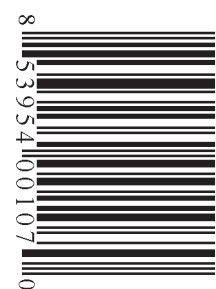

The International Questers collect and preserve America's heritage

Virtually every community has one or more organizations that promote local history and steward preservation efforts. Very few of them purposefully champion antiques as part of their mission. One of those rarities is The International Questers, which has been an antiques advocate for nearly 80 years.

During World War II, Red Cross production chairwoman Jessie Elizabeth Bardens was shopping during her lunch break when a blue syrup pitcher in an antique shop window caught her eye. She bought the pitcher thinking it might dress up her office desk. It turned out to be a conversation piece with her co-workers; those chats often led to colleagues sharing information about their own antiques.

Sensing how those antiques-driven conversations seemed to boost morale, Bardens decided to host an antiques discussion group in her home, where coworkers were invited to "bring an antique and a sandwich." The first group of 14 met on April 6, 1944. By the end of that year, attendance had more than doubled.

Because Barden could not accommodate that many people in her home, she encouraged members to start their own groups. Five local collectives quickly formed. Word got out, and people started asking about forming groups in other states. When possible in those early years, Bardens personally traveled to organize groups; for others, she coordinated by mail and phone.

By 1950, Bardens decided it was time to create a national umbrella organization. In 1953 she incorporated a Pennsylvania non-profit organization she named, "The Questers."

Since its inception in 1944, Questers groups have formed in every state except Vermont and Hawaii. Today, membership is nearly 7,000, spread across 38 states. In each state, chapters are formed when at least six prospective members commit to creating a group and holding regular meetings. In some states, the numbers are impressive: Iowa has the most chapters, with 92; Michigan has 52; and, Pennsylvania has 61.

The Questers went international in 1967 when Canada's first chapter was formed in Windsor, Ontario. Today, there are nine Canadian chapters. The organization added "International" to its name in 1992.

While the organization's original focus was - and to a great degree remains - antiques, their scope has

expanded to include historic preservation and the restoration of historic buildings and landmarks. With that aim in mind, the Questers chose for its headquarters an 1802 Philadelphia Federal-style row house, just blocks from iconic City Hall.

At the local level, members hold regular meetings that focus on particular antiques, historical sites, or related events. Meetings may include guest speakers like local collectors and are often held at historic sites, museums, and even antique stores.

In addition to local meetings, there are state-level events and an annual international Questers convention. Ohio's 2022 statewide meeting took place in October. Its theme focused on the Historic National Road, with speakers presenting on the history of the road and the development of communities in eastern Ohio along its path. A private dinner and tour were held at the Belmont County Victorian Mansion Museum in Barnesville, Ohio. Five months prior, the international convention was held in Milwaukee, Wis., at the 1890s Pfister Hotel.

Beyond meetings, member benefits include a subscription to the Quester Quarterly magazine. Some state and local chapters provide additional publications. Chapters often organize events and tours for their membership. Just in New Jersey, groups have arranged trips to the Statue of Liberty, the Thomas Edison National Historic Park, and

Winterthur. Questers in Arizona host a "Keepsake Roadshow" and even maintain a speaker's bureau.

Many Quester chapters undertake historic preservation and restoration projects (known as P&R projects) in their communities. The array of P&R projects is impressive. Iowa Questers spearheaded an early-American pressed glass collection housed at Iowa State

University's Brunnier Art Museum. That collection now encompasses more than 1,500 pieces dating from 1840 to 1950. A Maryland chapter helped restore the wheelhouse, decking, and library on the SS John W. Brown Liberty Ship. And in Florida, Questers outfitted the keeper's quarters at the Pensacola

These weights once kept newspapers from blowing away

As newspapers become more of a commercial success in the late 1800s; more and more of them began to be sold from newsstands. If there is one thing a newspaper is good at, it is flying away in even the slightest of breezes, so enterprising people began using weights to keep the papers in place.

Well-worn horseshoes could very well have been the first weights used to hold down newspapers; after all they were readily available as automobiles began replacing hooved transportation. Cast iron newsstand paperweights with advertising logos

started appearing around 1900 and by mid-century, they were a regularly on the job on the city newsstands.

In the 1950s and 1960s, Mortimer

Spiller tapped into the market manufacturing thousands of these newsstand paper weights. Many of Spiller's weights were shipped overseas by Life, Time and the Herald Tribune to newsstands in London, Paris, and other European capitals.

