Spice up your recipes with a vintage cookbook

AbeBooks reports the \$7,500 sale of a first-edition two-volume set "Mastering the Art of French Cooking: Volumes 1&2" by Julia Child. A feature story in "The Washington Post" considers "America's 'kitchen bibles,' mid-century to modern." competitive "cook-offs" are available for viewing 24/7, on everything from tablets to widescreen TVs. There's no doubt about it: What's in the oven or atop the range isn't the only thing that's hot.

"Broadly speaking, one of the most robust categories in terms of new books is cookbooks," said Don Lindgren, proprietor of "Rabelais - Fine Books on Food & Drink." This surge in interest extends to older cookbooks as well, he continued. "There's been a rise in sales over the last 20 years." With one of the country's largest selections of rare and out-of-print cookbooks, as well as a significant collection of culinary manuscripts and ephemera, Lindgren should know. Making the switch 15 years ago to food- and drink-related books, the southern Maine resident declared cookbooks to be "the most engaging books I've ever worked with."

Because food is "a deep expression of cultures around the world," essential to sustaining human life, it's not surprising that cookbooks, in one form or another, date to early times (think Babylonian tablets, he said). Moreover, cookbooks are "extremely complex." Lindgren went so far as to call them "really weird."

Unlike other books, cookbooks are often literally set apart. Not generally displayed among volumes on a personal library bookshelf, they are often stored in "a pantry, on a kitchen cabinet, or on an extra shelf around the corner from the kitchen." As Lindgren said, "They tend to live in a different part of the house."

Aside from a family Bible, a cookbook might well be the one book most likely to be handed down from generation to generation, making it an expression of continuity and tradition."

It's not unusual to find that a cookbook has been personalized, either with handwritten notes directly on the pages or with extra slips of paper, either stuffed among the pages, or





glued to or pasted onto the book's leaves. Lindgren has also discovered notes that were pinned onto, sewn into. or affixed with sealing wax to bound volumes. Although altered books are finds those with "evidence of use" intriguing.

For lovers of social history, not just aspiring chefs, cookbooks can be a treasure trove of information, providing


"a real look into a place at a specific moment in time." Whereas many early cookbooks were written with the "privileged" in mind, the first known cookbook written by an American was not technically in perfect condition, he meant as a guide for young people living on their own. Providing them with information to make them more

Tiffin Flea Market opened strong with first outing of the year

TIFFIN, Ohio —The huge Tiffin Flea Market commenced its 45th season the weekend of April 28-29. From humble beginnings in 1978, it has become the largest flea market in Northwest Ohio.

The annual flea market series is sponsored by the Seneca Junior Fair Foundation, a non-profit, all-volunteer organization providing programs and opportunities for local youth to develop leadership skills. Proceeds from the flea market have helped improve the fairgrounds, including funding the construction of the hog barn, beef barn, and youth center. Joan Zimmerman, flea market coordinator for the Foundation, who took over operations after founder Don Ziegler passed away in 2011, is quick to applaud all the efforts.

Anywhere from 250-400 dealers set up inside numerous buildings and outside along the fairgrounds' main aisles. In an interview with Tiffin's Advertiser-Tribune, Ms. Zimmerman noted that this year, large numbers of vendors made space arrangements ahead of time. Over 300 dealers were anticipated - many of them new faces - and all the buildings were expected

The abundance of vendors attracts throngs of shoppers. As many as 5,000-10,000 come to shop for antiques, collectibles, crafts, traditional flea market goods, and even local agricultural products. Zimmerman said the first show of the season attracts a big crowd.

As with most flea markets, vintage tools were plentiful, often priced as low as \$1 each. One standout was a small jewelry anvil priced at \$55, made by the former Columbian Vise Company of Cleveland. Nearby sat another common sight at shows like these - vintage cast iron cookware. An entire booth was filled with pieces, including skillets, loaf pans, cauldrons, and Dutch ovens, starting at \$20.

Across the aisle, the cast iron theme carried over to salesman sample stoves. There, 6-inch and 8-inch



Teich was one of the largest producers of promotional postcards

Curt Otto Teich (March 1877 - 1974) an American publisher of German ancestry turned out postcards in a myriad of bright color tones. His work delved into all things American: Travel, scenic views, landmarks, and anything else under the sun. Teich led the way in employing the offset printing process in producing his postcards. The Curt Teich & Company grew into the world's leading producer of promotional postcards.

