Search for gold lead to Meissen porcelain instead

Gleaming gold. Avaricious kings. An imprisoned inventor. Secret formulas.

And, oh yes, exquisite porcelain. Got your attention?

The 300-plus-year history of Meissen porcelain reads like a fairy tale, as reinterpreted in a suspense-filled "B" movie. Known for finely detailed figurines and exceptional tableware, Meissen is also recognized as the first European maker of fine porcelain. But, if not for a sovereign's overwhelming hunger for gold, Meissen might never have been born.

Ever since gold first dazzled the eye, those who've accumulated lots of it have had a single goal in mind: how to accumulate lots more. Enter the alchemist. From medieval times onward, these pseudo-scientific mystics managed to convince many that their experimentation would eventually result in a big payday: a "Philosopher's Stone," imbued with the power to transform base metal into gold.

One such alchemist was Johann Friedrich Bottger, who managed to persuade not one, but two monarchs, that he alone possessed the "Arcanum": the secret recipe for lead-to-gold.

Born in 1682 Prussia, Bottger was, at 14, apprenticed to a Berlin apothecary, and became obsessed with solving the riddle of alchemy. In a demonstration before reputable witnesses, Bottger sprinkled a powder of his own devising into a pot of molten silver. To the amazement of all, when the pot was emptied, "the silver had turned to gold!"

Word of this astonishing development quickly reached Friedrich I, Prussia's cash-strapped king, who demanded an in-person repeat performance. Knowing Friedrich's favorite means of ferreting out imposters (torture), Bottger escaped from Berlin, taking refuge in Saxony, and throwing himself on the mercy of King August II.

Bottger was given apartments in King August's castle, and a laboratory to continue his experimentation. Knowing the fate of failed alchemists (in a burst of black humor, the King had recently sent one to a gallows hung with gold tinsel), Bottger managed to convince August that he would (eventually) perfect his transformation formula. Although not above using trickery, Bottger actually believed that alchemy was achievable, and devoted his considerable skills in pursuit of that goal. This led to a discovery which managed to deflect even August's

single-minded golden focus: the creation of fine porcelain.

"Rediscovery" might be a better term, since the secret of producing fine, hard paste porcelain had been known to the Chinese for centuries. Until the 1700s, porcelain was exclusively a product of China, introduced to the Western world by Marco Polo, and imported at great expense. Kaolin (in Chinese, "white clay"), was a necessary porcelain component, ensuring its pristine whiteness, and smooth, non-porous finish. "Porcelain," Marco Polo's designation for his find, was an adaptation of the medieval term for mother-of-pearl shell.

Although Bottger was only looking for gold, he needed smooth, non-porous

vessels for his alchemic experiments. Since metal and glass proved unsuitable, he continued tinkering — and, in 1708, hit upon the process necessary for the manufacture of porcelain, becoming the first European to successfully replicate the Chinese formula.

China, introduced to the Western world by Marco Polo, and imported at great expense. Kaolin (in Chinese, "white clay"), was a necessary porcelain component, ensuring its pristine whiteness, and smooth, non-porous finish. "Porcelain," Marco Polo's

King August was intrigued. Although it wasn't gold, porcelain had a value all its own —particularly when August controlled not only its secret, but also its creator. Soon after, "The Royal Saxon Porcelain Works" set up shop in Dresden. However, fearing would-be

York show has been going strong since 1934

YORK, Pa. – At a time when an internet search might take the place of "going antiquing," the "Original 182nd Semi-Annual York Antiques Show & Sale" will once again showcase a wide range of wares, displayed in booths, touchable and ready to take home upon purchase. Founded by Mabel Renner in 1934, this longtime tradition for generations of collectors returns with the first of two 2024 shows, set for Friday and Saturday, February 2 and 3.

Over the years, the York show has weathered financial ups and downs, wars, and a pandemic. But it has remained resilient. And, according to Melvin Arion, it is now "the second oldest antique show in the country."

Arion's first association with the show was as an exhibitor. Beginning in 1963, he offered "furniture and general antiques, folk art" and the like, under the show management of Paul Ettline. Arion said he was attracted to the show because it was a "well-known show, with very good quality and selection." Having taken over as show promoter in 1996, the Delaware resident added, "The quality is still there."

