Precious coral has been adorning people for centuries

Warm, coral-toned fruits, flowers, shells, and sunsets have charmed people since time immemorial. Precious Coral, bright organic invertebrates found along the coasts of Spain, northern Africa, Italy, and the South Pacific, is prized for both its beauty and mystical powers born of nature.

Ancient Greeks, believing that precious coral turned from plant to stone when exposed to air, deemed this peculiar matter "agreeable to the gods." Since this sea gem was associated with health, life, and luck, people evidently carried bits on their person to deflect winds, wild beasts, witchery, thunderbolts, hailstones, hurricanes, and all manner of disease and danger. Women wore coral bead necklaces and adorned their gold earrings with amuletic coral beads.

"Precious coral, or red coral, is the common name given to a genus of marine corals, Corallium. The distinguishing characteristic of precious corals is their durable and intensely colored red or pinkorange skeleton, which is used for making jewelry," according to Wikipedia.

Others believed that bright coral was born of blood. According to Greek mythology, when Perseus, son of Zeus, beheaded the snake-haired monster

Best Resources for Antiques." Medusa, her blood, dripping into the water, turned its seaweed red. So, coral-inspired amulets featuring

Medusa's likeness were considered lucky as well.

In addition, Greeks relied on crushed red coral to cure bladder disorders, diseases of the spleen, and all sorts of bleeding ailments.

Crushed coral, mixed with powdered d pumice and pulverized date pits, e, cuttlefish bones, and burnt salts, was el also considered an effective teethal whitener.

Romans believed that precious coral held healing powers too. Besides draping small amuletic twigs around children's necks to keep them from harm, they used it, powdered in water, to cure snake and scorpion bites, block life-threatening blood loss, smooth scars, and even diagnose disease. Additionally, coral ash, valued for its soothing, cooling powers, was added to eve salves.

From the 1st century CE, traders bartered fragments of this costly, highly desirable "red gold" along ancient caravan routes stretching from the Mediterranean to Central Asia, India, and farther. People not only incorporated bits in personal ornamentation but also embellished their

NEWS Dutch vehicle maker issued a line of Model T Fords

Limburg, a province making up the southeast finger of the Netherlands, was a peat- and coal-mining region. The coal industry in Limburg dates to at least the 16th century, when the Augustinian Abbey of Rolduc began mining operations on neighboring abbey lands. More coal reserves were discovered near Eygelshoven in 1870, leading to large scale mining which continued for the next 100 years.

As the impending closure of the Limburg mines loomed in the early 1960s, the Dutch State Mines (DSM) looked at possibilities for replacement jobs for the up to 75,000 people who would be unemployed. The automaker Nedcar (a DAF company) later took up some of the slack with the founding of its factory in Born in 1967.

Based in Heerlen, Limburg, Best-Box was established in 1959. In 1962, the company entered the fray in competition with England's Matchbox Toys, producing its own range of pocket-sized diecast metal cars. As the Limburg mines began to close in 1965, the DSM created programs for Workshops for Disabled Miners, and Best-Box was enlisted to provide employment for such former workers.

Best-Box focused on producing models of Dutch, German, French, British, and French vehicles. Mostly fitted with solid plastic wheels (first gray, then silver, then black), some Best-Box models had wheels with plastic hubs and separate tires, similar to those of various 1960s Matchbox vehicles.

The undersides of the chassis had "best - box" cast in, followed by the item number,

the make and model of the vehicle, and finally "MADE IN HOLLAND," or variations thereof. Best-Box noted that all its road car miniatures had seats, steering wheels, and spring suspension.

The first Best-Box toys were models of Dutch DAF vehicles. These were a 600 SeSEE DUTCH VEHICLE MAKER PAGE 4

Auctioneer Shane Hawkins obituary

From a young age, Hawkins was an active player in the antique arena. His wealth of knowledge was based on years of buying, selling and promoting antiques, family vacations and game nights with family and friends.