Teich emigrated from Germany in 1895, where he was employed printer's apprentice in Lobenstein. Once in America, he started his printing career in New York City. Three years later he moved to Chicago, where he opened his own business, Curt Teich & Company.

"Greetings From" touting various cities across the country was one example of his


pot-belly models were priced at \$25 each. The seller also had a cast iron Crescent model cook stove for \$40 and a Bluebird model for \$35.

Vintage toy lovers found items like a 1930s Wyandotte Toys pressed steel ambulance for \$120 and a tin litho Alpine Express by Ohio Art, with cars and the original box, for \$60. The table-full of HO-scale train cars may have been more common but were nominally priced at \$20 for engines and \$5 for freight cars. For buyers preferring something rideable, there was a 1960s AMF Fire Fighter Unit 508 pedal car

in good vintage condition for \$175 and a new Schwinn Tango tandem bike for \$400

Anyone after popular mid-century and retro items had plenty to pick from. Vinyl records graced numerous booths, with prices starting around \$3. For someone needing to store records, there was a 1970s-era brass 45 record holder for \$7. Retro barware was prevalent and included a pair of Stroh's nautical lantern beer signs for \$40 each and a set of six mid-century owl cocktail glasses for \$35.

Electronic items came from a variety of eras and in many forms. Options ranged from a 1930s wood-cased Crosley table radio in working condition

for \$75 to an 80s-era handheld Oregon Trail video game shaped like a MacIntosh computer for \$10.

Shoppers drawn to traditional antiques found pieces like a 24-inch embossed steel antique milk can by O.M. Company of Orville, Ohio, tagged at \$40. Another booth sported two manual typewriters from the 1930s, each with their case and in exceptional condition. One was a black Royal with its original certificate for \$150; the other was a tan Underwood for \$200. Outside, a vendor offered a variety of produce and beverage crates for \$20 each, including a rare example from Toronto's defunct Vita Beverages, LTD.

The only lacking category seemed to be furniture, although some booths had the occasional piece. The exception was an outdoor booth filled with upcycled furniture from the 1920s-1970s ranging in price from \$35 to over \$200.

Each Tiffin Flea Market runs from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Saturday and 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Sunday, rain or shine, and is large enough to fill an entire day. If the weather gets uncooperative, most of the vendors are under roof and there are plenty of shaded and covered areas. On the grounds are multiple food concessioners serving everything from BBQ to kettle corn. In addition to browsing sellers' merchandise, guests can also patronize local organizations

like the Knights of Columbus and Cub Scouts.

The Seneca County Fairgrounds are located at 100 Hopewell Avenue in Tiffin, off US 224 and Market Street. Signs are posted. Admission and parking are free. Be aware, while parking is free, nobody directs. Early in the day, parking can be difficult, so have patience. The facilities are handicap accessible but much of the grounds are not paved. Porters are available to help move larger purchases to shoppers' vehicles.

Six additional Tiffin Flea Markets are scheduled for 2023: May 20-21, June 10-11, July 1-2, August 19-20, September 16-17, and October 7-8.

signature linen-textured postcards where he used vibrant colors and sported huge letters in bold print. This type of postcard was first seen in 1890s Germany. In 1904 Teich promoted "Greetings From" postcards for the American market.

Teich put a large cadre of traveling salesmen to work, selling his postcards door-to-door He also tapped the commercial market to use his advertising postcards. This process entailed his salesmen photographing the businesses and working with them to generate a fanciful representation

in 1978 when the Curt Teich & Company shuttered its doors, the Teich family contributed the company's records and store of postcards to the Lake County Discovery Museum in Illinois. This museum opened its doors to the public where they could view the Curt Teich Postcard Archive. In 2016, the archives were again moved to the Newberry Library. In total, the Newberry Library took delivery of nearly 2.5 million items. Contained within this bounty were 500,000 postcards. On April 3, 2017, the

Danish line of Tekno toys delight today's collectors

The Tekno scale model toy company was created in 1935 as a brand name of Dansk Legetois Industri (Danish Toy Industry). The latter was founded in 1928 by Danish plumber Andreas Siegumfeldt, who began by making toys in his basement in the Vanløse district of Copenhagen. Under the Tekno name, the company started to produce tinplate cars, fire tenders and other model vehicles. When Tekno was confronted with the wartime tinplate ban in 1940, the maker nimbly switched to the manufacture of wooden toys.

