Black and white (except on Sunday) and read all over: Although Charles Schulz's contributions to the "funny papers," not to mention the American psyche, were considerable, the comings and goings of a boy named Charlie Brown and his friends (includ-

ing his dog) had humble beginnings. First published 75 years ago in the women's section of a local Minnesota newspaper, "Li'l Folks" led to "Peanuts," which first appeared on October 2, 1950. Some 17,897 strips later, the last new "Peanuts" was published on February 13, 2000, one day after the death of its creator.

Today, the comic strip lives on in reruns under the name "Classic Peanuts," delighting faithful fans and attracting new readers. In light of its enduring (and continuing) popularity, there's little wonder that a vast array of Peanuts-related memorabilia has been produced over the years. Consequently, for many of the comic strip's devotés, amassing a collection featuring Charlie Brown, Snoopy, and the whole gang, is like, well, eating peanuts. As for the direction that two collectors in particular have taken, what else can be said other than "Good grief!"

It wasn't long after the comic strip's first appearance that Peanuts-related items were on the market, noted Caren Pilgrim. Introduced to Peanuts Below: This bank features a cool dog on a hot dog!

duced was a line of polyvinyl figures, first made in 1958 by the Hungerford Plastic Corporation. The original lineup of Charlie Brown, Lucy, Linus, and Snoopy was expanded in 1961 to include Baby Sally, Schroeder, and Pigpen. At this time, the size of the dolls grew from seven or eight inches to nine or ten inches tall. "Tons of them were made." Careful collectors can find them for under \$100 a piece, although because it's accompanied by a separate white piano,

Perambulator Museum contents will offer a wild auction ride

JEFFERSON, Ohio – For more than 35 years, it was a labor of love. Although the end was inevitable, twin sisters Janet L. Pallo and Judy A. Kaminski took some wild drives throughout the country, met a fine bunch of people, indulged their interest inthe arts and – most importantly provided a lot of joy for visitors of this small village in northern Ohio.

The Victorian Perambulator Museum on Cedar Street in Jefferson, once jam-packed with hundreds of antique baby carriages, children's dolls and toys is no more. The sisters didn't want to close the doors on their life's work; but support has waned, the world has gone high-tech and Covid-19 put the final nail in the coffin.

It was "the only museum of its kind in the world," according to the Ashtabula County Visitors Bureau website. Politicians, celebrities and the curious throughout the world visited the museum. The latest, Lady Gaga, toured the museum about two years ago.

"She was very focused on the carriages," Pollo said. "She loved the art. She was very interested."

The sisters opened the museum in 1987, according to Janet Pallo. She and her twin sister were elementary school teachers with a penchant for learning and teaching. They accomplished both, bringing a world-

wide attraction to tiny Jefferson.

For four decades the pair traveled throughout the United States and Canada during weekends and over summer breaks.

"We've been everywhere," Pallo said. "And we kept finding amazing things from the past. Every year, we added something very special to the museum.

The oldest and rarest piece is from 1850 and was commissioned by the Vanderbilt family. Also, on display were carriages once ridden as

children by historical figures such as the recent late Queen Elizabeth and her sister Margaret, Lucille Ball (given by her granddaughter) and one of P.T. Barnum's greatest "finds," General Tom Thumb (pulled by a team of horses).

The collection will be sold by An-

drew Richmond from Ohio Company Antiques in Art, all of them online events. The first is scheduled for Sept. 21, with at least two more auctions following during the next two years. The auction will be con-

Accessorizing the modern bathroom with vintage style

My first reno was of a 1929 bathroom, one that coincided with a number of other unrelated family disasters. I thought I had paid my dues, but then, one move later and due to conditions beyond my control, I once again found myself doing it all over again.

Unlike the first reno project, this one was a bit different, with little chance of incorporating 1920s charm into my smallest room. A clawfoot tub and pedestal sink, subway tile and wainscoting on the walls, and black and white penny rounds on the floor: I love them all, but they were just not possible this time around. So as the dust literally dies down, I'm thinking how to incorporate



vintage style into a 21st century design. The answer: accessorize, accessorize, accessorize.

