un and games with the Parker Brothers By Doug Graves

Most of us grew up playing board games with our friends and family, and even in the digital age, many of us still do. According to Research and Markets, the market size for board games in 2023 was \$12 billion.

"It's about finding people's interests, and drawing them in that way," said Rodney Smith, who founded Watch It Played. "I mean, if you want to play a game about making a quilt, there's a board game about making a quilt. There's really any theme you can think of."

For many people, Parker Brothers is the final name in board games.

Parker Brothers, which began making games in 1888, gave us those classics like Monopoly, Clue and Scrabble. All told, the company made and sold more than 1,800 games.

Parker Brothers was made up of George, Charles and Edward. George Parker was 16 years old when Parker Brothers games were born. The Brooklyn Bridge had just been completed, the Statue of Liberty was under construction, new technologies like telephones and electric lighting were entering the mainstream and the world was exploring a relatively new concept called "leisure time".

George and his young friends enjoyed playing games but when they tired of them, George was inspired to add his

own touch to an old card game called Everlasting. This was George's first game and he called it Banking. His friends loved it and encouraged him to get it published. He submitted it to a couple of Boston-based book publishers but was rejected so he decided to publish it himself.

George was an ambitious young man with unshakable determination, incredible sales skills and the ability to write rules both clearly and succinctly which was a real asset in the industry he was about to enter. He also knew what to look for in games that had to be re-playable, simple to learn and most of all fun. He sold currents to raise enough money to have 500 copies of Banking printed in time for the holidays that year. After getting leave from school he enthusiastically pitched his game to

Tiny Buddha stands tall with a \$12,600 bid at Pook & Pook

DOWNINGTOWN, Pa. — A Tibetan bronze and cloisonne Buddha was one of the highlights of a recent Pook & Pook online-only auction.

Standing only 8 inches high it was thought to be from the 17th century and was won with a bid of \$12,600. The final price obtained was the result of 47 bids. Prices include a buyer's premium.

Other Asian items surpassing their pre-sale estimates included the Chinese enameled wine warmer which realized \$4,788. A 19th century Chinese export Rose Mandarin charger was bid to \$1,260.

Native American items garnered a great deal of attention with a 19th century oil canvas portrait of a Native American warrior bringing \$9,375 and a circa 1900 Navajo Indian third phase transitional chief's blanket that measured 77 inches by 60 inches won with a bid of \$5,040.

Of special interest was the circa 1880 Norther Plains Indian tomahawk featuring a double-pierced blade of



winged elements. Measuring 23 inches long, this weapon sold for \$3,276. According to the catalog listing for this item, "A near identical example can be seen in Peterson, American Indian Tomahawks, fig. 191."

Furniture presented included a pair of 19th century Italian burl veneer cabinets; one being a three-drawer chest with the other being a single-door cabinet. The duo sold together for \$3,276.

A commanding late 18th century Pennsylvania hard pine, one-piece architectural corner cupboard was bid to \$3,204. This beauty stood an impressive 93 ½ inches tall.

Other decorative items also making a statement at this early December Pook & Pook event include a German clockwork nodding head reindeer that was bid to \$3,780. Fur covered, this beauty was an impressive 15 ¼ inch long and stood 19 ¼ inch high.

A lot of miscellaneous glass did not go unnoticed by collectors and included a cobalt diamond lidded sugar bowl as well as a 9 inch tall chestnut bottle. The grouping obtained a final bid of \$3,024.

Likewise, grabbing attention was the selling of a single 8 ½ inch in diameter rainbow spatter plate. Done in red, blue, and green, this little gem was won with a bid of \$2,772.

One lot with historical significance definitely needs noted. Four books on Revolutionary War subjects includ-





Trains pulled into the station with heavy bidding

SAGINAW, Mich. — Bob Brasseur received his first model train at the age of 5. It opened an exciting world not only of collecting, but of understanding how they worked. That fascination with electricity led to a career as an electrician at GM Steering Gear, but he also started a train repair business in his basement.