Tekno commenced production of its celebrated diecast models in the postwar period. The lingering tin shortage (and the scarcity of other metals as well) after the war led Tekno to turn to a zinc-based alloy for diecast manufacture. The alloy, called Zamac, was made up of zinc, aluminum, magnesium and copper (Zamac being an acronym for those metals). These early diecast toys included a number of Dodge and Ford trucks, emergency vehicles and aircraft.

Tekno grew, and formed a partnership with another Danish toymaker, H Lange, in 1948-49. The company created its export division, Tekno Svenska AB, in 1950. With this expansion in its business, Tekno began shipping its models to Holland, Germany, the UK and the US. As the company completely wound down its production of tinplate toys in the mid-1950s, export of its diecast toys flourished. Tekno's models of Volkswagen vans in various liveries proved especially popular.

Toymaker Kirk Production bought H Lange in 1960, and the success of Tekno's model autos continued to grow. The 1960s was the golden age of diecast toys and models, with such British makers as Corgi, Dinky and Matchbox famous the world over. Tekno's sales peaked at over one million models per year during this decade. Approximately two-thirds of these sales were made up of exports.

Tekno founder Andreas Siegumfeldt died in 1969, and the models started to be made under the Kirk brand name in 1970. That year and in 1971, tug-of-war acquisitions of Tekno by Kirk and Algrema financially undermined the company, leading to Algrema-Tekno becoming insolvent in 1972. After this economic fallout, Vanmin BV, a Dutch importer of Tekno goods, bought the Danish company.

By 1974 this purchase created Tekno Toys. The new Dutch-owned Tekno was based in Delft, the Netherlands. Dutch Tekno moved further into the manufacture of

detailed scale models designed for adults. In order to highlight the fact that their products were intended for collectors, the company dropped the word "toys" from its name in 1989.

Today, Tekno is owned by the Van Buuren company and is headquartered in Maasland. In order to differentiate it from the original Danish Tekno, it is sometimes referred to as "Tekno Holland."

Danish Tekno was known for its 1:43rd and 1:50th scale models of Scandinavian vehicles. These included representations of the Volvo Viking truck in many guises. Tekno produced a multitude of these as tankers, auto transporters, low loaders, dairy trucks, moving vans, timber carriers, dump trucks and more.

Tekno also created models of the Volvo Express truck in both articulated and standard forms. These ranged from fire tenders to refrigerated trucks to dropsides

Bidders flocked to turkey calls at Furlo auction

BAY CITY, Mich. — Certain auctions have an almost magnetic appeal that is rooted in the merchandise offered. That was the case with the 200 lots of handcrafted turkey calls available in the final of five auctions to liquidate the Robert and Judith Kareus wildlife memorabilia collection. The March 28-April 23 sale was conducted on HiBid by Michigan's Furlo Auction & Appraisal Service. In addition to the turkey calls, this round also featured commemorative knives, hunting memorabilia,

and wildlife art.

The turkey call stars of the show came in many styles. There was the most recognizable "box" type, as well as slate and glass disc, trumpet wing bone, and wedge varieties. Several sold for three-figure final bids, including a slate call signed and dated 7-16 by artist Don Bald that sold for \$329. It came with a matching striker and cleaner and featured hand carving on both the call and its striker.

A \$305 winning bid took home a but-





Monumental racing trophy made in Virginia joins Williamsburg collection

WILLIAMSBURG, Va. — In October 1810, a horse named Madison (likely in honor of President James Madison), won first place in a race held at the New-Market racecourse in Petersburg, Virginia. Its owner, Revolutionary War veteran Burwell Bassett Wilkes (1757-1815) of Brunswick Country, Virginia, received a \$400 cash prize for the win. Although Wilkes, who had turned to farming and breeding in the decades following the war, had several prized racehorses, this victory was certainly his greatest equestrian triumph. To mark the event, Wilkes converted his stakes into a monumental and unparalleled piece of early Virginian silver holloware. Known as the "Madison" Horse Racing Trophy, it descended through five generations of the Wilkes family before recently coming to The Colonial Williamsburg Foundation's esteemed silver collection.

