Collectors light up over vintage matchbooks

Unless you're already a matchbook collector, you've probably walked past scores of those old advertising gems without giving them much thought. It may be time to start paying attention because interest in vintage matchbooks is heating up. And, in an era when many other 20th-century collectibles are skyrocketing, matchbooks remain plentiful and affordable.

The niche hobby of matchbook collecting, phillumeny as it's called, has existed for about a century. Matchbook collectors, known as phillumenists, have long known what mainstream collectors have largely missed - that just like old signs and other advertising memorabilia, vintage matchbooks are fascinating commercial and design artifacts.

Matches have an interesting history dating back to the 1600s, with experiments using phosphorus to light fires. The lineage of modern matches began around the 1820s when an English chemist named John Walker created the first friction match using wood strips coated with a sulfur compound. A few years later, French chemist Charles Sauria invented a match with white tipped phosphorus. Unfortunately, those proved to be toxic, particularly for the factory workers who made them. In 1855, Swede Johan Lundstrom switched to safer red phosphorus and moved the striking plate to the outside of the container, eliminating accidental lighting of the entire package. The era of the "safety" match was born.

In 1889, American Joshua Pusey invented the type of paper matchbook we recognize today: a small paper "book" with cardboard matches stapled inside that could be struck on a friction strip on the bottom of the book. In 1896, Delawarebased wooden matchstick maker Diamond Match Company purchased Pusey's patent. Soon after, they began approaching hotels and other businesses to use the matchbooks as advertising pieces. One of their first clients was Pabst Beer.

By the 1920s, numerous companies worldwide were making matches as

advertising premiums. In those days, smoking was commonplace and the marketing world touted giveaway matches as the perfect advertising tool — something useful that could be given away, yet would keep one's business name in front of customers.

As these miniature advertisements became more popular, more creative energy was spent on their design. Energetic entrepreneurs commissioned matchbooks not only inscribed with their name and address, but emblazoned with logos, graphics, and often catchy slogans. Some gravitated to special die-cut shapes and other novelty matchbooks to add flare. During Wworld War II, even war effort propaganda was printed on matchbook covers. By the 1950s, matchbooks had become part of the natural landscape at restaurants, bars, hotels, and ironically

even gas stations.


Matchbook use went into a quick decline in the 1970s, driven by the widespread availability of cheap and disposable lighters, and the anti-smoking movement. It didn't take long for advertising matchbooks to fall into relative obscurity.

Long before their demise, people were keeping giveaway matches as mementos from their travels and favorite establishments. As the sunset of the matchbook era arrived, a collecting hobby emerged, which peaked in the 1980s. The hobby, in turn, faded by the early 21st century, until modern bars and breweries

HATFIELD, Pa. - For 40 years, William J. Dillon was the proprietor of Owl's Tale Antiques, a Haddonfield, N.J., shop known for its eclectic inventory of jewelry and art glass, porcelain and furniture. But Dillon was more than a noted antique dealer: Known for his discerning eye for museum-quality decorative arts, he was also a longtime collector. And it was property from his personal estate, not his shop's inventory, that drew approximately 800 bidders to Alderfer Auction's August 17 sale.

Even before the sale, interest ran high, with the preview exhibition drawing an "enthusiastic crowd" of nearly 100 potential bidders to inspect the assemblage of fine art and bronzes. Indeed, this was a "high quality sale spanning exceptional 18th to 20th century antiques, with particular emphasis on art glass, bronze sculptures, fine porcelain, and high-pedigree furniture," according to Auctioneer H. Brent Souder, speaking for Alderfer Auction. Strong interest continued during the six-hour live auction, with some 800 bidders, including phone and absentee bidders, vying for 295 lots.

Of particular note, according to Souder, were a monumental Antonin Mercie bronze female figure, which commanded \$1,400. and an Anton Chotka cold-painted bronze Orientalist figure that soared to \$5,400, exceeding presale hopes of \$3,000-5,000. A striking pair of ormolu and malachite obelisks also performed well at \$2,400. (Please note that all prices cited here include a 23 percent buyer's premium.)

