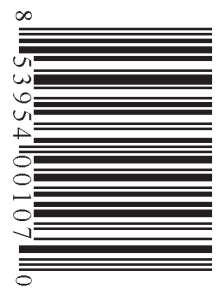

## Herman Munster: Still monsterishly collectible

If you were alive in the mid-1960s, chances are at 7:30 on Thursday evenings, you were in front of your television waiting for The Munsters to begin. The Munsters was a weekly CBS program that aired from 1964 to 1966. It was cancelled after two years because of a head-to-head competition with Batman.

The Munsters premise was a Transylvanian-American family, with gothic features and sensibilities, believes itself to be an “average” American family. The running gag each week was that the characters costumes and appearances were based on classic monsters (Frankenstein, Dracula, etc) found in horror movies of the 1930s and ‘40s. Each week the show satirized television’s typical family sitcoms—the well-meaning father, the nurturing mother, the eccentric live-in relative, the naïve teenager, and the precocious child. The family members resembled, in an oddly humorous way, Frankenstein’s monster, the Bride of Frankenstein, Dracula, and other unsavory but fun-loving characters. The main character was Herman Munster, the green faced, 7 feet 6 inch tall, Frankensteinian patriarch of the Munster family.

While many actors have played Herman Munster over the years, Fred Gwynne played the original and best-loved Herman Munster. For the television series, Herman was created by Dr. Victor Frankenstein in 1815 at the University of Heidelberg; although, work on Herman was not completed until 1850. At a young age, Herman left Germany to live in Victorian England where he was adopted by the Munster family of Munster Hall.

Later Herman moved to Transylvania where he met Lily Dracula. In 1865, Herman and Lily married. Eventually the couple, along with Lily’s father—Grandpa, moved to America, and Herman joined the US Army and fought in World War II. Herman works

for Gateman, Goodbury and Graves, a funeral home, where he started out as a “box boy.”

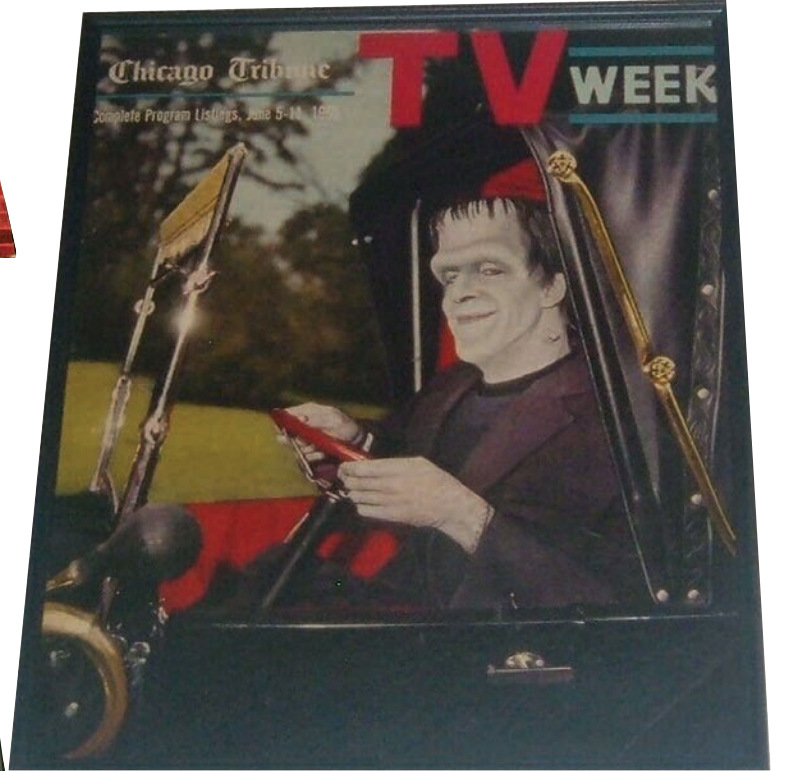
Fred Gwynne played Herman as a lovable, good-natured, and clumsy man, who behaves in childish ways, throwing temper tantrums that are more humorous than scary. Herman is kind to everyone he meets, but his naivety about human behavior sets up weekly problems that Herman must

get out of.

