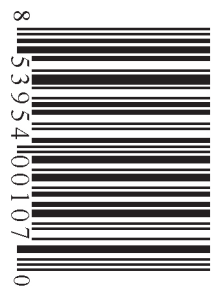

Blue Ridge pottery a colorful addition to any collection

Thousands of patterns. Millions of pieces. Each one of them just a little bit different from everything else. Although Southern Potteries Incorporated was in operation for 40 years, it wasn't until the second half of the company's time in business that it produced hand-painted Blue Ridge dinnerware. Colorful and pleasing, these wares were wildly popular when introduced. And they continue to appeal to today's collectors.

Up until 1916, the rural mountain town of Erwin was notable as the only known site in Tennessee to conduct a public execution of an elephant. But in that same year, construction of a pottery factory was begun on land that the Carolina, Clinchfield & Ohio Railroad sold to a group of investors. This means of stimulating local economies was "not an uncommon practice," according to Jay Parker, a long-time collector and dealer. As a result, trains delivered raw materials to the plant, including clay and feldspar from nearby mines, as well as coal for fueling the kilns; the finished wares were then transported to waiting markets.

Having opened in January of 1917, the plant first produced wares under the name of "Clinchfield China" before the business was incorporated as "Southern Potteries Incorporated" in 1920. Decorated with decals, Parker explained, the early output of the pottery was not easily distinguishable from that of other factories. But that would soon change, as

Charles Foreman, formerly of the Owens Pottery in Ohio, laid the groundwork for what would become Southern Potteries' winning formula: hand-painted designs under the glaze.

Parker noted that the transformation was gradual, as decals were eased out and hand painting was introduced, first as trimwork, and later for the painting of the entire design. By the mid-1930s, what was called Blue Ridge hand-painted dinnerware had "taken off."

With the increasing popularity of wares decorated by hand, employment opportunities for

local residents expanded. While those hired to manufacture the pottery blanks were primarily

Short-lived CEDs still delight today’s collectors

At the time of this writing, the highest resolution television available on the market is an 8K Ultra High Definition (UHD) TV, with a 7680 by 4320 resolution or approximately 33 million pixels. You can also purchase Blu-Ray discs with 4K UHD and a 1920 by 1080 resolution or simply stream your favorite movie in standard high definition. Yet, with a clear sense of irony, those last two sentences will likely be outdated by this time next year. Twenty-five years ago, Blockbuster Video reminded us to “Be Kind, Rewind” yet the thought of playing a VHS tape for new movie releases is a relic of the past.

Yet collectors love to search for these media relics of the past such as the Capacitance Electronic Disc System (CED). The CED was actually developed in the mid-1960s as the magnetic tape industry was beginning to become more widespread. It took a couple more decades before CED hit the commercial market and upon its release in 1981, only lasted for about three years. Though its shelf-life was short-lived, it actually had a significant impact on the 1980s boom of theatrical movie releases within the home market.

The CED system utilizes a stylus within the player that makes direct contact with the disc’s grooves to provide video and audio playback; this is nearly identical to how vinyl records are played. CED is often confused with laserdiscs, but laserdiscs do not use direct contact with a stylus, instead

utilizing a laser to optimize video and audio (this is still used in traditional Blu-Ray players). The CED system worked because the discs were conductive, in short meaning that electricity passed through the disc to the electrode in the stylus allowing the system to store an electric charge for playback. A significant limitation to this process is that dust and fingerprints severely impact skipping if present on the disc. Worried that handling of the discs would alter playback, developers created an outer shell protecting the disc (often referred to as the caddy). When the caddy was inserted into the player, the disc was transferred into the play-

er without exposure to dust and human hands. Though innovative in its approach, the disc’s maximum storage capacity was limited to 60 minutes per side. In addition to flipping the caddy halfway through a movie for continuous play, if the movie was two hours or more, a second caddy and disc were required. These limitations ultimately led to its untimely demise as VHS tapes emerged.

CED caddies (and ultimately discs) have become quite commonplace at antique markets and malls. While scarcity of some movies can be a driver for collectors, the uniqueness of the item itself and the large displayable caddy

art make them collectible. The traditional CED caddy is approximately 14 by 12 ¼ inches in size with cover art on both the back and front. The size of the graphic art makes them ideal and niche display pieces to accent any collection. The art itself is essentially paper that is glued to the plastic casing, thus making the art susceptible to damage and markings. Like any collectible, condition is everything.

