Collector finds Casper to be the friendliest of collectibles

Wise-cracking Bugs Bunny. Tom and Jerry duking it out. And Popeye and Bluto, vying for the affection of Olive Oyl. The cartoons that rounded out movie bills in the 1940s were often marked by violence and discord. . . all in fun, of course. But in the midst of all of these shenangians, there was one loveable little character who just wanted to make friends. Trouble was, he was a ghost.

Now, thanks to one dedicated fan and collector, Casper has his own category in the Guinness World Records. And, as Vanessa Irino put it, she and the Friendly Ghost are, in a sense, immortal.

Casper's first appearance in the earthly world dates back to 1939, when Seymour Reit collaborated with illustrator Joe Oriolo. Although their resulting children's book was a failure, the character was not yet dead. Six years later, in 1945, Casper made his debut in "The Friendly Ghost," a "Noveltoon" by the (later Famous Studios

Paramount Cartoon Studios). When first viewed on the big screen, Casper had a sheet for a body and a snub nose. From the start, he was often shunned because

he was a ghost.

Casper's universal appeal led to his first appearance in a comic book in 1949. With the advent of television, new audiences came to love Casper. And keeping up with the times, his fan base continued to grow, thanks to cable television and VHS tapes.

physical Meanwhile, Casper's appearance continued to evolve. In the 1950s, he "grew" fingers, arms, and legs. He traded in his knit cap (with a pom-pom on top) for a more stylish bowler hat. More recently, in the 1995 motion picture, "Casper," the Friendly Ghost was portrayed with a tail. Significantly, this overwhelmingly successful film was the first feature with a fully computergenerated image as the lead character; however, its two sequels were not well received by moviegoers.

Over the years, one thing about Casper never really changed, and that was his gentle nature. And it was this innate sweetness that first drew Vanessa Irino to the cartoon character. To this day, Irino still has a soft spot for the little fellow, whom she first "met" while watching a late-night cartoon show on television as a

young child. "I thought he was the cutest thing ever," she remembered. "He was my first BFF.'

Little did Irino know that this childhood interest would one day lead to an extraordinary collection of Casper memorabilia, one which began with a VHS tape of Casper cartoons, purchased at a dollar store. Although she still has her original Casper plush toy and a few other items leftover from her childhood, it wasn't until about five years ago that she decided to begin collecting in earnest. As she put it, "My little collection grew and grew."

Talk about an understatement. Today,

full of all things Casper, housing more than , 2 0 0 individual i t e m s displayed in six curio cabinets ("I may need one more cabinet in the future"). She has also taken advantage of the room's walls and floor for display purposes ("We might need a bigger house"). H e r collection runs gamut, from comic books ("I have a lot of the old ones") to games, cereal boxes and pullstring toys. Especially prized are her Casper other Irino and Harveytoon characters, that she thought she would never be able to find. Florida Highwaymen painting tops Soulis auction at \$8,000

LONE JACK, MO — Americana dating from around 1830 to 1940 along with material made for the American market and a few later items of historical interest made up the items presented for sale by Soülis Auctions at their April 13 live auction that also offered the ability to bid via telephone, absentee, or online.

Everything from furniture to fine art crossed the auction block this day with most interest being generated by some wonderful vintage shooting gallery items and framed Maxwell Parrish calendar prints.

The auction was lead by two pieces of fine art on opposite ends of this genre's spectrum. The top lot of the day was an image created by Harold Newton (1934-1994); an African American artist who was an early 'charter' member of the Florida Highwaymen painters group. A classic Florida sunset complete with egrets was scratch signed at lower right by Newton and sold for \$8,000. Prices do not include the buyer's premium.

As defined by www.floridahighwaymenpaintings.com, "In the early 1950s through the 1980s a group of 26 African American artists known as the 'Florida Highwaymen' used vivid and bright colors to display the beautiful untouched Florida landscape. The Florida Highwaymen painted wind-bent palm trees, serene sunsets, churning oceans and bright red Poinciana trees. They painted from their garages and back yards on inexpensive Upson board and then

on the weekends they would travel and sell their Highwaymen paintings for around \$25 a piece to hotels, offices, businesses and individuals who appreciated the artwork."

