The Beatles: Collecting with 'a little help from your friends'

Beatlemania is alive and well. And for those preteeners who first saw them on "The Ed Sullivan Show," the Beatles continue to hold a place in their hearts, not to mention their closets and attics, basements and storage units. When the Beatles invaded America, they awakened the entrepreneurial instincts of those who recognized a prime opportunity to make a dollar and, to a lesser extent, a British pound.

Now, some 60 years later, the merchandise bearing the images of the Beatles is collectable, not only by the fans who remember them "when," but also by subsequent generations, including their children and grandchildren. As Tom Anderton pointed out, regardless of who you are (or how young or how old you are), "It's not uncool to say you love a Beatles' song."

Anderton should know. As proprietor of "Tom's Music Trade" in Red Lion, Pa., Anderton boasts an inventory of more than 60,000 items, including vintage albums, 45's, CDs, and cassettes, as well as turntables, receivers, speakers and memorabilia.

Buying and selling is nothing new to the native of Birmingham, England. "I grew up going to 'car boot' sales on the weekend," he said. But when he came to the States in January of 2000, he had nothing more than a month's rent and a change of clothes.

That all changed in a hurry. Living in south central Pennsylvania and working on construction jobs, he supplemented his income at local record shows. "I'm a real rummager," he said with a smile. "I got the bug all over again."

In March 2006, Anderton learned of a vacant storefront in the York County borough of Red Lion. The \$300 monthly

rental fee was "cheaper than what I was paying for storage," he recalled. Thus was born "Tom's Record Trade." The first Saturday that he was open for business, "it took off."

With his shop's success, Anderton made plans to expand his empire by opening a rock-and-roll themed coffee bar with memorabilia-filled walls. When the pandemic nipped his dream in the

bud, he shifted gears, knocked down a wall in his shop, and transformed what had been his storeroom into "Tom's Homegrown Rock-N-Roll Museum."

Bids radiated for Swarovski crystal figurines

BLOOMINGTON, Ind. — On June 3, EDS Fine Estate Auctions held a fine furnishings, antiques, sterling, and art auction. The online-only sale contained 430 lots from multiple estates and consignors. Among the offerings were early 20th-century furniture, sterling silver flatware, and Swarovski crystal figurines, along with sketches, paintings, and pastels.

The auction's top lot of \$480 went to a signed/numbered folio entitled, "Physiologus Theobaldi Episcopi De Naturis Duodecim Animalium (Physiologist Theobald Bishop on the Nature of the Twelve Animals) illustrated with 12 lithographs and 10 woodcuts attributed to painter/ printmaker Rudolph Otto Pozzatti (American, 1925-2021). The circa 1964 volume had a cloth-covered clamshell box with a pasted woodcut on the front and gilt titles on the spine. It was in expected used condition.

Second place went for a good-condition pair of Savonarola Dante-style Italian gilt iron chairs, at \$450. The 26-inch wide by 17-inch-deep chairs featured thick hide seats and armrests upon heavy iron finial-capped frames.

Nearly four dozen other lots of furniture were offered, including a tufted leather Wrangler by Flexsteel club sofa that landed \$280. The 84-inch long by 39-inch wide couch was in very good used condition. It sported nail-head trim, a wooden base, and

two seat cushions attached with Velcro


Bidding went to \$145 for an antique four-drawer dresser with a marble top. The 41-inch wide by 36-inch-high piece was made of solid wood with mortise and tenon construction, dovetails, brass drop pulls, and brass lock escutcheons.

Surprisingly, bidding stalled out at \$85 on one of the showcased lots, a five-piece Art Deco living room suite, circa 1920-1930. The collection included a 15-inch-wide settee, three 26-inch armchairs, and an ottoman/ footstool. The set was "skyscraper" style with angular wood frames and Lurex/metallic upholstery that may have been original.

Everything was in solid condition but the fabric and springs needed some attention.