The draw of CED video discs is the ability to display content via the caddy art. While values range depending on the popularity of the movie or its scarcity, popular video discs can average \$25 - \$35 with some selling for upwards of \$100. More common and less desired discs can often be purchased in

There’s plenty inside those buildings at Springfield Extravaganza

SPRINGFIELD, Ohio — The late summer weather was spectacular during this September’s Springfield Extravaganza. Guests took full advantage of the sunshine and 70-degree temperatures to browse acres of vendors’ booths at the Clark County fairgrounds.

Extravaganza has as many as 2,000 sellers. Many of those vendors are spread across 120 acres of grounds and under several partially enclosed livestock pavilions. The siren call of a 75-degree sunny day begs for shoppers to enjoy the out-of-doors, and there’s more than enough to keep them busy. That’s evidenced by the overwhelming number of pictures from Extravaganza found on social media which are taken outdoors.

Yet, the Extravaganza also has hundreds of vendors in four climate-controlled buildings. While this past Extravaganza was beautiful in terms of weather that isn’t always the case. During last spring’s Extravaganza, for example, the fairgrounds looked like a scene from a California mudslide. When bad weather hits, shoppers naturally gravitate (and sometimes run) indoors, giving inside dealers a nice uptick. Those

fortunate enough to have indoor spaces are grateful they don’t have to contend with any weather-related problems.

Afforded the protection of four walls, the indoor settings are where you find most of

the merchandise that could easily get ruined by the elements. That means the inside is home to most of the show’s ephemera,

art, better-quality glassware, electronics, and high-grade antiques. Indoors is also where you will find jewelry and collectibles valuable enough to be secured in glass cases.

Even with a facility as large as the fairgrounds, locating the buildings is easy. Arriving from the parking area, one of the first things you spot is a complex with three connected structures: the Mercantile Building, the Arts & Crafts Building, and the Annex that bridges them. All three buildings contain a mixture of furniture, smalls, and collectibles. A seller of traditional antiques may be neighbors with a numismatics seller on one side and a petroliana dealer on the other.

Somewhat of a focal point in the Annex are jewelry and collectibles dealers with quality merchandise in glass displays. In the Art & Crafts and Mercantile buildings, it's sellers of handcrafted goods and flea market-type merchandise. That may seem disconcerting if you are a diehard antiquer, but it's a perfect juxtaposition for younger buyers who, in boutique style, like to pair the old with the new. Also, if you prefer to eat indoors, the Mercantile Building has a nice cafe, with cafeteria seating for about 100.

Another inside setting to explore is the Youth Building, home to the show's finest antiques. There you will find 18th through early-20th-century furniture, world art and decor, and the show's rarer collectibles. It's common to find items with four- or even five-figure price tags. To get to the Youth Building, exit any of the three aforementioned buildings opposite their parking lot side. The fairgrounds are laid out basically like a wheel and exiting on that end puts you on the wheel's hub. The Youth Building is 50 yards straight across the hub.

From the fine antiques in the Youth Building to the array of more wallet-friendly merchandise in the Annex, Arts & Crafts, or Mercantile buildings, the hundreds of indoor vendors offer items typically quite different from what is available outside. While an outdoor booth might feature things like farmhouse tables or vintage bicycles, inside you will find pieces like Jazz-age jewelry, fully restored antique clocks, and original 1970s concert posters. Of course, beauty is in the eyes of the beholder, and you might prefer a rusty milk can sitting outside to a shiny railroad pocket watch under glass. One thing is certain, in good weather or bad, you can spend an exciting day shopping indoors at Extravaganza.

the wild for \$2 - \$5. Similar to VHS and DVD, rare horror and thriller movies are typically the most sought after. The Halloween and Friday the 13th franchises are coveted by horror collectors, with each movie from the series averaging \$25 - \$50 for each movie. The 1983 Texas Chainsaw Massacre video disc can set you back \$50. Rock and roll or music video discs also carry some value. The Blues Brothers movie sells consistently at \$30, video discs of the Beatles are valued at \$30, while Rush, Queen, Duran Duran, and Pink Floyd have average sold comps around \$15 - \$25 each.

