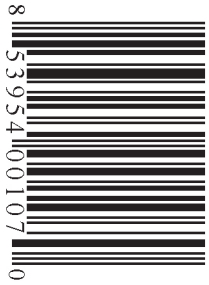

Celestial maps bring the stars home to collectors

Since time immemorial, humans have looked up at the sky in wonderment, studying the stars, using them to tell time, mark the seasons, and navigate the globe. To dream and to be inspired. Today, those living in a wide swath of America have anticipated the April 8 total solar eclipse with great excitement. But ironically, the advice for experiencing this spectacular phenomenon, one in which our star, the Sun, is a key player, is “don’t look.”

All the same, this rare event has rekindled in many what was already a strong interest in the heavens. And for those collectors seeking to own a bit of astronomical history, antique celestial maps might well be the perfect solution. Appreciated for their beauty, they are of historical interest as well. Best of all, there is a map to suit most any budget.

Fascination with the night sky is nothing new. With little more than the naked eye with which to work, ancient Egyptians aligned the pyramids with stars. The Mayans and Aztecs were gifted observers, as were the Greeks and the Chinese. And Stonehenge was built to match the sunrise of the summer solstice and the sunset of the winter solstice. Documenting an age-old interest in the sky, celestial maps, also referred to as “star maps” or “celestial charts,” trace their origins to carvings on the walls of caves, dating thousands of years ago.

Two inventions of the Renaissance era ushered in a new age of celestial maps.

The first was Johannes Gutenberg’s invention of the movable-type printing press, roughly dating from the year 1440. The second was the 1608 creation of the telescope; two years later, Galileo Galilei

was the first to use this new instrument to systematically observe celestial objects and record what he saw. Now, four centuries later, maps that feature stars, planets, moons, and more (“anything in the heavens”) continue to intrigue collectors for a number of reasons, according to Bob Zarembo of Chatham, Mass.

A longtime map enthusiast, Zarembo and his wife, Danielle Jeanloz, are proprietors of Maps of Antiquity; among their shop’s vast inventory are celestial maps. When considering why celestial maps attract those who visit their shop, be they casual customers or serious collectors, Zarembo pointed to the visual appeal of this collecting category. From the beginning, “Pretty was important.” The publishers of early maps, he added, were constantly trying to outdo the competition, and as a result, the fanciful illustrations that accompany many of these maps make them interesting to own.

Although it is difficult to pinpoint a golden age of maps, the 19th century certainly marked a time of change. Thanks to continued advances in the printing process, maps, originally produced for the rich and powerful, became increasingly available to a greater portion of the population. Just as woodblock printing had been supplanted by copperplate engraving, the use of lithography made the process of mapmaking easier and cheaper. Fabric paper, used before 1820, was expensive to

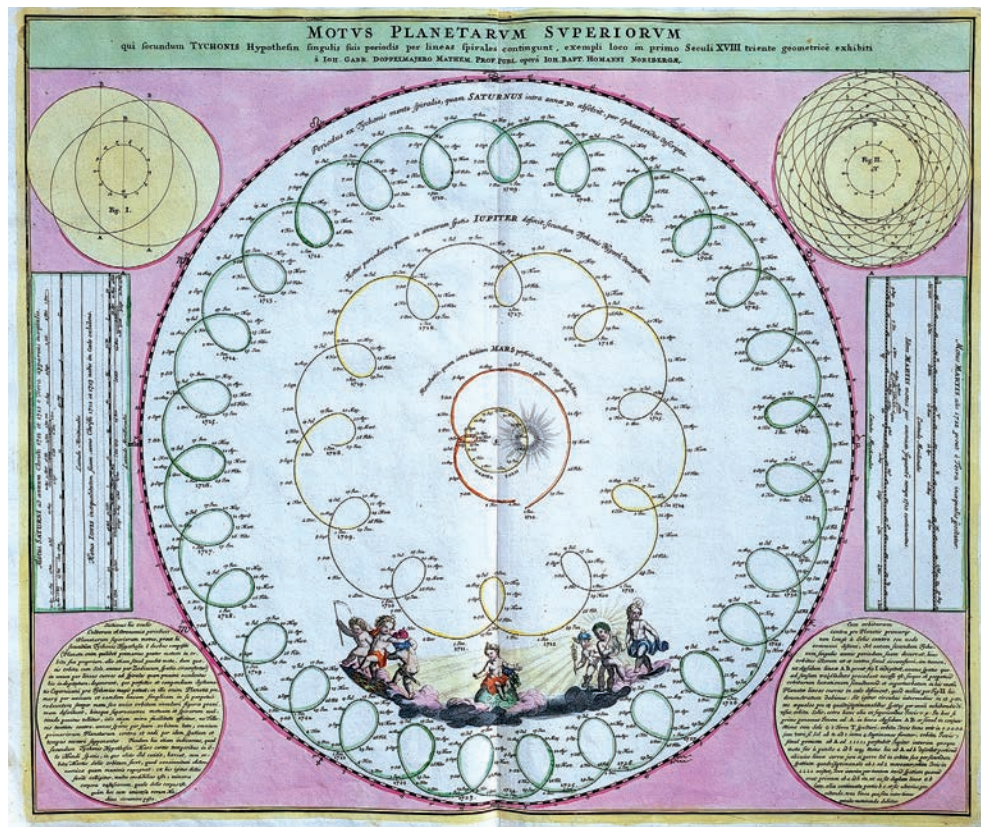

Fenton pancake lamps lit up the bidding with \$600 at Amanda

AMANDA, Ohio – Here is Amanda Auction Gallery's April 7 sale by the numbers: On a beautiful Sunday afternoon, some 239 online bidders came together with 60 inhouse folks for a "fantastic" sale, centered around the personal collection of an Ohio resident from Washington Courthouse. Up for bid were 246 lots, primarily American art pottery and sundry Victorian wares. Bidders hailed from 26 states, representing four countries (the United States and Canada, as well as China and Italy).

