The groovy '70s live on with 'The Brady Bunch'

Thanks to reruns, reunions, and collectibles, The Brady Bunch lives on in pop culture. Nearly 50 years since the series' last episode, fascination with the TV family endures.

The original series debuted Sept. 26, 1969, introducing audiences to one of TV's first blended families. The theme song explains, "It's the story of a man named Brady"—a widower with three sons-who marries "a lovely lady" who has three daughters "with hair of gold like their mother."

Veteran actors Robert Reed and Florence Henderson led the cast as the parents, along with Ann B. Davis as Alice, the housekeeper. When the show began, the young actors who portrayed the six children already had résumés that included commercials and guest spots on other TV shows, but as Bradys, their popularity soared. They found themselves on trading cards, teen magazines, comic books, and View-Master reels.

Those vintage items from the show's original run continue to appeal to Brady devotees. Wendy Winans, a

longtime fan who runs the Brady World website (www.bradyworld.com), says the series' timelessness attracts collectors.

"The issues that the Bradys dealt with, most are still relevant today: not

smoking, learning to get along with





Page 2 NEWS **Baccarat tops in field of glass paperweights**

Not much thought is given to the common paperweight. Nearly two centuries ago, paperweights were viewed as luxury items that satisfied the 19th-century taste for ornamentation, yet were inexpensive to make.

Letter writing was a popular activity at the time, and paperweights became a fashionable and economical way to decorate a home while keeping papers organized in drafty rooms. Paperweights appeared as early as the 1700s and these were made from textured stone or bronze. These were part of a writer's took kit, which included a quill pen and stand, inkpot and blotter.

The French were first to put their 'stamp' on 19th-century paperweights and four prominent French glasshouses went to work in making weights to help revive the depressed French glass industry: Baccarat, Saint-Louis, Clichy and Pantin. Most antique paperweights of quality were made by one of these four French factories. It's estimated that only about 25,000-30,000 remain today, with many tightly held in museum

collections. The most coveted paperweight among collectors? Hands down it's Baccarat.

Founded in 1765 with the permission of Louis XV. Baccarat is an art glass manufacturer that has transcended eras and fashions. Over the years, Baccarat has produced just about every form of art glass and glassware imaginable. It has designed exquisite crystal and glass vases, perfume bottles, chandeliers, stemware, windowpanes, mirrors and other decorative objects.

Just seven years after it began producing crystal, Baccarat was commissioned to create stemware for King Louis XVIII. Since

then, the company produced crystal for royalty and heads of state, whether it was stemware for Charles X and Franklin Roosevelt or vodka glasses for Czar Nicholas II. Baccarat's crystal is exquisite, refractive, luminous

Cork popped at \$750 for a French Champagne at Briggs fine wine auction

GARNET VALLEY, Pa. — Given that buying a bottle of wine only involves a visit to a local liquor store or grocer, why would someone chase wine at auction? For wine enthusiasts, the explanation generally falls into one of two camps. The first is the hope of acquiring desirable products at bargain prices. The other is the pursuit of unusual or hard-to-obtain varieties for investment or one's cellar. In either case, wine auctions present unique opportunities.

Such was the case on July 27 when Pennsylvania's Briggs Auction held an online fine wines auction featuring a curated selection of estate wines and spirits from selected Delaware Valley estates. The auction featured 259 lots of wines and other spirits, varving in size from single bottles to full cases. Bidding on each lot started at \$10. It was a fast-paced event, with three lots clos-

ing each minute.

Champagnes rather than traditional wines took the auction's highest bids. One variety of champagne in particular - Henri Giraud - ran up solid three-figure bids across six lots. Six bottles of 2002 Henri Giraud Argonne Brut in the original wood

gonne Champagne. Bids went as high as \$750 for a case of six.

crate reached the auction high of \$750. While a substantial bid, it was a solid win for the bidder — at retail, a single 750ml bottle can sell for nearly \$400!

Appreciable bidding landed the other Gi-

raud offerings. Two lots, with with six bottles of 2002 in the original crate, each hit \$700 as did bidding on two additional lots of the same. Earlier in the auction, five similar offerings reached \$550-\$600. A single

bottle of the 2002 went for \$120.

