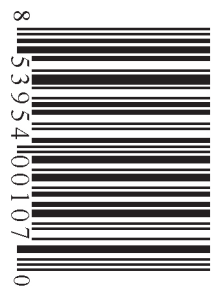

Collectors take to the skies with vintage airplanes

During the first half of the 20th century, little metal airplanes, fueled on imagination alone, soared to new heights in the make-believe world of children. Once inexpensive, these vintage die-cast metal toys are once again prized, this time taking a place of honor on the shelves of collectors.

Dean Rich did not start out to be a collector of toy airplanes. But while attending a 2016 convention of mechanical bank collectors in New Orleans, his eye was drawn to two little airplanes. He was intrigued, but, as the Illinois resident recalled, he had already spent the funds he had allotted for the show. Rich's wife Judy, however, came to the rescue by purchasing the pair for him as a birthday gift. Now, some seven years later, he estimates that he has 100 different planes in his collection.

Beginning at the turn of the century, everything relating to aviation was suddenly of interest, thanks to a combination of the Wright Brothers' first self-powered airplane flight in 1903 and the role of air power during World War I, later followed by Charles A. Lindbergh's historic 1927 transatlantic flight.

Then, with the Great Depression,

companies that had been producing metal wares, including kitchen utensils, skillets, and hardware items such as doorknobs were suddenly



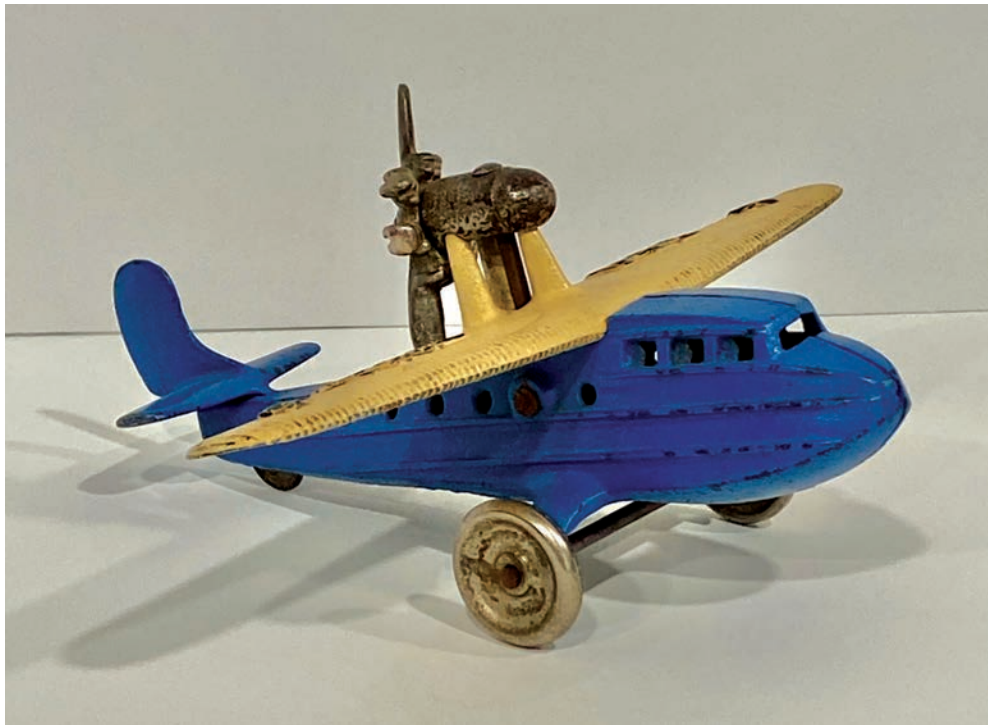

strapped for cash. What could be produced both inexpensively and easily, and then sold in large numbers at a low price? The solution was die-cast metal airplanes.

