Hood ornaments have moved from radiator caps to collectors

In the 1980s hood ornaments became a fashion statement. Rappers wore them like giant charms at the end of gold chains. Some people followed suit by stealing them right off the hoods of cars.

Hood ornaments were highly decorative and helped make cars stand out from each other. They were usually cast in brass, zinc or bronze, and finished in a chrome-plated finish. During the years when chrome plate was unavailable, they were plated in either silver or nickel.

Over time their popularity waned. Perhaps the biggest factor in the downfall of hood ornaments was safety. Europe led the charge with new pedestrian safety regulations. The idea was to keep that fancy bit of metal from seriously injuring a person during a collision. It might be the least of your worries if you're hit by a car, but it was a start.

To understand why car hood ornaments were once the standard one needs to look at how cars were designed in the early 20th century. Early automobiles had their radiator caps outside of the hood and just above the grille. These radiator caps aren't particularly attractive, so automakers started using hood ornaments to dress

them up and make them pretty. It was mostly about aesthetics. Any design would be much more appealing than boring old radiator caps.

When radiator caps were moved under the hood, hood ornaments remained atop the front of the vehicle, becoming a 'fashion statement' and identifier for the automaker.

Some of the more recognizable car hood ornaments include the Jaguar Leaper, Bugatti Dancing Elephant, Bentley Flying B and Rolls-Royce Spirit Left: The Spirit of Ecstasy is the bonnet mascot sculpture on Rolls-Royce cars and is one of the world's most highly desired and prestigious hood ornaments. It portrays the form of a woman leaning forwards with her arms outstretched behind and above her. With a value of hundreds of thousands of dollars, it is also the world's most expensive hood ornament. (photo submitted)

of Ecstasy. However, even more affordable brands once had a little something extra out on the hood.

Hood ornaments (or car mascots as they are known in the U.K.), were quite popular in the 1920s, 1930s, 1940s and 1950s. Many hood ornaments were themed to reflect the most powerful, or modern, technology of the times. For example, locomotives adorned cars in the 1930s while airplanes, torpedoes and





Janet's Antiques in Madison, Wis., celebrates 50 years in business

MADISON, Wis. — In 1973 Janet Holden Hoopes faced a dilemma. She was in the middle of PhD studies in English literature when her mother died unexpectedly. Her mother had also been the caretaker of Jane's daughter while Janet was in college. Janet put her studies on hold and looked for something she could do from home.

She drew on an interest in antique furniture and started an antiques business from her home. Today, the store is celebrating its 50th anniversary, and daughter Elizabeth Jane (she goes by Jane) is at the helm.

The business started humbly, with sales often staged in the driveway. Janet had a big learning curve and made her share of mistakes, like purchasing reproductions heralded as originals. But the business grew, and in 1978, Janet opened her first storefront in a former pub not far from the University of Wisconsin. Jane would come to the shop after school and do homework while her mother ran the store.

The original location was not ideal, as the building suffered from flooding. Jane recalls hastily stacking furniture during knee-deep swells to get it off the basement floor. One time, a basement wall collapsed and a deluge filled the basement. The loss was huge and insurance denied paying claims. They bounced back, and Janet stayed at that location until 2001, finally moving to another spot in the same shopping center.

Jane became a partner in the business in 1985. She added her specialties including art glass, art porcelain, and pottery and the pair began steering the business toward finer 18th and 19th antiques. Each year, they would set out on 4-5 cross-country buying trips to find good-caliber merchandise. "Sometimes that meant 20-hour days," Jane said, adding, "it was hard

Developer seeking public's help recovering stolen architectural antiques

CRAWFORDSVILLE, Ind. — In August thieves broke into Crawfordsville's Ben Hur Building, which is undergoing redevelopment, and stole multiple architectural artifacts.

In what was undoubtedly a scrap metal crime, the thieves took both common recyclable metal and metal architectural elements. Jonathan Anderson, principal of AP Development LLC, the Indianapolis-based company doing the renovation, said items taken included original door handles, railings, metal elevator trim, and mail slots. Anderson noted the stolen artifacts were important to their National Parks Standards restoration.

The artifacts are easily recognizable. Several of the stolen pieces dated to the building's 1911 construction.

but exhilarating!"

