# Collecting stock certificates pays unique dividends

In 1868, German immigrant John George Brill started a horsecar manufacturing firm in Philadelphia known as J. G. Brill Company. Most people probably wouldn't recognize the name today, but it was once the largest manufacturer of streetcars in the country. From its founding until World War II, Brill built 30,000 trolleys, trains, and buses, sold both domestically and abroad. During its heyday, scores of investors instructed their stockbrokers to buy shares in the company.

Unfortunately, the company never fully made the transition to rubberwheeled vehicles, and by 1954 had closed its doors. Aside from a few surviving Brill vehicles, not much remains of the company — except for an interesting group of artifacts, the firm's stock certificates. The ornate pieces of paper were provided to shareholders to document their investment. Surviving stock and bond certificates from companies like Brill and thousands of others offer a fascinating glimpse into commercial history. They are plentiful and often cheap, with entree for collectors as low as \$1.

Just like today, when companies like Brill needed to raise money, they often turned to private investors. Companies had two fundamental offerings at their disposal. For investors interested in partial ownership, firms could issue shares of stock. Shareholders would receive portions of the profits, known as dividends. Their stock value could rise with the fortunes of the company. More conservative investors could loan money by purchasing corporate bonds, which paid regular interest.

For both stock and bonds, companies issued paper certificates documenting


the investment. The certificates were valid financial instruments until the security was either sold, redeemed, or the obligations fulfilled. If a company was successful, investors often cashed out and took their profits on appreciated stock value. Their shares were canceled, indicated in some fashion on the certificate. Bondholders were usually content to keep receiving scheduled interest payments. Their certificates contained "coupons" that could be removed and redeemed at a bank for payment.

If a firm was acquired or merged with another company, existing securities would be bought back or exchanged, and

the existing certificates invalidated. Unfortunately, many enterprises ultimately failed, rendering securities claims worthless. That included a sordid history of fraudulent companies that duped the public with worthless investments.

Whether it's a redeemed or canceled certificate, or one from a company no longer around, old securities certificates are fundamentally — to be cliche - not worth the paper they're printed on. That is, except for collectors who appreciate certificates for their historical value. Enthusiasts worldwide are drawn to the



# Haunted Mansion picture soars to \$90,000 at Heritage Disney Auction

DALLAS — In early April, Heritage Auctions presented its first signature auction of 2024. "The Art of Disneyland" featured artwork, attraction artifacts, costumes, documents, signs, and posters spanning more than 70 years of Disney Park history. 1,855 lots were offered, representing Heritage's largest Disney theme park auction to date.

Heritage proclaimed it as, "an unparalleled collection of original artwork and memorabilia," from Disney's golden age, showcasing the work of "core animators of the 1930s through the '80s." Spotlighted was original artwork from the archives of Disney Legends Marc and Alice Davis. Marc Davis (1913-2000) started his Disney career on the original Snow White and went on to animate beloved characters like Tinkerbell and Cruella de Vil. Alice Davis (1929-2022) developed costumes for attractions as noteworthy as Pirates of the Caribbean and the 1964-65 It's a Small World.


Also offered were items from the archives of theme park designer David Bradley (1911-1988) and artist Bruce Bushman (1911-1972) who contributed to iconic works like 20,000 Leagues Under the Sea and The Mickey Mouse Club. Their design firm Bradley/Bushman helped develop attractions including the Disneyland Skyway and original carousel.

Also noteworthy were park artifacts





# Parlor lamps became known by famous movie name

Gone with the Wind oil lamps (also known as chamber lamps, hurricane lamps, or parlor lamps) were immensely popular in the late Victorian Era, roughly 1890 – 1910. These lamps were widely produced by a variety of glass companies.

The name "Gone with the Wind" attached to these parlor lamps following the release of the movie "Gone With the Wind," starring Clark Gable and Vivien Leigh, in 1939. Depending on which lamp historian you ask, parlor lamps became Gone with the Wind lamps when these lamps were used on the movie's set, inspiring a new generation of collectors. However, many historians will tell you that this is nothing more than a myth. Lamps such as these were never used in the movie-not even in one scene. Still, dealers today advertise these lamps as Gone with the Wind lamps even though the movie was released over 40 years after these parlor lamps lost their apLeft: This beautiful Gone with the Wind lamp, circa 1880s, features a hand-painted floral design, and the lamp has been electrified. painting stretched from top to bottom to reveal a trio of gentlemen trapped in quicksand. It was rated in very good condition with only minor surface and frame wear.

Another Davis piece, entitled "Four Artists Paint One Tree," grabbed the second-place bid of \$84,000. The 17 by 22 inch watercolor originated from the 1958 Disneyland television show, "An Adventure in Art" and was formerly displayed in the Davis home.