Quite by chance, those first two

planes in Rich's collection were made by the Hubley Manufacturing Company. "I didn't know Hubley from anything else," he said. Only later would he come to learn the significance of his gift. One of the oldest and largest makers of toys in the United States, the company was founded in Lancaster, Pa., in 1894 by John E. Hubley, with the original purpose, according to company records, of manufacturing equipment and accessories for electric trains. Financial difficulties forced the 1909 sale of the company, and a cast iron toy business moved into the 68,000-square-foot plant, one that included a die-cast room, warehouse, tool room, and paint room, in addition to special assembly equipment. A variety of vehicular toys were produced, including automobiles and farming equipment.

Company records illustrate the methods Hubley employed in the mid-1930s to increase its toy output, one that involved multiple-cavity steel dies. From there, the castings were broken off, trimmed, and tumbled, before being coated with baked enamel or lacquer and air dried. A portion of

Butt Drugs sale auctions more than 70 years of memories

CORYDON, Ind. — For more than 70 years, Butt Drugs Pharmacy was a fixture of Corydon, a historic and charming small town in Southern Indiana. Opened in 1952 and featuring an old-fashioned soda fountain, Butt Drugs became “internet famous” in its later years, thanks to a viral video celebrating its unusual name.

That certainly helped attract attention—and bidders—to an auction held on August 8 in which memorabilia, signs, and original fixtures from the store, which closed on May 1, were sold by Beckort Auctions.

Founded in 1978 and also located in Corydon, Beckort Auctions was the ideal auction house for the sale. The auction, which was conducted both online and in person, attracted 673 registered bidders from 26 states as far-flung as Vermont and California. But auctioneer Brian Beckort noted that residents of the Corydon area also vied for a piece of hometown history. “The interest in the Butt Drugs auction was generated from local sentiment and nostalgia for an iconic company that was open for 71 years,” Beckort said.

That nostalgia certainly helped “spur on” a winning bid of \$11,000 (prices listed

here include a 10 percent buyer’s premium) for “Sandy,” a coin-operated kiddie ride in the form of a beautiful brown-and-white horse. Still in working condition and boasting its original paint

and saddle, Sandy delighted the youngest visitors to Butt Drugs for many decades.

Another standout from the sale was a set of letters spelling out “Butt Drugs” that graced the pharmacy’s storefront. Measuring 24 inches in height, the iconic set of letters reached a sale price of \$1,705. Another set of orange plastic letters, spelling “Drug” and measuring 68 inches



es in overall length, fetched \$1,650. A sign that said, “Butt Drugs Drive-up Service,” sold for \$962.50, and a metal sign saying, “Reserved Parking Butt Drugs Customers Only,” fetched \$605.

As could be expected, the sale included a strong selection of vintage advertising items. Two Coca-Cola porcelain signs dated to the 1930s. One sign, bearing the words “Drug Store,” sold for \$990, while the other, which said “Fountain Service,” fetched \$935. Both signs measured 11 inches in height by 62 inches in length. Another porcelain Coca-Cola advertising sign from the Butt Drugs soda

Square outage impacts retailers worldwide

On Thursday, September 7th, payment processor Square experienced a service outage impacting tens of thousands of sellers worldwide who found themselves unable to accept credit cards or access vital business records.

Just before noon Pacific Time on Thursday, Square identified a service disruption at a data center. According to Web watchdog Down Detector, users started experiencing problems around 2:30 Thursday afternoon, eventually peaking around 4:30 on Friday.

Although Square posted updates on its status page and on the X platform (formerly Twitter), users needed more direct lines of support. Users couldn’t access live help and weren’t informed via email until almost 7:30 Friday evening. Many expressed frustrations over being left in the dark. “Square gave zero communication...which I understand may have been part of the crash but even on social media nothing was said until 8 hours into the crash,” said the president of the Elm Grove, West Virginia Business Association.

In that first email to users, Square simply acknowledged the situation, saying, “Since around noon [Pacific Time] on Thursday, sellers have been unable to access accounts or process payments due to a systems outage within Square. We know you trust us with your business, and these situations add challenges to running your operations. For that, we are truly sorry.”

