

Josef Originals kept the gift market bright

Thanks to the creative mind of Muriel Joseph George, the world has a seemingly limitless number of fetching ceramic figurines to collect. There are hoop-skirted maidens and "birthday party" girls, bearing birthstone-bedecked bouquets. There are poodles and pussycats, graceful ballerinas, playful pixies, and winsome young lovers.

Like many of her California ceramics contemporaries, Muriel George's career soared (and then soured) due to events far beyond her control. During World War II inexpensive giftware imports from overseas were cut off. To keep consumers satisfied (and store shelves filled), retailers turned to domestic manufacturers. Most of those manufacturers were, at least in their initial years, small operations. They operated out of converted storage sheds, kitchens, basements, or, in Muriel's case, the family garage.

In the early 1940s, Muriel Joseph began to establish a name for herself via a limited line of hand-crafted jewelry. While unique, her Lucite-leather-Austrian crystal creations were both time-consuming and expensive to produce. This caused their pricing to be unattractive to wartime buyers, so Muriel turned to ceramic as a less-costly medium. Her highly detailed "Muriel of California"

figurines were precursors of the creative deluge that followed.

Encouraged by the positive reaction of her family Muriel decided to focus full attention on figural production. In 1945, "Josef Originals" set up shop in the couple's Arcadia, California garage. According to company legend, the "Josef" name came about as a printer's error. The initial batch of labels for the first run of the firm's figurines arrived with "Joseph" misspelled. With a release deadline looming, Muriel decided the misprint had a catchy ring to it, and "Josef Originals" was born.

For a sales representative, Muriel called on the talents of her father, already

a salesman for other companies. She encouraged him to bring one of her earliest figurines, "Pitty Sing," along on sales calls. With other business completed, her father would display Muriel's tiny charmer to his clients. Orders were immediate for this child in an oversized conical hat, posed with a fluffy kitten. "Pitty Sing" became the first big hit for Josef Originals, and the firm's one kiln operated day and night to meet demand.

Soon outgrowing its makeshift garage surroundings, the firm moved to a dedicated production facility in Monrovia. Muriel knew exactly what her customers wanted and delivered it, relying on readily accessible themes with universal appeal.

Bidders discovered treasure at Freedom Auction's Sea Hagg sale

CORTEZ, Fla. — Decades ago, Jan Holman began a journey on the shores of Lake Erie that eventually wound her to the Ohio River, the Mississippi, and finally the sunny shores of Florida. Along the way, she became a proficient antiques and collectibles dealer specializing in maritime collectibles. She eventually landed in the historic fishing village of Cortez, Florida, and opened a nautical emporium she named the Sea Hagg.

What she called a "treasure-filled chandlery" was open for 25 years, becoming a tourist attraction profiled in travel guides and a professional resource for designers working on nautically-inspired projects. Sadly, in October of 2022, the beloved Sea Hagg closed its doors.

Enter Sarasota's Freedom Auction Company which was tasked with the liquidation. On March 12, Freedom

\$600, while an antique but functioning Sestrel binnacle compass, manufactured by England's Henry Browne and Son, reached \$425. Lucky buyers found items that dove under \$100 - like a 75-pound anchor that landed just \$30 and a 16-inch rectangular brass porthole that went for the same.

For anyone fancying a 'buccaneer' theme, booty included items salvaged from treasure ships. The auction's second-highest bid of \$1,600 went to a 14k, 29-gram



conducted the second installment of the "Hagg's Treasures" sale, featuring 546 incredible seafaring lots offered online via HiBid. Every imaginable type of maritime collectible was available,

from ship's antiques and maritime art to marine fossils and beachside architectural salvage.

Nautical antiques and pieces of marine salvage were headliners. The auction's highest bid of \$2,600 went to one of them, a brass diving helmet movie prop from Disney's 1954 film 20,000 Leagues Under the Sea. From a real vessel came a 39-inch copper Carl Schilbach & Company ship's cowl vent that sold for \$1,400. A 16-inch brass ship's bell, salvaged from a wreck off the island of Roatan, hit \$1,000.