First, the nono's. I love poodles, but I think it's time we all bid adieu to pink crocheted tissue covers. Ditto plastic needlepointed facial tissue holders, once a staple at every craft show back in the day. Let's face

it, we don't have (or should not have) nostalgic connections to these creations. And now here comes tough love: At this point in time, I'm saying goodbye to

cabinet where no one else will see them. Finally, and I think this goes without saying, fuzzy lid covers have no place in a modern bathroom.

Phew.

So what's left? Well, plenty. Because even without these Bicentennial-era accessories, there are little things, vintage things, that personalize an otherwise impersonal (albeit very personal) space.

Let's begin with the walls. This is the perfect opportunity to inject some color and a bit of personality. There's probably a blank space or two in the bathroom that is just begging for a wall hanging. Bear in mind that this space is not particularly art-friendly, thanks to humidity and uneven lighting. So this is the place to frame and hang inexpensive artwork. A full-page magazine ad, for instance, can be framed and given a place of honor. Extra points if it's an ad for soap or cosmetics. And if you have a free-standing mirror, consider encasing it in a vintage frame.

ducted on LivAuctioneers.

"I've spent the better part of the past two weeks up to my eyeballs in Victorian carriages and dolls," Richmond said. "There is so much material here, and the working space is very tight, so it's been difficult at best. I'm doing my best to make this auction, itself, a work of art. There's just so much good material here."

The phrase "work of art" is a predominant theme when talking with the sisters. Both, of whom are artistically inclined, immediately agreed upon the "artful lines" and workmanship that went into their first perambulator purchase. From then on, they were hooked.

"Each piece is its own work of art," Pallo said. "The first perambulator was made by Cyrus Wakefield. It was made in 1850."

The early perambulators also had a perceptive influence on early automotive devices. "I couldn't believe it, but a lot of our customers were early automotive collectors and mechanics. I finally got to talking with some of these people and they said the early braking system on perambulators influenced early automo-

biles.

"I figured that made sense. The prams were being built, or commissioned by the wealthy, from 1850 on and early automotive innovators had to be looking at them. Also, they were the first vehicle with a seat belt for children."

Pallo and Kaminski made several attempts to keep the collection together, but ultimately to no avail. It became "inevitable," but also "heartbreaking" that the highly unique vestiges from America's late 1800-early 1900 Gilded Age will be dispersed.

"It's been a wonderful journey," Pallo said. "We learned something new every day. We learned so much history and stories from the past. We met great people out there, and you couldn't learn to love these things anymore once you get them ready for display. Each one is truly a work of art."

Gold bar once on Johnny Carson show sells for \$2 million

California Gold Rush artifacts has paid more than \$2 million for a historic 62-pound gold bar recovered from the 1857 sinking of the fabled "Ship of Gold," the S.S. Central America.

The nearly foot-long ingot was nicknamed the "Carson Bar" after latenight television host Johnny Carson carefully picked it up during a 1991 segment of The Tonight Show Starring Johnny Carson, according to the seller of the massive gold bar, Rare Collectibles TV of Los Angeles California.

"The anonymous buyer is a collector who specializes in historically significant, rare United States coins with an emphasis on the California Gold Rush," explained Jack McNamara, co-founder of Rare Collectibles TV.

"This enormous gold ingot is 11 inches long, three and a half inches wide, and a little over two inches high and is one the largest surviving gold bars of the Old West. It's a national treasure that is one of America's most important artifacts of the California Gold Rush," McNamara stated.

Bob Evans, the chief scientist on the Central America discovery and recovery missions brought the huge

LOS ANGELES — A collector of gold bar to a May 10, 1991 on-air interview segment with Carson who was impressed by the retrieved sunken treasure and briefly lifted it.

"Because the ingot weighed over 50 pounds, two NBC-TV stagehands had to carry it onto the set, but during the unrehearsed segment on the air, Carson grabbed it by himself with both hands," Evans recalled. "The King of Late-night wrestled with the King of Gold Bars. As he held the big piece of yellow metal, I watched as concern crossed Johnny's face. Gold, mind you, is around 50% heavier than lead, which is usually regarded as something very heavy. Seated only five or six feet away, I saw Johnny's body grow tense, and the veins bulge in his neck. This became a brief competition between man and mass."