On its status page, Square indicated the outage particularly impacted Square Stands and readers connected via USB on point-of-sale systems, inordinately affecting stores, like antique shops and malls, that use Square as their cash register. Square’s team tried to deploy fixes and posted on X about workarounds like using offline payments. However, many discovered that “Offline Mode” wouldn’t even function. One retailer had his employees resort to writing down credit card numbers to enter later. Many discovered offline transactions weren’t credited, meaning merchandise potentially left their stores unpaid.

Given the number of shoppers who

pay by credit card - and Square’s 2-million+ user base - the outage had profound financial implications. In an NBC News interview, Pennsylvania restaurateur Adam Blackbill said he’d lost between \$8,000-\$10,000.

Some retailers, like Vintage Flip in Lake Mills Wisconsin, tried to operate on a cash or check basis. Owner Jennifer Vallier informed her customers, “Please be prepared to pay by cash or check for the remainder of business today. We hope the outage will be corrected prior to open of business tomorrow.” Others, like The Burg Boutique Resale in Roseburg, Oregon opted to close early. “Due to a nationwide outage of the Square POS System, we cannot take any payments! Therefore, we have decided to close down tonight.”

Businesses with nearby ATMs had an advantage as did those comfortable using peer-to-peer alternatives like Venmo. Unfortunately, one of the more popular ones, Cash App, is owned by Square’s parent company and was also impacted by the outage. That left customers frustrated. One Michigan show attendee said, “What a pain trying to

pay and nothing works.”

No less important, problems extended beyond credit card processing. Many vendors utilize Square’s back end for their businesses and reported that everything from invoices to shipping information was inaccessible. The Square status page confirmed disruptions to billing, balance checking, and transfers. Likely Finds Antique Boutique in Tillamook, Oregon said, “I can’t even access my inventory to look up prices.”

While the outage was regarded as nationwide, the effects were global. Vendors as distant as Australia were impacted. The Junee Licorice & Chocolate Factory in New South Wales had to resort to all cash payments. “Eighty percent of our customers pay with a card and that isn’t happening today because of technical issues with Square.”

By late Friday Square had things resolved - fortunately, before businesses and events opened Saturday. Still, vendors at shows like Marietta, Ohio’s Sternwheel Festival came prepared

fountain that said “Fountain Service, Drink Coca-Cola” sold for \$577.50. The sale also included two vintage coolers with the slogan “Drink Coca-Cola in Bottles.” One, made by the Progress Refrigerator Co., fetched \$253. The other, made by Cavalier, sold for \$220. Both coolers were in original condition.

Also on sale was an all-original porcelain thermometer—still working—advertising “Ex-Lax: The Chocolate Laxative.” This piece of pharmacy memorabilia reached a final sale price of \$660. Another porcelain thermometer, this one advertising Nature’s Remedy tablets, sold for \$451. And a vintage thermometer advertising the pharmacy itself, as William H. Butt Rexall Drugs, sold for \$341.

Other evocative pharmacy items on sale included a penny scale that dispenses “Character Readings” along with the user’s weight. Measuring 51 inches in height, still in working condition, and boasting its original paint, this charming piece of drugstore nostalgia made by the American Scale Manufacturing Co. sold for \$539. Another vintage penny scale, this one made by the Rock-ola Manufacturing Co., fetched \$396.

The original owner of Butt Drugs, William H. Butt, had a passion for fishing, and the pharmacy was decorated with several mounted catches. A mounted swordfish, caught by Butt in Panama City, Florida, in 1966, sold for \$1,155. This “rare catch” measured 77 inches in length. Another mounted fish that graced Butt Drugs’ walls—a white marlin caught by William’s son Thomas in Panama City in 1966—sold for \$577.50.

Another interesting lot sold at the auction was comprised of a Seth Thomas clock, a brass calendar, and a collection of

pharmacy books. These books included vintage editions of The National Formulary and Pharmacopoeia of the United States. The lot sold for \$550. In addition, a set of three iconic glass apothecary display jars sold for \$385. A single large display jar fetched \$198.

