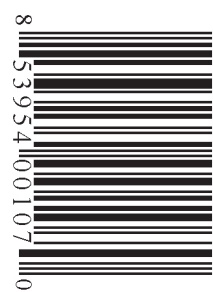

Higgins glass is a rainbow of opulent design

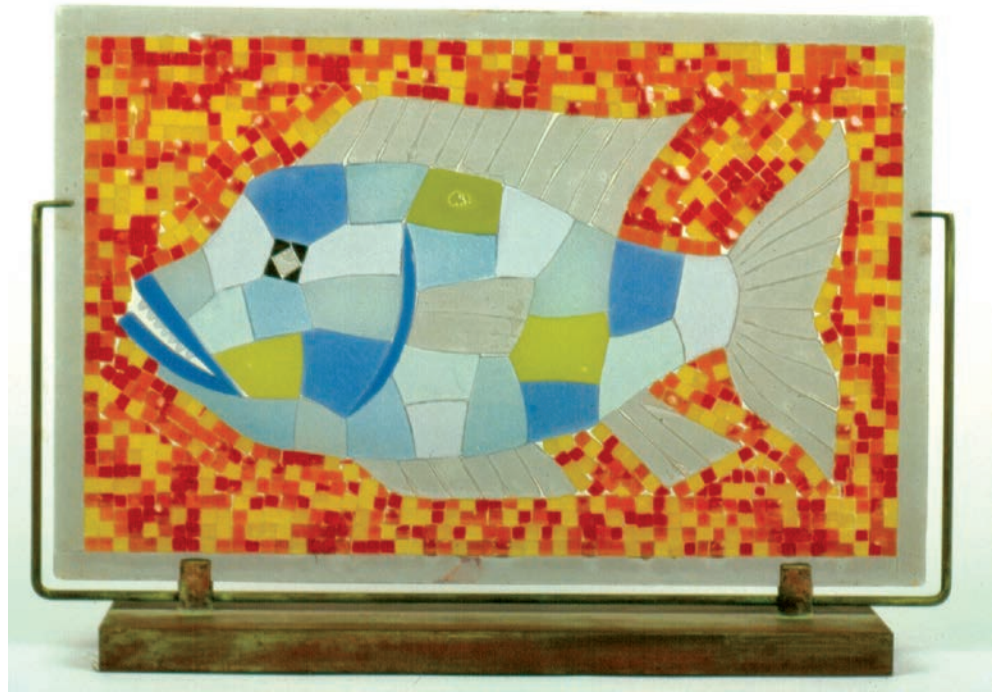
"Stardust"...
"Barbaric Jewels"...
"Arabesque"...
"Mandarin."

The titles glow with color and imagination. The glass objects they refer to make good on that promise. This is Higgins glass, the fused marvel that attracted buyers by the droves in the 1950s and '60s, and continues to delight collectors today.

With its arresting mix of geometric and curved lines, and bold use of colors ranging from eye-popping oranges to cool blues, Higgins glass transformed ordinary table and giftware into something vibrant and exciting. Why settle for a tableful of drab china bowls and plates, when for the same price that table could be transformed into a "glass act?" From chip bowls to candleholders, cake stands to cigarette boxes, Higgins glass provided all that the '50s-modern homemaker could wish for, and did so with affordable dazzle. Early ads called Higgins glass "an exclamation point in your decorating scheme," and the ads had it right. Higgins glass harnessed vivid imagination to innate practicality. That team up came courtesy of the team behind the "higgins" signature, Frances and Michael Higgins.

Born in London in 1908, Michael Higgins studied at the London Central School of Arts and Crafts before

immigrating to the United States in 1939. After serving in Washington during World War II, Michael was named Head of Visual Design at the Chicago Institute of Design. There, he met Frances Stewart.