"Following more than two hundred years of careful preservation in the family of its original owner, Colonial Williamsburg is honored to become the permanent steward of this important and monumental example of early Virginia silversmithing," said Ronald L. Hurst, the Foundation's senior vice president for education and historic resources.


Grand in stature, the Madison trophy stands 13 ¼ inches high and expands to 10 ¼ inches between its lip and its handle. Made and marked by Johnson & Reat (1804-1815) of Richmond, Virginia, the trophy is similar in form to a cream pot but on a majestic scale. Its tall, helmet-shaped body is of swollen, rectangular cross-section and has two bands at its

mid-point. While the top one is plain and convex, the lower band is milled and carries an undulating grapevine motif. The right side of the trophy bears an engraved inscription, while the other carries an engraved racecourse scene replete with an American flag at the finish line, centered around a cast appliqué of two galloping horses and their jockeys running neck and neck—with Madison in the lead. The body flows into a very narrow neck set above a stepped, rectangular foot with a strip of the same grapevine banding at the bottom. Its pouring lip is edged with an applied gadrooned band that ends

in an even higher three-dimensional horse's head crest. Made of hollow repoussé construction, the horse head details are applied, chased and engraved.

"The Madison Trophy is colossal, a work of silversmithing genius, and jaw-dropping to see. It will instantly grab and hold your attention," said Erik Goldstein, senior curator of mechanical arts, metals and numismatics. "Nothing like it exists in the world of early 19th-century, Virginia-made silver, and it is unique in the collections of Colonial Williamsburg for many reasons."

Wilkes, being "low and weak of body," composed his estate plan in late 1814; he passed away the following year at the age of 57. Described in his will as "a silver Cupp won by Madison," the trophy went to his daughter Mary "Polly" Wilkes, who saw fit to scratch variations of her initials into the underside of the foot. It seems the formal inscription was added years later and included the erroneous date "Spring, 1811" as shown by contemporary newspaper accounts. The trophy has been preserved in Virginia by Burwell Wilkes' descendants since it was made.







and fresh-produce trucks. Tekno also manufactured models of the Volvo F88 and F89 transport trucks, plus various Volvo buses.

Not forgetting aviation buffs, the Danish company made several airliner models, such as a Caravelle in Swissair or SAS livery, the DC-7C propeller airliner, plus jet fighters including the F-100 Super Sabre. There were also models of many other aircraft, such as World War II bombers and fighters.

Amongst Tekno's other creations were a range of 1:87th scale plastic cars, dollhouse furniture, figures and games. Additionally, the company produced building sets akin to those of Erector and Meccano. Marketed as Ingeniørsæt, or "Engineering Set," they featured green flatiron pieces, orange pulleys and wheels, and brass nuts and bolts. Some sets came with electric motors and batteries to provide power to various creations which could be constructed from the set's components.

Danish Tekno models are much sought after by collectors of classic diecast. Let's have a look at results from some recent online auctions.

First considering examples in good condition, a Volvo Crane Truck (wrecker) realized \$20, a Volvo flatbed went for \$36, a Vespa with cargo sidecar sold for \$57, while

a Volvo dropside truck in Cherry Heering livery auctioned for \$192. The high demand by collectors for Tekno VW vans is reflected by an example in Jolly Cola livery in good condition which realized \$440, and one in Buko livery in good condition which fell under the hammer for \$900.

For examples graded as very good, a military Jeep, Jaguar E-Type, Dodge army truck, Ford Taunus Minibus and a Mig jet fighter each sold for \$30-35. A Mercedes-Benz 220SE, Opel Kadett, Ford Taunus and a VW Bus taxi each realized \$40-50; while a Volvo PV544, Saab 96 and a VW van in BP livery all auctioned for \$60-63 each. There was also a Porsche 356 with crumbling tires which sold for \$82, and a Ford D-800 truck in Tuborg Beer livery which fell under the hammer for \$100.