Bidding on other Champagnes was not as stratospheric. Three bottles of Gosset



and heavy, thanks to its 32 percent lead content.

In 1846 the company began producing paperweights, whose interiors held captive everything from flowers to birds. By 1855 Baccarat was an industry leader in paperweights. Peak production of Baccarat paperweights was between 1846 and 1855. In 1855, Baccarat won its first gold medal at the World's Fair in Paris.

Baccarat first began marking its work with a registered mark in 1860. The mark was a label affixed to the bottom of the work. In the period 1846-1849 Baccarat signed some of its high-quality glass paperweights with the letter B and the year in a composite cane.

Paul Hollister, one of the foremost scholars of 17th to 19th century glass studies, glass paperweights and contemporary studio art glass, calls fine glass paperweights "The Crown Jewels for Collectors."

"Paperweights

are considered the most collectable of 19th century glass items, and also the most challenging of the glass arts to make," Hollister said. "Fine glass paperweights are, indeed, rare treasures."

Decorative glass paperweights reflected the 19th-century taste for intricate, overthe-top designs. Until the spread of textiles colorized with synthetic dyes, ceramics and glass were among the few objects that added brilliant color to a 19th-century Victorian interior. The popularity of these paper-

weights in the 1800s testifies to the sustained cultural interest in hand craftsmanship during an age of rapid industrialization.

Baccarat codified the basic types of paperweights that glassworkers still aspire to today. The "plain" millefiori paperweights (millefiori, an Italian word meaning 'thousand flowers') were produced in widely spaced or tight-and-close styles. Sometimes the canes were organized in concentric circles, other times their ends were interwoven like garlands. Geometric patterns and sil-



houettes ranged from dogs to doves to devils. Two other collectible Baccarat styles are 'mushroom', in which a bundle of canes seem to spout like a mushroom from within the weight, and 'carpets', whose wall-to-wall patterns would do a Persian rug maker proud.

Three-dimensional lampworked flowers encased in glass were the chief French innovation. At Baccarat, flower choices included pansies, primroses, wheat flowers, clematis, buttercups, and of course, roses. Fruits such as strawberries and pears were also frozen in glass, as were lizards, snakes and other reptiles.

After 1890, very few quality paperweights were made until the 1950s when the art was revived by Paul Ysart in Scotland and Charles Kazian in the United States. By 1960, factory production of paperweights began in Scotland, Japan, New Zealand, France and eventually the United States. Even large numbers of simple paperweights are mass-produced in China and Italy as well. The Belgians, English and even a few Russian companies got into the paperweight act, too.

Collecting paperweights began shortly after their production ceased, primarily by aristocracy and royalty. Collecting paperweights became more common in the early 20th century, when some outstanding collections were formed. They were recognized as a legitimate form of the decorative arts in 1925, when Sotheby's conducted the first major auction of paperweights.

The number of collectors increased markedly after 1953, when the Paperweight Collectors Association was formed. The International Paperweight Collectors Association hosts biennial conventions, bringing together collectors, artists and dealers. Today, there are 19 regional collectors' organizations across the United States.

for seven bottles of 2014 Italian Rossi Dei Politici Montepulciano D'Abruzzo.

While deal shopping certainly played a role in those wine bids, perhaps the modest prices echoed the market's shift toward whiskey and other hard liquors as the spirit of choice. In fact, nineteen different lots, each containing a trio of Kinsey Pennsylvania Rye Whiskey, bid as high as any of the wines, selling from \$45 to \$65. Even with those, the winners effectively landed a three-for-the-price of one (or better) victory.

Then came two lots with three bottles of aged-in-Spain Don Maderas 5 + 5 Aged Rum, which sold for \$70 and \$75 respectively. And, four lots holding three bottles of French Conjure Cognac sold for \$50 each.

In addition to Briggs, numerous auction houses hold wine and collectible spirits auctions. Among them are Christie's, Heritage, and Sotheby's. Several are scheduled in the next few months.