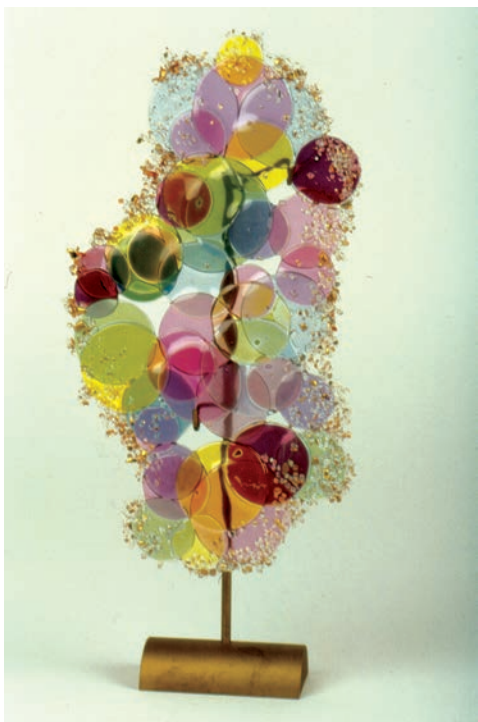
Frances, a Haddock, Georgia, native born in 1912, had graduated from the

Georgia State College for Women. An assistant professorship in art at the University of Georgia led to a Rockefeller Foundation Fellowship, which led to the Institute of Design — which led to her instructor, Michael Higgins. The attraction was immediate. As Michael once said, "it wasn't so much a whirlwind romance as a duststorm!" Determined to make a living as independent craftsmen, the two married, and left the Institute in

1948.

Today, it seems there are craft shops and art fairs on every corner. In 1948, the situation was much different. As Frances dryly noted, "we were about starving to death." Setting up kilns behind the sofa in their apartment on Chicago's Oak Street, the Higgins determined to make a go of it. Following small orders for glass plates, they attracted the attention of a buyer from Marshall Field & Company. Soon, Michael and Frances were working in split shifts, 14 hours a day, seven days a week, to keep up with orders from Marshall Field, Georg Jensen, Bullock's Wilshire, and other major retailers of the era. The attraction? Familiar glass objects fashioned in an unfamiliar manner, exotically colored, expertly made, and affordably priced. As Chicago Life magazine put it, the Higgins were adapting "old craft for modern tastes."

The Higgins were pioneers in the use of fused glass. Although it had been around for thousands of years, the technique had been abandoned by many mid-century artisans in favor of blown glass. Essentially, fusing is the creation of a "glass sandwich." On one piece of enamel-coated glass, a design is created, either drawn with colored

Amelia Jeffers returns to her roots at Garth’s Barn

COLUMBUS, Ohio — Auctioneer Amelia Jeffers has a long history with Garth’s Auctions. She was co-owner of the business from 1996 through 2017 and she worked there under the tutelage of original owners Tom and Carolyn Porter. Last year Jeffers returned to the Garth’s Barn in Delaware, Ohio, and held an auction there again. She is on track to hold a Thanksgiving weekend auction at the facility Nov. 24 and 25. This is a “black Friday” tradition at the facility that is 60 years old.

While she was working on this auction she got a call from a representative of her former company, who approached her with an opportunity to take on their existing clients. Over the coming days, she would learn that Garth’s would longer be conducting auctions, leaving behind a large amount of consigned material in a massive Columbus warehouse including the revered collection of the late Bruce Knight and his wife, Vivalyn. Conversations with her team, with Vivalyn, and a little soul searching led Jeffers to accept the opportunity.

Jeffers has agreed to take over the warehouse and assume responsibility for contacting each consignor personally to explain the situation and offer options that include picking up their items or placing them in the care of Jeffers moving forward. She has rolled the first of the consignments into her Thanksgiving sale and has scheduled the 60-year collection of Bruce and Vivalyn Knight for Jan. 5-6 also at The Garth’s Barn.

Bruce and Vivalyn Knight are well-known, having established the month-

ly Springfield Antique Show and Flea Market and the Heart of Ohio Antique Center, both icons in the antiques industry. The family’s lifelong collection will be one of the most significant sales held at the Garth’s Barn in many years, encompassing more than 800 lots of important Americana, folk art, and decorative arts. “The Knight Collection is a whole other story on its own,” Jeffers noted, promising more information to come.