He is survived by his wife, Kimberly, whom he married on June 14, 2008; four children, Joseph (Debra) Spalding, Michelle (Andy Steinke) Spalding, Emily (Jesse) Moore, and Elizabeth (Kyle Kraftchick) Spalding; six grandchildren, Adrienne, Ryan, Emerson, Sarah, William and Owen; his parents, Dave (Shelly) Hawkins and Jackie (Donnie) Pardo; a sister, Damita (Tim) Nocton; a brother, Shawn Hawkins; a very close and dear friend, Sharon White and a large extended family of aunts, uncles, cousin, nieces and nephews.

dan, G 1300 DA 475 Refuse Truck, Fire Engine Truck, Torpedo Tipper Truck, Torpedo Open Truck, and Torpedo Closed Truck. The Torpedo trucks were six-wheelers, and the Open Truck was a flatbed. These early Best-Box models were sold in multicolored green, yellow, blue and red boxes, with a different color to each side of the carton.

Best-Box's other early models included a Volkswagen 1600 TL, Mercedes-Benz 220 SE, a Citroën ID19 Break, Ford Taunus 17 M Super, Opel Rekord, Jaguar E-Type, Mercedes-Benz 230 SL, Opel Rekord 1900, a Mercedes-Benz 250 SE Coupé, a Citroën Dyane, and a Ford Transit Van. There were also a Porsche 911 S and a BMW 2000 CS. All these passenger cars (including the Porsche and BMW but excluding the DAF 600) had opening side doors except the Citroën ID19 Break, which had an opening rear hatch.

Best-Box also produced a series of Formula One racing cars. These were a Ferrari, a Brabham, a Cooper-Maserati, and a Lotus, all listed as models of 1966 racers. Additionally, there was a BRM, a Honda, and a McLaren—all Formula One cars.

Best-Box departed from its European theme with a series of Ford Model-T vehicles. These were a Pick-Up, Road-Tanker, Crane-Truck, Delivery-Van, Two-Seater, Sedan, and Transporter (an advertising truck). Early versions of these models had metal spoked wheels; these were later changed to plastic.

In the early 1970s the company dropped the Best-Box name and sold the toys under the Efsi moniker.

The original Best-Box vehicles were renumbered, and some of the castings were changed slightly. Efsi models had "efsi," "MADE IN HOLLAND" or "HOLLAND," the make of the vehicle, and the item number all cast into the bases of the toys. The company began to emphasize coaches and trucks sized to match HO scale model railways. With its truck focus, Efsi went to town with livery possibilities, using those of many Dutch brands.

There were several incarnations of Mercedes trucks. These were an Open Truck (flatbed), Covered Truck (flatbed with can-



opy), Red Cross, Army, Dump Truck, and Army Dump Truck. You could also get trailers for your Mercedes trucks: a standard trailer, a Red Cross variation, and an Army version. Efsi also made a Mercedes Fire Ladder truck, and a Mercedes tanker trunk in liveries such as Elf, Aral, and Shell.

Efsi continued to produce Mercedes and BMW cars, some of them as rally models, and they kept on with their Ford Transit Vans. The latter were available as the standard cargo van, as well as in police and ambulance formats.

The Dutch maker also produced several Land Rover models. All 109 versions, these included a tow truck, military, safari/gamekeeper (with World Wide Fund for Nature panda bear logo on the door), ambulance/ rescue, UNICEF, Land Rover 40th anniversary, police, and some civilian variations.

In 1986 Holland-Oto Miniatures obtained the Efsi molds. Holland-Oto start-

ed manufacturing some of the former Efsi models in about 1988, and the company is still in business in Limburg today producing scale models of trucks. Headquartered in Weert in Limburg province, Holland-Oto soldiered on with many of the Efsi vehicles such as the Commers and the Land Rovers, and delved deeper into the world of HO scale trucks, coaches, and buses. They currently offer a myriad of coaches and articulated trucks, mostly for corporate clients.

