Waterfall furniture is making a big splash

There is probably no style of American furnishing more commonly associated with the 1930s and 1940s than what is known as "waterfall" furniture. Chances are, if you grew up in a typical household, your parents or grandparents had a set. Waterfall furniture is becoming popular again, but very few people know much about the once-iconic style.

The fashionable furniture emerged from the Art Deco movement, popular during the pre-war decades. Designers turned to new materials and manufacturing techniques incorporated clean lines that emerged from the Bauhaus movement. The modern look appealed to younger buvers who shunned the overly ornate, often imposing furniture of their parents' and grandparents' generations. Today's antique buyers — who continue to favor modernist styles —are starting to broaden their radar beyond the 1950s. Art Deco is often in their sights, and waterfall furniture is part of what is catching their attention.

Waterfall pieces are characterized by attractive curved edge lines meant to mimic the flow of a waterfall. The style debuted at the Paris Colonial Exposition in 1931. Inspiration came from similar designs emanating from Europe —

particularly Austria, Germany, and France. The renowned French design firm Sue et Mare was the originator, and their work was mimicked by others.

The Johnson Furniture Company in Grand Rapids, Mich., was among the first to produce waterfall furniture for the U.S. market. Given the positive reaction by American consumers, other furniture makers quickly followed suit. Among them were Kansas-based

Abernathy Furniture Company, Virginia's Webb Furniture Company, and F.S. Harmon in Washington state. Eventually, higher-end firms joined the ranks. Those included Bassett, which enlisted famed designer Leo Jiranek to develop their line, and Heywood-Wakefield which experimented with their signature blonde woods for their versions.

Waterfall furnishings were among the first crafted primarily from new types of plywood developed in the early 1930s, as opposed to solid wood. Plywood allowed furniture designers to be surprisingly creative without the costs associated with solid wood. In particular, plywood allowed waterfall's curves to be efficiently molded with a machine rather than painstakingly created with trim.

Most waterfall pieces were then covered with very thin wood veneer. The veneers came in dark finishes like walnut and light blonde wood like pecan. Typically, veneers were laid in ornate patterns that gave the illusion the piece was finely crafted. A popular version was decorative "bookmatching" which used different color veneers to produce a contrasting pattern. Better-



Collectors looking for Coca-Cola sports bottle caps

A bottle of soda cost a mere 29 cents in 1967, but for a kid with a limited budget that was a lot of coin. But if your parents could afford a six-pack in a carton then Coca-Cola's products yielded a gold mine for young sports fans.

Coke produced bottle caps during the 1960s featuring hockey, baseball and football players.

In 1967 and 1968 bottles of Coke, Fanta, Tab, Sprit and Fresca were sealed with caps showing the black, and white likenesses of Major League baseball players on the inside of the cap, with a number to match the saver-sheet provided by the retailer or local newspaper.

Different saver-sheets included "Match the All-Stars," or a Major League team that was local to the purchaser's area. There were 25 team players and 10 All-Star caps in all.

Between 1964-66 Coke produced photos of AFL and NFL football players on the metal cap's underside. Coke produced a solid mixture of teams from both leagues, either 34 or 35 players per squad. In addition, there were 44 "All-Star" caps from each league.

Hockey bottle caps were produced in 1964 and 1965. The company issued a total of 108 different NHL hockey players, including players from all the original six NHL teams. The hockey caps were not the big hit that the football and baseball caps were.

Teens and younger adults were the target audience of these collectible bottle caps, but pre-teens were the most avid collectors and most of them congregated around 1,000-pound soda machines hoping to slip their small hands into the machine's cap retriever. "The standard Coke machine with the metal bottle cap remov-

er was a young kid's treasure chest," said Art Schaaf, a Dayton, Ohio, native whose collection of 4,000-plus Coke baseball bottle caps was 'born' when he was just 10 years old.