“It is a wild but exciting time for us,” Jeffers said when describing the mood around the warehouse. “My team is

hustling. We already had an additional single-owner online auction scheduled for December 8 - and it could be a sleeper. I was worried about getting it all done, but Vivalyn encouraged me when we agreed to sign together that it was going to be a lot of work in a short amount of time - but to not forget to have some fun. We are definitely having fun.”

The December online-only auction features a collection of country Americana assembled over more than 40 years, with great painted furniture, early advertising, primitives, toys,

early toys, textiles, and stoneware, with select additions bringing the catalog to more than 350 lots.

While both the Thanksgiving and December auctions are posted, Jeffers’ team is simultaneously completing the

Colonial Williamsburg gets fashionable donation

When Lewis Littlepage drew his last breath in 1802, he had no direct heirs. At his direction, his personal papers were burned. For that matter, his estate included few pieces of household goods. In short, after his death, the Virginia man left little behind in the way of a physical footprint, especially considering he was both educated and well-traveled, having hobnobbed with European royalty.

On the other hand, he left a legacy that, more than 200 years later, continues to thrill historians. As the proverb suggests, clothes make the man. And, in this case, they continue to define him.

Littlepage was born in 1762, but it is unclear in which Virginia county, either Hanover (as his grave marker indicates) or Kent. His life was altered at an early age with the death of his father and the remarriage of his widowed mother. After studying in Williamsburg at what is now known as the College of William & Mary, he set out to see the world and find adventure at the age of 17. He was successful on both counts, serving with John Jay at the Court of Spain during the American Revolution,

fighting in the Spanish army during the attack on Minorca and the Siege of Gibralt-

tar, and assuming the role of Chamberlain to Poland’s King Stanislav II until 1795. Littlepage returned home to America in

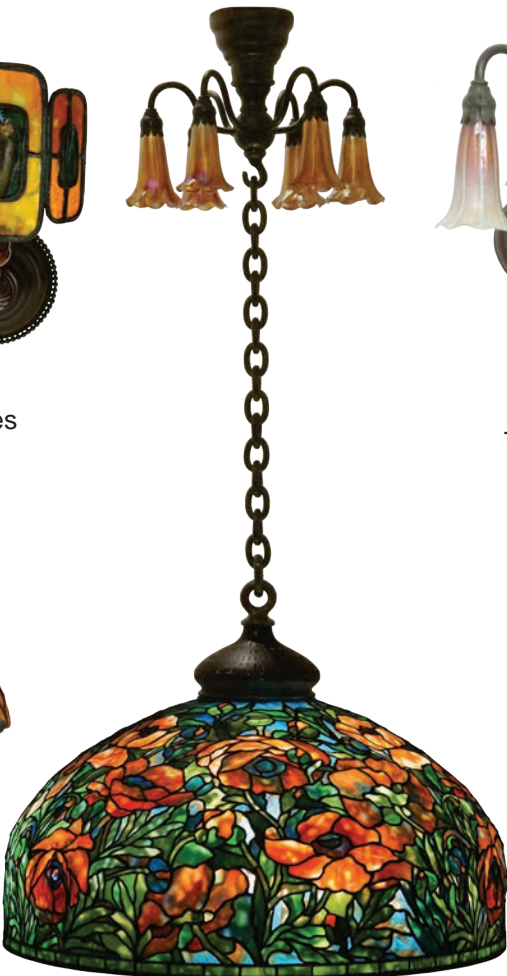

Unique roaster headlines Mr. Peanut auction at \$25,000

BIRDSBORO, Pa., – The second annual Peanut Power Consignment Auction hosted by Jesse Camelleri Auctioneer took place Oct. 20. Bidders could participate live at the Birdsboro, Pa., auction gallery or anywhere via the online option. Those with an affinity for anything and everything associated with Planters Peanuts love having an auction that features their favorite monocle-wearing legume.

To say the main attraction of the day was a rarity is an understatement. Easily falling into the category of “when-will-you-ever-find-another,” the top lot of the sale was the Planters Peanut roaster with a mechanical, fiberglass Mr. Peanut who when activated appeared to be riding the roaster.