At its peak, nearly one hundred dealers exhibited at the show, held twice a year at the York Fairground Convention & Expo Center. Covid shut the show down for two years. But these days, according to Arion, the show is once again on the upswing, with four new exhibitors this year, bringing the total to 60. Arion agreed that this number ensures a comfortable show, one at which both sellers and buyers have

The Columbus Paper, Postcard, and Book Show is getting new digs

COLUMBUS, Ohio — One of the best things about the Columbus Paper, Postcard, and Book show is, the calendar barely changes and the event awaits. The show, typically scheduled the first Sunday after New Year's Day, landed on January 7 this year.

This year, attendees also had a piece of news awaiting — it was the last round for the paper show at the Ohio Expo Center; come September, it is relocating to the Franklin County Fairgrounds in the Columbus suburb of Hilliard.

The current homeport, the Rhodes Building at the Expo Center, is facing likely demolition per proposed upgrade plans for the fairgrounds which includes modernizing or demolishing several buildings. Whether the building is razed or not, the show's relocation should be welcomed by attendees because they will no longer have to pay the \$7 parking fee levied by the Expo Center.

It's not the first time the popular event has moved during its 30-year history, although much of its time has been spent in the Rhodes Center. Twice each year — in September and January —dozens of dealers arrive, offering merchandise like vintage postcards, old advertising, comics, antique photographs, stereoviews, and archival accessories for protecting old documents. Promoter Terry Bigler, who took over the show about 10 years ago, said the January 7 event had 30-plus dealers who came from across Ohio, Indiana, and Michigan. Attendance is usually around 200-300. The larger September shows can pull as many as 90 dealers.

Collectors and the curious are drawn to the nostalgia of paper collectibles known as ephemera. From old letters and photographs to advertising pieces like posters and vintage brochures, ephemera offers amazing snapshots into history and is very approachable price-wise. With many items starting at \$1, a new collector can be easily inspired!





time to reconnect with each other, renewing years-old relationships. Think "old home week."

Those familiar with the show attribute its success to Arion's personal touch. Attending every detail, his goal is to make the process easy for both dealers (drawing from his own experience) and showgoers alike. Eschewing email and going "old school," Arion knows what works. He has a first-class mailing list that is "6,000 deep." To keep in touch with former showgoers, he sends postcards twice a year, reminding them of the show and offering a discount on admission. He advertises extensively in trade papers, listing the names of the exhibitors, many of whom showgoers have dealt with in the past. Knowing what to expect encourages "people to come to every show, looking for certain things to add to their collections."

As for the dealers, Arion said they hail from Maine to Florida, Philadelphia to the Midwest, including a few dealers from Kentucky. Many of the dealers have participated in the show for years because "they do very well financially."

York, he continued, is a natural. "It's in the heart of antique country," he said, noting that the Pennsylvania city is in the vicinity of Adamstown, Lancaster, and Harrisburg. He said it's also "centrally located for antique dealers" who regularly exhibit at the show.

With a good mix of dealers comes a variety of wares offered, Arion continued. Period American and English furniture and Oriental rugs, early kitchen and fireplace items, ephemera and pottery, vintage toys and estate jewelry: the list goes on. Looking for a hand-carved butter print, fine art, or hooked rugs? Pueblo pottery and baskets, or vintage holiday items (it's not too soon to think of Halloween and Christmas)? All of this and more will be offered "There's a variety of merchandise for everyone," Arion commented.

An integral part of the show's success is the amenities of the venue, he continued. Spending an entire day at the show is made easier thanks to a snack bar within the show and "plenty of free parking." In the spirit of no surprises, Arion spells out other show amenities: All major credit cards are accepted for both admission and buying. The building is smoke-free. And a dollar will be deducted from the \$10 admission fee, not only by presenting a postcard but also by showing this news story or an ad. Show hours are 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Friday the 2nd (Groundhog Day) and 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Saturday the 3rd.

Finally, what if Mother Nature intervenes? No problem, Arion concluded. "The fairgrounds know how to deal with snow."

Consider vintage postcards, which are the show's staple. Virtually every dealer offered a few, and for many, it was all they offered. Postcards are sometimes referred to as the "affordable antique" because they can commonly be picked up for \$1-\$3. One dealer even had boxes of unsorted cards available for just 25-cents each. While modest costs are typical, the rarest postcards — particularly "real photos postcards" made using a photographic process — can run much higher.