Popular franchise movies are unsurprisingly and commonly sought after by collectors, likely due to the art and caddy size. The Star Wars trilogy –

Star Wars, The Empire Strikes Back, and Return of the Jedi – in good condition sells for around \$100 for all three movies. Note Return of the Jedi's two-disc set sells for approximately \$50 by itself. The original Ridley Scott movie Alien carries a value around \$50, while the original Dune on two-discs sells for \$30. Depending on condition, Back to the Future is a sought-after video disc, with recent auctions bringing in an average of \$50. That's not to say all pop-culture movies carry high-values. Raiders of the Lost Ark, for example, sells for around \$15.

A three-year production window for the CED yielded an extensive video disc library. Though not quite as ubiquitous and not nearly as popular as vinyl records, video discs hold a place in the pantheon of physical media. However, flipping through video discs at an antique market is as enjoyable as flipping through a box of vinyl records.

2023 Auburn Cord Duesenberg festival was a Duesy!

AUBURN, Ind. — Auburn wears its monikers, the “Classic Car Capital of the World” and the Birthplace of the American Collector Car Auction Industry” proudly. It’s for good reason; three of the most exquisite pre-war American car lines ever made — Auburns, Cords, and Duesenbergs — were either manufactured in or had ties to the city.

From 1900 to 1937, the Auburn Automobile Company operated from town, building American auto legends like the 654 Cabriolet and the Supercharged Boattail Speedster. Yet, even in the Roaring 20s — and certainly after the 1929 stock market crash — Auburns proved too costly for the American market and the company found itself in trouble. Enter transportation magnate E.L. Cord, a one-time Auburn manager, who owned everything from Stinson Aircraft to a Luxury automobile brand bearing his name. Cord acquired Auburn in 1926, the same year he also purchased Indianapolis-based Duesenberg.

That auto heritage spawned three world-class automotive museums that bring thousands of tourists annually to town. The Auburn Cord Duesenberg Automobile Museum, established in 1974, is the flagship. It’s housed in Auburn’s Art Deco former corporate building, now filled with 140 classic vehicles. The National Auto and Truck Museum opened in 1988. Two circa-1920s Auburn and Cord buildings are home to 150 vintage vehicles spanning a century of auto manufacturing. Among them is an exceedingly rare GM Futurliner bus.

In 1992 the Ford V8 Museum opened, celebrating Ford cars, trucks, and even farm machinery built from 1932-1953. The museums are not the only attraction. For 67 years, the annual Auburn Cord Duesenberg (ACD) Festival has been drawing tens of thousands of visitors. The weeklong celebration starts the weekend before Labor Day with pre-festivities. Events continue throughout the week, with the activities culminating during the holiday weekend. While events take place in multiple locations, there are three main venues.

The first is downtown Auburn where the blocks around Courthouse Square are closed off for an open-air fair space. About a mile away, the Auburn Cord Duesenberg Museum holds events and hosts show cars. Finally, the grounds of Worldwide Auctioneers and the Ford V8 Museum, about four miles from downtown, are the site of the live auction and the largest of the swap meets. Things kick off the Saturday prior to Labor Day weekend with “Cheers to the Festival” featuring cars, cocktails, hors d’oeuvres, and a VIP parade. On Sunday, it’s the “Annual Garage Cruise.” You can tour area garages for a behind-the-scenes peek at their facilities and restoration projects. On Tuesday, 50 Auburns, Cords, and Duesenbergs head out on a circuit known as the “Hoosier Tour” to promote the ACD festival. They arrive back at the Auburn Cord Duesenberg Museum in the afternoon. Wednesday the auction preview begins at the headquarters of Worldwide Auctioneers. There, you can see hundreds of world-class cars and pieces of memorabilia before they are auctioned during the live sale that runs the rest of the week. Thursday, the swap meet opens on the grounds of Worldwide Auctioneers. It includes a car corral with acres of vehicles and over 100 vendors selling petroliana, classic car parts, and antiques.

tique automotive collectibles. At Eckhart Park, about 12 blocks from Courthouse Square, the ACD Club holds its swap meet that focuses on ACD items.

