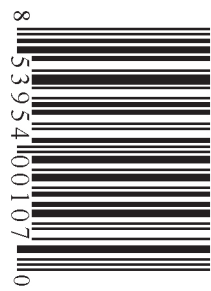

## May the luck of the Irish be with you when collecting

Green water in rivers and public fountains, green stripes down the middle of city streets, and famous buildings bathed in a wash of green lights. Green bread, green cookies, and yes, even green bagels. What began as a religious holy day, marking the death of the patron saint of Ireland, has segued into a day of celebration, with corned beef and cabbage and Irish soda bread, all washed down with green beer.

Although St. Patrick's Day is a special day, there are those who never stop thinking "green." To be sure, legions of dedicated collectors, with the luck of the Irish, scour yard sales, flea markets, and antique malls and shops with a common mission: to collect an array of items related to the March 17 holiday and all things Irish in general.

"Everybody likes to be Irish on St. Patrick's Day," said Jimmie Bucci, who noted that he is "100 percent Irish on his mother's side" and 56 percent overall. An inveterate collector of many things, Bucci enjoys searching for wares with an Irish motif, treasures that he uses for entertaining, as well as for decorating his home in Massachusetts. When it comes to this collection, he looks for, among other things, objects that bear a number of specific images, either



alone or in combination with each other.

"Anything with Irish dancers" is one place to begin, according to Bucci. He also favors anything featuring Irish harps, jaunting carts, and pots of gold at the end of rainbows, as well as shamrocks, three-leaf clovers that were originally prized as a symbol of the Trinity, as well as a representation of faith, hope, and love. Because of their place in Irish folklore, leprechauns are a common theme.

Shoemakers who prefer a solitary life, these tiny often-bearded old men are generally portrayed wearing a cocked hat and leather apron. Generally speaking, think of a box of Lucky Charms cereal, Bucci suggested with a smile.

Of course, traditional Irish wares are

regarded for their beauty. Unused examples often still bear an identifying distinctive sticker. But as president of the Vintage Tablecloth Lovers Club, Bucci is particularly drawn to mid-century tablecloths, of which there is one "iconic" cloth. Typical of tablecloths from this time, it pictures a bit of everything, including a courting couple, Paddy's pig, and the Blarney Stone, as well as a bar of music for "When Irish Eyes are Smiling." Rarely offered for sale, collectors should expect to pay \$100 for this sought-after cloth, Bucci said.

For textile lovers, there are other possibilities. Linen kitchen towels abound, many of which were originally intended as souvenirs of a visit to Ireland. "They made hundreds of them," laughed Bucci, "and I have dozens."

Early birds flocked to exclusive previews at 20th-Century Cincinnati

SHARONVILLE, Ohio — 20th-Century Cincinnati returned to its digs at the Sharonville Convention Center February 23-25. It was the show’s 29th season; this year, more than 70 dealers filled 40,000 square feet of exhibit space with everything from mid-century-modern furniture and space-age decor to pop-culture memorabilia. It’s one of the country’s premier gatherings for fans of the modernist period which spanned from the 1920s to the 1980s.

Last year, sisters Jess and Jenni Button acquired the show from the original promoter, Bruce Metzger. The Buttons had ideal skill sets for taking the reins. Jess is an event planner with a degree in hospitality. Jenni has a degree in fine arts and worked in the gallery industry. Together they own a digital marketing agency.

Jenni spoke about the formula they brought. “Our strengths match each other and match the show.” Daniel Weisenforth, owner of Dayton, Ohio’s Red Lion Antiques, who’s been with the show since its inception, corroborated. “Jenni and Jess both have work experience in the kind of things it takes to run a show,” he said.

The sisters’ experience, combined with youthful energy and lots of creative ideas, have brought what many long-time vendors described as “new blood” to the already extraordinary event. Linda Eckstein from Minerva, Ohio, a show fixture for 15 years observed, “They’re younger and very enthusiastic. They’ve really injected a lot of new energy.”