Herman Munster is incredibly strong,

Viscoloid helped make Halloween fun in America

Alexander Paton, Ludwig Stross, and Bernard Doyle founded the Sterling Comb Company in 1901. While combs were not revolutionary, their method of making them was. Sterling Comb used a new chemical element—Viscoloid—to manufacture new items for the 20th century.

Viscoloid proved a remarkable product, especially for its casting appeal, and in 1912 the three men consolidated several small Viscoloid manufacturing companies into one company—the Viscoloid Company.

Viscoloid was an early plastic, and the Viscoloid Company pioneered the use of Viscoloid plastic (known as pyroxylin plastic) in the manufactur-

Stunning six-panel cigar advertising sign will star at Rich Penn auction

WATERLOO, Iowa — Rich Penn will offer one of the finest pieces of cigar advertising ever sold during his Nov. 4-6 auction at the Waterloo Convention Center.

This exceptional auction includes what arguably is the finest piece of cigar advertising ever sold. “We sold it on one of our very first auctions twenty years ago,” Penn said. This stunning six panels of reverse paint and gold leaf on beveled glass measures an impressive 10 feet long. Signed by Fay, Minneapolis, this sign reportedly hung in a building in the Twin Cities for a number of years. It represents cigars distributed by W. S. Conrad, the largest wholesale tobacco business in the Northwest. In 1889 his business was at 341 Jackson St. in St. Paul and his business, the Conrad Tobacco House, was selling an estimated 15 million cigars a year.

There will also be a wide selection of other advertising for popular beverages. Included is a round serving tray with a gorgeous lady in elegant dress and plumed hat about to enjoy a glass of Jersey-Creme, “The Perfect Drink”. Other classic serving trays will include the American Maid Serving Tray. A prohibition era litho on tin of a young beauty with flowers for Enterprise Brewing Co, by Kaufmann & Strauss Co. One of the most sought after breweriana serving trays is the Mankato, Minn., 12 inch diameter Standard Brewing Co. tray. This Meek & Beach tray depicts “The Execution of 38 Sioux Indians.” In exceptional condition, this tray will be

an important addition to any breweriana collection.

For collectors who appreciate memories from their childhood days, there’s an impressive variety of choices. There are tin toys, windups, cast iron toys, mechanical banks, very rare air rifles and cap guns. All perfect candidates for surprises under the Christmas tree. There’s a long, nearly endless list of early Daisy air rifles in this auction, including: a “Golden Eagle” Model 50, copper plated 50th anniversary rifle.

If your cap gun armory is in need of smaller pieces, there’s an equally impressive selection of rare and early cap guns. Examples are from circa 1900 to the 1950s. The Peerless cast iron miniature pistol circa 1905 is one of the more rare

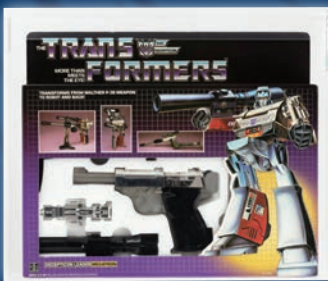
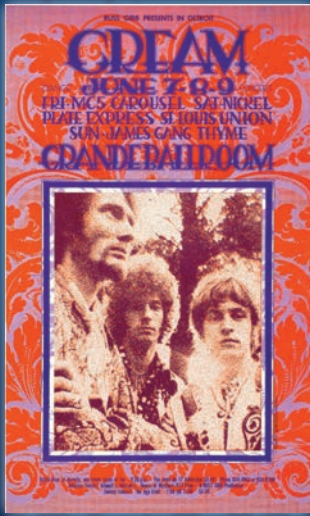

ing of hair combs, toiletry items, and other home products. But in 1914 the Viscoloid Company stumbled on the future of Viscoloid plastics when the company began manufacturing pyroxylin plastic toys.