Garnering similar interest was a portrait of George Thayer of Plymouth, Indiana, circa 1863, which was attributed to Jacob Cox (1810-1892). Though unsigned, Soülis had supporting materials attributing the image to Cox who was known to paint in and around the

sitter's hometown. This Thayer portrait, framed at 32 by 27.5 inches sold for \$5,000.

And then there were the Maxwell Parrish (1870-1966) prints. Of the top 12 lots, four of these spots were claimed by this artist's work used to promote Edison Mazda. The Parrish illustration "Egypt" gracing a 1922 Edison Mazda calendar helped this lot reach \$2,800. Also a major factor — this full pad calendar was in near mint condi-

tion. Further adding to the appeal was the hand-made vintage Art Deco-style frame perfectly fitting for the calendar it housed.

International buyers find language no barrier when shopping

GRAYS LAKE, Ill. — Language is not a barrier when shoppers want to buy something.

A group of buyers who were shopping the Chicagoland Advertising, Slot Machine and Juke Box Show were using translation devices. Both dealers and visitors were seemingly happy with the results.

"My English is pretty good" said Ben Franse, owner of "Bennies Fifties," who flew into Chicago from his business in the Netherlands. Franse, a regular buyer at the event, said he filled several ship containers with juke boxes, slot machines and other goodies to ship back home. "This is like Christmas," laughed Franse as he made another purchase at the show, a rare 20-inch-diameter star-shaped light-up Wurlitzer Juke Box speaker priced at \$1,500 from Bob Sossa, North Olmsted, Ohio.

Yet another overseas buyer Steve Cooper, said he was "all U.K. smiles" and very happy with his purchases,

Soülis' catlaog said, "The Dream Gardner is a longstanding dealer specializing in only the finest examples of original Maxfield Parrish illustration. This calendar was framed for the first time ever in 2006 and is guaranteed original.

The Dream Gardner frames are unique creations of fantasy painstakingly finished in colors and techniques inspired by the more elaborate frame examples found on Parrish prints from the 1920s and 1930s."

A framed illustrated Edison Mazda full pad calendar, this example being for the year 1919 featuring "Spirit of the Night" by Parrish made \$2,200. A 1930 Edison Mazda full pad calendar featuring Parrish's "Ecstasy brought \$2,000, and a 1924 full pad Edison Mazda calendar with the artist's "Venetian Lamplighter" featured sold for \$1,900. All were in The Dream Gardner frames.

A sizable grouping of vintage shooting gallery memorabilia was well received. An iron target with knockdown rabbits made \$4,400. The iron disc retained it dry old surface of red and green park paint and featured four bright yellow running rabbit knockdown targets which also still sported their bright yellow dry surface of old park paint with heavily peened surface from being shot at.

Other vintage shooting gallery items sold included an early 20th century J. T. Dickman Co. (Los Angeles) cast iron

knockdown target of smoking pipes. The rack consisted of 12 pipes and sold for \$3,200. The H.C. Evans cast iron mechanical mule target realized \$1,900, and measured an impressive 18.75 by 22 by 4 inches. And a rail of three bounding goats cast iron knockdown targets sold for \$1,500.

This auction was filled with unique items like the White Eagle Gas cast iron eagle that possibly once sat atop a



gas pump. It sold for \$2,800. The White Eagle Gas Company was a Midwestern oil company formed after the break-up of Standard oil in 1911 and absorbed by Standard Oil of New York around 1930.

A circa 1930 figural iron sprinkler of Art Deco influence complete with its original sprinkler head and weathered surface brought \$1,800, and an eight sided, 72 drawer revolving nut and bolt cabinet in yellow pine realized \$1,400.

those of the White Eagle Gas Company mascots. This circa was unsigned but attributed to Jacob Cox (1810-1892). It sold for \$5,000.

which were packed and ready to ship back to England. One was on his "personal wish list" — a half-dollar operated Jennings Chief slot machine he had been looking to buy for many years.

That half-dollar machine was not the only one offered at the Chicagoland Show. Frank Zygmunt Jr. Wesdtmont, Ill. said he sold a "very desirable rare" half-dollar operated Watling "Rol A Top" slot machine at the show 10 years ago for \$10,000 and was surprised to find the same machine available at the show again priced at \$10,000. "This one is not for sale," he said after buying it. "I'm taking it back home - for good!"