Those creative energies have given rise

to some noteworthy enhancements to the event. The pair has courted new vendors, modified the floor layout to make browsing easier, and added a Friday preview mixer. Commenting on the changes, Adam Hoover of Canton, Ohio’s Main Street Modern said, “It’s great to have someone

As the 1960s fade, historians scramble to capture Woodstock’s voices

BETHEL, N.Y. (AP) — Woodstock didn’t even happen in Woodstock.

The fabled music festival, seen as one of the seminal cultural events of the 1960s, took place 60 miles away in Bethel, New York, an even smaller village than Woodstock. It’s a fitting misnomer for an event that has become as much legend as reality — and has less to do with location than the memories it evokes about a society’s state of mind at the close of a jumbled decade.

An estimated 450,000 people converged on a swath of land owned by dairy farmer Max Yasgur to attend an “Aquarian Exposition” promising “three days of peace, love and music” from Aug. 15 to 17, 1969. Most were teenagers or young adults — people now approaching the twilight of their lives in an era where only a small portion of the population has living memories of the 1960s.

That ticking clock is why the Museum at Bethel Woods, located on the site of the festival, is immersed in a five-year project to sift facts from the legends and collect firsthand Woodstock memories before they fade away. It’s a quest that has taken museum curators on a cross-country pilgrimage to record and preserve the recollections of those who were there.

“You need to capture the history from the mouths of the people who had the direct experience,” says music journalist Rona Elliot, 77, who has been working as one of the museum’s “community connectors.” Elliot has her own stories about the festival; she was there, working with organizers like Michael Lang, who entrusted her with his archives before his death in 2022.

Woodstock, says Elliot, is “like a jigsaw puzzle — a panoply of everything that happened in the ‘60s.”

Woodstock attendees have done hundreds of interviews through the decades, particularly on major festival anniversaries. But the Bethel Woods museum is plunging deeper with a project that began in 2020, relying on techniques similar to those of the late historian Studs Terkel,

who produced hundreds of oral histories about what it was like to live through the Great Depression and World War II.

“There is a difference between someone being interviewed for a paper or a documentary and having an oral history catalogued and preserved in a museum,” says Neal Hitch, senior curator and director of the Museum At Bethel Woods. “We had to go to people where they are. If you just call someone on the phone, they aren’t quite sure what to say when we ask you to tell us about these personal, private memories from a festival when they may have been 18 or 19.”

To find and meet people willing to tell their Woodstock tales, the museum received grants totaling more than \$235,000 from the Institute of Museum and Library Services — enough money to pay for curators and community connectors such as Elliot to travel the country and record the stories.

The odyssey began in Santa Fe, New Mexico — home to the Hog Farm that provided hippie volunteers such as Hugh “Wavy Gravy” Romney and Lisa Law to help feed the Woodstock crowd. Museum

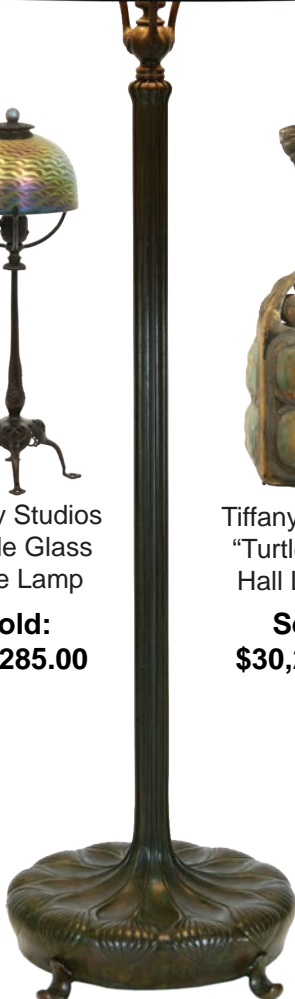

explore new avenues.”

