functional ("sounds great") and sold with 50 music rolls (\$6,562.50).

A number of cabinet cards changed hands, and one in particular caught the auctioneer's eve: an 1880s card picturing "Captain Costentenus," the tattooed "Greek Albanian." Of the card, with bril-



liant color and some creasing, Hollifield said, "It was nice to see it do well" at \$1,625. A collection of 10 photo prints of body-building icon Charles Atlas, dating from the 1930s, some signed, made \$500. Finally, a 10-legged tarantula, encased in acrylic (\$87.50) and a two-headed chicken taxidermy (\$468.75) were also sold.

Hollifield, who, with his wife Kisha, owns the Freedom Auction Company, noted that circus sales are one of their specialties. "They're always fun." And some are more affordable than others. Hollifield conceded that not everyone who buys circus memorabilia is a dedicated collector. "Doctors, lawyers, people who have offices" often purchase posters because of their great graphics, as do interior designers. And although there were some lots that went for less than \$100 in the August 6 sale, "there were precious few."

To that end, Freedom Auction Company is planning a circus poster auction for sometime this fall, "for the budget minded." Many lots will provide an entry into the collecting field, as well as satisfy the needs of others, with the starting bid on many lots beginning at \$10 and, as Hollifield predicted, "going up to \$200. But you never know. After all, it is an auction."

## Old Masters will go toe to toe with Modern works at Nye auction

BLOOMFIELD, N.J. - Nye & Company Auctioneers' online Chic and Antique Estate Treasures auction on Wednesday and Thursday, September 7th and 8th, features nearly 750 lots, a carefully curated mix of fine and decorative arts spanning from the 16th century to present day, including an exceptional group of Old Masters paintings and a terrific selection of modern and contemporary art and sculpture from the David and Laura Finn family collection.

The Old Master paintings primarily range from the 16th-19th centuries. Highlights include an en grisaille oil on panel portrait of a gentleman attributed to Anthony van Dyck (Belgian, 1599-1641), and a portrait of Isabella of Savoy attributed to Frans Pourbus II (French, 1569-1622). There is also work on paper version of Summer: Peasants Going to Market attributed to Peter Paul Rubens (Flemish, 1577-1640).

For those who prefer more contemporary and modern works, there is a conte crayon and watercolor on paper titled Cicada Pines in August by Charles Burchfield; an Andy Warhol silkscreen of baseball player Pete Rose, signed by both Warhol and Rose; a Maxfield Parrish gouache on paper, study for advertising art and three Childe Hassam watercolors.

William Scott, the celebrated UK artist, has one of his charcoal on paper abstract drawings in the sale. Pablo Picasso is represented with a large-scale goat's head in profile Madoura ceramic charger. The selftaught/outsider artist Purvis Young is also represented with a selection of works being deaccessioned from the NAMITS Collection.

There are several pieces from the David and Laura Finn family collection. David, a well-known photographer, forged relationships along with his wife with many of the artists that they collected. by's in May 2017 and more recently, a curated selection at Christie's, London in June 2022. Both performed extremely well.

The pieces being included in this sale were not previously offered and highlights include a charcoal drawing of Justice by the celebrated artist Henry Moore. There are also numerous Moore lithographs and etchings signed by the artist. The sculptor Fletcher Benton is well represented with several pieces of various sizes of his bold geometric sculptures. Gaston Lachaise and Max Kalish also have works included in the auction. Etchings and lithographs by artist such as Henri Matisse, Anders Zorn and James McNeil Whistler are aplenty.

Decorative arts also make up a strong component of the auction. Similar to the fine arts, the furniture and objets d'art range from works created in the 18th century through the 21st century. There is a heavy emphasis on the Art Nouveau and Arts and Crafts periods.

Of particular note is a carved and ormolu mounted buffet attributed to Louis Majorelle (French, 1859-1926). This highly stylized and floral carved piece has a delightfully naturalistic feel. There are also several French Art Nouveau wardrobes, Below: Gouache on paper by Maxfield Parrish (1870-1966), Untitled (Figures in a Landscape with Peacock).

beds and side cabinets, all of which exhibit the characteristics and hallmarks of Majorelle's genius and designs.

There is also a nice selection of Arts & Crafts furniture by Stickley. Rectilinear in design, this oak furniture includes dining chairs, rockers, armchairs, desks and more. Complementing the furniture is a lovely group of Arts & Crafts pottery by factories such as Roseville, Van Briggle, Weller and Grueby.

Also being offered is an exceptional timepiece - a long case clock by William Hislop, who was one of the founding members and first chairman of the British Horological Institute. The piece has a highly complex movement that will be sure to intrigue collectors and institutions alike.