Discovered in 1988 on the seabed about 7,200 feet below the surface of the Atlantic Ocean off the coast of North Carolina, the ingot was made during the California Gold Rush by prominent San Francisco assayers Justh & Hunter. It weighs 754.95 troy ounces (a little over 62 troy pounds) and was valued at the time of its creation a century-and-a-half ago at \$14,045.54.

"The S.S. Central America was carrying about 30,000 pounds of gold bars and gold coins when it sank in a hurricane in September 1857 on a voyage to New York City. The loss of

the gold was detrimental to the U.S. economy and one of the factors that led to the financial Panic of 1857," McNamara explained.

Taking advantage of all that steamy air, give some hardy houseplants the spa treatment, even better if, keeping it white, their home is a collection of milk glass planters.

Moving on. Extra towels (particularly hand towels) are close at hand and attractively displayed when rolled up and stored in an old basket. Reading material might be similarly kept neat. As for linens, what better place than this to display a collection of handwrought linens, both those embroidered by Grandmom as well as kitschy mid-century examples. And if you use disposable guest hand towels, consider placing them on a metal tray or perhaps an old ceramic platter to keep them organized, along with a cube tissue box.

Bar soap can get messy. Keep it neat and attractive by placing it on a vintage piece of ceramics: white ironstone soap dishes did the job for years and are not only practical, but they also go with any decor. Or consider using a saucer or another piece of small dinnerware.

Then there's the matter of tooth-



brushes and toothpaste. Luckily, there's a variety of old glass that can gussy up the space. I would suggest a footed spooner or, if you're lucky like me, a

vintage apothecary jar with printed designs. Ceramic shaving mugs, as well as century-old beer mugs, are also perfect for this task.

Marvel characters duked it out for top bid honors at Heritage

DALLAS, Texas - Four auction records were set in just the first 90 minutes of Heritage Auctions' completely sold-out, \$18,163,271 million Sept. 8-11 Comics & Comic Art Signature® Auction - further proof, as though any were needed, that these pop-culture classics are as coveted and collectible as ever.

The first new record set during the fourday event went to none other than the legendary Steve Ditko: His splash page opening 1964s Amazing Spider-Man No. 18 marked only the third appearance of Green Goblin. It was also the villain's earliest appearance at auction, which explains why this is now the most valuable Ditko page ever sold at auction at \$432,000.

Next came one heck of an auction record: Iron Man's first appearance in Tales of Suspense No. 39 was just a 13-page story, and only eight pages featured Tony Stark wearing the armor. One of the truly iconic Don Heck pages from that historic book realized

The only thing more special than an original Bill Watterson Calvin and Hobbes strip is one with a note to Doonesbury creator Garry Trudeau. A February 1992 daily strip sold for \$216,000 to become the most expensive Calvin and Hobbes sold at auction.

Also, Hulk smash record! The Incredible Hulk No. 181 has always been a fan favorite as it contains the first full appearance of Wolverine. But Thursday morning the CGC 9.8 copy sold during Session One became the most valuable in the world when it sold for \$138,000.

And, finally, it costs a lot more to hire a hero today than it did only a couple of years ago. Marvel's Hero for Hire No. 1, featuring the origin and first appearance of Luke Cage, is among the most beloved Bronze Age titles – but a CGC NM/MT 9.8 example of the 1972 title shattered records when it sold Sept. 8 for \$108,000, the first time it

has crossed the six-figure barrier.

"All five of these pieces exceeded our expectations, and our expectations were high," says Heritage Auctions Vice President Barry Sandoval. "Each of them is a memorable pop-culture trophy in its own right.'

More than 5,200 bidders worldwide participated in this auction, and right out of the gate a bidding war opened the fourday event, as Jim Aparo and Mike DeCarlo's complete 22-page story "A Death in the Family: Chapter 6," which ran in Batman No. 429, opened live bidding at \$23,000 and sold for \$156,000. Shortly after, collectors also fought over Mike Mignola's cover for Batman No. 429, which features one of the greatest images of The Joker ever rendered. This original work sold for \$180,000.

The Caped Crusader not surprisingly proved a smash hit in the auction.