Nearly as popular as postcards are old photographs and stereoviews. They're captivating because they capture genuine moments in time. Various dealers offered photography ranging from early Daguerreotypes and EdRight: Show promoter Terry Bigler is also one of the dealers. Antique photographs line much of his booth.

wardian-era stereoviews to 35mm slides from 1950s family vacations. Similar to postcards, antique photographs could be acquired for \$5 and under, although rarer shots, like World War II imagery, started around \$25.

One of the paper show's most varied categories is vintage advertising. Attendees found everything from 19th-century

political ads and old store catalogs to 1980s concert posters available. Vintage matchbooks seemed to be picking up some steam, and as with so much available, started as low as \$1.

Transportation ephemera appeals to many collectors, and there was plenty to choose from. Items from airlines, steamship lines, railroads, and automobile manufacturers were on dealer tables. Bill Knadler from Norwalk, Ohio is a fixture at the show. He specializes in stock certificates; among them were pieces from Studebaker, Pan Am, and Ford. Newbies could start collections from an impressive assortment priced at just \$1. Nearby, commercial letters and invoices from railroads, shipping companies, and even a whaling company, were priced from \$3-\$5. Other options included bus and railroad timetables, gasoline brand roadmaps, and cruise ship menus, often starting around \$5.

Then, there was pop culture merchandise that included old Hollywood magazines, pulp paperbacks, movie posters, and celebrity photographs. Commonplace items, like garden variety comic books and celebrity collector cards, could be found for \$1. A few

dealers, like Ohio's Mill Cliff Books and Collectibles, carried autographed pieces that often started at \$10 but went up from there, depending on rarity, the celebrity's fame, and if authenticated.

The show's traditional silent auction remained popular. Around two-dozen lots, spanning everything from a single antiquarian book to a mixed box of 19th-century portraits, were displayed throughout the day for interested parties to bid on. Bidding sometimes exceeded \$50 on some items while it stalled at under \$10 on others, making for some nice bargains.

While ephemera shows like this have their wallet-friendly side, it doesn't mean there aren't prime pieces that command top dollar. For example, some of those stock certificates exceeded \$500, good-condition circus posters can run over \$1,000, and an authenticated autograph from someone like



Marilyn Monroe or Frank Sinatra can land \$3,000 or more.

It's important to protect ephemera, particularly for those higher-value items, because handling and the environment will exact a toll. Fortunately, there are dealers like Barry Yancey who sell archival-quality storage items for everything from postcards to antique newspapers. Packages of acid-free sleeves, backing boards, and storage cases started around \$10

The next Columbus Paper, Postcard, and Book Show takes place September 8 at its new home in the Edwards Building at the Franklin County Fair-

grounds, 5035 NW Parkway in Hilliard Ohio, on Columbus' west side. Admission is \$6. A \$1 discount is available via most of the promoter's advertising.

Celebrity deaths can impact even if you didn't know the person

The year 2023 unfolded as yet another challenging chapter for celebrities. Despite their towering personas, these individuals are mortal like the rest of us.

The resonance of a celebrity's death, particularly those whose work has left an indelible mark on our lives, invokes a sense of melancholy within me. Critics may dismiss this sentiment as trivial, arguing that mourning should be reserved for those we personally know. However, the reality is that celebrities hold pivotal roles in people's lives, mine included. Beyond mere entertainers, they possess the ability to infuse vitality and enlightenment into our often-mundane existence.

After careful contemplation, I produced this (alphabetical) list of celebrities whose death last year affected me the most on a personal level. Call it a tribute of sorts to eight people I didn't know, but who impacted me significantly, nevertheless.



David Crosby

David Crosby - I'm heavily into heavy metal. Bands like Dio, Black Sabbath, Judas Priest, and Iron Maiden "get my motor running" (to paraphrase Steppenwolf). But I love a variety of other musical genres, including folk rock, which was perfected by Crosby, Stills, Nash & Young. Both lyrically and harmonically, the band is one of my favorites of the psychedelic era and beyond. One of the earlier "supergroups," CSNY created some of my all-time favorite songs, including such timeless classics as "Helpless," "Southern Cross," and "Woodstock."