Another spotlighted category — the Swarovski crystal figurines — did not disappoint. In all, there were 47 beautiful pieces on the block. Taking top bid, at \$205, was a 1997 annual edition figure entitled, "The Dragon" in its original packaging. In excellent condition, the 5 ½-inch long cut-crystal creature had gem eyes and frosted detailing.

A bid of \$125 took home a boxed 2002 piece called "The Magic of Dance Isadora." The 7 \(^3\)4-inch figure was in like-new condition with its original box. Later came a ninepiece Swarovski Nativity scene. It contained miniature figures of an archway, the Holy family, a shepherd, and three kings. Included was a slightly damaged Christmas Memories crystal angel ornament. The bundle was won for \$115. The smallest winning bid for a Swarovski piece was \$20, offered for a 1 1/2-inch diameter birthday cake with a mirror stand, in excellent condition, from 1992.

Sterling silver proved popular, with winning bids hitting as high as \$240 for a sterling S. Kirk & Son set of eight Repousse salad forks. Weighing in at 292 grams, the lot sold for around its metal value.

However, the \$220 bid offered for a 20-piece flatware set that held just 85 grams of sterling was well over its silver value. The set contained five spoons, 12 dinner knives, a two-piece carving set, and a pair of ice

Coming in at \$130 was a set of four ster-

ling coasters, a weighted sterling compote, and an engraved plate. The coasters measured 3 % inches, while the compote came in at 5 1/2 inches high and 5 3/4 inches in diameter. The compote was marked, "Preisner Weighted Sterling", the coasters, "Newport Sterling", and the plate, "Fisher Sterling." At 188 grams, the set sold just shy of its sil-


Art consisted mainly of two-dimensional works, both framed and unframed, spanning from oils to etchings. A framed vintage embroidered sampler portraying birds and flowers made it to \$370, earning it the auction's third place. The 27-inch by 29-inch piece, by an unknown artist, was framed and wired, ready for hanging.

Coming close, at \$360 was an etching of the Church of the Nativity in Bethlehem. signed by Axel Tallberg (Swedish 1860-1928) who taught at the Royal Academy of Fine Arts in Stockholm. The 21-inch by 16inch inch picture was also framed and wired for hanging.

Another \$360 picked up a circa 2010 acrylic painting entitled "Music Lovers" by Peter Bruning (Dutch/American, 1923-2018). The acrylic on canvas, measuring 19 inches by 15 inches was in good condition and signed by the artist.

Other interesting pieces included an M.A. Hadley blue and white pottery cat-shaped lamp that grabbed \$210. A 6-inch glass and metal bee-shaped honey server with the paddle left for \$140. And, a 10-inch contemporary Chinese cast-metal dragon figure, black with verdigris color highlights, sold

Obituary: Colin G. Campbell

Colin G. Campbell, who served as president of three internationally renowned educational and philanthropic organizations including Colonial Williamsburg died on June 21 at his home in Bluffton, S. C. He was 88.

In 1970, at age 34, Campbell became the youngest president of Wesleyan University in Middletown, Conn. e followed his 18-year tenure at Wesleyan with 12 years as president of the Rockefeller Brothers Fund, leading its global philanthropic efforts. In 2000 he became the president and CEO of The Colonial Williamsburg Foundation, championing another Rockefeller passion: the restored colonial capital of Virginia.

Colin Goetze Campbell was born on Nov. 3, 1935, in New York, New York. His father, Joseph Campbell, was the fourth comptroller general of the United States and a former treasurer of Columbia University. His mother, Marjorie Campbell, was one of the most prominent women in Connecticut politics during the 1950s and '60s. Colin Campbell, the youngest of five sons, was also close to his stepmother, Dorothy Bostwick Campbell, an artist and philanthropist.

Campbell graduated from Cornell University in Ithaca, New York, in 1957 and earned his JD at Columbia University in 1961. He was working at the American Stock Exchange in 1967 when he chose to follow his mentor, Edwin Etherington, to Wesleyan, initially serving as a vice president.