Frank Miller told us earlier this year he loved drawing silhouettes, as it's "the most important language you have." Collectors clearly agreed, as Page 11 from Book 4 of Batman: The Dark Knight Returns, featuring the Batman in silhouette astride a

horse as he leads "The Sons of Batman" into battle, galloped to a new owner for \$228,000. And no matter the grade, Batman No. 1 proved that it remains among the most valuable and coveted issues in comic-book history. The landmark book featuring the first appearances of The Joker and Catwoman, graded CGC VG- 3.5, sold for \$264,000, a record high for that grade.

And speaking of Miller, his historic run on Wolverine with writer Chris Claremont turns 40 this month. To celebrate, an extraordinary page from issue No. 4 sold for \$102,000, making it one of the most valuable Miller originals outside of his work on Dark Knight Returns (or Star Wars).





Folk art cane walks away with a \$4,000 bid at Stony Ridge

LEMOYNE, Ohio— Demonstrating the staying power of traditional antiques, northwest Ohio's Stony Ridge Auction Sept. 1 auction brought in some impressive bids. The 433-lot sale was held live, was open for absentee and phone bids, and simulcast online on LiveAuctioneers.

Getting the most fanfare — and achieving the auction's highest winning bid — was a rare hand-carved folk art walking cane from the Civil War era. The 39 inch long staff featured an American eagle with a federal shield at the top. Below it was carved figures of a black man, a Civil War soldier, a Native American, and a shield painted with 117th NY Infantry. The unique piece sold for \$4,000.

Securing the auction's second highest bid was a historically significant lot of four Western Union emergency telegraphs received from the Titanic after striking the iceberg. The museum-worthy pieces, in fragile condition with chips and tears, reached \$2,800.

American traditional antiques and primitives were a mainstay of this auction, with many pieces commanding impressive winning bids. Taking third place in the auction, with a winning bid of \$1,900, was a 43-inch antique cast iron hitching post in the shape of a gnome. A collection of rare heart-shaped tin and wood maple sugar molds went for \$475. Another rarity, a tiger maple, heart-shaped butter stamp bid to \$450.

Holiday-themed lots were also prevalent in this auction. They included 31 Santa figures and related items. Among them was a 9 ½-inch antique German Belsnickel Santa candy container that sold for \$850. The figure donned a rabbit fur beard and faux fur trimmed cloth and stood upon a mica decorated base. Another Belsnickle Santa reached \$750. The 12-inch 19th-century figure, in overall good condition, wore a crepe paper costume over a stuffed wood body. A papier-mache Santa Claus and sleigh store display reached yet another three-figure bid at \$600.

Other Christmas items sold well including a 6-pound Christmas bell windmill weight that went for \$600. A 5-inch German Schafer & Vater porcelain

Christmas flask, with a replaced stopper, sold for \$325. For decorating under the tree was a set of paper houses, church buildings, and wooden figures that went home for \$300.

Popular opinion might suggest that formal china has lost its appeal. This auction would indicate otherwise. The hammer went down at \$525 for an early 1900s French L.R.L. Limoges 12-piece table setting. The excellent-condition set was gilded and featured hand-painted game birds. Another buyer parted with \$375 for a 12-piece set of Vienna plates. The neoclassical set, in excellent condi-

tion, featured beehive marks and images of Achilles, Jupiter, and Venus, among other figures from Greek mythology. To complement the set was a 10-inch mid-century cut glass pitcher and six tumblers featuring gilding cut away to reveal clear glass. The collection sold for \$175

Antique toys were numerous; winning bids ran the gamut from high three-figures to under \$20. A working condition cast iron "bad accident" mechanical bank from the late 1800s-early 1900s went for \$700. At the other end of the spectrum, a steam toy water mill with a mill worker figurine only reached \$20. And, a group of tin toys hailing from the 1920s to the 1950s got snagged for just \$5.

Auction-wide, half of the lots sold in the three-figure range. Plenty of opportunities camel for those with modest budgets. A 19th-century set of wood butter paddles sold for just \$10 as did a framed 19th-century chromolithograph of whales and dolphins by Henry Johnson. A \$5 bid won a collection of ephemera with 1907 recipe cards, 1940s ration checks, and a 1947 Cincinnati auction catalog.