Toy production led the company's profits, and the Viscoloid Company soon became the leading Viscoloid plastic toy manufacturer in the United States. Following World War II, the company's toy production truly took off as the company began specializing in holiday toys, such as Easter, Christmas, and Halloween. Holiday toys allowed the company to sell different toys at different months of the year, keeping their product always before America's growing consumer markets.

By 1923, Bernard Doyle owned the Viscoloid Company, and the company's manufacturing process incorporated 106 buildings in Leominster, Massachusetts.

Dupont Company of Leominster purchased the Viscoloid Company in 1925, ending Doyle's involvement with the company he helped found. Dupont Viscoloid Company continued for the next 50 years.

Today, Viscoloid toys are highly collectible, especially Viscoloid Halloween toys depicting iconic Halloween characters, such as witches,

goblins, black cats, and veggie-men. Authentic Viscoloid Company Halloween toys were primarily made in the 1920s before the company's sale

to Dupont. These antique toys are expensive, so expect to pay \$15 to \$50 per toy, depending on condition.

# Kaminski to offer Part 2 of famed Athanas collection Oct. 29

DANVERS, Mass. — Kaminski Auctions will present Part Two of the Anthony Athanas collection, the legendary restaurateur of Anthony’s Pier 4 fame on Oct. 29 at the Athanas warehouse in Danvers. The auction will include furniture, furnishings and fine art from the General Glover House in Swampscott, Mass., and Anthony’s Cummaquid Inn in Yarmouth Port, Mass.

A self-made millionaire and philanthropist, Anthana’s restaurants at one point, had sales close to \$12 million annually and served over 700,000 meals per year. In the 1960s and 70s Anthony’s Pier 4 was the place to be seen in Boston. It was the go-to restaurant for out-of-town celebrities, athletes, and film stars visiting the city

His hard work and attention to detail permeated every aspect of running his restaurants, including decorating each one with unique original furniture and nautical antiques. In May of 1970, Athanas attended the auction conducted by the David Weisz Company, which auctioned off the furniture and furnishings from the Metro Goldwyn Mayer film sets in Hollywood, California. Many of the furnishings original to his four restaurants came from this historical sale.

Of particular interest from the David Weisz Company sale is a 17th century Italian cassone with intricately carved leaf decoration and detailed marquetry inlay of hunt scenes. The inlay is a combination of specialty woods and bone,

the cassone has carved gargoyle corner posts, and large hairy paw feet. It is estimated at \$5500-\$8500.

Fine art in the auction features two Louis Dodd (British, 1943-2006), paintings. The first titled “The 74 Gun Vermont”, the last American ship of the line in the East River New York. It is an oil on board, signed and the second also, oil on board is titled “Ship Flying American Flag,” both from the General Glover House.

A Yamaha ebony case “Disklavier II” player piano with a matching leather-top stool and the original manual, is also on offer, along with a cased wooden ship model, of the H.M.S. Speedwell, built in 1875, and restored by M. Costagliola in 1967.

Silver from the restaurants includes a pair of circa 1830 wine coolers, several pairs of Reed & Barton silverplate champagne buckets on matching stands, a silverplate covered food warmer and pairs of three branch silverplate candelabra.

# Rare Pokemon card finds home with NFL linebacker

NFL linebacker Blake Martinez, recently signed by the Las Vegas Raiders, has been revealed as the owner of one of the most famous and valuable modern trading cards, a Pokémon Illustrator. One of only 41 known examples, it was authenticated recently by experts at CGC Trading Cards (www.CGCcards.com) in Sarasota, Florida.

“In 1997 and 1998, Japanese comics magazine CoroCoro Comic conducted illustration contests for its fans, and winners received one of the specially-printed Illustrator promotion cards depicting a character from the Pokémon franchise,” said Matthew Quinn, CGC Trading Cards Vice President.

The Martinez Illustrator promo card is from 1998 and depicts one of the most popular Pokémon characters, Pikachu.

“This is pretty much the holy grail of Pokémon card collecting. It is in gem mint condition, one of the finest known. It is gorgeous, stunning, a 9.5 on the 10-point grading scale and we estimate it would bring \$1 million or more in an auction,” said Quinn.