There were plenty of ship's antiques at all price points. A copper ship lamp with an amber glass lens, wired for a modern bulb, sparked a \$650 bid. A huge 60-inch 10-spoke ship's wheel with a brass hub drove

Sales bells were ringing at Chicagoland

GRAYS LAKE, Ill. — The Chicagoland Antique Advertising, Slot Machine and Juke Box Show was definitely an international affair when it opened its doors on April 28 at the Lake County Fairgrounds Event Center.

A contingent of seven flew over 9 hours from Switzerland to shop the show, easily spotted with t-shirts showing illustrations of wanted items and the title of the group "Swiss Pickers."

One of the most expensive items for sale was shown by dealer Frank Zygumt Jr., of Westmont, Ill. Known for his rare slot machines, he wowed the crowd with a 5½-foot-tall wood and cast iron elaborately restored 1910 50-cent-operated Caille flash-brass-plated floor model slot. Carrying a \$40,000 price tag it was soon marked "sold." Zygumt offered more moderate priced slots spread over several booths priced at \$1,000 and up.

Some slots even came with oddball stories to match. Collin and Ashley Ulrich of Omaha, Nebraska, offered a restored wood cabinet floor model 5-cent Mills Page Boy slot machine with a whopper of a story: The former owner had sawed off the bot-

tom half of the cabinet so it would fit on his counter. Luckily Ashley has a wood-

men's gold ring mounted with a Spanish treasure coin. A circa 1715 pendant-mounted 2 Reale coin salvaged from the wreck site of a Spanish treasure flotilla struck \$750. It came with a certificate of authenticity by noted treasure hunter Mel Fisher.

Eight other lots held shipwreck coins with interesting histories. They included a pair of NGC-certified 17th-century 4 Reale and 8 Reale coins salvaged from the shipwreck of the Portuguese Almiranta Sao Jose which sank off the coast of Africa after being ambushed by British warships. They scored \$600.

Ancient cannonballs were also on the docket. Bidding hit \$425 for a 4.5-inch, 7-pound ball from the Spanish Capitana 'el Rubi. The vessel was the flagship of a 1730s-era treasure fleet sunk off Plantation Key, Florida, discovered in 1931 by a local fisherman. Another shot from the same vessel reached \$250. And, a collection of seven salvaged cannonballs, ranging from 2.25 to 5 inches in size, hit \$150.

In a different vein were the lots with marine fossils. A monumental clam shell measuring nearly 24 inches wide and weighing a stunning 50 pounds pulled \$750. Two others of similar size sold for \$700 and \$650 respectively. A

large pillar coral fragment weighing 55 pounds went for \$120. A mere \$80 won an 11-pound collection of fossilized whale vertebrae.

Another popular category was nautical and seaside art. At the forefront were 38 lots by Florida artist Julie Ross (1965-2021) who trained at the Ringling School of Art and Design and New York's School of Visual Arts. One of her pieces, a 52-inch salvaged window with multi-media artwork, brought \$1,100. Another, a multi-media painting on acrylic board, in a whimsical resin frame she also created, landed \$600. A \$500 bid won a 19-inch multimedia shadowbox containing sea elements and doll fragments.

Other artwork ranged from hand-carved statues to metal fish and included 22 lots of mermaid figures. A lot of five vintage 20-inch mermaid dock bumpers went for \$475. A 42-inch cast-metal sculpture of a reclining mermaid pulled \$275 and a \$100 bid took home an unusual 28-inch hand-carved wooden sculpture of a mermaid's tail.

Then, there was vintage Florida

advertising and seaside architectural salvage. A favorite was a hand-painted wood sign from Anna Maria Island's Rod & Reel Motel that eventually attracted \$800. Bidding went to \$600 for a 24 by 31-inch stained glass window from Key West Willy's bar, the oldest structure on Bradenton Beach. A mere \$50 grabbed Sea Hagg's own hand-painted wood parking signs.

