As we prepare for 250, we look toward Bicentennial plates

Tall ships and concerts, historical re-enactments and parades, fireworks and decorated fire hydrants: It's been nearly 50 years since Bicentennial Fever swept the United States. Painting the town red, white, and blue, Americans everywhere came together to celebrate, not just on Sunday, July 4, 1976, but in the days and weeks (and months and years) leading up to the country's 200th birthday. And now, America finds herself on the cusp of another important milestone: Saturday, July 4, 2026, the 250th anniversary of the ratification of the Declaration of Independence by the Second Continental Congress.

The Semiquincentennial (possible "Bisesquicentennial," "Sestercentennial" and the "Quarter Millennial" were passed over) is already the subject of an official commission that, among other duties, has directed the government to issue commemorative coins and postage stamps. But with the past as an indicator, will the commemorative wares stop there?

Consider the Bicentennial, when the country was awash in a variety of patriotic wares, from t-shirts and ashtrays, thimbles and bells, spoons and coffee cups. Needlecrafters were busy making afghans, samplers, and quilts. Even Madame Alexander, Holly Hobby, and Barbie got into the spirit. And then there were souvenir plates.

That the Bicentennial would be marked by commemorative plates should come as no surprise. As Kristen Pulley pointed out, the production of

china has enjoyed a long history, dating back to

the days of the Italian Renaissance, when majolica was produced in celebration of important family events. Pulley, speaking for Replacements, Ltd., noted that this tradition flourished in succeeding years with the rise of industrialization. Of particular note, she added, is the cherished tradition of annual dated Christmas plates by Bing

& Grondahl, begun in 1895 and continuing to this day.

Around the turn of the last century, a number of momentous milestones were the subject of souvenir plates. Wedgwood, Pulley said, was among those companies that celebrated milestones of the British royalty (including Queen Victoria's Jubilee, her death, and the coronation of her successor); other important events of the time, including World's Fairs,



William Shatner clothing beams buyers to new galaxies

HARTVILLE, Ohio - James Tiberious Kirk; T.J. Hooker; Denny Crane - however he is known, William Shatner can always draw a crowd. Nowhere was this more evident than at the July 18 KIKO Auction selling more than 400 lots of Shatner's previously worn clothing; an auction held in Hartville, Ohio.

Yes, I said Hartville. For those unfamiliar with northeast Ohio, Hartville is a mecca for flea market aficionados. There is the Hartville Marketplace and Flea Market a huge building filled with dealer spaces, gift shops, and a food court. The facility's parking lot hosts weekly flea markets as well. But, this area is rural America on the fringe of Amish country.

So how did William Shatner's clothing end up here? According to auctioneer, Jeff Kiko there were several reasons. "Bill was here in April where he signed autographs and took pictures with fans during a toy and comic show. He got to know the Hartville Market-

place's owners, thought they were great people, and wanted to do another event

That event turned out to be a Shatner closet clean-out, per say. "I met Bill in April as well," Kiko continued, "And we brainstormed a bit about having an auction; what that might look like. He mentioned he had so many clothes he'd only worn on set as well as clothes he had worn to events, and wondered if they would be of interest to fans. My thought was, absolutely!"

Shatner shipped more than 20 large boxes of clothing to KIKOs a few months ago, and the staff sorted, steamed, cataloged, and promoted the event as "From Hollywood to Hartville, William Shat-

ner's Luxury Wardrobe." Cue William Shatner's fan-base, who showed up both at the venue and online to own an item (or more) of what William Shatner once

"We had online bidders from Germany, the United Kingdom, Italy and British Columbia, as well as those here in the U.S. from 10 different states and as far away as Texas," Kiko noted.

While the opportunity to purchase an item of clothing was a draw, the real reason more than 200 people came to Hartville for the auction - William Shatner was in attendance. Not only was he present; he had a padded rock-

Ohio woodworker turns derelict radios into stunning retro bars

In a rural slice of Ohio about an hour southeast of Columbus, craftsperson Tom Peterson spends hours doing the most extraordinary thing. He turns neglected antique radios into amazing home bars.

Peterson has always been drawn to 20th-century furniture, particularly the geometry and lines of mid-century pieces. The attraction led him to restoring furniture as a sideline. It was a family member's cast-off antique radio that took him down an unexpected road. She was cleaning out her grandparent's estate and came across an old floor radio. Knowing Tom liked antiques, she asked if he wanted it, and he graciously accepted. ing chair on stage, and with mike in hand, spoke about the pieces of clothing as they were put up for bid.