Champagne Brut Grand Reserve only hit \$50, about 2/3 off retail. Similarly, three bottles of Champagne Ployez Jacquemart Extra Quality Brut, came in at \$35.

More than two hundred lots held traditional wines. Bidding was fairly aggressive on several lots of hard-to-obtain 2012 Italian Gillardi Dogliani Cursalet. A lot featuring a full case of 12 sold for around market value at \$200. Six bottles sold at \$120.

While bidding continued in the three-figure range on lots of 2011 Italian Oddero Rocche di Castiglione Barolo, bargain buying was at work. A bid of \$250 went for six bottles of it, which was the highest proffered auction-wide for a wine. Yet, at normal retail of around \$80 per bottle, it was quite a catch! One lot prior, a similar offering reached \$200.

Beyond those, buyers took home plenty of wine for modest two-figure bids, often for Parera Roig, and a dozen bottles of Joe's

lots with six to 12 bottles. The two-figure price point was tested at the outset. Lot 1, containing five bottles of 2014 Italian-made Fontezoppa Montepulciano d'Abruzzo, hit bottom-shelf pricing at only \$35.

Bids of \$35 snagged six bottles of 2016 Argentinian Michael Torino Cuma organic Malbec, six bottles of 2014 Spanish Fina

Bids ticked up slightly to \$40 for six bottles of 2013 Bacchus California Cabernet Sauvignon. It notched up again to \$45

Music box plays a merry tune with \$1,600 bid

CORYDON, Ind. - Three online only auctions conducted by Beckort Auctions of Corydon, Ind., were needed to handle the living estate of Dr. Mark C. Randall of New Albany, Ind. Dr. Randall is a retired local dentist in the Louisville and southern Indiana area and has collected antiques of all types for more than 70 years. With his wife and friends, he would scour antique shops throughout many states, especially Indiana, Kentucky and Ohio, searching for treasures to add to his numerous collections.

In May of this year, Randall's stoneware collection crossed the auction block to strong sales. Fast forward two months and July 12 was tapped as the day for two separate online only events to disperse two other of Randall's collections - art and furniture.

Fifty lots of furniture were offered with an early mahogany pedestal dining table leading the day. Having a burl veneer accented pedestal and selling with five 13-inch-wide leaves, this table realized \$1,050. Prices do not include a 10 percent buyer's premium.

Page 6 Items from Freddie Mercury estate will electrify auction crowd

LONDON (AP) — More than 1,400 of Freddie Mercury 's personal items, including his flamboyant stage costumes, handwritten drafts of "Bohemian Rhapsody" and the baby grand piano he used to compose Queen's greatest hits, are going on display in a free exhibition at Sotheby's London ahead of their sale.

The vast collection of the singer's personal belongings, which had been left to Mercury's close friend Mary Austin, had remained undisturbed in his west London mansion for 30 years since his death in 1991.

Austin, 72, said in a BBC interview in April that she has decided to sell almost all the items to "close this very special chapter in my life" and "put my affairs in order."

Among the hundreds of Mercury's personal treasures were previously unseen working drafts of hits "Don't Stop Me Now," "We Are the Champions" and "Somebody to Love."

The handwritten draft of "Bohemian Rhapsody" - which shows that Mercury experimented with naming the song "Mongolian Rhapsody" before crossing it out -is expected to fetch \$1 million to \$1.5 million.

"We have here working lyrics for pretty much every song that Freddie Mercury wrote through the 1970s," said Gabriel Heaton, a specialist at the auction house. "We've got extensive working drafts that really showed how songs developed, how

they changed, how they took shape in the most wonderful way."

The star of the show, however, is Mercury's beloved Yamaha baby grand piano, which is set to sell for \$2.5 million to \$3.8 million. The piano survived several house moves, took center stage at his mansion, and was the heart of Mercury's musical and personal story from 1975 until his death.

"Of all the objects that he had, this is the one that meant the most to him," Heaton said.

Many of the highlights conveyed Mercury's love of theatre and showmanship. There were his dazzling sequinned, skintight catsuits, leather jackets and the lavish red cape and crown he wore on his last Queen performance in 1986, as well as his collection of Japanese silk kimonos.