Two Wisconsin dealers that usually wow the crowd did not disappoint at the Chicago Show.

Jack Freund of Lake Geneva, Wis., calls himself "the oldest coin op machine dealer at the show" and at age 92 is known for rare vintage finds. The "elder statesman" brought two tiny shiny penny-operated treasures to the event. A 10-inch-tall 1915 Hance Breath Pellet vender could grace your shelf for \$2,200, while an 11-inch-tall early 1900s National Breath Perfume vender could be taken home for \$4,295.

Just down the aisle from Freund's booth, Paul Hindin of Mequon, Wis.,

showed off a 1910 era coin operated 17-inch-tall wire and wood bird in a cage that could "chirp" you a tune for 5 cents -and \$5,000. A 5 foot 10-inch 1905 floor model mahogany fortune teller could drop you a fortune telling card for one penny – and \$4,000.

It was a quick drive to the show for Dale Robinson of nearby St. Charles, Ill. who showed off several booths full of

vintage advertising signs. Many people stopped to admire his 1930s embossed tin 12-by 18-inch Natural Set Up soft drink sign with rolling dice illustration, priced at \$750. Others checked out his milk-bottle-shaped 1930s 7-by 24-inch embossed tin sign also priced at \$750.

Gas station collectors hovered around the 13-inch 1940-50s Husky dog illustrated round gas pump topper tagged at \$125 by Russ and Joann Newman of Elgin, Ill., while soda pop machine collectors admired their 1955 Pepsi VMC soft drink dispenser, which could cool soda at your place for \$6,500.

Still more gas globes could be found at Matt Hoppe's Fresh Coast Vintage site. The three-time repeat vender offered two different 1950s Sinclair gas globes for \$650 and \$850 each. At the same spot, a 36-inch-long 1950s full figured red neon arrow from an old motel could lead the way to your place for \$850.

Show regular Robert Wendland of Stevensville, Mich., known professionally as Mutoscope Man for his dealing in the early 1900s coin-operated flip card machines, offered a fully restored 6-foot-tall cast iron model for \$12,500, along with parts for cast iron and tin penny arcade devices. At Wendland's booth, coin op stamp machine collectors pulled nickels out of their pockets to test his 10-inch-tall cast iron base 10-inch-tall all-original 1890s tin construction stamp vending machine, priced at \$2,700.

Those interested in history of Mutoscope machines lined up to check out a two-volume book set, with a total of 800 pages detailing the history of the devices authored by Larry Bieza of St. Paul, Minn. The set offered information and entertainment for \$73 per volume.

John Fifer of Medina, Ohio., came to Chicagoland to buy and sell goodies, including his 1930s nickel-operated Mills

Lion Front Slot machine for \$1,450 and to promote the Coin Operated Collectors of America Club, of which he is this year's president. Fifer said more information about COCA is available at www.coinopclub.org.

Soft drink collectors hovered around the booth of Tim and Roxie Lockhard, Russell, Iowa., for a close look at their 1930s Art Deco 20-inch-diameter neon Dr. Pepper clock, which could light up and keep time for you for \$2,595. Soda pop bottle and sign collectors zeroed in on their 1945 Whistle Soda Pop 6 pack bottle, carton and advertising sign combination, priced at \$595.

Robert Kindness of nearby St. Charles, Ill., set up to sell Coke machines and vintage advertising signs with the help of son, Nick, who Robert said has been helping Dad since age 1! Now at age 26, Nick has his own business, "Nick's Pizza Truck," decorated with vintage advertising which the pair have purchased over the years.

The fall Chicagoland Antique Advertising, Slot Machine & Jukebox Show will again be held at the Lake County Fairgrounds and Event Center, Grayslake Ill., Nov. 15-17.

Painting of Zachary Taylor one of highlights of Stevens Auction

ABERDEEN, Miss. -Stevens Auction Company's annual Spring Multi-Estate Auction was originally planned for April 27th, but auctioneer and auction house owner Dwight Stevens was so busy getting elected mayor of Aberdeen (and in the process unseating a longtime incumbent), the sale date had to be pushed ahead to Saturday, May 11.