The Sea Hagg store may be gone but Jan Holman continues to hunt art and artifacts. She is currently working on the Sea Hagg Inn, expected to open in Cortez in late summer 2023.





working uncle who constructed a new floor model housing for the machine in order to bring it back to its original configuration. The restored slot could be taken home for \$3,300.

Paul Hinden of Mequon, Wis., pointed with pride to his King Doo-Doo "very rare fancy plated" 12-inch-tall cast iron penny - nickel - dime operated trade stimulator with asking price of \$29,500. He also called attention to the Shell Star, a nickel-operated wheel-type trade stimulator that tells your fortune, and horoscope priced at \$3,695. Meanwhile, across the trading floor, Jack Freund of Lake Geneva, Wis., pointed out his 18-inch-tall 1894 wooden triangle shaped Tower trade stimulator, offered for \$2,250 and a fancy etched glass construction clockwork mechanism 18-inch tall Mansfield gum vendor with original marquee, tagged \$2,100.

Another dairy state dealer, Walt Scott of Baraboo, wowed the crowd with a 24-inch-long cow-shaped early 1900s Windmill weight that tipped the scales at 50 pounds priced at \$1,800.

You could weigh yourself in style with a floor model 1930s penny scale which traveled 12 hours to the show with Jeff Stork of Round Hill, Va. The heavily restored - and flashy - 1920-30s National Novelty was priced at \$4,500, as was a similar Mills scale from the same era.

Gas and oil advertising items were featured by many at the event. For example, a long line of 18 lighted gas pump globes caught many an eye from Kenny Robbins,

Cary, Ill. They were priced at \$1,500 to \$1,800 each.

Colorful eye catching neon was seen in many booths at the Chicagoland show. An 8-foot-long 2-color Chevrolet "bow-tie" sign was marked "sold" but two Mobil Gas and Oil and one Standard Oil signs were available after they traveled 14 hours to the event by Neon Chuck, Oklahoma City, Ok.

The sounds and sights of vintage pinball games came from the booth of BJ Cunningham, Centralia, Mo. A Bally Old Chicago pin game could be played for \$2,500 while a Gottlieb Buccaneer game could challenge your skills for \$1,500.

Coin op items were mixed with advertising signs from Greg Rudd from Cincinnati, Oh. Many stopped to admire his 15 by 20-inch 1920s cardboard Squeeze Soda Pop sign, featuring young baseball players in a sandlot scene, priced at \$695. Others checked out his 17-inch-tall cast aluminum light-up Jack-O-Lantern peanut vender tagged at \$375.

Bill Norton of Augusta, Mich., offered a Donaldson Printing Co., 22 by 28-inch poster advertising Bock Beer priced at \$1,200. A 1900 framed and embossed lettering Chicago litho poster advertising Jersey Cream Soda Pop. Norton was priced at \$3,200.

Both early and recent vintage toys were shown by John Betts Of Woodstock, Ill. Traditional tastes were drawn to his 15 by 16 by 7-inch chrome-plated early 1900s Rival toy stove, offered for \$875, while other folks checked out his 1950-60s Sonicon battery-operated rocket with original box and accessories for \$1,500.

Tiffany windows and lamps will light up Fontaine auction

PITTSFIELD, MASS. — Lot one of the May 20 Fontaine's auction will certainly shine a bright light for bidders.

The action starts off with a Tiffany Studios leaded glass lamp, setting the tone for what bidders can expect to see in this auction. Lot one is a circa 1910 "Acorn & Bell" table lamp (\$20/30,000) having a 14-inch shade and with the base impressed "Tiffany Studios, New York, 68752."

Bidding is available via internet, phone and absentee methods.