Thursday and Friday, locals begin opening their yard sales. While auto collectibles are common, antiques from the 1920s-1930s, which reflect the ACD era, are also prevalent. Likewise, local boutiques begin spotlighting their early 20th-century merchandise for shoppers.

Friday, it's the cruise-in with upwards of 800 antique and classic cars landing downtown. Auburns, Cords, and Duesenbergs line 9th Street between Jackson and Main. Another 300 classic cars hosted by the Auburn Cord Duesenberg Car Club are stationed at Eckhart Park. On Saturday, during the "Parade of Classics," ACD owners drive their vehicles throughout town, eventually parking them around Courthouse Square. If you're lucky, you can score a "Ticket to Ride" in one of two dozen classic cars that will take you on a fan-

tasy ride through town.

There are also 1920s-1930s-themed events to enjoy. The "Legacy Gala" held Thursday night at the ACD Museum features food, cocktails, and entertainment amidst the museum's collections. Proceeds help support restoration projects. On Saturday night, it's the "Gatsby Gala Ball." Don your best Roaring Twenties attire and dance the night away to live big-band music. There is a cash bar featuring signature cocktails along with complimentary hors d'oeuvres.

If you don't attend a ticketed event, there are plenty of dining and entertainment options, including a Prohibition-style "speakeasy" presented by the local Moose Lodge, a pancake breakfast supporting the National Auto & Truck Museum, a food truck court with more than a dozen vendors, and of course, all the great bars, cafes, and shops in downtown Auburn.

With all the happenings, whether you go for an overnight or the week, the Auburn Cord Duesenberg Festival is a Duesy!

Silk maps provided World War II soldiers a means of escape

During World War II when pilots and soldiers found themselves lost behind enemy lines, they turned to escape or evasion maps to find their way out and back to safety. These government-issued maps were concealed upon one's person. These maps were to be used to evade capture, or if one found themselves a POW, the maps could aid in their escape.

Originally the maps were made of silk. Silk seemed the perfect medium because it is extremely flexible and tough making them a better option than paper maps. Also, silk maps were very thin, not given away with a telltale bulge when folded. They resist creasing and they are easy to read. They make no crinkly noise and are not prone to tearing as paper maps are. But making millions of maps from silk was not feasible.

The U.S. Military branches, along with the Army Map Service (AMS), worked to find a viable substitute for silk. With AMS joining Pont Corporation and Kaumagraph Company (experts in textile lithography), they found acetate rayon, having many of the qualities of silk, would be an

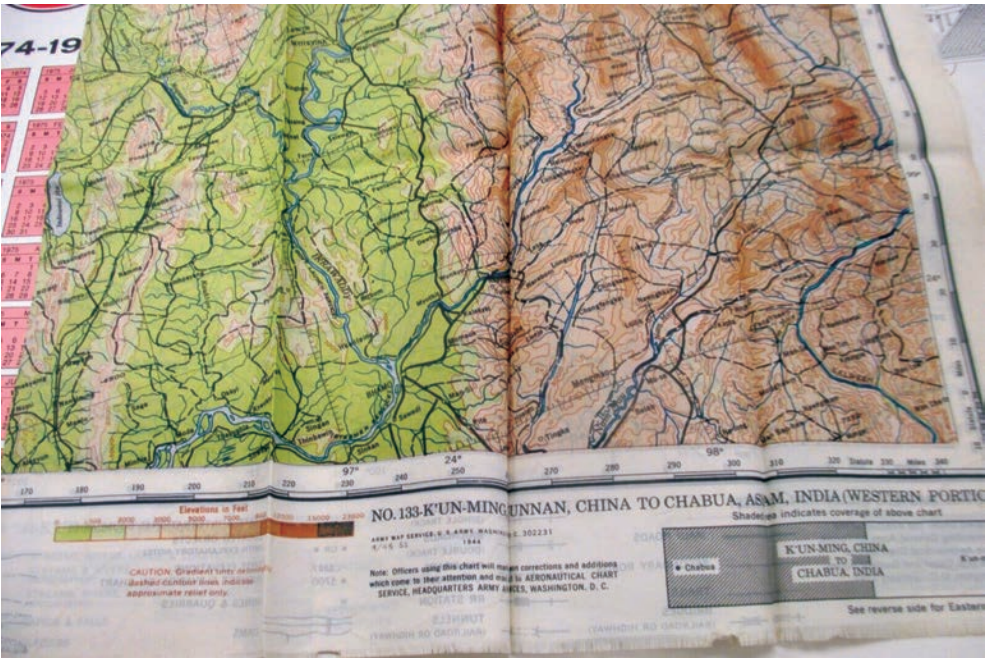

outstanding substitute for silk. Because of their silky feel; they were still referred to as silk maps. During World War II more than 3.5 million silk maps were issued to both US and Great Britain's troops.