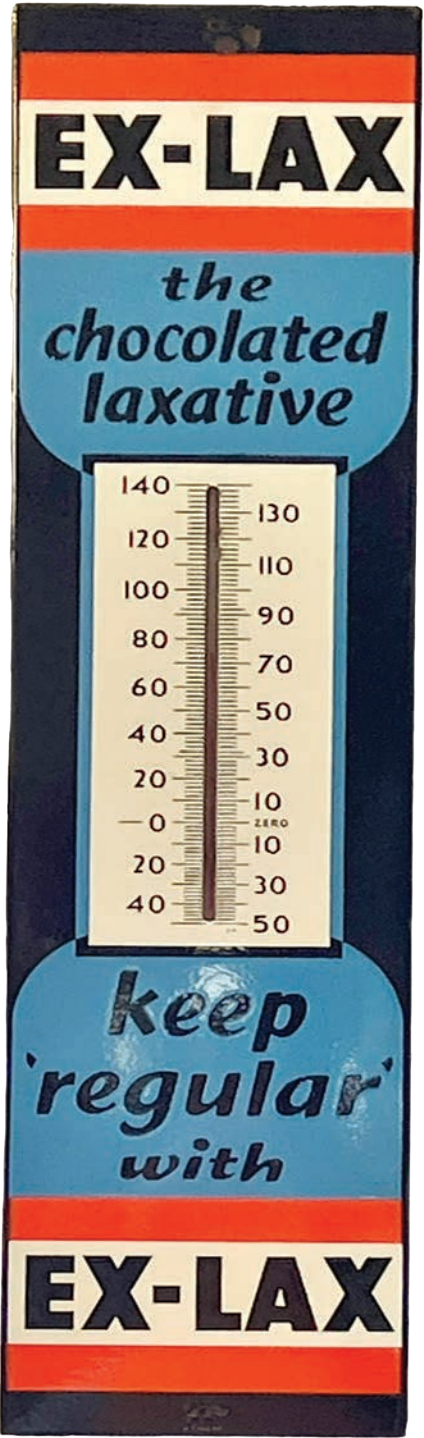
Also sold at the auction was an early hand-painted wooden restaurant booth from the Old Capital Restaurant in Corydon. The restaurant at 117 Chestnut Street—the location of the original Butt Drugs store and next door to the pharmacy’s most recent address. The circa 1923 booth, which included two benches and a connected table, sold for \$577.50. Meanwhile, a lot containing three 1950s chrome swivel barstools used in the Butt Drugs soda fountain fetched \$506. Anyone wishing to set up their own nostalgic soda shop would have done well by buying the “modern yet retro” Crosley iJuke

Deluxe CR12-2 jukebox. Styled like a classic 1950s model and playing CDs and MP3s, rather than 45s, the jukebox sold for \$1,017.50.