Decades of buying and selling helped finesse their expertise. Janet added antique jewelry to her lineup, joined the American Society of Appraisers (ASA), and became an officer of the National Association of Dealers in Antiques. Jane became an authority on cut glass. She also joined the ASA, along with the American Cut Glass Association (ACGA) for which she's been a National Convention pre-

Janet died in 2021, but Jane has kept the business going. "I enjoy what I am doing. I enjoy sharing my research. I have no plans to retire," Jane said.

Today, Janet's Antiques offers furniture, decor, jewelry, and fine art spanning the 18th century through the first half of the 20th. The expertise is a calling card. "We believe that if someone purchases one of our antiques, they deserve the benefit of our knowledge and experience."

Not many antique retailers last 50 years. For Janet's Antiques, the staying power stems from an appreciation for antiques combined with a bent toward customer service. Their website perhaps says it best, "Antiques are a tangible reminder of our history...to pass on to another caretaker." Jane feels that part of her job is to help customers find the right pieces. She mentioned that people often return to share stories about the pieces they've

Still, an antique shop also needs to change with the times, and Janet's has thoughtfully evolved. While they haven't embraced the late 20th-century craze, they have adjusted to a more significant shift in consumers' tastes.

Jane calls it a paradigm shift rooted in minimalism. "People are still buying, but now they just want one exceptional example of something," she said. And, that "something" generally needs to be utilitarian.

Their evolution is also evident in their use of technology. They have an impressive website, complete with a

video introduction, an X account (formerly Twitter), and a Facebook page with beautiful photography. Jane also noted they are big users of email for staying in front of customers.

There's also an online store, although they don't do a lot of e-commerce. "It's partly my own bias," Jane admitted. "Shipping is difficult and

people want to see and touch things. That's particularly important when it comes to furniture."

Janet's Antiques is holding a holiday sale from Thanksgiving to Christmas to celebrate their 50 years in business.

Multiple brass Art Nouveau door handles with the raised inscription "TBH" for "Tribe of Ben Hur" were taken. The door handles reference the insurance company that constructed the building. A 97-inch iron Art Nouveau stair railing with a distinctive pattern along with a complimentary pilaster; and, several brass mail slots, taken from interior doors, that have the raised word "Letters" on the flap were

Also stolen were elements added during a circa-1940 update that added Art Deco flair to the building. The thieves were successful at taking a Streamline Moderne stainless steel floor indicator for the elevator but were unable to steal the door faces or surrounding door trim. They also took metal mail drops from floors 2-5 imprinted with raised "US Mail" on their

The stolen elements were integral to the interior of the five-story neoclassical building. The terracotta-faced Ben Hur Life Insurance Building, located at the intersection of Main and Water streets, was constructed in 1911 as the headquarters for the Supreme Tribe of Ben-Hur, a mutual benefit society that provided life insurance to its members. The building was named after General Lew Wallace's famous 1880 novel, Ben Hur. Wallace, who sat on the Lincoln assassination trial, also served as Governor of the New Mexico Territory from 1878-1881 and was Minister to Turkey from 1881-1885. He also lived in Crawfordsville for many years.

The Ben Hur fraternity was incorporated in 1894 and once had over 100,000 members. In 1930, the entity changed its name to the Ben-Hur Life Association. By 1990, the fraternity had been disbanded in favor of a mutual insurance company, USA Life One Insurance Company of Indiana. That company operated from Fishers, Indiana, and the Ben Hur building was leased to various commercial tenants. By 2005, the building was vacant and in dire need of rehabilitation.

AP Development is renovating the landmark as the centerpiece in the city's Indiana Stellar Communities Designation plan intended to revitalize the downtown and attract professionals back to the city. Following an approximately \$13 million renovation, the building will have 60 apartments

and retail space on the first floor. Construction is set to begin this year

Anderson wants to convey that anything offered for sale from the Ben Hur building is stolen and not legitimately salvaged. A reward is offered for information leading to the return of the collection. He hopes that someone has seen - or will see - these items somewhere. "I just want these items back so that our restoration of the Ben Hur building will be complete," Anderson said. Barring their return, he's researched having the pieces reconstructed. "That's a matter of cost," he acknowledged.

800 pieces of pottery will cross the block at Embassy Auctions

KINZERS, Pa. – During his nearly 24 years in the auction business, the carefully-spoken Lee S. Jacobs has not generally been given to hyperbole.

But when the owner of Embassy Auctions International says, "This is going to be one of the largest and best auctions of a lifetime for fine pottery and antique bottle collectors," he must have some formidable firepower to back up his words.