The standout upgrade was the two-hour Friday night Mid-Mod Mixer complete with cocktails and light fare. While it carried a \$100 price tag, it provided admission for the duration of the weekend. While a tidy sum, the price tag didn’t seem to be a barrier. More than 200 guests took advantage of the exclusive entry and the chance to shop and mingle in a relaxed setting. There was a semi-open bar, carving station, tables with desserts, and servers walking among the crowd with silver trays laden with hors d’oeuvres.

The intimate setting provided a chance for purchasing-minded attendees, interior designers, and even fellow dealers, to get first dibs on the best items. That’s important for a show that’s highly regarded for top-tier merchandise. In all directions, booths were lined with pieces from names like Saarinen, Eames, and even Frank Lloyd Wright. Pedigree art and furniture can run thousands of dollars and it’s often those items that get cherry-picked. One new dealer, Kenya Adbul of Philadelphia’s The Modern Republic said, “Pound for pound, this show has the best quality I’ve seen.” Dealers enjoyed the event as much as attendees and - mingling aside - it proved good for sales.

Then came Saturday’s Java Preview. While not new, the exclusive event has taken on new life under the Button’s direction. The \$30 early-bird gathering, held from 9-noon on Saturday, includes complimentary coffee and other morning beverages, and a full weekend pass to the show. Like the previous evening’s mixer, it provided a few extra hours for serious shoppers to browse, buy, and beat the crowds. Also like the night before, the

entrance cost didn’t seem to deter attendance. This year, over 600 took advantage of the preview; by 9:30, it was a full house and wallets were open. One guest who traveled from Pittsburgh observed, “I’ve never seen this many people here this early!”

When the doors opened for general admission, many pieces already bore “sold” tags or had left the building. Porters were available during both the Mid Mod Mixer and the Java Preview to help remove and load larger purchases.

Over both days, over 4,000 hit the show, drawn by the amazing array of modernist merchandise and special exhibits. This year’s showcase exhibit was on the Cincinnati Preservation Association’s restoration of the Rauh House, one of the first International Style residences in Ohio. Cincinnati’s preservation group Form Follows Function (cf3) and Cincinnati Public Radio each had booths. And, for anyone

who didn’t drain their phone taking pictures of merchandise, there was a photo booth featuring the “Welcome to Modern” logo as a backdrop for selfies. Jenni Button said of it all, “We’re trying to create an experience, so even if you don’t buy anything you’ll have a good time.”

Next year’s show dates are already set for February 21-23. So, mark your calendars!

# Painting by Tiffany to highlight Cottone auction in March

GENESE0, N.Y. — A rediscovered painting by Louis Comfort Tiffany (American, 1848-1933), titled Gossipy Market Woman at Nuremburg, will be featured during a March 20 Cottone auction. Painted circa 1889, while Tiffany was busy with his celebrated Havemeyer Mansion commission, the subdued oil on canvas retains its original giltwood frame attributed to the collaboration between architect Stanford White and Louis C. Tiffany Decorating Company.

The painting was exhibited at the Society of American Artists, Thirteenth Annual Exhibition, The American Art Gallery, at Madison Square, New York, in 1891 and later the same year at the Art Institute of Chicago’s, Fourth Annual Exhibition of American Oil Paintings & Sculpture, in Chicago, Illinois, and is listed in the exhibition catalog as no. 335. Undoubtably the study for this work, titled Study of Women at Market, oil on panel; 6 ¾ by 5 inch (CHMF 55-21), is in the collection of the Charles Hosmer Morse Museum of American Art, Winter Park, Florida. Tiffany, used wood panels in the early stages of design to perfect details he felt important to the finished paintings, the studies appear to have been very personal to him as they were displayed on shelves in his studios and lined the halls of his personal suite at his Long Island country home, Laurelton Hall. When the house and contents were sold in the 1940s, these cherished studies escaped the auction block and were offered first to family. This study was later gifted to the museum by Tiffany’s daughter, Comfort Tiffany

Gilder. Although unsigned and undated the study was likely painted during a summer trip from June 15, 1889 – September 2, 1889, when Louis C. Tiffany traveled to the Exposition Universelle in Paris, Nuremburg, Germany and northern Italy. The 20 by 16 ¾ inch canvas descended in the family of Henry M. V. Summers (1871-1959); friend of Theodore Roosevelt and auctioneer in Oyster Bay, and is being offered, with an estimate of \$20,000-\$40,000.