Indeed, from the first lot hammered down, a Legras Montjoye enamel glass vase, to the final one, an unsigned oil-on-

canvas portrait of a seated gentleman, a wide variety of categories of quality antiques were offered, with many winning bids soared beyond presale estimates.

The sale was not without surprises. A monumental pair of figural court statues exceeded expectations. They sold for \$2,090 on a \$300-500 estimate. And a large gilt bronze urn, attributed to Ferdinand Barbe-

\$800-1.200 estimate. Among the finest standouts of the sale that emerged in the decorative arts included a magnificently carved oak pelican plant stand that achieved \$3,250, against its \$600-900 estimate.

Overall, this was "an excellent auction" for glass and porcelain collectors, with buyers appreciating the breadth of quality

> pieces offered from many renowned makers. Porcelain offerings, especially Continental examples, generated "significant interest." By way of example, Souder pointed to a pair of Napoleon and Josephine urns that brought \$6,450, thereby far exceeding a "modest" presale estimate of \$500-800.

historical creations like KPM and Dresden with discerning collectors continuing to "re-appreciate the technical mastery of these venerable manufactories," as evidenced at the sale. What Souder characterized as "fierce bidding competitions" drove many headlining lots well above expectations, including a KPM porcelain vase selling for \$1,920 against its \$300-500 estimate. Bidders also pushed a pair of Royal Vienna porcelain covered urns to \$4,800, well over the \$600-900 high estimate. Souder attributed these winning bids to "buyers" intent on securing these investment-grade pieces for their collections."

"Competitive bidding" on top art pottery lots resulted in "excellent results" for a Weller jardiniere and Rookwood vases. And "bidding enthusiasm" lifted an extensive Franziska Hirsch Dresden porcelain tableware set to \$1,664, handily surpassing expectations between \$200-300.

Top art glass lots, including Durand and Tiffany pieces, saw active participation, both in-person and online. A "resplendent" pair of Durand art glass "Hearts and Vines" vases took flight to \$2,176, far exceeding a presale estimate of \$300 to \$500. Souder noted that these impressive results underscored the buyers' recognition of Dillon's discerning eye for museum-quality decora-

tive arts, with his "keen selections" exciting competition between glass and porcelain connoisseurs "seeking the grace and artistry of these masterworks." Those bidding on furniture "clearly favored pieces tied to eminent designers," affirming the premium value placed on maker attribution.

Summarizing the sale, Souder reported that the sale ultimately achieved a 100 percent sell-through rate, while surpassing

the total high estimate value by 12 percent, "clear signs of high demand for Dillon's top-tier property." He concluded, "Overall, buyers responded very positively to Mr. Dillon's creme de la creme offerings in multiple high-demand collecting categories."

Alderfer Auction's next major online auction, scheduled for Sept. 14, will feature fine jewelry, silver, decorative and fine arts, and furniture.

Cube. Oh, and then there were the unopened VHS tapes of "Rocky," "Rocky II," and "Rocky III."


Fast forward to this past February, when those three tapes made a whopping total of \$43,000 at a Heritage Auctions sale.

This month, I decided we ought to consider how today's new things might one day morph into old things with some kind of value. After picking Jim's brain, we came to the conclusion that there are a couple of guidelines to keep in mind when determining what should be saved.

First of all, it's important to gather up items that serve as a record of what was going on in the world at the time of the birth. This includes newspapers (remember to put aside a copy of "AntiqueWeek"!) and magazines (especially those that make predictions for the future), as well as catalogs that include prices and reference books (atlases, almanacs, and the like).


live performances to telephone directories and maps. Jim and I agreed, however, if you manage to find printed versions of these items, you might indeed be saving something that will be rare later in the century.