Martinez acquired the card in a private transaction in September and submitted it to CGC Trading Cards for authentication and grading.

He described it as the “crème de la crème” of Pokémon cards. “I couldn’t have asked for anything better,” he said.

Before joining the Raiders this as an inside linebacker, Martinez previously played for the Green Bay Packers and the New York Giants football teams. In addition to being a professional athlete, Martinez is a collector and dealer of trading cards under the name Blake’s Breaks.

# 17th century caudle cup added to Colonial Williamsburg collection

WILLIAMSBURG, Va. — A 17th-century caudle cup that belonged to the Puritan congregation of the First Church of Christ in Farmington, Conn., and was used there as a vessel for sacramental wine, was recently acquired by The Colonial Williamsburg Foundation making it the earliest piece of American silver in its famed collection. The cup, wrought around 1670 in Boston was fashioned by the first silversmiths making goods in what is now the United States.

“Colonial Williamsburg’s curators have worked diligently and with notable successes over the last decade to assemble a collection of American-made silver worthy of the institution’s other decorative arts holdings,” said Ronald L. Hurst, senior vice president for education and historic resources. “The acquisition of this particularly early and well-preserved cup provides us with an excellent starting point for the story of American silversmithing over the next century and half.”

Although perfectly shaped to serve caudle — a hot, sweet, often alcoholic porridge — this so-called caudle cup was used as a treasured part of the church’s ecclesiastical service. The cup’s stable, low body with its two handles (or “ears”) made it easy to pass from one congregant to another. Clearly popular, five others that are nearly identical to this earliest example, were acquired by the church before 1720.

Adding to the distinctiveness of this cup,

struck into one side of it near the rim is the mark of Robert Sanderson, Sr. (ca. 1608-1693), a London-trained goldsmith who emigrated to America in 1639. On the bottom is the mark of his partner John Hull (1624-1683), a British-born tradesman who arrived in Boston in 1635. Also stamped into the cup is the mark of Jeremiah Dummer (1645-1718), the first native-born American silversmith, apprenticed to Hull in 1659. Interestingly, Dummer’s mark was struck over Sanderson’s, while Hull’s mark was struck over Dummer’s. Exactly what this means is unclear, but it likely has to do with Dummer’s transition from journeyman to master, and the opening of his own silversmithing business. The caudle cup is the only known piece to carry the marks of all three artisans. Sometime after the marks of Hull over Dummer were made, the church’s initials “F” and “C” (the ownership mark of Farmington Church) were engraved on the bottom of the cup flanking the center point.

The trio of Hull, Sanderson and Dummer are also important in the world of numismatics as they were responsible for the birth of American money. John Hull was appointed Mintmaster of the Massachusetts Bay Colony in 1652 and was assisted by his partner Sanderson as well as his apprentice/journeyman Dummer. Operating from 1652 until 1682, Hull & Sanderson’s mint produced the famed Oak Tree and Pine Tree coinage, among other types, in their shop in Boston’s North End. Furthermore, when Massachusetts authorized the first issue of American paper money in 1690, it was Jeremiah Dummer who engraved the printing plates.

Around 1907, Farmington Church (as it is also known) decided their centuries-old silver should be housed elsewhere for safe keeping. Stored in a bank vault until 1964, the caudle cups were loaned to the Wadsworth Atheneum in Hartford, approximately 10 miles from Farmington. In the early 2000s, the congregation decided to sell the group in order to advance the church’s mission; the proceeds from the 2005 sale went to structural renovation and the construction of a new building.

# Vintage Vespas still a classic ride reminiscent of ‘Roman Holiday’

One of the most iconic images of 1950s and ‘60s Italy is that of the ice cream- or sherbet-colored Vespa scooter. Inspired by the US military Cushman scooters used in Italy during World War II, the Vespa, produced by the Piaggio company, represents one of the greatest Italian success stories.