Etherington's tenure was brief, and within three years Campbell had ascended to the university's presidency. He was recognized for reestablishing financial stability at Wesleyan and oversaw the development of new courses, departments, and resource centers such as Earth and Environmental Sciences, Women's Studies, African American Studies, the East Asian Studies Center, and the Cinema Archives. His empathy and engagement with students in particular made him an accessible and beloved figure on campus.

Over the course of his Rockefeller Brothers Fund (RBF) presidency, Campbell oversaw more than a decade of grantmaking to encourage a rebirth of civil society in Central and Eastern Europe, strengthen education systems in South Africa, and promote the sustainable use of forest and marine resources. He facilitated a merger with the Charles A. Culpeper Foundation, significantly expanding the Fund's endowment and establishing the basis for an enduring commitment to the arts in New York City.

Campbell worked with the Rockefeller family and the National Trust for Historic Preser-

vation to establish The Pocantico Center on the family's former estate in Westchester County as a venue for meetings and conferences on critical global issues.

"Colin was a visionary leader who knew that philanthropy's greatest asset is its independence and ability to take risks in supporting innovation and experimentation," said Stephen Heintz, RBF's current president and CEO.

In 2000, Campbell left the RBF to become president and chief executive of The Colonial Williamsburg Foundation, where he had been a board member and board chair. He devoted considerable effort to developing Colonial Williamsburg as a center for history, citizenship and democracy, with the stated mission "That the future may learn from the past." He also completed significant additions to the historic area of Colonial Williamsburg, expanding on the original restoration led by John D. Rockefeller Jr.

In 2014, Campbell became chairman emeritus of the Colonial Williamsburg Foundation. He also served as chairman of Rockefeller Financial Services/Rockefeller & Co., a trustee of the NewYork Historical Society and the New York City Ballet, and chairman of the Public Broadcasting Service board of directors. Over the course of his lifetime he received honorary degrees from 11 colleges and universities, Wesleyan University's Baldwin Medal, the New-York Historical Society's DeWitt-Clinton Medal, the James Kent Medal from Columbia University School of Law, and the Churchill Bell from Colonial Williamsburg, among others

A constant throughout Campbell's life was his devotion to and celebration of family. He was married for 65 years to Nancy Nash Campbell, a preservationist and former board chair of the National Trust for Historic Preservation, whom he met in the summer of 1958 while both were studying at the University of Edinburgh in Scotland.

In addition to Nancy Campbell, Colin Campbell's survivors include four children: Betsy Campbell, Jennifer Celata, Colin M. Campbell, and Blair Campbell, as well as son- and daughter-in-laws Robert Celata and Liz Campbell, and eight grandchildren.

A service will be held at Bruton Parish Church in Williamsburg, Virginia, at 2 p.m. on Monday, July 8. In lieu of flowers, contributions may be made to the Colonial Williamsburg Foundation, Wesleyan University in Middletown, Connecticut, and Hospice of the Low-country in Bluffton, S.C.

honor and a real confirmation that Shipshewana and LaGrange County are special places to live and to visit. She added, "This could not have been accomplished without the availability of amazing local locations and experiences, as well as the input and collaboration of our partners. It proves that with teamwork and Hoosier Hospitality, there's nothing that can't be accomplished. Shipshewana may be a small town, but it can do big things, and do them well."

Shipshewana, located in northeast Indiana near the Michigan line and the RV industry's epicenter in Elkhart, Ind., is home to the third-largest Amish community in the United States. Over two million visitors travel there each year to enjoy the Amish culture and traditions. The town has more than 70 shops featuring everything from Amish food and crafts to antiques. Two-dozen restaurants, including the popular Blue Gate Restaurant & Bakery, offer an array of Amish and regional dining options.

Shipshewana is also home to the Shipshewana Trading Place, one of America's largest flea markets, with roots dating back to 1922 with local livestock auctions. On Tuesdays and Wednesdays, from spring through fall, as many as 700 open-air booths fill their 40-acre facility. A slate of

weekly auctions, including antique auctions on Wednesdays and livestock auctions on Wednesdays and Thursdays, are held year-round, with as many as 10 auctioneers calling.