Some surprising lots were passed antiques over. Among them was a late 19th century Ohio pine and poplar school master's desk, that had pre-bid estimates tion.com



between \$250 and \$500. Also passed was a six-piece Art Deco agate marble desk set which had pre-bid estimates as high as \$250. Perhaps those will reappear in one of Stony Ridge's future sales, along-side another batch of enticing traditional antiques.





founder of Determined Productions, Inc., recognized the marketing possibilities of Peanuts. Although there had already been compilations of Peanuts strips, Boucher saw the potential of other projects. She began with a Peanuts calendar and moved on to a hardback book entitled "Happiness is a Warm Puppy." On the New York Times Bestseller list for 45 weeks, the book, which embraced the wit and wisdom of Peanuts, peaked at number 2. The dam was broken.

In its 1967 catalog, Montgomery Wards introduced the Peanuts Gang Pocket Dolls by Determined Productions. Original sets, consisting of Charlie Brown, Schroeder, Linus, Lucy, and "Flying Ace" Snoopy (complete with goggles and a blue scarf) sold for \$12.90. For older collectors, Pilgrim said, Pocket Dolls were their earliest Peanuts toy; today, they are "iconic collectibles and a must-have for completing a collection." Complete dolls without their original packaging can bring \$10 to \$25, while those with missing clothes and accessories, or those showing wear, sell for \$4 to \$7 a

Keeping up with the times, "Astronaut Snoopy" was introduced in 1969. commemorating the landing of the first man on the moon. The most sought-after Pocket Doll, it is the hardest one to find fully intact; a missing helmet and a soiled white suit are among the challenges. A mint condition Astronaut Snoopy in its original box can sell for over \$150 at auction, \$70 without the box. Because reproductions have been made, "Always check the labels to identify an original

versus reproduction," Pilgrim recommended. Other "perennial favorites" are plush toys (think Snoopy and his sister Belle) and bright felt pennants with black lettering ("very striking").

In addition to shopping online, Pilgrim said that Peanuts memorabilia can be found at yard sales and thrift shops, flea markets and antique malls. Vintage sweatshirts and T-shirts show up in vintage clothing stores for \$40 to \$70. Condition matters to "discriminating collectors, but many do not care." Prices on Peanuts Christmas ornaments, produced by both Deter-

mined Productions and Hallmark, are sometimes high because they are cross-collectable. Advertising pieces include an array of items used as premiums from McDonald's, including drinking glasses and small toys from Happy Meals.

For Pilgrim, researching Peanuts collectibles is often rewarding and sometimes puzzling. The purchase of a hardback book entitled "Determined Productions" turned out to be a 1968 catalog; she has yet to determine its rarity

or its intended audience. Like many collectors, she is drawn to Snoopy ("obviously") but quickly added, "I collect everything." She aspires to one day own an original comic strip that Schulz once touched. And although she is not able to display her entire collection, her dream is to open a pri-

And then there's William Mercer, a Wheeling, West Virginia, physician, who, like Pilgrim, caught the Peanuts "bug" at age ten. A medical career ultimately overcame his initial interest in becoming an artist. But it didn't interfere with his being a Peanuts balloon handler in Macy's Thanksgiving Day parade, nor did it prevent him from connecting with Schulz's widow. And as for collecting Peanuts, serving as a doctor did nothing but expand his collection, as over the years, patients presented him with countless Peanuts-related objects, some of which are one-of-a-kind personal works of art. Displaying them in his professional office, at one point, Mercer moved to a larger space, primarily to accommodate his Peanuts collection.

Now retired, his collection has found a new home at the Kruger Street Toy and Train Museum in Wheeling, where a permanent exhibition will officially open to the public in early 2023. In the meantime, what was once a scary basement in the former Elm Grove Elementary School is now an inviting spot, a place that houses a cabinet full of Peanuts-related music boxes, snow globes, and statues; a clock wall; and a peanuts.com and toyandtrain.com

Peanuts "Halloween train." A "black and white room" is dedicated to Snoopy. And what was formerly used as a banquet room will soon have on display, among other things, Mercer's collection of approximately 150 Peanuts neckties. From Peanuts lip balm, erasers, and Snoopy Pez dispensers, to an oversized image of Snoopy which Mercer uses for his "Too Cool to Smoke" program in local schools, the exhibit of what is called "Dr. Mercer's Collection," though not yet complete, is nothing short of spectacular, as well as inspirational for new (and young collectors).