Life-size portrait of Queen Victoria to highlight Nye auction

BLOOMFIELD, N.J. - More than 1,000 lots of fine and decorative art spanning three centuries will be presented during Nye & Company Auctioneers' three-day, online-only Chic and Antique Estate Treasures auction. The event will be held Sept. 13th-15.

Highlights include an oil on silk of a mother and child from the French/Vietnamese artist Le Pho. This work dates from his Romanet period of 1946-1962 and is estimated conservatively at \$40,000-\$60,000.

The collection also includes three Severin Roesen oil paintings. Two are similar fruit-filled horizontal still lifes and the third is a floral still life in a vertical composition. These dynamic paintings are each estimated to sell between \$20,000-\$40,000.

Another highlight is a truly special enameled silver singing bird box by the Swiss maker Charles Bruguier. The little automaton was made circa 1850 and is numbered 250. Bruguier only made about 10 of these extremely fine and rare boxes per year.

Another standout will be a life-size portrait of Queen Victoria. Painted by Charles Cohill in 1856, this impressive painting is a copy of Thomas Sully's highly regarded portrait. The Cohill work is documented in Carrie Rebora Barratt's book Queen Victoria and Thomas Sully and is expected to realize \$20,000-\$40,000.

The same consignor also has an excellent oil on board depicting the Marquis de

Lafayette, after Ary Scheffer. This well executed copy is similar to Scheffer's work, which is currently on display at the US House of Representatives in Washington DC. The painting depicts Lafayette and was brought to the US during his return trip to the United States in 1824-1825.

The sale has property formerly in the collection of Ian and Carolina Irving, the famous and well-known textile designer and taste maker. Some pieces were fea-

tured in World of Interiors and various other shelter magazines.

Highlights include an excellent George Smith ottoman upholstered in vibrant fabrics (est. \$1,000-\$2,000); a superb Neoclassical iron and brass hobnail safe, Continental, 19th century and another fabulously upholstered George III black and gilt japanned settee (est. \$2,000-\$3,000). The settee is a symphony of curves and graceful lines and is wonderfully proportioned. There are also numerous smalls and objets d'art to pique bidder interest

If you prefer designer furniture to the traditional period works, the auction contains a plaster "ledge rock" console after Emilo Terry, estimated at \$3,000-\$5,000. There is also a Bunny Williams designed "hourglass" cocktail table estimated at \$1,000-\$2,000 and several pieces designed by Dessin Fournir, as well as a Harry Bertoia for Knoll designed chair.

For the musically inclined, the auction

includes a Classical labeled grand harmonicon by Francis Smith of Baltimore. This rare cased musical instrument is conservatively estimated at \$3,000-\$5,000. Of the approximately 30 surviving harmonicons, examples by Smith can be found in public collections such as the Metropolitan Museum of Art and the Chrysler Museum of Art.



Niles, Mich., is a great place to spend days antiquing

NILES, Mich. — The Midwest is fortunate to have some of the country's best antique shopping. Seemingly every weekend there are enticing antique shows, and the area's interstates are dotted with many of the nation's largest antique malls. Add to those, countless cities and towns with popular antique shops and even entire enclaves filled with vintage and antique dealers.

A place that could easily be categorized as an antique shopping "destination" is the small city of Niles, Mich., not far from the shores of Lake Michigan and Chicago. Niles' historic district and the surrounding area are home to seven great antique malls filled with over 450 vendors.

Niles is known as the "City of Four Flags" which refers to the four nations — England, France, Spain, and the U.S. — that separately occupied the original 1690s Fort St. Joseph. The town was laid out in the 1820s, and by the late 1800s had established itself as an agricultural and industrial center. Auto magnates John and Horace Dodge were born in Niles in the 1860s and grew up in their father's machine shop.