Other Disney Legends' artwork included several pieces by Mary Blair (1911-1978). Her concept painting "It's a Small World" circa 1964 sold for \$44,400. The 20 by 14 inch uache-on-board work was in very good condition, showing only minor handling wear. From Eyvind Earle (1916-2000), came a concept painting from Sleeping Beauty. The piece, "Now, Sword of Truth, fly swift and sure, that evil die, and good endure!" depicted the climactic battle between Prince Phillip and Maleficent turned dragon. Selling for \$17,400, the 28 by 9.5 inch signed gouache on board painting showed only minor wear.

Bidding hit \$8,131,20 for a Skyway concept brownline from the Bradley/Bushman archives. The rough design for the Disneyland Skyway by Bruce Bush-


man measured 13 by 9 inches on larger paper and was in very good condition. A similarly impressive Bushman concept drawing of the original Disneyland carousel was grabbed for \$1,860. It featured the carousel with a castle in the center and a twilight sky filled with trumpeting angels. The good-condition ink rendering filled a 21 by 25 inch sheet of vellum.

Most of the animatronic pieces pulled five figures. They included a good-condition, functioning bird from the Enchanted Tiki Room that landed \$60,000. The 26inch-tall fur and feathered bird sat atop a custom-built display and was equipped to sing and operate by connecting a compressor.

An animatronic display of two deep sea divers carrying a treasure chest reached \$18,000. The figure, originally visible from the Submarine Voyage at the 20,000 Leagues Under the Sea attraction, was historically important because it was the final attraction that Walt Disney personally supervised during construction. The 45 by 47 inch feature was housed in a custom-built museum-quality display and was in good condition with expected wear from underwater use. It came with a certificate of authenticity, a framed photo of Walt Disney enjoying the former Disneyland attraction, and a signed photo and letter from Imagineer Bob Gurr, who helped design the original submarines.

Two spotlighted animatronics sold solidly, but for less than one might expect. An Audio-Animatronic A-100 mechanical frame (circa 1980s-2000s), the first of its type to come to market, reached \$10,800. The steel and aluminum frames undergirded characters in attractions like Pirates of the Caribbean and the Hall of Presidents

gallery at the Fiesta Fun Center at the Disney World Contemporary Resort. The good-condition piece featured gags like a chattering skull, mermaid in a bottle, and screeching cat. The complete gallery was originally purchased in 1977 for the Santa Cruz boardwalk for \$139,000.

Static props attracted nearly as much attention as the animatronics. A parkused Pirates of the Caribbean pirate skull (circa 1990s) took \$40,800. The good-condition piece, displayed on a custom-made velvet-clad platform, bore a plaque reading, "Pirate Skull - Pirates of the Caribbean - Disneyland USA."

From the Disneyland Jungle Cruise came a Trader Sam's spear (circa 2000s) that struck a \$4,560 bid.

As with previous Art of Disney auctions, original silk-screened park posters sold handsomely. Among them was a rare "Enchanted Tiki Room, Presented by United Airlines" attraction poster that garnered \$18,600. The circa 1960s/70s posters were once displayed near the Disneyland entrance. In good vintage condition, it had been rolled for preservation and showed only exhibition-related wear. A good-condition Haunted Mansion attraction entrance poster, featuring artwork by Ken Chapman and Marc Davis, went for \$18,000.

Plenty sold to bidders with smaller budgets. A modest \$264 won a 12.5 by 39

inch framed and signed serigraph by Phil Dike (1906-1990). Dike worked alongside Marc Davis on productions such as Fantasia and Snow White. A group of 10 plot plans and blueprints for the Disneyland Hotel, Marina Tower, and Marriott Hall (circa 1970s-80s) sold for \$154. One bidder picked up a park-used Walt Disney World Contemporary Resort acrylic elevator directory sign (circa 1994) for just \$41.

these lamps were not called Gone with the Wind lamps until after 1939) appeared in the late 1800s with blown glass shades and, predominantly, brass parts and scrollwork. Many collectors search for lamps with decorative appeal, such as lamps with tassels or hanging prisms. Parlor lamps were typically produced in all types of glass, including milk glass, cut glass, etched glass, and colored glass.

These lamps were made to burn kerosene, so the bottom globe of the lamp served as a fuel reservoir, which is called a font. Many original parlor lamps have been electrified, which eliminates the need for kerosene or lamp oil and the smell attached to the kerosene. However, any lamp that does not have a fuel reservoir is not an authentic parlor lamp.

As with all antiques, values for parlor lamps depend on a variety of factors, including globe color, overall condition of the lamp, age of the lamp, has the lamp been altered or electrified, manufacturer, and rarity of the lamp.

