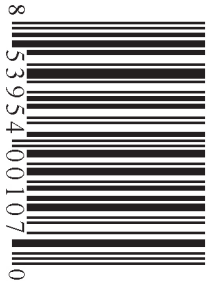

Electric football was the “Bzzzzz” among children in the ‘60s, ‘70s

Before Madden, before Tecmo Bowl and even before Atari Football, there was electric football. And this all started thanks to a company named Tudor Metal Products of New York.

Bzzzzzz!

That metallic hum and that familiar midcentury suburban thrum triggers memories of this highly popular, but noisy, children’s game of football. A switch is activated that turns on an electric or battery-powered counterbalanced motor, which in turn causes the field to vibrate, and these vibrations course through a thin metallic sheet and a miniature NFL offense convulses into action and deadlocks with a miniature NFL defense. Before you can cry “unnecessary roughness” the play is over.

The plastic players, which stand on a plastic base with tiny bristles (or prongs), would move, often erratically. The vibrating table would resemble 22 miniature panic attacks. Half the players would shake and fall down and the other half would cover in the end zones. The offensive and defensive lines smush together, spiraling in a circular rugby scrum that resembles a square dance.

The players of this electrified game stand just 1.3 inches tall. One could bend and twist the prongs below the base of each player to make a linemen hold his ground or a running back go left or right (or at least that was the idea). Quarterbacks and kickers had movable parts so one could throw a pass or attempt a field goal. The footballs were slivers of easily lost felt. And though passing was part of the game, actual completions were impossible.

Electric football’s ancestry can be traced back to 1929, when Elmer Sas incorporated Tudor Metal Products in New York City. The company’s main line of products included home safes and filing cabinets. The company also produced several electrified racing games at that time, mainly cars and horses that skittered along a track.

The company survived the Depression and in the late 1940s, Elmer’s son, Norman, became president of Tudor. Soon

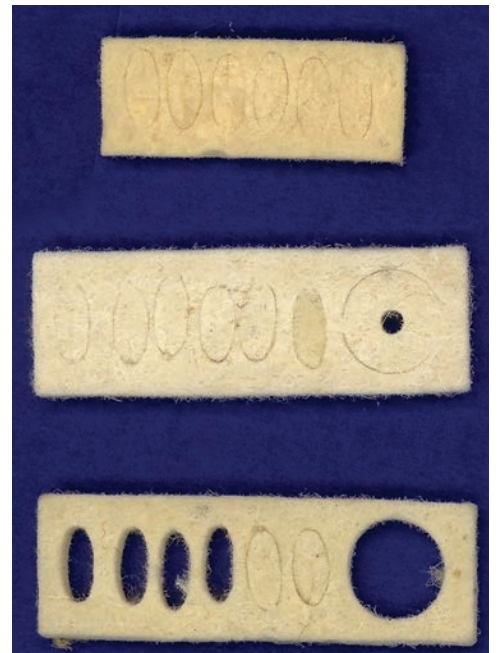


after taking over he had the idea of a tabletop football game. That’s when he invented the game of electric football.

Tudor’s first set of players were tiny little red, yellow or blue men that were one solid color. They stood 1.2 inches from the base. The small, metal playing field is scaled in the dimensions of a real football field. Tudor games came in various sizes: Mini (13 by 13 inches), Small (24 x 13), Medium (32 x 16) and Ultimate (48 x 24).

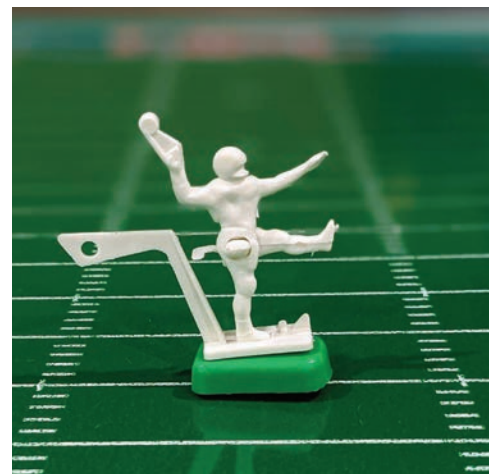
Those early No. 500 Electric Football models look crude to the modern eye, but imagine being a child on Christmas morning in 1949 and opening a gift to find one of the hottest toys of that time.

No spinners, no dice, no cards to flip over. Just flip the control switch and watch your players run all by themselves.