Today, the walkable, charming downtown is filled with preserved 19th and early 20th-century buildings, home to dozens of eclectic shops and eateries. Among those revitalized buildings is a former Montgomery Wards store at 218 N. 2nd Street, which has housed the Four Flags Antique Mall since 1988. The mall was named after the town's famed Four Flags Hotel which opened on Main Street in the 1920s and hosted notables like Eleanor Roosevelt and Truman Capote. The two-story, 24,000-square-foot building is now filled with 120 dealers offering everything from Queen Anne furniture to barbershop antiques.

Around the corner at 190 E. Main Street is Main Street Antique Mall. It resides in what was formerly the town's McClellan's Five and Dime store, part of a 200-store chain that lasted until the Great Depression. Inside the renovated building are 50 dealers spread over two floors. The first floor features traditional vendor spaces while the upper floor houses consignments.

Five additional antique malls lay just outside of the business district along Michigan Route 51/Indiana Route 933, which is S. 11th Street in town. The northsouth route was once part of old U.S. 31, a 1920s-era "beeline" highway that took vacationers to northern Michigan. Roadside remnants can still be spotted along the way.

Traveling south from the center of town, the first stop is the Michiana Antique Mall, on the east side of the road, at 2423 S. 11th Street. The 27,000-square-

foot freestanding building is home to 80 vendors. Among the offerings are impressive collections of lake fishing and hunting collectibles, mid-century decor from area estates, and plenty of automobilia echoing Michigan's auto-industry heritage.

Almost directly across the road, at 2428 S. 11th Street, is The Marketplace, owned by Erin and Paul Douglas. Its 80 dealers offer everything from farmhouse furniture to flea-market-type merchandise. The Douglases also own Antiques on 11th about a half mile further on the east

side of the road, at 2515 S. 11th Street. It opened in July of 2022. The relatively new, but quickly-growing addition to Niles antique scene has about a dozen vendors. Several specialize in popular Vaseline and uranium glass.

On the same side of the road, at 2809 S. 11th Street, is Pickers Paradise Antique Mall. There, 80 vendors carry the gamut from country store merchandise and Amish furniture to art glass and ephem-



More than a label; these are truly works of art

Colorful paper labels have been used to identify the contents of fruit crates since the early 1880s when the Industrial Revolution changed commerce forever. European artists introduced the concept of colorful labels to America, and lithographic labels soon were the rage, becoming the first commercial art. The goal was easy: use bold colors and images to catch the customer's eye and promote USA-grown fruit as superior to European-grown fruit.

As the fruit market grew larger each season, immense competition at the local markets erupted. Orchard owners, mostly in California, used lithographic labels to bring attention to their fruit. Labels quickly appeared on cedar crates full of fruit and vegetables.

In the 1950s, the development of preprinted cardboard boxes forced expensive wooden crates with paper labels into extinction. Even before the first cardboard box fell off the assembly line, historians and collectors, recognizing their importance, were scrounging old baarns and warehouses, looking for unused stocks of fruit crate labels.

As the desire to collect fruit crate labels, as both a thing of value and a work of art, grew, a secondary market developed for them. Today, collectors continue to seek out these paper-bits of history.

California's image of a Garden of Eden, springing forth with a bountiful harvest of oranges, lemons, and grapes first appeared on fruit crate labels. Not only were the images of the labels beautiful, but also the people looked healthy and happy and California appeared like the true Promise Land. Nearly 50 years after the first fruit crate label touted a California Utopia, thousands of Americas headed west during the Great Depression, their hopes fueled by the fruit crate images they had seen. It is arguable that there would have been no Grapes of Wrath had fruit crate labels never existed. But exist they did, and they were truly in their heyday during the dustbowl of the 1930s.

Age is one of the primary factors in determining value for fruit crate labels. The oldest—and because of age, the rarest labels date back to the 1880s. Orchards chose San Francisco lithographers to produce the needed labels, and the most famous of all of these early lithographers was Max Schmidt, a young German immigrant who had some knowledge of producing labels for wine bottles.