"We lived between two Ohio bowling establishments, Dayton's Bolero Lanes and Trotwood Lanes in Trotwood," Schaaf said. "My brother and I would climb

aboard our bikes and visit both bowling alleys several times a week. Each business had soda machines inside the business, and two outside. Most people didn't seem to care much about the Coke caps. As they bought their Cokes, they'd fix the

Religious items from monastery to be sold at Kaminski auction

BEVERLY, MASS. - Starting on Saturday, August 17, Kaminski Auctions will hold a weekend of auctions, featuring towering Brutalist style stained-glass windows and religious artifacts from the recently-closed Carmelite Monastery of St. Therese.

Brutalist style is defined as keeping things minimalistic by letting the organic shapes shine through stripped-down materials. It was popular in the 1950s through the 1970s.

The Saturday auction will take place in Danvers, Mass., at the Carmelite chapel, which was open from 1958 until April 2023. The chapel is now permanently closed, making this in-person auction a rare opportunity to bid on items that were once held sacred within its walls.

Kaminski Auctions will round out the weekend on Sunday, August 18, at its gallery in nearby Beverly, with a selection of contemporary, mid-century and European art, as well as Harlem Renaissance art by the painter Romare Bearden.

Saturday's Carmelite auction will include large multi-sectional stained-glass windows, a green marble altar with carved and gilded inscriptions, an oak and brass Brutalist-style chapel lectern and side table, lighting fixtures, silver chalices, candlesticks, and monstrances, which are transparent receptacles in which the consecrated Host is displayed for veneration. The collection also includes a French gilt brass monstrance with multiple diamonds — the largest being approximately two carats pearls, cabochon rubies, emeralds, and sapphires.

Two tall stained-glass windows in the auction portray St. John of the Cross and St. Therese Lisieux, saints especially venerated by the Carmelite nuns who lived in the monastery. The French-born St. Therese, who died in 1897 at age 24 of tuberculosis, is popularly known in English as the Little Flower of Jesus and in French as la petite Thérèse. Although she was obscure during her lifetime, Pope Pius X called her "the greatest saint of modern times."

The preview for this auction will be take place from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on August 14-16 at the Carmelite Monastery at 15 Mt. Carmel Road, Danvers. The auction will get underway at 11 a.m. on August 17.

Top lots of the Sunday auction on August 18 include a Paul Jenkins (1923-2012) contemporary acrylic on canvas titled "Phenomena Lure of Cardinal Red" from the estate of the late Maurice and Myna Perlstein of La Jolla, California, and Chicago; an oil on canvas by Pete Max, signed and dated 1988; a contemporary Jeff Koons sculpture, blue "Balloon Dog" (9 ½ by 10 by 3 ½ inches); and a gouache on paper by German expressionist Hans Richter (1888-1976), titled "Composition" and initialed H.R.

Highlights in the European category include a signed watercolor/gouache, dated 1914 by Emile Nolde (1867-1956) titled "Manam Motu" with a pre-sale estimate of \$200,000-\$300,000, and works by Frank Helmut Auerbach, Karl Schmidt-Rotluff, Albert Marquet and Pieter Willem Sebes.

Among art by American painters in the auction will be works by Ralston Crawford, Philip C. Curtis and Impressionist Mary Cassatt.

The Sunday auction will take place at 11 a.m. at the Kaminski Auctions gallery, 117 Elliott Street, Rte. 62, Beverly.



bottle under the built-in opener on the soda machine and pop off the cap, which would fall into a metal container inside.

"The only problem was that our fingers weren't long enough to reach down into the slot to pull the caps up. We ended up affixing a magnet to a string and fish the bottle caps out a few at a time. We taped pieces of wood to the outside of the magnet so it wouldn't stick to the sides of the container as we hauled them up, probably four or five at a time.


Schaaf and other young collectors mounted all the caps to the saver sheet and swapped them for prizes at a redemption center.

Prizes for completed sheets included official Little League baseballs, baseball caps with a team emblem on them and autographed photos of players.

Regional issues of the caps consisted of 18 All-Star bottle caps. If a collector tried to get every cap of every all-star and regional team, that would be a 580-cap master set.