Some escape maps, such as those made for the American Air Force were intended as an evasion tool for pilots to use when they were shot down and found themselves in enemy territory.

These types of maps included several details such as navigable rivers, easily distinguishable landmarks, a glossary of useful terms, and a legend defining local infrastructure and topography. The U.S. Navy also had their own escape maps, called "drift maps," so named for someone shot down over the sea would drift along with the currents.

Whether used as tools for escape or evasion, these maps were designed to make the most of a dire situation—possibly in life-or-death situations.

Today, escape maps are highly collectible. They cover quite a range on the collectible spectrum: military en-

1940s bicycle rode away from Rowley with \$128 bid

ATTICA, Mich. — The September Rowley Auctions estates and consignment online auction provided 1,545 lots with a variety of fascinating and useful temptations. From sporting equipment and advertising signs to furniture and antiques, the selection was appealing. Prices here do not include the buyer’s premium.

Shipping was available on some items, but not the larger ones such as the two golf carts that led the sale for final bid value. The 2002 Club Car 48 volt electric golf cart with new batteries, a restored paint job, and rear-facing back seat was reported to run and drive great. This very clean vehicle complete with charger pulled a final bid of \$4,000. Not far behind, the 2012 E-Z-GO 48 volt golf cart with 6 inch lift kit (which allows installation of larger tires), good batteries, new tires, rims, and charger, also in clean condition and reported to run and drive great, finished at \$3,950.

For the winter adventurer, the 2003 MX Z 700R yellow and black Ski-Doo Adrenaline Trail edition snowmobile provided an opportunity to take on the snowy terrain. Showing 4,800 miles, it sported a new track, push button reverse, and ran great. It required a final bid of \$1,525 to take it home. For those wishing to travel at a slower pace, the 1940s Hawthorne vintage 26 inch red bike originally sold

by Montgomery Ward stores could be just the answer. This well preserved specimen showed some wear, but still drew a respectable final bid of \$128.

Vintage advertising and product signs always seem to sell well. An unusual offering was a portion of a Sinclair Gas station sign. This remnant consisted of just the first 9 feet of the large green and white

porcelain sign, boldly displaying the letters “SIN”. Despite some minor damage, this eye-catching piece finished at \$460. Many folks have fond memories of Faygo beverages, so the vintage white and green metal Faygo sign displaying the slogan “Enjoy Ice Cold Faygo” proved popular. Measuring 17 inches high and 32 inches wide, complete with a logo featuring two

gold lions wearing crowns facing a letter “F”, it finished with a high bid of \$308.

An unusual, electrified vintage 12 inch tall oil lamp was an interesting oddity. The strawberry-shaped metal base was supported by the hanging trunks of four metal elephant heads mounted on the sides

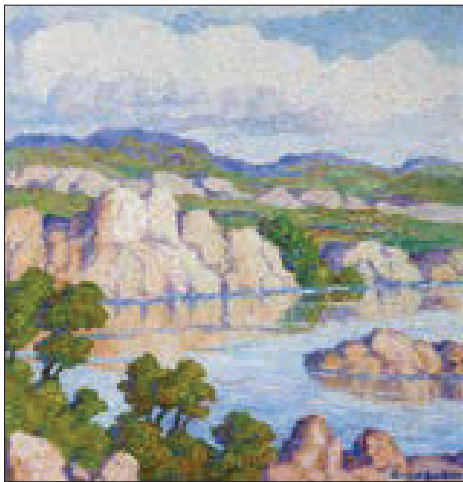

and costumed with tasseled head dresses. There were also segments of branches and leaves on the sides. This unique treasure reached a high bid of \$356. An electric lamp consisting of a lovely olive green and white stained glass shade supported by a sturdy bronze base standing 24 inches tall was not marked, but still managed a final bid of \$258. A delicate electrified vintage cranberry hanging light fixture with hobnail shade was offered complete with all the original hardware, including the retired burner assembly. It found a new home with a final bid of \$170.

