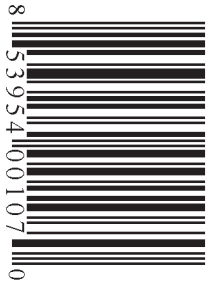

Coles Phillips women seemed to just fade away

Clarence Coles Phillips (1880 – 1927) was an American artist and magazine illustrator during the golden age of magazine illustration. Phillips signed his canvasses C. Coles Phillips, for his early work, and Coles Phillips, for his work after 1911. Phillips created cover art for many magazines during the turn of the last century, but his primary focus was illustrating the covers of Life magazine.

Phillips was born in Springfield, Ohio, and he attended college at Kenyon College, located in Gambier, Ohio. He began his career as an illustrator by publishing illustrations in The Reveille, Kenyon College's yearbook, during the four years he attended the school (1901 -1904).

Following graduation in 1904, Phillips moved to Manhattan to be near the center of America's magazine industry. He enrolled in the Chase School of Art, taking night classes for three months. These classes were his only formal training as an artist. In late 1904, Phillips opened his own advertising agency with himself as the

company's leading illustrator.

Shortly after opening his agency, Phillips hired a very young Edward Hopper, a former classmate. For a time, Hopper helped design magazine covers. Hopper (1882 – 1967) became a renowned artist for his ability to cap-

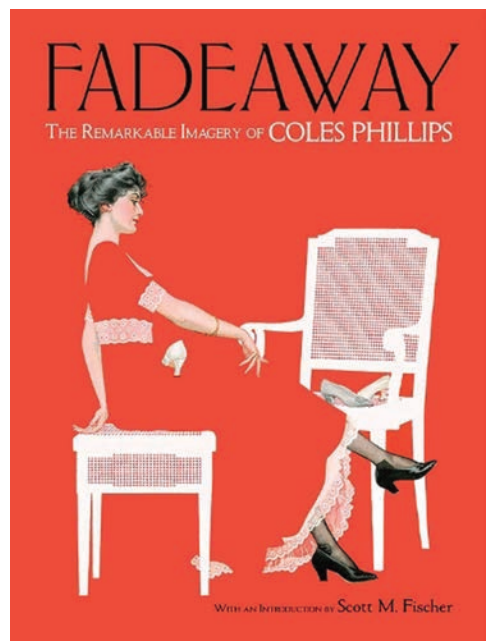

ture American life and landscapes. He predominately explored themes of loneliness in his work.

In 1907, Phillips met J. A. Mitchell, the publisher of Life magazine. Mitchell hired Phillips as an illustrator for the magazine. Phillips remained

Pierceton is reviving antiques industry in historic downtown

PIERCETON, Ind. — Nestled in north-east Indiana, Pierceton is a must-visit for antique lovers. Known affectionately as “the antique town,” its walkable downtown is filled with antique and vintage shops appealing to both casual shoppers and seasoned collectors. Spend a leisurely day exploring these charming stores, each with its own distinct character.

Pierceton is located in Kosciusko County, just off US Route 30, about 40 minutes west of Fort Wayne. Established in the 1830s, Pierceton, like many small Indiana communities, has agricultural roots. The origin of the town’s name is debated; some believe it honored President Franklin Pierce while others think the name reflects an early area family. As with many Midwest towns, the railroad was pivotal in Pierceton’s growth. The town grew with the arrival of the Atlantic and Great Western Railroad in the 1850s, which connected Pierceton to larger markets and spurred economic development. Today, Pierceton’s rail heritage is showcased at the circa 1867 Italianate-style Pennsylvania Railroad Depot, now home to a popular restaurant. An Atlantic Coast Line passenger car outside offers an excellent photo opportunity. Across the street is the former Flat Iron Hotel, which served rail passengers

through World War II.