Fine examples of antique Tiffany lamps in desirable forms and patterns are increasingly harder to find but buyers here seldom walk away disappointed as Fontaine's always seems to have choice offerings. This auction features a Favrile glass decorated table lamp (\$60/80,000), circa 1900, 29 1/2 inches tall. The shade is engraved "F2663" and the oil font is marked "591984 / Pat. 10, 19, 97." Coming out of the Linda L. Bean collection, the lamp is in a pleasing shade of green with iridescent swirls of purple, white and other colors.

Tiffany's "Daffodil" shades are a perennially popular pattern with buyers and Fontaine's offers up a fine circa 1910 table lamp (\$50/75,000), standing 27 inches tall and having a "Twisted Vine" base and a 20-inch shade impressed "Tiffany Studios, New York, 1497" and the base impressed "Tiffany Studios, New York, 443."

Tiffany lighting examples are abundant but one need not have the Tiffany pedigree to be fine. Case in point is the R. Williamson & Co. floral leaded glass and patinated metal chandelier that has matching sconces and hanging lights (\$15/25,000), early 20th century, measuring 66½ by 29 inches.

"Statement piece" jewelry will also make a strong showing early on in the auction, led by a platinum and diamond ring (\$50/75,000), centered by a G color, VS1 clarity, 4.01-carat princess cut diamond accented with over one carat of diamonds.

The auction touches on several prime collecting categories, extending far beyond jewelry and lamps. There will be eight Rolex wristwatches, two

Cartier wristwatches and others. Also, a notable lot is a set of three "Petrushka" goblets by Mihail Chemiakin (Russian, b 1943), estimated at \$25/35,000. The goblets are made with sterling silver and gilt sterling silver and the largest has 14K gold accents.

The presence of Tiffany designs from the height of the Art Nouveau era is not limited to lighting and this sale includes several grand leaded glass

landscape windows with religious iconography, attributed to Tiffany Studios, including "Jesus Christ At The Well" (\$20/30,000) and "Samaritan Woman At The Well" (\$20/30,000) that clearly were meant to be displayed together. Vintage temple art from India to highlight Kaminski auction

BEVERLEY, Mass. — Vintage temple art from India will be among the highlights of a May 20 Kaminski Auction. The items were collected by a Harvard University professor and counselor who made annual trips to India from the 1970s through the 1990s. Many pieces are from the Essajees Atelier Collection of Colaba, Bombay, India. Some were gifts from Indian dowries that have been passed down through generations.

Top lots from the collection include an 18th-century brass oil lamp on a stand depicting a Hindu epic story titled “Mahabharata,” a vintage four-piece silver tea set hand-crafted in Bombay circa the 1960s; the coffee and tea pots and creamer have black wooden handles and all pieces are footed, with a grape design. There is also a rare brass Shiva Lingam, a temple artifact depicting the embodiment of creation, the artifact being half woman half man, a group of three antique Krishnas, a principal deity in Hinduism, and an exceptional early 20th-century brass 12-piece serving set from Bombay, with traditional Indian decorative handles.

Fine art in the auction features a Luis Riccardo Falero (Spanish, 1851-1896) nude watercolor on paper, signed and dated 1880, and a Raymond Parker (American, 1922-1990) abstract of oil on paper and card.

Russian artists include a landscape by Igor Emmanuilovich Grabar (Russian, 1871-1960), of pastel on paper, signed and

dated 1954, and an Alexandre Altmann (Russian, 1878-1932), still life with flowers, oil on canvas, signed both from a Marlborough, Massachusetts collection.

Along with the Indian silver collection, there are two sterling silver flatware services. The first is a Wallace sterling “Grand Baroque” flatware for 12, and the second is a sterling service for 12 by S. Kirk & Son that is monogrammed.

Other items of interest include an Art Deco style platinum, diamond, and sapphire ring, with a one-carat center mine cut diamond surrounded by sapphires, and a Marcello Cuneo table and chair set, marked Cattelan Italia.

Josef Originals

Among the most popular Josef lines:

“Birthstone Dolls” (on each, the dress and birthstone colors matched).

“Birthday Girls” (available numerals covered all ages up to 21).