Auctioneer Jon LeMay conducted the auction. Not surprisingly, the highest hammered price of the day was for a pair of hand-painted Fenton pancake lamps, in working order and measuring nearly one foot tall. "They're rare," noted Dave Tuggle, the gallery's owner, adding that it was an internet buyer who won them for \$600.

Twentieth-century wares from prominent Ohio potteries dominated the sale, with Rookwood Pottery posting the strongest prices, according to Tuggle. Topping five other lots of Rookwood Pottery was a grouping of three ewers, all signed on the bottom, with one also signed on the inside; collectively, they sold for \$275. A pair of striking blue partridge bookends made \$225, and a small grouping that included Zing tiles sold for \$250.

On the other hand, it was a 7-inch Roseville Pottery Falline vase, a pattern introduced in 1933, that brought \$500. Competing bidders, including one phoning from Cleveland, soared past the pre-sale estimate of \$150 to \$300. But there was no need for Roseville collectors to be discouraged, with 37 additional lots offered.

A number of examples of the Pine Cone pattern were sold, including a striking 18-inch green pitcher (\$225), as well as a lot consisting of a blue vase, eight inches tall, and a green bowl, six inches tall, \$140 for the pair. Two lots featured Pine Cone triple bud vases, one in brown, offered with a vase and a small bowl (\$160), and the other in green, paired with a single-handled small vase (\$120). Other Roseville Pottery patterns did well, with an impressive blue floor vase in the "Fuchsia" pattern mak-

ing \$200, and an eight-inch handled blue Blueberry bowl topping out at \$160.

Eighteen lots of Weller Pottery found new homes, with the most impressive example, a Jap Birdimal umbrella stand, commanding \$225. Two pairs of bird figurines from Weller's Brighton line were sold: a pheasant and a kingfisher (\$130) and two bluebirds (\$110). "Thinking spring," buyers snapped up a Woodcraft chalice vase (\$90) and a pair of Woodcraft wall pockets, decorated with amusing

Collectors are on a roll, adding to their dice sets

Dice are still the game player's most vital, versatile and treasured piece of equipment. Dice collectors are all in, searching for those elusive gems out there. There are thousands of collectors of vintage dice out there, some with thousands of sets of dice.

Kevin Cook, who has amassed a collection of more than 97,000 dice from around the world, appears in the Guinness Book of World Records for having the largest collection of dice.

"Guinness has very stringent rules for collectors," Cook said, "so I had to cull many duplicates. It took nearly five years for me to photograph, catalog and submit my collection. I was instructed to have three people to come by and sign affidavits stating that they had seen the dice and that his collection was authentic."

Thirty-one weeks passed between Cook's first submission to Guinness and their response. In 2004 Cook was proclaimed the Guinness world record holder for largest collection of dice, with the official number listed as 11,097. By 2012, his collection had grown to more than 38,000. His collection is now 97,000 strong.

"It all began in 1981. I was visiting

pawn shops in search of dice when I came across an old shoe box full of dice. It contained many crystallized dice which disintegrated on examination, as well as some bone dice. That got me into the mindset for collecting."

Cook joined a club for other dice lovers. At the advice of The Dice Maniacs Club founder Dr. Alexander Simkin, Cook pursued his goal of having the largest collection of dice in the world.

"I heard that (at that time) the largest

number to date was 5,000 pairs of casino dice," he said. "I felt that this was an attainable goal."

Cook, an engineer and technical writer, got busy. His collection includes dice from a variety of materials, even precious stones like diamonds. Some of the dice in the roster of Cook's collection are more

squirrels (\$110), as well as a 1920s Glendale vase decorated with birds with eggs in a nest (\$130).

“Instant collections” included a number of lots each consisting of 10 ceramic cow pitchers selling for \$30 to \$40, and groupings of wall pockets at \$20 to \$40 per lot. Cabinets in which to display these new treasures were sold, including a handsome four-stack oak bookcase with bottom drawer, hammered down at \$400. Among other pieces of furniture sold were a stylish oak hall seat, complete with an oval mirror (\$225); a maple two-piece kitchen cupboard in excellent condition, with nine drawers, three doors, and a dough box (\$425); and a handsome musical wooden sewing box with inlaid trim (\$475).

Last minute bidding resulted in an auction surprise: A small Jumbo peanut butter tin, showing wear, sold for \$275, several times its pre-sale estimate. A glass-domed taxidermy bird display sold for \$350, while two framed taxidermied birds, a scarlet tanager and a parakeet, made \$150. A coffee grinder advertising “Golden Rule Blend Coffee” from near-

by Columbus brought \$120, and another marked “United Indurated Fibre Company,” sold for \$120. Among a variety

of mourning items was a Victorian hair wreath with the words “Our Hattie At Rest,” which made \$250.