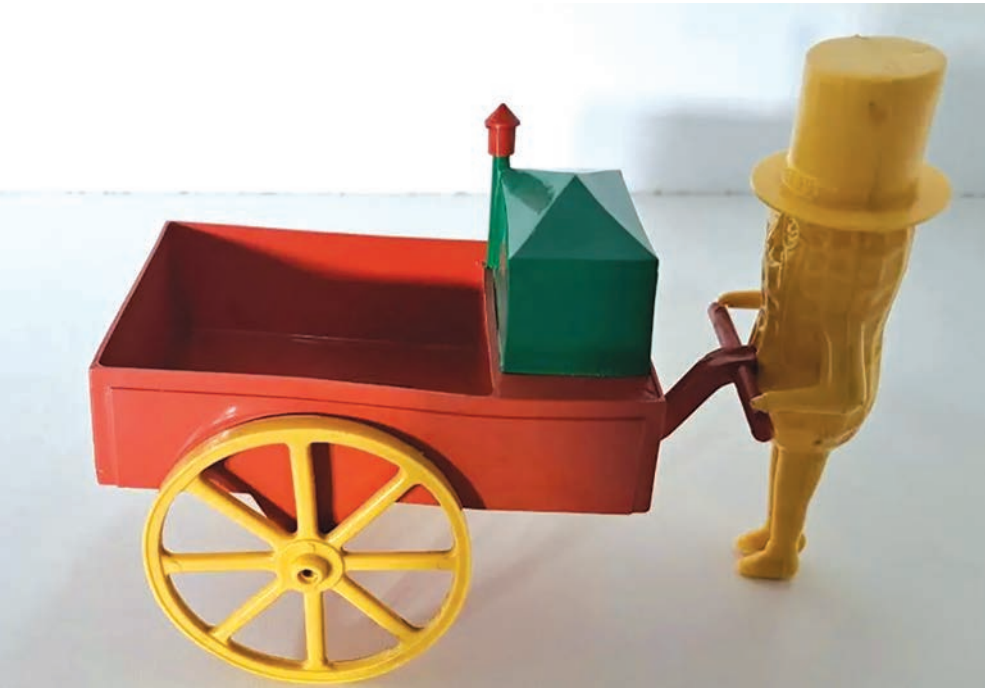
While the roaster and Fiberglass Mr. Peanut were original, the stainless “tower” that housed the gear reducer and belt drive to make Mr. Peanut move was a reproduction needed to keep the display in working order.

Camelleri noted in the auction listing, if you actually wanted to roast peanuts in the unit, a new motor would be needed, but other than that, the display piece was complete.

A whopping 7 foot 3 inches tall, 4 foot long, and 32 inches wide, this rare Mr. Peanut display piece was bid to \$25,000. Prices do not include

printed catalog for the Knights’ January auction.

Jeffers’ return to the historical barn last year marked a pivotal moment for her personally and professionally: within the walls of the 200+ year old building is where she had “grown up” in the auction business. Her four children had literally grown up there, as Jeffers lived on the property for a number of years when they were young.

The Thanksgiving Auction will feature choice objects from consignors throughout the country including an original Alexander Calder with Pace Galleries provenance, an important Vermont chest attributable to Ebenezer Wheeler, an early scheren-schnitte found in Tryon, North Carolina, and a variety of other fine and folk art, furniture, and decorative accessories.

“I am really proud of the way my business has grown incrementally over the past 18 months,” Jeffers said. “The Thanksgiving Auction at The Garth’s Barn marks my second auction in that

1801 and, in the following year, died in Fredericksburg, Virginia, at the age of 39. His half-brother, Waller Holladay, was charged with settling his affairs.

Among his directives was a two-page, detailed inventory, a listing of “cloathes (sic) and decorations” that were part of his estate. Stored in a trunk, the wardrobe was valued at \$340 (approximately \$8,000 in today’s money). Although items of everyday use were included (one hat and 24 pairs of drawers), there were extraordinary garments listed, luxurious clothing fit for a king (as well as fine enough to wear in the presence of royalty).

