Acoma pottery reflects traditions dating back centuries

In Southwestern New Mexico near Albuquerque, a 350-foot mesa rises like a monolith from the desert floor. Atop the mesa, a village of sandstone dwellings called "Sky City" lies along streets believed to date back to 1150 AD. The mesa and the surrounding land are known as Acoma Pueblo. It's the ancestral home of the Acoma people and is considered the oldest continuously occupied community in North America.

Acoma Pueblo is famed for its unique pottery style, using techniques and artistry dating back centuries. Traditional Acoma pottery is hand-coiled from local clay and slowly pit-fired, producing signature thin-walled vessels. The monochrome and two-color polychrome decoration, often featuring vivid geometric patterns, is acclaimed.

Before becoming a coveted art form, Acoma pottery was functional. Bowls, seed jars, and large ollas for storing food and water were crafted for everyday use. Other pieces like animal effigies and wedding vases were made for ceremonial purposes. Whether functional or ceremonial, Acoma potters - traditionally women - gave reverence to their craft. Everything from collecting the clay to making the dyes used to paint the vessels is done with veneration for the natural world.

Archaeological evidence suggests that the Acoma people lived in the desert surrounding the mesa, and then moved their village to the top, most likely for protection. That same evidence confirms that they were prolific potters long before contact with Europeans.

The Spanish came first, around 1540 when a contingent of Coronado's explorers arrived at the mesa. Unlike other villages, the mesa's almost impenetrable location made it resistant to Spanish control. Coronado described it as the strongest defensive position in the world.

Early interactions with the Spanish were friendly. However, relations degraded during the 1600s when

Franciscan missionaries tried to convert the Acoma people to Catholicism and began building the San Esteban del Ray mission church atop the mesa, using villagers as slave labor. Tension boiled over in 1680 when many pueblo villages, including Acoma, took part in a pueblo revolt against the Spanish.

The successful revolt pushed the Spanish out of New Mexico for more than a decade. Even upon their return, the Pueblo people retained much of their control, helping Pueblo artistic, cultural, and religious traditions survive.

One of Acoma's most important sur-

viving traditions was its centuries-old heritage of pottery making. Like many forms of Southwest earthenware, the process is laborious and painstaking, yet produces exceptional results.

The process starts with collecting clay from specific places on family plots. The dug clay is then cleaned and filtered of impurities. Then - and not insignificantly - each vessel gets an old pot incorporated into it, as old pot shards are ground into a powder used to temper the



John Wilkes Booth wanted poster tops Heritage at \$200,000

DALLAS, Texas - Heritage Auctions' Americana & Political Signature Auction #6286 held April 26-27, featured both vintage and more contemporary items of these genres. Leading the day was a rare first printing and first issue of probably the most infamous reward poster in the country's history – a John Wilkes Booth assassination folio broadside. Issued by the War Department's Secretary of War; Edwin M. Stanton, the broadside dated April 20, 1865, wore the bold headline "\$100,000 REWARD THE MURDERER Of our late beloved President, Abraham Lincoln, IS STILL AT LARGE." This rare poster sold for \$200,000. Prices include the 25% buyer's premium.

An item associated with another president that died at the hands of an assassin; the "Inauguration" Bible used by Jackie Kennedy for her husband, John F. Kennedy's funeral service was presented for bids with the new owner paying \$162,500. The 5.75 inch by 8.25 inch New Catholic Edition Illustrated of the Holy Bible (Old and New Testaments) gifted by Richard Cardinal Cushing (1895-1970) had a cover that was goldstamped on the bottom "January 20, 1961"; the date coinciding with JFK's inauguration. The flyleaf with an attached bookplate for John Fitzgerald Kennedy, featuring the Presidential Seal, also had a written note by Jacqueline

Kennedy stating "Bible we used the night Jack died to chose Ecclesiastes to be read at his Funeral. JBK 1963."

Mrs. Kennedy reportedly had a close spiritual relation with the Cardinal. This is not the Kennedy Family Bible used to

take the oath of office, but a significant artifact closely associated with the assassination and funeral.