If you care to take the plunge into Dutch diecast, you'll be wondering what collecting possibilities exist in the vintage Dutch diecast world. Best-Boxes with their original packaging are pretty scarce in online auctions. Models in nice condition without packaging are easier to find, though there is hardly a proliferation of these 1960s classics.

If you move on to Efsi, the market explodes, and you'll find that even mint, packaged examples are fairly widespread. Partly because of the great expansion of the range after 1971, Efsi models are generally easier to find than Best-Boxes. The Model-T Fords are perhaps the most common. Should you also explore auctions for Holland-Oto models, you'll likewise find the pickings pretty rich.

End of an era for Gary David Designs means opportunities for bidders

BONITA SPRINGS, Fla. – For nearly 40 years Sue Purcell and her husband, Gary David Niethamer lived the life many antiquers would envy.

In 1981, Gary opened Gary David Designs in Bonita Springs, Florida. In 1986, he hired his first employee, Sue Purcell. They married in 1994. Both Gary and Sue had a sharp eye for antiques. Their plan was both audacious and simple. The 1980s was a boom time for antiques and particularly the wealthy tier of the American economy.

"We catered to the high end," Purcell now says. "We started what is now considered an "old fashioned" design firm. We worked with architects and builders. The Bonita Springs area was flourishing, and we began dealing with people who had second, third and even fourth homes. These people were looking for one-ofa-kind unique pieces of décor and we delivered."

At the height of their firm's meteoric rise into the "upper market," Purcell said, Gary David Design employed 35 employees. The couple traveled throughout North America, Europe and Asia collecting antiques, one-of -a-kind pieces and making important contacts among overseas antique dealers and exporters.

Through their contacts, they also established a "house swapping' plan,

with Europeans to easier facilitate more shopping venues overseas. It was an easy gambit from sunny Florida in the winter. They spent a great deal of off-hours time skiing in Germany, Austria and Switzerland. They enjoyed several weeks of shortterm living in Paris, on the Island of Corsica, and beautiful Venice in Italy.

"The memories we have are priceless," Purcell says.

However, time has moved on.

Covid-19 and the Internet changed most of their methods of business. Gary has experienced poor health the past few years and Purcell is approaching her 70s. With a 10,000-square-foot warehouse brimming with antiques and collectibles, the job has become "overwhelming" for Purcell. They are closing the famed Gary David Design office and offering their entire inventory at auction.

Many of the antiques – like their memories - are nearly priceless.

A massive four-day online only auction on HiBid.com conducted by Earlywine Auctions is currently accepting bids, with closing scheduled for 6 p.m. on April 5-8. Earlywine Auctions, of Kokomo, Indiana, is employing a "soft close," meaning that any bids placed in the last three minutes of the items closing will extend the bidding for another three minutes.

Most of the items are one-of-a-kind pieces, many of which were handmade by European and Asian artisans. Staff from Earlywine auctions spent several days wading through the eclectic items stored in the warehouse and gallery.

"What impressed me is that all the items are clean," Brent Earlywine,

owner of Earlywine Auctions, said. "And the breadth of the offerings is amazing with much of the inventory bought from shops and markets throughout the world.

The auction includes a pair of late 1700s heavily carved Chinese temple brackets (24-27 inches tall) supporting a 4-inch coral stone top made into a 6-foot console table, a collection of a "couple hundred" bronzes, tempera paintings of Chinese emperors and empresses from the 1800s purchased from a British antique vendor, gates and grill works from India, a multitude of decorative items and builder models.

"There's such a high range of items," Earlywine said. "There are \$50 and \$100 items, up to items that should bring \$20,000."

Some of the items have been in the warehouse for decades, the consignors said. Vintage and more modern pieces of furniture by high-end firms include Maitland-Smith, Marge Carson and Henredon.