Featured in the 1953 film “Roman Holiday” (an event which generated 100,000+ sales), high-profile enthusiasts of the Vespa included Dean Martin. By 1956, Piaggio had sold over one million machines. The popularity of the scooters grew to such a pitch that a new word was coined: *vespare*, meaning to go on a journey on a Vespa.

### The Duckling

In 1943, with the idea of offering low-cost transportation to the masses, Enrico Piaggio asked engineer Renzo Spolti to design a motor-scooter. The prototype Spolti created was the Moto Piaggio 5, or MP5, but the workers at the Biella factory nicknamed it Paperino—“duckling,” or “Donald Duck.”

This 98cc scooter had a chain drive, was bulky and lacked the step-through design of the Vespa. So dissatisfied was Piaggio with the model that he halted production of the Paperino. By this time, approximately 100 Paperinos had come off the assembly line, and those which survive are highly sought after collector’s items.

### The Wasp

Enrico Piaggio asked aeronautical engineer Corradino D’Ascanio to take over the project. Some specifics were required: The scooter had to be elegant yet durable and reliable, and simple to operate with a layout which prevented the rider’s clothes from getting dirty.

D’Ascanio’s dislike of motorcycles coupled with his experience in aeronautics led him to create a groundbreaking new machine. The engineer found motorcycles uncomfortable to ride, the chain drive messy, and noted that changing a motorcycle tire was a cumbersome task. With these ideas in mind, D’Ascanio took an ergonomics-first approach and began plans by initially drawing the figure of a rider who sat comfortably upright, then sketched his proposed machine below and around the figure, accommodating the human proportions.

D’Ascanio’s innovations included a unibody frame, the placing of the gear-shift on the handlebars, a foot-brake, direct-drive, and attaching the front wheel to a single strut instead of a fork to allow for quick and easy wheel changes. The frame’s step-through design allowed dress- or skirt-wearing women to drive the scooter comfortably.

This 98cc model was the Moto Piaggio 6 (MP6). When Enrico Piaggio saw the prototype and heard the buzz of its motor in September 1945 he exclaimed, “Sembra una vespa!” (“It looks like a wasp!”).

### Vespa 98

The Light Motorized Runabout (Motoleggera Utilitaria), or Vespa 98, premiered at the Rome Golf Club in April 1946. Production began at the Pontedera factory at that time. This model was almost the same as the MP6, but D’Ascanio had made some refinements such as adding an engine cooling-fan, and repositioning the horn and handbrake.

The Vespa 98 made the cover of *La Moto* magazine, and Piaggio initially sold the scooters through Lancia dealerships. Optional features for the Vespa included a kickstand, whitewalls and a speedometer. The Italian public was curious but skeptical of the new creation, and the first year’s production number was only 2,484 units.

For 1947, Piaggio brought out the second generation Vespa 98. This model included improved lighting, a smaller front fender to further simplify front wheel removal, and a new start lever which was easier to operate. The silver finishes of these vehicles reflected the aeronautical heritage of the Piaggio company. The Vespa 98s could do 37mph.

### Vespa 125

As sales numbers climbed, Piaggio offered a new 125cc scooter in 1948. With a top speed of 43mph, this model had improved suspension, a rear shock absorber and simplified engine access.

The Sei Giorni, appeared in 1951. With its modifications, this scooter could do 60mph and won nine gold medals at the 26th International Six-Day Event.

A further incarnation of the 125 also debuted in 1951, the Vespa Siluro (“Torpedo”). With a sleek silver body of pan-

els, fins and fairings which enclosed the rider, this was a time-trials model which broke the standing kilometer record with a time of 21.4 seconds and an average speed of 106.3mph.

### Vespa 150 GS

Following up on the Sei Giorni, the 150 GS was a mass-produced sporty model. With a 145.6cc engine and a top speed of 63mph, the 150 GS is regarded as the height of beauty in scooter design, and is the most famous Vespa. Released in 1955, examples of this classic are prized by motor enthusiasts and collectors the world over.