The business grew, and when he retired, he moved Brasseur Electric Trains to a storefront in Saginaw where he sold and serviced Lionel and other models. He and his wife Nancy created a special world in that store, replicating the business model of the 1940s and 1950s with a welcoming environment, beautiful décor, and an emphasis on quality and service. Customers were treated like family. Christmas was a special time, with extra train displays set up as well as holiday decorations. One woman told him that he made a lot of people happy on Christmas morning. After more than 50 years running his operation, he retired at age 87 and sold the bulk of the massive inventory to a person in Georgia who will be setting up a store there. This auction consisted of the remaining items, including unopened dealer cars, toy fair items, boxes of service parts, and store fixtures such as counters, display cases, and shelving.

ratio they are relative to the real trains that they represent. The most common train scale in the United States is HO, which is a 1:87 ratio (3.5 mm to 1 foot) to the real thing. Other scales are larger or smaller, and this auction featured two LGB (Lehmann Gross Bahn, a German company) G scale models that are quite large at a 1:22 ratio. These are suitable for running both indoors and outdoors and can be exciting to operate. Their large size also allows for inclusion of more details than the smaller scales. The highest drawing lot of the auction was the LGB 20570 Santa Fe #239 G-gauge engine with unit and #952 trolley car. It was eagerly claimed with a final bid of \$475. The other was an LGB "Ready to Run" Christmas train set, with extra car and track that finished at \$325. This set still bore the original price tag that read \$549.95.

All year round Brasseur Electric Trains was set up with an attractive, interest-

ing, and inviting atmosphere. To enhance that experience, there were several tall, animated displays to add to the shoppers' enjoyment. A few of those were offered here, and very successfully sold. First was the Lionel Trains cardboard promo mechanical switchman. This 44-inch tall,

free-standing cardboard figure held a battery operated lantern and was taken with a high bid of \$345. Another figure standing 33 inches tall featured a fellow with a battery-powered lantern and a poster



that read "Lionel, the Giant of the Rails" along with young boys dressed in railroad attire operating (not playing with!) the model trains. This free-standing cardboard promo piece left with a final bid of \$335. A set of two 7-foot-tall Lionel 110 V, 3D lighted crossing signs would certainly be the focal point of any railroad room. They were sold without bulbs, but still managed a final bid of \$200.

A mixed lot was offered, consisting of a business sign that read "Old Saginaw City Brasseur Electric Trains, Everything in Model Railroading", along with photos of the "Chessie Steam Special", a 1920s view of the Highland Park train yard, and a map of the Detroit United lines. This desirable selection earned a high bid of \$245.

There were many individual train engines, cars, and accessories sold still in their boxes. Two examples that did well were both Lionel Norfolk & Western 4-8-4 steam locomotives and tenders. They were claimed with bids of \$280 and \$245. The "4-8-4" label refers to the wheel configuration, which is four leading wheels, eight powered and coupled driving wheels and four trailing wheels.

A very nice Rail King by MTH Hiawatha Hudson Engine Milwaukee Road set with ProtoSounds was eagerly claimed with a final bid of \$200. A set of six cars consisting of the Lionel Chessie System "Royal Limited" train set, #6-1070, including a diesel engine U36C, all in their original, unopened boxes cleared a final bid of \$175. A selection of vintage 1929 Lionel tinplate items in olive green was offered. Since it was still in the inventory, it must have been one of Bob's favorites, held till the last sale. There was a #253engine, two #607 passenger cars, and a #608 observation car, along with their controller and some track. This excellent

selection was claimed with a high bid of \$145. There were numerous other train cars, sets, accessories, equipment parts, and other related items.

An interesting promotional poster was also included. It consisted of an autographed monochrome image of Johnny Cash holding his guitar while standing in front of train posters. The words on his poster read "Kids get something wonderful when they get a Lionel train. They get Dad. --Johnny Cash" This unusual, framed collectible was rehomed with a final bid of \$265.

Finally, why was there a wood rocking horse at a train auction? It was a unique, hand-made equine that was skillfully constructed, finished, and topped with a mop mane and tail by one of Bob's former coworkers. This custom designed decoration (too small for a child to ride) found a new stable with a high bid of \$155.





part-time, but it wasn't long before his health interfered and his doctor advised him to quit his high-pressure job as a journalist.

His first game catalog came out in the fall of 1885 and listed Banking, Bakers' Dozen, Famous Men and some other new games of George's design. He was up against some strong competition like McLaughlin Brothers, Selchow and Milton Bradley, who published educational games. He managed to strike a deal with Jasper Singer (a strong competitor to McLaughlin Brothers) who agreed to sell his games as long as George took the place of his regional salesman.