The town continued to grow during the late 19th and early 20th centuries, filling with businesses like general stores, blacksmith shops, markets, and cafes

Pierceton’s antiques industry took root

in the early 20th century when a handful of residents began selling antiques from their homes and storefronts. Photographs show antique stores in Pierceton as early as the 1940s. Over time, Pierceton evolved into a sought-after antiques destination, thanks in part to its quaint downtown area. Antique dealers played a significant role by restoring historic buildings and preserving the town’s authentic, old-world charm which continues to draw antique enthusiasts today.

Pierceton remained a popular antiques

destination into the present century. At its peak, the town boasted up to 15 antique shops. Notable among them were the Antique Emporium and Barn at Pierceton, which had become local landmarks. Residents recall a time when buses used to bring visitors, who would often spend the entire day shopping.

Unfortunately, like many places across the country, vintage shopping in Pierceton began to decline in the 2000s. Buying increasingly shifted online, tastes changed, and many antique dealers aged out. The

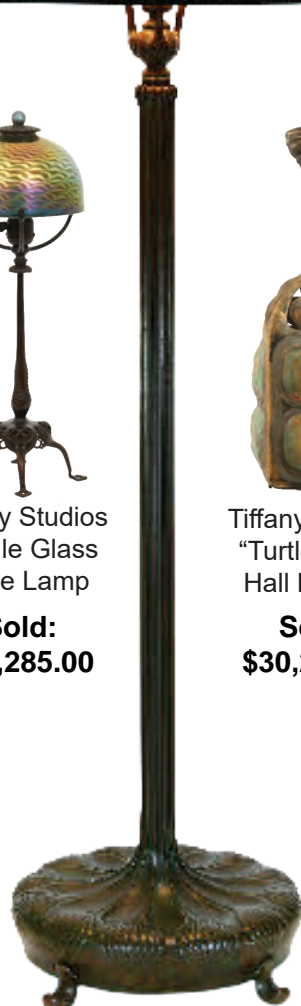

COVID-19 pandemic dealt a final blow, leading many to reluctantly close their doors. Sadly, none of the dozen antique shops operating as recently as 2005 are still open.

Yet, something exciting — though perhaps not surprising — began to unfold. Local entrepreneurs refused to let Pierceton's antique industry fade away. They started refilling the historic storefronts, creating inviting new spaces filled with collections appealing to both traditional enthusiasts and younger vintage buyers. Today, nine fresh faces make up Pierceton's antique and vintage scene, offering everything from gracefully restored period furniture to eclectic modernist wares. Here's a glimpse of each:

Antiques on First Street: Housed in the town's historic hardware building, this 30-space antique mall offers a diverse range of items, from Victorian furniture to mid-century barware. Opened just a month ago, it's quickly become a local favorite.

Barefoot Cottage: Another recent addition, this store features antiques and refinished furniture with a lake-lifestyle vibe.

Blue Pearl Antiques: A classic antique store with rooms bustling with an eclectic array of merchandise. They offer everything from affordable decor to rare high-end jewelry.

Homespun House: Branded as a "unique gift store," Homespun House boasts a generous inventory of antiques, particularly antique kitchenware, alongside its other items.

Kelsea Designs: Located in a 1916 building that once housed a clothing factory, Kelsea Designs specializes in repurposed and refurbished vintage furniture.

My Red Moon: Open seasonally from September to December, they offer a diverse mix of antiques, collectibles, and curiosities.

Pucks Vintage Interiors and Goblin Market: Known for its unusual and distinctive merchandise, this store appeals to younger buyers with its unique selection.

Purr-fectly Unique Boutique: The go-to spot in Pierceton for vintage clothing and jewelry.

Second Fiddle: Operating out of a former Odd Fellows building, this store — operated by the same couple behind Antiques on First — features a broad range

of antiques from various eras. It even has an in-store café.

Sydow's Antiques: Catering to discerning buyers, Sydow's Antiques features fine, one-of-a-kind pieces.

In addition to what's in town, there's also US 30 Countryside Antiques about three miles east in Larwill. The eye-catching 12,000-square-foot Alpine-style building is now a 50-dealer antique mall.