The many wonderful lamps by Tiffany Studios will be highlighted by a fine ruby red Peony lamp, with an 18-inch shade, estimated from \$60,000-\$80,000 which comes from the collection of Al and Sue Turner, Bonita Springs, Florida. A rare blue Acorn / Vine Border table lamp, in original oil, with

a 16-inch shade will be sold and is estimated from \$15,000-\$25,000. Descending in the family of the original owners, the oil lamp was acquired in the early 1900s by A. A. Anderson, artist, western rancher and naturalist. His portrait of Thomas Edison hangs in the National Portrait Gallery. President Roosevelt named him as the first Special Assistant of Forest Reserves and Yellowstone National Park. Tiffany’s Arrowroot, Ten-Light Lily, Jeweled Geometric, Raised Branch Apple Blossom, and Moorish Hall Lantern as well as accessories will also cross the auction block.

Standouts in paintings include a Montague Dawson (British, 1890-1973) Clipper ship ‘Midnight’ off Beachy Head, the 20 by 30-inch canvas, painted circa 1949 has an esti-

mate of \$20,000-\$40,000. Decorative arts and oriental rugs will feature several fine rugs, including a rare silk and metal thread Souf Kashan, Room-size Tabriz, and Hereke silks. A finely carved wood court jester torchiere by Italian master, Valentino Panciera Besarel (1829-1902), standing over 6-foot tall is estimated from \$3,000-\$5,000.

Arts & Crafts include Grueby pottery, bookcases by Gustave Stickley and Limbert Co., lamps by Dirk Van Erp and Handel including the Jungle Bird and Butterfly.

curators have traveled to Florida, hopped on a “Flower Power” cruise ship and visited Columbus, Ohio, before making a California swing earlier this year that included a San Francisco community center located near the former homes of festival performers Jefferson Airplane and the Grateful Dead.

Richard Schoellhorn, now 77, made the trip from his Sebastopol, California, home to San Francisco to discuss his experience at Woodstock. He was initially hired to be a security guard at the ticketing booth when the festival was supposed to occur in Wallkill, New York, before a community backlash prompted a late switch to the Bethel site.

Schoellhorn still reported for work in Bethel, only to promptly discover his services weren’t going to be needed because the festival became so overwhelmed that organizers stopped selling tickets.

“I was walking around at Woodstock and Hugh Romney comes up to me and says, ‘Are you working?’” Schoellhorn recalled to The Associated Press before sitting down to have his oral history recorded. “And I go, ‘No, I just got fired!’ He goes, ‘Well, would you like to volunteer?’”

Schoellhorn wound up working in a tent set up to assist people having bad experiences on hallucinogenic drugs they had taken. He wound up getting stoned himself while reveling in the first concert he’d ever attended.

“It felt like everyone was in the same freaking boat,” Schoellhorn said. “There wasn’t like one section where people were rich. Nobody was special there, right from the get-go.”

Before attending Woodstock, Schoellhorn said he was a loner intent on pursuing a career in marketing. After Woodstock, he became so extroverted that he wound up living in a Colorado commune for several years before spending 35 years as a dialysis technician.

Another Woodstock attendee, Akinye-

le Sadiq, also came to see the curators in San Francisco to excavate his memories of watching the festival from 25 feet away from the stage.

Although the festival wasn’t supposed to begin until a Friday, Sadiq departed on a Bethel-bound bus on a Wednesday. When the bus broke down, he hitched a ride that delivered him to the festival site by noon Thursday, allowing him to claim a spot so near the stage that he is visible in photos taken during the performances.