A public inspection of auction items from Gary David Designs studio, located at 24940 Tamiami Trail, Ste. 201 in Bonita Springs will be conducted on April 1, 3 and 4 from noon to 5 p.m. Nationwide shipping is also available through Pak-n-Ship from Davie, Florida.

Bakelite and comic characters combined to make pencil sharpeners

The advent of synthetic plastic began in 1907 when Belgian chemist Leo Baekeland submitted his patent one day before his rival Scottish chemist James Swinburne. Combining phenol – a common disinfectant – with formaldehyde, Baekeland developed what is now commonly known as Bakelite synthetic plastic.

Popular for its durability and ability to be commercially molded into various shapes, Bakelite was popularized in manufacturing electrical casings, jewelry, radios, engine parts, and everything in between.

When Baekeland founded the Bakelite Corp., the tagline for the company was "The Material of a Thousand Uses." In the 1920s, dyes were introduced into the phenol-formaldehyde plastic giving it those bright colors coveted by collectors. Competing accounts suggest American Catalin Corporation introduced the insertion of color dyes in 1927, while others suggest American Catalin Corporation controlled the market after the original Bakelite patents expired. Regardless, Catalin developed translucent, molded casting resins in approximately 20 different colors.

One of the uses of this new product was the production of character pencil sharpeners which are now coveted by collectors. The pencil sharpeners appeal to pop culture collectors, particularly Disneyana and cartoon enthusiasts.

The beauty of these collectibles is that they fall under three categories for collectors: (1) Bakelite / Catalin, (2) pencil sharpeners, and (3) cartoon characters. The latter particularly draws Disneyana collectors, given the proliferation of Disney characters imprinted on top of common Bakelite sharpeners. Popular characters include Mickey Mouse, Minnie Mouse, Donald Duck, Goofy, Snow White, and Pinocchio, whereas the rarer Timothy Mouse and Casey Junior from Dumbo, Ferdinand the Bull, and Geppetto's pet goldfish Cleo can also be found.

Other character sharpeners represent the pop culture of the 1930's and 1940's, including another beloved comic character Popeye. Similar to other Bakelite sharpeners, various colors palettes exist for the same cartoon imprint of Popeye. Whereas a bright green Popeye Bakelite may exist, so, too, does an orange version. Another popular set of sharpeners is for the TV series Our Gang (also known as The Little Rascals), which include images of Spanky and Pete the Pup, to name a few.

Other pencil sharpeners include those purchased at the 1939 New York World's Fair, Charlie McCarthy, a G-Man revolver, patriotic symbols, mantel clocks, and a Scottie Dog. Given the variety and overlap, the appeal of these pencil sharpeners spans various collectors. The extra couple seconds looking through a display case at an antique show may yield a nice addition to your collection.





PAGE 20 Orrey clock and music box will wow bidders at Cottone auction

GENESEO, N.Y. - Cottone Auctions' Important Timepieces & Decorative Arts auction, on Friday, March 31, will feature the incredible collection of Dr. William Thomas of Naples, Florida, showcasing 50 of the finest examples of French and European clock masterpieces.

Both rarity and condition were important to Dr. Thomas. Highlighting his collection is an extremely rare Raingo orrery clock and music box, with original matching pedestal. The clock and music box are in fine running order with beautiful patina and gilt bronze mounts, in remarkably original condition, possibly one of the finest known examples.

An orrery is a mechanical model of the solar system, one that illustrates or predicts the relative positions and motions of the planets and moons. Orreries are typically driven by a clockwork mechanism with a globe representing the sun at the center, and with a planet at the end of each of the arms.

Most known examples, like the present clock, are in the form of a gilt mounted, four column rotunda, veneered with mahogany or amboyna. Few rest on a musical base, playing on the hour or at will. A well-known example, now at Windsor Castle was purchased by King George IV in 1824. The clock offered at auction was purchased from renowned horologist, Jim Cipra of Long Beach, California, who acquired it from an important Portuguese collection.