Tudor electric football was sold for the first 15 years with two-dimensional representations of players. Thanks to the efforts of Tudor’s designer, Lee Payne, fully sculpted three-dimensional plastic figures arrived in the early 1960s, at which point the game became a huge success. They called it Tudor No. 600 Model and this new set of players with their realistic appearance would change the game forever.

The miniature players were made close to the 1:72 scale and there were five different poses, often referred to as the ‘Fab 5’ poses. Tudor eventually came out with new Pro Pack Action Figures with a set of 13 new poses for these players.

The game kept evolving, adding more

realistic fields with lithographed crowd scene backgrounds complete with scoreboards. A softer plastic material was used to develop a quarterback that could run, pass and kick better than those of the past.

From the mid-1960s on, professional football grew in nationwide stature and the two rival leagues up to this point (the AFL and NFL) kicked off the first inter-league championship and eventually merged into a single NFL. Norman got the idea of painting the figures using actual NFL uniform colors. He worked with the creative services department of the NFL to obtain the NFL license for making quality NFL-looking teams that every kid back then wanted to have. For quite some time, it was the NFL’s most successful license and more than 40 mil-

INDIANAPOLIS — A Hook’s Drug Store neon sign lit up the bidders at the annual New Year’s Day auction at Heimel Auction Center. This annual event brings out a crowd of eager bidders.

Heimel said prices were strong throughout the eight-hour auction.

The original green neon Hook’s drug store sign, was hotly contested by the granddaughter of August “Bud” Hooks and a retired pharmacist who had worked for the Indianapolis-based firm.

In the end the sign sold for \$3,900.

Hook’s Drug Stores was an Indianapolis, Indiana-based drug store chain founded in 1900 by John A. Hook. The chain flourished throughout central Indiana for most of the 20th-century.



By 1912, the chain had expanded to 12 stores. In 1956, John Hook’s son, August F. “Bud” Hook, assumed leadership of the company. The chain added 150 new stores between 1946 and 1972.

Other advertising signs also did well with a Dr. Pepper clock reaching \$400.

Another highlight was a Gustav Stickley plate shelf that sold for \$450. A beautifully framed print of Abraham Lincoln sold for \$300 and a cigar store Indian made \$750.

LAWRENCEBURG, Tenn. – Donnie Watson, owner of Lawrenceburg Antiques in southern Tennessee is ringing in the New Year in a big way.

The 800 lots of antiques accessed from at least a dozen estates, including West Palm Beach and a prominent northern Alabama estate is bringing in a bevy of fine antique furniture, including: a R.J. 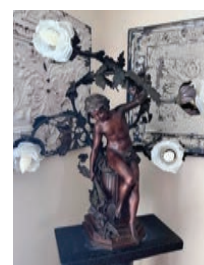

Time clock, an early walnut Ithaca calendar clock and mantel clocks, wall clocks and much, much more.

Add to that a collection of Victorian gold and porcelain umbrellas, including a Tiffany & Co. umbrella with a porcelain ball handle; a vast array of antique and vintage lighting, a collection of fine bronzes, and a collection of vintage advertising clocks (including Coca-Cola, Velvet Ice Cream and Diet Rite Cola).

There are also several selections of country store items, including a 23-drawer oak seed bin labeled "Sherer." Also selling under the hammer are a set of French dueling pistols, a rare James Rodgers "Self-Protector" knife pistol, several cut glass bowls and pitchers, a collection of Royal Dux figurines, early oil paintings and an extensive collection of German lidded steins.

"I think we got a little something for everyone," Watson said. Lawrenceburg Antiques has only one or two auctions a year. There is no online bidding for the events. The auction has a steady group of regular bidders that come to the southern Tennessee auction barn from most of the surrounding states, in addition to some bidders driving in from the West and Northeast parts of the country.

The auctions generally are an 8-hour event, with Alabama Auctioneer Stacey Pope calling bids in his customary fast and furious manner. "He's been doing our auctions for a long time," Watson said. "He's like family."

Lawrenceburg Antiques was founded by Watson's dad, Clyde, in early 1992. Donnie came in and took over most of the business in 1999. On

the morning of Nov. 11, 2017, before a scheduled auction, a fire erupted in the rear of the building. "It completely razed the building," Watson said, "but no one was hurt. I made my first call to the fire department, and my second call was to the good

Lord, praying that no one got injured in the fire."

That was about seven or eight auctions ago, Watson said. "They all kind of run together now." Since then he had a \$350,000 auction facility built with 8,000-9,000 square feet to accommodate his normal 120 active bidders on auction day.