Consider this, more than 800 pieces of quality pottery, dating from 1882 to 1960. All from one collector, a retired Army Lieutenant Colonel who has elected to remain in Japan after his separation from the mil-

The lineup includes: 338 pieces of Rookwood, 190 pieces of Roseville, 33 examples of Fulper, 48 pieces of Van Briggle, 53 selections of Weller, 21 pieces of Cowan, 11 pieces of Royal Doulton, and 11 pieces of Santa Barbara Ceramic Design pieces.

The listing doesn't stop there. Numerous other well-known pottery names will see the auction block.

More than 40 antique bottles featuring light amber Tippecanoe, amber Pineapple

unembossed, Barrel-Bourbon Whiskey Bitters, light The Arlington, Bakersfield, amber pumpkinseed flask, Van Dunck's figural coachman, Hall's Barrel bitters, Brown's India Queen in medium amber, Berkshire Bitters figural pig bottle and

The entire collection was shipped to Embassy Auctions from Japan where the Colonel had them in his possession and, with the exception of the treasure trove being tied up in Customs for 10 weeks, all safely arrived without chips, cracks and breaks.

"They all look brand new," Jacobs said.

The sale of the collection will be divided into two sessions: the first session is scheduled at the Embassy Auctions International gallery at 5336 Mine Road on Nov. 9, beginning at 10 a.m. Three hundred and fifty lots will be sold. The staff has taken great pains to ensure the selections between the two sessions are equitable.

Lighting and clocks kept bidders on their toes at Cottone auction

GENESEO, N.Y - Once again Cottone Auctions has made its mark in the auction arena, establishing itself as a leading seller of important collections. The September 29 Fine Art, Antiques & Silver auction was highlighted by the private collection of Hugh Douglas Barclay (1932-2021), an 11-term New York state senator and a United States ambassador to El Salvador. "I was thrilled to work with Barclay's family and we were very pleased with the interest in the auction," said Matt Cottone. "Prices finished very strong, which is not unusual for us. This two-day sale represented not only the Barclay collection but other outstanding forty to fifty year collections that included Tiffany, silver, art, and clocks, and prices were strong across the board."

The September 30 auction was highlighted by fine clocks from the collection of Thomas Grimshaw, internationally known scholar and horologist alongside the collection of Dr. Stephen Wallace. The total for the two auctions that offered 353 lots combined was \$3.2 million.

Cottone's knowledge of Tiffany is widely recognized in the arena, and the top lot was a Tiffany Studios "Poppy" table lamp that soared past the high estimate of \$80,000 to real-

The circa 1910 leaded glass and patinated bronze lamp had an organic form six-light base with six favrile glass candle sleeves and the original push-pull switch. It measured 22 inches high with a 17 inch diameter shade. The base was impressed 'Tiffany Studios New York 589'. The shade was impressed 'Tiffany studios New York 1461-17'.







18 ¾ inches tall with a 14 inch diameter shade, both impressed Tiffany Studios New York. The base, also impressed "554," is illustrated in "Tiffany Lamps and Metalware" by Alastair Duncan.

An interesting Tiffany Studios rondel, signed "L.C.T." and numbered F905, was 17 ½ inches in diameter and in excellent condition. It doubled the high estimate to sell for an impressive \$24,000. Cottone said, "Rondels would have been made at the end of the day as a decorative object to hang on the wall. They were basically made with what was left of the day's material for extra fun with a whimsical attitude. This one was a rare piece with a nice color and a very nice presentation."

Silver was topped by an exceptional pair of silver five-light candelabra designed by Georg Jensen with a mark of Georg Jensen, Copenhagen, 1925-1932. Each weighed 408 troy ounces and were mounted on a circular base with a vase-shaped stem decorated with openwork foliage. The bases were marked, No. 562B, and inscribed, "Dorothy Moody Barclay from Hugh Barclay – August 31 – 1936." They stood 22 inches tall and commanded \$81,000, outdistancing the estimate of \$40,000 to \$60,000.

Another standout from the Barclay collection was a rare monumental Georg Jensen silver centerpiece tureen and cover, Model 573, circa 1936. It was created in an ovoid melon form with a pinecone handle on a raised foot. The piece was signed and inscribed by Georg Jensen (in cursive), weighed 157.6 troy ounces, and mea-

sured 14 ½ inches high by 21 inches wide with a 13 inch diameter. It was in excellent condition and sold for \$66,000.