Salesman/artist teams called "scissor men," who could create label designs on the spot from sketches and cutouts from stock designs, created Schmidt's earliest fruit crate labels. Schmidt traveled throughout the orchard areas of California, looking for customers and designing some of the earliest fruit crate labels. In 1898, Schmidt helped found the Mutual Litho Company. Today. collectors search for labels made by Mutual between 1898 and 1906, when the Great San Francisco Earthquake destroyed the factory. These exceedingly rare fruit crate labels can be identified by the company name printed in the lower left-hand corner.

Design also plays an important part in the value of fruit crate labels. Labels from orange crates were more imaginatively designed than labels from other fruit crates; therefore, orange labels are more valued today. Also, California labels are generally worth more than labels promoting Florida or Texas fruit.

Age of a label can also be discerned in its design. Fruit crate labels from the 1880s through the late 1920s had highly detailed, picturesque scenes with a 3-dimensional effect. These type of labels are considered rare and, if found, their prices reflect their rarity. In the late 1920s, advertising art in general changed, becoming simpler, flatter, and bolder similar to what we would consider "poster art." Poster art fruit crate labels, while highly collectible, seldom bring as much on the secondary market as the detailed, earlier labels.

Updated labels often attract collectors of social history. Updated labels are ones that the basic label design does not change but details — such as changes in art, clothing styles, or architecture reflect the ever-changing social trends of humanity.

Wartime labels are specialty labels that many collectors like to look for. Some collectors make wartime labels the primary focus of their fruit crate label collections, searching out labels from the Spanish-American War, World War I, and World War II.

Other specialty label collections include Western themes with cowboys roping oranges, famous men such as Buffalo Bill, gold miners, scouts, and even Indians, especially on the Indian Belle Brand of fruit. and pirate themes, which are mainly found on Florida fruit.

Many collectors have concentrated their efforts on California landmarks, such as the 1932 Los Angeles Olympics stadium and the Palomar Observatory. One unusual category of labels are those that depict a homemaker actually cooking or serving the fruit on the label, such as the rare 1915 Appeal Brand lemon label showing a woman cutting a lemon meringue pie. Fruit crate labels also have crossover appeal as shown by the Red Riding Hood labels printed from 1911 to the 1930s. The label shown here depicts Red Riding Hood carrying a basket of oranges to Grandma's house. Anyone who collects Red Riding Hood items would love to own this enchanting fruit label.

Label conditions vary, depending on whether the label was ever used on a crate or if it was found, unused in a stash of labels. Many labels are found still attached to the crate heads (the ends of the old wooden packing crates).

Most fruit crate labels measure approximately 10 inches by 10 inches and today the price for one runs from about \$15 for an average one to many hundreds of dollars for a rare one.





era. It's a place that can keep you busy for a couple of hours.

Drive approximately one mile further south and you cross into Indiana and the outskirts of South Bend. There you will find Council Oak Antiques, at 50981 State Hwy 933, South Bend. Council Oaks is an exceptional retailer, with top-tier merchandise that is a step above what is found in most antique malls. In fact, several of their 50 dealers are interior designers! The facility's 17,000 square feet are filled with traditional antiques, noteworthy home decor, and wall art from recognized names. Expect to find everything from early 19th-century furniture to exceptional Art-Deco smalls.

Niles is an easy destination for visitors from places like Chicago, Detroit, or Indianapolis. Yet, with all the shopping options, doing justice to a visit takes more than a single day. Consider an overnight or weekend for a more enjoyable trek. Adjacent South Bend offers a perfect place to round out a shopping spree with some exceptional sightseeing, lodging, and dining.

The Oliver Inn Bed & Breakfast, a Queen Anne mansion tied to the Oliver farm equipment family, is an idyllic place to stay. You'll be a couple of blocks from the Oliver Mansion and Studebak-

er Museum. You'll also be just steps from Tippecanoe Place Restaurant/Studebaker Brewing Company which occupies the former Studebaker mansion.