The orrery clock, signed Raingo A. Paris, circa 1820, has an exceptional Amboyna burl veneer and gilt bronze Neoclassical case in the form of a classical rotunda temple. It is supported on a round base that is set on a plinth with cylinder musical movement. It is estimated to sell in the \$150,000 to \$200,000 range.

Another masterpiece from Dr. Thomas' collection is an exceptional Louis XVI Regulator with equation of time and remontoire, clockmaker Robert Robin, Horloger du Roi, renowned enameller Joseph Coteau and case attributed to Pierre-Philippe Thomire, Paris, circa 1785, the quintessence of Parisian luxury horology during the reign of Louis XVI. Such clocks were made for a handful of important connoisseurs, often people who were close to the royal family.

The regulator being offered features a stunning dial by Joseph Coteau (1740-1801) who is regarded as the greatest enameller of all time, supplying dials for the most em-

inent horologists, including Antide Janvier (1751-1835), Robert Robin (1742-1809) and Ferdinand Berthoud (1727-1807). This finely painted, jeweled and enameled porcelain dial with astrological zodiac cartouches is signed 'Coteau.' It stands a little over 15 inches tall and is in running condition, with an estimate of \$100,000-\$150,000.

Also up for bid will be Tiffany Studios (N.Y.) lamps from the collection of Dr. Robert McGann of Naples, Florida, led by a Poppy lamp with a 16-inch shade (est. \$50,000-\$80,000). Other fine works by Tiffany Studios from various private collections include a rare Lotus lamp with a 26-inch shade (est. \$80,000-\$120,000); a Poinsettia lamp with lighted turtleback base (est. \$40,000-\$60,000); and a Tiffany Studios Dichroic Curtain Border floor lamp (est. \$60,000-\$80,000).

Highlighting American paintings will be an oil on paper by Albert Bierstadt (1830-1902), titled A View of the High Sierras, included in the database being compiled for a forthcoming catalogue raisonné of the artist's work and acquired from William Hailes (Rochester, N.Y.) in the 1930s by Mr. and Mrs. Edward Crumpston (Rochester, N.Y.).

Asian items will feature an Imperial Chinese parcel gilt Bronze censer, mark and period of Qianlong (1736-1795), bronze with gilding, circular censor, bombe form and splayed foot, with Qingqing six character mantra (Om Mani Padme Hum) and celestial elephant handles, from a Buffalo, New York estate (est. \$3,000-\$5,000); an early Chinese gilt iron seated figure of Guanyin or Bodhisattva Avalokiteshvara; as well as Japanese Meji mixed metal warriors.

Americana and Native American offerings will include a Federal satinwood and mahogany bow-front chest of drawers, signed and dated Saco, Maine, 1812 (est. 10,000-\$15,000); and a hand-painted miniature of Lady Liberty, signed Abijah Canfield, April 1797, depicting a female figure dressed in a classical Greek or Roman costume, as well as a "cap of liberty" (est. \$5,000-\$8,000).

shields, weapons, helmets, and horse trappings with protective coral inlay.

From the mid-1200s, when the Mongol Empire stretched from Europe to Asia, precious coral, carried along great Eurasian trade routes, left bright rosy traces in its wake.

Bits of this precious matter eventually embellished Mongolian beaded necklaces, Turkish belt buckles, Uzbekistani jewelry, Tibetan ritual masks, Indian amulets, and Nepali dagger sheaths. Even as civilizations rose and fell and trade routes sank into the sand, belief in precious coral's mysterious origin, spiritual nature, visual allure, and protective powers endured.