"When that first lot went up, and I was just about to say 'Sold' and Bill started talking about the piece; his comments made it so the item's final sale price climbed even higher," Kiko noted. "When Bill spoke about an item, the crowd loved it!" Kiko notes. "Bill was only planning on staying for about an hour, as even being 93 years old; the guy is always on the go and has a full calendar of events, so he had places to be. But he was having such a good time, and the audience was having such a good time, Bill ended up staying for almost three hours. The auction took a bit longer than we anticipated," Kiko added with a smile, "But it was great seeing Bill so relaxed and having so much fun.'

Shatner made clear at the beginning of the auction, "I will try my best to recall where I wore these pieces, and by their nature it will be obvious, but much of the clothing were items given to me to wear on set or were ones purchased by myself to wear to events, and I might not remember the specifics of where I wore every item. On set, if I needed a black suit for example, one would be made for me; I'd wear it, and then I would be told, "Just take that home," once the shoot was done. Well, I've done a lot of shows and attended many events. I noticed recently that my closets were mysteriously shrinking, so that is why we are having this auction today. I need my closet space back."

The first 15 lots of the auction included the headliners with the first three lots being NHL official hockey jerseys given to Shatner by teams when he attended one of their games or participated in a charity fundraiser for the team.

"I am Canadian," Shatner noted, "And we Canadians love our hockey. These shirts were given to me and they had

them made with my name on the back," and then he added with a smile, "Along with the number 1 because, well..." The William Shatner Toronto Maple Leafs hockey jersey sold for \$250; the Montreal Canadians jersey made \$300, and the Edmonton Oilers example climbed to \$400.

More than once, Shatner hosted Star Trek related events. When Star Trek turned 50, Shatner and his family took part in a special cruise where he spoke, was present for photo opps, did autograph signings, etc. An extra-large t-shirt he wore on the cruise that looked like his captain's jersey created for the "Star Trek 50 – The Cruise" was bid to \$350. "Everyone who was on this cruise got one of these shirts, and this is mine," Shatner stated.

Shatner divides his time these days between two homes; one in Montreal and one in Los Angeles. In LA, Shatner became friends and was a supporter of the LA Fire Department near him. To thank him for his support, the department gave him a "Sinatra Manufactured Los Angeles, California," black

button down shirt with both the Star Trek emblem on the chest, an LA Fire Department patch on the sleeve, and his name embroidered on the back. This shirt sold for \$325.

The top four lots of the auction were all coats made for Shatner; some he wore on set. The top lot of the day was the leather Wilson Star Trek Generation bomber jacket in a size large. It was one of the few lots of the first 15 lots that sold to an online bidder as those in attendance were snatching up most of the items at the beginning of the auction. This leather jacket realized \$2,900.

A blue corduroy jacket with "Bill" embroidered on the front left chest and "T.J. Hooker" embroidered across the back was made by the Bowler's Shirt & Uniform Company of Los Angeles. When this went up for bids, Shatner picked up the mike and in true Shatner banter said, "This jacket was made for me when I was on this show, and I wore it to the set. It has my first name on the front and T. J. Hooker on the back because I was... well... I was T. J. Hooker." It sold for \$2,300.

Custom made for Shatner as a gift, a Fort Grizzly leather and calf skin fringed frontier's man coat made \$1,500, and a blue flight jacket (XL) with "Intrepid Sea Air & Space Museum" and "Enterprise" patch was taken to \$975.

A Hickey Freeman black cashmere over coat believed to have been worn on the television show Boston Legal had an inside tag that read "Denny" for Shatner's character, the infamous Denny Crane, made \$525, while a Harley Davidson leather riding jacket (2XL) - "I did lots of motorcycle movies, and this was a jacket I wore in one of them," Shatner interjected – brought \$700.

Speaking of jackets, Jeff Kiko spoke about the oddest item to sell this day. "We found a pair of Billboard ear buds in the pocket of one of the coats when sorting through everything, and thought, 'Why not' and listed this. When Bill saw we had these ear buds in the auction he stated, 'No one will want those!