Amanda Auction Gallery is currently preparing for what Tuggle called “our biggest sale of the year.” Set for April 21, the auction will feature advertising and country store items; more than 300 lots that will include, among other things, colorful neons and advertising signs, scooters and bikes, and store displays and cash registers.

than 2,000 years old.

Dice have been tossed by civilizations across the globe. And when most people think of dice, they generally picture a six-sided white cube sporting one to six black dots on each side. But, this hasn't always been the predominant dice template.

Ancient dice were often made of stick, shell or seed and most were two-sided, often with one flat side and one rounded side, like a shelled peanut. Sometimes the two sides were decorated with paint and carvings to further differentiate them. Two-sided dice were widely used by ancient peoples across the globe, from the Aztecs to native Polynesians. Some modern cultures, like the Navajo Nation, still use them for traditional games.

Astragals are also known as knucklebones. As their colloquial name suggests, knucklebones are literal bones taken from the back ankle of a sheep, goat, deer, horse or other large, hooved mammal. They have been used as four-sided dice since at least 500 B.C. by numerous civilizations, including Indigenous Americans, ancient Greeks and ancient Egyptians. In ancient Rome, each of the four sides were given a name corresponding to its shape: the belly, the hole, the ear and the vulture.

Tossing knucklebones is not a truly random process. Two of the sides (belly and the hole) are much broader than the other two and are therefore more likely to come up.

“Dice changed over time from natural

objects, such as shells and sticks or astragals, to manufactured objects,” said Anne-Elizabeth Dunn-Vaturi, a researcher in the Department of Ancient Near Eastern Art at the Metropolitan Museum of Art. “Knucklebones were used by ancient Egyptians and they used astragalus bones to play a game called senet. These bones had four long sides on which it could land when cast, with the numerical value assigned to the side facing up. Cubic dice have been in use in the Near East since the third millennium B.C.”

Scholars aren't quite sure what prompted people to use a six-sided shape, but they speculate that is probably had something to do with adding randomness. Early cubic dice were made from clay or bone, later models were sculpted from marble, metal

or even amber.

When asked about quantum mechanics, Albert Einstein famously quipped that "God does not play dice with the universe." But it seems that the ancient Greeks and Romans would have taken issue with Einstein's proclamation. They believed that it was possible to divine the gods' will with the roll of the dice.

It was not until the 16th century that dice games were subjected to mathematical analysis (by Italians Girolamo Cardano and Galileo, among others) and the concepts of randomness and probability were conceived. Until then, the prevalent attitude had been that dice and similar objects fell the way they did because of the indirect action of gods or supernatural forces.

In the 18th century, Britons played a dice game that they taught to the French. The French modified the name "crab," (which stood for a pair of ones) into "craps," which is played in casinos today. As adventurers came to the New World, so did dice. Seafarers played on the docks and onboard ships to while away the time.

By the 19th century, poker dice made their appearance. Each side of a die bore a likeness to a face on a playing card. By the early 20th century, the Ace, King, Queen and Jack were replaced with 'pips' or dots.

As the 20th century progressed, board games using dice became popular. Monopoly, Chutes and Ladders, Yahtzee and many others made their way into American homes, and dice were simply made of colorful plastic.

There are 13,000 members of the online Dice Maniacs' Club. Longtime member Ron Powell of Edenburg, Pa., advises people to collect a specific kind of die rather than encompass the broad spectrum that this hobby has to offer.

"I tell people that dice with markings set into their faces are more collectible than those with markings printed or

transferred onto the surface because of the probability of wear," Powell said. "I also advise going for dice that are made from materials other than plastic. But most of all collectors should read up on all the different types of dice and learn how to categorize and identify them. Learn as much as you can about the dice you collect, the history, dates, materials, manufacturer and more. There is such a vast range of different dice around that one will never have a complete collection."

Powell says some dice can fall into the high-end collectible category. Many are very rare indeed. They can be quite pricey. A pair of Playboy dice made by Tiffany & Co. can coax \$200 from the buyer. Tim Burton's "The Nightmare Before Christmas" dice will run \$1,500 or more. Advertising premiums include dice from soft drink companies like Pepsi and Coca-Cola, food companies like Hershey, and even Harley Davidson motorcycles. Even sports fans participate in dice collecting. Sports dice can feature the college or professional team name, logo or mascot.

"Polyhedral (multi-faceted) dice fall into the novelty category," Powell says. "These interesting shapes are used in role-playing games and determine the fate of the gamer, but they don't command high prices. They've become quite common, but there are many collectors of these out there."

Powell narrows his personal searches to souvenir, novelty and promotional dice. Souvenir dice, he says, often have a location on them and can be found in places with a tourist presence.

Powell says many members in his club collect dice-related items, such as throwing cups, chuck cages, dice throwing trays, bowls, drawstring bags and storage boxes.

Lincoln flag will have bidders 'wide awake' at Schultz auction

CLARENCE, N.Y. – No matter what you collect, you will find something to catch your eye at Schultz's three-day auction conducted on April 18-20.

"We like to have a wide assortment of items mixed into the sale," said Auctioneer Ben Schultz. "That way there should be something for everyone at auction."

Historians, sports collectors, car enthusiasts, numismatic aficionados, vintage Bakelite radio collectors, early musical instrument lovers and, of course, the discerning antique collector should be pleased at the plethora of items represented in the 1,600-lot sale.