The purpose of a newsstand paperweight is utilitarian; its primary purpose is to stop a stack of newspapers

from being carried off by the wind. While a brick or large rock would serve the same purpose; larger newspapers such as the New York Times and Chicago Tribune realized the newsstand paperweights with their names embossed might be a great advertising tool. Smaller newspapers also got into

Simpich character dolls have a Thanksgiving flair

American doll collectors have loved Simpich Character Dolls since their inception in 1952. Today, these dolls are still highly sought after, especially specialty Simpich dolls such as Simpich Thanksgiving Dolls.

Artists Bob and Jan Simpich founded Simpich Character Dolls in 1952 in Colorado Springs, Colorado. Character dolls have included historical and mythological figures, such as Tom Sawyer, Alice in Wonderland, Santa, Pecos Bill, and many others.

Bob and Jan created their first Character Dolls from found materials because they could not afford to buy gifts for their parents at Christmas. "We never set out to form a business," Bob said. But word of mouth started doll orders flooding in, and the dolls were instant hits, and in 1978 the couple opened a store in Old Colorado City Historic District. For much of their creative time, Jan specialized in delicate, youthful appearing dolls such as "The Standing Angel," and Bob specialized in grandfatherly-type dolls, such as Santa Claus.

At its height, Simpich Character Dolls employed 45 artisans, selling their dolls locally from their store and nationally from a doll catalog and website.

Simpich Character Dolls are made from local Colorado clays and from original molds, making them ceramic figurines. Although both Bob and Jan are artists,

neither of them had extensive ceramic training. They simply learned the ceramic business as they produced dolls. After each

the act. It was this realization that prodded newspaper companies to distribute these weights to newsstands. There was also another purpose of the weights; it dissuaded someone from pinching the top newspaper from the stack.

During World War II many of these weights were put into scrap drives to help the war effort. But when the war ended newsstand paperweights were back. Spiller seeing the market now wide-open set about manufacturing the weights, in a small community near Buffalo, N.Y., and selling them to print publications who then dispensed them to newsstand owners.

These vintage newsstand paperweights can command substantial prices. Spiller's weights include type raised above the surface of the weight that spelled out a newspaper or periodical's name. A two-sided antique cast Iron weight touting the Ladies Home Journal and the Saturday Evening Post is offered for sale for \$495 by eBay seller: ged2perfectionstore1s. This example weighs just over one pound and measures approximately 2 ¼ by 8 ¾ inches. Another, seller of-

fered an antique cast iron newsstand paper weight for the New York Herald Tribune. One side advertises their finance section and the other side media figure John Crosby. It measures 10.5 inches across by just under 3 inches wide and weighs 1.5 pounds and is offered for sale by eBay seller: sontag_visual for \$329.95.

Mortimer Spiller's firm continued making these paperweights through the 1980s. He amassed an archive of more than 150 unique newsstand paperweights and hand-carved prototypes from around the globe.

doll had been molded and fired, Bob and Jan hand painted each doll, made costumes for the dolls, and then dressed and mounted the dolls. Both Bob and Jan have stated that it was employee dedication that kept the business running smoothly.

In 2007, Bob and Jan closed their store and stopped producing dolls for sale. Today, some of their dolls are nearly 70 years old, and all of the dolls are highly collectible.

Gift of Imperial Lead Lustre lead to lifetime of collecting

BARNSVILLE, Ohio – When Ernie Albanese graduated from West Point in 1969 his mother gave him a piece of Imperial Lead Lustre. Now, this might not seem like the type of gift someone would give to a man who was an undefeated 4th Regiment boxing champion for two years and who would later go on to become an Army Ranger, but Albanese was born and raised among the glassmaking facilities in eastern Ohio and his mother was an avid glass collector.

A collector was born in that moment. The first line of Imperial glass was Free Hand. “They began making Free Hand in June 1923 until the end of 1924,” Albanese said. Free Hand was exactly what it claimed, made by the hands of an artist, no molds or forms of any kind used and no two pieces alike. Several artists may have worked on one piece, driving up the costs of Free Hand.

Unfortunately, Imperial Free Hand did not last long. Many historians attribute the demise to the high cost of production. Albanese also cites the reputation of Imperial as a more daily utilitarian glass manufacturer flooding the marketplace with dining and kitchen sets.

Free Hand was replaced in January 1925 with Imperial Lead Lustre Art Glass, Lead Lustre was hand blown into a paste mold and decorated using lustre finishes and the same hand decorated application and as that of Free Hand. It too was discontinued after about a year of production.