If you stay in South Bend, consider walking the historic downtown. You'll plant your feet on segments of the Lincoln Highway, Dixie Highway, and the Historic Michigan Road (old US 31). Along the way, a streetscape filled with jazz-age buildings built by industry giants like Oliver, Studebaker, and Singer provides

great photo opportunities.





Matchbooks

started commissioning matchbooks as swag, spurring a renaissance in their appeal.

Today's collectors tend to be motivated by nostalgia as much as anything. They usually start with matchbooks tied to places or things important to their personal history. As their collecting evolves, their attention usually gravitates toward various niches. Geography is often the motivator, with people hunting for examples from their home city or state. Akin are collectors who seek matchbooks affiliated with various consumer brands like hotels or liquor products, or even from transportation entities like airlines and railroads.

Some serious collectors hunt for examples from specific matchbook manufacturers like Diamond, Ohio Blue Tip, or Crown Match Company, and particularly from rarer producers. Novelty matchbooks from those die-cut into shapes to those holding trinkets — appeal to yet another category of collectors. Many appreciate the variety called "features," which contain matches with imprinted imagery. Still others fancy matchbooks with pinup and risqué images that reflect the mores of a different era.

Matchbook collecting is somewhat of a North American hobby (Europeans tend to favor matchboxes) and collectors tend to favor pieces from American entities. Yet, some hunt for examples from other countries and appreciate the cultural iconography on them.

No matter the preference, the wonderful thing about matchbook collecting, is that it remains affordable. It's quite common to purchase a good matchbook for \$1. Frankly, it's just as common to snag large batches for amounts that equate to pennies a piece. And, there's a certain appeal to rooting through a collection to find the goodies!


While pricing may be reasonable overall, it doesn't mean that rare matchbooks can't command significant value. Age is a particularly important determinant of value. Older matchbooks are generally prized more than newer ones, with pre-1940s pieces particularly sought by serious collectors.

There are a variety of approaches to determining a matchbook's age. Sometimes it's easy because the piece is dated (often found on the foot of the book). Manufacturers' marks, often found near the striker, can be a rough indicator of age since matchmakers' years of operation are known. The location of the striker also helps date a matchbook. Front-strikers were used until 1978, then moved to the rear for safety. And, while the history of the disclaimer, "Close cover before striking" dates to 1915, it was required after 1960.

The advertiser's history provides another clue. For example, Royal Inns of America operated from 1965 to 1975, providing a

rough date for their matchbooks. Also, consider the graphic arts employed. A piece laden with Art Deco imagery and text, for example, likely indicates a piece from the 1920s or 30s.

Rarity also influences value. A limited run for a small local hotel will be more desirable than a generic mass-produced piece for a huge hotel chain. Matchbooks for companies no longer in business are usually more desirable than those from businesses still open. Those with historical significance — such as those from a Presidential inauguration dinner — hold singular appeal.

Condition, of course, is a critical factor. A bent, torn, or otherwise damaged piece may not be worth much to a collector, even if rare. The bellwether for condition is an unstruck cover, which shows no sign of being used to light a match. While having the matches removed from the cover is generally fine, some collectors prefer intact packs.

A word of caution is in order. Even decades-old matches can ignite. So, it's generally sensible to remove the intact matches. It's known as "shucking" and is quite common. However, take care to not damage the cover. The matchbook covers can then be stored flat in albums. The exception is those "features" where the matches are part of the artwork. Any intact matchbooks should be stored in a dry, cool location.

While smoking bans have been in place for decades, as noted above, many contemporary businesses; particularly breweries, distilleries, and bars are once again employing matchbooks as promotional tools. Depending on the popularity of the business, some become collectibles overnight. Savvy individuals are holding on to these as readily as they grab vintage ones.

If you're inspired to start collecting matchbooks, your radar will no doubt blip every time you spot them at an antique store or even your favorite watering hole. It's the thrill of the hunt at its finest, and the treasure is these amazing little pieces of commercial history.