There were some attractive furniture options that were popular with the bidders, starting with a matched set of Finch Fine Furniture end tables standing 27

inches tall. Each dark wood piece had two dove-tail drawers, original metal drawer pulls, carved legs, and a medallion with the company name. It included many handy features such as a metal potato drawer with lid, a sliding rack, cutting board, and a knife holder. Painted white and in very good condition with ample storage space, this workhorse left with a high bid of \$134.

A stunning 10K yellow gold ring embellished with numerous diamonds at a total weight of 14 grams was taken with a final bid of \$258. A lot consisting of two gold rings and a gold filled band closed at \$100, a trillion cut tanzanite ring with four gemstones also finished at \$100, and an Olympus 14K gold lady's wristwatch went for \$77.

A small collection of four adorable Strawberry Shortcake dolls still in their original boxes by Kenner Products was offered. They featured the characters Baby Butter Cookie with Jelly Bear, Strawberry Shortcake, Apple Dumpling, and Raspberry Tart. The set of four went home with a final bid of \$160. A vintage pair of black Latin percussion Matador series conga and tumba drums was taken with a high bid of \$106. Another eye-catching item was the Art Deco Waltham inverted triangle 8-day wind up clock. It was originally found on the dashboard of a circa 1930 Hudson automobile and was installed before cars had electric clocks. This unusual collectible was claimed with a final bid of \$158. Meanwhile, a set of four 18 inch Michelin X-Ice winter snow tires proved that practical and useful items were also appreciated, drawing a final bid of \$228 for the set. This only begins to touch on the vast array of items that were available at this great auction.

thusiasts, World War II memorabilia collectors, those interested in vintage maps, and collectors of U.S. and British history. And there are several online sites to handle the traffic from avid collectors. One such is the Old Map Gallery. A quick scan of the inventory shows most of their

escape maps are sold out. Another online seller, Early California Antiques Shop, offered a World War II double-sided silk escape and evasion map of the European Theater of War, for \$150. On eBay a two-sided World War II escape map featuring Indian, Burma and China was being offered for just over \$1,000. Other maps were found for under \$100.