Authentic parlor lamps from the

> 1800s with original wick and burning components are sought after collectibles, so these lamps, in general, have the highest values for parlor lamps, often running in the thousands of dol-

Decorators often use parlor lamps to stage a home with a late-Victorian look. If a collector's goal for purchasing a Gone with the Wind lamp is decorating more than it is investment, then the collector should make a serious assessment of his or her reason for buying a parlor lamp. What is your intended use of the lamp? Where in your home will the lamp be displayed? If the lamp is electrified, will it take the place of a modern table lamp in

your home? Deter- mining the size, function, and color of your Gone with the Wind parlor lamp will greatly aid you on your scavenger hunt through estate sales, flea markets, and auction houses.



nine graduated pear brilliant cut diamonds (21.17 cttw).

Lots #5 and 6 are vibrant, colorful paintings by Robert Moskowitz (American, 1935-2024). Both are untitled, oil on canvas, signed lower left, with pre-sale estimates of 1,000-2,000. One has a frame size of 19 ½ inches by 16 ½ inches, the other 16 ½ inches by 15  $^{3}$ 4 inches. Moskowitz worked at the intersection of Abstract Expressionism, Minimalism and Pop Art.

The unusual folk art polychrome carved box found in a Chappaqua, New York home is from the late 19th or early 20th century. It's heavily carved with Incan devices and faces in relief, painted in green over yellow with silver highlights. It measures 6 1/2 inches long by  $4\frac{1}{2}$  inches wide (est. \$200-\$400).

A dazzling ladies' Panthere de Cartier 18k gold wristwatch features a white dial with Roman numerals, a stylized rectangular border and a sapphire crown, on a matching 18k gold five-row maillon panthere link bracelet with quartz movement. The case and bracelet are signed "Cartier" and impressed with Swiss hallmarks. Total weight: 67.8 grams (est. \$2,000-\$4,000).

A bronze sculpture on a conforming plinth, signed "L. Gregoire", for Jean-Louis Gregoire (French, 1840-1890), titled Flute players, 24 inches tall by 19 inches wide, should find a new home for \$2,000-\$3,000. Gregoire was known for allegorical figure sculpture and mythology.

An oil on board by Samuel Henry Gordon Alken (British, 1810-1894), titled Winter, depicts riders in a carriage in a snowy landscape before a sunset. One of two Alken paintings on offer, the work is signed lower left and housed in a frame of 38 inches by 26 ¼ inches. The painting is expected to realize \$1,000-\$2,000. Alken specialized in painting animals, especially horses, for which he was known.

A monumental Curtis Jere style bird sculpture made from welded rod and brushed metal, 79 inches tall by 22 1/2 inches wide (overall 103 inches tall, including stand) carries an estimate of \$1,000-\$2,000. The bird has been fashioned with a welded rod fitting into a pipe form stand, allowing it to swivel around its axis. The sculpture shows a welded, stylized signature "J".

An antique natural pearl and diamond demi-parure (matching set of jewelry), comprising a shield-form brooch with open scrollwork mounting six baroque pearls and melee diamonds set in 18k gold (marked) and suspending one bead cultured pearl, plus a pair of matching fleur-de-lis earrings suspending large (12mm) pearls, with GIA report, should fetch \$1,000-\$2,000.

A Chippendale carved partners desk having an inset red leather top with gilt tooling above two reeded drawers on balland-claw feet, 60 inches long by 38 inches wide, is expected to finish at \$1,000-\$2,000. Also, a gorgeous antique Moroccan rug, pulled from a waterfront Greenwich, Connecticut estate and purchased in London in 1988 for £3,250, should make \$500-\$1,000.

An H. Desprez / Sevres painted porcelain plaque, 14 inches in diameter and featuring an Orientalist scene of figures on horseback mounted within a gallery glass-top occasional table, signed lower left and in very good condition, is estimated to change hands for \$1,000-\$2,000.

A xylograph by Jean (Hans) Arp (French/ German/Swiss, 1886-1966), carries an estimate of \$500-\$1,000. Arp was known for abstract sculpture, installation and painting. Also, two Saint-Louis millefiori (glass of mosaic appearance) blown glass fruit basket paperweights, one with a twisted handle, the other suspended in a clear crystal orb, should each sell for \$200-\$400.

A gouache and mixed media on paper by the American-Russian artist Constantin Westchiloff (1877-1945), depicting Bear Mountain near New York's Hudson River, has an estimate of \$700-\$900. The work is signed lower left and housed in a 15 ½ inch

by 13 inch frame. The artist is probably best-known for his seascapes (particularly of the New England coastline).

A Chinese spinach jade covered cup (or bowl) with a conforming lid, pulled from the estate of Vincent Fulgenzi, the artist, playwright and former proprietor of The Red Carpet Antiques in Chappaqua, New York, should achieve \$200-\$300. The cup / bowl is 3 ¾ inches in diameter.



# **Stock Certificates**


company stories, historical context, and inherent beauty of these obsolete financial instruments.