Somber items lead this Heritage

The Lord's Prayer found in crosses with stanhopes

A popular tourist item is the Lord's Prayer or other religious work inside a Stanhope. Many of the Stanhopes containing the Lord's Prayer are in the shape of a cross.

These items hold a tiny photograph that is viewed through a microscope device embedded in the cross. When held to light, it shows a young girl on her knees in prayer and the Lord's prayer beneath her.

The name Stanhope comes from the lens inventor, Lord Charles Stanhope of England (1753-1816). The Stanhope lens is a simple, one-piece microscope. It is a cylinder of glass with each end curved outwards, one being more convex than the other.

In 1851 John Benjamin Dancer invented microphotographs using a collodion process (the basis of most wet-plate photography until it superseded by modern gelatin emulsions), and a microscope converted to a camera. This resulted in a microphotograph about 3 square millimeters (0.0047 sq in) in area.

The Stanhope enabled the viewing of the microphotograph. In 1857, French chemist Renee Dagron, invented microphotography on collodion film. This involved the use of iodides

and nitrates to produce light-sensitive glass and the transparent black and white image seen in the Stanhope. He called the devices bijoux photo-microscopiques or microscopic

photo-jewelry.

Dagron modified the lens by keeping one curved end to refract light while sectioning the other end flat and locating it at the focal plane of

the curved side. This produced a plano-convex lens, where he was able to

Auctions sale with a 9/11 World Trade Center recovered American flag with provenance making \$41,250. This 58 inch by 34 inch tattered flag was recovered from debris by first responder Vito Messana who was at Ground Zero on September 11, 2001. He was assisting in Search and Rescue efforts and did so every day for two weeks. Messana was a member of Teamsters Local 282.





Heritage Auctions' catalog notes about American flags recovered after the 9/11 attack, "U.S., state, and international flags were among the 9/11 artifacts retrieved. Most recovered flags went to public institutions, including the Smithsonian, the New York State Museum, and the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey. It is estimated that hundreds of flags had been in World Trade Center buildings, due both to the large number of government offices there and the American tradition of flag ownership by private individuals. However, only a handful survived the fires and ultimate collapse of the Twin Towers."

A lovely 20 by 16 inch oil on canvas depicting a wooded scene at Camp David; the Presidential retreat located at Catoctin Mountain Park in northern Maryland; the work of President Dwight D. Eisenhower, realized \$40,000. The work is inscribed on the back of the stretcher - "To George R. Bechatel from Sue Eisenhower granddaughter of Pres. DDE 8-15-68".

Heritage's catalog listing for this lot included some fun facts - "Camp David was originally built by the WPA, opening in 1938 as "Hi-Catoctin". FDR renamed it "Shangri-La" in 1942, using it for state and presidential visits. It was renamed


by President Eisenhower in 1953 as "Camp David", named after his father and grandson. It hosted many heads-of-state, including Winston Churchill in 1943 and Nikita Khrushchev in 1959."

One lot brought history and Hollywood together. A Butch Cassidy and the Sundance Kid; Harry Longabaugh ("Sundance Kid") signed postcard was taken to \$20,625. So much cool history here. The picture postcard was written and signed by the Sundance Kid, Harry Longabaugh (a.k.a., Longbough). The postcard is of Balance Rock in the Garden of the Gods in Colorado, and was sent from Thistle, Utah, on September 4, 1904. It was addressed to Clarence Longbough, Dodge Center, Minnesota, arriving there on the 6th. The postcard is written entirely in Longabaugh's hand. He indicates he visited the Garden of the Gods. The text reads, in full: "All is well. Ben [sic] moving a lot. Leroy wanted to be in Utah. for awhile was in N. M. and Colorado. Glad to be out of S. Am [South America] no work ther very hard country write later Say hi to all Harry".