“Dolls of the Month” (there were 12, of course).

“Day Of the Week Dolls” (seven, naturally).

“Little Pets” (each little ceramic girl cuddled an even littler ceramic animal).

“Little Internationals” (29 countries made the roll call in this series).

“Flower Girls” (each figurine’s sun hat was a different flower).

“Big Sisters and Little Sisters” (one for each!)

“Belle Girls” (the skirt of each doll was a bell).

“You Are An Angel” (angel figurines with gold-tipped wings).

Series concepts could be inspired by a childhood activity—an historical period—or even a favorite catch phrase. Among the many other Josef series introduced throughout the years: “Nursery Rhymes”; “Make Believe”; “Little Homemakers”; “Dress-Ups”; “Mama & Baby”; “American Colonial Days”; “Four Seasons”; “Moments To Remember”; “First Love”, and “My Favorite Things.”

In addition to purely decorative pieces, Josef Originals occasionally turned out “double-duty” figurines. Particularly popular themes were combined to enhance sales, resulting in such mash-ups as the “Twelve Month Musical Dolls With Birthstones”. Also on the market: Josef planters, vases, candleholders, towel rings, trinket boxes, lady head vases, pin trays, soap dishes, lipstick holders, wall plaques, pie birds, music boxes, bells, mugs, ashtrays, bride-and-groom cake toppers, and a sleigh-ful of assorted holiday ware. Crossover tie-ins included the “Secret Pals” series, with Josef figurines designed to match specific Hallmark greeting cards.

Easy-to-relate-to themes were one element of the Josef appeal. Even more

important, however, was the overall skill of execution. Particularly throughout the 1950s, when Josef was based in California, the figurines, both in design and realization, are exquisite. The colors are restful pastels and the finishes glossy, with embellishments including applied gold accents, spaghettiwork, and jeweled trim.

Muriel specialized in depicting children (adult Josef figurines are few and far between), and these are children that look like children. Their proportions, poses, and facial features—the always-black eyes, wide-open, or demurely downcast, the button noses and shy smiles—were carefully observed from real life, and lovingly recreated.

With the reopening of overseas markets after the war, Josef Originals, like so many domestic ceramics firms in the 1950s, found import competition a new and unwelcome threat. Often, overseas competitors simply copied the work of firms based in the United States, slapping their own labels on vastly inferior work. Buyers in search of a bargain snapped up the imports, causing a severe dent in domestic sales.

In 1959, facing stiff domestic competition, Muriel and Tom George teamed up with George Good, their ceramics distributor since 1954, and moved the Josef base of operations to Katayama, Japan. Prior to the opening of the now co-owned “George-Good” plant, both Muriel and Tom George spent several months in Japan, so that workers could receive first-hand training in the Josef style and technique.

Once Josef Originals Japan was up and running, the Georges returned to the United States. For the next two decades, before retiring completely in 1985, Muriel

would send her designs to Japan; prototypes of the figurines would be returned for her approval, then put on the market.

Thanks to lower production and labor costs overseas, Josef was able to remain competitive in the giftware market long after its contemporaries had vanished. And, freed from the daily demands of mass production, Muriel Joseph George was able to devote herself completely to her first love—design—prolifically adding to the already-vast Josef inventory.

While the Josef Japan figurines are certainly attractive, and have a loyal band of fans, many collectors remain smitten with the Josef California output. These figures seem to possess more uniquely individualized “personalities”, thanks, in large part, to their carefully realized facial features.

While both Japanese and California pieces often have an incised “Josef Originals” on the base, there is a differentiation in other markings. California works originally boasted black labels with gold or silver lettering, reading “Josef Originals California”; in Japan, “California” was replaced with a decorative gold squiggle.

George Good acquired full ownership of Josef Originals in 1982, selling his interest in 1985. Muriel Joseph George died in 1992. Although different owners, (Applause, Dakin), have continued to turn out “Josef” items right up until the present day, most modern collecting interest centers on Muriel’s designs.