## Lincoln Buy-Way offers shopping and a taste of history

This year's regional yard sale season is starting to wind down. Shoppers anxiously awaited one of the last events - the annual Lincoln Buy-Way - which took place August 11-13.

The sale originated along Ohio's portion of the Lincoln Highway but is now an 800-mile affair that includes stretches of Pennsylvania, West Virginia, Indiana, Illinois, and Iowa. The popular event attracts visitors from across the country and even worldwide to treasure hunt and experience a slice of Americana.

The Lincoln Highway is one of the nation's most historically significant roads. In 1913, Carl Fisher, an early developer of automobile headlamps, and Henry Joy, the president of Packard Motor Company pushed for a network of good, paved roads for the growing number of automobiles. Their efforts led to a 3,000-mile coast-tocoast road running from New York to San Francisco, named in memory of President Lincoln.

The Lincoln Highway became the country's first paved transcontinental road and passed through so many communities it was nicknamed the "Main Street of America." In the 1920s, when the federal government adopted the system of numbered US highways, the route was realigned and re-designated as U.S. Route 30. Today, the Lincoln Highway is getting almost as much attention as the famed Route 66, particularly among international travelers.

Credit for some of that revival belongs to the Ohio Lincoln Highway Heritage Corridor which launched the Buy-Way sale in 2005. The idea was to promote the historic road by getting people to drive it. That first year, around 250 sellers participated. In the following years, participation quickly grew and it wasn't long before other states along the road jumped on board. Today, thousands of sellers set up across the five participating states.

Traversing the sale can be a bit challenging because the Lincoln Highway doesn't follow a single road. While the Lincoln Highway is often allied with US Route 30, its actual path often follows what are now state and local roads.


Starting outside Philadelphia and heading west, the Lincoln is US-30, passing through small towns like Lancaster and Gettysburg. While US-30 continues across Pennsylvania and the short chunk of West Virginia, two older alignments (roughly traveling Pennsylvania routes 65 and 51) provide alternative routes.

Things are more complex in Ohio be-

cause, through much of the state, US-30 is a four-lane highway that serves as a bypass. The Lincoln Highway is found on stretches designated as "Old Lincoln Highway," "Old Route 30," and a handful of state and county roads.

In Indiana, the original 1914-era alignment runs on US-33, US-20, and Indiana-2. There is also the 920s alignment along US-30. Shoppers can travel either path until they reach the outskirts of Chicago

The Lincoln Highway's path through Chicago is along US-30. It then heads west as Illinois-38. By the time the route hits Iowa, it's back to US-30.

If that all sounds confusing, the Lincoln Highway Association (lincolnhighwayassoc.org) has extensive maps to help route the trip. In addition, state organizations like Ohio's Lincoln Highway Heritage Corridor (historicbyway.com) and the Indiana Lincoln Highway Association (indianalincolnhighway.org), offer everything from websites and Facebook groups to printed brochures to guide travelers.

In every state, this year's Lincoln Buyway appeared a stellar success. Shoppers and sellers were out in droves, undoubtedly taking advantage of the overall good weather and a welcome dip in gas prices. Here is just a sampling of what was available in north-central Ohio on the first day: At the fairgrounds in the small city of Wooster, about 50 vendors were camped out. One, rife with antiques and primitives, had two good-condition antique steamer trunks priced at just \$20 and \$30. In a nearby booth of mainly vintage wares was a 1960s Deputy Dawg cartoon TV tray for \$20.

to shop among Amish and Mennonites and hear only German spoken. Many were also holding their own sales. One family who referred to themselves as "Pennsylvania Dutch" had a trailer filled with dozens of bins of merchandise. Among their offerings were several lamps, including a pair of mid-century table lamps for \$35.

Three families stationed in front of a mini-storage complex had tables of vintage clothing, smalls, and antique tools. Several tables were designated as \$1, \$3, or \$5 per item. Other pieces were higher. That included a striking hand-built 36" wooden train priced for \$75. For the bachelor pad was an 80s framed Playboy picture available for \$15.

Miles down the road in another parking lot, among modern second-hand furniture, was an Art Deco chifferobe with a built-in secretary for \$100. Directly across the road sat another Deco piece - a threepiece maple curving bookshelf for \$125.

You never know what you will spot One couple had a trailer full of reclaimed post and beam barn wood, great for a home renovation. Pieces started at \$10. At a farmhouse were two industrial lockers available for \$30 each. For the classic car enthusiast, an in-town seller had a 1985 daily driver Chevrolet Camaro for \$6,500.