Other items were more personal and intimate, including a school book with the singer's name, Fred Bulsara, dating from the 1960s when he had just arrived in the U.K. with his family from Zanzibar. Visitors could study Mercury's detailed dinner party seating plans and menus, as well as handwritten invitations to his famous birthday bashes — including one dated 1977 that instructed guests to "Dress to Kill!"

Also on sale are Mercury's art collection, featuring works by Pablo Picasso, Salvador Dali and Marc Chagall, as well as his eclectic antique furniture and numerous cat figurines.

"(Mercury) wrote this: 'I like to be surrounded by splendid things. I want to lead a Victorian life, surrounded by exquisite clutter," said Sotheby's furniture and decorative arts specialist Thomas Williams.

The hundreds of items have turned the auction house's elegant central London building into a shrine to Mercury, with all 15 of its galleries devoted to his story. It is the first time Sotheby's is opening its entire gallery space to the public for the weekslong exhibition, Williams said.

"Freddie Mercury: A World of His Own," which is free to view, runs until Sept. 5. The items will then be sold in a series of auctions later that month.

the finish on this piece was eyecatching. It had chamfered doors and its original untouched interior were also major selling points.

A Robert Mitchell Furniture Co. French marguetry sheet music cabinet professionally restored by Schumann Antiques in 1989 had a solid showing bringing \$310. Featuring lovely inlay work that included musical instruments, the piece measured 53 inches high by 27 inches wide and was 15 inches deep.

Another piece attracting interest was the elaborate mahogany wall mounted corner cabinet that made \$200. With burl accents, bottom and top finials, and an interior maple veneered drawer, the cabinet was 31 inches high and 22 inches wide.







C.S. Fly captured important moments in Western history with his camera

"[C. S.] Fly is an excellent artist and he was not a respecter of persons or circumstances, and even in the midst of the most serious interviews with the Indians, he would step up to an officer and say, just put your hat a little more on this side, General. No, Geronimo, your right foot must rest on that stone, etc., so wrapped was he in the artistic effect of his views." These words spoken by C. M. Strauss, mayor of Tucson who was present at the meeting, between Geronimo and General Crook, gave a serious view of the measure of the man who was C.S. Fly.


Camillus Sidney Fly, known as "Buck," to his friends, married Mary "Mollie" Goodrich, also a photographer in 1879. The Fly's made their way to the silver-mining town of Tombstone, Arizona, which was booming at the time of their arrival.

opened this photography studio together in Tombstone.

The two set up their first studio in a tent but soon opened "Fly's Photography Gallery" on Fremont Street. There, the going rate of a cabinet photograph was 35 cents. Their business holdings included a 12-room boarding house that housed one especially famous border - Doc Holladay. Molly usually tended to business indoors while C.S. concentrated on the outdoor photographs. This included scenic vistas, mines, famous and infamous characters. His famous subjects included Doc Holladay. Tombstone founder Ed Schieffelin, pioneer surgeon Dr. George E. Goodfellow, and Wyatt Earp's wife Josephine. He was an eyewitness to the Gunfight at the O.K. Corral — as luck would have it, the corral was just outside his photography studio. On Oct. 26, 1881, the gunfight at the O.K. Corral took place where Billy Claiborne, Ike and Billy Clanton, and Tom and Frank McLaury faced off against local lawman Wyatt Earp and Doc Holliday. Fly didn't manage to get any photographs of the shoot-out, as it lasted a mere 30 seconds, but he did capture the images of both the Clanton bunch and the lawmen before and after the killing. Later,



Fly would take his most important photo-

graphs — those of Geronimo and his warriors.

By the late 1880s, Fly's photographic work was attracting assignments beyond Tombstone itself, with exhibitions in Phoenix, Prescott, San Francisco, and even New York. Here it must be noted that, although C.S. Fly was credited with most of the gallery photographs, surely Mollie had a hand in taking a number of them.