The address side is stamped "Pinkerton Det. Agy. Hold". There was a \$30,000 reward offered for his capture and the Pinkertons were hot on his trail. The Pinkerton stamp is evidence they were intercepting mail addressed to family members (five siblings) in an effort to pinpoint his location. Leroy was Butch Cassidy's middle name. He was born and raised in Utah which explains the

And showing history is history regardless of age — A 1st Generation 4GB iPhone sealed in its box complete with an Apple drawstring bag sold for \$75,000. Released in 2007, this phone was swiftly discontinued only two months after its debut. Heritage notes, "Acquiring early generation items using the ever-evolving technology upon which we have all come to depend, especially in this unmolested form, is among the hottest trends in modern collectibles."

mount the microscopic photograph on the flat side of the lens using Canada balsam as adhesive. This arrangement enabled a focused picture. The sectioned lens could magnify the microphotograph three hundred times. The modified Stanhope lens was small enough to be mounted in all manner of miniature artifacts such as rings, ivory miniatures, and wood-

Dagron viewers were introduced to the public at the 1859 International Fair in Paris. The success of his viewers enabled Dagron to build a factory dedicated to their production. As of June 1859, Dagron's factory was manufacturing the stanhopes, mounted in jewelry and souvenirs. In August 1859, he exhibited them at the International Exhibition in Paris and met with great success. In 1860 Dagron obtained the patent for his viewers under the title Bijoux Photomicroscopiques. In 1862 he had 150 employees and was manufacturing

12,000 units a day.

In 1864 Dagron became famous when he produced a stanhope optical viewer which enabled the viewing of a microphotograph 1 square millimetre (0.0016 sq in), (equivalent in size to the head of a pin), that included the portraits of 450 people.

In the early 20th century Eugène Reymond took control of Dagron's stanhope lens factory in Gex, France. In 1972 the factory produced the last stanhope lens made by the traditional methods. In 1998, the workshop closed and its equipment was dismantled and sold. Stanhope lenses are manufactured to this day, but they are not produced according to Dagron's methodology.

Originally, Lord's prayer crosses, made in France were sold by various vendors, mostly at religious tourist locations like Lourdes. Today's stanhopes are made by two companies, Stanhope Jewelry Company and Stanhope MicroWorks. In modern times, the most common stanhopes are usually gold or silver crosses with Christian prayers in the microphotograph.





nusual items will lure bidders to Morphy offering

DENVER, Pa. – Exquisite jewelry and watches, 35 pieces of early Amphora pottery, and 25 exceptional Tiffany Studios lamps lead the select array of fine and decorative art to be auctioned by Morphy's on June 11-12.

The Pennsylvania gallery is beaming with rainbow colors from the auction's 72 art glass lamps by Tiffany Studios, Handel, Pairpoint, Duffner & Kimberly and other acclaimed manufacturers of the early 20th century.

The 25 Tiffany creations chosen for the June 11-12 sale will delight even the most discerning connoisseur, starting with an absolutely stunning "Peony" leaded-glass lamp. This glorious top-tier table lamp dazzles with its multicolored background of mottled cobalt and streaked sky blues, medley of multicol-

ored confetti glass, and blossoms crafted from numerous types of Tiffany glass, including granite-backed reds and highly mottled opalescent whites. Both the Peony shade and base are signed by Tiffany, with illustrious provenance adding to their desirability. The 22-inch (diameter) shade was formerly in the collection of Minna Rosenblatt (1944-2008), while the lamp's base was previously acquired at a Sotheby's auction.

Another wonderful buying opportunity comes in the form of a Duffner & Kimberly "Viking" leaded-glass table lamp, a model that appeared in the manufacturer's 1906 catalog. It is one of few examples of its type known to exist. Against its emerald-green background, the shade has an intricate motif executed in various hues of purple, teal, yellow and red glass. It is further accented by bronze straps, each terminating in a three-dimensional monster head reminiscent of mythical creatures that might have been carved on the prow of a Viking ship. The lamp stands 30 inches tall and is signed under its (correct) base and on one of the inside straps. With provenance from the Barry Toombs collection, it comes to auction with a \$60,000-\$90,000 estimate.