Turning to Tekno examples graded as excellent, a Cooper Norton Midget Car (Formula One racer), Lincoln Continental, MGA 1600, Volkswagen 1500, Ford D-800

dump truck and a Hyster forklift each auctioned for \$30-40. A Mercedes-Benz 300SL, Ferguson Tractor, Scania-Vabis truck and trailer, and a Scania-Vabis 75 Aerial Ladder truck each went for about \$50. A Ferrari 750 Monza, Oldsmobile Toronado, Ford Mustang Rallye, and a Renault 4CV each sold for \$70-80. Also in the "excellent" category, a Volvo 221 station wagon and a VW Beetle in Deutsche Bundespost livery each auctioned for about \$100.

Regarding Tekno examples in near-mint condition, a Monza Spyder with box realized \$52, and an Opel Kadett with box and a Volvo P1800 sold for \$110-120 each. A VW Transporter fire tender with box, Saab 96 Type 2, and a VW Van in Philips livery each went for \$140-180.

Finally zeroing in on Tekno examples graded as mint, a Mercedes-Benz 230SL in box, Volvo Crane Truck in window box, Scania-Vabis LS56 truck in window box, Åkerman 700 excavator, and a Volvo Falck fire truck in box each auctioned for \$40-55.

A DKW Junior De Luxe in box and a Ford D Series timber truck each went for \$82-86; a VW Bus Taxi in box sold for \$125, a Ferrari 750 Monza with box for \$185, a Lloyd LKS 600 in box for \$181, and a Volvo Amazon 121/122 in box auctioned for \$295.

It can be a serious business (and an investment) collecting these Danish jewels. Some begin collections of Tekno models with lower-valued examples which don't have their original packaging and/or are in less than mint condition. Others buy models in poor condition and restore them.

Creating a collection of original Tekno models is a way to commemorate and preserve Danish workmanship. A collection such as this also honors periods of classic motoring, and the golden age of diecast toys when Tekno was a major Danish exporter, with its models famed and beloved amongst children and adults around the world.



ternut wood "double trouble" trough call crafted of slate and aluminum. The 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch x 5-inch piece was signed and dated 6/12/01 by artist Dick Kirby, and identified as "Field Grade 2001." The third-highest bid for a turkey call, coming in at \$225, went for a box slate call by Richard Moore of Heart of Dixie Turkey Callers

Price points for calls varied considerably. Most sold for solid two-figure bids, like the \$81 that won a box call signed by Johnny Mitchell of Southland Game Calls. The limited-edition piece was approximately 12 inches long and featured a Tom turkey on the paddle. A \$43 bid scored a handcrafted trumpet wing bone call mounted on a base. The 7-inch call was signed, numbered, and dated by A.J. Jonathan. Many other calls were even picked up for under \$5 like a 3 ½-inch P.S. Olt F-6 scratch box call won for just \$3.

Accessories for calls were also offered. The most substantial was a handcrafted wood turkey call storage container that hit \$304. The approximately 12-inch container was signed and dated by Don Bald and featured a scrimshaw-style Tom turkey head on the lid, a Tom turkey painted on the side, and a belt notch for carrying.

There were also several lots of strikers, including a collection of four that sold for \$27.

Accouterments extended to personal accessories like a collection of nearly four-dozen turkey-themed tie-tacks, cufflinks, and other jewelry that sold for \$93. More striking - but only reaching \$19 - was a collection of Grand National Call Competition medals. The 35 medallions spanned various years from 2006-2014 and bore well-known competitors' names.

The turkey theme continued with eight lots of turkey-themed decanters. Overall, prices for the bottles were understated. The highest of just \$11 went for a limited-edition Austin Nichols porcelain eagle and turkey decanter, with a broken bottle stamp, for Wild Turkey Kentucky Straight 101. Another \$11 bid picked up an Austin Nichols Wild Turkey bottle portraying a Tom turkey sitting atop a book entitled Wild Turkey Lore. The remaining decanters sold for between \$4-\$6.