### Vespa 50

A small-sized 49cc scooter which could do 25mph, the 1963 Vespa 50 was the last model designed by D’Ascanio. Known for its simplicity and easy handling, this motor-scooter was popular with the youth culture of the time. Its small engine allowed it to circumvent the Italian Highway Code which required license plates for vehicles with motors of greater than 1.5 horsepower. Over three million Vespa 50s were built.

### Vespa 90 SS

The 1966 Super Sprint 90 departed from previous Piaggio designs with its narrow leg shield and the addition of a pannier between the seat and the handlebars. Now a collectible, this 88.5cc scooter could do 58mph.

### Expansion and the future

From its single motor-scooter intro-

duced in 1946, Piaggio has since created hundreds of different models. As sales mushroomed, Piaggio had the scooters made under license in France, Spain, Belgium, Great Britain and Germany. Production expanded into Brazil, Indonesia and India in the 1960s.

With many variations introduced over the decades—such as a military Vespa which carried a 75mm anti-tank gun, scooters with sidecars, scooters with trailers, and other competition models—production of the Vespa continues to this day. Recent projects include the development of hybrid scooters. Piaggio is the world’s top producer of two-wheeled motor vehicles.

### Vintage Vespa values

Vespa scooters are known to hold their worth better than do most road vehicles, and selling prices of vintage Vespas can be impressive. Values will also depend on whether the scooter is in original condition or has been restored. In recent auctions, a 1965 Super 150 in good original condition went for \$1,675, while a restored 1967 VLB 150 Sprint auctioned for \$3,400. Other recent auction results of restored Vespas include a 1960 150 VBB closing for \$3,900, a 1961 150 realizing \$3,600, and a 1962 150 selling for \$3,850.

Some examples of current asking prices for older and/or scarcer restored Vespas are a 1947 model 98 listed for \$69,591, a 1948 98 for \$25,993, a 1951 125 for \$19,765, a 1953 125 for \$12,588, a 1956 150 for \$8823, and a rare 1966 90 Super Sprint for \$23,294.





# Warhol Flowers print blossomed to \$59,000 at World Auction Gallery

EAST MEADOW, N.Y. — When an auction bears the label “Important” it certainly reflects a standout event. That was the case with World Auction Gallery’s “Important Fall Auction” held on September 18.

Nearly 500 lots of fine art, decorative pieces, furnishings, and jewelry were offered on Invaluable and World Auction Gallery’s proprietary online auction platform. There were numerous Warhol pieces, three Chagall’s, two monumental bronzes by Dave McGary, and a handful of Tiffany items, among scores of Art Nouveau furniture, antique Asian porcelain, and stunning vintage jewelry.

One-quarter of the offerings were fine art. Seventy were two-dimensional pieces including watercolors, oils, sketches, and lithographs. Twenty lots were attributed in some manner to Andy Warhol. Not surprisingly, it was a Warhol piece that brought in the auction’s highest bid of \$59,000. The good-condition polymer and silkscreen ink on canvas entitled “Flowers” was signed, and dated 1964, with provenance to a Midwest private collector.

Also attributed to Warhol, but created by Richard Pettibone (1938-) was an approximately 3 by 3 inch rendition of Warhol’s Jackie Kennedy works. Pettibone is known for his small-scale ‘appropriated’ renditions of material by artists like Warhol. The four-pane set hailed from a private collection and bid to \$20,000. Five other Richard Pettibone lots sold for five-figure sums.

Three-dimensional fine art was also well-represented, starting with two bronzes by American sculptor Dave McGary

(1958-2013), noted for his bronzes of Native Americans. One took the auction’s second highest bid of \$24,000. The excellent-condition 42-inch bronze figure entitled, “Trophies of Honor Kangi Yatapi” hailed from a doctor’s personal collection. It was signed, numbered, and dated 1999. The other McGary bronze, bringing \$17,000, came from the same collection. The 47-inch figure entitled “Bear Tracks” was also in excellent condition. It was signed, numbered, and dated 1993.

There were five pieces by multi-dimensional artist American-Mexican Rick Wolfryd (1953-). Two figurines, crafted in Huichol colored bead style - entitled “Flowering X Man” and “Pop Star” - sold for \$750 each. Beaded bobbleheads of Baby Yoda and Mickey Mouse as “the Magician” sold for \$550 and \$500 respectively.