Albanese has now written two books on Imperial glass, “Imperial Lead Lustre Art Glass,” was the first. This month his latest book, co-authored with Kimberly Weygandt-Scialdone, will hit bookstore shelves. It is titled “Imperial Free Hand Glass.”

Now 75 and fighting an “uphill” battle with cancer, Albanese is beginning to sell some of his beloved possessions.

On Dec. 7, 80 pieces of Lotton, Durand and Bohemian Czech art glass from the Albanese collection will be sold in Texas at the Jaremos Auction Gallery. Bruce Orr, longtime collector of art glass, and owner of Jaremos Art Glass Specialists traveled to Barnsville, Ohio in September to see Albanese’s collections.

“In a 30-year career of collecting, buying, selling and loving glass, I have met some very interesting people and this last September was no exception,” Orr said. “I received a phone call from a long-time friend and glass junky Kimberly Weygandt-Scialdone to see if I could converge on Barnsville, Ohio, to check out a Lotton collection for a possible consignment to my auction house in Texas.

“Upon arriving at a very nice two-story

Victorian, Kimberly introduced me to Ernie Albanese and lead me into what could only be called a glass and pottery museum. Every room, including the attic and kitchen was filled with wonderful items of pottery and glass, the Lotton was just the tip of the iceberg. The love and passion that I felt from listening to Ernie talk about his collection was almost akin to listening to grandparents talk about the grandkids. And, that is what makes this fun.”

“I’m probably more conservative than most art glass collectors, who tend to be more liberal minded,” Albanese said. “But that’s all put aside. Here we’re talking about the humanity of sharing. We may glare at each other during auctions, but at the end of the day we all meet for supper, laugh, tell stories and maybe even share secrets about possible finds.”

In addition to the two books produced by Albanese and Weygandt-Scialdone (who contributed many of the photos from her collection in the Albanese’ first book) Albanese spent more than 10 years building a website, www.imperialartglass.net, that thoroughly illustrates the history, the artists, the various shapes and pieces produced throughout Imperial’s tenure.

In addition to his collection of art glass, Albanese has an extraordinary collection of art pottery. The Albanese art pottery collection will be sold next year at Rago Auctions, he said. Also being sold online only on Dec. 10-11 through Magnum Auctions in Upper Sandusky, Ohio, will be other examples of Albanese’s American and Czech art glass. In

late February, Magnum will be selling part of his art pottery collection.

Albanese has always been willing to share his knowledge, as evidenced by his massive website and books. Both he and Weygandt-Scialdone have generously contributed to the Museum of American Glass in West Virginia, other museums and collector groups.

Selling his 50-year old collections is difficult for Albanese, particularly under the circumstances. “It’s not very promising and I’m preparing for the worst-case scenario,” he said. “But I can’t complain. I have had many good experiences, met a lot of great people. The collecting has restored a belief in the humanity of others. I am doing this to provide for Mary Ann, my wife of 53 years I care deeply about. The way I look at it, I’m ahead of the game.”

Kaminski Thanksgiving auction dedicated to Mary Westcott

BEVERLY, Mass. — Kaminski Auctions will hold its annual Thanksgiving Auction on Nov. 26-27. This year’s auction is dedicated to Mary Westcott in honor of her 90th birthday. Mary has worked as a Senior Appraiser at Kaminski for over 32 years and is well-known throughout the antique industry.

Mary started her career as an educator. She taught school, and later in her professional career, she served as Guidance Director at Westford Academy in Westford, Massachusetts. She served as president of the Massachusetts School Counselors Association and was awarded their highest honor.

Upon retirement from a successful career in education, she took a course to become an antique appraiser. She met Frank Kaminski in the 1980s and attended his first auction on Brattle Street, Cambridge, in 1987. Frank asked Mary to do some appraisal events and later joined the staff as an appraiser, cataloger, auction consultant, and auctioneer and learned every facet of the auction industry. During the past 32 years, she has had many exciting and challenging experiences. The most memorable was the appraisal of artifacts at The Grand Canyon Hotel. Mary was essential to Kaminski Auctions’ success, including auctions with Martha Stewart and Oprah Winfrey.

This year’s Thanksgiving Auction features items from numerous Boston, Palm Beach, and local New England estates.

The sculpture category leads the auction highlights with two entries by the Cuban sculptor Augustin Cardenas (Cuban, 1927-2001.) Augustín Cárdenas died in Havana, Cuba, in 2001. Cárdenas studied at the San Alejandro Academy of Fine Art. He was active in the Surrealist movement in Paris, and his sculpture is said to be influenced by Brâncuși, Henry Moore, and Jean Arp.