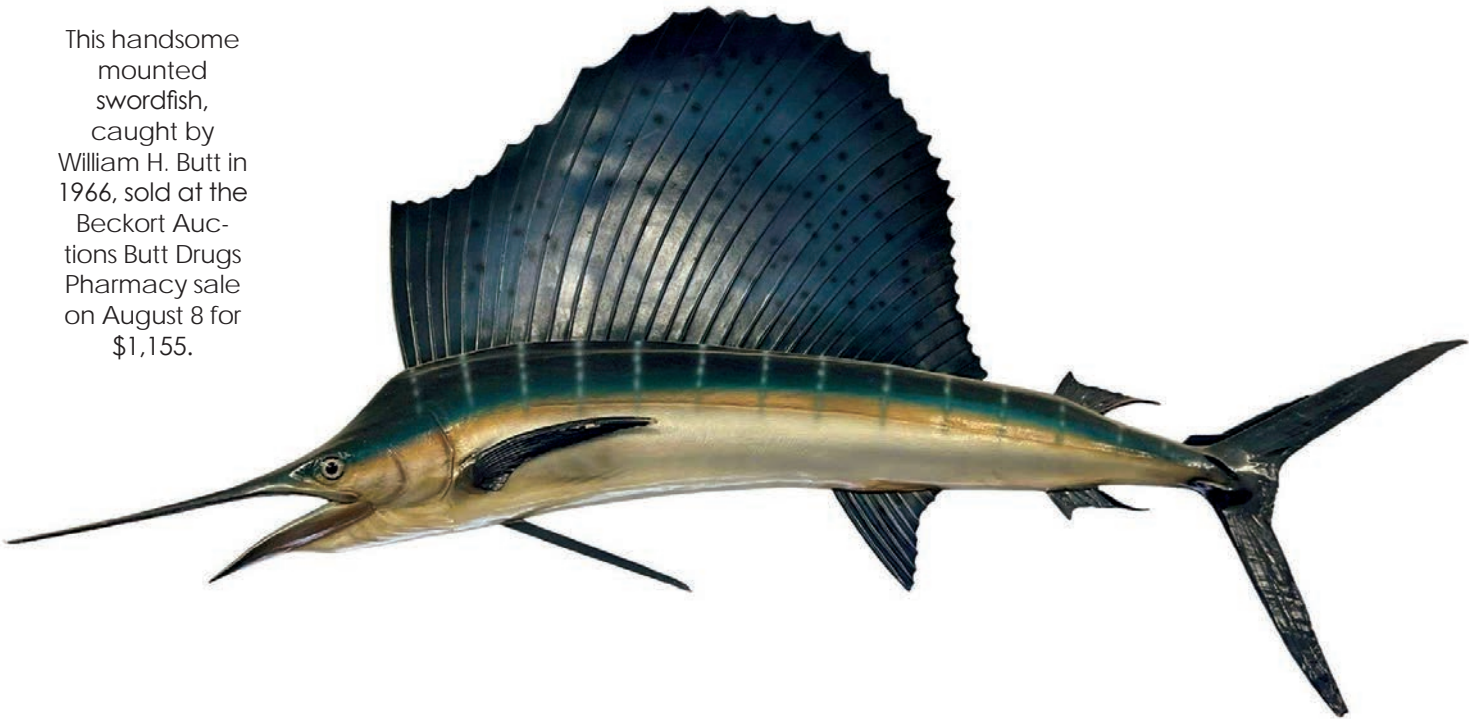
Although Butt Drugs Pharmacy has closed its doors after more than seven decades of serving Southern Indiana, its legacy will live on in the collections of many lucky bidders. As auctioneer Brian Beckort put it, “The owners are sincerely appreciative of the response and are happy to see people get to keep a piece of Butt Drugs with them.”

Cottone’s will offer collection of Ambassador Barclay at auction

GENESEO, N.Y. – Cottone Auctions’ Fine Art, Antiques and Silver Auction slated for Friday, September 29 will feature the collection of New York State Senator and Ambassador Hugh Douglas Barclay (July 5, 1932 – March 14, 2021) of Pulaski, N.Y.

Barclay was a graduate of Yale College and the Syracuse University College of Law. He served eleven consecutive terms as a New York State Senator from 1965 to 1984 before being appointed Ambassador to the Republic of El Salvador by President George W. Bush in 2003. In 2007, Ambassador Barclay was awarded El Salvador’s Order of José Matías Delgado for eminent services to the Republic.

Highlighting Barclay’s collection is an extensive collection of fine silver, including “special order” pieces by Georg Jensen, such as a pair of monumental five-light candelabras (est. \$40,000-\$60,000); a large centerpiece tureen with cover, signed by Georg Jensen, in cursive (est. \$30,000-\$50,000); and a graduated set of tazzas by Johan Rohde for Georg Jensen, with hammered pedestal

base, floral and scroll work combined with floral center piece with a hand hammered sculptural bowl.