According to Schaaf, the biggest issue with caps, like any other piece of collectible memorabilia, is condition. There were no twist off caps in the 1960s, so openers were needed to open the Coca-Cola bottles. Some of those hand-held openers, as well as the openers on machines,

were pretty rough on the caps causing severe bending and occasional piercing that would damage the player image. Rust was also an issue, as the metal caps would corrode easily.


"There are plenty of baseball caps floating around on eBay, ranging in price from three dollars to \$100 and up," Schaaf said. "A 1967 Mickey Mantle will fetch around \$150, as might Willie Mays, Hank Aaron, Pete Rose, Carl Yastrzemski and others. Then again, prices in the latest Standard Catalog of Vintage Baseball Cards, show that a collector of these pop caps could find members of the 1967 California Angels, New York Mets and Cleveland Indiana for under \$6 apiece on average. Same with the 1968 Red Sox set."

"Many of the 1964-66 Coke football caps and 1967-68 football caps can still be found, but you can expect dings, bends and scratches, and possibly some rust, since through normal use, wear and time they can be hard enough to locate in better shape," Schaaf said. "Back in the day millions of these caps were affixed to the saver sheets, and were likely tossed by moms throughout the country who did their house cleaning."

Another expert in these caps, particu-

larly football, is Mike Mosier of Columbia City Collectibles. Mosier is based out of Columbia, Ind.

"The good thing is these caps had a great survival rate, unlike, say, baseball cards which were made of paper. They were made of something that wouldn't break or even crack, though they would rust if exposed to moisture." Mosier said. "I just returned from a collectibles show in Cleveland and can tell you there is still a market for these bottle caps."

According to Mosier, the Coca-Cola Company produced football caps for teams in each region, but finding key players was often difficult. The company, he says, also produced All-Star caps and those were easy to come by. Mosier says 25 team players and 10 All-Star caps were needed to complete a set for each team.

Harder to find, Mosier says, are the collector sheets.

"Saver sheets are high in demand," Mosier said. "The saver sheets go for \$25 to \$30 on average, more for the real tough teams. These can go for \$75 to \$100, even

If one has deep pockets, these rare bottle caps are available. A complete set of 1973 NFL Dallas Cowboys bottle caps (in mint condition) is for sale on eBay for \$2,376.

As it is with baseball cards, football caps' value depends on the popularity of the player at that time.

Mosier said common caps bring a buck or two for several teams, "but the hardest teams to find were the Dallas Cowboys, Houston Oilers and anything on the West Coast and most AFL teams."

Mosier says players appearing on caps bottled with Sprite, Fresca, Tab and Fanta "can bring up to 50 percent more than those on Coke Caps."

Art glass and lamps will light up Woody Auction offering

DOUGLASS, Kan. – An original 12-light Tiffany Studios Lily table lamp, late 19th or early 20th century French cameo art glass vases signed Galle and Daum, and a lovely French cameo art glass boudoir lamp signed Daum Nancy are just a few of the outstanding items bidders will compete for in an August 24 auction by Woody Auction. An online-only auction featuring similar items will be held on August 23.

The original bronze Lily Pad 12-light lamp marked Tiffany Studios (#382) is the auction's excepted top lot, with a presale estimate of \$15,000-\$20,000. Woody called it "the finest original 12-light Lily Tiffany lamp we've ever sold." All twelve gold favrile shades are marked "LCT" and the 20-inch-tall lamp also boasts a fantastic patina and original switch hardware.

Called the oldest truck, it rolled off with \$10,000 bid

FREELAND, Mich. — A 1909 Federal truck was one of the highlights of a recent auction conducted by Wegner Auctioneers for the Richard Spies estate. This was the second auction Wegner had held for this estate.

The truck offered at the auction has been owned by the same family since it was purchased in 1909. This vehicle was the registered 1909 prototype, with the first Federal production model made in 1910. The truck was museum quality in its ninety-nine percent original condition. The truck is registered with the Federal Motor Trust Registry and the Antique Truck Registry of the American Truck Historical Society. It came with the original family registration and hard rubber tires and was in excellent running condition. The wooden bed had been restored to the original blueprint specifications, but other than that, it was all original. It is listed in the Henry Ford Museum in Detroit, Michigan, as the oldest truck. With its paperwork, the truck brought some competitive bidding and finally found a new home for \$10,000.