By the time he left Bethel a few days later, in a hearse that a fellow festival-goer had converted into a van, Sadiq had changed.

“Before Woodstock, I didn’t have real direction. I basically didn’t have a lot of friends, but I knew I was looking for peace and justice and wanted to be with creative people who were looking to make the world a better place,” Sadiq, now 72, told the AP before having his oral history recorded. “Before Woodstock, if you were living in a little town, you thought there might be a dozen people out there you might be able

to get along with. But then you realized there was at least a half a million of us. It just gave me hope.”

Hitch says curators have heard many life-changing experiences while collecting more than 500 oral histories so far and are convinced they will amass even more during the next year.

The museum intends to focus on finding and interviewing festival attendees scattered across New York state, where Hitch estimates roughly half the Woodstock crowd still lives.

The museum will spend 2025 combing through the oral histories before turning to special projects such as reuniting friends who attended the festival together but now live in different parts of the country.

Elliot is convinced — “both karmically and cosmically” — that the oral history project is something she was meant to do.

“I want this to be a teaching tool,” she says. “I don’t want historians telling the story of a spiritual event that just appeared to be a musical event.”

# Set of matching oak display cases will highlight Appalachia auction

DAMASCUS, Va. – After 125 years and four families of owners, a thriving business in the heart of Abingdon, Virginia (pop. 8,376) is liquidating its final assets March 23 with Appalachian Trading Post and Auctions.

Many of the items in the sale were part of the original jewelry story when it opened in downtown Abingdon in the late 1800s by Jeweler W. G. Hagy. At least seven of the wall display cases and the six floor cases are thought to have come with Hagy, consisting of a matching set of tiger oak.

Auctioneer Alan Shope was only able to find a name listing on one of the 8-foot by 8-foot wall cases: The H. Kros Showcase Co, in downtown Cincinnati.

“It’s becoming difficult to find just one of these fine tiger oak showcases,” Shope says. “But, to find a full matching set is unreal. It’s a rare find. And they can absolutely be used for anything. They’re in immaculate condition.”

The cases were painted black when Susie Buckner, her sister, Judy and husband Carson Jackson bought the store in 1985 from the Greer family. The Greer’s had established a solid reputation since they bought the store in 1940, and the new owners elected to not change the name of the business.

Susie, herself, has worked in the store nearly 50 years. She and her family are looking forward to retirement after such a long run.

“It was always a bustling business” Susie says. “Abingdon is the country seat and we have a Federal Courthouse here. We’ve had two or three governors stop in and other celebrities. June Carter Cash came in a few years ago and bought several items. We still have her signed paper from the credit card she paid with.

“After we announced our retirement, we had several people come in and reminisce about how their grandparents bought their wedding rings here, or a great-grandfather bought a watch. It’s really been a hub of this community.”

cabinets are some fine watchmaker parts cabinets coming up for sale, used by clock and watch repairman who had worked in the store under previous ownership.

Also being sold at auction are several older firearms, pistols and collector knives, in addition to coins, rings and Native American arrow points.

# The Luck of the Irish

Look for those made by Dunmoy and Ulster, he suggested. Attractively decorated, many of these towels feature not only maps but also representations of tourist attractions, as well as recipes, especially those involving alcoholic beverages. Although these souvenir towels are still being manufactured, Bucci characterized those from the 1950s and 1960s as “especially interesting.” It should be noted that terry cloth dish towels decorated with shamrocks are not as collectable as are their linen counterparts.

That said, an inexpensive St. Patrick’s Day collection might focus on handkerchiefs, which were often originally intended as a small gift to be tucked inside a greeting card. Hankies decorated with shamrocks might be purchased for as little as \$2, although those more elaborate might sell for \$12 to \$15. Likewise, vintage placemats with matching napkins are another affordable option. And then there are vintage Irish-themed ties, a fun accessory that brings back memories for Bucci: They were the only non-uniform ties that he and his fellow Catholic school students could wear, if only for one day of the year.