For many years Morphy's has been regarded as a trusted source for antique Amphora pottery, garnering record prices on several designs. The opening session of the June 11-12 auction will not disappoint Amphora fans, as it includes 35 pieces, led by a monumental circa-1906 Amphora Cactus Vase by Paul Dachsel. Regarded as one of the artist's most innovative designs, the streamlined form seems to foretell the Moderne aesthetic that would not arrive on the art scene for another quarter of a century. The 11-inch vase displays an iridized matte green glaze and undulating reticulated handles. It is marked PD and impressed with the number 1048. In mint condition, the Dachsel Cactus vase is estimated at \$18,000-\$24,000.

Gold and platinum jewelry, luxury watches, pocket watches, coins and collectible currency comprise a 140-lot selection of very fine quality. The star of the group is an 18K white gold, emerald and diamond necklace with nine graduated emerald-cut emeralds having a total weight of 49.20cts (largest stone measuring 15.4mm x 7.0mm), and 640 brilliant-cut diamonds with total weight of 8.91cts. Its overall clasped length is 17.5 inches, and its gross weight is 57.5 grams. The necklace is marked Oscar Friedman 18K EM29.51ct D5.68ct under the clasp and it comes with its GemAssure Gemological Appraisals Report. Estimate: \$20,000-\$40,000

On June 12, Morphy's will auction three weathervanes, the most unusual being an early 20th-century molded-zinc depiction of a woman tennis player in a long, billowing skirt, with her racquet held aloft. Standing 32 inches tall on a metal stand, it is one of only seven known to exist and is in excellent condition. Estimate: \$5,000-\$15,000

Another auction entry with charm to spare is a circa-1877 hand-painted wood trade sign in the form of a tea kettle, advertising 'Gilbert & Lawrence Coppersmiths." This very rare piece, measuring 48 inches by 48 inches by 71/4 inches deep, is flat on one side, making it very easy to display. Estimate: \$3,000-\$8,000

A fabulous selection of 170 antique walking sticks and canes traverses a broad spectrum of subject matter, including animals, buildings, and medieval, religious or mythological characters.

Antique occupational shaving mugs have shown strong upward momentum in the marketplace for several years, now. Morphy's has remained at the fore-

front of the trend, selling some of the rarest and costliest examples. In the June sale, they will offer an extremely rare mug depicting three gymnasts practicing their various athletic disciplines. The mug is emblazoned in gilt with the owner's name, "Leoder Brodecki" and is stamped T & V Limoges France under the base. Visually outstanding and in excellent condition, it is expected to claim a winning bid in the region of \$1,000-

new clay.

Once the clay is prepared, the potter hand-coils each vessel from the bottom up, with long strands of clay. Once the pot is in the desired shape and size, it's hand-scraped to smooth the exterior and interior surfaces. The entire process can take as much as 60-80 hours before firing.

Traditional firing is done outdoors in a pit, using manure for fuel. The long, slow firing allows potters to construct the signature thin-walled vessels. Even with the huge time invested, many pots are lost in the firing process.

Next comes the decoration. Firing produces a naturally gray finish. A coating of Kaolin, a type of soft white clay, is applied to the surface, creating the renown white or cream background on which the artist paints. Traditionally, natural pigments are used for decoration. Acoma potters gather mineral and vegetable ingredients, grind them into fine powders, and mix them with water to create basic paints.

The paints are applied using yucca fibers and sometimes feathers, to create intricate details.


Acoma artists tend to pull artistic inspiration from their ancestors, the Mimbres civilization (550-1150 AD). Mimbres pottery was often black or gray on white and featured repeating geometric patterns seen on modern Acoma pottery. Acoma potters often add brown, orange, or red for a simple polychrome effect.

Acoma artists are known both for their symbolism, like animals, birds, and rain and for fine lines and repeating geometric forms. The art often depicts a story, like petroglyphs on a stone wall.

One particular trait of Acoma pottery

is that it's normally unglazed. Although ancient Acoma earthenware was glazed, makers transitioned to matte painting after the Pueblo Revolt, when the returning Spanish took over the sites that held the lead ore used for glaze.