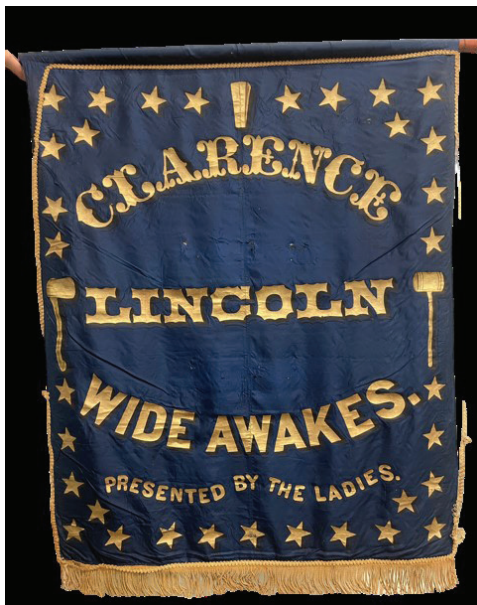
One of the stars of the sale is expected to be the 1860 Lincoln Presidential campaign banner, recently deaccessioned from the Clarence Historical Society. "These banners are extremely rare," Schultz said, "and this one you can consider one-of-a-kind, in that it was specifically created for our town of Clarence."

The flag reads, "Clarence Lincoln Wide Awakes presented by the ladies."

"The structured militant Wide Awakes appealed to a generation which had been profoundly shaken by the partisan instability in the 1850s, and offered young northerners a much-needed political identity," according to author Jon Grinspan in "Young Men for War: The Wide Awakes and Lincoln's 1860 Presidential Campaign," which appeared in the Journal of American History.

The Clarence banner was seemingly presented by the town's ladies to the patriotic men of the era who were advocating the preservation of the Union.

Another flag also finds itself as one of the stars of the auction. Only 39 days after New Mexico became a state on Jan. 6, 1912, Arizona joined the Union on Feb. 14, 1912. Officially, the govern-

ment – adhering to the Flag Act of 1813 – decided the official flag would immediately switch from 46 stars to 48 stars on July 4.

But New Mexicans wanted a flag of their own and flag manufacturers were only too happy to accommodate the New Mexicans and fashioned their own 47-star flags for the market.

Although unofficial, the 47-star flag has become a sought-after flag, in addition to a frequent trivial question. The flag is expected to sell for a conservative \$2,000-\$3,000, although Schultz believes it could sell for many times that

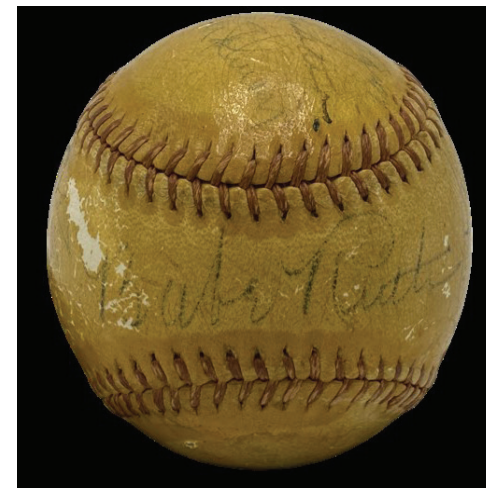
amount. "It's nearly priceless," he says, "as a quirk of history."

Another grand-standing item coming up on the second day of the sale is the baseball signed by the giants of the game during a World War II war bond raising event. Signers include Ruth, Cobb, Johnson, Connie Mack and George Sisler, four of the five members of the inaugural opening of the Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown in 1939. Mack, who did not enter the Cooperstown shrine until shortly afterwards was a legendary player, manager and owner who still holds Major League Baseball records after nearly 50 years in baseball between 1901 and 1950.

"We've already had a lot of interest in this auction," Schultz said. "When you have good inventory and a wide range of items, it always brings a lot of people out of the woodwork. There's just so much good stuff in this auction that there's not enough paper to write about it."

Superman and Spider-Man model kits were super strong at \$54,516

YORK, Pa. – Hake’s highlight-packed March 19-20 auction of pop-culture rarities closed the books at \$2.5 million and sent a resounding signal about the strength of the current market for high-grade, market-fresh memorabilia. The abundance of record-setting and estimate-defying prices attested to the growing demand for superhero toys of the 1960s and elusive figures from the Star Wars galaxy.

Like-new model kits with provenance from the renowned Janusey Brothers collection ran the table, commanding prices that were nothing short of astonishing. A boxed and factory-sealed Aurora model kit duo consisting of Superman (second version) kit No. 462-100 and Marvel Comics Group Spider-Man kit No. 477-100 topped the two-day event. Sixty years ago, the kits would have retailed for \$1 apiece, but combined in a promotional package for WT Grant variety stores, they were factory-labeled with the pennywise price of \$1.58. The superhero combo teamed up to achieve \$54,516 against a pre-sale estimate of \$2,000-\$5,000.

A “monstrous” price was paid for another boxed and unused Aurora model kit with Janusey Brothers provenance. Copyrighted in 1966, “Godzilla’s Go Kart” was produced in low numbers and distributed to a mere handful of stores near Aurora’s Long Island (NY) headquarters, making it a very rare item from the get-go. The auction entry – the only boxed example Hake’s has handled in its 57 years of operation – raced across the finish line to a world-record \$36,344 against an estimate of \$10,000-\$20,000.