William Friedkin

William Friedkin - Back in the early '90s, when I was dating my now-wife, she came over and we watched The Exorcist with my roommate. It was terrifying, and the three of us were genuinely spooked afterward. My roommate even brought his Bible out from his bedroom and placed it on the coffee table. I had seen it before, but for some reason it seemed especially scary this time around. Admittedly. I haven't watched many of Friedkin's other films (The French Connection is a notable exception), but The Exorcist alone is enough to earn him a spot on my list. It made all previous horror films seem less realistic to me in comparison.

Marty Krofft - More than Star Trek. More than The Super Friends. The most influential television show in the history of my life is The Land of the Lost, produced by the brothers Sidney and Marty Krofft. Featuring Marshall, Will, and Holly on a "routine expedition" gone awry, the program debuted when I was seven years old, and I was absolutely mesmerized. Written by such sci-fi legends as David Gerrold and Larry Niven, it played a huge role in my becoming obsessed with fantasy and science fiction. The Krofft brothers also created such wonderfully creative shows as H.R. Pufnstuf, Sigmund and the Sea Monsters, and Electra Woman and Dyna Girl.



Norman Lear

Norman Lear - Like so many kids who grew up before the internet and smart phones, I spent a TON of time playing outside. However, I also watched a lot of television, especially during windy winter days when severe bronchitis forced me to stay indoors. Norman Lear created and produced many of my favorites of that era, including All in the Family, Sanford & Son, and One Day at a Time. Unlike so much TV, which is sheer fluff, Lear's shows used humor to deal with serious and controversial topics—he was a trailblazer for the medium like no other. He lived to be 101, a testament to his timeless talent.

Mathew Perry – As with countless oth-

er celebrities, the funny and charming Mathew Perry, who played Chandler on Friends, showed that you can have it all fame, fortune, good looks, great friendsand still be a miserable mess. In his memoir, he said that he never really felt good or even normal unless he was on some type of mood-enhancing substance. Sad. Friends hit the air when I was dating my now-wife, and it's been a big part of our lives. She even has a big part of her office devoted to Friends memorabilia. It's a highly likeable show with numerous hilarious and memorable moments, and Chandler was a big part of that.



John Romita Sr.

John Romita Sr. - Decades before comic book stories got so convoluted, and when continuity was still important to publishers, John Romita Jr. took over for Steve Ditko as the artist on The Amazing Spider-Man (in 1966 with issue #39), one of Marvel's flagship titles. Romita aped Ditko's style initially, but after a few issues,

he embraced the book and began crafting the character and his adventures in his now-iconic style. In 1973, Romita took over as art director for Marvel and played a major role in defining the look of the company's output and in designing new characters. From a long list of great craftsmen, he's my favorite Spidey artist of all time.



Suzanne Somers

Suzanne Somers - Freud spoke of a latency period, but I never had one. I was girl-crazy all throughout my childhood. One of my biggest crushes was Chrissy Snow, the gorgeous, but ditzy blonde roommate of Jack Tripper (John Ritter) and Janet Wood (Joyce DeWitt). Although he had to pretend to be gay to live with Chrissy and Janet to get landlord approval, I thought Jack was the luckiest dude in the world. He was smitten with both girls, but ultimately the show was about the trio's close friendship and their misunderstandings and misadventures. I loved it. And, in my own childish way, I loved Chrissy.



Cindy Williams

Cindy Williams - Numerous sitcoms had a girl that "got around," and that was part of their appeal and a big part of the comedy. Alice had Florence Jean Castleberry. Golden Girls had Blanche Devereaux. Laverne & Shirley had Laverne DeFazio, who was played by Penny Marshall opposite "good girl" Shirley Feeny, played by the incredibly cute and affable Cindy Williams. Like her boyfriend Carmine "The Big Ragoo" Ragusa, I was quite smitten with the virginal Shirley, who I far preferred to loose Laverne. She was the ultimate "girl next door type," rivaled only by Mary Ann from Gilligan's Island. And she just seemed so

While I limited my list to just eight, there were many more celebrities who died last year who played a key role in my life as a fan and content creator. These include Jeff Beck, Riccou Browning, Jimmy Buffet, Phillis Coates, Bert I. 