There were 155 lots of decorative art including 21 Tiffany items. Taking \$3,250 was a 10-inch L.C. Tiffany Favre Stalactite glass lamp shade in excellent condition. A numbered and signed L.C. Tiffany Favre glass vase reached \$2,250.

A circa 1900 Art Nouveau figural lamp “Nautilus” by Austrian sculptor Gustav Gurschner (1873-1970) also sold for \$2,250. The unsigned piece was in overall good condition with some silver tarnish and needing rewiring for modern use. From the same era came an 8-inch cameo glass gooseneck vase from French glassmaker Muller Fres. The signed piece reached \$2,250 as well.

Nearly four-dozen pieces of furniture were offered; much of it was Art Nouveau. Commanding a \$4,000 bid was an Art Nouveau

marquetry desk and chair. The good-condition set showed no evidence of repair or restoration.

Other pieces included a circa 1900 three-tier marquetry side table with pond lily decorations that bid to \$1,700 and a 30-inch French Galle two-tier inlaid side table with bronze-covered legs that went for \$1,200.

There were several standouts among the 60 lots of jewelry. A 14-inch dark coral bead necklace with a 14K gold clasp in excellent condition was won for \$3,750. The hammer went down at \$1,600 for a six-strand natural pearl necklace with serpentine diamond and an 18K gold pendant. A bid of \$1,000 won another natural pearl necklace with 10 diamonds embedded in an 18k gold clasp.

Another exciting aspect of this auction was that exceptional pieces did not always go for exorbitant sums. Two Chagall works - a “self-portrait” lithograph, and a lithograph entitled “L’Apparition au Cirque” went for just \$150 and \$125. Both had provenance to the artist’s personal collection.

Additionally, about 120 of the lots sold for winning bids under \$100. A signed lithograph entitled “Circus Players” by Romanian surrealist Sami Briss (1930-) sold for a mere \$50.

A table lamp with an Andy Warhol Collection tag was snagged for \$40. And, a Charles Labino glass cup, signed and dated 1973 made it to just \$30.



just like the Frankenstein monster in the movies. In one episode, Herman is shown lifting a solid metal demolition ball (an average wrecking ball weighs 5,000 pounds) with one hand like it is a bag of cotton candy. In another episode, Herman is asked how much he weighs, and he answers, “Three spins,” meaning the dial on a scale spins around three times when he steps on it (Herman’s driver’s license lists his weight as 380 pounds). And Herman considers himself, as does his wife, to be quite handsome; although, his face can crack a mirror just by looking in it.

Although nearly every Munster character has its own fan base, by and large, collectors search for Herman Munster items since Herman has always been a beloved television character.

In 1964 Mattel started a Herman Munster collectible fan club when the company came out with a Herman Munster doll that featured Fred Gwynne’s voice and spoke ten random phrases with the pull of its “Chatty Ring” cord. This was a spin-off of Mattel’s highly successful Chatty Cathy doll, for which the talking mechanism had been invented. This doll is still highly collectible and is occasionally seen on eBay for around \$1,000.

Since the first Herman Munster doll, many other dolls and figurines have been produced, including a mid-1960s Herman blow mold toy, a Herman hand puppet that in its original packaging sells for over \$1,500, and a Polystone 1/6th scale Herman Munster figurine from Sideshow Collectibles.

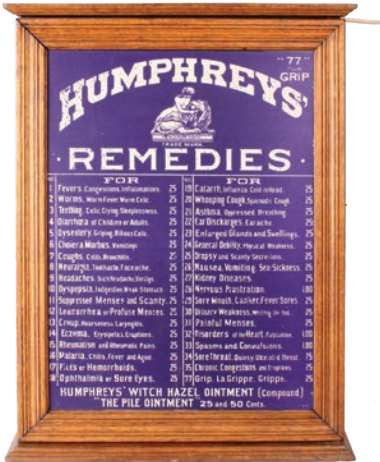