To cap off a day of shopping, you'll find a variety of dining options in town. Among them is the Old Train Depot serving classic American dishes and Julia's Tamales Y Tacos offering homemade Mexican cuisine in a charming, cozy atmosphere. For a drink,

head to Taproot Brewhouse and Company, where you can enjoy a beer or pub food in a Key West vibe.

Pierceton also hosts several events that draw antique enthusiasts. They include a town-wide garage sale in June, Small Business Saturday in November, and the Heritage Gathering Primitive Show in December.

Whether you're a seasoned collector or a casual browser, Pierceton's antique scene has plenty to offer. Whether your tastes run to primitive furniture or 1970s vinyl, this charming town has something waiting for you.

Rich life of Bunny Hathaway will cross the Nye auction block

BLOOMFIELD, N.J. – Nye & Company Auctioneers will hold a three-day Country House Splendor auction on September 11-13. The auction will include approximately 1,000 lots of fine and decorative arts from the 17th century up to modern day, headlined by items from the estate of Barbara Mallory Hathaway.

Barbara M. (“Bunny”) Hathaway was a World War II veteran and philanthropist known for her green thumb. She died in May 2023 at age 101. Hathaway was born in 1921 and raised in Greenwich, Connecticut and New York City. She was the daughter of Clifford Day Mallory, president and CEO of the Mallory Line, a family shipping concern that was established in 1816.

Hathaway lived in the same house for over 70 years. Many of the pieces included in the sale were originally from her parents’ apartment in New York City, as well as the William Bottomley designed estate of her great aunt in Maryland. The collection features terrific objects one might expect to see decorating the interior of a classic country home, whether English or American.

Highlights include a Regency inlaid desk-and-bookcase that seems to reach for the sky and is finely proportioned. The ‘smalls’ are abundant and rich in design and flare. There are numerous Staffordshire figures, some equestrian themed, terrific silver, glass, porcelain and lighting. There is also a selection of garden ornamentation including a figural fountain of a young boy with flute.

Hathaway’s maternal grandfather was George Sealy, the Texas banker, merchant, cotton baron and owner/president of the Gulf, Colorado and Santa Fe Railroad. After being educated at boarding school in Virginia, she was named by Hearst Newspaper Syndicates as 1939’s Debutant of the

Year. When the US entered World War II, she moved to Washington, DC, where she was employed by the Office of Strategic Services (the precursor of the CIA) and was assigned to the Balkan Desk.

At war’s end she married Captain

E. Phillips Hathaway, a decorated Marine aviator who had received three air medals including the Distinguished Flying Cross. They moved to the Greenspring Valley outside of Baltimore, Md., where they built a French inspired house. Bunny – a passionate amateur gardener – proceeded to design and layout extensive gardens.

There is also an equally rare Federal carved cherrywood armchair from Mitchelsburg, Ky. This chair has been upholstered with a non-invasive covering pioneered by Colonial Williams-

Collection of 60,000 comic books coming to Appalachian Trading Post auction

DAMASCUS, W. Va. – Appalachian Trading Post and Auction Co. is bringing a whole host of new characters into town Sept. 21, including superheroes and villains from 60,000 comic books.

The comics come from the collection of retired schoolteacher Barry Kuhl. With the proceeds of the sale, Kuhl plans on helping his 80-some-year-old parents through their later years.