Bronze sculpture is bearish with a \$10,000 bid

YPSILANTI, Mich. —There are many traditions that start the New Year off right. One of them is the annual Jan. 1 Schmidt's New Year's Day Gallery Auction. This online and in person event featured antiques, fine art, furniture, coins, and furnishings from a variety of estates and private collections. Prices listed here do not include the buyer's premium.

A sculpture with an endearing story led the field. Artist Marshall M. Fredericks was commissioned by the J.L. Hudson Company to create a life-sized whimsical bronze sculpture in 1954 titled "Boy and Bear". It was located at the store entrance at Northland Shopping Center in Southfield, Michigan to appeal to children and draw families in. An 11-inchtall bronze model of that sculpture was available at this auction and proved extremely popular, requiring a final bid of \$10,000 to claim it. Meanwhile, an amusing sculpture by Robert Zeppel-Sperl, titled "S Man" produced by Murano Glass depicted a clown-like kneeling fellow in striped multi-colored clothing. Measuring 16 inches tall and numbered 4/8, it was gleefully taken with a final bid of

Elegant and unique home furnishings provided many temptations. Leading this category was the 1960s Lalique "Champs-Élysées" crystal chandelier. This handsome fixture featured six molded Sycamore frosted leaf design lights supported by a hexagonal brass frame and was etched "Lalique France". Measuring 30 inches tall, this exquisite item found a new home with a final bid of \$6,000. With quite a different appearance, there was a late 19th century American Victorian gasolier (a chandelier with gas burners). Now converted to

electric operation, the six-light, 44-inchtall brass body sported elaborate swag decoration and etched glass shades. It drew a final bid of \$3,000.

Standing a remarkable 77 inches tall, a pair of Oscar Bach brass, iron, and lead torchieres towered over the scene. Consisting of intricate hand-forged details including dancing Bacchante finials over

reticulated chambers, this pair of torchlike floor lamps drew an impressive final bid of \$5,500. A club fender is a three-sided seat on uprights which surrounds the fireplace hearth. A beautiful, early 20th century Art Deco example was offered that featured a wrought Iron frame and hammered brass detail depicting a woodland scene with a Satyr and two dancing Nymphs and a velvet upholstered seat.



mond bracelet featured three links each set with marquis diamonds, along with numerous other diamonds, chips, and accents. The bidders agreed that it was a desirable piece, and it required a final bid of \$2,500 to claim it. The vintage 10k white gold brooch, with a 27 carat aquamarine stone and 66 single cut diamonds measuring 1.5 inches across exceeded its estimate and finished at \$1,400. A colorful vintage 14k yellow gold bracelet consisting of amethyst stones and pearl accents mounted on square filigree links also did very well, finishing with a final bid of \$1,200.

Classic wall art is always a popular category, and there were several options. An oil on canvas portrait of Princess Marie Adelaide de France, daughter of Louis XV, was attributed to the 18th century. This unsigned painting measured 33 by 40 inches housed in a gilt wood frame. Minor damage due to age did not deter bidders from claiming this prize, taking it with a final bid of \$2,400. A pair of mid-18th century Irish oil on canvas portraits of Richard Thomas Cooke and Martha Leeson of Cookesborough was also unsigned. Measuring 34 x 40 inches in their gilt wood frames, the set cleared a final bid of \$2,100. Landscapes, seascapes, and other portraits were also available.

Elegant serving sets were available. The mid-20th century Mexican sterling silver tea set by Tane Orfebres included a coffee pot, teapot, creamer, sugar bowl, and an 18-inch serving tray. Each was impressed with the maker's mark and the set was rated at 150.98 troy ounces total. It found

a new home with a final bid of \$2,500. A detailed 72-piece set of 20th century Royal Copenhagen porcelain tableware in the intricate "Blue Fluted Full Lace" pattern included plates, bowls, and saucers but no serving dishes. This lovely set was taken with a final bid of \$2,400.

Gold coins are a solid investment, and several were offered. An 1881 U.S. gold "quarter eagle" \$2.50 coin with a Philadelphia mint, liberty head on the face and eagle on the reverse surpassed its estimate with a final bid of \$2,300. The designation of quarter eagle or half eagle compares the coin's face value to that of the full eagle coin which was a \$10 piece. An 1878 U.S. Gold \$3 coin featuring a Native American "Princess" head on face and laurel wreath on the reverse finished at \$800, and two U.S. gold half eagle coins were claimed for \$700 each.