A 1941 Plymouth four-door coupe was completely restored and had a 201.3 cubic inch, six-cylinder engine. The beautiful red color on the outside of this vehicle, with the matching red on the inside of the hubs, made this car pop. The final sale price of this show vehicle was \$17,500.

A project truck selling for \$6,000 was a 1940 pickup with the original body. It came from the Saginaw Boot Repair shop. It had the original drive train but no engine. The body was clean. Another project vehicle was a 1934 Plymouth two-door coupe with a big block 440 engine. It came with a 727 transmission. The final bid price for a chance to work on this project and bring it back to its original beauty was \$5,500. A 1927 Ford Model T coupe looked complete but needed to be restored. It sold

A more modern 2005 Dodge Magnum BLT looked pretty good. It had a salvage title from California and ran and could be driven. The airbag was set off, but it didn't stop the bidders. A bid of \$3,750 came out on top with this one.

A 1997 custom Chrysler van was "not your average soccer mom van", according to the description. It had a motorcycle carrier and was handicapped accessible. It was custom painted with "ghost" flames. It had 10 infinity speakers and all the bells and whistles. It was crafted by a Barrett-Jackson executive to transport one of his custom-made V8 motorcycles. The floor was lowered, the suspension was modified. and a remote-control rear entry hatch and ramp were added. It could be used as a handicapped transport vehicle or a motorcycle carrier. This one sold for only \$1,500 despite all the bells and whistles.

Doubling that bid at \$3,000 was a Dodge Charger SRT8 engine with the transmission and drive train. It included

the wheels, tires, and seats. This engine was thought to have less than one hundred miles on it.

A 1949 Cadillac two-door convertible drove the bidding back up. This one had a fat man fabrication front clip and stainless-steel A-arm front suspension. It also came with a 500 cubic-inch Cadillac motor. The body was rust-free, and it was mostly complete. It just needed to be assembled and painted with a gorgeous color to catch everyone's eye. It came with many extra parts, and the bidding reflected that it was much sought after. It took a high bid of \$14,000 for the hammer to come down on this one.

Selling for \$6,500 was a 1956 Chevrolet Belair. This four-door sedan was also a project car. A 1934 Plymouth two-door coupe was run across the auction block. This one had a big block 400 engine and a 727 transmission. It was a project car from Florida and was in good condition. It came in right behind the \$6,500 bid with a final bid of \$5,500, making the hammer fall.

If you are interested in vintage automobiles, you are probably interested in vintage signs. There were some nice ones offered up at this auction. Taking a high bid was a Standard Oil sign. This was a wall-mounted sign. It measured almost 59 by 55 inches, so it was big. The final price of this piece of history was \$4,950. And coming in right behind the Standard Oil sign was a Gulf dealer sign. This sign, with

its faded colors, measured six feet. But it sold for a respectable price of \$3,750.

A Pennzoil double-sided standing sign measured 31 by 20 inches and stood 47 inches tall. It sold for \$1,550.

It appeared to be complete and was very sharp with its bright red and white color scheme. The second one was a Correct Measure Company Model 10-H from 1929. It needed some tender loving care to make it a display piece, but with its' glass globe, it would make an excellent conversation piece. The last one was a Guarantee Liquid Measure company pump out of Rochester, Pennsylvania. It had a wire mesh-like piece surrounding the glass top and also needed some restoration. It still had the original tags on it.

A cute safari car for children to drive was offered. The backseat passengers were a giraffe and an elephant. Sitting in the front passenger seat was an ape. The car was painted in the zebra pattern. It sold for \$200.

Several different piles of children's rideon airplanes were available. These aluminum amusement park planes were offered up, with the bidding prices at \$250, \$225, \$200, and \$175. They were already taken apart for easy transport, all painted sky

A full-size, operating Ferris wheel was sold. It stood a majestic 45 feet into the air. It was a Deluxe No. 12 and sold for only \$600, with the new buyers being required to show they had insurance before starting the disassembly.