For the next century and a half, members of the Holladay family faithfully maintained this legacy of clothing and kept it intact. In 1952, they offered Littlepage’s items to The Valentine, the city of Richmond’s first public museum, founded in 1898 by Mann S. Valentine. The museum accepted the gift, recognizing its “historical value,” noted Nichol Gabor. Among the items donated were twenty-some “random” articles of clothing, including britches and waistcoats, overcoats and dressing gowns, according to Gabor, curator of costumes and textiles at The Valentine. Although it is not known how or where the 18th-century menswear had been stored, she suggested that it was in a dry place away from sunlight, as the clothing survived in remarkably good condition. The fact that the garments were made of natural fibers and colored by natural dyes was also a likely factor.

While under the auspices of The Valentine, some elements of the collection were used in conjunction with exhibitions, in particular, one that focused on the life of a Virginia gentleman. When the museum underwent a recent major physical renovation, the decision was made to return to its original focus, that being the interpretation of Richmond’s history. Consequently, a new home was sought for costumes and accessories that did not fit in with this criterion.

The search for a more appropriate home for these items went no further than the Colonial capital of Williamsburg, less than 50 miles southeast of Richmond. Gabor noted that both museums benefitted from the decision; she added that the move was also “good for the objects.” Being underutilized at The Valentine did them “no service.” Furthermore, because Littlepage was once a student in Williamsburg, “in many ways, we are sending them home.”

On the receiving end, the Colonial Williamsburg Foundation, which operates the world’s largest living history muse-

um, welcomed The Valentine’s gift. “This large grouping of clothing, most with ties to Virginia history, fits well within our collection’s parameters,” stated Neil Hurst, curator of historic dress and textile at Colonial Williamsburg.

Included in this gift are men’s and women’s wear, “a lot” of children’s clothing, and a variety of small accessories (such as shoe buckles and reticules), all dating from the 1750s to 1840. Three “lovely” hair combs, fashionable in the 1810s and 1820s, are of particular interest, as they are the first such examples with a Virginia history to be included in the Colonial Williamsburg holdings. Noteworthy are a coat once belonging to Williamsburg resident Henry Tazewell and two identical women’s dresses, differing only in color, believed to have belonged to Tazewell’s wife Dorothy.

A variety of Littlepage’s personal effects are also in the gift, including watches, a chamberlain’s key, and assorted pieces of jewelry, swords and pistols, and a sash and badge from the Order of Saint Stanislaus. But it is the group of garments once worn by Littlepage that are of particular interest.

Speaking of the man who wore these clothes, Hurst described him as “incredibly smart by all accounts.” He continued, saying “he handled himself well” in many ways, except for when dealing with his financial affairs (“he had a hard time with money”). In the midst of the Age of Revolution, dating from 1775 to 1848, Littlepage

was well-received in Europe. Clearly, Littlepage prided himself on making a good impression, and he had a discerning eye when it came to fashion. Hurst added that during this time, it appears that the stylish young man had fairly free rein to travel about the Continent.

Among the recent additions to the Colonial Williamsburg costume collection are a green coat presented to him by the King of Poland and two coats that were gifts from the King of Spain. Another highlight is the three-piece suit that he wore while at the court of Catherine II of Russia; constructed in 1787, he wore it at least until 1790, when he became a member of the Order of

Saint Stanislaus.

For Hurst, a journeyman tailor, the acquisition of Littlepage’s clothing is of particular interest for a variety of reasons. Coats made of vicuna wool, “the softest of wools” indicate that the young man was “on the cutting edge” of fashion in the late 18th century. Examining the placement of buttons, embroidery styles, and construction methods is helpful in the study of eastern European tailors. “And you can see how cold it gets in Poland,” he added, as evidenced by the layers of wool wadding incorporated in the garments. Establishing the provenance of the pieces, Hurst said, was aided, thanks to Valentine’s detailed inventory; additionally, some of the items were marked.

Finally, Hurst credited the members of the Holladay family for their stewardship, a testimony of respect for their esteemed ancestor. As an aside, he added that Lewis Littlepage’s name has been carried down through the generations.