Take those out of the sale.' But we convinced him someone would." Kiko noted, "When they sold for \$65, I looked at Bill and smiled and he threw his hands up in the air. We had fun that day!"

"A portion of the proceeds of the event is going to charity," Kiko explained. "Bill has raised so much money for charity over the years, especially through the Hollywood Charity Horse Show he started 30 years ago." Several horse show related items crossed the auction block. A Hollywood Charity Horse Show - HCHS 2014 - denim shirt (XL) with "William Shatner" embroidered on the front was bid to \$450. William Shatner raised and showed (he drove fine harness) American Saddlebred horses for years. Horses were, and still are, a passion for him. Whether it was a blue silk button down Versace shirt (\$275) or lot of nine designer neckties (\$425) William Shatner fans will always turn out to support the man who has spent his life entertaining the masses as he did once again at Hartville, Ohio.

Beloved Bloomington, Ind., antique shop is being liquidated

BLOOMINGTON, Ind. — Estate & Downsizing Specialists (aka. EDS Auctions) was selected to liquidate the extensive estate of the late Dennis and Nancy Garrett, who for 50 years owned Garrett Antiques in Bloomington.

During their years running the popular antique shop, the Garretts amassed a huge cache of antiques and collectibles, including fine furniture, antique lamps, geological specimens, Native American artifacts, rare photography, and vintage glassware. The enormous estate sale spans both their store inventory and personal holdings.

The Garretts were lifelong collectors who opened their first antique store in downtown Bloomington in 1964. A decade later they purchased a stunning Victorian-era home in Bloomington's West Side Historic District, just two

blocks from the town square, which eventually became their landmark

The massive limestone mansion was built in 1895 by the Batman family as a wedding gift for their daughter. The 8,000-square-foot home was designed by local architect John Nichols and featured Queen Anne, Second Empire, and Romanesque elements.


Although still sometimes referred to as the "Batman House," the building served many purposes throughout its history. In the 1920s, it housed the

Weir Funeral Home. In the 1940s, it became offices for the local chapter of the AFL-CIO. It was still a union hall when the Garrett's acquired it in 1974, eager to relocate their antiques busi-

townwide event. They invited him to showcase his pieces in the vendor arena. His pieces almost sold out. "Until the show, I didn't know how big the vintage barware community was." Now, he's keenly aware he offers a unique way for enthusiasts to display their wares.

ness there. After two years of major structural and interior renovations, the antique store opened its doors. Named, "The Garrett Antiques," both for the couple's last name and to edify the building's architecture, it remained a community icon until its closing in 2023.

The turreted mansion provided ample room for both their shop and residence. Rooms, alcoves, and hallways were filled with antiques often stacked nearly to the ceiling. Their home occupied the upper floors. Those, too, were filled with antiques in their private collection. A third-floor attic that the public never saw had as many antiques as the rest of the house.


The Garrett's antiques business started with their own collection plus that of a retiring antique dealer. Among their specialties were antique lamps. Dennis Garrett was well known for his skill in repairing and restoring all types of antique lighting, including leaded glass shades. The shop eventually held the state's largest collection of lamps, shades, and lamp accessories. He was also an advanced collector of fossils, rocks, minerals, and Native American artifacts, which were displayed throughout the museum-like building. His other major interests included Asian art, erotica, postcards, and primitives.

Like her husband, Nancy Garrett enjoyed rare antiques, including fine furniture and art glass. Along with helping in the store, she raised five children, and for 48 years worked at Indiana University. After her husband died in 2006 at age 73, she kept the store running until she died in 2023 at the age of 88.

EDS started holding sales to clear the estate in May. Owner Brian Sample said, "What they assembled in a lifetime was staggering," adding, "We are never going to see another situa-

tion like it again."

Sample noted they've already sold 4,000 lots and have at least 15,000 to go. Each sale is exemplary and bidders should expect to be impressed. The June 24 sale included items like an advertising thermometer from the Weir Funeral Home featuring a photograph of the house from the early. July's calendar included a two-day rock, mineral, and fossil auction - but given the thousands of pieces in the building, they figure it will take up to eight more to sell them all. July also featured a 400+ piece auction featuring nude and pinup art.

Upcoming auctions will liquidate Garrett's fine lamp, glass, pottery, and statuary collections. 5,000-10,000 Native American artifacts also await a sale. Then, there are thousands of antique bottles and tools, and at least 225 pieces of antique furniture. "Every visit, we uncover another tier and find something unexpected," Sample said.