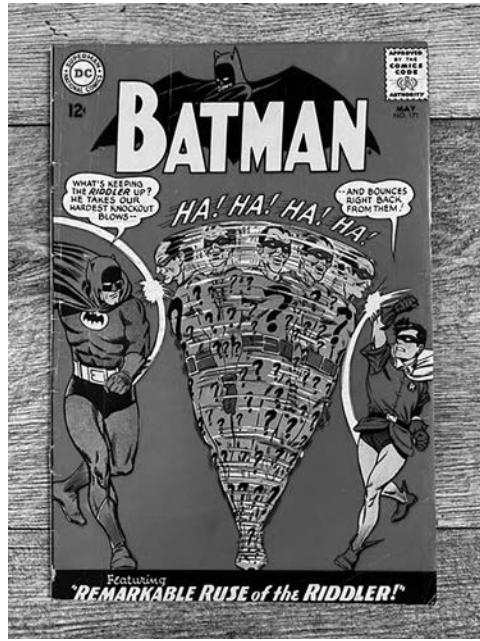
“I had a great childhood,” said Kuhl, who taught high school for 29 years. “Since I was five years old, I thrived on those comics. I had two grandfathers, and one uncle live to be older than 100 years, and they had stories that would blow away kids today. I remember we got our first TV in the 1960s, but we could only get three channels.

“We lived in our own fantasies, and part of that was found in comics. I was lucky to grow up with a much older generation of relatives around, which just sparked my imagination more. Then there was Ironman, Thor, The Amazing Spiderman, Batman and all these characters that could do things only your mind could conger-up.

The Kuhl collection, which may be sold in four auctions, covers nearly every niche of comics ever made, according to Alan Shope, owner of Appalachian Trading Post and Auction. “He picked up on everything,” Shope said. “There’s Golden Key comics, Abbott and Costello, Space Ghost, Star Trek, Tarzan, Bugs Bunny, the Long Ranger, Daffy Duck, you name it, he collected

it all.”

However, the Sept. 21 auction will feature “the crème de la crème,” according to Shope. The auction in-person and online bidding.

Kuhl remains content, despite selling such endearing items from his childhood.

“Me, I’m content,” he says. “I’ve accomplished everything in my life I wanted. When I was a child, we had a house fire that destroyed everything. Once my parents got everything back together my dad went to me and my sisters and asked them if they wanted anything back that was destroyed in the fire. I only had about 600 or 700 comic books then. I told him I would like some of my books back.

“He and my Uncle Bobby went

out and scoured every flea market they could find and, eventually, returned with around 800 comics. I got back most of the comic that were lost. My parents were great to me. I’ll have my childhood memories and selling those comic books will give me the opportunity to help my family when they need it.”

burg’s upholsterer, Leroy Graves. This cutting-edge technology allows the seat covering to be easily removed and avoids tacking anything to the frame.

The collection also includes an early Queen Anne pair of balloon seat side chairs made in Philadelphia, 1750-1760, with a history of descending in the Mendenhall family (est. \$15,000-\$30,000). There is also a terrific Lemuel Curtis girandole clock (est. \$15,000-\$30,000). These rare wall clocks are often some of the most sought-after pieces for Americana collectors.

Another excellent complement to the furnishings category is the splendid collection of silver, brass and Pakong candlesticks dating from the second-half of the 18th century. These well-crafted and beautifully designed metalwork sources of light helped illuminate the homes and lives of generations past. Some are estimated as low as \$500-\$1,000.

For those who appreciate whimsy, craftsmanship and folk art, there is a small but choice selection of canes being sold from the estate of Marjorie and Robert L. Hirschhorn. The Hirschhorns were passionate collectors

Coles Phillips

with Life magazine for the remainder of his life.

Life magazine's readers quickly popularized Phillips' illustrations. In May 1908, Phillips changed the way magazine covers looked when Life magazine published, on the cover, Phillips first "fadeaway" girl design. Phillips diligently worked to develop this artistic line of expression, which, basically, had a woman's clothing match the background so the woman seemed to "fadeaway" into the background. It has been said that the style in which Phillips painted "seamlessly blended the figure into the background, rendering some amount of the clothing invisible for the edges."

To achieve a "fadeaway" look, Phillips mastered the use of negative space on canvass. By strategically posing his models, Phillips painted in such a way that viewers could "fill-in" the image even as the background seemed to swallow up the model. Basically, a viewer's eyes, using shape, followed the outline of the model's clothing even though the background of the painting rendered the clothing invisible. The edge of the skirt is still fully identifiable for the viewer in order to keep the entire illustration from becoming lost.

