

Vintage Santas make the holidays so much more jolly

“Twas the night before Christmas,
when all through the house,
Not a creature was stirring, not even a
mouse. . .”

Clement Clarke Moore, 1823

Santa. St. Nick. Father Christmas. No matter what he is called in your neck of the woods, it's Christmas time again, and... he's baaaack!

The custom of holiday gift-giving originates with the Nativity, and the visit of the Three Kings. The legend of Santa Claus however, dates to the fourth century. Stories of his origin vary, but here's one favorite:

The setting was Asia Minor, where a down-on-his luck nobleman found himself unable to cough up dowries for his three daughters. Enter St. Nicholas, a kindly (and well-to-do) bishop, who crept to the man's home one wintry eve. With exceptionally good aim, he tossed three bags of gold he'd brought along through an open window. They conveniently landed in three stockings left hanging to dry before a roaring fire. The result: dowries for each daughter. Thanks to some sleuthing on the part of the happy nobleman, his mysterious benefactor was identified, and tales of the generosity of St. Nicholas soon became legend.

Early helpers of St. Nicholas (i.e., parents), stayed with the stuffed-stockings theme, although bags of gold were quickly replaced by apples, oranges, candies, and small homemade toys. Other cultures offered their own variations. Children in the Netherlands filled wooden shoes with hay, for the horses accompanying “Sinter Klaas” (that's Dutch for “St. Nicholas”). The next morning, delightful goodies had miraculously taken the place of the hay. Italian children had to wait until January 6th, the “Feast of the Three Kings,” for the

arrival of “La Befana,” who filled their empty shoes with treats.

St. Nicholas made his way to America with Dutch immigrants in the 1600s. Mispronunciations of “Sinter Klaas” by those unfamiliar with the language eventually resulted in the name we now know and love: “Santa Claus!”

Initial depictions of Santa offer us a thin man with a long, scraggly white beard, clad in what appears to be a hooded, floor-length red bathrobe. However, in Clement Clarke Moore's beloved 1823 poem, “A Visit From St. Nicholas,” he referred to Santa as a “right jolly old elf.” Early illustrations accompanying Moore's poem accented Santa's gnomish, elf-like appearance.

The image of a roly-poly, human-sized gent in red suit and fluffy white beard, came courtesy of Harper's Bazaar illustrator Thomas Nast, in the 1860s. That visual, refined since then in countless Coca-Cola ads by Haddon Sundblom, and *Ideals* magazine covers by George Hinke,

The National Farm Toy Show has cultivated a big following



DYERSVILLE, Iowa — The National Farm Toy Show returned to Dyersville, Iowa, the weekend of November 3-5. Now in its 46th year, the huge event brought nearly 300 vendors from 20 states offering everything from 19th-century toy farm implements to modern-era diecast tractors.

The show's home base of Dyersville is nicknamed the "Farm Toy Capital of the World," in part because it was where, in 1959, enterprising engineer Fred Ertl, Sr. relocated his burgeoning scale-model toy tractor business after starting in his home a decade earlier. The Ertl name has remained a fixture in manufacturing farm toys ever since. In honoring that legacy, the National Farm Toy Museum opened in town in 1986.

Just a few years before the museum's opening, Claire and Cathy Scheibe started Toy Farmer magazine and became instrumental in launching the National Farm Toy Show. The event is now considered the largest of its type; the weekend can draw well over 5,000 visitors from across the country and often from outside the U.S.

The show takes up multiple venues, including the Beckman High School gym, the gym at the National Farm Toy Museum, and outdoors at both buildings and the nearby Commercial Club Park. The locales are filled with dealers offering thousands of farm machinery models in an amazing array of ages, categories, and conditions. There are cast-iron pieces dating back to the late 1800s, early sand-casted models, and decades of die-cast replicas. Sizes range from rideable

pedal tractors down to the tiny 1:128 pieces which are smaller than a Matchbox car.

Becoming more prevalent are custom-built and scratch-built models and even wooden scale models with working parts. One attendee posting online described his amazement - "It was my first time going and I was like a kid in a candy store. It got me reminiscing about toys I either had or

currently have. My mind was blown with some of the things I saw!"

American farm toy manufacturers are also on hand, displaying their new releases. Bill Walters, senior vice president of Tomy's Ertl Division said, "The collector market remains strong. We are spending millions of dollars on new tooling and product releases across various scale

Amelia Jeffers talks about coming home again to Garth's Barn

DELAWARE, Ohio — Garth's Auctions has been an Ohio institution for decades. The business and its famous barn where auctions were held was known nation-wide for bringing to the masses wonderful pieces of early Americana. While it now appears that the name Garth's Auctions may be resigned to history, its spirit and at least some of its name will live on with a former owner.