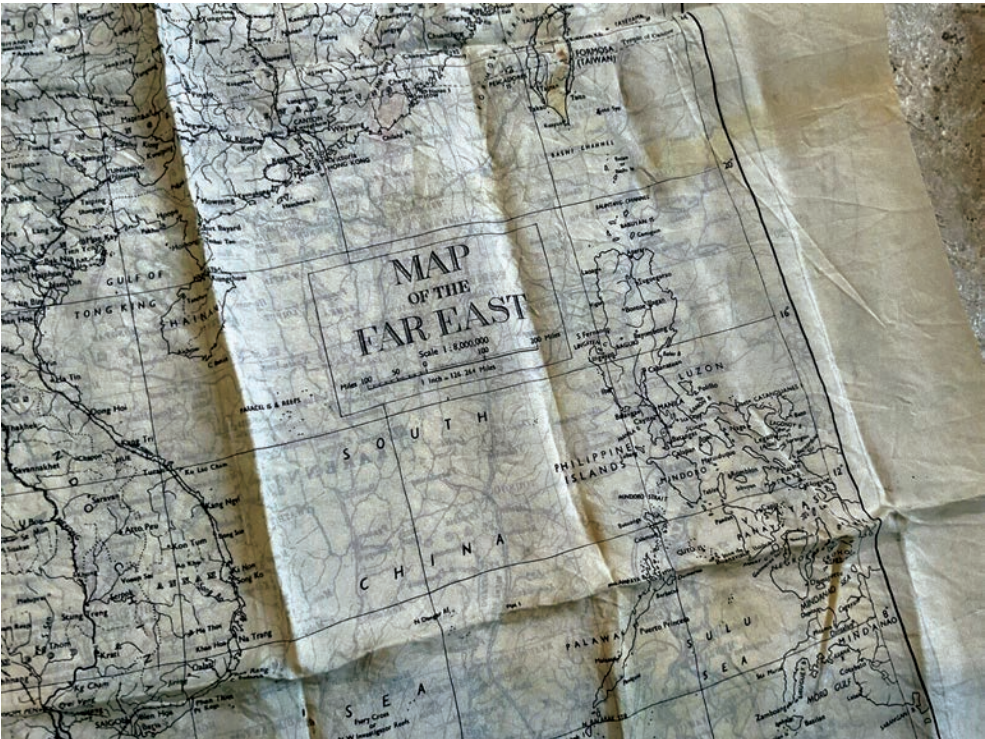

men, it was, for the most part, women who were hired as painters. Parker noted that sometimes, young women applying for a position lied about their age in order to work at the pottery.

As for the decorating process, a designer painted an “extremely good” model that was then copied by members of the paint department, who worked in teams of three or four. For example, one painter might be responsible for painting the main flower, another would fill in the leaves and stems, and finally, the rest of the team would add the finishing touches, perhaps adding sponge work or decorative lines. By all accounts, there was a strong feeling of camaraderie among the women painters.

Inspiration was often found in current decorating trends. As a result, Blue Ridge dinnerware was recognized by consumers as a “new and different” option, thanks to the designers’ “very fashionable ideas.” It was only natural that the market for these wares would expand to include department stores in New York City, as well as in stores located in Chicago, California and Minneapolis, as well as other locations, Parker pointed out. By the 1940s, Blue Ridge dinnerware was also offered for sale in companies with catalogs, including Sears and Montgomery Ward. On the other end of the spectrum, “ma and pa grocery stores” might offer these dinnerware pieces as premiums, Parker added.

With imports cut off during World War II, the sale of domestic dinnerware soared, topping out at 17 million pieces produced each year. Nothing was wasted. Plates that were deemed “seconds” because of chipped edges might be salvaged by encasing them in metal frames that would cover the flaws.

Additionally, a higher grade of porcelain wares was produced, with offerings that extended beyond dinnerware to include relish trays and lamp bases, ashtrays and vases, and trinket and cigarette boxes,

among other items.

But with the end of the War, inexpensive imports once again flooded the market, and a slump in sales of domestic wares followed. Modern tastes changed. Unbreakable dinnerware seemed to better suit the needs of young families. And the traditional patterns embraced by a previous generation were deemed to be old fashioned. On top of these, with rising labor costs, the liquidation of Southern Potteries Incorporated was inevitable. Almost 40 years to the day, the factory shut its doors in 1957.

But the story of Blue Ridge dinnerware does not end with the factory’s closing. With a new generation of collectors came a renaissance of interest in Blue Ridge, and a series of price guides and reference books were published in the 1980s. Collectors of the day were particularly attracted to patterns that resembled quimperware, and patterns with a country feel were also considered desirable. After a period of increased interest, “a decade of stagnant prices” followed. However, current interest in Blue Ridge dinnerware is once again on the rise.

And for good reason.

For those seeking vintage dinnerware for daily use, Blue Ridge is a natural choice for modern cooks and hosts. A high-fired stoneware, these pieces are hard and durable, lead-free and safe for use with all foods. Conveniently, they are also safe for use in the dishwasher, oven, and microwave. Even as interest in Blue Ridge dinnerware continues to strengthen, a set of this vintage dinnerware is still less expensive than many comparable newly-

made options. And while it may be difficult to complete a matched dinnerware set, mismatched tableware is in keeping with contemporary trends.

Beginning a collection is affordable, Parker continued. Among pieces that command relatively high prices are place settings for Christmas and, harder to find, Thanksgiving. “French Peasant” pieces are once again appearing on the market (“this might be a good time to buy them”). Children’s dishes are popular among collectors, including ones with themes that include the circus, Humpty Dumpty, and the Three Little Pigs. Mickey and Minnie Mouse children’s wares, licensed by Disney, are particularly difficult to find, thanks to their cross-collectability. For those with limited space for a collection, Parker suggested specializing in demitasse cups and saucers (or maybe, narrowing the field, say, to only those with purple flowers). Tea tiles are another option.