There were so many incredible items available, but here are two of the more unique choices. A very well made19th century Black Forest tantalus cabinet

Meissen Porcelains

competitors, August moved the firm's base of operations in 1710 to Albrechtburg Castle in Meissen, Saxony. There, in fortress-like surroundings, prying eyes could be successfully deflected. Because of that move, the company name eventually became one with its locale: "Meissen."

Early Meissen pieces were red stoneware, reminiscent of Chinese work, and incised with Chinese characters. Porcelain became the Meissen focus in 1713. Non-figural Meissen ware, eagerly embraced by King August as a means of increasing his country's trade, included tea sets, dining sets, and serving vessels; handles for eating utensils; vases; tankards; pipe bowls; decorative tiles; and even official court medals. The dazzling white porcelain surfaces proved ideal for the richly colored decoration that became a Meissen trademark.

Although there are Meissen figurals dating from the Bottger era and the early1720s, the company did not employ a full-time sculptor until the 1727 arrival of Johann Gottlieb Kirchner. Trained in metal and wood. Kirchner had little interest in sculpting porcelain, but quickly learned that King August never took "no" for an answer. Although his sculptures of animals and saints found favor with the King, Kirchner had little patience with his Meissen co-workers, and even less with his eventual successor, Johann Joachim Kaendler. Kaendler actually enjoyed working in porcelain, and his ease with the format made Kirchner livid. An unbearable working situation led to Kirchner's 1733 release from his position, due to "permanent indisposition"

Meanwhile, Kaendler's enthusiasm

and talent shone through, in a series of imaginative renditions that came to define the Meissen style. Kaendler's porcelain figurines were colorful, extremely detailed, and embraced a variety of themes and concepts with widespread popular appeal. In other words, they "sold."

Meissen figurines take many forms, and reflect the times during which they were created. There are birds, animals, and characters from commedia dell'arte. Some figures are bucolic (shepherds, harvesters, milkmaids¬). Others show

> folks engaged in everyday pursuits (potters, butchers, seamstresses). There are romantic "Ladies and Cavaliers," and personifications of such intangibles as "The Elements," "The Senses," and "The Whimsy Seasons." rules in such figurals as a harpsichordplaying fox, a tailor astride a goat, (both rider and ridee wearing thick eyeglasses), and a multi-piece monkey band. And, of course, there were always the old reliables: figural retellings of ancient myths, such as that of Phoenician the princess "Europa"

god Zeus, who has taken the form of a white bull.

In the mid-1700s, a vogue for Neo-Classicism led to the employment of Michel Victor Acier as co-modelmaster. Acier's design focus relied heavily on less fluid interpretations of mythic characters (gladiators, "The Muses"), and sentimental themes ("The Good Mother"). By the late 1700s, Meissen's influence began to wane. Both France and England had developed thriving potteries, and their less-costly wares did a land-office business in Saxony, despite heavy duty charges. Even worse was a notable deterioration in the quality of Meissen pieces, due to the use of cheaper, inferior clay, and employment of the untrained (among the "porcelain workers" listed on the Meissen payroll in the 1760s: a shoemaker, a tailor, and a barber). As for the famed "Meissen formula," the secret of making fine porcelain was a secret no longer. Now, the entire world was in on it.

By the 1820s, Meissen finally got the message. Changes were instituted, especially technical improvements in production which allowed the firm to operate more efficiently and profitably. More importantly, the Meissen designs, which had remained relatively stagnant for nearly a century, were refurbished. Since then, Meissen has continued to reinterpret, and expand on, design themes from its earlier, glorious past.

Many Meissen figurines are now in museums. Many more, however, are offered regularly at auction houses and being abducted by the websites, and are eagerly snapped up. The combination of age, rarity, and fine handcraftsmanship results in sometimes-heady valuations, but for the passionate collector of fine ceramics, the prize is often worth the price.

Johann Friedrich Bottger never managed the miracle of transforming base metal into gold. He did however, transform common clay into porcelain perfection: the miracle that is Meissen.