Star Wars fans were in the fight for a 1984 Palitoy Star Wars: Return of the Jedi Tri-Logo 70 Back-B blister card containing a 3.75-inch action figure of General Madine. One of the rarest of all production Star Wars figures, its packaging includes text in four languages: English, Spanish, French and Italian. The first of its type to be offered by Hake’s in any condition, it sold for record-setting \$42,242 against an estimate of \$10,000-\$20,000.

There was also intense interest in a 1978 Kenner Star Wars early bird mail-away kit, the trailblazing mini-collection that marked the beginning of action-figure production for the storied franchise. The kit includes a sealed baggie containing figures of R2-D2, Chewbacca, Princess Leia, and Luke Skywalker with a Double-Telescoping Saber. AFA-graded 85 NM+, it clinched a world-record price of \$25,960.

In addition to action figures, Hake’s sale featured coveted pre-production one-offs, such as Kenner’s mock-up concept proof card for the 1982 Star Wars: Revenge Of The Jedi (later renamed Star Wars: Return Of The Jedi) toyline. It is a completely unique piece that was made by repurposing an Empire Strikes Back Bospin Security Guard 45 back blister card and adding a completely hand-done mixed-media design

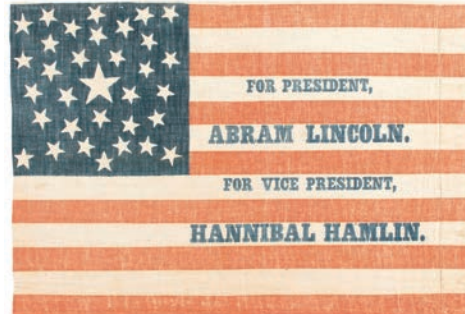

and logo. It sold above its high estimate for \$22,066.

From the Disney empire came an extremely rare Mego Series 2 The Black Hole blister card with a 3.5-inch action figure of “Humanoid.” Made in Hong Kong, the toy was shipped exclusively to Canadian and Italian retailers. The auction example was exported to Canada, hence its bilingual card with text in English and French. It sold for \$11,033 against an estimate of \$2,000-\$5,000.

Another highflier was the 1986 AFA NM Mattel Masters of the Universe Eternia Series 5 playset, the highest-graded of all known examples of this particular playset. With imaginative art by William George, the set includes three themed towers and three different battery-operated vehicles that run on its monorail system. It easily surpassed its high estimate to settle at \$23,273.

Weeks before the auction, a quiet buzz started to build in sports circles about a 1910 Baltimore News baseball card depicting Orioles manager Jack Dunn (1872-1928). Hake’s experts could find no evidence of any other card like it, deeming it to be the

only extant example. CGC-graded 1 Poor, it rounded the bases to slide home at \$28,556 against an estimate of \$10,000-\$20,000.

Original comic book art also held strong. Dick Giordano’s (1932-2010) original pen-and-ink comic book cover art for DC Comics’ Batman #315 (Sept. 1979) was one of the category’s most notable works. It features the Caped Crusader airborne above Gotham with his Bat-Glider, ready to battle Kite-Man. The closing price was \$14,278 against an estimate of \$5,000-\$10,000. Also, Gary Frank’s original comic book cover art (with inks by Brad Anderson) for DC Comics’ Superman: Secret Origin #6, Oct. 2020, appealingly depicts a modern-era Superman with Jimmie Olsen and Lois Lane. Metallo is seen in the background, subdued by chains. The artwork rose to \$13,240.

Duncan Eagleson was commissioned to create the 1983 original art for a pre-release one-sheet movie poster promoting the slasher classic A Nightmare on Elm Street. His original acrylic and airbrush artwork, artist-initialed and dated ‘83, is an absolutely unique depiction with three overhead blades as opposed to four, as seen in subsequent iterations by other noted artists. Eagleson’s original sold for \$15,340.

Perhaps buoyed by the fact that 2024 is a presidential election year, early campaign collectibles were hot sellers. An 1860 glazed cotton parade flag emblazoned For President Abram Lincoln For Vice President Hannibal Hamlin is considered a classic design. In excellent the beguiling banner was

chased to \$42,185.

A Theodore Roosevelt/Charles E. Hughes/William H. Taft ‘Security Harmony Justice’ 1916 campaign button with images of all three men came to auction with a historical footnote in tow. Along with any others like it that may have been produced, the button was supposed to be distributed at an Oct. 3, 1916 event in Hughes’ honor, but it was vehemently rejected by Roosevelt, who did not approve of Taft’s image being included. The button’s extremely fine condition makes it the nicer of two known survivors of its type. It sold for \$25,960.

Provenance from the John Grossman collection speaks volumes and no doubt added a golden touch to a complete 1932 U.S. Caramel set of 30 portrait/bio cards depicting American Presidents and retaining its “American Heroes Caramel” wax-paper wrapper. The set easily claimed victory at \$12,338.

Collectors of vintage concert signage said, “Please, please, please” when a window poster promoting James Brown and the Famous Flames’ March 8, 1962 appearance at WC Taylor High School in Warrenton, Va., came up for bid. Its exciting graphics feature “Mr Dynamite” against a DayGlo orange background, together with several opening acts in a yellow vignette. The only example of its type known to Hake’s experts, it landed “on the good foot” at \$8,697.