Shopping aside, the Lincoln Highway offers a great road trip, no matter where or when you take it. Not only is there the beautiful American countryside, but there's also everything from the solemnity of the Gettysburg battlefield, to the excitement of Navy Pier in Chicago, and even the opportunity to take a great selfie on the famed Lincoln Highway bridge in Tama, Iowa.


There will be experts on hand to identify artifacts.



## **Pedal Vehicles**

typically enameled to ensure rich colors, while pedals were adjustable to give young drivers a comfortable ride. Like the cars that adults drove, models ranged from economy (Whippet) to luxury (Studebaker). On the better models, steering wheels and other solid parts were custom cast.

Pedal cars varied in design specification. While there were many that were replicas of the full-sized automobile at that time, there was an entire market for pedal fire engines, pedal trucks, pedal planes and pedal tractors.

Lori Verderame, a popular American appraiser of antiques and collectibles, says pedal cars are hotter today more than ever.

"Pedal cars have not only thrilled kids in the past, but they have encouraged collectors and have sparked a restoration movement, too," Verderame said. "Today, American pedal cars are some of the most coveted objects at antique shows, flea markets and yard sales. Even the pedal car parts are desirable and costly on the Internet. Many pedal cars are valued into the thousands of dollars for fine examples.

"Pedal cars enjoyed a major resurgence in the vintage toy and car markets in the mid-2000s, when kids of those days turned 50 years old. Just as they loved full-size automobiles, Americans have a love affair with pedal cars. In the suburbs of America in the 1950s and 1960s, mid-century modern kids used pedal cars for neighborhood mobility."

More than anything other toy out there, the pedal car has sparked memories for those who recall owning or even riding in one.

"The 1950s was a major period of automotive mania," Verderame added. "Kids in pedal cars mimicked their parents during those two decades during the era when the Interstate highway system was establishing 46,000 miles of American roadway. President Eisenhower's \$34 billion law got the asphalt flowing on the union's massive highway project and the system's famous hub and spike design around major cities was designed to assist if Cold War evacuations were deemed necessary and to give suburban commuters easy access to urban workplaces."

In the 1960s, interest in pedal cars began to wane as the burgeoning field of space exploration began to capture the attention of children. New safety standards for children's toys also made them less cost-effective to manufacture. By the 1970s, plastic pedal toys like the Big Wheel had virtually put pedal cars out of business.

"Today, collectors look for all types and

styles of pedal cars by many different makers," Verderame said. "Condition is key to value when it comes to pedal cars and just like adult automobiles, collectors want pedal cars that are close to pristine with complete and original parts as possible. They seek out original enamel paint colors, too."

For a few select toys, the manufacturers play a significant role in pricing, demand and value. As is true for the classic car circuit, pedal car collectors are just as beholden to the different companies that produced these quaint childhood toys and can build entire exhibits around a single manufacturer. Some of the most notable pedal car manufacturers include American National, Steelcraft Wheel Goods, Gendron Iron Wheel Co., Garton Toy Company, Cyclops, Austin J40, Eureka, Toledo Wheel, Butler Bros. and Murray Pedal Cars.

In 2020, RM Sotheby's held a "Pedal Power" auction. There a collection of 53 museum-quality toy pedal cars raised roughly \$150,000.

The star seller of the auction was a 1955 Austin J40 Roadster, which sold for \$9,000. As far as pedal cars go, these are considered high-end, with battery-powered lights and an opening hood that features a simulated engine, complete with a line of spark plugs.

A bidding war ensued when a 1941 Lincoln-Zephyr hit the auction table. Sixty-five bids were submitted before landing at the \$8,700 mark.

Other top sellers included a 1935 Skippy Racer by American National (\$2,000) and a 1935 Chevrolet by Steelcraft (\$2,200). A 1940s Austin Pathfinder sold for a little over \$3,000, a 1977 Oreo Formula 1 Racer fetched \$1,740 and a 1958 Highway Patrol Jeep sold for \$2,880.

Two years ago, Wichita resident Bob Guenthner showcased 45 of his foot-pow-

ered vehicles at the Wichita-Sedgwick County Historical Museum in Kansas. He titled his show "Metal to the Pedal".

"In the 1960s, pedal cars became pretty small, pretty plain and there wasn't really much to like about them except they gave kids something to ride in," Guenthner said. "But as you go back through the years from there, particularly into the 1920s and the 1930s, you see much larger, much fancier cars that copied the features of full size cars, complete with rear view mirrors, horns, speedometers, working

Among those pedal cars in his exhibit was a 1927 American National Alemite Packard 6 believed to be the only one still in original condition, and with its working grease gun; a 1931 Gendron Packard 6-wheel car; and a 1934 American National truck that converts into a dump truck, fire truck, wrecker, delivery truck or army field ambulance.