As unlikely as it seems, mid-century holiday-themed paper products for parties, often in mint condition and made by companies such as Hallmark, still exist, even though they were originally intended for single use. In addition to tablecloths, look for cups, plates, and napkins, as well as honeycomb centerpieces, all of which might be found at yard sales, flea markets, and antique malls. Bucci also suggested searching for cardboard holiday cut-outs; once used to decorate classrooms and homes, these items have survived more than half a century and can still elicit a smile.

Other Irish-related paper collectibles include vintage postcards. When compared to those made for other holidays, including Christmas, those intended for St. Patrick’s Day were made in limited numbers; as such,

expect to pay a bit more for them. On the other hand, keep in mind that a collection of postcards depicting scenic views of Ireland can be fun and affordable. And don’t overlook vintage St. Patrick’s Day greeting cards.

Irish jewelry is among other wares that are prized. Claddagh rings and charms are recognizable, with a heart representing love, a crown standing for loyalty, and two clasped hands symbolizing friendship, all of which might be accented with emeralds. Irish Belleek china is cherished by many. And even as values have decreased, Bucci noted that vintage Waterford crystal vases and glassware made in Ireland are still appreciated for their beauty. This might be the time to begin or complete a collection.

And then there’s Irish coffee. A hot drink topped with fresh cream and made from Irish whiskey, hot coffee, and sugar, this potent potable is served in tall mugs with handles. Not surprisingly, serving sets for this purpose are collectible.

When looking for

ceramics, don’t be surprised to find happy cows or leprechauns pursuing various merry pranks. Check out salt and pepper shakers, cups and saucers, and sugar bowls and creamers, which, if they are particularly amusing, might have increased value. Because many of these pieces involve anthropomorphic figures, their cross-collectability results in higher prices. Don’t overlook Irish-themed ashtrays, as well as souvenir plates that picture maps and famous landmarks.

Finally, no party is a party without music. And there is no shortage of collectable LPs full of Irish songs that fit this bill. Bucci suggested collecting albums by the Irish Rovers, the Clancy Brothers, and Carmel Quinn. And then there’s Connie Frances. From “My Wild Irish Rose” and “Danny Boy” to “MacNamara’s Band” and “Too-Ra-Loo-Ra-Loo-Ral,” the Italian-American singer, in Bucci’s words, is “really good. You’d swear she’s Irish.”

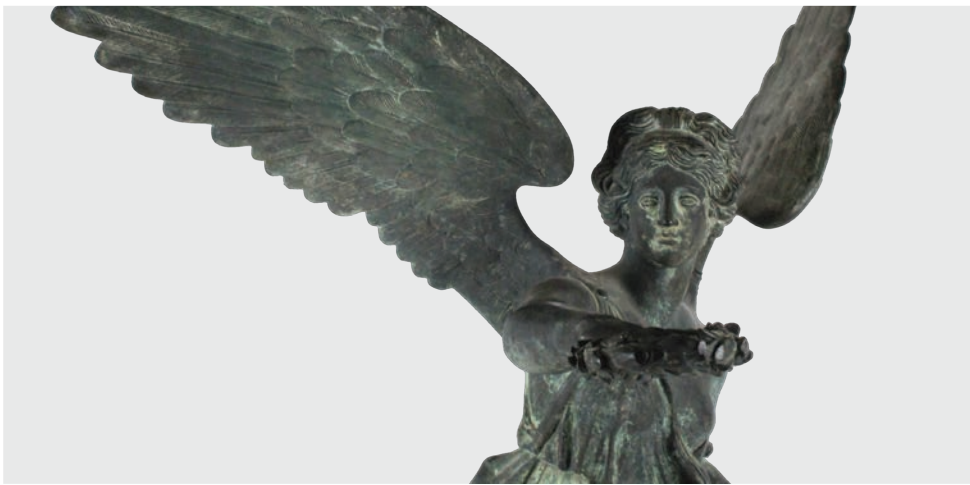