Not currently available for public viewing, the collection can be accessed on the museum’s website. Looking ahead, Hurst suggested the possibility of an international exhibition focusing on the Age of Revolution as seen through Littlepage’s eyes. In the meantime, the garments are being given careful treatment. “We store them flat,” Durst explained. “We hope that they can have a long life in retirement here in Colonial Williamsburg.”

the 19 percent buyer's premium.

While the roaster was a large piece, the original cast iron Mr. Peanut fence post sitter was the heavy item of the day. According to Camelleri, "These were used at the Planters Peanut factories mounted atop the fence posts surrounding the plant." The figure is hollow and has a removable hat. It was also mounted to a steel piece which was thought to possibly be the original fence post top. At 40 inches tall, this Mr. Peanut post sitter sold for \$5,500.

Another oddity selling this day was the very unusual photo ID card issued by Boston captain of port on 6-23-1943 for a "Wesley E. Johnson." He was the north east branch manager for the Planters Nut and Chocolate Company. The card measured 4 by 5 inches and sold for \$300.

All kinds of Mr. Peanut memorabilia came up for bids. On the smaller side was the red, white, and blue plastic Mr. Peanut figural bank that stood 8 ¼ inches tall. It brought \$1,500.

Peanut tins were also on hand with 10 pound Planters Peanuts Suffolk Brand tin that once house Spanish salted peanuts selling for \$1,250. The tin was 10 ½ inches tall and 8 ¼ inches in diameter. It had no lid.

Having minor wear and some dents was the early Planters Peanut 10 pound "Sal n Shell" tin showing Mr. Peanut scooping peanuts out of the ocean. The same graphic was found

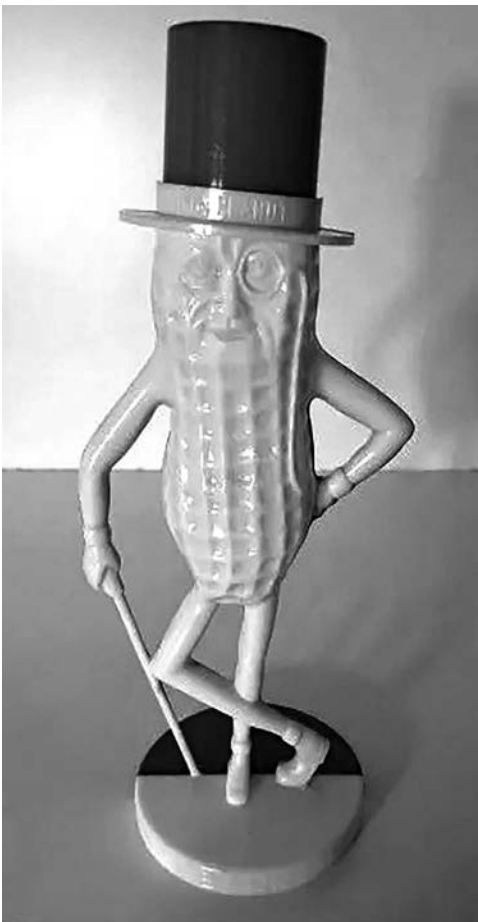

the 19 percent buyer's premium.

While the roaster was a large piece, the original cast iron Mr. Peanut fence post sitter was the heavy item of the day. According to Camelleri, "These were used at the Planters Peanut factories mounted atop the fence posts surrounding the plant." The figure is hollow and has a removable hat. It was also mounted to a steel piece which was thought to possibly be the original fence post top. At 40 inches tall, this Mr. Peanut post sitter sold for \$5,500.

Another oddity selling this day was the very unusual photo ID card issued by Boston captain of port on 6-23-1943 for a "Wesley E. Johnson." He was the north east branch manager for the Planters Nut and Chocolate Company. The card measured 4 by 5 inches and sold for \$300.

All kinds of Mr. Peanut memorabilia came up for bids. On the smaller side was the red, white, and blue plastic Mr. Peanut figural bank that stood 8 ¼ inches tall. It brought \$1,500.

Peanut tins were also on hand with 10 pound Planters Peanuts Suffolk Brand tin that once house Spanish salted peanuts selling for \$1,250. The tin was 10 ½ inches tall and 8 ¼ inches in diameter. It had no lid.