Research continues on the Blue Ridge dinnerware. Parker estimates that there are between 4,000 and 5,000 known patterns, 1,360 of which he has documented in his 2015 book. Numerous identifying marks were used over the years, but it should be noted that only about half of the pieces manufactured were marked.

For those seeking to learn more, the Unicoi County Heritage Museum in Erwin features exhibits of local wares in the dining room and pantry. And the Erwin

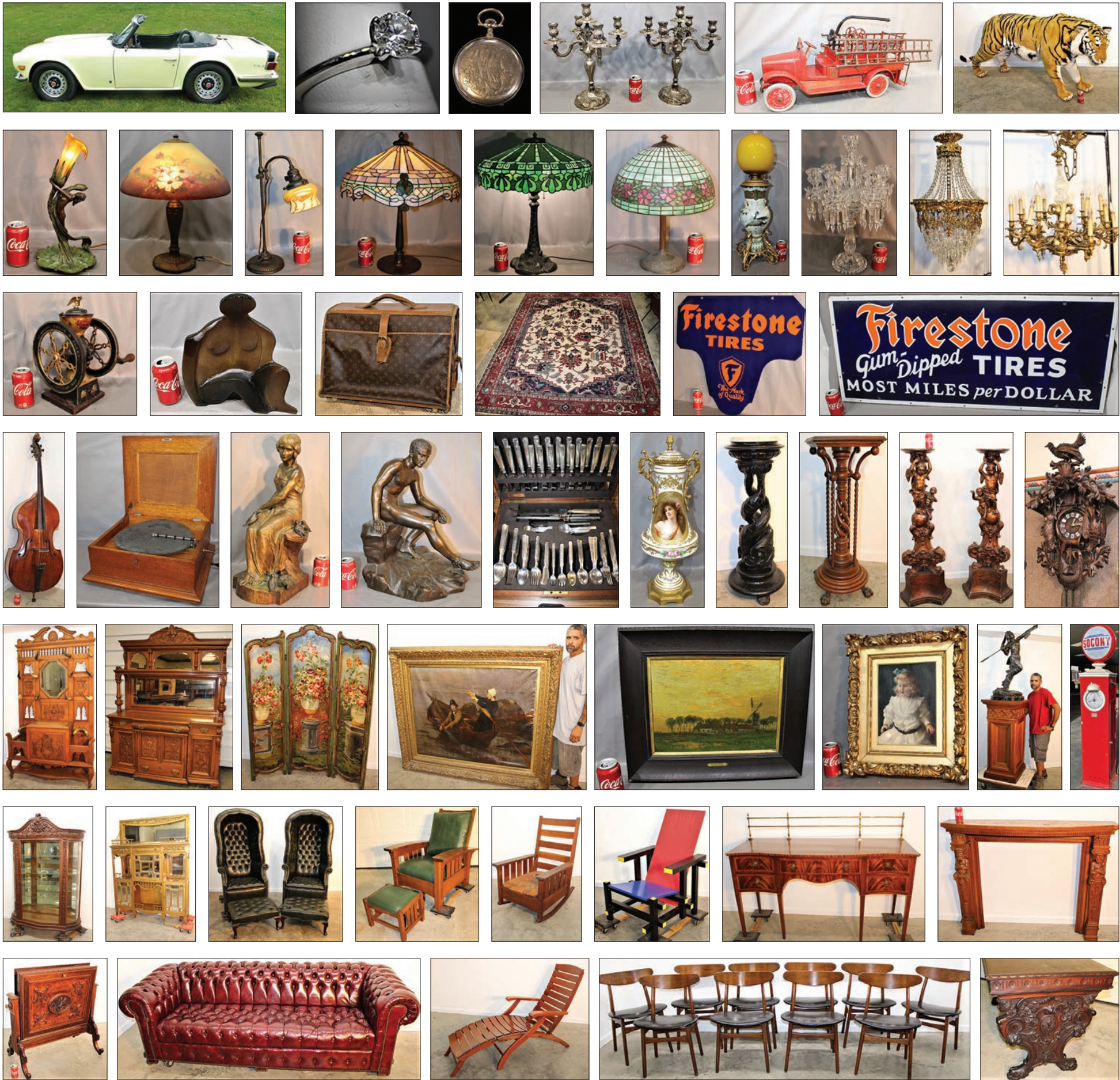