Celestial Maps

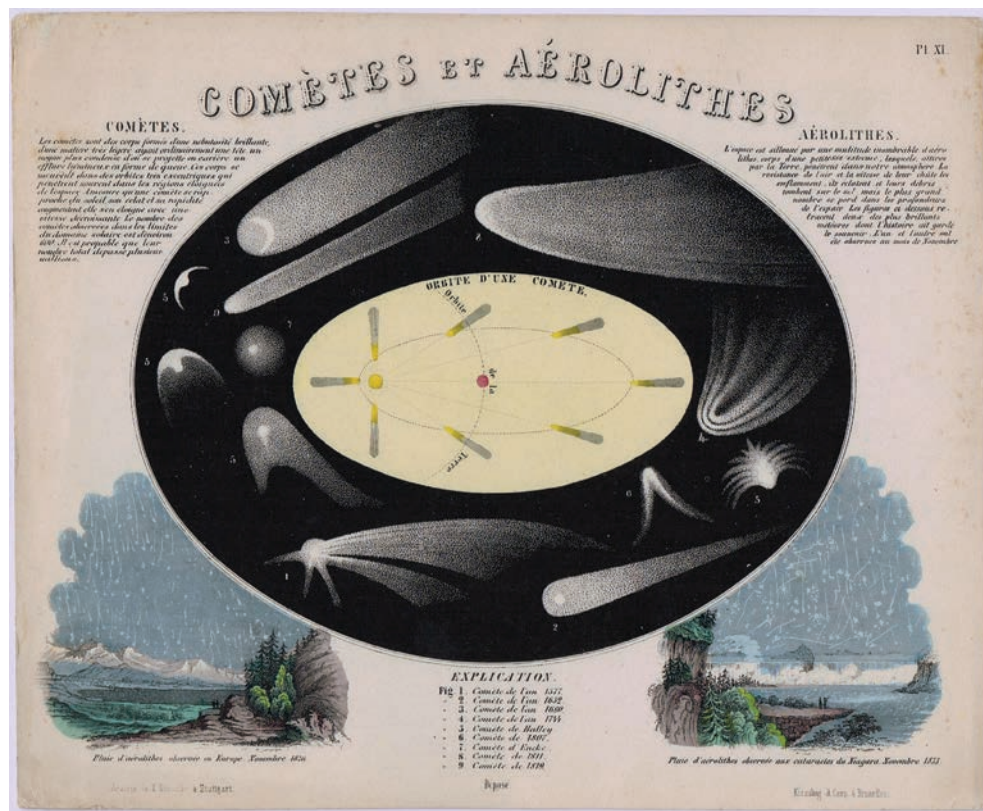
make; it was replaced with wood-based paper. "All were durable," Zaremba commented.

"Every atlas in the 19th century had star maps," he continued, usually with four celestial maps, but other times six, with the addition of two polar views. Originally bound and then distributed within the covers of an atlas, many of the maps found today have been extracted from those atlases and sold individually, thereby making celestial maps an affordable collectible.

Sizes vary among antique celestial maps. Zaremba described a 17th-century set by French cartographer Alain Manesson Mallet, noting its "small format, approximately five by seven inches, like a large postcard." Making these prints particularly fascinating is the manner in which they were illustrated: Farm and village scenes feature rustic people who appear to be looking up at the pictured sky. These maps are reasonably priced between \$75 and \$150, he said.

Of course, some celestial maps were clearly made not to be included in atlases, but as "stand alone" examples. Zaremba cited a French wall map, picturing hemispheres and constellations and measuring 4 by 5 feet, as one such oversized example.

And then there are maps with an unusual twist. One example of an interesting niche category is "hold to lights." As their name implies, when the map is held up to the light, specific heavenly bodies are revealed, thanks to strategically placed punched holes in the map surface. Against a black or midnight blue background the white (or gold or yellow) stars appear. The effect,

according to Zaremba, is similar to that of a stained glass window. "It's as if you're looking at the stars."

Determining the date of a celestial map can be a bit tricky. Unlike terrestrial maps, celestial maps were not subject to constant updates. As such, the same maps might be used from year to year, and often passed on from one publishing company to another. The best estimate of age might come from identifying the publication date of the atlas from which the map was taken.

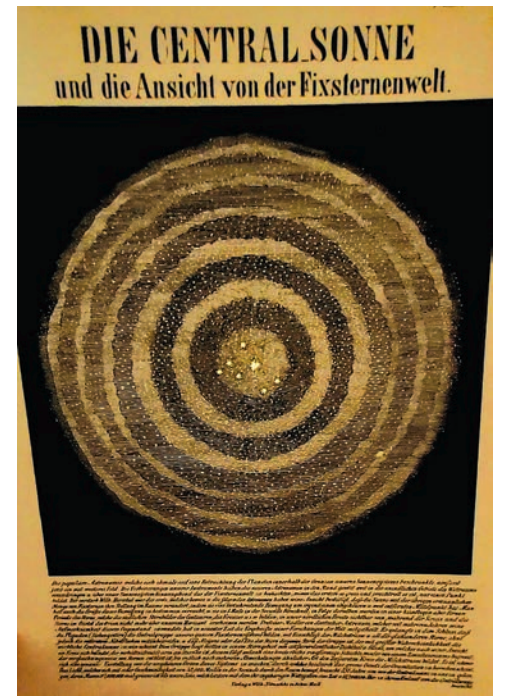
Zaremba noted that the sheer beauty of a celestial map is often enough to warrant the purchase of one. "Some people are just interested in the image,"

he said, "only looking to these maps for decorative purposes." He continued, "There are loads of reproductions" and, when under glass and framed, "you can't even tell the difference."