Lawrenceburg Antiques takes absentee and phone bids. However,

both must be received on the Friday before the auction to be accepted. There is no phone bidding during the auction.

"We move at a fast pace," Watson says. "We usually start to run out of bidders before we run out of antiques."

lion of these games were sold.

In 1967, Tudor introduced its new flagship Model No. 620, complete with an improved metal playing surface, cardboard backdrop scoreboard, NFL-style goal posts and NFL-painted teams.

Tudor capped its popular game by creating the "TTC", or Total Team Control base, with its directional dial that allowed for finer route control and all new strategies.

Electric Football was highly popular, captivating imaginations like few toys ever had. Tudor did so well with the game that four companies also entered the fray. Over the decades, some of electric football's greatest innovations would come out of the competition between the companies.

Toy makers such as Cadaco and Gotham got into the electric football craze in 1956 and 1954 respectively. Gotham even got the endorsement of NFL Hall of Fame quarterback Joe Namath. Cadaco's Model No. G-880 was that company's first football game.

In 1967, Tudor brought out the '67 Deluxe Figures, painted to represent the (then) 16 NFL teams and nine AFL teams.

A very popular mold used in 1974-75 produced "Haiti" figures, named for the molded NFL players that were painted in Haiti at that time. These figures are detailed and well-painted and are highly sought after by collectors today. In addition to NFL teams, Tudor produced Army and Navy team figures. No college teams were produced, though Tudor provided paint so enthusiasts could adorn players accordingly.

By the late 1970s, Tudor created Invisible Cleats, a control mechanism at the

base of each player which can be moved to control the speed of the player's movement. The cleats (or prongs) below the bases were often trimmed with safety scissors or nail clippers to have the players run in a desired direction, or leave them squared off for maximum blocking. Generally, the less material touching the field, the faster the players would move. The more material touching the field, the 'stronger' the players were.

In 1978, Mattel released its first electronic, hand-held football game. There was no going back once the hand-helds appeared on the scene. Gaming systems like Nintendo and Sega, which boomed in the 1980s, made the electric football game obsolete. Electric football was no longer on the Christmas wish list of children.

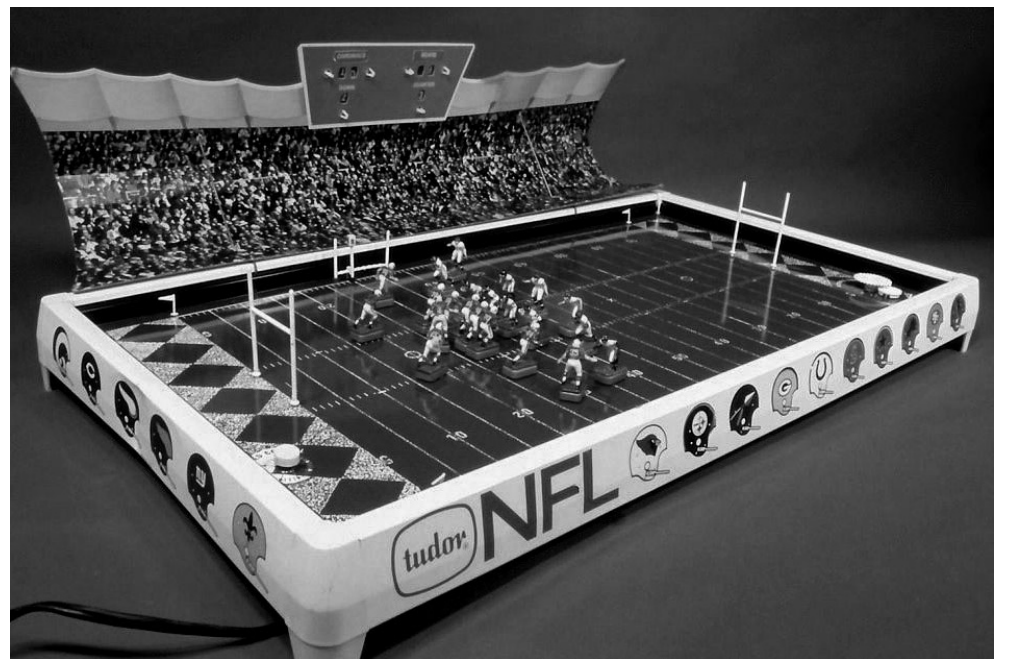
Electric football hobbyists and leagues in North America persist to this day. Tudor still manufactures an array of different playing fields, figures and bases.