George opened a storefront and staffed it with his friend and first employee, 15 year-old Harry Phillips. There he sold his games, and he and his brother, Charles, named their company Parker Brothers in 1888.

Parker Brothers purchased the rights to the games of a local company, W. & S.B. Ives, which included the rights to Dr. Busby and the Mansion of Happiness, the very games that George and his friends had played years before. The Mansion of Happiness stayed in the Parker Brothers lineup for 30 years and the games kept coming in an era when people were eager for fun, knowledge, culture and education. Next in their lineup was The United States Game, Office Boy game and Innocence Abroad, which was the first game ever licensed by the company for publication.


Eventually their brother, Edward, was lured away from the newspaper business and became a partner in 1898.

The brothers had connections in England as well, starting with the Tiddledy Winks and a game called Pillow Dex, both of which became hit imports. By this time Parker Brothers became the second largest game company behind McLaughlin Brothers.

The Parker brothers expanded and opened a facility in the famous Flatiron Building in New York and an office in London so they could quickly access popular games in the UK and France.

Next game produced by the Parker brothers was Flinch (1902) followed by Pit (1904), a classic chaotic card game that sold more than 750,000 copies in the first six months of publication. Pit is a fast paced card game simulating the open outcry bidding system of the commodity exchange used at the Chicago Board of Trade which was known as the "Pit". Next game to be produced was

Rook (1906).

Following the financial panic of 1907, Parker Brothers narrowed their focus to wood jigsaw puzzles, (some with as many as 1,200 interlocking pieces) which they continued through World War I and into the 1920s.

Their next big game was Lindy, a flying game endorsed by Charles Lindbergh, the first person to fly solo across the Atlantic, and Eddie Cantor, who is best known for composing the Looney Tunes theme song. George Parker even got Laurel and Hardy to promote a reworking of his old game Chivalry.

Sales of the Parker Brothers' card game Touring topped \$1.3 million in 1928. The stock market crashed in 1929 and the Great Depression began. People just didn't have money to buy games anymore. Parker Brothers came up with the game Sorry, which did well despite being similar to the classic game Parcheesi, but the Depression affected the company, which was losing money.

In 1933, Charles Darrow presented to Parker Brothers a game about real estate investment. Although initially being rejected for being too long and complicated, this game (Monopoly) went on to become one of the best-selling games of all time. It is said that Dwight David Eisenhower played a game of Monopoly on the eve of D-Day to relieve the stress.

Parker Brothers was overwhelmed with orders for Monopoly when the game was published in 1935 and the company had to go all in on making this one game. More than 250,000 copies had been sold by Christmas of 1935, and by the end of 1936, 1.8 million copies had been sold. Sadly, Charles Parker died at the end of that year leaving George without his trusted advisor and friend.

In 1941, Parker Brothers bought the rights to the British game Cluedo and launched the board game Clue. The games of Risk, Bobble, Masterpiece, The Mad Magazine Game, Mille Bornes, Ouija, Payday and Sorry were added during the post-war years.

Next, a game called Careers hit the store shelves in 1957. This was followed by the now-popular continental game Risk. In 1964, the company released a game called Spill & Spell. Sales of their games grew from \$6 million in 1957, \$13.3 million in 1965 and \$16 million in 1966.

Around 1966, the company decided to buy the rights to a novelty item for \$1 million dollars that had already been around for 75 years – Ouija. The unusual game's title is a combination of the French and German words for 'yes'. It had a great advertising campaign and even outsold Monopoly in 1967.

In 1968, General Mills purchased Parker Brothers for \$47.5 million. The logos of both companies were adhered to games from that time on.

In 1977, classics were introduced. Games like Pay Day and Boggle made the scene. They even licensed games for the TV shows Happy Days and the Six

Million Dollar Man and Mad Magazine.

The microprocessor changed games forever, and Parker Brothers launched their first electronic game in 1977. It. was called Code Name: Sector.

In 1985, General Mills merged the company with their subsidiary, Kenner. This new company (Kenner Parker Toys Inc.) was acquired by Tonka in 1987. Tonka, including Parker Brothers, was bought by Hasbro in 1991. After being bought out by Hasbro in 1991, the Parker Brothers plant in Salem, Massachusetts closed and production facilities were transferred to a Milton Bradley factory in Springfield, Massachusetts.