One of Phillips most successful models was Teresa Hyde, a local nurse who he met in 1907. Hyde frequently modeled for him, and a relationship between the two blossomed. In 1910 they were married.

Phillips painted in watercolor, using live models for his fadeaway women. He became one of the most in-demand magazine illustrators during the 1910s and 20s. His fadeaway women were not only visually appealing, but Life magazine quickly realized it could print covers for the magazine much cheaper using Phillips fadeaway women because most of the women were painted with just two to three colors, making printing costs cheaper.

While Life magazine utilized Phillips talents for its covers more than any

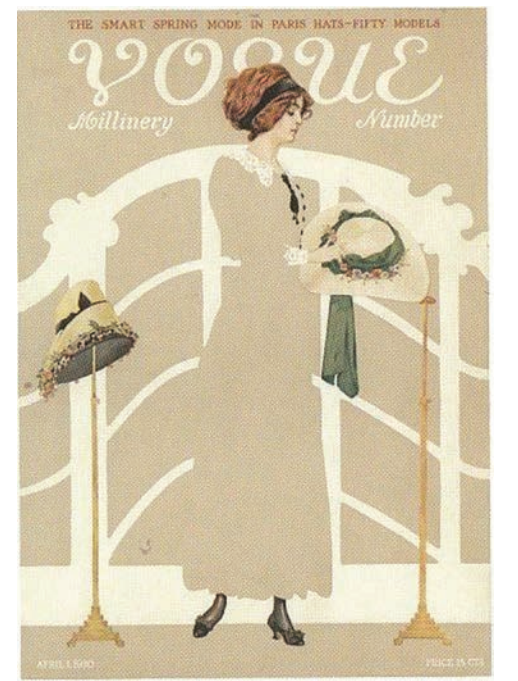
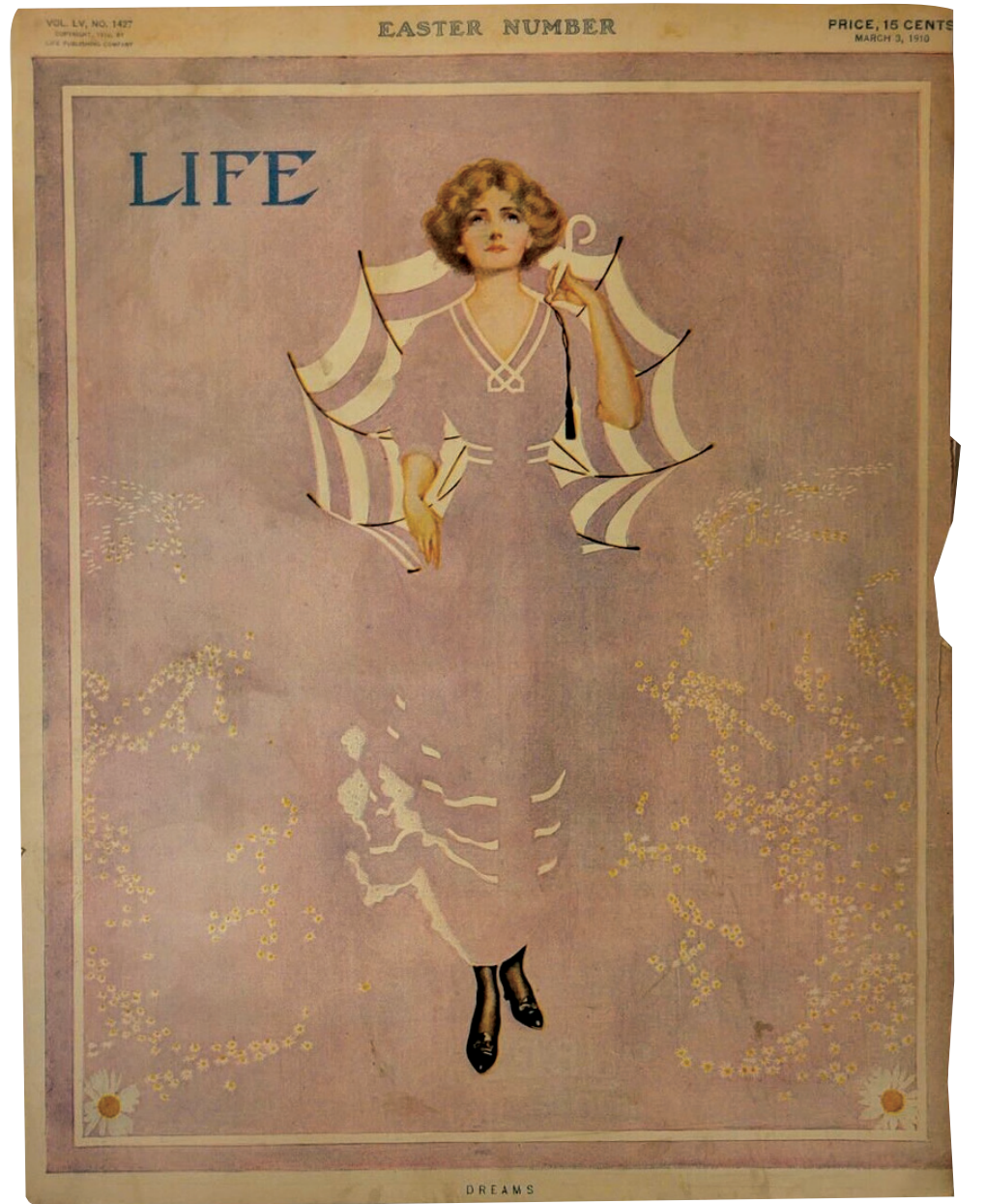
other magazine, other magazines did use fadeaway women on their covers. Between 1912 and 1914, Good Housekeeping ran 24 consecutive issues with a Phillips fadeaway woman on its cover. Several other magazines, including Lucky Bag, the U. S. Naval Academy's yearbook, used Phillips work. Some of his covers for Vogue magazine is considered his best work.