In addition to the flea market and auctions, Shipshewana Trading Place also hosts special events, including an antique market held the first Saturday in August, craft and vintage shows held three times each year, and swap meets held monthly during warmer weather. In colder months, there's the Shipshewana Across the Road indoor market held on Fridays and Saturdays.

When not shopping or dining, visitors can enjoy activities like visiting the Menno-Hof Museum to learn about the history and life of the Amish, Hutterite, and Mennonite communities, taking buggy rides, or enjoying local theater. Ample lodging options allow visitors to extend their stays to take in everything.



The Beatles

Filling the space from floor to ceiling and wall to wall, his mind boggling collection is an egalitarian tribute to musicians, as artifacts from local bands share space with bands that are beloved around the world. For his part, Anderton conceded that his museum gives him an excuse for more collecting.

And although he is passionate about a host of bands, Tom's face lights up when talking about the Beatles. "Being British, I can't help but to love the Beatles," he said. "They've stood the test of time," he continued. "Everyone seems to have a connection with them," he said of their universal appeal. Collecting Beatles memorabilia has its challenges, however. Even though "there is a lot out there," Beatles fans "don't want to part with it. and those that are willing aren't giving it away." Chalk it up to sentimentality. On the other hand, he said, you never know what you're going to discover. Take, for instance, one of his recent finds, a pair of low-top "Wing Ding" women's tennis shoes. Picturing individual Beatles with their printed signatures, these pale blue shoes were found in like-new condition, with their original box and packing paper. Anderton shook his head in wonderment at their condition.

An early acquisition for his museum was a Beatles leatherette pocketbook, purchased along with an original ticket to the band's August 16, 1966, show at JFK Stadium in Philadelphia. But that's just a taste of what's in store for Beatles fans who visit this museum-within-a-shop.

Where else will you see a photograph and letter, accompanied by the original mailing envelope, from the Brian Epstein Fan Club? (As an aside, who even knew that "the man who discovered the Beatles" had his own fan club?) Nearby are the three covers of the Beatles' "Yesterday and Today" album, including the "butcher cover" (probably the "Holy Grail" and worth "a few thousand dollars"), along with a poster promoting the album ("among the best of the best").

How about four paper clothes hangers, each one picturing a Beatle as seen in the animated feature, "Yellow Submarine"? Noted Anderton, "I've never seen anything like them before."

Among the other treasures on view are a Beatles wig in its original packages; early 1964 NEMS dolls and later bobbleheads, and a 1964 metal lunch box (alas, missing the thermos bottle). Take a trip down memory lane with the "Flip Your Wig" game, complete and in likenew condition; several round plastic record cases for 45s; and Beatles wallpaper. A Christmas card from the official fan club, a Beatles scarf, and a wrapper for a Beatles ice cream bar. A "Yellow Submarine" pop-up book and an "official fan club jigsaw puzzle." Many of the pieces on exhibit, Anderton added, are "one-offs." And yes, there is at least one thing in the museum that a Beatle has touched, that being an autograph in Ringo Starr's scrawling handwriting. "He rarely signs anything except for charity," according to Anderton.



On the other hand, there are pieces that are a bit more within the reach of the average collector, such as fan magazines, pinbacks (beware of sloppy reproductions), and hundreds of Beatles collectors' cards, affordable for the casual collector, except for the ones that have been graded as "mint 10s." Although the Beatles were British, Anderton agreed that most of what's being collected today was made in America and marketed to

American fans. There were no licensing deals, he said; the money that band members lost as a result is incalculable.

Anderton said that a new collector could get started with less than \$100. He recommended buying "a handful of albums in good condition. Enjoy the music. And that will make you want more," he predicted.

These days, Anderton can be found in his shop six days a week. "I rarely take time off," he explained, as he continues "24 years of non-stop buying. I still have a passion for it, like I did when I was a kid." And as for the Beatles, "There will never again be another band like them." Call or text Tom at (717) 659-4006