Then came six lots of carved wood ducks, which sold very reasonably. Going for \$26 was a 17-inch inch carved wood American black duck, signed and dated '79 by artist Tim Clayton. A \$21 bid won a 14-inch rough-carved mallard by Gary E. Bbel, dated 1985. Close behind, at \$19.99, was a slightly chipped 13-inch figure of a mallard on a stump, signed and dated '80 by Jim Rutledge.

Wildlife figures extended to a handful of lots containing metal animal figurines in brass, bronze, and pewter. A 17 ½-inch bronze National Wild Turkey Federation

Tom turkey on a post, entitled 'Spring Ritual' landed \$61. A \$46 bid won a signed/dated bronze hunchback whale and \$22 snagged a bronze set with a cow seal and baby pup.

Also spotlighted were nine lots of collectible and utilitarian knives, one of which was a 6 ¼-inch National Wild Turkey Federation commemorative knife that reached \$31.09. The others, mainly hunting and fileting knives, sold between \$4-9.

Vintage Cookbooks

employable, "American Cookery" by Amelia Simmons was a slim volume published in 1796; Lindgren considers her story to be "very moving."

As for classic American cookbooks ("The Fannie Farmer Cookbook" and "The Joy of Cooking" immediately come to mind), Lindgren pointed out that they continue to be of enduring interest, with early editions commanding impressive sums. On a personal note, he considers the dust jacket for the first edition of Irma Rombauer's "Joy" to be extraordinary. But for those with more modest budgets (and limited space), he suggested collecting community cookbooks.


For the past 150 years, community cookbooks have flourished, marked by three characteristics, as set out by Lindgren: First, these books are produced by a recognizable group. Secondly, the recipes included in them are drawn from members of that group. And finally, proceeds from the sale of these books are intended to support a charitable cause. This last parameter, he conceded, is sometimes difficult to ascertain.


With some 6,000 community cookbooks currently among his holdings, Lindgren is in the midst of a years-long, comprehensive project to catalog them. Along the way, his study of community cookbooks has led to interesting observations. Often, these books were made either for sale at a local exposition, or in response to ensuing civic pride generated from such an event. When considering the local advertising that supported their printing, these cookbooks provide "a snapshot of what was going on in that town." These days, he noted, there are fewer books produced by church congregations and members of the Grange than in years past.

As for beginning collectors of cookbooks, Lindgren suggested narrowing the search by selecting a state or a city (he has collected approximately 1,000 publications from his state of Maine). Or select a specific dish and collect books that include a recipe for it. Although community books can be budget friendly, there are exceptions: "Firsts" (as in the first book published in a particular state), as well as those produced by Black communities, generally bear higher price tags.

There are, however, several inherent drawbacks to these cookbooks. When it comes time to shelve them, the title is not always on the spine, making identification tricky. And as for the spine, books bound with wire or plastic






coils require careful handling. Due to limited printings, community cookbooks can be scarce without being old, he concluded.

Serious collectors continue to pay serious money for what they want, according to Udo Goellmann, speaking for AbeBooks. In light of purchases made in the past few years from the online marketplace, Goellmann said that cookbooks are "still desirable." Among the examples he cited was "Les Diners de Gala" by Salvador Dali, published in 1973 and signed by him; it recently sold for \$5,000. Condition "affects the price," but in the case of extremely rare cookbooks, concessions are made by collectors.

And then there is Sue Jimenez, whose private collection of 6,600 cookbooks (give or take) landed her in the 2015 Guinness World Records. 

out-of-the ordinary cookbooks, the seldom seen cookbooks," the Albuquerque resident explained. She prizes a copy of the only cookbook published in the Pitcairn Islands, written by a descendant of Fletcher Christian (of "Mutiny on the Bounty" fame), as well as a cookbook featuring the Kazakh national cuisine (written entirely in the Kazakh language).

But her all-time favorite is a 1925 cookbook by Marjorie Swift. As



evidenced there, it's not just cooking hints that lie between the covers of cookbooks, but words of wisdom and philosophies of the time. As Swift stated (and to Jimenez's amusement), "The well-fed man is a happy man — and a very easily 'managed' one too. And since we women know that to maintain harmony, every man, however clever, however efficient, however charming, must be 'managed,' let us feed him well first and manage him afterwards." The title of the book? "Feed the Brute!"