Amelia Jeffers, former co-owner of Garth's has been offered and accepted a much unexpected but greatly appreciated opportunity.

In October it was announced Amelia Jeffers would be taking over Garth's inventory and would be selling these items under her business' name.

"At the end of October, legal counsel for Garth's Auctions and Jeff Jeffers reached out to me with an opportunity to buy the company — a call I had long-hoped to receive. Unfortunately, the current financial and legal obligations of the company made it impossible for me to buy Garth's (the name). Right now, the only entity that can use the Garth's Auctions brand name is Garth's, and Garth's is no longer licensed

to conduct auctions. The State of Ohio has indicated that it is acceptable for me to use 'Garth's Barn' as my auction location - so, for now, I will conduct in-person auctions as Amelia Jeffers' Auctions at Garth's Barn."

During the time Amelia was reviewing the company assets, Jeff Jeffers, the current owner of Garth's and Amelia's ex-husband, contacted her to ask if he could discuss with Vivalyn Knight that Amelia was the buyer with whom he was engaged in

model sizes. In fact, we have 130-plus new items planned for 2024 that include vintage and modern tractors along with implements." Among those new items are multiple Tomy-Ertl 2023 show tractors, including a Versatile 125 4WD in both 1:32 and 1:64 scales and show commemorative 1:32-scale Farmall Model 1206 turbo diesel.

One of the weekend's major draws is the sizable toy auction, which this year held over 400 lots., Cornwell, Inc. of Aurora, Nebraska has handled the auction for 30 years. Live bidding takes place on Saturday in the Beckman auditorium. This year's was also simulcast on HiBid. Tom Corwell gave a bit of insight into the event: "The auction consisted of rare vintage toys and collectibles. The highest-selling piece was the cast-iron John Deere combine made by Vindex in the early 1900s. The quality, rare model sold for \$10,000." Last year, an Adriance Buckeye mower and reaper salesman's sample did even better at \$18,500.

In addition to the items for sale, farm toy displays are set up at Beckman. Visitors can admire the skillful construction and fine details that go into the panoramas. There are micro-mini tractor pulls among models outfitted with engines, and a pedal-tractor pull is available for kids.

The popularity of the November show spawned a second one held in Dyersville each June. In addition to its slate of vendors, that event includes activities like a tractor parade and farm toy display contest with public voting on favorite exhibits.

A must-see while attending either show is the National Farm Toy Museum,

with over 8,000 ag-related toys on display. Among the collection is a showcase of National Farm Toy Hall of Fame winners.

Toy Farmer Publications, sponsor of the show, now publishes two collector magazines - Toy Farmer, the iconic publication for the farm toy hobby, and Toy Trucker & Contractor, the principal periodical for toy truck and construction equipment collectors. Accumulation from a lifetime of trading will sell at auction

DAMASCUS, Va. – “He’s a collector that has just gone wild,” auctioneer Alan Shope, owner of Appalachian Trading Post and Auctions, says of his 90-year-old consignors Bill Venable.

“In all my 40-some years in the auction business, I have never seen anything like it. He just keeps bringing more and more things – good things – for me to sell. We still haven’t been through a couple of his buildings yet. It may take three or four sales to disperse all his belongings. I know we’re going to have another sale around Dec. 30.”

Shope says he estimates there will be more than 400 vintage and newer pedal cars to sell, more than 200 firearms, more than 100 pocket watches, tin toys that are just exceptional, old Tonka toys I’ve never seen before, rare gold pieces, silver, copper and paper money, a huge knife collection.”

On Dec. 9, Appalachian Trading Post and Auctions will be selling 600 lots of coins, pedal cars, toys, knives, pocket watches, firearms and more. The following

day, beginning at 1 p.m., 500 lots will be sold. The sale will also be live cast on invaluable.com.

Venable doesn’t mind being characterized as a “collector gone wild.” He’s one of those guys that “all in” on something or

you can count him out. He’s not a middle-of-the-road man.

And he’s a trader. One of his favorite sayings is: “I’ll buy anything if you make

talks.

Vivalyn’s husband, Bruce, was the mastermind behind both Heart of Ohio Antique Center and the Springfield Antique Show and Flea Market of Springfield, Ohio, so naturally, the couple were collectors extraordinaire. Garth’s Auctions had been given the nod by Vivalyn to sell the Knight’s extensive collections earlier this year.