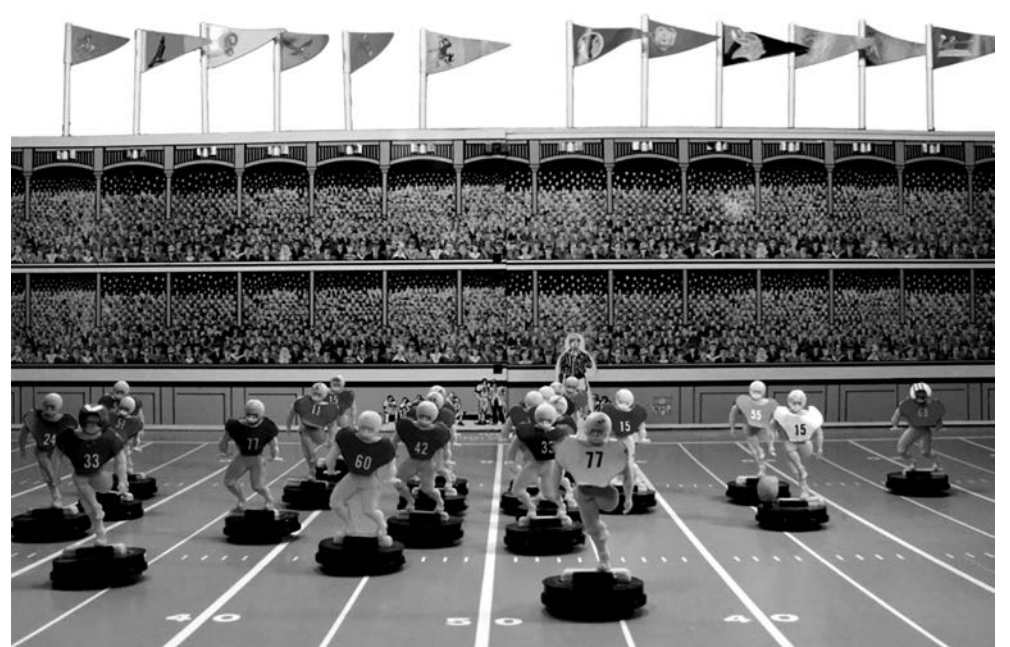
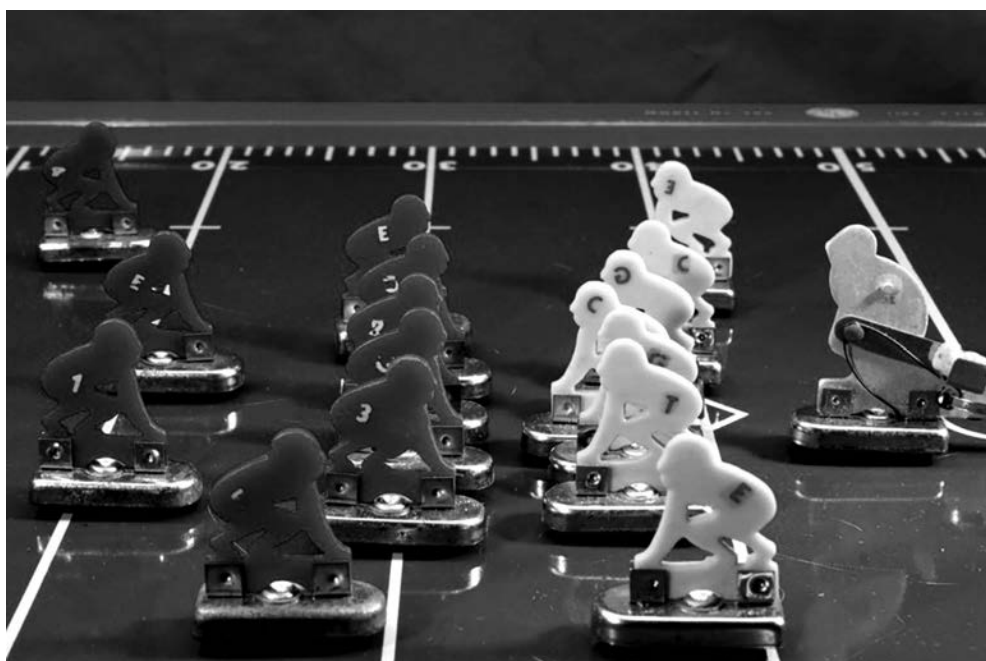