The hobby of stock and bond collecting is known as scripophily. The name was coined by a British lawyer who combined the English word "scrip" which refers to an alternative to legal tender with the Greek word "philos" which means to love. Stock and bond collectors are known as scripophilists or scripophiles. The hobby started getting traction in the 1970s after two German bankers published catalogs on collectible Chinese and Russian bonds. Today, depending on whose estimates you use, there are upwards of 40,000 scripophily collectors.

Because stock and bond certificates are financial instruments, scripophily is often regarded as an offshoot of the numismatics, or currency collecting hobby. Others, however, consider scripophily part of the ephemera collecting hobby, since certificates are ultimately collectible pieces of paper.

The distinctions are important considering the design energies that went into the documents. During the 19th and early 20th centuries, stock and bond certificates were usually a bit large (often 7 ¾ by 11 inches) and printed on good-quality paper, intended to make an impression. They were often lavishly illustrated, using the better printing technologies of the day. Depending on age, anything from Art Nouveau to modernist elements might be evident. Many certificates reflected the issuer's industry through vignettes of factories, hotels, ships, or trains.

During the later 20th century, certificates became smaller, less ornate, and were printed on cheaper paper. With electronic trading, the need for paper certificates waned. Starting in

the 1980s, paper certificates were eliminated entirely — a process known as dematerialization — in favor of entries in a computer.

Scripophilists are often drawn to particular types of certificates. In many cases, it's to a specific industry. Favored categories include transportation stocks from railroads, steamship lines, and automakers. Certificates for mining and oil companies are also popular, as are those from household names like Coca-Cola or J.C. Penny.

Other collectors have geographic interests, like seeking pieces from companies tied to the Wild West or a particular country. Many are drawn to artistic factors like vignettes or eraspecific design, while others seek examples with signatures of famous executives like John D. Rockefeller or Thomas Edison.

Certificates can vary tremendously in price. A run-of-the-mill New York

Central Railroad certificate might sell for less than \$10, while an example signed by Cornelius Vanderbilt can easily top \$3,000. The factors affecting value include:

Age - The historical era of the certificate is generally more important to collectors than the absolute year unless a milestone like the year the company opened is represented.

Artwork - This is a favorite element for many collectors, but not necessarily a determinant of overall value.

Cancellation - When shares were sold or otherwise redeemed, some form of cancelation would appear on the certificate. It could involve written notes or holes being punched in the paper. There is debate among collectors as to the effect cancellation has on value.

Company history - Collectors view certificates through the lens of the company, its industry, and the era. Thus, history and context are among the biggest drivers of value. A certificate from a fraudulent Florida land company, for example, is much more alluring than one from a municipal water company. Likewise, examples from well-known companies, especially from early in their history, spark natural appeal.

Condition - This is an important concern. Tears, water stains, and other serious damage significantly reduce the value of all but the rarest pieces. Mailing-related folds are considered common but random folds have a negative impact. Grading systems for scripophily parallel those employed for other paper collectibles, (ex. ranging from "poor" with heavy signs of wear, to "very fine" with only slight signs of wear).

Rarity - This considers how many shares were available as well as how many survive. It is an important factor for serious collectors. Some place significance on owning certificates with low numbers in the overall issuance of shares or early in a company's history.

Signatures - Already noted, are a big component of value, particularly on the high end. If the certificate bears the signature of an important executive like Henry Ford, it will likely command a good price. An actual hand-signed autograph is worth more than an imprinted signature.

Some additional factors include whether the stock was issued to anyone (or anyone noteworthy). Bonds with remaining interest payment coupons are considered more valuable than empty certificates.

It's also worth mentioning that, while old securities certificates are theoretically worthless, there are some for existing companies that may still be valid and have investor value. There are collectors who, like treasure hunters, seek out uncancelled certificates from surviving companies, hoping for a windfall. Another population is starting to treat Scripophily as an alternative investment as significant as collectible art.

Whether you are a hobbyist or a serious investor, securities certificates as with any paper collectible - must be stored properly to ensure their preservation. Matting and framing is a great way to display your favorites, but if they are valuable pieces, have them conservation mounted. For larger collections, storing certificates in albums using archival-quality sleeves is the most efficient approach.

Reproductions and counterfeits do exist, particularly of rare and autographed certificates that command high prices. Thus, it's best to vet the seller before spending a lot of money on a supposedly exceptional piece.

If you are interested in learning about this fascinating hobby, there are lots of resources. The International Bond and Share Society (scripophily.org) has a wealth of information, including two archived decades of their magazine.

Two good books are, The Art of the Market: Two Centuries of American Business as Seen Through Its Stock Certificates by Richard Drezen; and, Scripophily: Collecting Bonds and Stock Certificates by Keith Hollendar.