Somehow, word reached C.S. Fly that Geronimo and his band were planning to surrender to U.S. Army Gen. George Crook at Silver Springs. Armed with this information in mid-March 1886, Fly boxed up a number of large glass photographic plates and loaded them onto pack animals. Accompanied by his assistant, Fly left Tombstone, intent on capturing the surrender of Geronimo and his band. Geronimo was wary of treachery on the part of the Americans, and set up a meeting place, not on American soil, but at the Cañon de los Embudos aka "Canyon of the Funnels" in northeastern Sonora, Mexico.

On March 25, with Fly present, Geronimo and General Crook met. With his camera set upon its tripod Fly inserted the glass photographic plates, lit the flash tray, and saved for posterity the historic images of the meeting between Geronimo and General Crook. When the meeting was over, Fly's work did not end. He took several more photos of the Apaches. Within a matter of days, he had photographs of Geronimo and his warriors, for sale from his gallery in Tombstone, to the tune of one dollar apiece for Geronimo, and half that amount

for the lesser-tribal members. That was a lot of money in 1886. With the sale of these images to the Harpers Weekly publication those pictures would find their way to every city, town and hamlet throughout the United States, as well as over the Atlantic to Europe. Two years later, Fly's photographs were published also as engravings by Frank Leslie's Illustrated Newspaper.

Fly was fortunate to get these photographs of the Apaches, during the meetings that took place on March 25 and 25; within a few days the talks broke down and Geronimo was on the warpath once again, conducting raids in the Southwest until he relinquished his carbine for the last time. On Sept. 4, 1886, Geronimo surrendered to Gen. Nelson Miles at Skeleton Canyon.

Fly was also renowned as a landscape photographer shooting pictures in Mexico, New Mexico, and Arizona Territory.

C.S. Fly recognized the potential of his photographs, not only for his individual clients but for what they could do, as illustrations for print publication. A case in point is his photographs that illustrated Harper's Weekly and Frank Leslie's publications. Fly had a sort of photographic wanderlust. He was always eager to separate himself from the static confines of his studio to record scenes of important places, scenes, and people. His work grabbed the attention of Americans during the late 1880s, 1890s, and into the early 1900s, as a testament to the old west that had gasped its last breath. The interest in his work especially those of Geronimo still captures the imagination of people today.

By the dawn of the 20th century, C.S. Fly's life would be cut short when he was afflicted with a bacterial skin infection and died on October 12, 1901, at the age of 51. He is aptly buried in the older section of the Tombstone City Cemetery. Mollie continued to operate the Tombstone Gallery until it was razed by fire in 1912. Much of Fly's work was lost, but that which Mollie saved from the flames, she contributed to the Smithsonian.

your siblings, getting braces, learning to drive, etc.," Winans said. "The show gives viewers a wholesome venue in which to relate to their own issues and even laugh at life sometimes."

Winans first started watching The Brady Bunch as a 5-year-old. She cut pictures out of teen magazines for a scrapbook that she kept along with the vinyl albums and tie-in books she could find in stores.

"When I was 8 or 9 years old, my father contacted the local television station that was airing reruns of the show and requested an episode guide." she said. "Long before all of the current books came out with descriptions of the episodes, I had my very own as part of my scrapbook."

She's not the only fan who has been eager for items featuring the Bradys, and publishers and toy companies have been quick to meet that need with everything from paperbacks to paper dolls.

William Johnston wrote and Lancer Books published a five-book series in 1969-1970, the first year The Brady Bunch aired. Tigerbeat followed in 1972, publishing three short novels by Jack Matcha. These books typically sell for \$2-\$8 on eBay, but The Brady Bunch #4: The Bumbler Strikes Again. is harder to find. An Etsy vendor sold a copy of the rare paperback for \$65 in 2021.

Also published early in the show's run were comic books. A 9.4-graded 1970 Dell Comics Brady Bunch #1 sold for \$899 in July 2023, with other non-graded comics going for \$40-\$100. Brady Bunch #2, which includes mislabeled actors Chris Knight and Mike Lookinland, sold for \$40 in fair condition and \$125 for VF+.