Waterfall Furniture

grade pieces, like those from Heywood Wakefield, were often covered in thicker imported woods like birch or elm or used rich burled wood veneer.

Embellishments often included delicate-looking Bakelite or brass handles. Vanities and dressers were typically paired with mirrors featuring trim matching the handles. The detailing produced an overall feminine look while the geometric lines and bold veneer patterning appealed to masculine tastes.

Waterfall furnishings were most associated with bedroom suites and were often called "newlywed furniture" for their popularity with young couples. During the Great Depression, it was fairly common for newlyweds to occupy a room in a family member's home. The new couple's bedroom set was often the only thing that they owned which differentiated their own space and tastes in an abode that belonged to another person and era. Due to their low cost, waterfall sets were affordable for young couples of various incomes, even during the tight years of the Depression. A glance at Sears' catalogs of the 1930s shows a basic "suite" costing as little as \$19.95-\$39.95.

The items, however, were not limited to bedroom sets. Desks, dining sets, and end tables were among the options. In those same mail-order catalogs, a full dining room group accommodating six, with a table, leaves, chairs, buffet, and china cabinet could be had for around \$105. When young families moved to their own residences, it was easy to fill the rooms with complimentary furnishings.

Eventually, waterfall motifs began appearing on everything from small appliances like radios to kitchen cabinetry and even house exteriors. Designers also made inroads using other materials like glass, metal, and plastic.

After World War II, the waterfall style fell out of fashion. Materials developed during the war effort, along with newer post-war styles like the International and Jet Age schools, caught suburban consumers' attention. Yet, given the circumstances around how those early waterfall sets were acquired, sentimental attachments often ran deep. Even when

redecorated, many held onto their waterfall items, even if it meant relegating them to the attic or basement. That meant many pieces (and even entire sets) survived for new generations of fans.

Today, waterfall chests, dressers, side tables, and vanities are common sights at thrift stores and yard sales — often at surprisingly low prices. It's not unusual to find a single piece priced less than \$25, even in decent shape.

Nonetheless, because waterfall furniture was mass-produced, it tended to be of poor quality (at least by the standards of its day) and it's difficult to find a pristine piece. Manufacturing shortcuts are evident. The only frame is the plywood underlay, which did not always provide adequate structural support. Add to that drawers that often had no drawer glides, and alignment issues plus opening/closing problems with drawers and doors existed even when new.

One of the biggest weaknesses was the veneer, which was prone to damage, staining, and breakage. Moisture would easily mar the surface, and a simple

perfume spill could loosen

the glue. Time, heat from attics. and moisture from basements have usually taken their toll. Veneer is often found detached from the underlying plywood, brittle, often broken off shredded. Heat-related from damage cigarettes or even modern curling irons may have left burned holes. Furniture restorers have processes repair or replace damaged veneer but most waterfall furniture is

the expense.

Often motivated by such conditional issues, waterfall pieces seem to be a favorite target of shabby chic'ers who will quickly paint them to mask any faults. No matter how good

not

enough to warrant

valuable

that looks, unfortunately, it can't be undone as paint strippers will quickly dissolve the veneer's glue and destroy the exterior.

A \$100 chalk-painted waterfall dresser will always remain one.

Fortunately, it's not impossible to find pieces that just need a bit of attention — like cleaning decades of dust and debris and carefully rejuvenating the veneer's surface with a non-solvent wood cleaner. A complete bedroom set in need of simple sprucing may be found reasonably priced, perhaps for \$400-\$800. If pieces were lovingly cared for over the years, they can look nearly as good today as when they were put into service. That's

particularly the case with higherquality pieces that better stood the ravages of time. Those command prices you would expect for good antique furniture. A top-condition set with original hardware, from a maker like Basset, can top \$1,500.

This stylish and often affordable furniture is still admired by those who appreciate the Art Deco era. The simple elegant curves, sheathed in warm wood tones, oftentimes accented with handsome hardware, are at home alongside both contemporary and traditional decor. And given what appears to be an unceasing interest in the entire Modernist era, it's not surprising that waterfall furniture is attracting renewed attention.