“I said of course - I have known Vivalyn and her late husband, Bruce, for many years,” Amelia said. “Over the course of several days, Vivalyn and I spoke at length about her sincere interest in supporting Garth’s and Jeff, and her strong desire to have the collection she and Bruce built together sold in association with the Garth’s history. Between the Knights and Garth’s, you are talking some serious contributions to not only the Ohio antique scene - but I would argue definitely the Midwest, and really throughout the country. At the end of the day, we decided it made a whole lot of sense for me to take on the collection and to sell it at the Garth’s Barn.”

When Amelia met with Jeff to go over the Knight collection, she and her attorneys talked with Jeff and it was “it just made good sense for me to take over the warehouse lease and to do the same for the remaining Garth’s consignors. So, my

team and I have been there since October 31, and are working to contact every consignors and buyer with items in the building to make arrangements to get their items back to them, or sign a new contract with me.”

Amelia and her staff just wrapped up the company’s Thanksgiving weekend auctions which took place at Garth’s Barn.

Most of the items in that auction were from consignments from Amelia’s company, Great Estates, but she did add in some of the material from Garth’s consignors.

“The bulk of it was my consignors, but we did bump one collection (The Lifetime Collection of the late C.J. Hawley & Phil Florence) to early spring to make room for some of the Garth’s consignors.”

When asked how it felt to be back in the barn for this past Thanksgiving auction, Amelia said, “I don’t think I stopped smiling all week during preview and the auctions. Every time I looked up, another old friend had walked in. There were lots of hugs, and I heard ‘welcome back!’ more times than I can count. It was my second auction in the barn in the past two years, but this one was really the big turnout. It was like homecoming in so many ways - for me, for longtime clients, and even for my kids.

My daughter, Maddie, has not worked or attended an antiques auction since I left Garth’s in 2017. She was 12 - and remembers learning how to register bidders, and run items and paperwork during the

auction. It was so wonderful for her, too, to see familiar faces and to be embraced so warmly. We had about 100 people on Friday in the room - amazing by today’s standards! Overall, I think we had about 2,200 bidders. When I took the block to open on Friday, I thanked everyone for being there, and they all clapped and thanked ME. I can’t describe the feeling of being welcomed so warmly and enthusiastically back to the love of your (work) life. It is a pretty awesome time to be Amelia Jeffers.”

Amelia finished the conversation by stating, “I built the Great Estates concept (Jeffers’ auction company) to be able to take the top tier of lots of different categories and build a fun auction around the idea that bidders can shop from the greatest estates in the Midwest. I am a firm believer in crossover audiences and bidders. Rare is the collector who is so focused as to only collect one specific category. Most people collect across a variety of genres and periods. Knowing that, why would it be a good idea to sell choice items in a venue that specializes in only one thing? While I so respect the scholarship of specialized firms, from a return on investment for an entire collection, I think getting objects in front of the most eyes possible is the best strategy. The Knights are a great collection - they bought across dozens of categories. Those kinds of buyers love auctions that have a big variety. That is what we are shooting for - and I think my consignors see it and appreciate it.”

Alexander Calder work hits \$72,000 at Amelia Jeffers return to Garth's Barn

DELAWARE, Ohio — Auctioneer, Realtor, and publisher, Amelia Jeffers, could not contain her joy Friday, Nov. 24; when she found herself behind the podium once again, conducting the annual Thanksgiving Weekend auction at the former "Garth's Barn" in Delaware, Ohio. A beloved tradition for antique enthusiasts nationwide for more than 60 years this is the event that has always been synonymous with the kick-off of the holiday season for collectors in love with antique decorative arts and Americana.

What a wonderful homecoming! With a sell through rate of 91 percent; a sale total coming in just over \$450,000 and having more than 100 buyers in attendance, and 2,200 registered bidders overall there were a plethora of happy people during this two-day affair.

Not surprising, a great deal of interest was seen for any piece wearing wonderful paint. A two-piece, pine, possibly York County, Pennsylvania, corner cupboard dressed in its original exuberant paint - red, green, and yellow on the exterior; salmon interior; sold for \$7,200 despite needing a big corner as it was quite broad. Prices include a buyer's premium.

Surprising – a great deal of "brown" furniture also generated strong sales with the Sheraton chest of drawers attributed to Ebenezer Wheeler of Vermont, bringing \$5,937.50. Made of birch and pine with mahogany veneer as well as sapwood and ebony inlays, this chest had a high backplash, biscuit corners, reeded columns, and unusual scrolled apron with an inlaid star

at center – fancy! Inside of the drawer was signed "Mrs George Lesmer, Chester, Vermont" and back incised "Fairchild family Old Brookville".