Also offered will be a massive King’s Bowl, originally designed for King Gustav V of Sweden in 1917 (est. \$30,000-\$50,000); a pair of Queen’s Bowls (est. \$30,000-\$50,000); Princess Bowls (est. \$10,000-\$15,000); and a pair of George III silver wine coolers by Paul Storr, London, 1819, bombe fluted form with applied oak

sprays, shell and foliage scroll borders and retaining their original undertrays (est. \$50,000-\$80,000).

The Barclay collection will also include fine Oriental and silk Kashan rugs; Chinese jade carvings purchased from Stanley Charles Nott (The House of Jade, Ltd., N.Y.); historical documents

The lamps and lighting category will be led by Tiffany Studios, to include a lovely Nasturtium table lamp with 18-inch shade (est. \$50,000-\$80,000); a dichroic "jeweled" Dragonfly" lamp with "pony tree trunk" base and 14-inch shade (est. \$50,000-\$80,000); a Poppy lamp on a turtleback tiled base and 20-inch shade (est. \$50,000-\$80,000); a rare Bird lamp on a Queen Anne's lace base with 16-inch shade (est. \$30,000-\$50,000); a Pansy lamp with 16-inch shade (est. \$40,000-\$60,000; and a Poppy lamp on a rare organic six-light

Even local officials took preemptive measures to inform visitors coming to their area's events. In advance of the Fremont Colorado Antique Show and Flea Market, the local Business Association posted on Facebook, "If you plan to shop tomorrow, maybe take cash just in case the system is still down." Unfortunately, at events that began Thursday or early Friday, vendors had to wade through the challenge.

On Monday around 8:30 AM, Square finally emailed users with an explanation. “While making several standard changes to our internal network software, the combination of updates prevented our systems from properly communicating with each other and ultimately caused the disruption. The issue also affected many of our internal tools for troubleshooting and support, making them temporarily unavailable. There is no evidence that this was a cybersecurity event or that any seller or buyer data was compromised by the outage.”

This outage is a reminder of the hazards of entrepreneurs being overly dependent on technology - and highlights why cash still has its place. While card-taking and peer-to-peer payments may be favored, small businesses should always prepare for cash transactions at their stores and during events.

Garage sale of printing presses draws specialists to museum

If you want to make a big impression, the Museum of Printing in Haverhill, Massachusetts, is the place to go.

MOP, as it's affectionately known, is the oldest and largest printing museum in the nation. On Aug. 12-13 graphic artists and printshop operators from all over New England trekked to this little city in Northeastern Massachusetts for MOP's twice-annual garage sale. There they picked through trays of wooden or metal printing type and perused antique letterpress presses, ranging from tabletop models for making business cards to a seven-foot-tall, century-old Hoe Co. iron flatbed press.

Dave Saums drove a dozen miles from Amesbury, Massachusetts, to pick through type drawers for interesting lead fonts for his collection. Eric Johnson-DeBaufre journeyed two hours from his home print shop in Wethersfield, Connecticut, hoping to buy new type faces.

Tom Lichtman drove 150 miles from Rutland, Vermont, and spent \$250 for his third Chandler & Price "Pilot" model table-top printing press. The Pilot can print images up to six by ten inches, one at a time. Lichtman teaches letterpress printing at a makerspace (rutlandmint.org) in Rutland, and now, with three identical presses, his students will be able to work in the same format at different speeds.

In the decade since he took up letterpress printing as a hobby, Lichtman has seen growing interest in the process. His tabletop presses have opened the door for scores of beginners.

"With a tabletop you can learn the mechanics," he said. "For over 90 years they haven't changed." In general, tabletop presses all feature a round ink wheel, rollers that spread the ink from the wheel onto the type or image to be printed, and the platen, which holds the paper or card stock and presses it against the inked image. "The basics didn't change," Lichtman said. "You print ink on paper."

On average, about one in eight of his basic letterpress students catch the bug and move onto more complex work and larger letterpress presses.