Commercialization of Acoma pottery started in the late 19th century when the railroad arrived in New Mexico. Railroads brought throngs of tourists who 'discovered' the artwork of the indigenous Southwest people. Acoma potters, like others, began catering to that market.

Starting in the 1800s, trading posts were established to supply basic goods to Native Americans, particularly those relocated to reservations. Indian people often traded items like turquoise jewelry and pottery for necessities. In turn, trading posts resold those items to tourists seeking native-made goods.

Among the establishments selling Native American pottery was the Fred Harvey Company which ran hotels with retail shops along the Santa Fe Railway. Harvey hired Indian artisans to make pieces at several of the Harvey House hotels. The Native crafts were then sold as souvenirs.

Pawning items also evolved as a means of trade for native artisans. Handmade pieces like blankets and pottery could be pawned for cash, and then retrieved when the amount, plus interest, was repaid. For artists, pawning became a banking system. For traders, dead pawn (items that weren't redeemed) became a source of merchandise.


During the auto era, Indian artisans, Acoma included, began selling pieces directly, often from the roadside along popular routes. By the 1960s, many native potters adapted to the growing tourist market by shifting from time-consuming traditional techniques to more efficient methods. Hand-coiling often gave way to molds, firing moved to kilns, and modern

brushes stroked chemical paint. Also contrasting with tradition, male potters began entering the trade.

Around the 1950s, four Acoma friends - fearing the loss of their people's pottery-making traditions to the tourist trade - started reviving the old ways. Known as the "Four Matriarchs", Marie Zieu Chino (1907-1982), Jessie Garcia (1910-1999), Lucy Lewis (1890-1992), and Juana Leno (1917-2000), are credited with resurrecting the Acoma style and giving rise to its popularity as an art form.


Each came from a skilled family of potters (Chino won her first pottery award when she was just 15). They passed along traditions to their daughters and grand-daughters, like digging clay from family clay beds, making natural pigments, and using the coil-and-scrape method to make pots. They also taught the Mimbres decorative style, with its limited color palette, fine lines, and precise patterns.

The matriarchs were among the first to sign their pieces and their promotion helped popularize the Santa Fe Indian Market. Vetted pieces from one of the matriarchs can run tens of thousands of dollars. Fortunately, pieces from their descendants are often much more affordable

For anyone interested in Acoma pottery, coming across a pre-19th-century piece is unlikely. Most are in museums or would be otherwise unaffordable. The earliest will typically be from the 19th century and can run several thousand dollars.

Pieces from the first half of the 20th century are regularly found in galleries, Southwest stores, shows, and auctions. Prices are generally \$150-\$1,000.

More contemporary Acoma pottery (i.e. from the second half of the 20th century through today) can run as little as \$25 for

a tourist trade piece to over \$500 for a vessel made using traditional methods. Modern production pieces are still stunning and great for starting a collection. They can be found online, in tourist locations, in Southwest stores, at roadside stands in New Mexico, and of course, at Acoma itself. Better-grade traditionally-made pottery can be found in galleries, at Southwest art shows, and at higher-end boutique stores in Southwest states.

When buying, the artist, caliber, and condition all matter. In particular, look for signatures on the bottom. The lack of a signature can point to an older, pre-1950s piece when signing wasn't commonplace. Conversely, signatures identify the artists, whether it's someone with notoriety or an up-and-coming potter. Contemporary figures, like Melissa Antonio, Barbara & Joseph Cerno, and Delores Juanico craft using traditional methods and have made names for themselves. Yet, even an unrecognized artist's signature proclaims their personal membership in Acoma's pottery-making heritage.

Today, Acoma Pueblo is one of New Mexico's top tourist destinations. A handful of around 50 people, including tribal elders, live atop the mesa, even though there is no running water, electricity, or telephone. The mesa is periodically the site for festivals and sacred ceremonies. The remaining 5,000 Acoma people live in farming villages like Acomita below the mesa.

Visitors can reach the mesa's top via tour shuttles from the Haa'ku Museum and Sky City Cultural Center, or climb a primitive staircase cut into the rock, the same way generations did. A big draw is the opportunity to meet and purchase from artists while there.