Art was highlighted by an Andy Warhol (American, 1928 - 1987) depiction of Mick Jagger (F. & S. II.139) The colored screenprint on Arches Aquarelle paper, 1975, was signed in pencil and also signed in black felttip pen by the subject, numbered 204/250 (total edition includes 50 art-

ist's proofs). It was printed by Alexander Heinrici, with the publisher's ink stamp verso, Seabird Editions, New York. The work was 43 ¾ inches high by 29 inches wide and surpassed the high estimate of \$80,000 to yield \$132,000. An in-depth background of Warhol was included in the catalog description noting the importance of Warhol's creations. The work was derived from the private collection of Dr. H. Rolf and Elisabeth Weber, Buffalo, N.Y.

Another color screenprint on cardboard, "Growing" (Plate 2), by Keith Haring (American, 1958-1990), from the Growing Portfolio, 1988, was signed and numbered from the edition of 100 in pencil. The piece measured 40 inches high by 30 inches wide and was printed by Rupert Jasen Smith, New York (with blind stamp). The work brought \$69,000, going beyond the high estimate of \$40,000.

Clocks included a Carousel astronomical timepiece by Aaron Dodd Crane, made by the Boston Clock Company, circa 1850, that brought a hefty \$78,000. The highly presentational clock, believed to one of only four examples still in existence, had a gilt frame on a marble base, original painted metal dial, and a skeletonized fusee movement. The 20 inch tall clock was signed Boston Clock Co., 375 Days, and with 1841 to 1855 patent dates.

The sum of \$45,600 was paid for a rare, one of a kind, Juvet celestial time globe that was estimated at \$15,000 to \$25,000. The piece was made by Louis P. Juvet, Juvet & Co. Time Globe Table Clock, Canajoharie, New York, circa 1880, and the catalog noted, "This Juvet model is the only known example with a celestial globe." It stood 35 ½ inches tall and had a tabletop stand supporting a 12 inch celestial globe displaying constellations with zodiacal figures. Manufactured by JUVET & CO., CA-NAJOHARIE, N.Y. United States Patents, Sept. 23, Oct. 28, 1879. English Patent, Oct. 3, 1879

It is easy to add antiques ambiance to the holiday kitchen

There's no place like home for the holidays: The dining room looks like something out of a Norman Rockwell painting, and a big-screen television is the main attraction in the

family room. Then there's the kitchen, which is always the heart of the home. But especially so now.

These days, thanks in large part to decorating shows, the concept of a perfect kitchen is more than one that boasts decent counterspace and a dishwasher. If we can believe what we see on tv, many homeowners are anxious to knock down a few walls, take the cabinets up to the ceiling, and install an oversized island. Cold stone surfaces and stainless steel appliances blend in with the overall monochromatic color palette, with champagne gradually becoming the new white (which was the new gray).

On the other hand, some trends are moving away from the concept of a sleek kitchen to embrace "farmhouse chic" and "cottage style." Fortunately, cozying up a kitchen space doesn't require a complete redo, just the injection of a bit of vintage style to soften harsh lines and warm up otherwise cold spaces.

Let's start with the kitchen table. The addition of a colorful tablecloth is an easy "fix," according to Jimmie Bucci. "Vintage linens bring back fond memories of cozier times when families gathered around the table for meals and for discussing what was going on in each other's life," according to Jimmie, president of the Vintage Tablecloth Lovers Club. He added "when paired with vintage dinnerware that has been passed down



from generation generation, tablecloths and napkins provide a nostalgic feel for simpler times."

Because of the quality of fabric used for even the most modest

mid-century tablecloths, their care is easy. Machine wash on the gentle cycle and then pull the cloth from the dryer, smooth it, and fold it before it can wrinkle. No ironing required. And while "thinking textiles," remember to display seasonal vintage tea towels for all to see. For that matter, why not keep a tablecloth on the table even when it's not mealtime?

On the other hand, a small vintage electric accessory might be fun. Even if overhead lighting in your kitchen is adequate, the addition of a small tabletop lamp in a dark corner can make a difference. Besides adding ambience when day is done, it can serve as the perfect nightlight for midnight snackers. Similarly, instead of depending on the stove read-out for the time of day, hang a kitschy electric clock on the wall. Extra points if it's in the shape of a teapot.

Speaking of teapots, one new homeowner recently found a way to use teapots in a decorative way. "I wanted to re-pot the new house plants I bought for my house," noted Connie Swaim, editor of "AntiqueWeek." "I was sure I had some wonderful planters stashed somewhere, but I couldn't find them. I was going through some of the boxes and saw a teapot. I decided it would be perfect." At last count, she has at least two teapots serving as planters.