Jeffers said, "The Wheeler chest came from John Boulware. John is awesome. His shop was a standout there for decades; he was THE place to go for Americana in Denver, and arguably all of Colorado. He had identified the correlation between his chest and one featured in an exhibition at The Shelburne Museum. They are unmistakably the same hand. It is a neat thing - but again, price was held back (I think) by two factors: size, because it is pretty bulky; and the esoteric nature of such a regional piece."

Decorative arts also sold strong at the Friday session. An English, 8 inch high, mocha pitcher having a barrel shape with multicolored banding and cat's eye and earthworm decoration soared to \$3,480.

Two blown glass jars; one olive green with a flared lip and broken pontil, 7 1/2 inches tall; and the other being an amber jar with a folded rim and iron pontil at 9 inches tall sold together for \$2,000.

Leading the lovely stoneware presented for bids was the incised "W. ROBERTS BINGHAMTON. N.Y." 17 1/2 inch tall decorated stoneware jug which made \$2,160. The four-gallon, 19th century jug wore a freehand cobalt crested bird and vining flowers.

And a Darke County, Ohio, long rifle; approximately .36 cal; 54 inch long, by Daniel Marker Sr. (Kentucky/Ohio, 1774-1853) with a carved tiger maple full stock, engraved silver inlays and a patch box engraved with a Native American's profile was bid to \$4,062.50.

"The patch box on this was so spectacular," Jeffers noted.

Leading the two day event was no shocker. During the second day of this auction, a gouache on paper by Alexander Calder (1898-1976), titled Homage to Miro signed at lower right was estimated to bring between \$40,000 and \$60,000 sold for \$72,000. The gouache had been purchased by the consignor; a central Ohio couple, in 1989 from Pace Galleries.

me think I'm getting a steal." He's also a sly judge of people, with a canny knowledge of just what they're looking for in a deal.

He grew up poor in the town of Bristol; half the town is in Virginia and the other half in Tennessee. "We were poor, but so was everyone in the neighborhood. So, we didn't know it. The only way a guy could get anything was either to make it or trade for it.

"I traded for my first bicycle. I traded for my first car, ah, I remember it, a 1936 Ford coupe. Then, my girlfriend was competing in a beauty contest in the Bristol high school. But her parents didn't have enough money to buy her a fancy dress to wear during the competition. Well, I sold the Ford and gave her parents enough money to buy a dress. She won the contest. She was beautiful.

Not too long after that, he eloped with the girl, Joann, and got married. He was 17 years old; she was 16. They had been married for 49 years. "I buried her on our 49th anniversary," he says.

That was nearly 20 years ago. Venable never re-married.

After three hitches in the U.S. Army (the first go-around was terminated after the government discovered he was 15 years old), Venable kicked around the Bristol area during the Post-Depression years. But Venable was far from a lazy man. He first got into the wholesale food business, buying canned goods from tractor-trailers, from the manufacturing companies, just anywhere he could buy in bulk. Then he would cut up the inventory, usually into case lots, and sell to "anybody I could find."

On the hustle, Venable turned over a lot of canned foods, before going into handling frozen product just as well. Although the wholesale gig was profitable, he came to own five or six restaurants during his lifetime. One Florida restaurant was highly successful for 33 years, working with his wife and two adopted sons.

At 50 years old, Venable realized one his life dreams, obtaining a pilot's license. His wife was never comfortable in the plane,

he says. "She just wasn't very adventurous," he said. "She went up only three or four times with me. But I loved it."

As a man with Venable's attributes, he ended up owning four planes at one time, plus he co-owned an airport. "A guy asked me what kind of man owns four airplanes," he recalled. "I said, a very stupid man, they're too expensive to maintain."

Throughout this lifetime, Venable was always trading, buying and selling. Some of his past creditors in the wholesale and restaurant business often settled up their accounts with antiques and collectibles.

"Once people find out you collect things, they start bringing stuff to you," he says. "And if I think I can make money I'll buy it. Whatever it is."

Venable began collecting coins – dimes and pennies – in the 1950s, later turning

to gold coins and more exotic currency. He put the coin collections in safe deposit boxes. "Nothing is safe in your home anymore," he says. And, not having seen the coins for some time, has no idea what he has. For example, the last Mercury dime to usually fill out any collection is usually the 1916-D dime. Venable has three of those that will be sold at auction. Prices, of course vary, but a 1916-D Mercury dime in average condition might sell for less than \$1,000, but in mint condition it could be valued at \$41,000, according to Coin Tracker.

Venable concluded he didn't want to bother his heirs with the largess he has accumulated over the past 90 years. His two sons are deceased, and his only family is grandchildren and great-grandchildren.