Phillips also painted advertisements for numerous companies in the early

part of the 20th century, including Oneida flatware, Overland automobiles, and Holeproof Hosiery, which were considered a little risqué for the times. He also painted covers for The Saturday Evening Post prior to Norman Rockwell's starting at the Post in 1916.

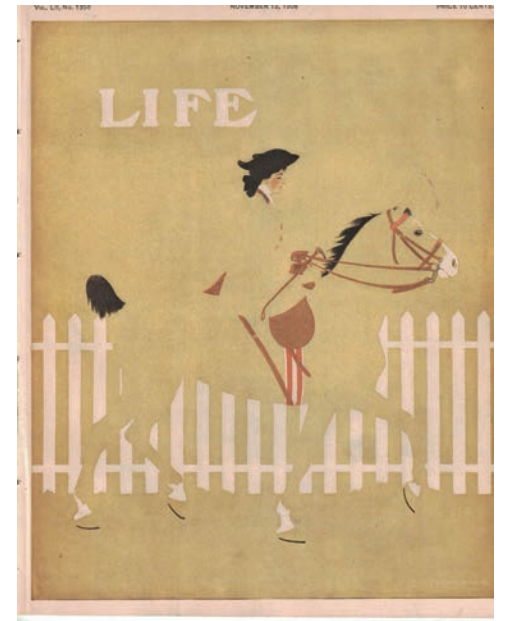
In 1924 Phillips was diagnosed with renal tuberculosis. From that time until his death in 1927 at age 47, he had difficulty painting because of fail-

ing eyesight. Today, Phillips work is admired and collected around the world by students of graphic design, illustration, and 1920s advertising fashion.