Connie said that it was "necessity" that influenced her. All I can say is that this is a good way to repurpose

a teapot with a lost or broken lid. If er time. nothing else, let it be an incentive to start a kitchen herb garden. Think mint for tea, chives for salads, and basil for homemade tomato sauce.

Back to the subject of ceramics. Consider using a colorful old bowl for ripening fruit on the countertop. Or dedicate an otherwise unusable corner of the counter for a collection of decorative ceramic pieces (including salt-and-pepper shakers) from anoth-

Finally, take a look at the seating in your kitchen. Old wooden farmhouse chairs add a homey touch, all the better if they are not part of a matched set (but painted the same color). Or put a metal counter chair/step ladder to work. And if there's room, why not add an inviting wooden rocking chair into the kitchen, the perfect perch for someone to keep the cook company?



gun sights appeared in the 1940s. Jet aircraft and rockets made their appearance in the 1950s. These technology imageries coupled with several other stylized shapes and themes inspired a wide array of hood sculptures that still fascinate collectors today.

Women were also popular ornaments. In the 1930s Cadillac adorned its hoods with a winged woman. Buick hood ornaments were characterized by stylized versions of female figures (early 1930s), locomotives (late 1930s), airplanes (early 1940s), gun sights (late 1940s to mid-1950s) and jet fighters (mid to late 1950s).

The Chevrolet Motor Company incorporated the eagle ornament in its line of cars from the late 1920s to early 1930s. In the 1930s and 1940s, it added the locomotive to its designs, before turned to the impala design in the early 1950s. Gun sights were used in the late 1950s.

In 1926, General Motors introduced a modestly-priced car line produced in Pontiac, Michigan (so named after a famous Ottawa chief). So, it's no surprise that throughout the 1930s, 1940s and 1950s, car hoods would be adorned with sleek variations of a "chief" with the head-dress motif.

The Plymouth automobile was introduced in 1928 by the Chrysler Corporation. From the 1930s to the early 1950s, Plymouth hood ornaments were typically characterized by stylized sailing ships or schooners.

Rolls-Royce is one of the few automakers left today that still uses a hood ornament to adorn the front of its cars. It's called the Spirit of Ecstasy, an elegantly winged woman that appears to lean into a constant headwind.

The Rolls Royce ornament was designed from an original radiator cap statuette sculpted for Lord Montagu of Beaulieu, modeled after his mistress Eleanor Velasco Thornton. Rolls Royce's hood ornaments were actually silver plated through 1914, but their frequent theft caused the company to switch to stainless steel.

Mercedes-Benz how has its threepointed star prominently displayed on the grille. It's even subtly backlit at night so no one can miss the fact that you're driving a Benz.

Some car makers chose to use animals in their ornaments, like the Packard swan, the Mac Truck bulldog, the Dodge

ram's head, or the Ford greyhound. Many other hood ornaments were created to represent ancient civilizations or mythological characters, like Armstrong Siddeley's sphinx and Cadillac's winged goddess.

During the 1920s, the illustrious glass studio of Rene Lalique introduced a series of beautifully sculpted radiator covers (and eventually hood ornaments) featuring classical deities and animal figures. These ornaments, which could be used to customize any standard car, ranged from "The Archer," to a flat disc engraved with a nude Grecian bow hunter, to a stylized row of leaping glass horses.

"The most valuable are the glass ornaments by Rene Lalique," said Sandy Erdman an appraiser from Winona, Minn. "In mint condition, they sell for thousands of dollars each. They are designed for Citroens, Butattis, Bentleys

and others. With any collectible, the rarity of Lalique pieces has also led to many fakes, as most collectors cannot afford a Lalique."

One of Lalique's most popular designs, "The Dragonfly," included a lighted, multicolored mechanism beneath its base, which revolved as the car moved to cast various shades of light up through the clear glass statue. By 1932, Lalique was offering 46 different radiator cap designs in its annual catalog.

One can expect to pay \$1,000 for a Jaguar Mark 7 hood ornament, up to \$400 for a 1939 Dodge leaping ram ornament, \$500 for a Lincoln Greyhound ornament or \$350 for a 1934 Chevrolet ornament. Of course, much less for all of these if they're in imperfect condition.

Hood ornaments are not cheap. But then, they're much less expense than the vintage four-wheeler they adorned.