Having minor wear and some dents was the early Planters Peanut 10 pound "Sal n Shell" tin showing Mr. Peanut scooping peanuts out of the ocean. The same graphic was found

enamels, or pieced with glass segments. (Frances favored “drawn” designs; Michael, “pieced.”) Over this, another piece of enameled glass is laid. Placed on a mold, the object is then heated. Under heat, the glass “slumps” (or “bends”) to the shape of the mold. The design itself is fused between the glass pieces.

Among the varied advantages of fused glass is a most important one for the type of houseware items the Higgins were producing: because the patterns are sealed between glass layers, colors will not fade with time. Fused glass plates, bowls, and ashtrays could be subjected to daily use, and still remain brightly colorful.

The Higgins turned out an inventory of over 100 different household items at breakneck speed. Their schedule was grueling, but relief was at hand: an offer to adapt their handcrafted talents and techniques to the arena of mass production.

Prior to its association with Frances and Michael Higgins, Dearborn Glass Company, of Bedford Park, Illinois, had specialized in the production of industrial glass components. As the Higgins’ work gained wider recognition, Dearborn took note. Already experienced with “bent” glass for industrial use, the company could combine this with the Higgins’ fusing expertise to create a line of consumer giftware. Michael and Frances accepted the challenge — and the Dearborn line of Higgins handcrafted glass, “higginsware,” hit the market in 1957.

Much of the Higgins glass available today was mass-produced at Dearborn, and is readily identifiable by a gold, lower-case “higgins” signature on the front of each piece. Michael and Frances invariably signed their work with the inclusive “higgins,” because, as Michael once noted, “our ideas have so blended that we can’t always tell which pieces are hers and which are mine.” (Engraved signatures on the reverse of an item identify it as non-Dearborn. Those produced prior to 1957 also often carry a raised “dancing man” symbol.)

Michael and Frances quickly learned that mass production had its own harried timetables. Frances noted that the goal set for Higgins glass at

Dearborn was “a new line every six months.” With the success of basic tableware items, Dearborn encouraged the Higgins studio to broaden its horizons. In addition to Higgins bowls, plates, and ashtrays, there were Higgins “compartment servers,” trivets, relish servers, and butter dishes. Also available: Higgins candy dishes and bonbon servers, candleholders, wall sconces, and table lamps.

Higgins experimentation extended beyond their work at Dearborn. Over the years, other Higgins projects have included clocks for General Electric and Haddon, bookends and glass-topped ceramic dishes for Raymor, tables, backgammon boards, ornaments, jewelry, plaques, mobiles, sculptures, mirrors, church windows, and exterior building ornamentation.

At Dearborn, the Higgins kept up a brisk design pace. During their tenure, they introduced at least 70 known patterns, in a dizzying variety of sizes and shapes. By 1965, the time was right for change. After a short stay at Haeger Potteries in Dundee, Illinois, the Higgins decided to return to where

it all began: their own private studio. There they would be free to set their own goals, meet their own standards, and design in the direction their hearts and minds led them. Since 1966, the Higgins Glass Studio has been located at 33 E. Quincy St. in Riverside, Illinois.

On first entering the Higgins Glass Studio, a young visitor once exclaimed, “it’s like walking into a rainbow!” That description was right on target. The Higgins showroom is a kaleidoscope of color, with hanging mobiles, brilliantly hued bowls and platters, glass clocks, lamps, jewelry, and plaques competing for the customer’s attention. The air is particularly electric each holiday season, as new pieces fill the shelves for the “Holiday Open House,” a longstanding Higgins tradition.

Michael Higgins died in 1999, Frances Higgins in 2004. The Higgins Glass Studio is today under the direction of their longtime design associates, Louise and Jonathan Wimmer. That direct line of continuity ensures that collectors will continue to enjoy glassware created in the style uniquely “Higgins.” New pieces celebrate, and expand on, the traditions and techniques of the past.

Frances Higgins once said, “we just try to make what looks good — any time, any place.” After 75 years, their “modern miracles with everyday glass” live on.