The letterpress printing process isn't hard to understand, but it takes time. "It's a lot of setup. You're not just making one print. If you want to do that you just paint a watercolor," Lichtman said. "With

letterpress you need to think in terms of a series," such as printing two or three dozen greeting cards in one sitting from one plate.

Presses at the museum's garage sale went for anywhere from \$100 ("or make an offer") for a tabletop model needing a total rehab, to \$12,000 for the Hoe Co. iron flatbed press, which stood about six feet tall. One buyer spent \$4,500 for a Vandercook No. 5 hand press, which can handle poster-sized work. Frank Romano, a MOP board member, said Vandercooks are "the Mercedes of letterpress printing," and in demand by graphic artists and small print shops.

A walking encyclopedia of printing history, Romano was one of the founders of the museum in 1978. He got his start in the printing industry right after he graduated from high school in the late 1950s and went to work for the Mergenthaler Linotype Company in Brooklyn, New York. Over the decades, he worked as an industry consultant, founded the publication TypeWorld, wrote more than 60 books about the industry, and taught at Rochester Institute of Technology and California Polytechnic State University. Now 82, he spends his days at the museum, sharing his knowledge with visitors, and contributing to the MOP Newsletter.

The museum hosts an impressive array of large and small letterpress printing presses, Linotype machines, antique typewriters and not-so-antique computers in its permanent displays. It also houses a library of 11,000 volumes – many donated by Romano – on everything dealing with the history and techniques of printing. In addition to the presses and printing devices on display, there is a room showcasing bibles, some dating to the 17th century, galleries with rotating exhibits, a gift shop, workshop and a meeting room that regularly features specialized panels. Earlier this summer, four experts delved into the evolution of keyboards, Linotype and type-

writers under the banner "Shift Happens."

Letterpress printing had its heyday well over a century ago, but Romano said it's seen a renaissance as people come to appreciate the creative process. "They are able to print something, to produce it and hold it in their hands and say 'I did that.'"

Despite the old technology and today's ready access to computer printing, there is still a call by artists and others for letterpress presses, which underscores the purpose, if not the need, for a whole museum dedicated to the history of printing. After all, this is where printing presses were first used in America. The printing industry started in New England, specifically in Cambridge, in the 1630s. Over the years, print shops spread to Philadelphia, New York and Chicago.

Romano said that just about every other day he gets a call from someone asking if the museum is interested in a late relative's basement print shop or an old press gathering dust in the barn.

In response to the calls, museum volunteers assess the equipment to determine if it has historical value as a museum display, if it can be refurbished and put back in service, or if it's only good for parts or scrap. Even scrap matters. The museum has no endowment and is run by volunteers, funded through memberships, donations and the sale of presses, type cases, metal and wooden type and related items, including scrap.

Romano said the museum has "brought 110 presses back to life" since it opened 45 years ago, selling them to people who use them for printing or display. There's a workshop in the back where volunteers rebuild and refurbish presses and store parts for repairs. And to keep the love of the letterpress process alive, MOP hosts periodic letterpress printing classes for seven or eight students at a time – classes that always fill up as soon as they are announced, Romano said.

The Museum of Printing is open on Saturdays at 15 Thornton Ave., Haverhill. For more information visit museumofprinting.org.

Vintage Airplanes

these toys were hand painted while some were dipped. At one point, as many as a dozen young women were employed by Hubley in the paint department.

Hubley was not alone, as other companies, located primarily in America’s “Iron Belt” states

in the Midwest (but also extending as far northward as New England) followed suit. Rich pointed out that Hubley’s chief competitor was the Arcade Manufacturing Company, founded in the late 1800s as a maker of cork pullers. He added that Arcade went on to make approximately 500 different toys, including airplanes. Among other companies that produced these metal toys as part of their line were Kenton, Kilgore, and Dent. Tootsie Toys entered the market, as did the National Sewing Machine Company and Henry Ford (but only for a short time).