That's with two or more each month totaling at least 30 additional auctions heading into 2025 and possibly beyond. "My entire staff is having a great time as we work through the 1,000s of items collected by the Garretts," Sample conveyed.

Bicentennial Plates

came to be honored by producers of souvenir plates, according to Pulley.

Interest in commemorative china continued to increase during the following years, and subsequently, the 1970s became a "heyday" for plates intended for collecting, not just for dining. Illustrating this, Pulley noted that this was when two American companies, the Franklin Mint and the Bradford Exchange, hit their stride. Having survived multiple challenges in the years leading up to 1976, the country was ready to celebrate. Renewed patriotism and a branding bonanza combined to feed into a wave of commercialism. It was a perfect storm for collectables.

Meanwhile, sensing this enthusiasm. companies did not wait until 1976 to begin issuing souvenirs, and those producing commemorative plates took advantage of the head start. What followed, beginning in 1972, was the offering of a wide variety of plates, with a style and subject to appeal to every collector. There were historic figures (including George Washington, Benjamin Franklin, and Paul Revere), landmarks (Independence Hall in Philadelphia and Washington's Virginia home, Mount Vernon), and notable events (the Boston Tea Party and Paul Revere's ride, as well as the signing of the Declaration of Independence, the crossing of the Delaware, and the victory at Yorktown), to name but a few. Among featured symbols were the American flag and the Liberty Bell; popular slogans included "We the People" and the "Spirit of '76. Needless to say, color schemes were overwhelmingly red,

white and blue.

Manufacturers around the globe produced commemorative plates for American consumption, even as the output of domestic companies included celebratory wares. Frankoma Pottery, located in Oklahoma, produced a line called "Bicentennial by Frankoma" from 1972 to 1976, with "American History Moments" plates that included "Provocations," "Battles for Independence," and "Victories for Independence."

In addition to a line of state-themed plates, Gorham issued a somewhat whimsical collectable plate that featured Norman Rockwell's illustration of Benjamin Franklin. Numbered and limited to 18,500 editions, this plate was a replication of the May 29, 1926, cover of "The Saturday Evening Post."

A West Virginia company, Taylor Smith & Taylor, took advantage of the occasion by issuing calendar plates with "big eagles and big flags." As it happens,

Pulley commented, "Red, white, and blue work well on a calendar plate." And plates distributed by Schmid Brothers were playful in nature, with one featuring Mickey Mouse getting into the act with a musket and tricorn hat and another with Raggedy Ann and Andy reenacting their version of the Spirit of '76.

Beyond the United States, Royal Copenhagen produced plates with a traditional blue and white Bicentennial theme. Pulley added that Denmark is home to a large community of American ex-patriots, and as a result, the Fourth of July is regularly celebrated in this Scandinavian country.

Offering collectors a different perspective were the plates issued by D'Arceau Limoges, ones that focus on the role of the Marquis de Lafayette, who served as a General in the American Revolution. These plates are "beautiful and pretty easy to find," as she characterized them.

Even though England was on the opposite side of the conflict, British companies made notable contributions to the array of Bicentennial-themed plates produced. Staffordshire's "Liberty Blue" plates are often mistaken for similar ironstone wares by Wedgwood, according to Pulley. On the other hand, it was Wedgwood that supplied the Avon company with patriotic plates, premiums for members of the firm's President's Club.

But for today's collectors, those Bicentennial commemorative plates with the most enduring appeal are examples of Wedgwood's "Jasperware." Characterized by their distinctive matte "biscuit" finish, these plates often feature a cameo in the center, be it a silhouette of George Washington or an

eagle, or the representation of an historic moment, including the Boston Tea Party, Paul Revere's ride, or the signing of the Declaration of Independence, frequently surrounded by a circle of stars. Pulley attributed the popularity of these pieces to their pleasing shade of what is referred to as "Wedgwood Blue," which lends itself to use as part of a contemporary plate wall.

Today's collectors are at an advantage. Because the original owners of Bicentennial commemorative souvenirs realized that they were living during an important time in history, many of these plates were carefully displayed, often in china cabinets. Pulley concluded by noting that these plates can be found in good condition, sometimes with their original boxes. For an estimated expenditure of \$10 to \$200, today's collectors have a wide array from which to choose.