Whitman added coloring/activity books to the mix, publishing five from 1972-1974 that depict scenes from episodes and everyday life. A 1972 coloring book, featuring photos of the characters surrounded by mod designs, sold for \$19.95. A 1974 edition in very good condition sold for \$38.

Whitman also produced paper dolls, which, like coloring books, are difficult to find in mint or near-mint condition. A 1972 set features illustrations of all six children on the box, but the paper dolls inside are just the oldest children, Greg and Marcia. Those siblings, portrayed by Barry Williams and Maureen McCormick, are the only Bradys in the 1973 and 1974 boxed sets, while a 1973 book of paper dolls features the whole Brady family on the cover and paper dolls for all six children. Uncut sets have sold for up to \$75, while boxes with missing or punched-out clothing typically sell for \$10-\$15.

Winans, who after more than 45 vears of collecting says she "basically [has] a museum" in her house, considers certain items that have survived half a century "truly special."

"I think the three pieces that any true Brady collector should have are the lunch box/thermos, a Kitty Karry-All doll, and the complete trading card set," she said. "All of these items are hard to find because they are 50-plus years old and are things most kids throw away when their interest fades."

Indeed, the Topps 1971 set of 88 trading cards, which features a woodgrain background, has soared in value in the last five years, with individual commons selling for as little \$10 each up to \$450 for individual rare, near-mint cards. Heritage Auctions sold a graded partial set of 35 cards for \$4,200 in 2020.

The 1970 lunch box and thermos depict scenes from the wedding in the series pilot along with highlights from the first season's clubhouse and camping episodes. A lightly used metal lunch box and thermos sold on eBay for \$425 in July. Some collectors have found the lunch box without the thermos for less, from \$48-\$165 depending on condition.

Winans said "the 'holy grail' of the average Brady Bunch collection" is an original Kitty Karry-All, the doll the youngest Brady, Cindy, adores in the early seasons.

The vintage toy is extremely hard to find; a pair of the vintage doll's shoes - no doll included - sold for \$85 in May. The slightly more accessible but still elusive 2002 reproduction Kitty home used for The Brady Bunch

Karry-All sells for \$500-\$600.

The 2002 doll is just one of many recent collectibles to hit the market long after The Brady Bunch original series ended in 1974. TV reunions in the '80s and '90s, along with 1995's tongue-in-cheek The Brady Bunch Movie and its sequels, renewed interest in the original series among fans and entrepreneurs alike.

"The Brady Bunch holds and finds new fans because it has never been off the air and continues to have reunions and new appearances of their cast and characters that reinvigorate the market," Winans said.

The 1981 made-for-TV movie The Brady Girls Get Married led to The Brady Brides, a sitcom that followed sisters Marcia and Jan and their new husbands. While that series lasted just one season, A Very Brady Christmas followed in 1988 and was the second-rated TV movie that year. The Bradys, a comedy-drama series that aired in 1990, hoped to capitalize on that popularity but was canceled after six episodes.

In spite of the reboot shows' spotty reception, dedicated fans continued to gravitate toward Brady Bunch items. In the 1990s, Vandor and other companies produced tin boxes, clocks, and coffee mugs, and Matchbox released the Bradys' station wagon and '55 Chevy convertible as part of its "Star Car Collection."

In 2019 the six Brady "kids" reunited yet again for A Very Brady Renovation, a project to recreate the sitcom's original set inside the Studio City

sets in television history leaves an impression that no one who has experienced it will ever forget." In June, HGTV put the Brady house

on the market for \$5.5 million, never opening it to the public. With current neighborhood restrictions in place, it's unlikely that fans will get to step inside the house. Even though visiting the renovated residence is not an option, collecting Brady Bunch items allows fans to hold on to their own memories of the iconic 1970s TV family.

"Over the past 50-plus years, with each new chapter in The Brady Bunch history, a new generation is introduced to the original show; older fans are reminded of why they loved the show in the beginning and are brought up-to-date on their favorite family," Winans said. "This re-energizes fans and collectors alike. Each new series or show brings along with it new merchandise for the avid fan or collector to buy."