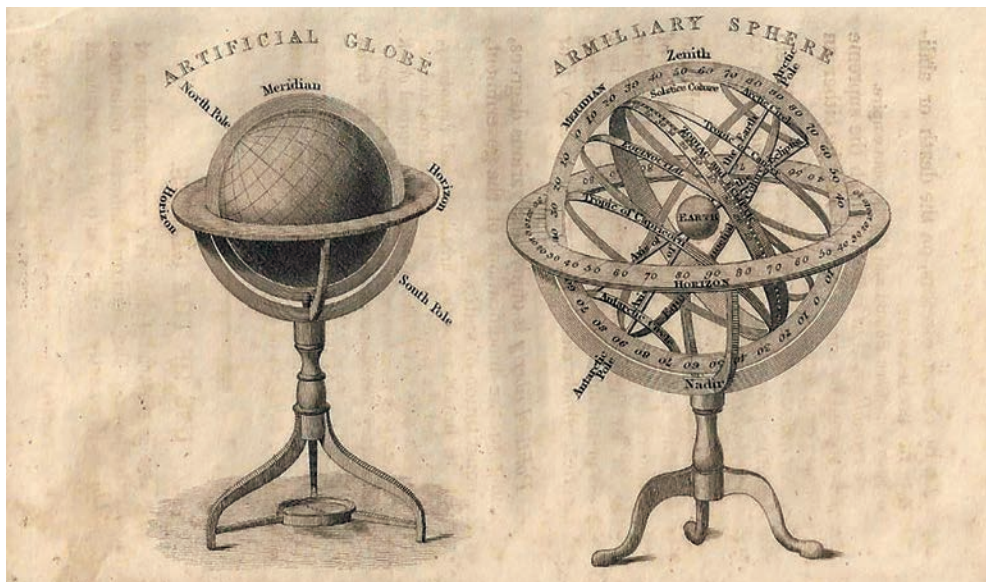
But then there are what he estimates to be the "40 percent (of his customers) who only want originals." An antique map collection can be started with for as little as \$100, although serious collectors often seek those produced by Johann Gabriel Doppelmayr, a German mathematician and cartographer, and Johann Homann, the most prominent and prolific map publisher of the 18th century. Prices for these 18th-century treasures can go "as high as \$2,000 to \$5,000," but Zaremba said that a collector might purchase one for less ("\$1,000 might be a realistic amount").

Using modern technology, computer-generated celestial maps are now being produced, ones that can capture the night sky on a specific day and at a certain time and place. But by collecting antique maps, enthusiasts enjoy the blending of scientific observation with the appreciation of a piece of art. And for that reason, nothing can compare to an antique celestial map for that starry-eyed feeling.