As early as the 15th century, the shallow waters around Corsica, Sicily, Sardinia, and Naples, Italy had become major centers of precious coral fishing and jewelry production. Initially, workers cleaned and sorted heaps of these rough, knotted, gnarled, fibrous, highly prized coral twigs. Smaller bits, softer and more fragile than other precious gems, were carefully handcut, drilled, ground, then filed into convex, flat-backed cabochons for jewelry or variously sized beads for rosaries. Coarser strings of coral, meant for the expanding East Indian and African trade, were briefly hand-polished with pumice stone. Finer beads, however, were placed in pumicefilled canvas bags which craftsmen laboriously kneaded in water until they reached a high, glossy sheen. Then these were strung on necklaces or mounted on brooches, earrings, or rings.

Larger pieces of Italian precious coral, which took longer to develop, were exceedingly popular during the Victorian era. British gentlemen favored vibrantly hued cabochon or carved coral cufflinks. Their wives wore dramatic button brooches or delicately carved florals, gold-set cameos, rosy pink pendants, brooches, and bracelets gleaming with cloisonné, seed pearl, sapphires or diamond accents. Others preferred exotic pieces featuring natural, spiky-shaped branch coral forms, sometimes enhanced with freshwater cultured pearls.

Salmon-hued, orange, red, pink, or less

design, length, its weight, and bead size, can command well over \$10,000. Coral pieces enhanced with а wealth of sparkling gemstones generally cost considerably more.

Enthusiasts may enjoy perusing

including coral. Others may find the expansive, highly embellished volume, "Where Corals Lie: A Natural and Cultural History" by J. Malcolm Shick, of interest. It explores our relationship with coral through the prisms of art, jewelry, literature, folklore, history, commerce, politics, geology, and biology. It also discusses threats to its continuing existence.

desirable pinkish-white "angel skin" precious coral jewelry soon charmed Americans as well. Through the early 1900s, companies, like Van Cleef & Arpels and Cartier, introduced a wealth of dramatic, deeply-hued Art Deco coral items, often paired with pearls, garnets, rubies, diamonds, enamel, marcasite, jet, or onyx set in gold or platinum. By mid-century, multi-strand necklaces featuring precious coral beads petite or plump, as well as fancy, cabochon cut coral cocktail rings, pendants, and stud earrings became trendy.

By this time, Mediterranean precious coral, introduced to the American southwest centuries earlier, had also become an integral part of the Native American economy. Though typically passed from one generation to the next as protection from envy, jealousy and "bad medicine," in times of need, coral also served as portable wealth. To this day, coral-tipped silver bracelets, bolos, concho belts, cuff bracelets, rings, and necklaces are not only exchanged for horses, sheep, and cows, but also serve as pawn pledges at Native American reservation trading posts. Only if unclaimed do these authentic, Native-worn "old pawn" treasures reach the general market. Though they may be very costly, to many, they are wildly collectible. Additionally, examples are often found in prestigious museums.

Contemporary Native American creations are far more accessible. Produced in large numbers for the international market and the tourist trade, most feature bright, angular precious coral and turquoise patterns set in

pieces, like pins, bangles, and earrings, feature tiny, coral "needlework" bead patterns or naturalistic bits of coral worked into traditional designs. Others, like Zuni chokers, pendants, and brooches, feature fine channel work or inlays combining coral, shell, mother-of-pearl, black jet, and turquoise bits forming traditional images of Sun Face, Rain Bird, or Thunderbird. Other Native American creations, like Hopi and Navajo necklaces, feature amazingly tiny, tube-shaped precious coral beads, dramatic twigs, or plump, polished, multi-stone combinations. Yet among coral connoisseurs, works like Kenneth Begay's diamond and gold collages, Charles Loloma's elegant inlays, and Verma Neguatewa's subtle, stunning mosaics are far more collectible.

Some people look for stunning sculptures, natural specimens, or protective coral amulets- rather than jewelry.

Though jewels featuring pink, salmon, or "angel skin" coral is alluring and relatively inexpensive, those worked in deep, dramatic blood-red coral are most desirable. These also tend to be the most expensive. Fine red coral carved brooches, depending on their designs, size, and settings, can cost anywhere from several hundred to several thousand dollars. A necklace, depending on