It will be well worth the wait, as just over 400 lots comprising the contents of several prominent estates from across the South will come up for bid, led by a vibrant figural landscape painting by renowned New Orleans artist Richard Clague, Jr. (1821-1873) and what is believed to be the last portrait painting President Zachary Taylor sat for prior to his death in office from cancer in

The auction will be held live in Stevens Auction Company's new gallery facility in downtown Aberdeen, at 129 East Commerce Street, as well as online via LiveAuctioneers.com.

The painting signed by Richard Clague, Jr. is an 1862 oil on cradled wood panel titled Hunter and Fisherman, Louisiana Countryside. It measures 18 by 22 inches and is nicely housed in a 28 ½ by 33 inch period gilt frame. Clague studied with Earnest Herbert and at the Ecole des Beaux Arts in Paris. The painting carries a pre-sale estimate of \$50,000-\$100,000.

Clague's obituary in the New Orleans Bee stated: "Mr. Clague has stood at the head of his profession in this state and his works have always been highly regarded by connoisseurs in New York as well as here."

The 19th century oil on canvas por-

trait of Zachary Taylor is after the 1847 Battle of Buena Vista lithograph titled Gen. Z. Taylor Rough and Ready, according to the Smithsonian Institute. The painting was given to William Dudley Talley from Taylor himself, to solve a debt. It has remained in the Talley family all these years and has an estimate of \$4,000-\$8,000.

Zachary Taylor died in 1850, just ten months after assuming the Presidency after a bout with stomach cancer. He appears gaunt and thin in the portrait, not stout and robust as in previous portraits, a fact that gave rise to the belief that he was close to death during the sitting. The portrait is oval in the frame, with a square canvas size of 30 inches by 25 inches (minus frame).

Period furniture will be highlight-

ed by a magnificent, heavily carved R. J. Horner dining table with carved band and figural angels for support and three 20-inch leaves (est. \$7,000-\$10,000); companion to that a heavily carved set of 12 dining chairs, two of them arm chairs, in excellent condition with paisley upholstery (est. \$4,000-\$8,000); and a pierce carved Meeks side chair in the Henry Ford pattern with laminated black and yellow velvet upholstery (est. \$400-\$800).

There are three very old oil on canvas religious pre-Crucifixion scenes of Jesus, all measuring 86 inches by 59 inches and each expected to sell for \$5,000-\$10,000. One depicts Jesus being judged before being placed on the cross; another is a scene of Jesus being carried into temple by Roman soldiers to be judged by a priest; and the third depicts Jesus being nailed to the cross by three peasants and two Roman soldiers. All three works are in antique gold gilded frames.





antique shops that I didn't even know existed," she commented. So popular is the Friendly Ghost there that she said it's not uncommon to see Japanese residents walking about and wearing Casper sweatshirts or carrying Casper bags. "I always ask them, 'Where did you get that?" she laughed.

As for adding to her collection back at home, she said it is hard to find Casper memorabilia in local thrift and vintage shops. Most of her acquisitions have been made online, with a good number of them originating from other countries. For example, she noted that she once found Casper glow-in-the-dark ceiling stickers from a person in Greece. Her collection of VHS tapes includes ones with the dialogue spoken in Spanish and Japanese, Korean and French. She has tapes from Turkey and the United Kingdom, all of which prove Casper's international appeal.

Irino's collection took on a new sense of purpose when a Canadian fan of Scooby-Doo, with whom she had connected online, suggested that she might hold the record for the world's largest Casper collection. When Irino googled the subject, "nothing popped up. I had no competition." An inquiry to Guinness World Records resulted in her learning that a new category for Casper would be created, and that she could hold that record if she could verify, within a year, that she had at least 1,000 items in her collection. Making this particularly challenging, she explained, was the fact that autographs do not

"count," and pogs and trading cards are considered to be a set, not individual items.

Using these guidelines, Irino found that she had just a bit over 800 qualifying items. Consequently, on their next trip to Japan, she and her husband ("he

> supported hardcore t h i s ") concentrated on their search for more Casper merchandise. Returning home with 113 items,

they bore down on purchasing additional objects online in order to get her over the finish line.

With the items under her roof, the next step was to prepare a spreadsheet to identify each item, followed by the verification of the collection by professionals, a service provided, in this case, by the owners of a San Antonio antique shop. With all deadlines met, Irino received a certificate this past February, confirming her collection's