In addition to the Cárdenas sculptures, there is a circa 1970 Harry Bertoia bush sculpture in bronze and brass. It is welded and maintains its original patina. A signed, circa 1932 Picasso

sculpture of a bronze head with gold and brown patina, probably of Marie-Therese Walter, measures 19 ½ inches by 12 ½ inches and is estimated at \$20,000-\$30,000. Along with the Picasso is a Fernando Botero (Colombian, b.1932) bronze sculpture, titled “La Mano,” numbered 2/9, on a plinth.

An American sculpture on offer is “Appeal to the Great Spirit,” 1906, by Charles Henry Humphriss (American, 1867-1934). It is a bronze sculpture with dark brown patina, signed and dated, with a Gorham Company founders mark verso.

American art features a 19th-century portrait of George Washington, oil on canvas, after Gilbert Stuart that has been in a Newburyport estate for generations.

A local North Shore of Boston personality, the late Nondas Lagonakis of Salem, Mass, was the owner of Bill & Bob’s Roast Beef. He was an avid collector of European paintings and sculptures. The Thanksgiving auction features several pieces from his estate, including an oil on panel painting titled “The Crucifixion” after Sir Peter Paul Rubens, The Last Communion of St. Jerome, oil on canvas after Domenico Zampieri, the Death of Seneca, oil on canvas from the circle of Sebastiano Ricci (18th century), and a Continental School, late 18th/early 19th century, of The Madonna of the Rabbit, after Tiziano Vecellio (“Titian”). The collection also includes several 19-century Italian marble statues.

Modern furniture from designer Jay Spectre abounds with a selection of credenzas, coffee tables, and sofa tables in marble and stainless steel on offer.

Other noteworthy lots in the auction include two Louis Vuitton cabin trunks. The first, serial #755355, measures 20 inches by 40 inches and consists of two keys. The second, the Louis Vuitton cabin trunk, has serial #753094 and measures 14 inches by 44 inches by 22 inches with two keys. Both boxes belonged to Arthur Dryhurst Budd, born in 1882 in Meriden, Connecticut. He served as Lieutenant Colonel in the Army 78th Division of American Expeditionary Forces, War Dept. General Order #35, 1919, and received the Distinguished Service Cross for extraordinary heroism in action while serving with the 311th Infantry Regiment near Grand Pre, France, October 28, 1918.

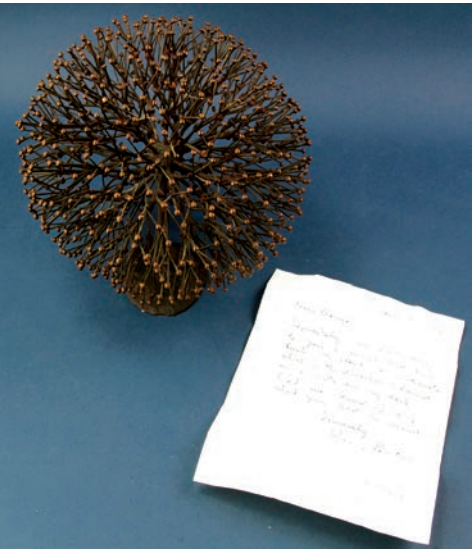

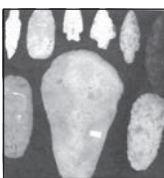

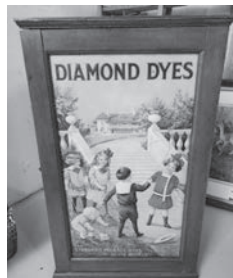

Many different myths surround the Corn Maiden

Thanksgiving is a time for turkey, pumpkins, and Indian corn. Indian corn, also known as flint corn or calico corn, is a variant of maize, a cereal grain first cultivated by indigenous people in southern Mexico about 10,000 years ago. Generations of selective breeding by American Indian tribes helped maize evolve into the colorful corn that, today, is known as Indian corn. Northeast American Indian tribes extensively cultivated Indian corn along with a few Great Plains tribes, such as the Pawnee.