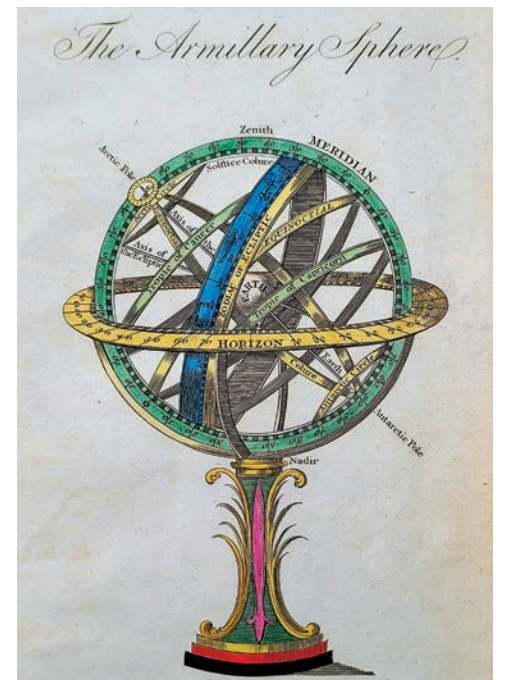

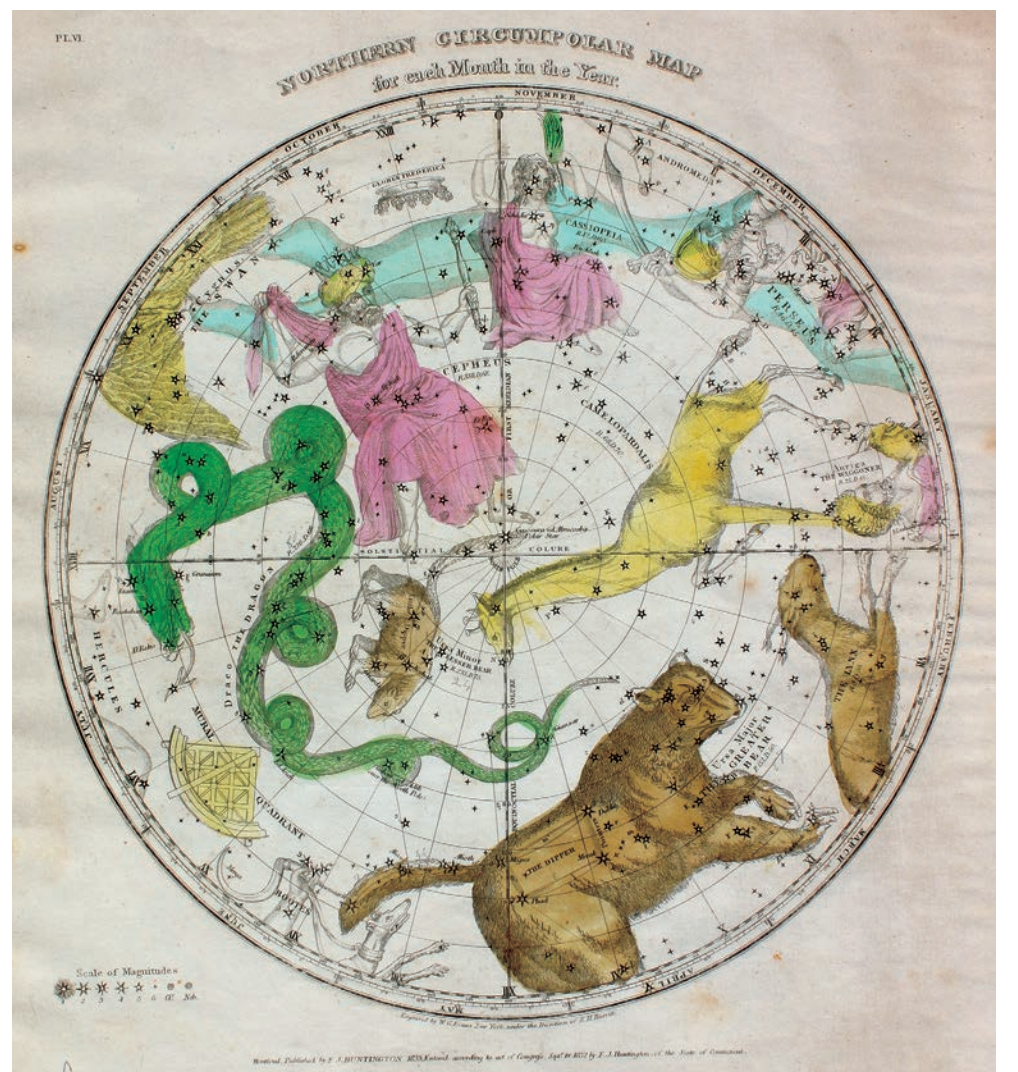
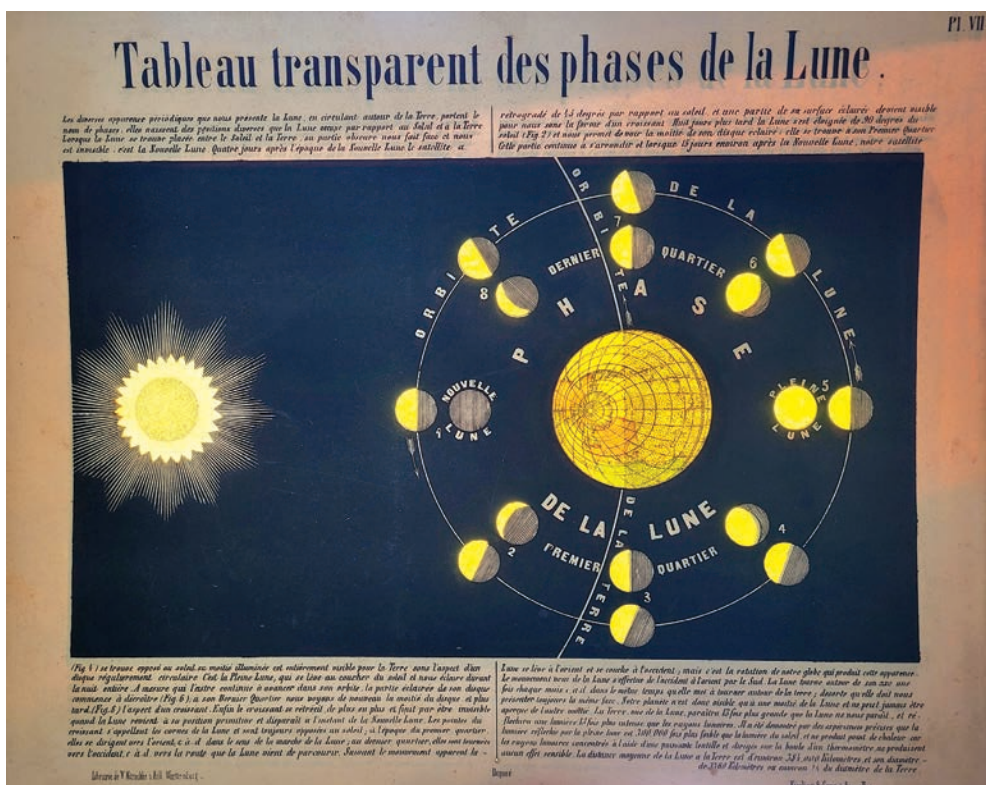


Above: This 1829 antique print, taken from a book by Rev. J. Goldsmith, pictures images of a globe and an armillary sphere.