These little metal airplanes were relatively simple in design, not necessarily to scale, and often lacking intricate detail. Because they were made in large numbers and at a low cost, these toys have been designated as “NPQs” (“nickel, penny, dime” items), sold in dime stores across America. Usually small, with wingspans often ranging from but three to five inches they provided hours of imaginative play. Not all of the planes from this time were simple, though, or, for that matter, small enough to fit in a child’s hand. The Hubley “America,” first sold in 1928 (“possibly the most impressive of all toy airplanes ever made,” according to Rich), had a 17-inch wingspan that

featured a propeller with a spring as well as a cord with which to pull it.

During World War II, the scarcity of metal forced many companies out of the toy business and into the manufacturing of war-related items. Cast iron toy production resumed with the resolution of the Korean conflict, at which point Japanese and European manufacturers entered the market. Thus marks the end of an era.

Even though “condition is the number one thing,” as with many toys that have been played with, collectors are satisfied with examples that show some wear. A few chips in the paint is preferable to a toy airplane having been repainted. Rubber tires can be replaced. And not surprisingly, reproductions can be a problem. The best way to determine if something is not what it is purported to be is by

handling it, Rich advised. Reproductions often have a “pebbly” feel and are “not cast well.” He added, “They are nowhere near the quality of the originals.” He further cautioned against buying anything that is broken, in hopes of repairing it.

Beginners can start a collection for under \$100, Rich continued. Tootsie Toy “made a lot of them,” for example, and they can be purchased for as little as \$30. The collector recommends attending toy shows and shopping from toy catalogs. And for those who are “really lucky,” fine examples can be picked up at flea markets and in antique malls.

On the other hand, serious collectors are willing to pay considerably more for highly coveted examples. The Hubley “America” plane “might go for \$2,000 to \$3,000, but I’ve seen them for

as high as \$7,000,” Rich noted. A Vindex “Fokker” airplane, made in 1929 by the National Sewing Machine Co., might change hands for as much as \$10,000.

In the end, the power of these toys from another century should never be underestimated, Rich concluded. The second addition to his collection (but his third plane) was a little green Hubley Giro-Plane, which he acquired at an estate auction. As fine as the little plane is, its backstory is even better, as it was a father’s gift to his son upon entering the United States Naval Academy in 1935. John P. “Blackie” Weinel went on to have a distinguished 40-year career in the Navy. Although there is no written testimony to this effect, Rich likes to think that this little toy was something of an inspiration to a man who rose to the rank of a four-star admiral. And as for Rich, Weinel’s plane and its history served as the impetus for his own magnificent collection.

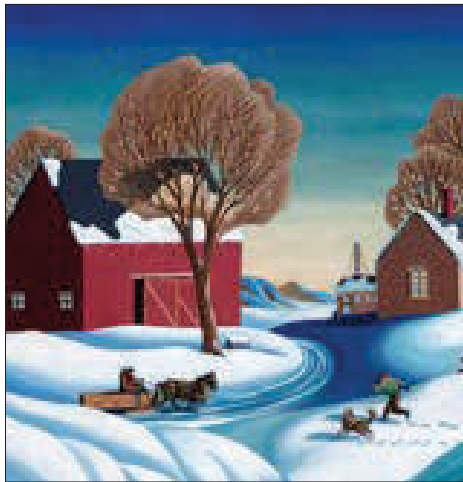

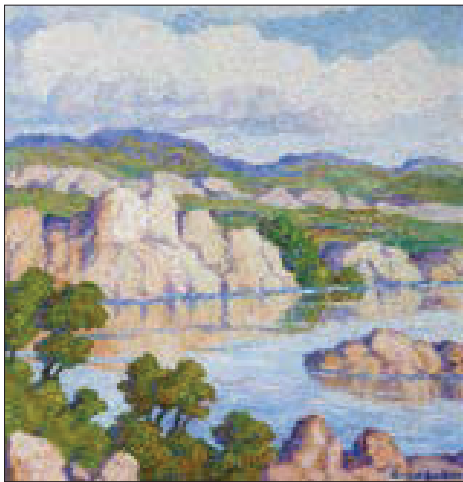