Many North American Indian tribes associate the origin of corn with the mythological figure Corn Maiden, also called Corn Mother. Most Indian tribes believe one of two versions of the story of the Corn Maiden. The first version, called the “immolation version,” depicts the Corn Maiden as an old woman (more probably a Corn Mother) who offers relief to a hungry tribe. In the story, the Corn Maiden often adopts an orphan Indian child as her own foster child. The Corn Maiden secretly produces kernels of corn by rubbing her body. The tribe people become disgusted by her means of producing corn and accuse the Maiden of witchcraft. The tribe kills the Corn Maiden, but before she dies, she instructs the Indians on how to treat her corpse. Stalks of maize or corn sprout from the earth wherever the Corn Maiden’s corpse is dragged, and a field of corn sprouts from her burial site.

In the second version, called the “flight version,” the Corn Maiden is depicted as a beautiful, young woman who marries an Indian man whose tribe is starving. The Maiden secretly produces maize by rubbing kernels from her body. This also disgusts the tribe, and the Corn Maiden’s in-laws insult her and call her a witch. She flees the tribe, returning to her ancestral home. Her tribal husband follows her, and the Maiden gives him seed corn and teaches him how to cultivate the corn or maize. He returns to his tribe and teaches them to grow maize so that they will never be hungry again.

Of all the Native American cultures,

the Pueblo and Zuni cultures seem to have truly embraced the myths surrounding the Corn Maiden. As archeology has shown us, corn has been the main food source for many Indian tribes since ancient times. The Pueblo and Zuni, as farming cultures, could easily trace their tribe’s history to the history of maize in America.

The Zuni culture and myths have added greatly to the myth of the Corn Maiden. Zuni mythology says Corn Maidens were beautiful, and their beauty was so stunning that men who saw them desired them for their own. Even though men desired Corn Maidens, the Maidens sought to mislead or deceive the men who were pursu-

ing them. Not long after the Corn Maidens became aware that men desired them, the Maidens also realized that trouble was brewing because of this great desire, so the Corn Maidens asked the Great Spirit what should be done about the men’s desires. The Great Spirit instructed the Corn Maidens to select a sacred kachina image and to place the image on their head; thus, disguising themselves. After placing the kachina image on their heads, the Corn Maidens traveled to each tribe’s village, but the men of the village did not recognize one Corn Maiden from another. The men all felt like they could not pursue a Corn Maiden without knowing which Maiden she was.

Historians believe that the legend of the kachina disguise is the reason that in many Indian artworks all of the Corn Maidens look alike. The disguise made the Corn Maiden a more generic-appearing person.

Corn Maiden mythology has been around for centuries since different tribes used Maiden mythology to explain the creation of corn and other plants and animals that benefit humans. Creation mythology has always been important to Native American people.

Today, Corn Maiden mythology is kept alive in collections all over the United States. While the majority of Corn Maiden figurines are made in the southwestern United States, collectors, who love both southwest art and Native American art, are found in nearly every state of the union.

Beautiful Corn Maidens are made from a variety of materials, including clay, wood, silver, iron, malachite, turquoise, and coral. Some Corn Maidens have been carved from semi-precious stones and decorated with other stones. These are the most sought after Corn Maidens because they are the most beautiful.

ola lighthouse with appropriate 19th-century furnishings and accessories.

Chapters often raise funds for local P&R projects. The Prescott, Arizona, chapter hosts the Prescott Antique Show & Vintage Market as a fundraiser. Last year they raised \$16,000 which was used for several area preservation projects. Chapters can also apply for annual preservation grants from the national headquarters. In 2022, 18 grants were awarded to chapters in 11 states. Since the 1980s, the organization has awarded nearly \$1.5 million in preservation-related funding to chapter projects.

The Questers also has an affiliation with the National Trust for Historic Preservation in which chapters can have their name inscribed on Trust promotional signage alongside text that states, “This Place Matters.”

In addition to preservation projects, The Questers sponsors a two-year scholarship at Columbia University’s Gradu-

ate School of Architecture for students pursuing preservation-related graduate degrees. The group also sponsors a fellowship in art conservation at the Winterthur Museum offered in tandem with the University of Delaware.

Bardens was quoted as to why she felt antiques and related preservation efforts were worthwhile: “Antiques are part of human history, a tangible record of the things of everyday living.” She added, “The study of antiques gives the most pleasure to those who strive to learn all they can about where, when, why, and how they were made. Through discovery and knowledge of antiques, we may bring the past to life.”

While all that may sound serious and scholarly, Questers have plenty of light-heartednesses tied to their love of antiques. Much of the fun happens when members gather for the thrill of the hunt at local antique shops, flea

markets, and yard sales. As their motto claims, “Antiques are fun to search and a joy to find!”