"A lot of people say I'll live to be 100 because I'm so damned ornery," he says. "It's

been a good life so far, the usual ups and downs. But I've always told myself, each morning when I get up, live it like it's your last day. One of these days, I just might be right."

Garth's, I had a long standing connection to the leadership of Pace. It is just such a small world," Jeffers explains, adding, "I was grateful and proud the consignor went with me - though she had been pitched by several gallerists and a New York auction house."





Vintage Santas

is essentially "Santa" as we recognize him today.

Stores jumped on Santa's sleigh as early as the 1820s. In 1841, a life-size Santa figure in a Philadelphia shop window attracted hordes of eager youngsters, who dragged along their toy-buying parents, much to the owner's delight. Live department store Santas soon followed, as did "Letters to Santa," those annual wish lists which turned such tiny towns as "Santa Claus, Indiana" into postal Meccas.

Over the centuries, Santa Claus has at times been denounced. A Danish clergyman referred to him as "en hedensk trold" ("a heathen goblin"). Even his very existence has occasionally been denied. Francis Pharcellus Church set the record straight, in an 1897 New York Sun editorial. 8-year old Virginia O'Hanlon had sent in a letter asking if Santa Claus was real, as her little friends had told her differently. Church responded:

"Yes Virginia, there is a Santa Claus. He exists as certainly as love and generosity and devotion exist. . . No Santa Claus! Thank God he lives, and he lives forever! A thousand years from now, Virginia, nay, ten times ten thousand years from now, he will continue to make glad the heart of childhood."

For collectors of Santa memorabilia, there's a boundless treasure trove to choose from. There are Santa figurines. Santa bubble lights. Plastic wall Santas. Some Santas even talk: push the button, and a merry voice booms out "Ho, ho, ho! I'm Santa!" (As if introductions were really needed.)

And it's not just Santa. Joining him is an entire sleighful of North Pole denizens: Mrs. Santa, the elves, the reindeer (with Rudolph lighting the way), choruses of carolers and an avalanche of snowmen, making the seasonal circle complete. Who knew there could be so many variations on a theme? Santa & Co. have been featured on holiday candy dishes, ash trays, tea towels, drinking glasses, mugs, cookie plates, tidbit trays, salt-and-peppers, and candleholders.

Source materials for Santas have run the gamut, from glass and plastic, to wood and metal. Over the decades, homemaking magazines have encouraged the especially crafty to rummage through whatever was at hand for homemade artistic inspiration, resulting in a merry multitude of construction paper Santas with cotton ball whiskers.

Most popular with collectors, however, are vintage Santa representations from the 1950s and '60s. Of these, the most prevalent (and durable) are Santas fashioned from ceramic. Thanks to the introduction of airbrush painting just after World War II, Santa's features could now be more delicately and smoothly styled. Goodbye to flat-faced stares and clown-like red cheeks. Other attributes adding to the desirability of postwar ceramic Santas:

Metallic accents. Where would Ol' St. Nick be without his gold belt buckle? After a ceramic was painted and fired, metallic accents were often hand-applied. The piece was then fired again at a lower heat. A touch of gold gave Santa's red and white outfit visual pop. On some pieces, the gold highlights were sponged on, creating an attractive stippled effect.

Spaghetti art. A ceramic Santa gained texture and dimensionality through the application of thin, entwined clay strands,

visually amplifying everything from his beard to the ermine-like trim on his red costume. Since the clay "spaghetti" was applied by hand, even mass-produced Santas possessed a certain individuality. As for the name? The clay pieces certainly looked like spaghetti, and the machine that extruded them was remarkably similar to a spaghetti press.

Flocking. Applied flocking gave ceramics the appearance of lush velvet at a fraction of the cost. The secret ingredient: glue. Portions of the ceramic to be flocked were glue-coated. "Flocking" (polyester fiber bits) was then sprinkled on, adhering to the glue. Many ceramic Santas were no doubt grateful for this addition of eye-catching elegance.

Seemingly limitless buying options await determined Santa-searchers. A quick check online brings up hundreds of listings for Santa-themed items, leading to one conclusion: no matter how many Santas you collect, you'll never run out of options. Vintage Santas remain extremely affordable; almost all are under \$50, primarily because they were produced in such vast quantities. After the restrictions of World War II were eased, decorative Christmas items by such importers as Lefton, Napco, and Enesco flooded the market. Cheap but charming, these imports brightened many an American home. Today, like individual sparkling snowflakes, they recapture—at least for a moment—the nostalgic appeal of a more innocent era.




